#### **Full Military** honours accorded to 3 soldiers killed in J&K accident

BELAGAVI (Karnataka), Dec 26 (Agencies): Glowing tributes were paid on Thursday to three soldiers from Karnataka, who were killed in an accident in Jammu and Kashmir on December 24.

Kundapura's Anoop Pujari (33), Mahesh Nagappa Marigond (25) from Bagalkote and Dayanand Thirakannavar (44) from Belagavi were among the five killed after their vehicle plunged into a gorge in Poonch district, Jammu and Kashmir.

They were from the 11 Maratha Light Infantry. Their bodies were flown to Belagavi on Thursday where they were given military honour at the Maratha Light Infantry Regimental Centre (MLIRC).

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, who is in Belagavi, laid a wreath on the mortal remains of the soldiers and offered his tribute.

The Chief Minister said he was "deeply pained" to learn about the deaths of three soldiers

#### **Centre proposes coal law extension** to Jammu and Kashmir

JAMMU, Dec 26 (Agencies): The Union Government has proposed amendments to the Coal Bearing Areas (Acquisition and Development) Act-1957 to make it applicable to Jammu & Kashmir.

According to the draft bill, the amendment proposes to omit the words "except the State of Jammu and Kashmir." The Coal Bearing Areas (Acquisition and Development) Amendment Bill, 2024, proposes to extend the law to Jammu & Kashmir, which was previously excluded.

NEW DELHI, Dec 26 (Agencies): Indian Railways has successfully carried out a trial run of a tower wagon on the Anji Khad Bridge, the country's first cable-stayed rail bridge, located in Jammu and Kashmir's

Reasi district.

The achievement is a major step forward in enhancing railway connectivity in Jammu and Kashmir, with services expected to commence in January 2025.

Railways Minister Ash-

wini Vaishnaw shared a video of the trial run on the social media platform X, highlighting the progress of the crucial project.

"The trial run on the Anji Khad Bridge, a key component of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Railway Link (USBRL) project, has been successfully completed," according to the Ministry of Railways.

### DFSS holds protest against inflation



#### **Top News Report**

JAMMU. Dec 26: Food inflation remained a significant concern throughout the year, with vegetable prices experiencing a particularly sharp surge.

While retail inflation (CPI) saw a slight decline in November, dropping to 5.48% from 6.21% in October, and wholesale inflation (WPI) moderated to 1.89% from 2.36% during the same period, the cost of essential commodities continued to burden household budgets.

The elevated food prices have significantly impacted consumer behavior, with households reducing discretionary spending. Retailers reported a slowdown in sales of electronics and home

appliances during the festive season, attributing the trend to consumers diverting a larger share of their income to groceries and other necessities. An EY report highlighted rising household debt due to

increased borrowing

through personal loans

and credit cards, fur-

ther limiting consumer

spending. In response to the escalating vegetable prices, the workers of Dogra Front and Shiv Sena (DFSS), led by their president Ashok Gupta, staged a rally in Jammu city. The protest aimed to draw attention to the government's inaction in addressing

prices. During the protest, Gupta criticized the political focus of the recent winter session

the issue of high food

that the pressing issue of food inflation was not discussed even once.

He highlighted the disparity between the low payments received by farmers and the massive profits earned by black marketeers.

Gupta pointed to the Punjab government's practice of releasing daily price lists for vegetables and commodities, ensuring prices remain controlled. In contrast. the lack of such measures in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir has led to inflated prices and unchecked profiteering.

The protesters demanded the formation of a government price committee to regulate daily prices and curb black market activities. Such measures, they argued, would protect the common man from inflation and ensure fair compensation for farmers.

Among the protesters were several prominent party members, including Bantu, Kalu, Nanku, Ashish, Naresh, Vikky, Sukhdev, Prem, and others, who expressed solidarity with the cause and called for immediate government intervention.

### JKFD employees protest over neglect by authorities

JAMMU, Dec 26: Employees of the Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department (JKFD) staged a protest at the Forest Complex Dogra Hall in Jammu today, expressing their frustration over what they described as step motherly treatment by the authorities. The demonstration, organized by the All Jammu and Kashmir Non-Gazetted Forest **Employees Association** (NGFOA), drew employees from various districts, all united in highlighting several long-standing issues that have adversely impacted their welfare and working conditions.

One of the major grievances raised was the prolonged delay in conducting Departmental **Promotion Committees** (DPCs) in Jammu Prov-

ince. Employees lamented that the delay has unfairly deprived them of their rightful promotions, leaving many disillusioned about their career progression. This issue. they said, has persisted despite repeated assurances from the authori-

The reorganization of the Forest Department was another pressing concern. Despite numerous requests from the NGFOA, the matter remains unresolved, causing operational inefficiencies and hindering the department's overall effectiveness. Employees demanded immediate action to address this critical issue.

Pay anomalies were also highlighted during the protest. Forest Guards. Revenue Patwaris, and Teachers were initially assigned the same grade

pay, but while the grades of Patwaris and Teachers have been revised upward over time. Forest Department employees have been left behind. Protesters described this disparity as unjust and tification.

