Fire in MLA hostel building in Srinagar

SRINAGAR, Dec 10 (Agencies): A fire broke out in the MLA hostel here on Tuesday, causing damage to a few rooms in the building meant for housing legislators, officials said.

The blaze broke out in the first floor of the four-storey MLA hostel building near the M A Road area around noon, the officials said.

They said the fire engulfed three rooms on the first floor of the building causing some damage to them.

The fire was immediately brought under control by the Fire and **Emergency Services** personnel along with police personnel.

The cause of the fire is being ascertained.

Property of notorious drug peddler attached in **Anantnag: Police**

SRINAGAR, Dec 10 (Agencies): In a significant crackdown on drug trafficking, Anantnag Police on Tuesday attached a residential 50 lakhs belonging to a notorious drug peddler, Gh Hassan Bandro, alias Qasim, son of Wali Mohammad, a resident of Sotkipora.

This action, according to officials was carried out by Police Station Srigufwara as part of the ongoing intensified efforts to combat the

drug menace.

The accused, a habitual offender, has a history of involvement in drug trafficking and is implicated in multiple cases under the NDPS Act, including FIR Nos. 04/2014 and 74/2021 at Police Station Srigufwara. These cases highlight his repeated attempts to undermine societal well-being through illegal activities, officials said.

Cyber crimes, climate change new threats to human rights: President

NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): The human rights discourse so far has been centred on the "human agency" as the violator is assumed to be a human but with Al entering our lives, the "culprit could be a nonhuman" but an intelligent agent. President Droupadi Murmu said on Tuesday. In her address at an

event hosted by the NHRC here to mark the Human Rights Day, the President also underlined that cyber crimes and climate change are "new threats" to human rights.

Human Rights Day is observed on December 10 every year to commemorate the Universal Declaration of Human



Rights (UDHR), which was adopted and proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948.

The UDHR serves as a global benchmark for the protection and promotion of human rights.

"As we progress into the future, we are confronted with emerging challenges. Cyber crimes and climate change are new threats to human rights," Murmu

The digital era, while being transformative, had brought with it complex issues such as cyber bullying, deep fake, privacy concerns and spread of misinformation, she added.

"These challenges underscore the importance of fostering a safe, secure and equitable digital environment that protect the rights and dignity of every individual," the President said. In her address, she also touched upon the

impact on human lives. "Artificial intelligence has now entered our day-to-day life, solving many problems, and creating several new

Opposition MPs protest on Adani issue in Parliament Premises with black 'Jholas'



NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): Several Opposition MPs on Tuesday demonstrated over the Adani issue in Parliament premises, carrying black 'jholas' (bags) with caricatures of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and billionaire Gautam Adani printed on it and 'Modi Adani Bhai Bhai' written on the obverse side.

This is the latest in the series of unusual protests led by the Congress daily ahead of the sitting of Parliament in the morning

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi. Congress gen-

eral secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, MPs from the Congress, DMK, JMM, Left, among others, protested in front of the Makar Dwar steps.

They were carrying black 'jholas' with caricatures of Modi and Adani printed on one side and 'Modi Adani Bhai Bhai' written on the obverse side of the bag. They raised slogans

against alleged collusion between Modi and Adani and demanded a Joint Parliamentary Committee probe into the matter.

Earlier, Gandhi chaired a meeting of Congress MPs in the Lok Sabha to take stock of the party's stance on various issues and the way forward in Parliament.

The protest comes a day after leaders of some INDIA bloc parties protested in Parliament complex over the Adani row, with Rahul Gandhi conducting a mock 'interview' over the issue with Congress members wearing masks of Prime Minister Modi and industrialist Gautam Adani.

SM Krishna, former Karnataka CM and Maharashtra Governor, Dies at 92 BENGALURU, Dec Somanahalli Mallaiah

10 (Agencies): Former **External Affairs Minister** and Karnataka Chief Minister S M Krishna died at his residence early Tuesday morning.

The 92-year-old veteran politician was ailing for quite some time, a family source said.

"S M Krishna is no more. He breathed his last at 2:45 am at



his residence. Mortal remains are likely to be taken to Maddur today," the source said.

Krishna is survived by wife Prema and two daughters.

Born in Somanahalli in Karnataka's Mandva district on May 1, 1932, Somanahalli Mallaiah Krishna began his career in electoral politics in 1962 by winning the Maddur assembly seat as an independent. Turn to page 9

Actor Dharmendra summoned by Delhi court in cheating case

NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): A Delhi court has summoned veteran Bollywood actor Dharmendra and two others in a cheating case related to the Garam Dharam Dhaba franchise, according to the complainant's lawyer.

Judicial Magistrate Yashdeep Chahal passed the order against the 89-year-old actor on a complaint filed by Delhi businessman, Sushil Kumar, who alleged that he was lured into investing in the franchise, the lawyer D D Pandey said.

The evidence on record prima facie indicates that the accused persons induced the complainant in furtherance of their common intent and the ingredients of offence of cheating are duly disclosed, the judge said in the order passed on December 5.

The Judge said there was prima facie case of cheating and criminal conspiracy and directed the accused persons to appear before the court on February 20. The Judge noted

that the documents

on record pertained to Garam Dharam Dhaba and letter of intent also had logo of the said restaurant. It is fairly apparent that

transaction between the parties pertains to Garam Dharam Dhaba and was being pursued by the co-accused on behalf of accused Dharam Singh Deol, the court noted.

According to the complaint, in April 2018, the co-accused had approached him on behalf of Dharam Singh ■Turn to page 9



JKMEF delegation meets Dy CM, discusses health employees' issues

JAMMU, Dec 10: A delegation from the Jammu Kashmir Medical Employees Federation (JKMEF) led by President Sh. Sushil Sudan, recently met with the Deputy Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir to address pressing concerns of health employees in the Jammu Province. The delegation submitted a memorandum outlining several critical issues affecting their workforce and sought the government's intervention for timely resolution.

One of the primary issues discussed was the pending salaries of employees under the 2211 Major Head. Despite the State Administrative Council's decision (No. 63/05/204, dated 7/6/2024) approving regular salaries and



the subsequent release of □5558.75 lakh under Govt Order No. 460 JK (HME) of 2024 dated 10/7/2024, these employees have not received their wages for the past six months, leaving them on the brink of financial hardship.

The delegation also raised the demand for upgrading the designation of pharmacists to "Pharmacy Officer," in line with similar changes implemented by the Central Government. They emphasized the crucial role pharmacists play in the healthcare system, serving at every level from sub-centers to district hospitals and medical colleges.

