

Three-day wet weather likely to bring rain, snowfall over J&K from Nov 30: **MeT**

SRINAGAR, Nov 26 (Agencies): The Meteorological Centre on Tuesday predicted a three-day wet weather event beginning at the end of this month that can bring rain and snow to scattered to fairly widespread places over Jammu and Kashmir.

The MeT office said the weather will generally remain dry till November 29, and from the evening of November 30, there is a possibility of light rain and light snow over the higher reaches and at isolated places.

The weather is very likely to remain inclement during December 1 and 2 with the possibility of light rain and light snow over the higher reaches and at the scattered to fairly widespread places over Jammu and Kashmir, the MeT office said, and added the weather will remain dry hereafter till December 6.

The cold weather condition continued to grip the Kashmir Valley, and barring Srinagar and Kokernag, the night temperature remained below freezing point at other weather stations, with the hill resorts of Gulmarg and Pahalgam

Ten Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorists from Pakistan arrived by sea on November 26, 2008, and killed 166 people, including 18 security person-



nel, during a 60-hour siege in Mumbai.

Centre approves Rs 1,115 Crore to States for disaster mitigation, capacity-building projects

The committee also approved another project for training and capacity building of civil defence volunteers in all states and Union territories at a total outlay of Rs 115.67 crore, according to an official statement. According to an offi-



Separate FIRs were registered against them under section 223 (failure to comply with order issued by public servant) of BNS. The



cases against two of them were filed in Nowabad police station and against the three others at Bahu Fort police station, reported The Indian Express.

Pointing out that "Jammu police have initiated a comprehensive investigation in this regard", police said the Rohingya persons that the landlords had rented property to were "undocumented and pose a potential security threat".

The Rohingya are refugees from Myanmar.

There is growing impression among the people and political parties that the exit polls are not exact polls and thus there are always false and incorrect .This impression about exit polls proved totally wrong in the recent exit polls in case of the assembly polls in the states of Maharashtra ,Jharkhand and the bye polls in the politically most significant state of Uttar Pradesh as the exit polls came true and dismantled the wrong notion about the exit polls and the soothsayers proved wrong. The poll results in the assembly elections in Maharashtra ,Jharkhand and the bye polls in UP proved exact as the results which came on 23rd November are very much exact and true .The Maharashtra, Jharkhand elections showed BJP regained the upper hand and are totally in accordance with the poll predictions given by various exit polls of different channels and organizations .Same happened in case of the bye polls in UP were SP chief Alkesh Yadav was roaring that all the by poll seats in the state will go into the kitty of Samajwadi party .But the actual election results in the bye polls in UP were as per the poll predictions of the exit polls and SP chief's claims turned wrong as the BJP maintained its position and hold by winning six assembly seats. show how the BJP keeps building its electoral and ideological dominance .Election season ended with two results going in two different directions but were as per the forecasts and exit polls .In Maharashtra, the BJP has swept the election while in Jharkhand ,the JMM has managed to retain its hold and kept BJP at bay .It is noteworthy that in both states incumbents have held onto to their fortress -like in Haryana assembly polls earlier .However, while in Maharashtra ,the BJP's two partners and the opposition will now face an existential crisis in Jharkhand, despite its inability to wrest power ,the BJP has done reasonably well -it rightly retained its vote of 2019. Thus it shows that BJP has reasserted its upper hand in electoral politics .Some time ago ,the BJP was momentarily on the back foot .Haryana warned that BJP should not be written off .The election results of Maharashtra confirmed the warning and writing on the wall .The Lok Sabha election results had cut the BJP to size ,but its strength was still intact, as was its ability to steer the terms of political discourse . Assembly elections in the last couple of months testify to this .Three issues might be taken into account in order to understand the outcome in Maharashtra and Jharkhand and connect it to Haryana and Jammu region of J&K .Following the setback in the Lok Sabha election ,the BJP seems to have made a conscious effort to insulate Prime Minister Modi from defeats. While Modi remains the mascot, the emphasis on his rallies was carefully reduced .Rather than a shrill vote getter, his potential role as PM is projected more prominently .Whether it was in Haryana or in Maharashtra ,the PM inaugurated a number of projects .This ensured that he is seen as the benefactor