The frontline staff also raised concerns about their working conditions. Despite working 24/7 under tough and often dangerous circumstances, they have not been granted the right to two days' salary. Additionally, employees called for the introduction of a risk allowance, citing the lifethreatening nature of their work. Over 140 Forest Department employees have tragically lost their lives while on duty, yet no risk allowance has been provided to recognize the

hazards they face daily. Speaking at the pro-

test, key NGFOA leaders, including Rajinder Singh Parihar (President, J&K UT All J&K NGFOA), Gurcharan Singh (Provincial President, Jammu Province), and Ghulam Nabi War (General Secretary, J&K UT), criticized the indifferent attitude of the authorities. They emphasized the dedication and integrity with which Forest Department employees perform their duties, often going above and beyond their official responsibilities. However, they expressed disappointment that their contributions are routinelv ignored, leaving them feeling like "bonded labor-

The NGFOA announced a two-day mass casual leave on December 27 and 28, 2024, urging employees to stage protests in their respective office complexes. They also called for continued demonstrations at the Forest Complex Dogra Hall, Jammu, to press for their legitimate rights. The association reaffirmed its commitment to fighting for justice and demanded immediate action from the authorities to resolve these long-standing

JAMMU, Dec 26: The National Statistics Office (NSO), Field Operations Division (FOD), Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Government of India, conducted a fourday Regional Training Camp for the 80th Round National Sample Survey (NSS), Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS), and Annual Survey of Unincorporated Sector Enterprises (ASUSE) from December 23 to 26, 2024. The event was held at the Conference Hall of Hotel Country

attended by officers and field staff from the NSO Regional Office, Jammu; Sub-Regional Office, Udhampur; and the Directorate of Economics & Statistics (DES), J&K Government. The first three days

focused on the NSS 80th Round, including a modified PLFS schedule and the Household Social Consumption: Health survey, alongside a Comprehensive Modular Survey (CMS) on telecom. The Household Social Consumption: Health survey aims to collect data on mor-



bidity rates, utilization of healthcare services, and related expenditures across public and private sectors. The CMS on telecom addresses data gaps in telecomrelated indicators and ICT skills, crucial for reporting global indices and supporting national ministries.

The camp began on December 23 with a ceremonial lamp-lighting and the National Anthem, presented by Senior Statistical Officer Sunil K. Khar. Deputy Director General P.

Palanivel inaugurated the training, emphasizing the NSO's role in creating a robust statistical database for national and international use. He highlighted the significance of the ongoing surveys and urged public cooperation in

providing accurate data. Assistant Director R.K. Sharma welcomed the participants, providing an overview of NSO surveys, while Assistant Director Swaran Lal delivered a vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the media and participants.

The first two days were dedicated to discussions on concepts, definitions, technical terms, and schedules, with specific attention to data entry using CAPI (Computer-Assisted Personal Interviewing) for the 80th Round. The third day focused on field training

and discussions on the revised sampling design and PLFS schedule, concluding with a feedback and quiz session to assess trainee understanding

The final day, December 26, was dedicated to the ASUSE survey. Practical training sessions in nearby areas of Jammu Town were conducted, followed by a feedback and quiz

session in the afternoon. Training sessions were led by Assistant Director R.K. Sharma and Senior Statistical Officers Sunil K. Khar and P.S. Jamwal, with Sunil

### Revitalizing Agriculture

griculture has been the backbone of Jammu and Kashmir's economy for centuries. The picturesque landscapes of the region, with its fertile plains, lush valleys, and abundant water resources, offer immense potential for agricultural growth. However, over the years, the agricultural sector has faced several challenges, ranging from climatic variations and outdated farming practices to socio-political instability and limited market access. To ensure the sustainable growth of agriculture and the overall economic prosperity of Jammu and Kashmir, a focused and comprehensive approach to revitalizing the sector is needed.

Jammu and Kashmir's agricultural sector faces a number of pressing challenges. Many farmers still rely on outdated tools and techniques, leading to low productivity and inefficiency. It was Vajpayee as the prime minister who laid the strong foundation of infrastructure which helped and catapulted the economic, social, technological and cultural development of India .Through his unimpeachable leadership, Vajpayee nurtured secularism ,democracy, humanity and above all his honesty inspired countless people .Born in Gwaliar MP on December 25,1924 into a family steeped in values and education ,Vajpayee imbibed the essence of nationalism from an early age. His father ,Krishna Bihari Vajpayee ,a school teacher and a scholar, was instrumental in shaping Atal's intellectual and spiritual pursuits .He was influenced by the views of Savarkar and Jansung Ideologue Lt.Dr Shyama Prasad and was an active member of RSS and he boasted of his Sangh credentials .Vajpayee was the great advocate ,votary and epitome of good governance and stood for it throughout his career as the prime minister .The good governance Day or Sushasan diwas ,is marked on December 25 every year in India to commemorate the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister A.B. It is observed to guarantee that the nation's citizens are treated equitably by the government and that they get a chance to avail themselves of the benefits of diverse government services .A poet -politician ,Atal Ji was born on December 25,1924,in Gwalior ,MP ,which is why good governance Day is celebrated every year in India on December 25, and in 2024, it was observed on Wednesday .Atal Ji ,the first leader of the BJP ,served as the India's Prime Minister three times briefly in 1996, for 13 months in 1998, and 1999, and for full -time from 1999 to 2004. Vajpayee revolutionized and transformed infrastructure, agriculture economy, public life and even politics, and took many great steps and strides .Wednesday ,December 25, marked the 100th birth anniversary of Atal Bihari