Another significant issue brought to attention was the non-release of COVID-19 incentives, which were announced by the Lt. Govamounting to Rs 10,000 for doctors, Rs 7.000 for paramedical staff, and Rs 5,000 for drivers and Class IV employees, have been disbursed in GMC Jammu and associated hospitals but remain unpaid to other health department employ-The reorganization of

the electrician cadre in the health department, as per the norms of the Medical Education Department, was another concern raised. Additionally, the delegation advocated for the inclusion of all health department employees and pensioners under Central Government Health Schemes, citing the paramount importance of health security for employ-

The delegation also urged the government to

formulate a policy for the regularization of contractual staff working under NHM, HDF, RNTCP, and similar schemes, to provide job stability and long-term security for these workers.

The Deputy Chief Minister attentively listened to the delegation's concerns and assured that their demands would be addressed promptly.

Climate Change-Challenges and Responses

The Declaration was proclaimed by the United Nations general Assembly in Paris on 10th of December 1948 and sets out ,for the first time ,fundamental human rights to be universally accepted and. protected .Human Rights Day on December 10 , commemorates the adoption of the universal declaration of Human Rights in 1948. Human Rights Day is celebrated every year on December 10 to remember the day in 1948 when the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was ratified by the UN General Assembly .On this important day ,the world is reminded of the fundamental freedoms and rights to which every person is entitled ,regardless of nationality ,ethnicity ,religion or any other distinction .On this occasion ,all stakeholders in the national and international community are reminded and given an opportunity to reflect on their past and future actions and responsi-

bilities and to strive for the promotion and protection of human rights .On this human rights Day ,let us reflect on the fundamental importance of human rights for every individual and use them as a daily guide to pursue justice, equality ,peace and freedom for all .Like the other parts of the world as well as the UNO, India is also celebrating the world human rights day with fanfare and enthusiasm .The Indian constitution guarantees its citizens the fundamental rights which are more or less similar to the human rights declarations of UN .In this connection various programs ,workshops, symposiums, debates and discussions are organized by the educational institutions as well by the different departments of the government of India and Jammu and Kashmir .The main aim is to aware the citizens of their freedoms and rights as guaranteed by the UNO and by the constitution of India .Every year there is a theme of the international human rights day and in 2024 the theme is "Our Rights,Our Future, Right Now' 'In the decades since the ratification of the UDHR, the human rights have become more widely recognized and protected around the world .The declaration has served as the corner stone for a system of human rights protection ,that is growing and reaching out to more vulnerable populations, including migrants, indigenous peoples and persons with disabilities .As already pointed at the outset ,the Universal Declarations of Human Rights was ratified by the UN General Assembly on this day in 1948, known as Human Rights Day .Human Rights Day was formally established in 1950 when the Assembly adopted resolution 423 (V) designating December 10 as an annual day of observance of human rights. The UDHR, though not legally binding has inspired over 60 human rights instruments, creating an international framework for the protection and promotion of human rights . This docu-

ment, comprising 30 articles, served as a landmark commitment to safeguarding the inherent dignity and equal rights of all human beings. The aftermath of world war two underscored the need for a global commitment to human rights .The UNHR emerged as a beacon of hope and justice ,emphasizing that human rights are not privilege but a universal entitlement .The UDHR, with its compressive articulation of fundamental rights and freedoms, serves as a compass guiding nations towards meeting the basic needs of their citizens ,whether they be of a socioeconomic or political nature .In India ,the National Human Rights Commission has organized a programme at Bharat Mandapam ,New Delhi ,on December 10,2023, at 10 am. The Vice President of India Jagdeep Dhankhar war the chief guest and he delivered an important speech on this occasion highlighting the importance of human rights and their constitutional safeguards .Various dignitaries, including NHRC Chairperson Justice Arun Mishra, and representatives from diplomatic circles ,civil society members ,academia ,NGO's and human right defenders and activists attended the function to mark the human rights day .This year is the 75th year of the adoption of human rights by UNGA and the 75 years journey of this landmark document has been overwhelmingly endorsed by all member countries of the united nations . Recently a conference of National Human Rights institutions of Asia Pacific was successfully hosted by NHRC ,India in New Delhi ,also reaffirmed its Delhi Declaration ,the enduring importance of UDHR .It has guided the drafting of the Paris Principles ,as a yardstick for setting up NHRI's worldwide for promoting and safeguarding human rights by engaging with diverse stakeholders, including governments, in the formulation of human rights centered policies and legislations. The day for the

national Human Rights Commission ,NHRC, India serves as an opportunity and a reminder for all stakeholders in the national and international community to reflect on their past and future actions and responsibilities and to work towards the promotion and protection of human rights to ensure 'Freedoms ,Equality and Justice for all ,which is also the theme of human rights day this year .In India NHRC has been working continuously to safeguard civil, political ,economic ,social and cultural rights of the people since its inception. The commission has also contributed in raising awareness among public officials and civil society on various human right issues and promoting a human rights -centered approach in policies and programmes through its various initiatives and activities .During the last one year from 1st December ,2022 to 30th November 2023, the commission registered 80,376 cases ,including 117 cases of suo motu cognizance .In India there is much awareness of the Human rights as the government ,NGO's ,NHRC and human right activists and organizations are making efforts to aware the citizens about the importance of human rights .It is because of this awareness that there is very little human right violations and wherever there is some violations of the human rights ,the human rights watchdog comes to the rescue of the affected people and makes the violators to correct the situation so that human rights are protected and promoted .In India very year December 10 is celebrated every year with gaiety as the pious occasion to ensure ,promote and protect the human dignity and human freedoms and rights.

Assad's exit an inflection point: Stability or chaos?

he 24-year-old government of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad was ousted on Sunday, December 8, as rebel forces from southern Syria swamped the capital, Damascus, ahead of the main rebel thrust from the north. The sudden collapse of the Syrian military and the Ba'athist regime surprised most of the world, including the United States, which has at least 900 soldiers in northeast Syria, ostensibly to monitor Daesh, or the Islamic State.

The rebel operation began on November 27 as local retaliation and then extended to Aleppo, Syria's second largest city. That fell two days later, followed by Hama on December 5 and the third largest city Homs on December 7. A day later, the capital Damascus was "freed". Why did Syria's military and then its foreign allies, such as Russia and Iran, let this happen? Russia is distracted and even weakened by its misadventure in Ukraine. The Iranian ability was compromised by Israel's relentless attack on Hezbollah, the decapitation of its top leadership and that of Iran's Quds Force, which was training and equipping the militias of non-Arab Shias, including from Pakistan. The rapid collapse of the Syrian National Army is comparable to that of the US-trained and equipped Afghan National Army when the Americans prepared to pull out of Afghanistan just over three years ago. Both cases demonstrated that once external support weakens, then the morale of any indigenous Army units, sensing lack of support or even animus amongst the local population, begins to crack. The Assad family managed to rule for 50 years, despite belonging to the Alawite-Shia community

constituting just 10 per cent of the population, by repressive measures and brutal authoritarian control.

