Minimum temperature improves across J&K, Srinagar records minus 3.6

SRINAGAR, Dec 23 (Agencies): Due to nightlong cloud cover, minimum temperature improved across Jammu and Kashmir on Monday with Srinagar city recording minus 3.6 as the minimum temperature.

The Meteorological (MeT) department said the improvement in minimum temperature will continue for another two days after which another spell of extreme cold is likely to occur in Kashmir. Despite improvement

in night temperature, life remained adversely affected due to frozen water taps, slippery roads, shortages of electric power, etc., in the Valley.

Accepting the gravity of the situation, Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has cancelled all his engagements outside and decided to remain stationed in Kashmir to address the problems of the people.

"In light of the severe cold spell in the Kashmir valley & the resultant difficulties

Face covering by women advocates violates BCI dress code: J&K High Court

JAMMU, Dec 23 (Agencies): The High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh has categorically held that women advocates cannot appear before the court with their faces covered, citing clear provisions under the Bar Council of India (BCI)

The court noted that according to these provisions, women advocates may wear black importance of maintaining decorum and pro-

fessional identification in courtrooms. The matter was triggered when a woman identifying herself as advocate appeared before the court wearing a face cover. Upon being requested to remove it for identification, she insisted that it was her fundamental right to appear in such a state of attire. This led the court to direct the Registrar General of the High Court to confirm the legal and rule position regarding the dress code for advocates. Upon submission of

full-sleeve jackets or blouses, white bands, sarees, or other subdued traditional attire, along with a black coat. However, there is no mention or allowance for the inclusion of face coverings as part of the prescribed courtroom attire, the court pointed. "It is nowhere stated in the rules that any such attire (face cover) is permissible for appearing before this court.", Justice Kazmi remarked. Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association urges Govt to redress long-standing issues

JAMMU, Dec 23: The Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association (J&K UT) convened a press conference under the leadership of General Secretary D.K. Chauhan to address critical issues faced by paramilitary personnel and ex-servicemen.

The press conference was attended by prominent members of the association, including Ashok Kumar Verma (Chairman), Kuldeep Singh (President), Harbans Lal (Vice President), Noor Mohammad (President, District Samba),

Yash Pal, Gurdeep Singh, Bachan Lal Bhagat, Kamlesh Kumari, Warem and others. During the press conference,

the association highlighted the systemic discrimination faced by central paramilitary forces since 2014. Despite their unwavering commitment to safeguarding the nation under challenging conditions, their demands remain unaddressed, Chauhan said.

Unlike the Indian Army, paramilitary forces have not been granted One Rank One Pension (OROP), leading to significant disparities in post-retirement benefits, he said and criticized



the government for failing to ensure regular pension revisions for retired personnel. He said that paramilitary

forces do not receive medical benefits on par with their Army counterparts, despite facing similar risks and hardships.

"Personnel martyred in the line of duty are not accorded martyr status, which denies them and their families the respect and benefits they deserve," Chauhan said and lamented the lack of priority given to paramilitary forces who serve tirelessly on international borders, maintain law and order, and operate in terrorism affected regions like Jammu & Kashmir, Chhattisindifference. While these forces work 24/7 throughout the year, their contributions are undervalued, and their service conditions remain stagnant, he said. The association also expressed disappointment with

the Director Generals (DGs) of paramilitary forces, accusing them of failing to advocate for the welfare of their personnel. Additionally, the association criticized the lack of action from local political leaders. They appealed to J&K MPs Jugal Kishore Sharma and Dr. Jiten-

garh, and the Northeast.

He accused the central gov-

ernment of treating paramilitary

forces with "step-motherly"

dra Singh (MoS PMO) to raise their concerns in Parliament. However, the response from these MPs remains pending.

The association also urged local MLAs to bring the issues of paramilitary personnel to the government's attention, emphasizing the need for political intervention at both state and central levels.

In a gesture of unity, the association extended its respect and support to farmers who have been fighting for their rights. They criticized the government for ignoring the legitimate demands of farmers, drawing parallels with their own struggle for recognition and justice.

The Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association vowed to continue its fight for justice, demanding equal treatment for paramilitary forces.

The association called on the government to recognize the sacrifices of paramilitary personnel and address their longstanding grievances.