Vajpayee, a recipient of India's highest civilian honor, the Bharat Ratna, is celebrated for his outstanding political contributions, including his leadership in shaping India's post-independence political and economic landscape .President Droupadi Murmu ,PM Narendra Modi and NDA cabinet members paid homage to former Prime Minister and BJP founding president Atal Ji at his memorial ,"Sadaiv Atal," on his 100th birth anniversary .Vajpayee served as Prime Minister of India three times and played a pivotal role in elevating the BJP to national prominence, driving major political and economic reforms during his tenure, significantly shaping India's trajectory .Vajpayee served as India's external affairs minister in 1977 under Morarji Desai's Janata Party government. His diplomatic approach contributed to India's foreign policy during a turbulent time in the country's political history .First elected to Lok Sabha in 1957 from Balrampur ,UP ,Vajpayee became the only leader to win elections from six different constituencies across Uttar Pradesh ,MP ,New Delhi ,and Gujarat solidifying his influence in Indian politics . Despite fluency in English ,Vajpayee's speeches shone brightest in Hindi. Known as 'Shabdoo Ka Jadugar", his oratory in Hindi is equally famous .Vajpayee became an activist of RSS at very young age and it instilled in him the principles of selfless service ,cultural pride ,and unwavering commitment to Bharat Mata . Even as a student ,Vajpayee exhibited remarkable oratory and writing skills .His essays and speeches reflected his deep understanding of Hindutva, nationalism, and governance. His formative years in RSS and his association with stalwarts like Guru Golwalkar laid the foundation for his lifelong dedication to the cause of Hindutva and Bharat's resurgence. Vajpayee's entry into politics began with the formation of the Bharatiya Jan Sangh -BJS in 1951 under the leadership of Dr Shyama Parasad Mukherjee .As a founding member, Vajpayee became the voice of a nationalist Bharat ,tirelessly advocating for cultural and ideological unity. His speeches in parliament were a masterpiece in statesmanship ,blending intellectual rigor with ideological conviction. These were a clarion call for India to reclaim its civilizational heritage while navigating modern challenges .His consistent advocacy for the

abolition of Article 370 and his vision for a united India underlined his unwavering commitment to cultural nationalism .In emergency of 1975, Vajpayee's unwavering commitment to democratic values and Hindutva were spectacular . 

### Eye on key BMC polls, Uddhav begins exercise to review position of Sena (UBT) in Mumbai

MUMBAI, Dec 26 (Agencies): Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Thursday started a three-day exercise to assess his party's position in Mumbai. where civic polls are likely to be held next year, one of his close aides said.

After the split in the Bal Thackeray-founded Shiv Sena in 2022, the recently concluded assembly elections were seen as a litmus test for Uddhav's party, which is a constituent of the opposition bloc Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA).

However, the MVA performed disastrously winning only 46, including 20 by Sena (UBT), of the state's 288 assembly seats. Of the 36 assembly seats in Mumbai, Sena (UBT) contested in 21 constituencies and won 10.

Sena (UBT) leader Anil

Parab said, "Uddhav ji is taking stock of the poll preparedness of Sena (UBT) in all 227 municipal wards of Mumbai. The deliberations will go on for three days." Local body elections, including in Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), could be held in March-April 2025 if the Supreme Court gives its verdict over the "OBC (Other Backward Class)

quota" in January. Following the setback

in the state polls, the Sena (UBT) is keen to retain the BMC, which is among Asia's richest civic bodies. The corporation's last budget outlay stood at nearly Rs 60,000 crore, higher than some states in the country.

The five-year term of most municipal corporations, including the BMC, and many other local bodies in the state expired in 2022.

In December 2021, the Supreme Court had ruled that reservation for OBCs in local bodies would not be allowed unless the government fulfilled the triple test laid down in the apex court's 2010 order. It had ruled



that until the triple test criteria was fulfilled, OBC seats would be renotified as general category seats.

The triple test required the state government to set up a dedicated commission to gather data on the backwardness of OBCs in every local body, to specify the proportion of reservation in each local body in light of the commission's recommendations, and ensure that such reservation does not exceed the overall 50 per cent quota ceiling.

#### 'Shameful, condemnable': Rahul slams police action against protesting **BPSC** candidates in Patna



NEW DELHI, Dec 26 (Agencies): Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi Thursday condemned the police action on protesting Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) candidates in Patna and claimed that the NDA government is "resorting to lathicharging students" to hide its own failures.

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra also slammed the BJP over the police action, saying the ruling party's only vision is to save its chair and whoever demands employment is oppressed.

In a post in Hindi on X, Rahul Gandhi said, "I had said in Parliament that in the same way that Eklavya's thumb was cut off, the thumbs of the youth were being chopped off by paper leaks." "The latest example of this is Bihar. BPSC candidates are raising their voice against the paper leak and demanding cancellation of the exam. But to hide its failure, the NDA government is instead resorting to lathi-charge on the students," the former Congress chief said.

"This is extremely shameful and condemnable. Playing with the future of students will not be tolerated. We

are with them and will

fight to get them jus-

tice," he said.

Chaos erupted during a protest in Patna on Wednesday over the alleged leak of a question paper of the December 13 combined preliminary exam conducted by BPSC, prompting the police to baton charge job aspirants

Job seekers claimed that several protesters were injured during the police action but a senior officer denied the charge.

