J&K Youth Congress stages protest against detention of IYC President in Assam

Top News Report

JAMMU, Dec 21: The Jammu & Kashmir Youth Congress (JKPYC) held a protest in Jammu on Saturday, strongly condemning the detention of Indian Youth Congress (IYC) President Uday Bhanu Chib in Assam. Protesters accused the BJP-led Assam government of suppressing opposition voices and targeting dissent. The demonstration, led by Maan Singh Rathore, IYC Secretary Incharge J&K. along with JKPYC President Akash Bharat and other senior leaders, involved burning an effigy to symbolize frustration with the BJP's alleged undemocratic actions.

The protestors also criticized

controversial remarks made by the Union Home Minister in Parliament about Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, calling it an insult to democratic principles and equality upheld by the Constitution's architect.

Addressing the gathering, Maan Singh Rathore called the detention of Uday Bhanu Chib a blatant misuse of power. "This is not just an attack on an individual but on democracy itself." he said, accusing the BJP of being intolerant of dissent. He highlighted a pattern of criminalizing opposition voices and vowed to continue resisting such tyranny. "The systematic erosion of democratic values under BJP rule is unacceptable. We will not back down, no matter the cost," he asserted.



JKPYC President Akash Bharat criticized the BJP for its "cowardly move" aimed at demoralizing the Youth Congress. "The BJP fears the growing voice of the youth

under Uday Bhanu Chib's leadership," he said. Bharat stressed that such actions only strengthen the Youth Congress's resolve and reaffirmed the youth's commitment

to fighting against divisive and oppressive policies. "From Assam to Jammu, the frustration with this government is evident," he added. Anirudh Sawhney, JKPYC State General Secretary, accused the BJP of detaining Chib without just cause, calling it an act of desperation. "The BJP fears the truth that the Youth Congress is exposing about their failures," he said. Sawhney also expressed outrage over remarks made by the Union Home Minister regarding Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, describing them as disrespectful and indicative of the BJP's disdain for constitutional values

The protest concluded with calls to intensify agitation if such actions persist. Leaders vowed to

continue their fight against authoritarianism and stand in solidarity with Uday Bhanu Chib.

Prominent leaders present at the protest included Vice Presidents Madassar Choudhary, Ranjot Singh, Shoaib Magray, General Secretaries Anirudh Sawhney, Rahul Tandon, Divyansh Verma, Sunny Parihar, and other office bearers such as Annas Munshi, Surinder Kumar, Raghav Khajuria, Jai Sidh, Anmol Kohli, Mehul Abrol, Raghav, Ranjeet Kumar, and Muneeb Kamal.

The protest underscored the Youth Congress's commitment to safeguarding democratic values and challenging oppressive governance.

AIIMS Jammu achieves milestone with groundbreaking rehabilitation surgery on young patient **Top News Report**

JAMMU, Dec 21: In a remarkable feat of surgical precision and teamwork, the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Vijaypur in Jammu successfully performed its first case of bilateral equinocavus deformity correction on a pediatric patient. The surgery, a significant achievement in the field of Rehabilitation medicine was carried out by a dedicated multidisciplinary team under the visionary leadership of Prof (Dr) Shakti Kumar Gupta, Executive Director and CEO of AIIMS Jammu.

The young patient, who had been diagnosed operated case of meningomyelocele with severe bilateral equinocavus deformity coupled with fixed flexion deformities left knee, faced significant challenges in mobility and quality of life. This condition, characterized by an abnormally high arch of the foot and persistent downward-pointing toes, had left the child struggling with standing, and limited function. Addressing such complex deformities requires advanced surgical intervention and exceptional coordination among specialists.

Dr. Junis Ali, Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Dr. Rashid Anjum, Department of Orthopaedics, and Dr. Parvez M. Dar, Department of Trauma and Emergency Medicine with their teams performed a series of procedures, including

Bilateral Z-Plasty of the Achilles Tendon: This innovative technique lengthens the tendon to relieve tightness and improve flexibility.

Posterior Capsular Release: A critical step to enhance the range of motion by releasing the stiff posterior capsule in the ankle joint.

Plantar Fascia Release: Targeting the thickened band of tissue on the sole, this procedure alleviates tension and corrects deformity.

Fractional Release of Medial and Lateral Hamstring Muscle Tendons: This delicate intervention ensures better alignment of the lower limbs.

The surgery was performed with meticulous precision and lasted several hours. Post-operative care plans were designed to include intensive rehabilitation care ensuring optimal recovery for the young patient. Dr. Junis Ali said, "This case was unique as it required careful planning, coordination, and execution. We are proud to have successfully completed this complex surgery and are optimistic about the patient's improved quality of life post-recovery." Dr. Rashid Anjum emphasized the importance of such cases in highlighting AIIMS Jammu growing capabilities. "Orthopaedic deformities like this demand advanced surgical expertise and collaboration among departments. This milestone demonstrates our readiness to handle complex cases with cutting-edge techniques.

