LG Sinha expresses grief over demise of **Former PM** Manmohan Singh

JAMMU, Dec 27 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday expressed grief over the demise of former prime minister Manmohan Singh, saying that he made extremely significant contributions to India's growth.

Singh died at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Delhi, on Thursday night. He was 92.

"My heartfelt condolences to the family members and admirers. May God give them the strength and courage to bear this irreparable loss. Om Shanti," Sinha said on X.

"As Prime Minister, he took bold steps for nation building. In his passing away, the nation has lost a towering politician and a distinguished luminary," he added.

Three residential houses, ICDS centre gutted in fire incident in Kupwara

SRINAGAR, Dec 27 (Agencies): Three residential houses, an Integrated Child Development Service (ICDS) centre and two cowsheds were gutted in a fire incident in Jammu Kashmir's Kupwara district, officials said.

A fire-fighter Irfan Ahmad Dar was injured during the operation who was promptly shifted to a nearby health facility for treatment, the Fire and Emergency officials said.

They said the fire broke out during the intervening night of Thursday and Friday in a residential house at Village Marsari in Chokibal area and engulfed other nearby houses causing damage to three two storied residential houses, an ICDS centre and two cowsheds.

As soon as the fire occurred several fire tenders were rushed from the nearby fire stations of Kralpora, Tangdhar and Kuwara to douse the leaping

Eyewitness said the Army and locals rescued the civilians from the area and extended every possible help to the civil administration

to control the fire. The cause of the fire is stated to be due to the electricity short circuit, they said.

Manmohan Singh's life will serve as lesson to coming generations: PM Modi

NEW DELHI, Dec 27 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday described his predecessor Manmohan Singh's death as a big loss to the nation, asserting that his commitment to the people and the country's development would always be respected.

In a video message. Modi recalled Singh's life journey after his family's migration to India. leaving behind everything following Partition, as he noted that his numerous achievements since then were no mean feat. His life will always serve as

a lesson for the future generations on how someone can rise



above deprivation and struggles to attain the heights of success,

Modi said Singh, who passed

away at 92 on Thursday, would always be remembered as a decent human being, scholar, economist and a leader dedicated to reforms.

Noting that he served in various capacities in the government, the prime minister said Singh was Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor during challenging times and put the country on a new economic path as finance minister in the government headed by PV Narasimha Rao.

Modi said, "As prime minister, his contribution to the country's development and progress will always be remembered."

He was also effusive in praising Singh's personal virtues, noting that his life was a reflection of

JAMMU, Dec 27 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir government has declared a seven-day state mourning from December 26, 2024, to January 1, 2025, to honor the former Prime Minister of India, Dr. Manmohan Singh, who passed

away on December 26. During this period, the National Flag will be flown at half-mast at all official locations, and no official entertainment events will take place. The General Administration Department has issued directives to ensure compliance with

these measures.

The decision, communicated by Commissioner/Secretary Sanjeev Verma, reflects the state's respect for the late leader. Citizens have been requested to observe the guidelines during the mourning period.

JDA mandated to create Water Park at Sidhra

CS for early completion of paperwork to execute project on ground

Top News Report

JAMMU, Dec 27: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo on Friday chaired a meeting to discuss the suitability of different ways and means to establish the Water Theme Park along River Tawi here at Sidhra, Jammu.

Those who attended this meeting includes Commissioner Secretary, H&UDD; Commissioner Secretary, Tourism; VC, JDA and other concerned officers.

In the beginning the Chief Secretary took note of the status of land identified by the Department around Sidhra Golf Course on the banks of River Tawi. He enjoined upon the Housing Department to ascertain that the land is free from



all encumbrances especially seeking NoC from the Forest Department.

He advised the Jammu **Development Authority** (JDA) to use this prized land as their equity in the project so that it would be a source of regular income for the authority. He asked them to invite EoI for creating a

thematic Water Amusement Park at this site in a PPP mode as per the formulated plan.

Dulloo also underscored the need of taking this matter to the respective Board of Directors (BoD) of JDA for the same is empowered to take decisions about further course of

action.

He observed that this park would be a new addition to the tourist attractions in Jammu along with Tawi Lake Front, Zoological Park and other amenities created here. He made out that such amusements together with creation of better infrastructure

is going to increase the tourist footfall here besides making Jammu a tourist destination in its own right.