.The murky polemic was unleashed not by Modi but by others in the party .This nuanced transformation of Modi's role in the BJP s latest electoral wars is a significant fallout of the Lok Sabha elections .This strategy showed that BJP protected Brand Modi from failures, although his hold on the party continued as earlier victory is attributed always to Modi but he was saved from embarrassment of owning up to defeats .We should also know what led to the BJP's win in Maharashtra. The three C''s helped BJP to win .This is a different Modi from the one we have seen since 2014.Even a cursory glance at the full=page advertisements splashed by the BJP showed that Modi is still the overarching image and big crowd puller and vote catcher .His itineraries before the announcement of election show that he steers the "development plank" While getting swayed by the likes of Yogi Adityanath and Himanta Biswa Sarma ,a significant proportion of voters in both Maharashtra and Jharkhand would have hint of Modi in making their choices .The second issue is the various schemes promised ,launched and implemented by the contesting parties in both the states .Indeed flagship schemes have always helped parties ---incumbents in particular to acquire an edge among electorate .We have seen this since the launch of the employment scheme of the UPA -MNREGA .There is no doubt that the slew of schemes implemented by the state governments, with particular emphasis on DBT both in Maharashtra ANS Iharkhand has helped win coalitions .The third issue which impacted the outcome of the polls in both the starts was that BJP brought shrill Hindutva to the centre stage .This is not new .But follow-

performance in April-May ,the party has emphasized the Hinduitva message in which this agenda is implemented in different states . When the BJP won Haryana, much was said about its clever management of caste -based fault lines .In Maharashtra too ,it ensured through micro-management that the deep fissures on the question of Maratha reservation did not hurt it .However success in the polls in Maharashtra and good performance in Jharkhand can be attributed to BJP's core agenda of Hindutva which it marketed in the polls .Yogi's slogan of Bategay tou Katengay and eak Rahayagay tou Safe Rahayagay which found expression and endorsement in Modi's electioneering and resulted into party regaining power in Maharashtra and its somewhat good performance in Jharkhand although BJP failed to gain power there is a different story .To counter radical Muslims love Jihad and vote Jihad by the consolidation of unity among the Hindu's proved a nectar and it watered the growing prospects of the BJP in the two states .It can be said that emphasis on its core ideology of Hindutva worked wonders and it turned a vote catching device besides being a big crowed puller .Thus the assembly elections of the two states proved beyond doubt that Hindutva impacted the outcome of the polls in both the states .Any way the election results were on the expected lines and were as per the projections of the exit polls. In brief this time Exit polls were exact polls and the myth that exit polls are not exact polls proved wrong.

Carving magic around the theme of zodiacs, 13 sculptors made each piece of stone talk at Kalagram

Every block of stone has a statue inside it and it is the task of the sculptor to discover it, famously said Michelangelo. And, 13 sculptors at the recently concluded 20-day National Sculpture Camp-24 at Kalagram, Chandigarh, lived up to it.

The theme was zodiacs and the sculptors from various parts of the country, including Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Ladakh, Kashmir, Bihar, Chandigarh, Punjab and Delhi, were part of this mega camp. It was organised by the North Zone Cultural Centre (NZCC), Ministry of Culture, Government of India, and concluded on November 23.

Each one was entrusted a huge block of black marble. six-by-six by two feet. Working in a row, there was a storm of dust covering the entire lane; not smog but the dust of stones due to the constant cutting and grilling. Each artist had his face covered as the cacophony of machine drowned other sounds. Maquettes — small, preliminary models — sat pretty, but looked forlorn amongst the tools and blocks of extra stone. What was heartening in the melee was that one could see the shapes taking forms — a robust lion, a muscled crab, a fish and a strong bull, just about getting ready to charge!