Eligibility:

A. For Sanginis (Anganwadi Workers)

- 1. The candidate should be a domicile of the UT of J&K.
- Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years as on 01-01-2024 shall be eligible
- 3. The candidate should be a resident of the Electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is situated. Name in the voter list for the ward shall be considered as the proof of residence of the candidate. In case the name of the candidate appears in the voter list along with her parents, then she must provide certificate of being un-married issued by the concerned Tehsildar. Wherever, there is any dispute as to residence for

any reason, then a residence proof certifying the ward of residence from the concerned SDM/ACR shall be considered

- 4. Minimum qualification for Sangini (Anganwadi Worker) shall be 10+2 and maximum Graduation. In case no 10+2 pass candidate is available in the ward, 10+2 pass candidate from the adjoining ward shall be considered which would require prior approval of Mission Director, Mission Poshan.
- In case suitable candidate is not available from adjoining ward, candidate from the nearest ward within the Panchayat can be considered subject to the approval of the MD, Mission Poshan
- 6. Weight-age shall be given on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 and selection shall be done purely on merit basis and not other criteria to be considered.
- 7. In case of tie in merit of the eligible candidate, candidate with higher age will be preferred.
- 8. Candidate with qualification higher than Graduation shall not be considered.
- 9. In case eligible candidate is available within the family of retiring AWWs/AWHs, the said candidate shall qualify for additional two percent points.

B. Sahavikas (Anganwadi Helpers)

- 1. The selection of Helper shall be restricted to the Electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is located.
- 2. Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years as on 01-01-2024 shall be eligible.
- 3. The candidate should be a domicile of the UT of J&K.
- 4. Minimum qualification for (Sahayikas) Anganwadi Helper shall be matriculation.
- 5. In case no Matriculate candidate is available in the ward, candidates with qualification not less than 8th standard shall be considered.
- 6. The Committee shall select the most destitute/ needy married woman of the ward as helper from amongst those who fulfill the qualification criteria. In case no married candidate is available, unmarried candidate may be considered.

India's Influence in Global Politics

ccording to the Central Pollution Control Board, the air quality index of the national capital Delhi again reached the 'severe category' with 481 points at 8 am on Wednesday. This huge increase in air pollution has come after a gap of about three weeks, when restrictions were imposed under the fourth phase of the 'Graded Response Action Plan'. Pollution has also got the support of cold. Delhi-based Regional Weather Forecasting Center has predicted fog and moderate to dense fog in the morning, partly cloudy. It is expected to be cloudy and the minimum temperature will be around six degrees. There is talk of cold wave in Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh as well as in Delhi. In fact, the Indian Meteorological Department declares a cold wave when the minimum temperature in a plain area drops to 10 degrees Celsius or less, while in hilly areas the temperature drops to zero degrees or below. If we look at the difference between normal and basic temperature, then the condition of cold wave is considered when the temperature is normal.4.5 to 6.4 degrees Celsius below normal, while in a severe cold wave the temperature falls by more than 6.4 degrees Celsius above normal. By the way, talking on the basis of actual minimum temperature (for plains only), in cold wave the minimum temperature drops to four degrees Celsius or less, whereas in severe cold wave conditions it drops to

two degrees Celsius or less. However, cold wave conditions are considered common in other areas including North India from November to March, but its lethality is not known to us between December and February. It bothers me a lot. Same thing is happening this time also. Like extreme heat, extreme cold also harms the homeless, the elderly, the economically disadvantaged, the disabled, pregnant women, lactating women, children, farmers, outdoor laborers and those who live without proper heating or Are forced to work in adverse weather conditions. If precautionary measures are not taken, extreme cold can cause harm in many ways, even causing death to a person. hypothermia due to cold Problems like frostbite, i.e. becoming numb due to extreme cold, trench foot, chilblains can occur. The most life-threatening condition is hypothermia, which is caused by prolonged exposure to very cold temperatures and the body losing heat faster than it can generate it. Due to this, the body temperature becomes very low, due to which the brain is affected. And the person becomes unable to think or walk properly. It is noteworthy that hypothermia can also become dangerous when a person is exposed to rain, sweat, etc.Or gets cooled by immersion in cold water. What also happens is that after the temperature falls below, the blood vessels of our body start shrinking and our blood pressure (BP) starts increasing. This increases the pressure on our heart, which naturally increases the risk of heart attack or heart attack.

Double blow of cold wave and pollution

Extreme cold also makes our heart beats abnormal, which can become a life-threatening situation especially for those who are already suffering from heart related diseases. From 60 years in Britain, Ireland and the Netherlands A comprehensive study conducted on older people found that if the cold lasts even for four days, the risk of heart attack and stroke increases more than double. This study was actually done with the aim of defining particularly cold days compared to the rest of the month. In this, the drop in temperature compared to previous days was considered to be the main factor in heart attack, and not the cold felt. Cold waves and cold winds also have a negative effect on our lungs in many ways. cold air is generally dry And affects the respiratory tract, which can cause wheezing, cough and trouble breathing. This condition can be especially dangerous for people suffering from diseases like asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). Cold air can narrow and harden the airways, causing trouble breathing, which can especially affect young children. Air quality also deteriorates in cold conditions and increases in particulate matter, nitrogen dioxide and volatile organic compounds. Exposure to these pollutants can increase lung irritation and respiratory problems. Therefore, with the increase in pollution in the last two days, cough and respiratory problems have increased among people. Obviously, we should take many precautions at this time. Doctors always advise wear-