The Commissioner Secretary, H&UDD, Mandeep Kaur while presenting details apprised the meeting that a chunk of land measuring 92 Kanal and 3 Marlas at village Dwara (Sidhra

area, adjacent to Golf Course) along the river Tawi has been identified by JDA for development of this Water Park.

She added that the proposed site is approximately 04 Kms from the National Highway and is suitable for this project. The "Land Use" status as per Master Plan 2032 is 'Recreation Use' and

cost of the land is estimated at Rs.129.36 Crores, the meeting was informed.

It was further given out that in response to the EOI floated earlier. an offer was received which is under consideration for appointment of transaction advisor for framing RFP.

About the proposed

footfall, it was revealed that as per preliminary estimates the Park is going to attract around 20 lakh visitors annually taking the percentage of pilgrims coming for Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine or Amarnathji Yatra including the locals and those coming to visit other tourist places.

Dr. Manmohan Singh: Architect of Economic Transformation

r. Manmohan Singh, the 14th Prime Minister of India from 2004 to 2014, remains one of the most respected and significant figures in India's political and economic history. he unexpected joy of forging meaningful friendships in middle age defies the common belief that the best opportunities for connection are behind us

Your hat is fantastic. It makes you look more Bavarian than any of us, the concierge quipped as I entered the venue for the coffeeand-cake event at a resort in southern Germany. Although he was stretching the truth I have neither blonde hair nor blue eyes — I accepted the compliment with a coy smile. "Danke schön," I said, tipping my woolen hat. Just then, another guest remarked, "That's a pretty pin on your hat," pointing to the delicate hand-crafted Edelweiss flower. A cherished gift from my friends, Wolfgang and Amelie, the pin symbolised a friendship that began just a year ago, in this very Bavarian town of Schliersee.

The Wolfgangs — a handsome, warm-hearted couple — are a testament to the unexpected joy of friendships made in middle age. Our bond didn't begin with shared childhoods or decades of history but with a simple "hello" and an open heart. The modest origins of our connection and the way it blossomed over the past year defy the notion that meaningful friendships are reserved for youth. Our paths crossed serendipitously during an evening walk.

A casual exchange of pleasantries evolved into deeper conversations about life, culture, and shared interests. What began as polite conversation in an Alpine countryside ended with an exchange of coordinates and it continued with texting in the months after. It is widely held that the friends we make in our formative years are the ones who stay, while those forged later in life are fleeting, superficial, or driven by necessity. This belief may hold some truth; adulthood brings with it obligations, scepticism, and wariness.

We become cautious in extending ourselves. The innocence of youthful camaraderie gives way to guarded interactions, and we convince ourselves that the window for profound friendship has closed. Yet, the Wolfgangs remind me that this window is not sealed shut — it merely takes a little more effort to open.

Friendships formed in middle age are special not despite our life experiences, but because of them. We bring to these connections a deeper sense of self-awareness, empathy, and appreciation.

There's no rush to impress or to conform. The pressures of youthful identity-building are gone. In their place, we find sincerity, authenticity, and the willingness to value people for who they truly are. They remind us of the universality of human warmth and curiosity. Meeting someone from another country — someone whose life, traditions, and language are different — can feel like discovering an entirely new world.

And when such encounters lead to genuine friendship, they break down the invisible walls that geography and culture often build around us.

There is also a profound joy in the intentionality of these connections. In our younger years, friendships are often born of proximity - classmates, neighbours, or college roommates. As adults, friendships require deliberate effort. This intentionality infuses middle-aged friendships with a depth and resilience that can be even more rewarding than the bonds of our youth. I think back to the pin on my hat — that delicate Edelweiss and I see it as a metaphor for these kinds of friendships. The Edelweiss, a rare Alpine flower, thrives in challenging conditions.

It symbolises courage, devotion, and the willingness to climb new heights. Like the flower, friendships made in middle age might take more effort to cultivate, but they are hardy, resilient, and precious. A year after that first meeting, I found myself once again in Schliersee last month, sharing coffee and cake with the Wolfgangs, laughing over our language blunders and cultural quirks. It is never too late to make friends.

Manmohan Singh's government also introduced the National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (NREGA), which later came to be known as MGNREGA

He retired from the Rajya Sabha earlier this year after serving for 33 years.

Dr Singh took over the helms at a crucial time for Indian economy and steered the nation on the economic front, Mr Kovind said.