Narinder J S Maloya was rather happy working on the sign Cancer. Having studied the crab in detail, he was creating a giant one. A post graduate from Government College of Art



(GCA)-10, he is much in love with stone. "This black marble looks grey since it's being carved, but once complete and polished it will be jet black." His entire focus was on getting the proportions right. "Art should be accessible to all - rich, poor, man, woman, old or young," shared the artist.

Next to him was Simarjeet Sekha, who had the sign Leo to work upon. An impressive lion, robust and roaring was taking shape. Interestingly, Simarjeet loves to create animal forms, his favourite being a dog, for which he won an award too.

Keralite Ajesh Kumar Kandalloor, who teaches at Stone Artisan Park Training Institute. Gujarat, had Aries as his theme, and we saw the outline of horns shaping up in a huge chunk of stone. Sanul Kuttan was dealing with Gemini. Two human figures being his sign, he was seen making full figures. Kuttan was here before at another sculpture workshop. At that time in the wake of farmers' protests, he made a figure of a farmer

with hay.

Mohammad lobal teaches at Anantnag. Carving a weighing scale, the symbol for Libra, he shared, "I love being here. I haven't seen such a large collection of sculptures anywhere else.'

Devi Das Khattri, who is with the Lalit Kala Akademi, Garhi, Delhi, was busy making a goat as he was assigned the Capricorn sign. Surakala Appalaraju, from Andhra Pradesh, was seen painstakingly carving a bull for Tauras. Not ready to waste any of the heavy stone, he was making a robust figure.

Abhishek Singh also freelances at Garhi. Working on the symbol Sagittarius, half-human, half- horse, he did Masters from GCA-10. He fondly recalled, "College ka mahaul bahut acha

Alay Mistry from Ahmedabad was chopping off a bulky stone. The theme assigned to him was Pisces. He was scraping a stone to carve lean meen (fish). Rajender Kumar was making a woman for the sign Virgo. While he was enjoying the workshop with fellow sculptures, he was on a deputation at Burail Jail, an experience he spoke highly of. "Mostly, I worked with undertrials there. Their zeal to learn was unparalleled amd I enjoyed the stint."

Tsering Gurmet from Ladakh was busy shaping a big block for his sign — Scorpio. Hugely inspired by Leonardo's horse, Gurmet shared, "We have bustling art scene in Ladakh. While art there has largely been religious and traditional, we, the first generation of sculptors, are getting a huge response."

Aquarian Shubham Santosh Salve from Maharashtra had the Aquarian sign to chisel. While most of the artists were noncommittal to zodiac concepts, Salve seemed to have happily embraced it. Keenly displaying his sculpture — a water bearer — he said, "Aquarians are eager to spread knowledge just like the

flowing water in their symbol." Away from this din was Jagdeep Jolly. He was seen putting all the symbols in a circle in fiberglass. Having studied from the Delhi College of Art, he teaches at Chandigarh.

The petition in a New York court on Monday by the rapper's company Frozen Moments LLC demands the preservation and divulgence of information that might be evidence in a potential lawsuit against the streaming giant Spotify and UMG, which is the distributor for the record labels of both Drake and Lamar.

In allegations that UMG calls "offensive and untrue," the filing says that UMG "launched a campaign to manipulate and

saturate the streaming services and airwaves with a song, 'Not Like Us,' in order to make that song go viral, including by using bots' and pay-to-play agreements." It said the company and Spotify "have a long-standing, symbiotic business relationship" and alleges that UMG offered special licensing rates to Spotify for the song. The petition also says UMG has fired employees seen as loyal to Drake "in an apparent effort to conceal its schemes."

Universal Music Group said in a statement in response that the "suggestion that UMG would do anything to undermine any of its artists is offensive and untrue. We employ the highest ethical practices in our marketing and promotional campaigns. No amount of contrived and absurd legal argu-



ments in this pre-action submission can mask the fact that fans choose the music they want to hear."