ing adequate warm clothes as you grow. We should protect our hands and feet from cold and cover our exposed skin as much as possible. Mask should also be used, which also protects us from pollution. SufficientFruits and vegetables should be consumed and coarse grains, legumes, nuts and foods obtained from animal sources should be used. Regular exercise is also necessary. This improves our immune system. Older people, infants and children under five years of age, disabled people and people suffering from chronic diseases are more at risk, hence it is necessary to take special care of them. The good thing is that in many cities, action plans are being prepared to deal with pollution according to local conditions, which can be implemented in short, medium And are of long duration. In these, measures like dealing with road pollution, overcoming pollutants from construction work, ban on burning of waste are being taken. Not only this, many types of agencies are also being contacted, so that all the challenges on the path of pollution freedom can be overcome.

All We Imagine As Light, which features Malayalam actors Kani Kusruti, Divya Prabha, Hridhu Haroon and Azees Nedumangad and several crew members from Kerala along with Marathi actor Chhaya Khadam and others, witnessed many acting workshops and script revisions in the state to reflect the reality of roles and languages.

Kapadia, who heads to Los Angeles from Thiruvananthapuram for the Golden Globes Awards ceremony in the Beverly Hills on January 5 and promotion of her film for the Academy Awards nominations, talks to agency at the conclusion of the IFFK (December 13-20) about the response to the film following the theatrical release in India last month, her own artistic response to the country's socio-economic and political changes through the film, and the forthcoming awards season in the United States. Excerpts from an interview:

It has been a good response largely. In every country, the response has been different. In India, the main thing is that we have been able to screen films in as many cinemas as possible because it is very difficult to get distribution for independent movies in India. Our main aim was, even if we had only one or two cinemas, in each big city, people could come and watch. I think we had a pretty decent response. We had the first release in Kochi, Kerala, and we got an almost hopeful response. In Chennai, too, it was good, also in Delhi and Kolkata. The Chennai audience is a killer audience (laughs). Mostly, we had trouble in smaller cities because we didn't have money for marketing. Many people

didn't even know that it was in their city. Now, we are trying to have a focused distribution, for example, in Guwahati. We received a lot of calls from Guwahati saying, please release it there. We will release it only on the weekend, and, like a quorum, people can sign up for the screening on the internet. We are trying our best. The people want to watch a film about what is happening in the country.

It is obvious from our film that it is the diversity we want to be maintained in our country. The One Nation One election will not allow that. For a federal system to continue the way it is, we must have the elections as we have been having them. We believe in a representational democracy. It is obvious from the film what our stance is. Multiple identities can exist together peacefully. Unfortunately, the world benefits from dividing people. As artists, we all feel diversity is beneficial for better and organic thoughts and ideas. That is democracy and discourse. If everybody was thinking along the same lines, democracy would be null and void.

What was the premise of the city of Bombay? The city was not there. It was a bunch of islands where a few people were residing. Then the colonial British rulers said, They are throwing us out of Surat, so we have to do something over here. So they made a new port. They called people from all over the country to come and work here. The entire premise of the city is that people have come from all over the country, all over Maharashtra, and from all over outside Maharashtra. That is the premise of the city. Then how can of people from all over our country. What is wrong with that? That is a great thing. We have to respect that also. While people of many religions live in Mumbai, there are also many castes and classes. That is the reality. Many people have also made films about that reality.

I think Cannes should really have more Indian films. There has been a gross neglect. We have made so many good films in the past three decades, and these films could easily have been on par. Other festivals are taking Indian films in the main competition, in Venice, Locarno... We had Mahesh Narayanan's film, Ariyippu (Declaration), another Malayalam film in Locarno two years ago. The Disciple by Chaitanya Tamhane was screened in Venice in 2020. Films from states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and Maharashtra are doing well at festivals. There are a lot of different interesting works happening in Indian cinema. There are some people taking risks in the narratives, in the forms. As soon as you start doing that you can have some reach outside as well.

To have our film screened at the International Film Festival of Kerala was an honour. All We Imagine As Light actually started with the IDSFFK in Thiruvananthapuram in 2015. In 2022, too, I was in Thiruvananthapuram, staying in the same hotel and attending the festival, but also doing some casting and pre-production over here. We started like that, and we are ending our journey here. This week witnessed the last day of the film's release in Thiruvananthapuram. It is like a long journey starting in Thiruvananthapuram and ending in Thiruvananthapuram. We also had a great crowd coming to the film screening at the IFFK. Receiving the Spirit of Cinema Award was the cherry on top.

Everything is a new experience. We didn't even know so many awards existed before. In Europe, yes we knew the many awards there. In America, it is new for us. The Golden Globes, of course, we have heard of. In America, we didn't know there were several other awards. Every state has its own critics prize. We got many critics prizes in places like Boston and New York. We were first or second in all of these. It is interesting that in the United States people like All We Imagine As Light.