Mr Assad earlier faced displacement once the Arab Spring, a street-level popular uprisings in the Arab world which began in Tunisia and overthrew authoritarian rulers in Egypt and Libya, hit Syria in 2011. But Iran and Russia had helped to stabilise his government. Thus unsurprisingly, according to a BBC report, Bashar al-Assad and his family have got asylum in Russia. Meanwhile, the fate remains uncertain of the Russian naval base at Tartus as well as an airbase. Both these facilities had allowed Russia to support their militias in Africa and project Russian influence and presence across West Asia and the eastern Mediterranean. Both facilities being west of a mountain chain appear to be safe for now. Though reportedly Russia has begun withdrawing its helicopters and moved ships out of the port, ostensibly for an exercise.

The rebel coalition's main component is Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS), led by Abu Mohammad al-Jilani. They controlled till now a small area around Idlib. Al-Jilani formed the Nusra Front during the early phase of the Syrian civil war but claims to have left the Islamic State, or Daesh, in 2016. Reportedly, HTS' rule in Idlib was authoritarian, conservative and intolerant of dissent, though it left the minorities alone. His latest statements preach tolerance and coexistence. Only time will tell if he maintains that, but the multi-ethnic and diverse nature of the Syrian population practising multiple faiths can only be handled either, like the Assads, by authoritarian secularism, or via tolerant democracy. Egypt provides an example.

After President Hosni Mubarak's

ouster following the popular protests in 2011, an election led to a Muslim Brotherhood Islamist government. Soon popular resentment arose over its attempt to impose an Islamic framework, which in turn allowed the military to execute another coup and seize power. According to the CIA World Factbook, the Syrian population is 87 per cent Muslim, of which 74 per cent are Sunnis. The rest are Shias, dominated by the Alawis, besides some Ismailis. Christians are estimated to be 10 per cent, mostly Greek Orthodox or Catholic. The rebels were quoted claiming that "the future is ours". However, Syria's neighbours and global leaders have voiced concern. US President Joe Biden has cautioned about the resurgence of the Islamic State or Daesh. Germany expressed relief over Mr Assad's ouster but also warned about the ascent of disruptive Islamist elements. France, diplomatic as always, simply advocated a peaceful transition. Iran cautiously suggests that decision-making must be "solely the responsibility" of Syrians. Jordan's King Abdullah II appeared to be supporting the rebels, hoping to keep the lines of communication open. The challenge for HTS would be to keep the disparate rebel components united. The first challenge would be the Kurdish People's Defence Units, called YPG, with about 70,000 fighters. They played an important role, with US help, to eliminate ISIS' control. Turkey and Qatar characterise them as a terrorist organisation. Turkey and Iran fear their links to their own substantial Kurdish populations, especially Turkey's PKK. Kurds are an Iranic ethnic group scattered amongst Iran, Iraq, Turkey and Syria. They number around 40 million, ranging from 14.3-20 million in Turkey, 8.2-12 million

in Iran, 5.6-8.5 million in Iraq and 2-3.6 million in Syria. Even in Germany, they are 1.2-1.5 million. US President-elect Donald Trump has voiced happiness over Mr Assad's ouster but strongly urged a hands-off policy regarding Syria. Does that mean that the United States will abandon the Syrian Kurds as they did Afghan allies earlier? One obvious lesson is that Israel's blitzkrieg to weaken both the Hezbollah and Iranian influence in West Asia created a vacuum which the Syrian rebels have quickly exploited. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu now voices concern over the next regime in Damascus. Israel's military has also acted to seize the Golan Heights' areas vacated by the Syrian Army. A secular regime run by Bashar al-Assad, despite allowing Iran land access to Hezbollah, provided more regional stability than a ruling group with past links to the Islamic State and unknown future propensities. The immediate gain for Turkey and Lebanon is that Syrian refugees have begun trickling back into Syria. Syria's Prime Minister Mohammad Ghazi al-Jalali, who refused to abandon his post, has offered to assist in the transition. If an orderly transition occurs and the new rulers quickly establish control without getting diverted by revenge against members of the Assad regime, gradually stability may be restored. The region is thus at an inflection point, with either revived Islamic radicalism spilling across the region and beyond or a new non-authoritarian model of multi-ethnic governance and growth. The latter is unlikely with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanvahu persisting with his genocidal activities or Donald Trump with his isolationist instincts.

There are 24 Ekadashis every year, but during Adhik Maas or Mal Maas, the number increases to 26.

The Ekadashi falling in the Shukla Paksha (waxing phase of the moon) of Margashirsha month is called Mokshada Ekadashi. On this subject, Mahant Rohit Shastri. Jvotishacharva and President of Shri Kailakh Jyotish avim Vedic sansthan Trust, explained that religious texts highly extol the significance of Mokshada Ekadashi. This year, the sunrise-based Ekadashi of Margashirsha Shukla Paksha will occur on Wednesday, December 11, making it the day of fasting

for Mokshada Ekadashi. According to religious

Vishnu on Ekadashi eradicates all sins. Observing the fast yields merit greater than performing Ashwamedha Yaina or undertaking holy pilgrimages. Mokshada Ekadashi is observed to pray for liberation (moksha).

After bathing in the morning, set up the idol or picture of Lord Lakshmi-Narayan on a clean platform in the prayer room or any pure space in the house.

Purify the platform and room with Ganga water or cow urine. Place a waterfilled silver, copper, or clay pitcher with a coconut on it as part of the Kalash Sthanana. Worship all the deities. Navagrahas (nine planets), Yoginis, and Nagar Devtas present in the Kalash. Then take a vow of fasting and perform the Shodashopachara (16-step) worship of Lord Lakshmi-Narayan along with all established deities using Vedic mantras and the Vishnu Sahas-

ranama. Offerings include: invocation, seating, water for washing feet, arghya, sipping water, bath, clothing, sacred thread, sandalwood paste, roli, turmeric, vermilion, durva grass, bilva leaves, ornaments, garlands, fragrant substances. incense, lamp, food, fruits betel leaves, sesame seeds. donation, aarti, circumambulation, and mantra flowers. Conclude the worship by reciting or listening to the fast's story and distributing prasad Chant "Om Namo Bhaga-

vate Vasudevava" 108 times. The fast can be observed either without food or with fruits. Fasting individuals

can consume fruits in the evening after worshiping Lord Vishnu. However, the fast concludes (Parana) on Dwadashi (the twelfth day). On the next day. Dwadashi, offer food and alms to a needy person or Brahmin. Avoid consuming tamasic foods on Ekadashi. Observe

celibacy and refrain from intoxicants such as alcohol. Those observing the fast should not cut their hair, nails, or beard during this time. Thousands take out rally against AFSPA, civilian killings in Manipur's Imphal

GUWAHATI, Dec 10 (Agencies): Thousands of people, largely women and students, took out a massive rally in the Manipur capital Imphal on Tuesday against the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) and civilian killings by "terrorists".