'Not Like Us', the wildly popular Lamar single released in May as part of a flurry of duelling tracks by the two artists, includes the lyrics, "Say, Drake, I hear you like 'em young, You better not ever go to cell block one." It has gotten more than 900 million plays, according to figures listed on Spotify.

Spotify representatives declined immediate comment, but in a statement on a previous case the company said it "invests heavily in automated and manual reviews to prevent, detect, and mitigate the impact of artificial streaming on our platform," and in broader public statements has said it has gone to great lengths to mitigate the effects

of bad actors on streaming numbers and royalties.

The feud between Drake, a 38-year-old Canadian rapper and singer and five-time Grammy winner; and Lamar, a 37-year-old Pulitzer Prize winner who is set to headline the next Super Bowl halftime, is among the biggest in hip-hop in recent years, with two of the genre's biggest stars at its centre.

The two were occasional collaborators more than a decade ago, but Lamar began taking public jabs at Drake starting in 2013. The fight escalated steeply earlier this year. The move to court, while not yet a lawsuit, still represents a major escalation of the feud and involves some of the biggest business partners of both men.

The governor asked Shinde to act as a caretaker chief minister till the new CM is sworn in, as suspense continues over who would be the ruling Mahayuti coalition's choice for the post following its landslide victory.

Shinde was accompanied by deputy Chief Ministers Devendra Fadnavis and Ajit Pawar as he visited the Raj Bhavan.

The term of the outgoing

Deepak Kesarkar, who served as a minister in the Eknath Shinde cabinet, told reporters, "The chief minister has tendered

his resignation.

Despite the Mahayuti alliance of the BJP, Shinde-led Shiv Sena and Ajit Pawar's NCP securing a massive victory, winning 230 seats in the 288-member assembly, consensus has eluded the ruling combine's leaders so far on who should be the next CM.

When asked who will be the next CM, Kesarkar said, "Every political worker desires that the CM should from his or her party, but whatever decision Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah take will be acceptable to all of us."

"Shinde has told the senior leaders (apparent reference to Modi and Shah) that whatever decision they take is acceptable to him," the Shiv Sena leader added.

Four women dead as explosion wrecks three houses in MP's Morena



MORENA, Nov 26 (Agencies): Four women died and five others were injured after an explosion caused three houses to collapse in Madhya Pradesh's Morena city, police said on Tuesday.

The incident took place in the city's Rathore Colony area around midnight, said Superintendent of Police Sameer Saurabh.

The body of one of the deceased women was still being extricated from under the debris, he said.

Vasudev Rathore, whose house was destroyed in the explosion and whose 28-year-old daughter-in-law was among the deceased, expressed suspicion that the blast was caused by gunpowder.

LPG cylinders were found intact during the removal of debris, he told reporters.

Sub Divisional Magistrate Bhupendra Singh Kushwaha said the reason behind the blast was yet not clear.

A Forensic Science Laboratory team will be able to ascertain whether it was gunpowder or a gas cylinder that exploded, he added.

The injured persons were sent to Gwalior for further treatment, said a doctor at the Morena district hospital.

Donald Trump's Re-election sparks a healthcare shift in reproductive choices

WASHINGTON, Nov 26 (Agencies): Donald Trump's re-election has unleashed a wave of uncertainty, sparking changes in reproductive healthcare decisions across the country. His administration's anti-abortion policies, coupled with the overturning of Roe v. Wade, have reignited fears amongst young adults and parents about the future of women's reproductive rights. Concerns over rising teenage pregnancies and restricted access to abortion dominate public conversations.

The impact is visible in healthcare trends. Planned Parenthood has reported a 1,200% surge in vasectomy appointments just days after the election. Appointments for IUDs have jumped 760%, while birth control implants rose by 350%. Emergency contraception sales are at an all-time high, with a staggering 1,000% increase in demand. Pharmacies and clinics are scrambling to meet the surge, some facing critical shortages of emergency contraception and other reproductive health supplies.