The press conference concluded with a collective appeal to the government, urging immediate action to ensure the welfare and dignity of paramilitary forces who serve the nation with unmatched dedication.

KDP Wing of DPAP demands easing out of procedures in relief organisation working

JAMMU, Dec 23: The Kashmiri Displaced People (KDP) Wing of the Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP), led by President Sanjay Dhar, Chairman Piaray Lal Pandita, General Secretary Raj Kumar Ticku, Publicity Secretary Charanjeet Singh, Mahila President Daizy Dhar, and Mahila Working President Renu Razdan, has expressed serious concerns over the cumbersome procedures in the Relief Organisation. In a joint statement, the leaders called for immediate reforms to simplify the processes and alleviate

should clearly outline the responsibilities of each section within the organisation, including Camp Commandants and Zonal Officers. Such a document would ensure clarity in procedures for obtaining certificates, handling deletions, additions, bifurcations, and other related tasks. The current lack of fixed procedures leads to prolonged delays, often lasting months, causing unnecessary hardship for the displaced community.

The Relief Organisation must streamline its procedures and implement time-bound resolutions to ensure effi-

dants and Zonal Officers be empowered to handle minor tasks such as the deletion of names in case of deaths and the inclusion of newborns at the zone level. Additionally, Zonal Officers should conduct visits to camp jurisdictions twice a week to directly address

issues promptly. The leaders also suggested that the Deputy Commissioner (Relief) be empowered to conduct public darbars in camps for on-the-spot resolution of minor submissions. This approach would significantly reduce delays and improve the overall efficiency of the Relief Organisation. They also urged the authorities to issue proper notifications before introducing any new forms or formats, as the community has been burdened with

grievances and resolve

repetitive paperwork over the past 35 years without any tangible results.

Another pressing issue raised was the need for adequate police deployment in Jagti Camp, as promised by the Hon'ble Chief Secretary during his recent visit. This measure is essential to ensure the safety and security of camp residents. Additionally, the leaders expressed concern over the unscheduled power cuts in the camp and urged the authorities to reduce curtailment hours to provide uninterrupted electricity.

The statement highlighted several pending commitments, including the election of the Resident Welfare Association and the allotment of shops in Jagti Camp. Despite assurances from the Relief and Rehabilitation Comises remain unfulfilled and require immediate action. Similarly, the leaders demanded the initiation of infrastructure repairs and renovations in the camp, which have been delayed despite repeated assurances. They also called for the repair of lanes, by-lanes, and the main road up to Kandoli, along with the installation of streetlights and CCTV cameras to enhance safety.

135th birth anniversary, CJI Mehr Chand Mahajan who as Prime Minister played key role in J&K's accession

he 135th birth anniversary of Mehr Chand Mahajan, who donned many hats falls on December 23, 2024. Who is Mehr Chand Mahajan? His role as Prime Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, Chief Justice of India, head of Punjab Border Commission and much more. Let's discuss.

Mehr Chand Mahajan, an eminent Indian jurist and politician, was born on December 23, 1889, in the village of Tikka Nagrota in distict Kangra ,Punjab Province – then British India now in Himachal Pradesh.

His father Brij Lal was an advocate and was practicing in Dharamshala. Mehr Chand Mahajan studied Chemistry in Lahore and later switched to Law. He started practicing in Dharamshala for an year and shifted to Gurdaspur where he practiced for four years between 1914 and 1918. He then practiced law in Lahore from 1918 to 1943. He Served as president of the High Court Association Lahore from 1938 to 1943. Mahajan later became judge of Punjab High Court during pre-independence.

Mehr Chand Mahajan's son Vikram Chand Mahajan was a politician and three time MP and Union Minister representing Kangra Parliamentary Constituency from Congress party between 1967 to 1971, 1972 to 1977, 1980 to 1984.

Prime Minister of Jammu and Kashmir After National Conference govt assumed office in Jammu and Kashmir in 1996 and in commemoration of the country's Golden Jubilee of Independence, the department of information headed by its Director KB Jandial took onerous project of publishing a book on 50 years in J&K.

I was fortunate to receive one copy of this masterpiece from none other than the Director himself almost 26 years ago when I was working for a leading English daily.