Stating that for him it was a personal loss no less than losing a near and dear ones, Mr Kovind said he has many memories to cherish about Dr Singh.

Mr Kovind described Dr Singh "as a confluence of spirituality and science," who embodied the values and ethos of Bharat.

Dr Singh, the architect of India's economic reforms, died in Delhi on Thursday night at the age of 92. He was the prime minister during 2004-14.

Surat man kills wife and son, attacks parents before bid to end his life



SURAT, Dec 27 (Agencies): A 34-year-old man stabbed his wife and son to death, attacked his parents and tried to end his own life using a knife over a domestic issue in Surat city of Gujarat on Friday,

As per the preliminary probe, the man - Smit Jivani was disturbed after the family of his uncle, who passed away recently, cut off ties with his family and asked him never to visit their house, Deputy Superintendent of Police Vipul Patel said.

Jivani stabbed his wife Hiral (30), son Chahat (4), mother Vilasben and father Labhubhai at their residence in Sarthana area of Surat city on Friday morn-

"After attacking his family members with a knife, Jivani tried to end his own life by slitting his neck. While Hiral and Chahat died in the attack, Jivani and his parents were injured and the three of them are undergoing treatment at a hospital here," he said.

"We have found that Jivani was mentally disturbed after the family of his deceased uncle snapped ties and asked him and his family not to visit their house," the DySP said, adding that a thorough probe will be conducted to know the exact reason behind the incident.

UK honours legacy of India's 'reluctant prime minister' Manmohan Singh

In January 2023, Singh was honoured with Lifetime Achievement Award by National Indian Students and Alumni Union in the UK

LONDON, Dec 27 (Agencies): India's "reluctant prime minister" and the "architect of economic reforms" is how sections of the UK media have been honouring the legacy of Dr Manmohan Singh, the former prime minister who passed away aged 92 in New Delhi on Thursday.

British High Commissioner to India Lindy Cameron took to social media to pay tribute to "a great Prime Minister, Finance Minister and global statesman who advanced India's interests through bold economic reforms and played a key role in putting India in its rightful place on the world stage and stabilising the global economy after the financial crisis".

"The UK will always be proud of his invaluable partnership with three UK Prime Ministers, and proud of him as an alumnus of two of our great universities. My thoughts and wishes are with his family and the people of India," she said.

Singh's tenure overlapped with Labour prime ministers Tony Blair and Gordon Brown and Conservative David Cameron, who later wrote in his memoir that he "got on well" with this "saintly man" who was robust on the threats India faced

"On a later visit he told me that another terrorist attack like that in Mumbai in July 2011, and



India would have to take military action against Pakistan," notes the former UK PM in 'For the Record', published in 2019.

Manoj Ladwa, founder and chairman of UK-based policy and events platform India Global Forum, described the former PM as a "towering statesman and visionary economist".

"His transformative reforms in the 1990s not only shaped India's future but also helped spark my own commitment to fostering stronger UK-India ties. As an alumnus of Oxford and Cambridge, he symbolised the deep cultural and academic connections between our nations. His legacy will inspire generations," he said.

The Guardian newspaper referenced Singh's "trademark sky-blue turbans and homespun white kurta pyjamas" in its

"Singh, called India's 'reluctant prime minister' due to his shyness and preference for being behind the scenes, was considered an unlikely choice to lead the world's biggest democracy. But when Congress leader Sonia Gandhi led her party to a surprise victory in 2004, she turned to Singh to be prime minister," the newspaper notes.

"He served a rare full two terms as prime minister in India's tumultuous politics and is credited with spurring the rapid economic growth that lifted tens of millions of Indians from poverty," it adds.

The BBC, in its obituary, hailed Singh as one of India's longestserving prime ministers who was considered the "architect of key liberalising economic reforms, as premier from 2004-2014 and

before that as finance minister". "In his maiden speech as finance minister he famously quoted Victor Hugo, saying that 'no power on Earth can stop an idea whose time has come'.

That served as a launchpad for an ambitious and unprecedented economic reform programme: he cut taxes, devalued the rupee, privatised state-run companies and encouraged foreign investment. The economy revived, industry picked up, inflation was checked and growth rates remained consistently high in the 1990s," reads the report.

In January 2023, Singh was honoured with a Lifetime Achievement Award by the National Indian Students and Alumni Union in the UK during their annual India-UK Achievers Honours in London.