Men are playing a larger role in contraception, as options like vasectomies gain traction. Social media campaigns, under hashtags like #SnipResponsibly and #VasectomyNow, encourage male responsibility

Nepal says no loan pact will be signed during PM Oli's visit to Beijing



KATHMANDU, Nov 26 (Agencies): Nepal Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli, who is set to embark on a five-day visit to China on December 2, has stressed that no agreement on loan would be reached with Beijing during his upcoming tour. The development came amid reports of disagreement with Nepal's ruling coalition about signing Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) projects with loan components.

Mr Oli, during recent a meeting with former PMs and foreign ministers, claimed the BRI deal signed with China was not a loan-based agreement and there was no need to discuss now whether or not to seek a loan from Beijing.

"We take loans or grants based on our national interests as and when we need them from any country or agency. We should not be swayed by the baseless rumour that a loan is being taken to entrap the country." Mr Oli clarified

country," Mr Oli clarified.
"Irrespective of the country we chose for our first visit, we keep sovereignty, independence and freedom as well as national welfare along with global welfare in top priority," he said.

Mr Oli's remarks came amid speculations that Nepali Congress, led by Sher Bahadur Deuba, favours grants from China under BRI while the priority of Nepali Prime Minister's Communist Party of Nepal-Unified Marxist Leninist (CPN-UML) is to seek loans under the arrangement.

KP Oli's China Visit
In a departure from

the tradition of Nepal's newly elected leaders visiting India first, which was seen as a nod to the close ties between Kathmandu and New Delhi, PM Oli chose China for his maiden visit since taking office. The Prime Minister's office justified the move saying the visit to Beijing was fixed recently, and that New Delhi has not extended an invitation to Mr Oli thus far.

However, Mr Oli is known for his pro-China stance. On multiple occasions over the past decade, Mr Oli and his CPN-UML have advocated for closer ties with China. In 2016, Mr Oli made his maiden visit to China as Prime Minister. Soon after, his administration sought to improve cross-border railroad connectivity, infrastructure development, trade, investment and tourism cooperation with China under the framework of the Belt and Road Initiative.

However, the agreement signed in 2017, is yet to be finalised, as China and Nepal have been unable to negotiate a loan under the BRI despite intense efforts from Beijing.

Russia sets new drone attack record in overnight Ukraine barrage

KYIV, Nov 26 (Agencies): Russia launched a record-high 188 strike drones into Ukraine on Monday night and Tuesday morning, expanding its long-range campaign against Ukrainian infrastructure to coincide with the onset of winter.

Ukraine's air force said on Telegram that it downed 76 drones. Another 95 were lost in flight -- possibly due to jamming efforts -- and five flew into Belarus.

Russia also fired four Iskander-M ballistic missiles as part of the assault, the air force said. None were shot down

"Unfortunately, critical infrastructure objects have been hit, and private and multiapartment buildings have been damaged in several regions due to a mass attack by UAVs,"

the air force wrote.
Recent weeks have



seen a clear intensification of Russian drone and missile strikes on Ukraine, with the scale and regularity of such attacks on the rise. The previous largest attack of 145 drones occurred on Nov. 10.

As in previous winters, Russia is attacking critical energy infrastructure in a bid to deny Ukrainians power and warmth through the coming freezing months. Temperatures in Ukraine have already fallen below freezing and will

remain low until early spring.

Monday night's drone attack damaged energy infrastructure in the western city of Ternopil, Serhii Nadal -- the head of the local regional defense body -- said on Telegram.

Russia's Defense Ministry, meanwhile, reported the downing of at least 39 Ukrainian drones over multiple Russian regions on Monday night. The ministry reported no damage or casualties.

Imran Khan supporters breach lockdown in Pakistani capital, at least six people killed in violence

ISLAMABAD, Nov 26 (Agencies): Supporters seeking the release of imprisoned Pakistani former premier Imran Khan on Tuesday broke through a ring of shipping containers locking down the capital Islamabad, while at least six people have died in protest-related violence. Protesters battled security forces and ignored a government threat to respond with gunfire.