The book, which mainly focuses on the 50 years journey of Jammu and Kashmir before and after the partition, apart from delving deep-- from politics to partition to accession with India etc-- slightly sheds light on Mehr Chand Mahajan who served as Prime Minister of Jammu and Kashmir around the period of Independence, partition of India and J&K's accession with India.

RC Kak and Maj General Janak Singh had earlier served as Prime Ministers of Jammu and Kashmir. Before his appointment as Prime Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, Mahajan was a Judge in Punjab High Court during pre-independence era.

Though there are other books like Mehr Chand Mahajan's own autobiography "Looking Back" and Vidhya Dhar Mahajan's book titled " Chief Justice Mehr Chand Mahajan" which gives insight on life, work and profile of Mehr Chand Mahajan and his contributions towards the boundary demarcation, legal field, politics and the society at large, the book released by J&K Government 26 years ago carries eyewitness account of horrors of partition from an eminent journalist Sati Sahni dealing with the period between June 3 and November 3, 1947--from the time Mountbatten Plan for Independence was announced and up to the day the Emergency administration was established in Jammu and Kashmir.

Sati Sahni writes, "Major General Janak Singh, who was made Prime Minister on August 11 was not able to gear up the administration to meet the explosive situation. The Maharaja replaced him on October 15, 1947 by Mr Mehr Chand Mahajan. The situation all along the Pakistani border had become warlike. Telegrams were exchanged between Kashmir Government and the Pakistani Government accusing each other of creating trouble for the other".

That Justice Mahajan is credited with having played a key role in the State's accession to India becomes evident while going through the book.

"The Indian Government after receiving reports of Pakistani attack considered the fast developing situation and on October 25 sent Mr VP Menon, Secretary of the Ministry of States to Srinagar to take stock of the situation and report back. He met the Prime Minister Mr Mahajan and called on the Maharaja to leave for Jammu same evening along with his family in view of the enemy advance towards Srinagar. Mr Menon returned to New Delhi on October 26, along with Mr Mahajan. They conveyed to the ministers in New Delhi the desire of Maharaja Hari Singh to make his state part of Indian Dominion and seek assistance for defence of his state and its people. Same day both of them were flown to Jammu to complete the document of Instrument of Accession ... "Sahni writes.

Justice Mahajan was also the Prime Minister of Jammu & Kashmir from October 15,1947 to October 30, 1947 till Sheikh Mohd Abdullah replaced him on March 5, 1948. "The Maharaja did not do away with the Cabinet headed by the Prime Minister Mr Mehar Chand Mahajan. However, they did not function in the face of popular response to the Emergency Administration. On March 5, 1948, Sheikh Abdullah was made the Prime Minister", Sahni writes.

Punjab boundary Commission As on June 3, 1947, British declared independence under Mountbatten Plan. Sir Cyril Radcliff chaired two committees on division of India from Punjab and Bengal side. Where as Radcliff was a lawyer from England with no previous knowledge or experience of cartography, Mehr Chand Mahajan was made head of boundary commission on Punjab border. Though Mahajan had studied in Lahore, practicing there and also serving as Judge of Lahore High Court, even then he seemed to be helpless in retaining Lahore for India because the four member commission--two from Indian National Congress (Mehr Chand Mahajan, Teja Singh from Indian National Congress and Din Mohd and Mohd Munir from Muslim League) were not ready to part with the historic cities like Amritsar and Lahore. It was Radcliff whose decision mattered the most.

Even then Mahajan's involvement in the commission was marked by intense negotiations and debates over territorial claims. He represented India's interests with great zeal, ensuring that the rights and aspirations of Indian citizens were safeguarded. His efforts were particularly significant in securing areas like Gurdaspur for India, which had strategic and symbolic importance.

Despite his best efforts, Mahajan was deeply troubled by the violence and displacement caused by the partition. He viewed the commission's work as a necessary but painful step in the process of India's independence, and he remained committed to mitigating its adverse effects on affected communities. The boundary award was announced on August 17, 1947 which resulted into deaths of a million people and displacement of over 12 million on both the sides.

Role towards Judiciary

Mahajan's tenure as a judge of Supreme Court of India from 1948 to 1954 and later as Chief Justice of India from January 4, 1954 to December 22, 1954 was marked by several landmark judgments that have had a lasting impact on Indian jurisprudence.