Modi embarks on historic Kuwait visit, aims for 'futuristic partnership'

Indira Gandhi, was the last PM, who visited the country in 1981

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi--just before departing for Kuwait--on Saturday said his visit would be an opportunity to chalk out a roadmap for a futuristic partnership between the two countries.

Modi would be in Kuwait for two days and it is the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister in 43 years. In a statement before leaving the country, the PM described the visit saying: "It would be an opportunity to chalk out a roadmap for a futuristic partnership for the benefit of our people and the region." On India-Kuwait relations,

Modi said: "We are not just strong trade and energy partners, but also have shared interest in peace, security, stability and prosperity in the West Asia.'

Modi said he was confident that the visit would further strengthen and reinforce the special ties and bonds of friendship.

"We deeply value the historical connection with Kuwait that has been nurtured over generations," the PM added.

On Saturday, Modi is scheduled to meet the Indian diaspora



and he expressed that he eagerly looked forward to meeting the diaspora.

"(They) have immensely contributed to strengthening of bonds of friendship between the two nations," Modi added.

There is a million strong Indian diaspora in Kuwait. Modi thanked the leadership of Kuwait for inviting him, on Saturday, to the inauguration ceremony of the Arabian Gulf Cup. The Ministry of External Affairs said Modi would be guest of honour at the event. Also, on Saturday, Modi would visit Gulf Spic Labour Camp and meet Indian workers. In June this year 46 Indians had died following a fire at another labour camp.

The Ministry of External Affairs said PM Modi is visiting Kuwait on the invitation of Kuwait's Amir Sheikh Jaber Al Sabah.

Modi would be accorded ceremonial guard of honour at Amir's Bayan Palace following which he would hold discussions with the leadership of Kuwait. A bilateral is scheduled with Modi's counterpart Ahmad Al-Sabah and some MoU's are expected. Kuwait is among India's top trading partners, with bilateral trade at US \$ 10.47 billion in financial year 2023-24. Kuwait is India's 6th largest crude supplier, meeting 3 per cent of the country's energy needs. Indian exports to Kuwait reached US \$ 2 billion for the first time. Investments by the Kuwait Investment Authority in India exceed US \$ 10 billion.

The two nations share a robust trade and vibrant cultural connections.

Traditionally, India and Kuwait have enjoyed friendly relations, with links dating back to Kuwait's pre-oil economy when maritime trade with India was the backbone of its economy. The diplomatic relations between India and Kuwait were established in 1961.

Earlier this year, PM Modi and Kuwait's Crown Prince held meeting on the sidelines of UNGA in September. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar also held meeting with his Kuwaiti counterpart this year in August.

Both the countries have institutionalized their cooperation through mechanisms such as the Joint Commission for Cooperation (JCC).

AHMEDABAD, Dec 21 (Agencies): Two persons were injured after a parcel containing an electronic circuit and batteries delivered to a house in Ahmedabad city exploded on Saturday morning, police said.

The blast occurred at a rowhouse in the Sabarmati area around 10.45 am, an official said

Additional Commissioner of Police (Sector-1) Neeraj Badgujar said the person who delivered the parcel to the house was also injured and has been arrested

He said the parcel was delivered to the house of Baldev Sukhadia to exact revenge over some dispute.

"Even as the accused, Gaurav Gadhavi, handed the parcel, the receiver noticed smoke. The package exploded, leaving Sukhadia's brother Kirit with injuries," Badgujar said.

Gadhavi was also injured and has been arrested, he said, adding that the police teams were looking for other



accused involved in the incident.

"Primary interrogation has revealed that the parcel was delivered to the address over a dispute with the Sukhadia family. They had also received threats earlier," he said.

The official said the bomb appears to have been remotely operated, and an electronic circuit, battery and blades were recovered from the site.

A probe team is investigating the exact nature of the device, he said. The bomb disposal squad (BDS) and forensic team reached the site along with senior police officials, he said.

The BSP chief also stated that in such a situation, if the demand

is not met, the BSP will raise its voice across the country.

"That is why the party has now decided to hold a nationwide movement on December 24 in support of this demand. On that day, a complete peaceful dharna-demonstration will be held at all district headquarters across the country," she said.

Sanjay Raut hints at Uddhav Sena's solo fight in Mumbai civic polls

Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut said that the party workers are demanding to contest the Mumbai Municipal Corporation polls alone.

MUMBAI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut on Saturday hinted that his party, led by Uddhav Thackeray, may contest the upcoming Mumbai local body polls alone, without an alliance with Congress and Sharad Pawar's NCP.

Raut said that party workers are demanding to contest the Mumbai Municipal Corporation polls alone and mentioned that the party chief will take a decision after consulting with them. He also pointed out that Shiv Sena has contested the polls on its own in the past.