"Lathi charge on youths who had their hands folded is the height of cruelty. In BJP rule, youths demanding employment are beaten with sticks. Be it UP, Bihar or Madhya Pradesh - if youths raise their voice, they are brutally beaten," Priyanka Gandhi said in a post in Hindi on her WhatsApp channel.

"It is the government's job to think about the future of the youth of the world's youngest country and make policies for it. But the BJP only has the vision of saving its chair," she

Whoever demands employment oppressed, the Congress MP added.

The Congress had condemned the police action on job aspirants. while Independent MP from Purnea Rajesh Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav called for a Bihar bandh on January 1, 2025, if the December 13 combined preliminary examination is not cancelled.

The police registered a case against protestors in connection with Wednesday's incident. The protesters claimed that several job seekers were injured in the baton charge, which the police denied.

Video clips of the police action against job aspirants went viral on social media with some showing personnel chasing and beating up protesters, including women.

PTI could not verify the authenticity of the video clips.

Protesters were seen raising slogans against the BPSC officials and demanding the cancellation of the December 13 combined preliminarv exam.

The job aspirants have been demanding the cancellation of the preliminary examination of the BPSC and have requested the commission to announce a fresh date for the test at the earliest.

#### Man stabs girlfriend to death in Assam, attempts suicide: police

GUWAHATI. Dec 26 (Agencies): A woman was stabbed to death by her boyfriend, who then attempted suicide, in Guwahati on Thursday morning, police said.

The accused, who stabbed himself, is undergoing treatment and will soon be arrested, the police added.

The attack on the woman, Mousumi Gogoi, took place outside her residence in Late Gate area, and was captured on CCTV. According to Director General of Police (DGP) GP Singh, Gogoi was



waiting for a vehicle she had booked through an app-based service when the accused, Bhupen Das, arrived in his car and stabbed her before fleeing the spot.

The woman was

rushed to a nearby hospital, where she succumbed to injuries.

Mr Singh said that Das was later apprehended from near the Housing complex area. "He has self-stabbed himself and is being admitted to the hospital," he said in a post on X.

Police sources said Gogoi had earlier filed a complaint against the man at Pan Bazar Police Station, alleging threat to her life.

A case has been registered and further probe is underway, the sources said.

### Over 70 hours on, rescue efforts continue for girl trapped in borewell in Rajasthan

JAIPUR, Dec 26 (Agencies): Three-yearold Chetna has been stuck inside a narrow 150 feet deep borewell for over 70 hours as the rescue operations were still underway on Thursday to save the girl.

Worried about her daughter's condition, Dholi Devi has not eaten anything since the tragic accident on Monday.

Chetna fell into the borewell while playing in the agriculture farm of her father in Badiyali Dhani under Sarund police station of Kotputli-Behror district.

With each passing moment, the hope for the girl being well is diminishing as the rescue team was not able to supply any food or water to Chetna.

Dholi Devi and others are constantly praying for the well being of Chetna amid the non-stop rescue operation by NDRF and SDRF teams, assisted by the local police



and administration.

Initially, efforts were made to pull the girl out of the borewell with the help of a ring but all attempts failed.

After two days of repeated attempts that fetched no results, a piling was brought to the spot on Wednesday morning and a pit parallel to the borewell was dug.

'.... Now a horizontal tunnel will be made through which the experts will reach the girl," Sarund SHO Mohammad Imran said.

He said all possible efforts were made to pull out the girl but all hard work went in vain as the borewell is narrow and the technique could not deliver results.

A team of doctors with an ambulance are

"The rescue operation is likely to conclude today," the SHO said.

Kotputli-Behror District Collector Kalpana Agarwal reached the village late Wednesday

night to take stock of the situation. She said that the rescue operation had been constantly going on. A lot of preparations had to be done to bring the piling

machine to the farm. Two weeks ago, a five year old boy fell into a borewell in Dausa district and the rescue operation lasted over 55 hours.

However, the boy had lost the battle for life by that time he was taken out.

#### Middle-aged couple in Andhra dies by suicide over son's decision to marry transgender

NANDYAL, Dec 26 (Agencies): A middleaged couple allegedly died by suicide in Nandyal district after their 24-year-old son expressed his desire to marry a transgender person.

According to Nandyal sub-divisional police officer P Srinivas Reddy, Subba Rayudu (45) and Saraswati (38) took their lives after conflicts over their son, Sunil Kumar associating with the local transgender community for the past three years.

Kumar had been in a relationship with a transgender person for three years and was adamant about not marrying a woman.



He insisted on staying with the transgender person, leading to frequent quarrels with his parents.

Kumar had previously attempted suicide over the matter, police said on Thursday.

Further investigation revealed that Kumar had spent Rs 1.5 lakh belonging to the transgenders, prompting them to demand the amount from his parents and cause nuisance. The public insults directed at his parents by members of the transgender community compounded their distress and drove them to take the extreme step, they said.

An investigation is on.

#### 45-year-old farmer beaten to death over land dispute in **UP's Bareilly**

BAREILLY, Dec 26 (Agencies): A 45-yearold farmer was allegedly beaten to death over an old land dispute in the Fatehgaj area here, police said on Thursday.

The incident occurred on Wednesday night when Ahilkar, a resident of village Vandiya Khurd, was on his way to deliver food to his son at a field, said Fatehganj police station incharge Inspector Santosh Kumar.