One of his most notable contributions was his focus on upholding fundamental rights. As a judge, he frequently emphasized the importance of balancing individual freedoms with societal welfare. His judgments often highlighted the principles of equity, justice, and good conscience, making him a key figure in shaping India's post-independence legal framework.

One of his most impactful judgments was in State of Madras v. Champakam Dorairajan (1951).

This case dealt with the issue of castebased reservations in educational institutions. Champakam Dorairajan, a Brahmin woman, challenged the State of Madras' order that reserved seats in government colleges on the basis of caste, which restricted her admission opportunities.

Judgment: The Supreme Court, with Mehr Chand Mahajan as part of the bench, struck down this reservation order, ruling that it violated Article 15(1) of the Indian Constitution, which prohibits discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth. This judgment reaffirmed the constitutional principle of equality and ensured that no discriminatory practices could override fundamental rights.

The judgment also exposed the need for affirmative action to uplift historically disadvantaged communities, leading to the First Amendment of the Indian Constitution (1951), which added Article 15(4), enabling the State to make special provisions for the advancement of socially and educationally backward classes.

Notable judgment on freedom of speech Justice Mahajan's significant contributions to the legal landscape in India regarding freedom of speech came through the landmark case of Brij Bhushan v. State of Delhi (1950).

The case revolved around the pre-censorship order issued by the Delhi government against the magazine Organiser. The government sought to regulate the publication of material critical of Pakistan, following communal tensions post-Partition. The magazine challenged the restriction, claiming it infringed on their fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression under Article 19(1)(a) of the Indian Constitution. Judgment:

The Supreme Court, with Justice Mehr Chand Mahajan as a part of the bench, struck down the pre-censorship order as unconstitutional, ruling that such restrictions were not in line with Article 19(1)(a) and could not be justified under the reasonable restrictions provided in Article 19(2).

The judgment was among the first to uphold freedom of speech as a fundamental right, ensuring the press's autonomy and independence in a democratic setup.

It clarified that censorship could only be imposed under specific circumstances mentioned in Article 19(2), such as concerns for public order, security, or morality, and precensorship was not permissible without a clear justification.

Mahajan Sabha of Faridabad in Haryana has been organizing functions to commemorate the birth anniversaries of this towering figure. This year-135th anniversary celebrations were also organized where life of Mehr Chand Mahajan was celebrated and homage paid to him. On the invitation of President of the Sabha Dr Akhil Mahajan, I too got the opportunity to speak a few words where I made a suggestion for raising demand for bestowing Bharat Ratan upon Mehr Chand Mahajan and some within the audience took to social media urging the government for the same. Mr Dipak Thukral and Satinder Duggal were among others speakers who threw light on life and personality of Mehr Chand Mahajan. This gesture of Bharat Ratna demand would be the best tribute to remember contributions of this great human being who donned many hats when the pre and post independent India was facing tough times.

JAMMU, Dec 23: The Mission Statehood Jammu Kashmir held a strong protest rally on Janipur High Court Road against the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government and Home Minister Amit Shah for their noncommittal stance on restoring Jammu and Kashmir's statehood within a defined timeline. The protest, led by Sunil Dimple, President of Mission Statehood, highlighted the lack of progress on the issue during the recent Parliament session, which was overshadowed by debates on unrelated controversies.

Addressing the protestors, Sunil Dimple criticized the BJP government for allowing the Parliament session to focus on the Adani controversy, Ambedkar debates, and constitutional issues, while neglecting Jammu and Kashmir's pressing con-

former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Shah remained non-committal on the timeline for restoring statehood. Dimple demanded that the Prime Minister and Home Minister implement the Supreme Court's orders for the immediate restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood, in line with the Instrument of Accession conditions signed by Maharaja Hari Singh at the time of accession. He further accused the BJP government of causing

region's downgrade to Union Territory status. Highlighting governance issues, Dimple criticized the existence of dual power centers in Jammu and Kashmir, stating that it was detrimental to the region's stability and welfare. He demanded the unification of PoK, Gilgit, and Baltistan into Jammu and Kashmir as part of the statehood restoration process. He also called for the reinstatement of the state subject system and the cancellation of all domicile laws imposed postcriticized BJP leaders for claiming that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had never committed to a specific timeline for restoring statehood, despite the Supreme Court's directives to expedite the process.