The rally, coinciding with the International Human Rights Day, was taken out from the Thau Ground and it culminated at the Khuman Lampak Stadium, 5 km away. Security was tightened to thwart any untoward incident.

The protest broke out a day after the state government had lifted the ban on mobile internet



services. Internet services were suspended on November 16 in the wake of fresh violence. Five organisations such as All Manipur United Clubs Organisation, Poirei Leimarol Apunba Meira Paibi, All Manipur Women's Voluntary Association, Committee on Human Rights and Manipur Students' Federation organised the rally.

People from various communities and also relief camp inmates took part in the rally. The protestors held placards with messages such as "Repeal AFSPA", "Do not obliterate Manipur", "Save

Manipur" etc.

The protestors told the media they would not relent till the repeal of AFSPA which gives sweeping powers to the armed forces to arrest, shoot, kill and occupy or destroy property that is likely to be used by insurgents.

"We stand opposed

denounce the killings of six innocent women and children by the Kuki militants," a protestor said.

The killings of the six civilians from Jiribam district had triggered widespread protests in the Imphal valley last month, during which irate mobs torched and attacked the houses and properties of several legislators, including ministers.

AFSPA was reimposed in six police station jurisdictions of the Imphal Valley last month much to the chagrin of the valley residents. Later, the MLAs of ruling NDA parties met and resolved to urge the central government to consider repealing it.

Mumbai BEST bus crash: Death toll climbs to 7; experts examine vehicle

42 injured; Maharashtra CM Fadnavis announces financial assistance of Rs 5 lakh to kin of each of the deceased

MUMBAI, Dec 10 (Agencies): The death toll in the BEST bus accident in Mumbai has risen to seven, officials on Tuesday said as experts inspected the wet leased vehicle to ascertain if it had any mechanical fault.

As many as 42 other persons were also rushed to various hospitals after being injured in the incident on the SG Barve Marg in Kurla (West) at around 9.30 pm on Monday when the bus dashed into pedestrians and some vehicles after its driver lost control over the wheels, they said.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Tuesday expressed deep sorrow over the loss of lives in the incident and prayed for the speedy recovery of the injured persons.

In a message on X, Fadnavis announced a financial assistance of Rs 5 lakh to the kin of each of the deceased from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

The medical expenses of the injured will be covered by the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation and the Brihanmumbai Electric Supply and Transport (BEST) undertaking, he said.

"We stand with the families of those who lost their lives in this unfortunate incident. I pray for the speedy recovery of the injured," the CM said.

Necessary instructions had been issued to ensure the victims and their families receive prompt assistance, he assured.

The BEST bus, after ploughing through pedestrians and vehicles, entered into a residential society, Buddha Colony, and came to a halt, the officials said.

Three deaths were reported on Monday. A civic official on Tuesday said the death toll in the incident has gone up to

The official said a total of 49 persons were rushed to various hospitals after the accident. Of them, 35 were taken to the civic-run Bhabha Hospital in Kurla. Two of them were brought dead, while two others were declared dead after admission at the medical facility, the official said.

Later, six injured persons were shifted from the Bhabha Hospital to Sion Hospital where one of them died during treatment.

Out of the total 49



injured, three were rushed to the private Kohinoor Hospital nearby where one person was declared dead, while the condition of the other two was reported to be critical.

Six other injured persons were taken to the private Habib Hospital where one of them was declared dead while the others were undergoing treatment.

Four police personnel were also injured in the accident. They were admitted to the civic-run Seven Hills Hospital and their condition was stable

Besides, a 35-year-old man was admitted to the private City Hospital in Kurla, the official said.

Police took the bus driver, Sanjay More, into custody after the incident and he was booked on charges of culpable homicide not amounting to murder, as per officials.

trol over the wheels. A BEST official said the bus suffered extensive damage on its front portion and windscreen and some window glasses were also shattered in the accident.

The bus was removed from the spot with the help of a crane and an earth mover machine at around 12.30 am on Tuesday and brought to Kurla depot by 1.15 am.

A team of motor vehicle inspectors examined the bus to find out if there was any mechanical problem in it. They will submit a report to police on the basis of their findings, sources at the Regional Transport Office (RTO) said.

The bus was a 12-metre long electric vehicle manufactured by Hyderabad-based Olectra Greentech and it had been taken by BEST on wet lease, an official earlier said.

No official communication was received so far from the wet leasing company EVEY Trans and Olectra on the accident.

Meanwhile, the Mumbai police shut the SG Barve Marg, connecting to Kurla station, for traffic movement.

As a result, BEST was operating buses on as many as 10 routes from other nearby locations instead of plying to Kurla station, an official from the transport body said.

Barve road is one of the busiest routes connecting to Kurla station. Scores of passengers travel in buses from Kurla bus stand located on Barve road to reach the Bandra-Kurla Complex and other location.

Mamata should be allowed to lead INDIA bloc: RJD chief Lalu Prasad



NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): RJD chief Lalu Prasad on Tuesday asserted that West Bengal Chief Minister and Trinamool Congress supremo Mamata Baneriee should be allowed to lead the INDIA bloc.

His comment comes days after Banerjee expressed her intent to take charge of the anti-BJP coalition.

Prasad also said if the Congress, a major ally of the INDIA bloc, had any reservation about accepting Banerjee as the leader of the opposition front, it would "not make any difference".

"Mamta Banerjee should be allowed to head the INDIA bloc," the RJD chief

Asked about the Congress' "reservation" to accept her as the opposition bloc leader, Lalu said, "The Congress' opposition will not make any difference...She should be allowed to lead the INDIA bloc." Earlier, Lalu's son and senior RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav had

said he had "no objection to any senior leader of the INDIA bloc, including Banerjee, leading the coalition", but stressed that the decision must be reached through consensus.