"The India-UK relationship is indeed especially defined by our educational partnership. The founding fathers of our nation, including Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Dr BR Ambedkar and Sardar Patel, studied in the UK and went on to become great leaders, leaving a legacy which continues to inspire India and the world. Over the years, countless Indian students have had the opportunity to study in the UK," Singh said in his acceptance message at the time.

North Korean soldier captured in Russia-Ukraine war: Seoul

SEOUL, Dec 27 (Agencies): South Korea's spy agency said Friday it had confirmed that a North Korean soldier sent to back Russia's war against Ukraine had been captured by Ukrainian forces.

Pyongyang deployed thousands of troops to reinforce Russia's military, including in the Kursk border region where Ukraine mounted a shock border incursion in August.

"Through real-time information sharing with an allied country's intelligence agency, it has been confirmed that one injured North Korean soldier has been captured," South Korea's National Intelligence Service said in a statement.

The soldier was captured by the Ukrainian army, a South Korean intelligence source told agency, adding that the location where he was

seized was not known. Friday's confirmation came days after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said that nearly 3,000 North Korean soldiers had been "killed or wounded" so far as they joined Russian troops in combat.

South Korea's intelligence service had previously put the number of killed or wounded

North Koreans at 1,000, saying the high casualty rate could be down to an unfamiliar battlefield environment and their lack of capability to counter drone attacks.

Pyongyang's soldiers were also being "utilised as expendable frontline assault units", lawmaker Lee Seong-kweun said, speaking last week after a briefing by South Korea's spy agency.

Dangerous expansion North Korea and Russia have strengthened their military ties since Moscow's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

A landmark defence pact between Pyongyang and Moscow signed in June came into force this month, with Russian President Vladimir Putin hailing it as a "breakthrough document".

North Korean state media said Friday that Putin sent a New Year's message to North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, saying "the bilateral ties between our two countries have been elevated after our talks in June in Pyongyang".

Ukraine's allies have called Pyongyang's growing involvement in Russia's war in Ukraine a "dangerous expansion" of the conflict. Seoul's military believes that North Korea was seeking to modernise its conventional warfare capabilities through combat experience gained in the

Russia-Ukraine war. NATO chief Mark Rutte had also said that Moscow was providing support to Pyongyang's missile and nuclear programmes in exchange for the troops.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said Monday that Pyongyang is reportedly "preparing for the rotation or additional deployment of soldiers" and supplying "240mm rocket launchers and 170mm self-propelled artillery" to the Russian army.

Pyongyang's involvement in Russia's war against Ukraine had prompted warnings from Seoul.

South Korea's President Yoon Suk Yeol, currently suspended, said in November that Seoul was "not ruling out the possibility of providing weapons" to Ukraine. which would mark a major shift to a longstanding policy barring the sale of weapons to countries in active con-

Japan's 'Black Widow' death row inmate, Chisako Kakehi, dies

Chisako Kakehi was sentenced to death for the murder of three men, including her husband, and the attempted murder of another man.

TOKYO, Dec 27 (Agencies): A Japanese deathrow inmate, dubbed the "Black Widow" after she used cyanide to kill her elderly lovers, has died in a detention centre at age 78, officials said on Friday.

Chisako Kakehi was sentenced to death for the murder of three men, including her husband, and the attempted murder of another man about a decade ago in a case that gripped Japan.

"Her death was confirmed at a hospital on Thursday" after she was found lying in her cell at the Osaka detention centre, a justice ministry official told AFP.

The cause of death has yet to be determined, he said. Japanese media said it could be from an undisclosed illness

Kakehi's death sentence was upheld in 2021, with Supreme Court judge Yuko Miyazaki saying she had "used cyanide on the men after making them trust her as a life



partner".

"It's a calculated, cruel crime based on a strong intent of murder," Miyazaki said.

Kakehi reportedly amassed one billion yen (\$9 million at the time) in insurance payouts and inheritance over 10 years but subsequently lost most of the money through unsuccessful financial trading.

She had relationships primarily with elderly or ill men and met some through dating agencies, where she reportedly stipulated that prospective partners should be wealthy and childless.

The poison was found in the body of at least two of the men she was involved with and police reportedly found traces of cyanide in the rubbish at her Kyoto home.

Her partners' deaths were not investigated immediately because police initially determined they died from illnesses, with no autopsies being performed on most.

Her arrest only came after police discovered her most recent husband, 75-year-old Isao Kakehi, died from cyanide poisoning. Police then began looking into the earlier cases and found a pattern.