At that time, some villagers stopped Ahilkar, hurled abuses at him and allegedly beat him with sticks before attacking him with

sharp weapons, Kumar said.

The farmer was taken to Faridpur Community Health Centre and given first aid, Kumar said. He was later referred

to a private hospital in Bareilly city, where he died during treatment. The inspector added

that the body has been sent for a post-mortem. According to the police, the incident stemmed from an old land dispute.

Based on a complaint from the deceased's relatives, a case has been registered against four individuals and an investigation is ongoing.

#### **MBBS** student from Assam dies by suicide at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar BHUBANESWAR, Assam.

Dec 26 (Agencies): A second-year MBBS student allegedly died by suicide at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar, police said on Thursday.

The body of Ratnesh Kumar Mishra (21), a resident of Dibrugarh in Assam, was found hanging from the ceiling fan in his hostel room on Wednesday, they said.

Police suspect that financial crisis in his family led Mishra to take his life.

Before hanging himself, he sent an audio message to his younger brother, requesting their father not to sell their land.

He also asked his brother to become a doctor but stay in

In the note found in his room, Mishra said nobody was responsible for his death, according to police.

His second-year examination was supposed to start on Thursday, and he returned to the campus from home after a 10-day vacation on Tuesday. His father had accompanied him back to Bhubaneswar

this time. Mishra was supposed to visit the temple town of Puri on Wednesday along with his father, who was staying at a hotel outside the campus.

The father told reporters that he spoke to Mishra in the morning, but could not reach him on his mobile later. As repeated calls went unanswered, he rushed to his hostel and found the door locked from inside.

With no response even after repeated bangings, the father along with some students broke into the room to find the body of Mishra.

He was immediately taken to the Emergency Room of the hospital, where he was declared dead, police said.

AIIMS-Bhubaneswar Director Ashutosh Biswas visited the hostel room later in the day.

A case of unnatural death was registered at the Khandagiri police station, and an investigation was started, police said.

### S. Korean opposition submits motion to impeach the country's acting president

SEOUL, Dec 26 (Agencies): South Korea's main opposition party submitted a motion on Thursday to impeach the country's acting leader over his reluctance to fill three Constitutional Court vacancies ahead of the court's review of rebellion charges against impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol stemming from his short-lived martial law decree on Dec. 3.

The court appointments have stalled amid an intensifying dispute between the liberal opposition and Yoon's conservative party, and the potential impeachment of Prime Minister Han Duck-soo may deepen the political paralysis that has halted high-level diplomacy and rattled financial markets.

The opposition-controlled National Assembly also passed motions calling for the appointment of three Constitutional Court justices as the court prepares to start deliberations on whether to dismiss or reinstate Yoon. The vote came shortly after Han reiterated in a televised statement that he wouldn't appoint the justices without bipartisan consent.

National Assembly Speaker Woo Won Shik urged Han to swiftly appoint the justices, saying that his calls for bipartisan consent essentially amounted to a refusal and "infringes on the National Assembly's right to select Constitutional Court justices."

Yoon's People Power Party, whose members mostly boycotted the National Assembly vote, argued that Han shouldn't exercise presidential authority to appoint the proposed justices while Yoon has yet to be formally removed from office.

The main opposition Democratic Party has accused the conservatives of undermining the court process to save Yoon's presidency, and its



motion to impeach Han could go to a floor vote as early as Friday. The Democrats' floor leader, Park Chan-dae, said Han's comments showed "he lacks both the qualifications to serve as the acting leader and the will to uphold the Constitution."

Yoon's presidential powers were suspended after the National Assembly voted to impeach him on Dec. 14 over an attempted power grab that lasted only hours but has triggered weeks of political turmoil that has shaken one of Asia's most robust democra-

To formally end Yoon's presidency, at least six justices on the nine-member Constitutional Court must vote in favor. Three seats remain vacant following retirements and a full bench could make conviction more likely.

The court, which is to hold a pretrial hearing in Yoon's case on Friday, has said it believes the acting president can exercise the right to appoint jus-

Three of the court's nine justices are directly appointed by the president. Three are nominated by the head of the Supreme Court and three by the National Assembly, and they are then formally appointed by the president in what is widely considered a procedural matter.

The three seats that are currently open are to be nominated by lawmakers. South Korea's Constitution states that the National Assembly "selects" three spots on the court rather than recommends, suggesting that the presidential appointments for these spots are a formal-

ity rather than a substantive

authority, according to some

legal experts. "The consistent spirit reflected in our Constitution and laws is that an acting president should focus on maintaining stability in governance to help the country overcome crisis while refraining from exercising significant powers exclusive to the president, including appointments to constitutional institutions," Han said. "I will withhold the appointment of Constitutional Court justices until the ruling and opposition parties submit an agreedupon proposal.'

Han has also clashed with the Democrats over his vetoes of controversial agricultural bills endorsed by the opposition and refusal to approve bills calling for independent investigations of Yoon and corruption allegations involving his wife. Kim Keon Hee.