The dead included four members of the security services and one civilian who were killed when a vehicle rammed them on a street. Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif denounced the attack on Tuesday, saying an "anarchist group" was deliberately targeting law enforcement personnel. There were no claims of responsibility for the ramming. A police officer died in a separate incident.

Shortly after midnight, Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi threatened security forces would respond with live fire if protesters fired weapons at them.

"If they again fire bullets, the bullet will be responded with the bullet," he said.

Police used tear gas to try and disperse the crowds. Scores of people more have been injured,



including journalists who were attacked by Khan supporters. Dozens of Khan supporters beat a videographer covering the protest for The Associated Press and took his camera. He sustained head injuries and was being treated in a hospital.

Pakistani media have mostly stopped filming and photographing the rally, instead focusing on the security measures and the city's deserted streets.

Khan, who has been in jail for over a year and faces more than 150 criminal cases, remains popular. His party, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf, or PTI, says the cases are politically motivated.
Authorities say only courts can order the release of Khan, who was ousted in 2022 through a no-confidence vote in Parliament. He has been imprisoned since his first conviction in a graft case, in August 2023, and

has been sentenced in several

cases.

Khan's supporters were around 10 km (6.2 miles) from their destination, the city's Red Zone that houses key government buildings. Naqvi said Khan's party rejected a government offer to rally on the outskirts of the city.

Khan's wife Bushra Bibi, who is

leading the protest, told people to keep marching toward the Red Zone peacefully. She said another plan of action would be conveyed to protesters if Khan was not released. She also urged the government not to harm the demonstrators.

In a bid to foil the protest, police arrested more than 4,000 Khan supporters since Friday and suspended mobile and internet services in some parts of the country. On Thursday, a court prohibited rallies in the capital and Naqvi said anyone violating the ban would be arrested.

Travel between Islamabad and other cities has become nearly impossible because of shipping containers blocking the roads. All educational institutions remain closed. Mobile internet services and messaging platforms are experiencing severe disruption in the capital.

The PTI relies heavily on social media to demand his release and uses messaging platforms like WhatsApp to share information, including details of events. The X platform, which is banned in Pakistan, is no longer accessible even with a VPN.

The violence comes during an official visit by Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko.

Hong Kong's top court rules in favor of equal inheritance and housing benefits for same-sex couples HONG KONG, Nov 26 have traditionally had On the inheritance and on the inheritance

HONG KONG, Nov 26 (Agencies): Hong Kong's top court on Tuesday upheld earlier rulings that favored subsidized housing benefits and equal inheritance rights for same-sex married couples, in a landmark victory for the city's LGBTQ+ community.

The Court of Final Appeal's dismissal of the government's appeals ended some yearslong legal battles over the differential treatment facing samesex couples married overseas under Hong Kong's Housing Authority policies and two inheritance laws.

The unanimous decisions are expected to have a far-reaching impact on the lives of same-sex couples, who

fewer rights compared to their heterosexual counterparts in the global financial hub. Chief Justice Andrew

Cheung said in his judgement that exclusionary housing policies were argued to be beneficial to oppositesex married couples because they increase the supply of subsidized housing for them and thereby support the institution of traditional families.

But Cheung said authorities failed to provide evidence showing the potential impact on opposite-sex couples if those policies were relaxed.

"The challenged policies cannot be justified," he wrote.

On the inheritance laws, judges Roberto Ribeiro and Joseph Fok ruled that the disputed provisions are "discriminatory and unconstitutional" in their written judgement.

Hong Kong does not recognize same-sex marriage, prompting some couples to marry elsewhere.

Currently, the city only recognizes same-sex marriage for certain purposes such as taxation, civil service benefits and dependent visas. Many of the government's concessions were won through legal challenges, and the city has seen a growing social acceptance toward same-sex marriage.