Banerjee had, on December 6, expressed dissatisfaction with the functioning of the INDIA bloc, signalling her intent to take charge of the alliance if given the opportunity. The Trinamool Congress supremo said she could manage the dual responsibility of running the opposition front while continuing her role as the chief minister of West Bengal. "I had formed the INDIA bloc, now it is up to those leading the front to manage it. If they can't run the show, what can I do? I would just say that everyone needs to be taken along," she said in an interview with agency.

Asked about Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's proposed statewide yatra from December 15, the RJD supremo said, "He is holding the statewide yatra just to refresh his eyes. The RJD-led coalition will form the government in the state in 2025."

Kumar is all set to embark on the statewide journey – 'Mahila Samvad Yatra' - from December 15 to review the progress of the state government's seven-resolves programme and feel the pulse of the people through interaction with women.

Air quality slips into poor category in city

NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): The city's air quality slipped into the 'poor' category on Tuesday with the AQI recorded

Out of the 38 monitoring stations, only Jahangirpuri recorded air quality in the 'very poor' category.

Twenty-seven stations reported 'poor' air quality, while the remaining were in the 'moderate' category, according to the Sameer app which provides hourly data. Delhi's air quality had returned to the

'moderate' category on Monday. The Central Pollution Control Board

(CPCB) classifies Air Quality Index (AQI) between 0 and 50 as 'good', between 51 and 100 as 'satisfactory', between 101 and 200 as 'moderate', between 201 and 300 as 'poor', between 301 and 400 'very poor', and above 400 as 'severe'.

The night temperature was recorded at 8 degree Celsius, two notches below the normal, according to the IMD.

The weather department has forecasted clear skies for Tuesday, with the maximum expected to settle around 23 degrees Celsius.

Israeli warplanes pound Syria as troops reportedly advance deeper into the country

Israel has carried out a wave of heavy airstrikes across Syria as its troops advance deeper into the country, reportedly drawing to within 15 miles of the capital

DAMASCUS, Dec 10 (Agencies): Israel carried out a wave of heavy airstrikes across Syria as its troops advanced deeper into the country, drawing to within 25 kilometers (15 miles) of the capital, a Syrian opposition war monitor said Tuesday.

Agency reporters in Damascus heard heavy airstrikes overnight and into Tuesday on the city and its suburbs. Photographs circulating online showed destroyed missile launchers, helicopters and warplanes.

There was no immediate comment from the insurgent groups — led by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham, or HTS – that have taken control of Damascus.

Israel had earlier seized a roughly 400-square-kilometer (155-square-mile) buffer zone inside Syria that had been established after the 1973 Mideast war, a move it said was taken to prevent attacks in the aftermath of the overthrow of President Bashar Assad.

Israel has also said it is striking suspected chemical weapons sites and heavy weapons to prevent them from falling into the hands of extremists. Israeli officials rarely acknowl-

Zelensky grateful for Donald Trump's "strong resolve" to end war in Ukraine

US President-elect Donald Trump has long claimed he will settle the Russia-Ukraine war in "24 hours" once in power.



KYIV, Dec 10 (Agencies): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Tuesday he was grateful for Donald Trump's "strong resolve" to end the war in Ukraine, after meeting the US president-elect in Paris last week.

French President Emmanuel Macron hosted three-way talks with Zelensky and Trump at the Elysee Palace on Saturday, as fears grow in Kyiv about the level of support Ukraine will receive under the incoming US administration.

"The most important thing is to work together on how to end this war -- that is our top priority. During the meeting in Paris, this was exactly what we focused on," Zelensky said in a post early Tuesday on social media platform X.

"I reiterate my gratitude to President Macron for organizing it, as well as my deep gratitude to President Trump for his strong resolve to bring this war to a fair end," the Ukrainian leader

Trump has long claimed he will settle the nearly three-year conflict in "24 hours" once in power, raising alarm in Ukraine that it will be forced to make huge territorial concessions in exchange for peace.

On Sunday, the Republican called for an "immediate ceasefire", writing on his Truth Social platform that Zelensky was ready to "make a deal and stop the madness"

Zelensky also rejected calls to lower the draft age, following reports US officials want Ukraine to expand the pool of fighting-age men to include 18-year-olds.

"We must focus on equipping existing brigades and training personnel to use this equipment. We must not compensate the lack of equipment and training with the youth of soldiers," he said in the same post Tuesday.

Sri Lankan President Anura Dissanayake to visit India in first overseas trip from Dec 15-17

COLOMBO, Dec 10 (Agencies): Sri Lankan President, Anura Dissanayake, will be making his first international visit since he came to power to India next week. This is being viewed as a good indicator of the relations between India and Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka's Cabinet spokesperson Dr Nalinda Jayatissa issued a statement mentioning about the President's upcoming visit which will be from December 15th to 17th.

During his visit, President Dissanayake will meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Droupadi Murmu, Cabinet spokesperson Nalinda Jayat-

issa said on Tuesday. "He will be accompanied by Foreign Minister Vijitha Herath and Deputy Minister of Finance Anil Jayantha Fernando," said Jayatissa, also the Minister

The December 15-17 visit is Dissanayake's first overseas visit since being elected the island nation's President in September.

The invitation to visit New Delhi was extended by the External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar, who visited Colombo less than a fortnight after Dissanayake's victory.

Dr Jaishankar was the first foreign dignitary to visit Sri Lanka since the National People's Power (NPP) government led by President Dissanayake who came to power on September 23.

President Dissanayake's visit was on hold until the completion of the Parliamentary election in November when his NPP recorded a historic win, gaining absolute control of the 225-member



Parliament.

Meanwhile agency adds: New Delhi has been concerned about Beijing's growing toehold in Sri Lanka, which it sees as being within its sphere of geopolitical influence.

India has stepped up infrastructure projects in Sri Lanka in recent years, but China is Sri Lanka's largest bilateral

Loans from Chinese banks have funded large-scale infrastructure projects, some of which have proved to be white elephants.

Dissanayake is expected to travel to Beijing for talks with Chinese leaders sometime next month, the government had announced earlier.

Sri Lanka suffered its worst financial crisis in 2022 when it ran out of foreign exchange to pay for essential imports such as food, fuel and medicines, and defaulted on its \$46 billion foreign debt. China is Sri Lanka's largest single lender, accounting for more than half

at the time of default. India is in third place with 12 percent of the debt while Japan is second with 19.5 percent.

China's sea deployment in region bigger than 2022 military drills, says Taiwan

TAIPAI, Dec 10 (Agencies): China is deploying its largest navy fleet in regional waters in nearly three decades, posing a threat to Taiwan that is more pronounced than previous Chinese war games, the Taiwanese defence ministry said on

Speaking in Taipei, defence ministry spokesperson Sun Lifang said the scale of the current Chinese naval deployment in an area running from the southern Jananese islands down into the South China Sea was the largest since China held war games around Taiwan ahead of 1996 Taiwanese presidential elections.