If Han is impeached, Choi Sang-mok, the country's deputy prime minister and finance minister, is next in line. The impeachment vote

against Han could face legal ambiguities. Most South Korean officials can be impeached with a simple majority of the National Assembly, but impeaching presidents requires twothirds. The rival parties differ on which standard should apply to an acting president. The Democratic Party controls 170 of the National Assembly's 300 seats, so it would need support from members of other parties including Yoon's own to get a two-thirds major-

While focusing on defending himself in the Constitutional Court, Yoon has dodged several requests by law enforcement authorities to appear for questioning over rebellion charges and also blocked searches of his office. The Corruption Investigation Office for High-Ranking Officials, which is leading a joint investigation with police and military authorities of Yoon, summoned him for questioning this Sunday after he ignored a request to appear on Christmas Day. The office plans to question Yoon on charges of abuse of authority and orchestrating a rebellion.

Authorities have already arrested Yoon's defense minister, police chief and several other military commanders involved in the attempt to implement martial law, which harkened back to the days of authoritarian leaders the country hasn't seen since the 1980s.

In a news conference in Seoul, Yoo Seung Soo, lawyer for former Defense Minister Kim Yong Hyun, repeated Yoon's claim that his martial law decree was to "sound alarm against ... political abuse" by an opposition that has bogged down his agenda, and did not amount to a rebel-

lion.

#### Prayers and tears mark 20 years since the Indian Ocean tsunami that killed some 230,000 people



BANDA ACEH, Dec 26 (Agencies): People started gathering in prayer on Thursday and visiting the mass graves in Indonesia's Aceh province to mark 20 years since the massive Indian Ocean tsunami, one of modern history's worst natural disasters.

Many openly wept at the mass grave in Ulee Lheue village, where more than 14,000 unidentified and unclaimed tsunami victims are buried. It is one of several mass graves in Banda Aceh, the capital of Indonesia's northernmost province. It was one of the areas worst-hit by the earthquake and tsunami, along with the district of Aceh Besar.

A powerful 9.1-magnitude earthquake off the coast of the Indonesian island of Sumatra on Dec. 26, 2004, triggered a tsunami that killed around 230,000 people across a dozen countries, reaching as far as East Africa. Some 1.7 million people were displaced, mostly in the four worst-affected countries:

India and Thailand. More than 170,000 people died in Indonesia alone. Even though 20 years have passed, the grief remains and survivors still remember their loved ones, lost to the giant waves that flattened buildings in most of the coastal areas of Aceh — all the way to the city

Indonesia, Sri Lanka,

The infrastructure in Aceh has been rebuilt and is now more resilient than it was before the tsunami struck. Early warning systems have been installed in coastal areas to alert residents of potential tsunamis, providing crucial time to seek safety.

The rebuilding efforts were made possible by the support of international donors and organizations, who contributed significant funds to help the region recover. Schools, hospitals, and essential infrastructure that were destroyed by the disaster have been reconstructed with enhanced strength and durability, ensuring better preparedness for future challenges.

The tsunami also claimed the lives of over 8,000 people in Thailand, including many who remain missing, leaving a deep scar on the nation's history. Nearly 400 bodies remain unidentified and unclaimed.

### Japan Airlines hit by cyber attack, flights delayed

TOKYO, Dec 26 (Agencies): Japan Airlines (JAL) said on Thursday it was hit by a cyber attack that caused delays to some domestic and international

The attack began at 7.24 am and affected the company's internal and external systems, JAL said.

The company said it temporarily shut down a router that was causing system malfunctions and also suspended ticket sales for flights departing on Thursday.

ANA Holdings, Japan's other major air carrier, saw no signs of an attack on its



systems, a spokesperson said. Earlier this week, American Airlines briefly grounded all flights for an hour, disrupting travel for thousands on Christmas Eve, due to a technical glitch

involving its network hardware.

#### At least 10 killed in Israeli strikes on Gaza, medics say

GAZA STRIP, Dec 26 (Agencies): At least 10 people were killed and more than a dozen wounded in Israeli strikes on Gaza early on Thursday, medics with the Gaza health authorities said.

Five people were killed and 20 wounded in an Israeli airstrike on a house in Gaza City's Zeitoun neighborhood, the medics reported. They warned the deaths could rise as many remained trapped under the rubble.

In a separate incident. five journalists were killed when their vehicle was struck in the vicinity of Al-Awda



hospital in Nuseirat in central Gaza, the enclave's health authorities said. The iournalists worked for the Al-Quds Al-Youm television channel.

Palestinian media and local reporters said the vehicle was marked as a media van and was used by journalists to report from

inside the hospital and Nuseirat camp.

There was no immediate Israeli comment on the reported strikes. On Wednesday, Pal-

estinian group Hamas and Israel traded blame over their failure to conclude a ceasefire agreement despite progress reported by both sides in past days.

### Former Presidential candidate in Taiwan, Ko Wen-je, indicted for corruption TAIPEI, Dec 26 (Agen-

cies): Prosecutors in Taiwan indicted former presidential candidate and Taiwan People's Party founder Ko Wen-je on corruption charges Thursday, accusing him of taking bribes during his time as mayor of the island's capital.

Ko, a former mayor of Taipei, is accused of accepting bribes related to a real estate development during his time in office, according to the prosecutors' statement. He's also accused of embezzling political donations.

If convicted on all charges, he faces a



possible 28.5 years in

Core to the case is a development owned by Core Pacific City group in Taipei. Prosecutors say Ko allowed the company to evade city

building regulations in

exchange for bribes.