Dimple announced plans to convene an allparty meeting in Jammu to strategize for the restoration of statehood, special status, and Articles 370 and 35-A. He accused the BJP government of being unwilling to address these demands and called for united action from all political factions.

He reiterated the demand for the implementation of the Instrument of Accession conditions and the reintroduction of the state subject system.



Spectacle is the new name of entertainment as films like Kalki 2898 AD proved. As the year saw its first major big-ticket release, Fighter, starring Hrithik Roshan and Deepika Padukone, its reassuring box-office status led us to believe that superstar vehicles can still run, if not fly. However, as the year passed by post-Covid reality and the changing landscape of entertainment hit

"BJP has no agenda to contest elections. They should tell the people



of Delhi what they have done for Delhi in 5 years," the former Chief Minister said. "AAP has done a lot

of work for Delhiites in terms of electricity, water, women's travel, roads and many other things. What work have these people done? The law and order situation in Delhi has collapsed. They have not done

any work. Now that they have come for elections, they are issuing chargesheets against me. They do not have a Chief Minister face," he added.

The BJP accused the ruling party in Delhi, AAP, and its convener Arvind Kejriwal of turning the national capital into a "corruption lab" through a series of

"scams".

"What kind of a party is this which came to power promising to give a corruption-free government but was involved in eight to nine scams related to the liquor policy, Delhi Jal Board, DTC, Waqf Board," BJP leader Anurag Thakur said, while releasing the

chargesheet. The BJP also accused AAP of failing to improve Delhi's healthcare, education, and infrastructure despite central funds, alleging misuse of public money on advertisements.

It also alleged that AAP was supporting "antinational" forces, questioning India's surgical strikes, and receiving backing from "Khalistani elements" during the Punjab elections.

Meanwhile, Congress also attacked Kejriwal, saying that the AAP chief will not be able to run the government.

"He can't always become a Chief Minister. For him, I don't think it is possible to even become an MLA. In New Delhi, the fight will be between Congress and BJP," Congress leader Sandeep Dikshit said.

"Even if he takes the oath as Chief Minister...he can't sign files, attend meetings, go to the CM office, as per the Supreme Court's instructions. So, what will the Chief Minister do?," he asked.

The elections for the 70-member Delhi Assembly are due to be held in February next vear.

PURNEA, Dec 23 (Agencies): At least five persons were killed and six others injured after a speeding pick-up van rammed them in Bihar's Purnea district.

The incident happened on Sunday night when a speeding pickup van driven by Sonu Kumar rammed into a group of 11 people standing near the Panchayat Bhawan in Dhakwa village, Purnea district. The vehicle initially hit a child, leading to a dispute between Sonu and the villagers.

Following the argument, Sonu allegedly drove his vehicle in a drunken and enraged state, deliberately running over the people.

The injured were rushed to a hospital where five persons lost their lives during treatment. They have been identified as Jyotish Thakur, 50, Sanyukta Devi, 45, Amardeep, 6, Akhilesh.11, and Manisha,11.

Six others, including Rajesh Muni, Abhinandan Muni, Shalu Kumar, Poonam Devi, Twinkle Kumari, and Nikki Devi, received severe injuries. Two remain in critical condition at Purnea Medical College Hospital.

The injured were initially taken to Dhamdaha Sub-divisional Hospital but were later referred to Purnea Medical College Hospital due to



their critical conditions. A case has been registered against Sonu Kumar based on the written complaint from the villagers. Police are conducting raids to arrest Sonu, who fled the scene.

Preliminary investigation suggests Sonu was intoxicated at the time of the incident and was driving at a fast speed. Residents have accused Sonu of intentionally targeting the group due to the earlier dispute.

The police officials sent the bodies of the deceased for post-mortem examinations on Monday morning.

Ranian Kumar, the incharge of the Dhamdaha Police Station, said, "On the written application of the local people, we have registered an FIR under relevant sections of rash and negligent driving against Sonu Kumar. We are continuously raiding to arrest Sonu Kumar. He has fled from the village. Information has been received that the accused has committed such a big incident over a small dispute. A complaint has been received that he was in a state of intoxication."