China's military has yet to comment and has not confirmed it is carrying out any exercises.

China, which views democratically governed Taiwan as its own territory over the island's rejection, had been expected to launch drills to express its anger at President Lai Ching-te's tour of the Pacific that ended on Friday, which included stopovers in Hawaii and the U.S. ter-



ritory of Guam.

military raised its alert on Monday after saying China had reserved airspace and deployed naval and coast guard vessels.

"The current scale is the largest compared to the previous four," Sun said. "Regardless of whether they have announced drills, they are posing a great threats to us.'

China's deployment in the First Island Chain which runs from Japan through Taiwan, the Philippines and on to Borneo, enclosing China's coastal seas - is aimed at area denial to prevent foreign forces from interfering, Hsieh

The ministry said China's navy is building two "walls" in the Pacific, one at the eastern end of Taiwan's Air Defence Identification Zone and the other further out in the Pacific.

"They are sending a very simple message with these two walls: trying to make the Taiwan Strait an internal sea" of China, said Hsieh.

Earlier on Tuesday, the defence ministry said it detected 47 military aircraft operating around the island over the past 24 hours, as well as 12 navy vessels and nine

"official" ships, which refers to vessels from ostensibly civilian agencies such as the coast guard.

Of the aircraft, 26 flew in an area to the north of Taiwan off the coast of China's Zhejiang province, six in the Taiwan Strait and a further 15 to the island's southwest, according to a map the ministry provided in its daily morning statement on Chinese activities.

A senior Taiwan security source told Reuters that the Chinese aircraft simulated attacks on foreign naval ships and practised driving away military and civilian aircraft as part of a "blockade exercise".

Lai and his government reject Beijing's sovereignty claims, saying only Taiwan's people can decide their future.

China says the Taiwan issue is the "core of its core interests" and a red line the United States should not cross.

Syria rebel leader says will announce 'list' of former officials wanted for torture

"We will offer rewards to anyone who provides information about senior army and security officers involved in war crimes," rebel leader Abu Mohammed al-Jolani, now using his real name Ahmed al-

Sharaa, said in a statement on Telegram. The rebel leader on Monday began discussions with the ousted government on transferring power, a day after his opposition alliance dramatically unseated President Bashar al-Assad following decades of brutal rule. "We will not hesitate to hold accountable the criminals, murderers, security and army officers involved in torturing the Syrian people," Sharaa said in



the Tuesday statement, adding they "will pursue war criminals and ask for their hand over from the countries to which they fled". "We have affirmed our commitment to tolerance for those whose

hands are not stained with the blood of the Syrian people, and we have granted amnesty to those who were in compulsory service," he said.

al-Sham (HTS) group had been administering swathes of Idlib province and parts of neighbouring areas until November 27, when along with allied factions it launched a lightning offensive, seizing government-held territory and capturing Damascus on Sunday.

Assad fled Syria as the Islamist-led rebels swept into the capital, bringing a spectacular end to five decades of brutal rule by his clan.

Death toll in Italy's fuel depot explosion rises to 4



ROME, Dec 10 (Agencies): Rescuers found two more bodies on Tuesday at the site of the massive explosion that hit a fuel depot a day earlier in the central Italian region of Tuscany, bringing the death toll to four, local officials said.

The blast collapsed a building with offices where one person is believed to be still missing,

Fourteen people have been injured and hospitalized, Tuscany's governor

Eugenio Giani said, adding that two were in "critical conditions."

The explosion struck an ENI fuel depot north of Florence, sending a dark plume of smoke into the air. Witnesses kilometers (miles) away reported a large bang and tremors.

Residents were advised on Monday to keep their windows closed out, but environmental officials later determined that the air quality was safe. The smoke temporarily interrupted regional train

Italy's ENI oil company said on Monday that the cause of the blast at the depot in the city of Calenzano was under investigation.

Flames were quickly contained, preventing the fire from spreading to storage tanks from a loading dock area where the explosion occurred.

water and power connections to them in Jammu, the BJP had also alleged it was done to protect them as they belong to a particular community.

According to government data, more than 13,700 foreigners, most of them Rohingyas (illegal immigrants from Myanmar)

and Bangladeshi nationals, are settled in Jammu and other districts of Jammu and Kashmir. Their population increased by over 6,000 between 2008 and 2016.

In March 2021, police found over 270 Rohingyas, including women and children, living illegally in the Jammu city during a verification drive and lodged them at a holding centre inside the Kathua sub-jail.

Abdullah also batted strongly for restoration of statehood in Jammu and Kashmir, and said there will be only one power

"The double-engine government will not work here. Statehood will be restored. There will be only one power centre in Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

Asked about atrocities on Hindus in Bangladesh, Abdullah criticised the central government, saying "the Government of India should look into this. It is an RSS-led government. We need to pay attention to this issue."

On the question of restoring Jammu and Kashmir's statehood, Abdullah reaffirmed, "statehood will be restored. It is the promise of the Government of India and has also been pledged before the Supreme Court. Just as their election promises were fulfilled, the Supreme Court commitment will also honoured, and statehood will return."

Abdullah addressed the issue of power cuts in the region, attributing them to a lack of rainfall and snowfall. "We are trying to minimise power cuts. There is a shortage of electricity because there has been no snowfall or rain. Efforts are being made to improve the power supply," he said.

Asked about PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti's recent statements on Hindutava, Abdullah said, "I do not need to comment on her statements.

The former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister also spoke about the concerns regarding Electronic Voting Machines

"Questions about EVMs have not arisen today; they have been raised ever since these machines were introduced. The government must ensure that people trust these machines," he said.

Highlighting unemployment as the biggest issue in Jammu and Kashmir, Abdullah said "There are many educated boys and girls who remain unemployed. Numerous vacancies exist, but they have not been filled. The government must focus on these issues so that our youth can find work.'

Abdullah also criticised the condition of healthcare and educational infrastructure in the region, calling it "poor" and in need of urgent improvement.

Warning about environmental degradation. Abdullah said. "If our forests are not preserved, how will we get rain and snow? Crops are failing in many areas due to a lack of water. Protecting the environment and forests is not just the Government's responsibility but also the people's duty. We must all work together to save nature.'

SM Krishna. former Karnataka CM and Maharashtra Governor. Dies at 92

He was then associated with the Praja Socialist Party before joining the Congress. Later, he joined the BJP in March 2017, ending his nearly 50-year-long association with the Congress.