"The defendant, Ko, violated his vow as a mayor to not accept bribes, and abide by our national laws. Instead, Ko intended to help the

dollars in illegal benefits, while collecting millions in bribes," said Kao Yi-shu, the lead prosecutor, while unveiling the charges Thursday.

Ko has previously denied the allegations of bribery and corruption.

Ko, a former doctor, burst onto the political scene to win Taipei's 2014 mayoral race. He served two terms from 2014 to 2022.

Ko founded the TPP in 2019 as an alternative to the two-party system, promising a break from politics as usual.

He ran for President this year. Despite finishing third, he attracted attention for his appeal to young voters. Taiwan's politics is mostly dominated by two main political parties, the Nationalist Party (Kuomingtang) and the **Democratic Progressive** Party.

Ko's Taiwan People's Party, while small, is allied with the Kuomingtang in Taiwan's legislature and helped it pass three laws last week that critics say have paralyzed the Constitutional Court and will weaken Taiwan President Lai Ching-te's ability to carry out his political agenda.

#### Russia ready for consultations with Trump on Ukraine: Lavrov



MOSCOW, Dec 26 (Agencies): Russia is ready to hold consultations with the administration of US Presidentelect Donald Trump on Ukraine and hopes the White House will study the root causes of the conflict, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said on Thursday.

"I very much hope that Trump's administration, including [Trump's special envoy to Ukraine and Russia Keith] Kellogg, will get to the root causes of the conflict. We are always ready for consultations," Lavrov told a press conference for Russian and foreign media.

#### Fans confront Khalistani group desecrating Indian flag during Australia game

MELBOURNE, Dec 26 (Agencies): The first day of the Boxing Day Test match at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG) between India and Australia on Thursday saw heated action not only on the field but off it as well as Indian fans confronted Khalistan supporters outside the stadium over chanting anti-India slogans and allegedly desecrating the national flag.

A pro-Khalistan group gathered outside the stadium on Thursday morning. The group was seen waving Khalistani flags, shouting slogans against India and desecrating the Indian flag. In a video being widely circulated



across social media, the Khalistani radicals can be seen wrapping the Indian flag into a football and playing with it. A few Indian fans came forward to protest and things took a heated turn before the Victoria police sprung to action and drove the disruptive elements away.

When asked about the confrontation, one Indian fan at the MCG

told news agency agency, "Who is Khalistani? I don't know who is a Khalistani. I am a proud Sikh.'

"...I don't think any limelight should be given to them...Whatever they do, I think it's not worth it. They are just 5-10 people who have been born and brought up here. They have never been to Punjab and

doing this nonsense agenda for themselves. Let's just not give any limelight to them," another Indian cricket fan told agency outside the MCG. Pro-Khalistani groups

have targeted Indians and have tried to sabotage events across the US, Canada and the UK over the past two years. Last month, a group of Khalistani supporters barged into a temple in Canada's Brampton, attacking Hindu devotees. Last year, India's High Commission in London came under attack when India's flag was replaced with the Khalistani flag.

#### Syria forces carry out operation against pro-Assad 'militias', reports state media



DAMASCUS, Dec 26 (Agencies): Syria's security forces launched an operation on Thursday against pro-Assad "militias" in the western province of Tartus, state news agency SANA reported, a day after deadly clashes with gunmen affiliated with the former gov-

The operation had already succeeded in "neutralising a certain number" of armed men loyal to toppled president Bashar al-Assad, SANA said. The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitor has reported several arrests in connection with Wednesday's clashes.

JAMMU, Dec 26: In a press statement today, Sunil Dimple, President of Mission Statehood Jammu Kashmir, called upon the alliance government to nominate a Jammu Dogra for the Rajya Sabha (RS) seat, emphasizing the contribution of those who have fought for the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood after August 5, 2019. Dimple pointed out that despite uniting all political parties on one platform for the cause of Jammu and Kashmir, the assembly elections had led to divisions among the parties due to vested interests.

Dimple further demanded that the alliance government, led by Dr. Faroog Abdullah and Omar Abdullah, immediately nominate four members for the Rajya Sabha seats, with at least one from Jammu, as Jammu districts currently lack representation in the alliance government. He

for compromising on all issues with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at the center and reiterated the mission for the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir as a Dogra state with its special status.

Addressing the Prime Minister, Dimple questioned why the business rules for Jammu and Kashmir have not been restored, especially in light of the ongoing drafting of the rules by the Ministry of Home Affairs. He also raised concerns over the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly Speaker, Abdul Rahim Rather, who has formed a nine-member panel to draft the business rules, asking whether the rules being applied would be those from the Ministry of Home Affairs or the Speaker's panel.

Srinagar recorded a low of minus 7 degrees Celsius on Wednesday night, slightly up from the previous night's minus 7.3 degrees Celsius, the meteorological department said.

Gulmarg, a tourist resort town known for skiing activities in north Kashmir, recorded a minimum temperature of minus 6 degrees Celsius, up from minus 6.6 degrees Celsius the previous night.

Pahalgam, the base camp for the annual Amarnath Yatra in south Kashmir, registered a minimum temperature of minus 8.6 degrees Celsius, slightly down from the previous night's minus 8.4 degrees Celsius, it said.

Qazigund, the gateway town to Kashmir, logged a minimum temperature of minus 7 degrees Celsius, while Konibal, a hamlet in the Pampore area, was the coldest recorded place in the valley at minus 9 degrees Celsius, it said

Kupwara, in north Kashmir, registered a low of minus 6.7 degrees Celsius, while Kokernag, in south Kashmir, was minus 5.5 degrees Celsius.