"Party workers demand that Shiv Sena should contest the Mumbai Municipal Corporation elections on its own. Uddhav Thackeray will take a decision after meeting the workers. This does not mean that the Maha Vikas Aghadi has broken. Even before this, when we were with the BJP, we had contested elections separately," Raut said at a press meeting.

The Uddhav Sena contested the recent Assembly and Lok Sabha elections in alliance with Congress and Sharad Pawar's NCP under the banner of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA). In the April-May Lok Sabha elections, the alliance performed well, but it delivered a



dismal performance in the Assembly polls in November.

While the BJP-led Mahayuti secured 230 out of 288 Assembly seats, the Opposition coalition managed to win only 46 seats, with the Shiv Sena (UBT) winning 20, Congress 16, and the NCP (SP) 10.

Of the 36 Assembly seats in the Mumbai region, which form the Municipal Corporation's electoral territory, the Uddhav Sena won 10, while Congress bagged only three, compared to the Mahayuti's combined tally of 22. The remaining one seat went to the Samajwadi

Party. Sharad Pawar's NCP is not a key player in the city.

Following the poor performance in the Assembly polls, the MVA alliance witnessed instances of discord, with alliance partners blaming each other for a lack of coordination and for failing to capitalise on the momentum from the Lok Sabha elections. However, alliance leaders maintained that the MVA remains strong despite the setbacks.

The dates for the Mumbai polls are yet to be announced by the state election commission and could be held in early 2025.

16 Injured after missile launched by Yemen lands near Tel Aviv, says Israel

"Following the sirens that sounded a short while ago in central Israel, one projectile launched from Yemen was identified and unsuccessful interception attempts were made," the Israeli military said on its Telegram channel.

TEL AVIV, Dec 21 (Agencies): Israel's military said Saturday it had failed to intercept a "projectile" launched from Yemen that landed near Tel Aviv, with the national medical service saying 16 people were lightly wounded.

"Following the sirens that sounded a short while ago in central Israel, one projectile launched from Yemen was identified and unsuccessful interception attempts were made," the Israeli military said on its Telegram channel.

Yemen's Iranianbacked Huthi rebels have repeatedly launched missile attacks against Israel since the war in Gaza began more than a year ago, most of which have been intercepted. In return, Israel has struck multiple targets in Yemen -- including ports and energy facilities in areas controlled



by the Huthis.

The German government declined to comment on Musk's support for the far-right party, while the AfD has continued to push its hardline positions on immigration and Islam, agency reported.

Russian airports disrupted after 'massive' overnight drone exchange with Ukraine

Russian authorities reported 8 Ukrainian drones over the city of Kazan.

MOSCOW, Dec 21 (Agencies): Two Russian airports were put under flight restrictions early Saturday after authorities alleged an attack by Ukrainian drones, according to state-run news agencies.

Russia's Defense Ministry said it downed six Ukrainian drones over the city, which it said were "flying in three waves from different directions." Three were shot down and three defeated using electronic warfare measures, the ministry said.

US Senate clears bipartisan spending bill, narrowly avoids government shutdown

WASHINGTON, Dec 21 (Agencies): The US Congress passed spending legislation early on Saturday in a down-to-the-wire burst of activity that will avert a destabilising government shutdown ahead of the busy holiday travel season.

The Democraticcontrolled Senate, in an 85-11 vote, passed the bill to continue government funding 38 minutes after it expired at midnight. The government did not invoke shutdown procedures in of caving in to pressure from an unelected billionaire who has no experience in government.

Congress did not act on Trump's demand to raise the debt ceiling, a politically difficult task, before he takes office on Jan. 20. The federal government spent roughly \$6.2

trillion last year and has more than \$36 trillion in debt, and Congress will need to act to authorise further borrowing by the middle of next year.

The legislation would extend government funding until March 14, provide \$100 billion for disaster-hit states and \$10 billion for farmers. and extend farm and food aid programs due to expire at the end of the year. Some Republicans voted against the package because it did not cut spending. House Speaker Mike Johnson said the party will have more influence next year, when they will have majorities in both chambers of Congress and Trump will be in the White House. "This was a necessary step to bridge the gap, to put us into that moment where we can put our fingerprints on the final decisions on spending," he told reporters after the House vote. He said Trump supported the

package. A government shutdown would have disrupted everything from law enforcement to national parks and suspended paychecks for millions of federal workers.

A travel industry trade group warned it could cost airlines, hotels and other companies \$1 billion per week and lead to widespread disruptions during the busy Christmas season. Authorities warned travellers could face long lines at airports.



The press service of the head of the Tatarstan region -- of which Kazan is the largest city -- said authorities recorded eight drones attacking the city, with no reported casualties, according to the state-run Tass news agency.

"One was at an industrial enterprise, one was over a river and six were at a residential area," the press service said, as quoted by Tass.

Kazan Mayor Ilsur Metshin said that fires were reported in houses in three districts of the city and announced selective evacuation of schools where it was deemed necessary, Tass reported. Tatarstan head Rustam Minnikhanov wrote on Telegram that the region was subjected to "a massive UAV attack."

Ukraine's air force, meanwhile, said Russia launched 113 drones into Ukraine overnight, of which air defense teams shot down 57.