North Korea preparing for additional troop deployment, suicide drone supply to Russia: Seoul

No specific signs of provocation detected from the North, aims to expand their military cooperation with Russia: JCS

SEOUL, Dec 23 (Agencies): North Korea appears to be preparing to deploy additional troops and military equipment to Russia (including suicide drones) in support of Moscow's war against Ukraine, South Korea's military said on Monday

According to the South's spy agency, the assessment came as North Korea is believed to have sent thousands of troops to fight for Russia in its war against Ukraine, with the number of casualties estimated to be around 1,100, Yonhap news agency reported.

"A comprehensive assessment of multiple intelligence shows that North Korea is preparing to rotate or increase the deployment of troops (in Russia), while currently supplying 240-millimetre rocket launchers and 170 mm selfpropelled artillery," the Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said.

"There are also some signs of (the North) moving to manufacture and supply suicide drones, first unveiled during Kim Jong-un's on-site inspection in November," the JCS said, attributing the move to the North's efforts to gain practical warfare experience and modernise its conventional weapons system.



Last month, the North's state media reported that Kim observed an on-site test of various types of suicide attack drones and called for the fullscale production of weapons that are increasingly becoming important in modern warfare due to their cost-effectiveness.

The military is monitoring the situation, following signs, that the North has expressed its intent to provide loitering munitions to Russia, a JCS official told reporters.

The JCS said no specific signs of provocation have been detected from the North, adding that the country is focusing on expanding its military cooperation with Russia and stably managing its domestic environment ahead of a key year-end plenary party meeting. The military, however, did not

rule out the possibility of the North staging a surprise military provocation timed around the major political event, such as launching an intermediaterange ballistic missile (IRBM) tipped with a hypersonic warhead.

In April, North Korea said it successfully launched a new IRBM tipped with a hypersonic warhead, a claim that Seoul assessed as "unsuccessful," although it acknowledged that Pyongyang appears to have

made some progress in its hypersonic weapons program. Going forward, the JCS projected the North to continue with "grey zone" provocations next year, such as launching trashcarrying balloons and carrying out GPS jamming attacks.

"As the North has to concentrate on supporting Russia next year, it is likely to feel burdened by (the possibility of) causing military tension or conflicts that could lead to the creation of a new war front," the JCS said. "But the need for cooperation

on information sharing with the US as well as establishing a firm readiness posture is vital as there is also the possibility of the North attempting various provocations, such as an intercontinental ballistic missile launch or a nuclear test to enhance its bargaining power against the US"

The JCS also noted that the North's construction activities to reinforce border security are still underway, unveiling photos of North Korean troops testing electric barbed-wire fences with what appeared to be goats. Since April, the North has

mobilised thousands of soldiers to reinforce roads and install anti-tank barriers.

SEOUL, Dec 23 (Agencies): South Korea's main opposition party threatened on Monday to impeach acting president Han Duck-soo if he failed to proclaim a law to launch a special counsel investigation into President Yoon Suk Yeol's failed bid to impose martial law.

Prime Minister Han has taken over from the suspended Yoon, who was impeached on Dec. 14 and faces a Constitutional Court review on whether to oust him.

With a majority in parliament, the opposition Democratic Party passed a bill this month to appoint a special counsel to pursue charges of insurrection, among others, against the conservative Yoon and to investigate his wife over a luxury bag scandal and other allegations.

Park also accused Yoon of hampering the Constitutional Court trial by repeatedly refusing to accept court documents.

"Any delay in the investigation and impeachment trials is an extension of the insurrection and an act of plotting a second one," Park said. A joint investigative team including police and the Corruption Investigation Office for High-ranking Officials has made a second attempt to call Yoon in for questioning on Dec. 25, though it was unclear whether he would appear.

Woo Jong-soo, investigation chief of the national police agency, told parliament on Monday that police had tried to raid Yoon's office twice but the presidential security service denied them entry. Woo said his team sent a request to preserve evidence, including a secure phone server.

Australia approves extradition of ex-US Marine for allegedly training Chinese pilots

NEWCASTLE, Dec 23 (Agencies): Former U.S. Marine Corps pilot Daniel Duggan will be extradited from Australia to the United States over allegations that he illegally trained Chinese aviators.

Australia's Attorney General Mark Dreyfus approved the extradition on Monday, ending the Boston-born 55-yearold's nearly two-year attempt to avoid being returned to the U.S.