In September 2023, the top court ruled that



the government should provide a framework for recognizing same-sex partnerships. This ruling, along with other successful legal challenges brought by members of the LGBTQ+ community, made Hong Kong the only place in China to grant such recognition for same-sex couples

for same-sex couples.

In separate judge-ments handed down in

2020 and 2021, a lower court had ruled that the housing policies involved in Tuesday's cases violated the constitutional right to equality, and that excluding same-sex spouses from inheritance law benefits constituted unlawful discrimination.

The government had challenged these decisions at the Court of

Appeal but subsequently lost in October 2023. It then took the cases to the top court.

Nick Infinger, who first launched a judicial review against the Housing Authority in 2018, told reporters that Tuesday's rulings "acknowledged samesex couples can love each other and deserve to live together."

"This is not only fighting for me, for my partner, but this is fighting for all the same-sex couples in Hong Kong," he said outside the court build-

Hong Kong Marriage Equality, a non-governmental organization, said in a statement that the judges' decisions made it clear that discrimination and differential treatment on the grounds of sexual orientation violate human dignity and equality. It called on the government to immediately end the exclusion of samesex couples from marriage.

The top court's rulings also concluded a long legal journey taken by Henry Li and his late partner, Edgar Ng. After they married in Britain in 2017, Ng bought a subsidized flat as his matrimonial home with Li.

The Housing Authority, however, said Li could not be added as an authorized occupant of the flat in the capacity of Ng's family member because same-sex married partners do not fall within its definition of "spouse." Ng was also

concerned that if he died intestate, his proprieties would not be passed to Li, the court heard.

Ng died in 2020 after suffering years of depression.

After the rulings, Li posted a message on his Facebook page, saying that although he has lived in pain in the absence of Ng, he has not given up his husband's aspiration to pursue equality.

"Without you by my side, the arguments of the government and the Housing Authority in the cases seemed to become more cruel, causing me even more distress," he wrote to Ng in the message. "Our cases have finally reached their conclusion."

US goalkeeper Alyssa Naeher announces her retirement from international football

WASHINGTON, Nov 26 (Agencies): US women's national team goalkeeper Alyssa Naeher, announced her retirement from international football, after a career spanning of 15 years.

Naeher was on the team's roster for a pair of upcoming matches in Europe but those games will be her last after a full 11 years playing for the United States.

Naeher was the starting goalkeeper for the U.S. team that won the Women's World Cup in 2019 and the gold medal at this year's Olympics in France.

She's the only U.S. goalkeeper to earn a shutout in both a World Cup and an Olympic final.

She made a key one-handed save in stoppage time to preserve the Americans' 1-0 victory over Brazil in the Olympic final.

Mallory Swanson, who scored the only goal, ran down the length of the field to embrace Naeher at the final whistle.

"Every tear shed in the challenging times and disappointments made every smile and celebration in the moments of success that much more joyful. This has been a special team to be a part of and I am beyond proud of what we have achieved both on and off the field. The

memories I have made over the years will last me a lifetime," she wrote on X. Naeher has been known throughout her career for her calm and steady lead-

She is one of just three goalkeepers to make more than 100 appearances for the United States.

Naeher made her debut with the national team in 2014 and was a backup to Hope Solo at the 2015 World Cup, were the United States won.

She became the team's regular starter following the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympics and was on the squad that repeated as World Cup winners in 2019.

In her career, Naeher has appeared in 113 games with 110 starts, 88 wins and 68 shutouts.

She had four shutouts throughout the Olympic tournament in France.

The 36-year-old has also played for the Chicago Red Stars in the National Women's Soccer League since 2016. She is set to play for Chicago next

AUS vs IND: Coach Gautam Gambhir to return from Australia for family emergency

PERTH. Nov 26 (Agencies): India head coach Gautam Gambhir is set to leave Australia in the middle of Border-Gavaskar Trophy due to a family emergency, India Today has learnt. Gambhir, who was at the helm of India's historic victory at the Optus Stadium in Perth, will however, return back before the second Test match, set to be hosted in Adelaide.