The meteorological department has said an active Western Disturbance is set to impact Jammu and Kashmir from Friday afternoon to Saturday afternoon.

Under the influence of the system, there is a possibility of light snowfall over the higher reaches towards late afternoon of Friday till the forenoon the next day, the Met Office said.

While the weather would stay mainly dry on December 29, 30, and 31, light snowfall is possible at isolated places in Kashmir from January 1-4.

Kashmir is currently under the grip of 'Chillai-Kalan' - considered the harshest period of winter - which started on December 21.

During the 40 days of Chillai-Kalan, the chances of snowfall are most frequent and maximum and the temperature drops con-

It will end on January 30 next year, but the cold wave would continue. The 40 days are followed by a 20-day 'Chillai-Khurd' (small cold) and a 10-day 'Chillai-Bachha' (baby cold).

MELBOURNE, Dec 26 (Agencies): Jasprit Bumrah's knack of coming up with magic deliveries in crunch situations kept India alive after Australia's toporder, headlined by teen debutant Sam Konstas' stroke-filled half-century, guided the hosts to 311 for 6 on the opening day of the fourth Test here on Thursday.

If Konstas' audacious 60 off 65 balls enthralled the near sell-out crowd of over 80,000 at the MCG during a humid morning session, Bumrah's (3/75 in 21 overs) deception of length to dismiss Travis Head (0) also had its takers as chants of 'Boom, Boom, Booooomraaaaaaah' reverberated through the stands.

Coming into the Test with back-to-back hundreds, Head couldn't judge the length of a Bumrah delivery that was pitched slightly fuller than what the batter expected. He shouldered his arms trusting the bounce but the 66.2 overs old Kookaburra nipped back to clip the off-bail.

In the next over, he removed an out-of-form Mitchell Marsh (4), having got Usman Khawaja (57 off 121 balls) with the half-tracker in the post-lunch session

And it was laced with a lot of spunk as he got into a verbal duel with Kohli after their shoulders brushed while crossing each other. Mohammed Siraj was welcomed into the attack with a loud round of boos as he sledged the youngster due to his unconventional hitting style.

In all, Konstas hit six fours apart from the two maximums. Only Akash bowled a good channel among the pacers as Siraj was guilty of going too full

or too short. As Australia scored at more than a fair clip, skipper Rohit Sharma had to introduce Ravindra Jadeja (1/33 in 11 overs) in the 16th over to at least stem the flow of runs before it went out of hand. The decision did pay dividends as the seasoned spinner got an arm ball to skid through with the angle to trap Konstas in front.

Khawaja and Labuschagne then added 65 for the second wicket with the Pakistan-born opener hitting Akash for a couple of boundaries to complete his first fifty of the series.

MELBOURNE, Dec 26 (Agencies): Dec 26 (Agencies): Virat Kohli and Australian youngster Sam Konstas were on Thursday involved in a physical altercation as tempers flared on the first day of the fourth Test here but the 19-year-old home debutant played down the incident, saying the Indian superstar accidentally bumped into

The brief showdown took place after the completion of the 10th over of the Australian innings when the players were crossing over.

Kohli and Konstas bumped shoulders while moving across the pitch.

Both players quickly turned around to glance at each other and engage in a heated exchange of words with Konstas' teammate Usman Khawaja stepping in to separate

The on-field umpires also had a word with the two.

Speaking to reporters after stumps, Konstas said Kohli bumped into him and it wasn't deliberate.

"Virat Kohli accidentally bumped into me, that's cricket and can happen with tension," said the teenager.

"I think the emotions got to both of us," Konstas had told 'Channel 7' during the second session. I didn't quite realise, I was doing my gloves, then a little shoulder charge, but it happens in cricket," he added. Konstas, who was

batting on 27 at the time, went on to hit Jasprit Bumrah for two boundaries and a six in the next over. The 19-vear-old scored a stunning fifty on debut before Ravindra Jadeja trapped him leg before wicket. Konstas might have dismissed it as routine but former Australian skipper Ricky Ponting blamed Kohli for instigating the exchange.

Oz media says Kohli could face disciplinary action

Konstas might have dismissed it as routine but former Australian skipper Ricky Ponting blamed Kohli for instigating the exchange.

He went to the extent of saying that Kohli could face disciplinary action for it.

"Have a look where Virat walks. Virat's walked one whole pitch over to his right and instigated that confrontation. No doubt in my mind whatsoever," Ponting said on Channel 7 while watching the replay of the incident.

"I have no doubt that the umpires and the referee will have a good look at that. Fielders should be nowhere near the batsman at that stage. It looked to me that Konstas looked up really late, wouldn't even know anyone is in front of him. That man on-screen there (Kohli) might have a few questions to answer," Ponting added.

Match referee Andy Pycroft is certain to review the incident. according to a report in cricket.com.au.

The ICC's Code of Conduct states that "any form of inappropriate physical contact is prohibited in cricket. Without limitation, players will breach this regulation if they deliberately, recklessly and/or negligently walk or run into or shoulder another player or umpire".

A Level 1 offence would likely mean a match fee fine. However, Level 2 offences carry a penalty of three to four demerit points. Four demerit points would lead to a suspension of one Test.