Climate change added 41 days of dangerous heat around world in 2024 lead of World Weather Attribution and an Impe-

WASHINGTON, Dec 27 (Agencies): People around the world suffered an average of 41 extra days of dangerous heat this year because of human-caused climate change, according to a group of scientists who also said that climate change worsened much of the world's damaging weather throughout 2024.

The analysis from World Weather Attribution and Climate Central researchers comes at the end of a year that shattered climate record after climate record as heat across the globe made 2024 likely to be its hottest ever measured and a slew of other fatal weather events spared few.

"The finding is devastating but utterly unsurprising: Climate change did play a role, and often a major role in most of the events we studied, making heat, droughts, tropical cyclones and heavy rainfall more likely and more intense across the world, destroying lives and livelihoods of millions and often uncounted numbers of people," Friederike Otto, the rial College climate scientist, said during a media briefing on the scientists' findings. "As long as the world keeps burning fossil fuels, this will only get worse."

Millions of people

endured stifling heat this year. Northern California and Death Valley baked. Sizzling daytime temperatures scorched Mexico and Central America. Heat endangered already vulnerable children in West Africa. Skyrocketing southern European temperatures forced Greece to close the Acropolis. In South and Southeast Asian countries, heat forced school closures. Earth experienced some of the hottest days ever measured and its hottest-vet summer, with a 13-month heat streak

that just barely broke. To do its heat analysis. the team of volunteer international scientists compared daily temperatures around the globe in 2024 to the temperatures that would have been expected in a world without climate change.

The results are not yet peer-reviewed, but researchers use peerreviewed methods.

Some areas saw 150 days or more of extreme heat due to climate change.

"The poorest, least developed countries on the planet are the places that are experiencing even higher numbers," said Kristina Dahl, vice president of climate science at Climate Central.

What's worse, heatrelated deaths are often

underreported. "People don't have to die in heat waves. But if we can't communicate convincingly, but actually a lot of people are dying,' it's much harder to raise this awareness." Otto said. "Heat waves are by far the deadliest extreme event, and they are the extreme events where climate change is a real game changer."

This year was a warning that the planet is getting dangerously close to the Paris Agreement's 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) warming limit compared to the pre-industrial average, according to the scientists. Earth is expected to soon edge past that threshold, although it's not considered to have been breached until that warming is sustained over decades.

The researchers closely examined 29 extreme weather events this year that killed at least 3,700 people and displaced millions, and found that 26 of them had clear links to climate change.

> The El Niño weather pattern, which naturally warms the Pacific Ocean and changes weather around the world, made some of this weather more likely earlier in the year. But the researchers said most of their studies found that climate change played a bigger role than that phenomenon in fueling 2024's events. Warm ocean waters and warmer air fueled more destructive storms, according to the researchers, while temperatures led to many

pours. Jennifer Francis, a climate scientist at the Woodwell Climate Research Center in Cape Cod who wasn't involved in the research,

said the science and findings were sound.

"Extreme weather will continue to become more frequent, intense, destructive, costly, and deadly, until we can lower the concentration of heat-trapping gases in the atmosphere," she said.

Significantly more climate extremes could be expected without action, the United Nations Environment Programme said in the fall, as more planet-warming carbon dioxide has been sent into the air this year by burning fossil fuels than last year.

But the deaths and damages from extreme weather events aren't inevitable, said Julie Arrighi, director of programmes at the Red Cross Red Crescent Climate Centre and part of the research.

"Countries can reduce those impacts by preparing for climate change and adapting for climate change, and while the challenges faced by individual countries or systems or places vary around the world, we do see that every country has a role to play," she said.

ing in 2020 by an anti-Makki, deputy chief of JuD, had been keeping terrorism court.

The Samiti, which represents shopkeepers, pony operators and palanquin owners, argues that the ropeway would destroy the livelihoods of local business owners and has demanded that the project be

With black flags displayed across the town, shops, restaurants, and other business establishments remained closed for the third day, and vehicular movement was at a standstill, following the Samiti's call for protest.

The bandh has disrupted normal life in

one of India's busiest pilgrimage hubs, which is visited daily by thousands of devotees seeking blessings at the cave shrine.

"The bandh is part of our 72-hour-long shutdown against the ropeway project. It is going on peacefully. The committee will decide on the next course of action soon," said a spokesperson for the Samiti.