Another 56 went missing due to "active countermeasures" by Ukrainian defenders, the air force added.

Air raid sirens sounded across Ukraine on Saturday morning with the air force warning of a "threat of the use of ballistic weapons throughout the territory of Ukraine."

The latest overnight attacks followed a combined missile and drone strike on Kyiv early on Friday, which the Kyiv City Military Administration said caused significant damage to buildings in the city center and killed at least one person. China accounted for more than half of Sri Lanka's bilateral debt at the time of the 2022 economic crash, when Colombo ran out of foreign exchange to pay for essential imports such as food, fuel and medicines

Its economy is recov-

ering after receiving an International Monetary Fund rescue package and imposing austerity reforms aimed at repairing the government's ruined finances.

Leftist Dissanayake came to power in September on a pledge to fight corruption and tightened his grip after his party won a landslide in snap parliamentary polls.

"I will be going to China mid next month", he told reporters, without setting an exact date.

Kashmir Sports Council has sought names of the office bearers, those government employees and political persons to furnish supported documents viz No-Objection-Certificate (NOC) etc further seeking submission of the report may by or before December 24, 2024 through hard copy as well as at official email.

However, UNI has reliably learnt from the administrative sources that over 60 people including government officials and political persons are associated as office bearers in the sports association recognised and affiliated with the Jammu and Kashmir Sports Council (JKSC).

"At present, 53 sports associations are affiliated with the J&K Sports Council and most of them have representatives either from the government or the political parties including mainstream," sources said.

Pickleball can make it to Olympics: India's Vrushali, Vanshik relish sport's boom

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): Vrushali Thakare and Vanshik Kapadia, India's pickleball power duo, are smashing stereotypes and winning medals while dreaming big for the sport. They see pickleball's age and gender-agnostic inclusivity as the secret sauce behind its rapid rise, even envisioning it paddling its way to the 2032 Olympics. Vrushali, who transitioned from badminton to pickleball and rose to the top, teams up with Vanshik, a pickleball prodigy hooked on the sport since childhood, to dominate the court.

Pickleball is the game everyone's talking about these days. Mixing the best bits of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong, this paddle sport is on a rapid rise, and even celebrities are hopping on the bandwagon, swinging their paddles to stay fit. The game is gaining a global following, but India is quickly catching up. Just last month, tennis legend Andre Agassi also visited India to promote the sport in India.

The dynamic pair recently struck gold in the 19+ open mixed doubles at the Hong Kong leg of the World Pickleball Championship, building on India's medal streak from the India leg last November, where the country claimed 28 medals, including 11 golds. Both Vrushali and Vanshik will participate in the inaugural World Pickleball League, scheduled for January 2025. While Vrushali was selected by the Bengaluru franchise during the player draft, Vanshik will represent Pune. A total of 48 players were chosen by the six teams under the close guidance of the league. Players from 14 countries will grace the court as the WPBL kicks off on January 24, 2025.

VRUSHALI BREAKS SOCIAL BARRIERS VIA PICKLEBALL

Nicknamed "Hammer Thakare," Vrushali Thakare has overcome numerous challenges to become one of India's leading pickleball players. Known for her sharp anticipatory skills, Vrushali began her journey in the small town of Jalgaon, Maharashtra. Despite societal pressure to pursue a teaching career, she chose to follow her passion for sports.

. "At the end of 2017 muse see h



taught table tennis, introduced me to pickleball. He had seen the sport and suggested, "Try it out; it's a good sport. If you like it, you can continue, or else leave it." At that time, I was playing badminton and had been a university-level badminton player for four years. I decided to give pickleball a shot, and three months after starting, there was a tournament in Jalgaon. Players from various states were participating. My coach encouraged me to play, saying, "You might perform well." I participated and won gold in doubles and silver in mixed doubles. After that, my coach told me to continue because I was doing well, and that's how my pickleball journey began," Vrushali Thakare said in an exclusive interview with agency.

However, starting from a remote area was not without its challenges. "Coming from a remote area, we faced significant challenges. We didn't have paddles or balls. Our coach had wooden paddles made by a carpenter, which didn't even have proper grips and were hard to hold. Balls weren't available in India then, so we used smiley balls to play. Thankfully, our college had two badminton courts. We lowered the nets and used them for pickleball. Today, the situation has improved. Wooden paddles are available for as little as Rs 250, and a ball can last a week on a decent surface. So now, even kids in remote areas can afford to play pickleball,"Vrushali explained. In 2021, Vrushali and her mixed doubles partner Ajay Choudhary established the Thakare Pickleball Academy in Pune. With two courts funded from their own earnings, the academy has since trained over 200 playChampionship in Vietnam. " At that time, pickleball was relatively unknown in the city, and there weren't any courts. We invested our earnings from pickleball to build two courts and began training players. In just two years, we coached over 200 players, including five juniors who were selected to represent India in the Junior Championship in Vietnam. It's been incredible to see the sport grow and gain recognition. Pickleball is a sport for everyone. At our academy, we've trained players as young as five and as old as 80. I remember a 72-year-old woman from a nearby building who used to watch the games. She was so inspired that she decided to join us, saying, "I want to learn and play too."