"Duggan was given the opportunity to provide representations as to why he should not be surrendered to the United States. In arriving at my decision, I took into consideration all material in front of me," Dreyfus said in the statement.

"For purposes of national security and freedom throughout the world, the United States of America feels that the ownership and control of Greenland is an absolute necessity," Trump wrote on Truth Social. While Greenland has autonomous

Japan's former Emperor Akihito marks his 91st birthday

WASHINGTON, Dec 23 (Agencies): Japan's beloved former Emperor Akihito marked his 91st birthday on Monday, as he continues to pursue his lifetime research into goby fish, care for his wife and pray for peace.

Akihito, who abdicated in 2019 and handed over the Chrysanthemum throne to his son, Emperor Naruhito, now holds the title of Emperor Emeritus.

Akihito has since receded from official duties and enjoys his time quietly while caring for his 90-year-old wife, former Empress Michiko, who broke her leg bone in October and is still recovering, according to the Imperial Household Agency. Akihito's daily routine includes reading newspapers in the morning and evening, and



watching the news with Michiko over meals, the IHA said.

The former Emperor was to celebrate his birthday on Monday with his relatives and other guests.

This year, Akihito has been particularly concerned about people who were affected by a fatal New Year earthquake and heavy rains in autumn in Japan's northcentral region of Noto, the IHA said. Akihito continues to

Akihito during his three-decade reign embraced an identity as peacemaker and often made reconciliatory missions and carefully scripted expressions of regret on the war.

Palace officials said Akihito continues to observe a moment of silence on days marking key events of the war, including the end of the Battle of Okinawa. the anniversaries of the U.S. atomic bombings on Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the day Japan surrendered

The former emperor's daily life is "still deeply connected with his wartime memories," the palace said. Akihito and Michiko are currently rehearsing passages from a book on the Battle of Okinawa as part of their daily routine, the IHA said.

UNITED NATIONS, Dec 23 (Agencies): A Christmas ceasefire between Moscow and Kiev, proposed by Hungary, could serve as an excellent platform towards a long-term peaceful settlement of the Ukraine crisis, Hungarian Foreign Minister

Peter Szijjarto told RIA Novosti. "We were right and we are right, that this war doesn't have a solution on the battlefield, just around the negotiating table, but in order to be able to sit around the negotiating table with the target of finding a long-term solution for peace, you need to

have the necessary circumstances, meaning ceasefire. I think that Christmas, which is approaching, could have meant or could



have provided a great platform for that, even if just for a couple of days. We could have saved lives of hundreds of thousands, and we would have been able to create a good example,' Szijjarto said.

He noted that Hungary's task was to make a proposal, but the next steps were up to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

"It's up to his responsibility, and let the Ukrainian people judge his decision," the Hungarian foreign minister added.

Pandas An An and Ke Ke celebrate their 1st Christmas in Hong Kong

HONG KONG, Dec 23 (Agencies): A pair of five-yearold pandas, named An An and Ke Ke, celebrated their first Christmas early in a Hong Kong park Monday, munching on special treats and looking cute for the cameras.

An An, the male panda, was presented with an ice slab that had "Merry Christmas" written on it with sweet potato and carrots while Ke Ke, his female companion, got a snowman garnished with slices of carrot and apple in a special press event before visitors streamed to the park.

China sent the pair to Hong Kong in late September in a bid to boost tourism in the city. They were quarantined for a couple of months before they made their debut to enthusiastic visitors at the city's Ocean Park theme park, joining four other pandas.

An An is described as intelligent and active while Ke Ke is known to have a gentle temperament and is a good climber.

Pandas are widely seen as China's unofficial national mascot, as they are only found in China's southwest and their population is under threat from development. The Chinese government actively breeds pandas and raises them as part of a national program. It also loans the animals out in an international program with overseas zoos as part of Beijing's soft-power diplomacy. Hong Kong's Ocean Park has been hosting pandas since 1999, when the first pair, An An and Jia Jia, arrived in the financial hub shortly after the former British colony returned to China.

Amitabh Yash, Additional Director General (Law and Order), Uttar Pradesh Police said the trio was involved in the grenade attack on a police checkpoint in Gurdaspur.

"The three sustained serious injuries in the encounter and were immediately rushed to CHC Puranpur for treatment," he said.