Criticising the administration for its lack of engagement, the spokesperson said, "The administration is indifferent to the plight of people, including women and children, holding peaceful protests. Our simple demand is to shelve the project, as it threatens the livelihood of Katra residents, most of whom rely on the pilgrimage economy." He further claimed that instead of initiating dialogue, the administration resorted to force, including the detention of Samiti leaders during a peaceful protest. "They are creating an unnecessary crisis with their approach," he stated.

Shiva, a participant in the hunger strike, had to be hospitalised after his condition deteriorated.

"Our hunger strike will continue until the detained individuals are released. If someone falls ill, another person will replace them," said another participant in the hunger strike.

Eighteen protesters, including Samiti leaders Bhupinder Singh and Sohan Chand, were detained by police during Wednesday's march and taken away from the protest site.

India collapse after Jaiswal's terrible run-out

Despite his fluent spell Jaiswal was run out with India ending day two at 164/5

MELBOURNE. Dec 27 (Agencies): A familiar collapse unfolded after Yashasvi Jaiswal's inexplicable run-out as India stared down the barrel at 164/5 against a menacing Australia on day two of the fourth Test here on Friday.

Jaiswal, who was quite fluent during his 118-ball stay that yielded 82 runs, was way short of his crease after a mix-up with Virat Kohli (36) while attempting a quick single, handing Australia the breakthrough that could prove decisive.

India are still 310 runs behind Australia's first innings score of 474 and would need another 111 runs to avoid a follow-on that should never have been a consideration on a placid batting track.

It was 153 for 2 at one stage and in four overs, another three wickets fell with Gautam Gambhir's plan of sending a night watchman in Akash Deep turning out to be one of the many poor calls that the head coach has taken in this game.

In a space of barely five minutes, cricket showed its fickle nature as Jaiswal pushed towards mid-on and called for a quick single with an assured Kohli (36) at the other end. Kohli took a step and half before retreating.

Pat Cummins swooped the ball and threw at the striker's end with a frustrated Jaiswal seen telling his idol "my call".

This moment will be one for posterity as Kohli looked down



and perhaps felt that he could have at least said a loud "No" to allow Jaiswal to sprint back.

The run-out broke his concentration and for the first time after 85 balls, he poked a delivery bowled in the corridor of uncertainty and it was the end.

Scott Boland repeated the dismissal that has been a norm for quite a while now. Akash Deep didn't have the technique to survive and the day ended in Australia's favour just like it started.

The Jaiswal-Kohli pair had added 102 runs and looked comfortable just like they did in the Perth second innings. The ball hardly did anything after Rohit Sharma (3) played a poor shot and KL Rahul got a ripper from Pat Cummins.

Jaiswal was in regal form, as he cut, pulled, drove and lofted the Australian bowlers stamping his authority as the next megastar of Indian batting.

Kohli, at the other end,

endured boos for Thursday's

run-in with debutant Sam Kon-

stas and battled his demons This was after Steve Smith's 34th Test hundred ensured a very good total for hosts.

Starting the day at 311 for 6, Smith added 112 and 44 runs with Cummins (49) and Mitchell Starc (15) respectively, leaving the visitors searching for backup plans.

Jasprit Bumrah (4/99 in 28.4 oves) was once again brilliant despite the first spell thrashing from Konstas but Mohammed Siraj's ordinary showing (0/122 in 23 overs) was the primary reason for batters not being under any pressure.

Smith, who was unbeaten overnight on 68 off 111 balls, took another 56 deliveries in the second morning to complete a Test ton which placed him on even keel with the legendary Sunil Gavaskar (34).

The century came with a push drive through the vacant cover region and celebrations were pretty muted with a just vigorous head nod for his teammates in the dug-out.

Smith, who had a torrid run till the second Test of this series, played both days in contrasting styles. On Thursday, he was ready to be patient and waited for deliveries at the expense of looking ugly.

On Friday, the same batter was walking down the track to force the bowlers to alter their length. He was ready to pull and hook, getting two sixes off Bumrah and Siraj respectively.

Despite a significant drop in temperature and some nip in the air, Indians failed to make use of the semi-new Kookaburra, with lines going all awry and length being short enough to be punished. Cummins was allowed to settle down and hit seven boundaries.

The Indian ploy of playing two spinners backfired with Ravindra Jadeja (3/78 in 22 overs) and Washington Sundar (1/49 in 15 overs) never looking penetrative.