Sources in the know confirmed India Today about the development hours after India's win in the first Test match of the series. India went 1-0 up in the 5-match series with a 295-run win in Perth, as they make a late push for the World Test Championship final spots.



The Indian team is set to travel to Canberra on Wednesday for a two-day pink-ball tour game. However, Gautam Gambhir will not be part of the squad for this practice match, which is scheduled to begin on Saturday. The team is preparing for the daynight Test in Adelaide, which is expected to be

Indian team are expected to have a selection headache for the 2nd Test match as Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill return to the playing XI. On Day 4 of the series opener against Australia, Rohit Sharma was seen sit-

ting alongside Gambhir in the Indian dressing room. Rohit was also spotted practicing with the pink ball in the nets on Monday, working on his skills ahead of the crucial clash in Adelaide.

Earlier, Jasprit Bumrah led a spirited group of Indian cricketers to a commanding Test victory on Australian soil, securing a massive win by 295 runs. This remarkable turnaround is sure to be remembered as one of the golden moments in Indian cricket history. As stand-in skipper, Bumrah set the tone with an exceptional match haul of 8/72, helping India dismiss the hosts, chasing a monumental target of 534, for just 238 runs in 58.4 overs on the fourth afternoon of the opening Test of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. This triumph catapulted India to the top of the World Test Championship standings, with a percentage point tally of 61.11.

Credit must also be given to head coach Gautam Gambhir, who faced significant criticism after India's defeat to the Black Caps. Many believed that young talents Reddy and Harshit were handed Test debuts at his insistence. Under the Perth sun, the usually stoic Gambhir managed a rare smile as Harshit and Nitish, following the plans laid out for them, played pivotal roles in the victory.

Australia to retain squad for Adelaide Test, Marsh's fitness will be monitored: McDonald

PERTH, Nov 26 (Agencies): Australia will not make any change to the squad that took a 295-run hammering from India in the opening Border-Gavaskar Trophy Test here but there are some fitness concerns over all-rounder Mitchell Marsh's ability to bowl, coach and selector Andrew McDonald has said

Following the crushing loss, McDonald revealed that the team would land in Adelaide for the day-night second Test beginning December 6 earlier than planned to allow an additional net session.

"The people in that change-room (for Perth Test) are the same people that will be in Adelaide," McDonald was quoted as saying by 'cricket.com.au'.

"It (making changes) is always a consideration, wherever you go in the world in terms of the personnel you pick for conditions." Marsh, who bowled just 17 overs in the first Test for a match haul of three wickets, has been dealing with "niggles" since the whiteball tour of England in September.

Skipper Pat Cummins has already revealed that Marsh finished the first Test "a little bit sore."

McDonald expressed satisfaction with Marsh's bowling performance in the first innings but said his fitness would be monitored closely moving forward.

"Has he (Marsh) pulled up okay? We'll wait and see," McDonald said.

"No, we didn't feel that (was a weakness). We knew that Mitch (Marsh) was slightly underdone coming in, but I thought the performance in the first innings was satisfactory." Another player under scanner is toporder batter Marnus Labuschagne, who has struggled for form with an average of just 13.66 in his last 10 Test innings.

However, McDonald said he has faith in Labuschagne's abilities, describing him as "the player we need" and urging him to rediscover his form. "That's an ongoing discussion and that ebbs and flows in players' careers, so at the moment he's in one of those patches and no doubt he'll be getting critiqued externally," McDonald said.

"But internally we're really confident that, at his best, he's the player that we need."
When asked if Labuschagne's struggles were due to a technical issue, McDonald

responded: "It's always a combination of

factors, isn't it, with the mindset?"

"There's some technical aspects to that also within the mindset play. So as I said, we're really confident that he can turn that around."

"We felt as though our planning going in (to Perth) was where we needed it to be. Execution in amongst that is always a question, but we were comfortable with the plans."