The ADG told agency that the three suspects later succumbed to their injuries.

Two AK-47 rifles, two Glock pistols, and a huge cache of ammunition were seized from them, he said.

In a post on X, the Punjab police chief said, "In a major breakthrough against a #Pak-sponsored Khalistan Zindabad Force(KZF) terror module, a joint operation of UP Police and Punjab Police has led to an encounter with three module members who fired at the police party."

He said this terror module is involved in the grenade attacks at police establishments in border areas of Punjab.

"The encounter has taken place in the jurisdiction of PS Puranpur, Pilibhit, between the joint police teams of Pilibhit & Punjab and the three module members are involved in the grenade attack on a police post in #Gurdaspur," he said.

Later in another post on X, DGP Yadav said. "This module is controlled by Ranjeet Singh Nita, the chief of KZF, and operated by Jaswinder Singh Mannu, based in #Greece, a resident of village Agwan. It is further controlled by Jagjeet Singh, based in the #UK and serving in the #British Army. Jagjeet Singh used the identity of Fateh

SRINAGAR, Dec 23: The Jammu & Kashmir Medical Council has issued a stern notice to all private clinics, poly-clinics, infertility centres, rehabilitation centres, de-addiction centres, hospices, domiciliary care providers, mobile clinics, and other clinical establishments across Jammu and Kashmir, warning against the engagement of unregistered allopathic medical practitioners

The council expressed serious concern over reports of practitioners operating without proper registration, terming it a breach of professional ethics and conduct. "Such actions violate ethics and pose a risk to patient safety," the notice stated.

The council directed all proprietors and managers of these establishments to ensure that only practitioners with valid permanent or additional qualification registration from the J&K Medical Council are allowed to practice or perform any procedures, surgeries, or therapies

They have been advised to immediately inform unregistered practitioners to apply online for registration through the official website of the J&K Medical Council. Failure to comply with these directives will lead to strict disciplinary action under the Professional Conduct, Etiquette & Ethics Regulations, 2002.

Chanu, who etched her name in history by ending India's 21-year Olympic medal drought in the sport with a silver at the Tokyo Games, embarked on a quest this year to achieve an extraordinary feat-a second consecutive Olympic medal in weightlifting

While no other Indian lifter came close to qualifying for the Paris Games, Chanu secured her spot with an underwhelming 184kg (81kg + 103kg) at the Phuket World Cup, while making a remarkable return from a sixmonth injury layoff.

"I do have a plan for Bumrah but I am not going to tell what it is. Trying to put pressure back on bowlers," Konstas told reporters on Monday, three days before his muchanticipated Test debut.

His predecessor in the opening slot, Nathan McSweeney, had said the same thing for Bumrah but was dismissed four out of five times by the premier bowler in three Tests, leading to his eventual exclusion from the squad.

Bumrah wasn't a part of the Indian attack in the two warm-up games in which Konstas got runs. So, who apart from Bumrah stood out?

"All are very good bowlers ... world-class, looking forward to experiencing that challenge and living that," he won't give away anything.

Konstas had a cheeky smile when asked



how his Christmas Eve used to be few years back

"Used to play backyard cricket with my brother and loads of food and they are coming over soon for Christmas," he said.

"It is amazing to get an opportunity at my age and it's a dream come true to represent my country," he added.

The entire Konstas family will be in attendance at the 'G' for his biggest day.

"It's a special day for me with my parents coming in. Plan is pretty simple, to back myself and savour it really," he added.

Tennis player Mark Phillippoussis was the first renowned Australian international sportsperson of Greek heritage and Konstas could become the second one considering how big a melting pot the country's sporting teams have been over the years.

"It's a special feeling I think and sacrifices that they (parents) have made to take me to games of cricket and experiencing the highs and lows. Just to give back something to them is special," Konstas was a touch emotional speaking about how the family reacted. He had played at MCG for New South Wales when local hero Scott Boland got him out.

"It is a different wicket from when I have played earlier. Bowler friendly but playing at the MCG on sell out Boxing Day is a dream come true." His game has reminded a lot of people of Shane Watson and with two good innings against India A and the senior team, including a hundred in a pink ball practice match, he is ready to be the aggressor.

"I don't look too much on social media but would take that as a compliment," he seemed a bit shy as he spoke.