For a change, Siraj didn't try and sledge an in-form batter, something that he did in Adelaide with some disastrous results.

But that didn't soften the Australian supporters, who constantly booed him and Kohli as and when the ball went to them.

Indian cricket team wears black armbands in memory of Manmohan Singh



MELBOURNE, Dec 27 (Agencies): The Indian cricket team sported black armbands on the second day of the fourth Test against Australia to minister Manmohan Singh, who died in New Delhi.

Singh, a two-time former prime minister from 2004 to 2014, died at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences on Thursday after losing consciousness at his home owing to agerelated ailments. He was 92.

"The Indian team is wearing black armbands as a mark of respect in the memory of former PM Dr Manmohan Singh, who passed away," the BCCI said in a statement.

World Championships Rapid and Blitz: Erigaisi looks to qualify for Candidates

NEW YORK, Dec 27 (Agencies): Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi will have to tackle obstacles to retain his chances of becoming the first Indian to enter the 2026 Candidates' tournament when he opens his campaign at the World Rapid and Blitz chess tournament here. Erigaisi, who currently trails Fabiano Caruana of the United States in the list of players slated to qualify from 2024, will have a tall order to win the World Rapid chess championship that gets underway.

It may be noted here that the last time an Indian won the crown here was in 2019 when Koneru Humpy triumphed and in 2017 Viswanathan Anand had defied all odds to win the title.



World's top-rated Magnus Carlsen will be back to defend his title in the faster version of the game as the top seed in both rapid and blitz.

Manchester United just have to survive: Ruben Amorim on Boxing Day loss vs Wolves

MANCHESTER, Dec 27 (Agencies): Manchester United manager Ruben Amorim admitted his team must shift to "survival mode" after a 2-0 loss to Wolverhampton Wanderers compounded their Premier League woes. United suffered their fourth loss in five matches to languish in 14th place, just eight points clear of the relegation zone.

The Portuguese manager, who replaced Erik ten Hag six weeks ago, pointed to limited time to train with his players as a key reason for the team's struggles. Amorim has become the first United boss since Walter Crickmer in 1932 to lose five of his first 10 games across all competitions.

"I manage, but I didn't train [the players]," Amorim said. "They need time to adapt to the new style of play. Without results, it's even harder for them to believe in the process. Right now, we just have to survive and win time to work on the team. It's a long journey."

Wolves took lead through Matheus Cunha's 58th-minute



corner, which curled over United goalkeeper André Onana and into the net-a strikingly simiduring United's Carabao Cup exit against Totten-

Wolves manager Vtor Pereira, who has now overseen back-to-back wins since succeeding Gary O'Neil, credited tactical planning for the goal. "We analysed their weaknesses," Pereira said. "Cunha is a special player who made the difference.

United's task was made even harder when captain Bruno Fernandes received a second yellow card two minutes after halftime. Despite their numerical disadvantage, Amorim noted moments of promise but admitted the team lacked potency even before the red

"With 10 men, we were near the goal, which is a positive, but we lost," he said

Marcus Rashford was left out for a fourth consecutive match, with Amorim reiterating that the forward is not in his plans. The England international has reportedly sought a "new challenge," and Amorim's post-match comments suggest little chance of reconciliation.

"It's always the same reason," Amorim said. "If he's not here, you can make your mind up."

When asked about qualifying for European competitions, Amorim dismissed such aspirations, stressing the need to focus on rebuilding. "We have to work on a lot of things-on and off the pitch. Let's focus on each game and make use of every training session," he said.

Will Rohit drop himself before Sydney Test or await big call till end of series? batting in the middle-"That's just a lazy, not

MELBOURNE, Dec 27 (Agencies): Rohit Sharma seems to have nothing left in the tank.

"Tough times for him," the legendary Sunil Gavaskar said while on air with broadcasters '7Cricket'.

"There will be a second innings and two more in Sydney. Questions will be asked if he doesn't score in those three innings," Gavaskar said on air as he saw it.

After yet another cheap dismissal off a Pat Cummins' short ball, questions are mounting on when the 38-year-old Indian captain will finally call time on his Test

But will Rohit allow all these questions to fester? The national selection committee chairman Aiit Agarkar is in Melbourne and it won't surprise anyone if it comes out that the two former teammates have had some discussions on the future as India copes with a tough transition.