In January last year, Krishna announced his retirement from active politics, citing his age as the reason.

He was the 16th Chief Minister of Karnataka from October 11, 1999, to May 28, 2004, (from Congress).

He also served as the Governor of Maharashtra and was the External Affairs Minister during the Manmohan Singh-led United Progressive Alliance (UPA) government

A law graduate, Krishna studied in the US. He graduated from the Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas, and The George Washington University Law School in Washington DC, where he was a Fulbright Scholar.

Krishna served as the Speaker of the Karnataka Legislative Assembly from December 1989 to January 1993. He was also a member of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha several times between 1971 and 2014.

Krishna was a member of both the Karnataka Assembly and Council and also served as Deputy Chief Minister (1993 to

He was Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee president ahead of the 1999 assembly polls in which the party won and he became the CM.

Krishna is credited by many for putting Bengaluru on the global map as a fillip given to the IT sector during his tenure

imprisonment, should be taken against them. He called for a detailed investigation to identify

those who facilitated the settlement of these individuals on government lands, provided them with water and electricity connections, and helped them obtain Aadhaar cards. "These people have even cast votes in local elections. These facts have now come to light. Indians residing in other parts of India cannot settle in Jammu and Kashmir, but these illegal immigrants were allowed to settle here based solely on religion.

Gupta said that as per a statement made by one of the ministers in the current government as per the rules in Jammu and Kashmir, obtaining water or electricity connections requires a domicile certificate and legal posses-

sion of land.

Under the UN charter, decisions are made about who qualifies as a legal immigrant, but these individuals are illegal.

There is no justification for providing them with water and electricity. Removing them from Jammu is essential for national security and efficient governance.

World Chess C'ship: Nerves to play crucial role as Gukesh, Liren head for close finish

SINGAPORE, Dec 10 (Agencies): A handy lead has slipped through his grip but Indian Grandmaster D Gukesh will rely on his steely resolve to bounce back when he takes on enigmatic defending champion Ding Liren in the 13th game of the World Chess Championship that has been quite a roller-coaster ride for the players.

The 18-year-old Gukesh, who is the youngest challenger to the title, and the 32-year-old defending champion from China have been locked in an intriguing battle in which both have held leads for not too long. They will resume on Wednesday after a day of rest.

The scores are currently tied at 6-6 with the first to reach 7.5 assured of the coveted crown.

After squandering away, a full point lead with just three games to go, the 12th round loss was heartbreaking for the young Indian and many experts believe that he will go for an aggressive approach in his last game with white pieces under Classical time control.

It won't be off the mark to say that nerves are likely to play a crucial role in the final stretch.

The scores were tied 5-5 after



game 10 but the last two decisive games thereafter have breathed new life into an otherwise well-contested match in which both players have had their chances.

After what he described as a see-saw victory in the 11th game, Gukesh was simply not himself in the 12th game and his idea to play a new position for the first time backfired spectacularly.

If the scores are still tied in the USD 2.5 million championship, tie-break games of shorter duration will be played to determine

Generally, a smooth operator, Liren looked a pale shadow of himself after the 11th game

and the case was no different

for Gukesh when he was com-

pletely outplayed for the first

time here on Monday. To regain composure is the name of the game here and Gukesh has shown resolve in the past.

Liren, on the other hand, was in a similar situation in the last world championships match against Ian Nepomniachtchi that he won, rallying as many as three times before eventually clinching the tiebreaker.

Liren's precision was simply immaculate in the 12th game.

Gukesh did not look the same player and the Chinese took advantage of the situation right from the word go to earn high praise from many in the elite chess circles.

Five-time world champion across formats, Viswanathan Anand, called it a "very impressive game" while Liren himself said, "it was the best game that I have played in recent times."

While the mind games will go on in the last two games and a potential tiebreaker, American Hikaru Nakamura and world number one Magnus Carlsen feel that the balance had tilted slightly in Liren's favour.

"Ding did not have to calculate a single line in this whole game, he is being able to play the game based on positional understanding where he is very good," said Carlsen on his new YouTube channel

It might be a tightrope walk for Gukesh but the young Indian is likely to go out there and give his best in the penultimate game.

In case of another draw, there is a decent chance that the chess buffs will get to see the tie-break games.

Shastri, Gavaskar urge captain Rohit to return to opener's role



ADELAIDE, Dec 10 (Agencies): Former India players Ravi Shastri and Sunil Gavaskar want skipper Rohit Sharma to return to the opening spot so that he can be his aggressive and expressive self.

Rohit, who had missed the first Test, dropped down to the No. 6 spot in the pink ball Test after KL Rahul excelled at the top. However, the Indian skipper looked "too subdued" as he managed scores of 3 and 6 in India's 10-wicket loss

Rahul's failure to capitalise on the opportunity has prompted former India captain Gavaskar to call for Rohit's return to his opening slot. "He should return to his regular spot. We should remember why Rahul had opened. He did that because Rohit was not available for the first Test," Gavaskar said.

"I can understand why they kept him as an opener in the second Test, he had a 200plus partnership with Jaiswal. But now that he couldn't score this Test. I feel Rahul should go back to No. 5 or No. 6 and Rohit should open. If Rohit scores quickly in the beginning, then he can score a big century also later," he added.

Kambli needs to help himself, go back to rehab: Kapil Dev

He was seen refusing to let go of his childhood friend Sachin Tendulkar. Expressing sadness over Kambli's condition. Kapil emphasised the need for self-help along-

side external support. "We should all try to support him. But more than us, he has to support himself. We can't look after anybody if that person can't look after



himself." Kapil said.

"All the cricketers feel very sad about what we have seen. I wish his closest friends can try to get him some help, to look after himself, to go back to rehab. People do get this illness, but you have to get back to

Kambli, a former lefthanded batter, has battled numerous health challenges over the years.

In 2012, he underwent angioplasty to treat blocked arteries, followed by a heart attack

in 2013. His struggles with alcohol addiction have led him to multiple stints in rehabilitation, significantly affecting his overall health and well-being.

> Kambli boasts an impressive cricketing career, having represented India in 104 ODIs and 17 Tests, where he amassed 2,477 and 1,084 runs, respectively.

Notably, during his school days, he forged an iconic unbroken partnership of 664 runs with Tendulkar in a schoollevel cricket match.

'Bad look': Ex-Australia captain tears into Siraj for 'premature celebrations'

ADELAIDE, Dec 10 (Agencies): Former Australian captain Mark Taylor believes Mohammed Siraj has a tendency of celebrating wickets prematurely without waiting for the umpire's decision and his senior India teammates should have a word with the pacer to address this as it is giving him a "bad look".