Vrushali explains how the Indian Pickleball Association (IPA) has played a key role in promoting the sport nationwide, organizing tournaments and providing players with essential resources. As pickleball rapidly gains popularity, with tennis courts in housing societies being converted for the game, it mirrors the sport's growth in the US. With this momentum, pickleball could soon rank among India's top sports.

"The Indian Pickleball Association (IPA) has played a significant role in the sport's growth. When I started, IPA was already organizing tournaments, providing exposure and experience for players. Today, they continue to support players with equipment and resources. Their efforts have been instrumental in popularising pickleball across India."

Pick"Pickleball is growing rapidly in India, just as it has in the US. In many housing societies, tennis ademy courts are being converted into 0 playpickleball courts. With such expansion, I believe pickleball Junior most popular sport in India in the next five years. To aspiring players, I would say: play because you enjoy it. If you love the sport, it will give back to you in ways you can't imagine. Whether it's pickleball or any other sport, passion and joy will take you far."

VANSHIK HOPES PICKLE-BALL REACHES OLYMPICS At just 19 years old, Vanshik Kapadia made a formidable presence in pickleball. Transitioning from tennis, a sport he began playing at the age of six, Vanshik found his true calling in pickleball in 2018. Today, he holds the prestigious rank of No. 1 in both Asia and India. Reflecting on his journey, Vanshik shared, "I started playing pickleball when I was six years old, and in 2018, I began playing professionally. My journey began at my home club, Khar Gymkhana, where I hit my first pickleball shot. It was my dad who introduced me to the sport, and from that moment, there was no looking back. I fell in love with pickleball the instant I played my first shot. That's how it all started, and I decided then and there that this was the path I wanted to pursue."

Despite competing on the global stage, Vanshik's calm and focused demeanour sets him apart. "I don't see pressure as a hindrance. It's all about focusing on what's within your control. External factors are just distractions," he explained.

As an advocate for the sport's growth, Vanshik is optimistic about pickleball's potential to reach new heights. "Regarding the sport and my involvement, I've been associated with the Indian Pickleball Association (IPA) for the past two years. It has been an incredible journey of growth, both in the game and in life," he said.

Looking ahead, Vanshik expressed his excitement for the upcoming World League, set to take place in January. "It's going to be a huge event with celebrities attending, and I believe pickleball is on its way to becoming a global sensation," he noted. With the sport's growing popularity, Vanshik's ultimate dream is to see pickleball included in the 2032 Olympics. "I hope it gets included, which would be a dream come true for the sport and its players."

NEW DELHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): An arrest warrant has been issued against former Indian cricketer Robin Uthappa over allegations of Provident Fund (PF) fraud. The warrant, issued by PF Regional Commissioner Shadakshari Gopal Reddy, directs the Pulakeshinagar police to take appropriate action.

Uthappa, who managed a private firm called Centuries Lifestyle Brand Private Limited, is accused of deducting PF contributions from employees' salaries but failing to deposit the amounts,

The warrant noted that the failure to remit the dues has prevented the PF office from settling the accounts of the affected workers. It directed the police to arrest Robin Uthappa and return the warrant by December 27. Uthappa, who represented India in 59 international matches, was a prominent player in the Indian Premier League (IPL). Over his cricket career, he scored 1,183 runs in 54 ODI innings, including seven half-centuries. In the IPL, Uthappa played for teams such as Kolkata Knight Riders, Royal Challengers Bangalore, and Mumbai Indians. He was part of KKR's winning squad in 2014 and was known for his aggressive batting style. Authorities are now working to trace Uthappa's whereabouts to proceed with the investigation and ensure legal compliance.

New Zealand Cricket send delegation to Pakistan to inspect security arrangements ahead of tri-series

KARACHI, Dec 21 (Agencies): New Zealand Cricket has sent a delegation to Pakistan to inspect security and other arrangements for a scheduled tri-series in January.

Besides hosts Pakistan and New Zealand, South Africa is the third team in the event. Pakistan is hosting the multi-team event as a curtain raiser to the ICC Champions Trophy in February and March.

The New Zealand delegation, including security expert Reg Dickason and New Zealand Players' Association representative Brad Rodden are in Karachi and Lahore to discuss security arrangements and other preparations for the event.

Around the same time a high-powered delegation from the ICC has also arrived in Pakistan to inspect ongoing preparations and other arrangements for the eight-team Champions Trophy.

The ICC delegation also visited the National Stadium in Karachi before going to Lahore and Rawalpindi.

Pep Guardiola backs Erling Haaland to perform if Manchester City 'play better'

MANCHESTER, Dec 21 (Agencies): Pep Guardiola has thrown his support behind star striker Erling Haaland, highlighting the need for Manchester City to improve their overall play to maximize the Norwegian's impact. This comes as City navigate a challenging spell of form, with only one win in their last 11 matches across all competitions - a stark contrast to the dominance typically associated with Guardiola's tenure.