Taylor said Siraj charges down the wicket towards his teammates, without checking the umpire's decision when he thinks that he has got a batter

"I think with Mohammed Siraj, I'd like to see some of the Indian players have a chat with him, not so much what happened with Travis Head but how when he thinks he's got a batter out he doesn't turn around and actually acknowledge the umpire whether he's given it out or not," Taylor told Nine News.

"I think that's the bad look for him and the game."

"I love his exuberance, I love his competitive nature, I love the fact we've got a really good



series going on but there is also the respect of the game that needs to be upheld. I think a little word from one of the senior players would go a long way."

Siraj has become a topic of discussion after his brief showdown with Travis Head on day two of the Adelaide Test, which Australia won by 10 wickets to level the series 1-1.

Head had struck a splendid 141-ball knock of 140 before

being castled by Siraj, who went on to give him an aggressive send-off following an exchange of words. The Indian endured boos from the Adelaide crowd following the confrontation.

Both players were handed one demerit point each on their disciplinary records with Siraj also receiving a fine of 20 per cent of his match fee.

"I love the combative nature of Head and Siraj, but it has to be kept in check because the last thing we want to see in this game is that developing into a batsman maybe whacking a

"They get close together in that sort of situation and you don't want to see that. So the administrators need to keep a check on that, and so do the two captains," Taylor added.

Former Australia batter Simon Katich felt Siraj had a "brain fade" moment, which the Indian regretted later.

"It's a shame that Siraj had a bit of a brain fade...there's no need for that in the game," Katich said SEN Radio.

"He would regret that Siraj... it was all spur of the moment and when he got Mitchell Starc out not long after that he was pretty sheepish.

"You don't know what head space some of the players are in at times... he was probably disappointed with his performance and something like this can happen," he added.

World Test Championship final scenarios: Exact results India, SA, Australia and SL need to qualify place in the final. Even if they

NEW DELHI, Dec 10 (Agencies): With 10 Tests remaining in the current World Test Championship (WTC) cycle, several teams remain in contention for a place in the top two, although no team is guaranteed a spot just yet, as per ESPNcricinfo. South Africa, leading the table with a percentage of 63.33, have two home matches against Pakistan remaining. Their recent 2-0 series sweep against Sri Lanka has put them in a strong position. To secure a spot in the final, they need to win just one of their upcoming Tests against Pakistan. A 1-1 series result would leave them at 61.11 percent, with only India or Australia in a position to overtake them.

If both Tests are drawn, South Africa would finish at 58.33 per cent. In such a scenario, India would need to beat Australia 3-2. and Australia would need to win both Tests in Sri Lanka to surpass South Africa. If South Africa lose the series 1-0, they would then rely on Australia winning no more than two of their remaining five Tests, or India securing no more than one win and one draw from their remaining three Tests in Australia.

Sri Lanka, currently at 45.45 per cent, have two home matches against Australia left. Even if they win both Tests, they would only reach 53.85 per cent, and



would then be dependent on other results. South Africa and one of India or Australia can surpass this percentage. For both teams to finish below 53.85 per cent, Australia would need to win their series against India 2-1 with two draws, and South Africa would have to lose both Tests against Pakistan.

India, with a percentage of 57.29, have three away Tests against Australia remaining. To ensure a place in the final, they need two wins and a draw, which would take them to 60.53 per cent, securing at least second place behind South Africa. If India win the series 3-2, they would finish at 58.77 per cent. and Australia could still finish below them if they win against Sri Lanka 1-0. However, if India lose the series 2-3, they would finish at 53.51 per cent, allowing Australia, Sri Lanka, and South Africa to surpass them. In this case, India would need South Africa to lose both Tests against Pakistan and hope Australia achieve at least a draw in Sri Lanka.

Australia, standing at 60.71 per cent, have three home Tests against India and two away Tests in Sri Lanka remaining. They need two wins from their three Tests against India to secure a

lose both Tests in Sri Lanka, a 3-2 series win against India would leave them at 55.26 per cent, higher than India's 53.51 per cent and Sri Lanka's 53.85 per cent. If Australia lose 2-3, India would move up to 58.77 per cent, and Australia would then need to win both Tests in Sri Lanka to surpass India. Alternatively, they would have to hope that South Africa manage no more than one draw against Pakistan, leaving South Africa at 55.56%, a mark Australia can surpass with a win and a draw in Sri Lanka.

Pakistan, currently at 33.33 per cent, have a slim, mathematical chance of qualifying, contingent on South Africa dropping an over-rate point. Even with four wins from their remaining four matches, Pakistan would finish at 52.38 per cent, just below South Africa's 52.78 per cent. Should South Africa lose a game, they would drop to 52.08 per cent. With several other results going in their favour, it remains mathematically possible for Pakistan to finish second to either Australia or India. However, their chances are remote.

New Zealand, England, Bangladesh, and West Indies are out of contention for a place in the final.

Afghanistan extend Trott's contract by 1 year ahead of Champions Trophy



KABUL, Dec 10 (Agencies): Jonathan Trott will continue as Afghanistan's head coach for another year after the country's cricket board extended his contract through 2025.

The announcement comes a few months ahead of next year's Champions Trophy, where Afghanistan will make their maiden

appearance. The 43-year-old former England batter has been Afghanistan's head coach since July 2022, and under his guidance, the team has made impressive strides in international

cricket. "The Afghanistan Cricket Board wishes Trott the best of luck for his next year's stint

with Afghan Atalan as he strives to elevate Afghanistan cricket further on the global stage," the Afghanistan Cricket Board (ACB) said in a statement. Trott, the team has

achieved significant milestones, including reaching their first-ever T20 World Cup semifinal this year with stunning victories over Australia and New Zealand.

Afghanistan also enjoyed a memorable ODI World Cup last year in India, where they stunned England, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka, finishing among the top eight teams to secure their maiden appearance in the Champions Trophy.

Additionally, Afghanistan recently triumphed in bilateral ODI series against South Africa and Bangladesh in Sharjah, winning both by 2-1 margins.

Since Trott's appointment, Afghanistan have played 34 ODIs, winning 14, and in 44 T20Is they have 20 victories.

The team is currently touring Zimbabwe for an all-format series, which includes three T20Is, three ODIs, and two Tests.

However, Trott will accompany the squad only for the ODI matches, as he will remain unavailable for the T20Is and Tests due to personal commitments, the ACB added.

In Trott's absence, Hamid Hassan will step up as head coach, while Nawroz Mangal, who recently guided Afghanistan to victory in the Emerging Asia Cup, will serve as the assistant head coach for the series, it added.