Haaland, who has been a goal-scoring machine since joining City, has struggled recently, scoring just once in his last five games. The lack of service has left him isolated against opposing defenders. However, Guardiola dismissed any suggestion of reverting to a false nine system, which had previously brought him success

"I prefer to play with Erling," Guardiola said ahead of City's Premier League clash with Aston Villa. "I don't think in this situation that I should not let Erling play absolutely not. We have to adapt to the qualities he brings."

Guardiola acknowledged that Haaland's reduced goal tally is a symptom of the team's struggles rather than a reflection of the player's form.

"The reason he's not been as productive is the way we're playing," Guardiola explained. "We're not creating the volume of chances we did in the past. When he's surrounded by two, three, or four defenders, it's tough for him. We need to play better as a team to create the spaces he needs."

Amid City's current struggles, Guardiola hinted at the possibility of January reinforcements, a departure from the club's usual reluctance to engage heavily in the winter transfer market.

"We've spoken about doing something," Guardiola revealed. "But it

has to be for the long term, not just for four or five months. Historically,
we haven't done much business in January,
but the circumstances this season have been

special." Guardiola referenced Aymeric Laporte's signing in January 2018 as a rare exception and underscored the challenges of making impactful signings midseason. "Teams don't want to sell, and prices

are high," he noted. One potential hurdle for City is the ongoing investigation into alleged breaches of Premier League financial regulations. While the club faces 115 charges, Guardiola expressed uncertainty over whether this could impact recruitment plans.

As City prepare for their trip to Villa Park, the focus remains on turning their season around. Guardiola's faith in Haaland and the team's ability to rediscover their rhythm will be crucial as they navi-

gate this critical period.

Hockey India League a big boost for youngsters: PR Sreejesh

CHENNAI, Dec 21 (Agencies): There is something about PR Sreejesh. He is always ebullient, seems at peace with himself and more than anything he is shrouded in an aura of positivity. Always cheerful and articulate, Sreejesh speaks his mind. During a short conversation, he felt that his stint as coach of the junior team had been fantastic. India won the junior men's Asia Cup title beating Pakistan in the final. The first major outing, in his words, was a 'good job'.

Sreejesh said that the revival of the Hockey India League was a big step. "The league is like an international match where top players from across the world play and it is a platform where youngsters can learn and grow," Sreejesh said during

a Zoom interaction on Friday. He said that like earlier editions, domestic players will benefit from it.

With the HIL set to begin in the last week of December, Sreejesh's role has changed – coaching to an administrator. Right now he is the Director and mentor of the Delhi SG Pipers team.



The two-time Olympic bronze medal winner with the India hockey team said even this stint too would be interesting. Sreejesh realised that coaching was not easy either.

"Playing was easier than coaching," he said. "As a player, you just need to worry about your own business. But now you are the boss of 40 players and another eight staff under you. You are responsible for everything. Then it is a new role. But I am enjoying it. I always say this... on the field, the goalkeepers always act like a coach. You are commanding the defenders or organizing them, communicating with the midfielders and forwards. It has slightly changed now. I used to yell from the back or the goalpost but now I am yelling from the sidelines. Hockey is

something which I had known for the last 24 years and teaching that game to the youngsters is something I am enjoying seriously," Sreejesh mentioned.

It is not always that international players are inducted as coaches just after retirement. Sreejesh is an aberration. The moment he retired after the bronze medal at the Paris Olympics, he was offered the role of a coach for the junior national team.

"It happened unexpectedly," admitted Sreejesh, adding that he was hoping to take a break for two years and spend some time with the family.

"I just wanted to join the junior team not as a chief coach. I spoke with my family first about this offer from Hockey India. She said we are happy if you take us with you. We can shift to Bangalore because being a coach you get an apartment." About his new role as director of the Delhi team, Sreejesh felt that this would give him an opportunity to learn something about sports administration. He said that when Mahesh Bhupathi (CEO of the team) approached him and told him to help build the team he was more than willing to join.

"I have been in the sport for quite a long time and I know who are the best players, so I said yes," he said.

Sreejesh has given an example of how HIL can help players.

"It is like this. When I step into a new franchisee in HIL, I'm going to be with some of the best foreign players. And I am going to learn everything from him. From the dining hall, what he eats... what are the things he eats before a match... his daily routine on a match day. How he prepares for a match or behaves before, during, and after a match. How he motivates a player when the team continuously loses or how he talks to a player when the team is winning."

Sreejesh said that HIL helps because every country has its own style. "India, we got a culture, we do have a style. The Europeans have theirs so do Australians. So you are getting a platform where you can learn."

The former India goalkeeper also said that playing in front of a good crowd also helps.

"These youngsters who are 18, 17 or 20 and are dreaming about becoming a part of a senior team are getting the experience playing to play in front of a huge crowd," he said. "I think that is an important part. Pressure management is something that is really important for becoming an elite or mature player."

Sreejesh felt more than anything else he would want his Delhi team to enjoy their games. "If they enjoy they will play well and win," he said. Sreejesh said he would be happy if the team finished in the top four.