Only 155 runs in eight Tests at an average of 11.07 in 14 innings is very poor by all standards and not scoring runs after tinkering a set opening combina-



tion hasn't done him any good.

The common belief is that if India do not qualify for the World Test Championship, then Sydney will be the final destination of his cricketing journey in whites.

Will the skipper be more pragmatic and, for the sake of the team, drop himself from the playing eleven for the Sydney Test? If so, he will allow an in-form KL Rahul to continue with a rampaging Yashasvi Jaiswal.

Current national head coach Gautam Gambhir, during his playing time in the IPL, once dropped himself from after a horrendous first phase, knowing that his days as a T20 opener were behind him.

There is a growing feeling that Indian cricket consider using a similar tactic for senior players. If Ravichandran Ashwin could be

nudged into retirement and clearly told that he is not even among the top two spinners in overseas conditions, then shouldn't the Indian skipper be told that he is perhaps no longer an automatic choice in the Test top six?

However, there is an **ODI Champions Trophy** to be played in another seven weeks and the skipper is still a force to reckon with in that format.

Although current form is a huge factor and it does affect confidence, he might just come good in the ODIs if the Test responsibility is off his shoulders.

Rohit was never comfortable with the idea of order and he realised after three innings that it has not worked. As a result, Shubman Gill was dropped from the playing eleven to allow Rohit to go back to his familiar opening posi-

But just like his pull shots aren't coming off anymore, the strategic moves are failing too.

The biggest difference between Rohit and Virat Kohli, despite both going through a lean patch, is how they are looking at the crease

Kohli is still a picture of intent and gives the feeling that there could be a big knock around the corner and in fact, a hundred did come in the Perth Test's second innings.

On second day at the MCG, he looked solid, trying to leave as many deliveries in the channel but not forgetting to punish the half-volleys.

But Rohit has been a walking wicket, a trifle lost and looking completely out of place. No one could have put

it as concisely as former Australian skipper Ricky Ponting, whose technical analysis has always been spot on.

switched on, not up for the moment type of shot," Ponting said while analysing his dismissal on air for 7Cricket. "He's been known as

one of the best hookers and pullers of the ball since he's made his debut but that's just not there. It's nothing.

"It's not committed, not really looking to be aggressive, he's just looking to tap it on the head," added possibly the best horizontal bat shot-maker, of his gen-

In captaincy and batting, it is about making good decisions and the Indian skipper is not being able to do that at this point.

"It (ball) might have held in the wicket yes. It might have seemed away from him a fraction. But if you're going to survive against this Australian attack, you've got to be switched on.

"You've got to be making good decisions. If you're not, they'll knock vou over everv time," Ponting said.

As things stand, the skipper needs to make a auick decision. His team is possibly waiting for it.

Kohli not let off lightly, says Gavaskar; Ponting disagrees

MELBOURNE, Dec 27 (Agencies): Virat Kohli was not extended any special treatment, asserted Indian great Sunil Gavaskar but some former Australian players felt the batting superstar got away lightly for his physical altercation with debutant Sam Konstas in the ongoing Boxing Day

Kohli was fined 20 per cent of his match fee and handed a demerit point for a brief face off with Konstas on Thursday during which the two players bumped shoulders and exchanged words. The run-in was initiated by Kohli but the 19-year-old Konstas insisted that their physical contact was accidental. The showdown remained a talking point even on Friday with Gavaskar slamming the Australian media for going after Kohli and demanding harsher punishment for him.

"You can't hang a man for picking someone's pocket," Gavaskar remarked, dismissing claims that Kohli was let off lightly.

"That's a slap on the wrist. All these players are highly paid professionals. Any fines will have to be a deterrent. Yes, you could say that the degree of punishment maybe light because of what we see and experience but that's the maximum punishment decided by the ICC," he pointed out on Star

Sports after the first session. "So, it's not that he's been done any favour. If the final punishment would have been say 10 percent you could have said

then there's a favour done," he added. Criticising the Australian media, Gavaskar said, "The Australian media acts like their 12th or 13th player, targeting anyone they perceive as a threat to their team.

"They are asking that Kohli should be

hanged for a minor offence and he's got away because he is Kohli but that's not However, former Australia skipper

Ricky Ponting argued that the punishment was insufficient. "Personally, I don't think it was harsh enough. There have been precedents; things have happened in the past, and it generally has been 15-25 per cent fine, but let's have a look at the enormity of

the incident," Ponting said on Channel 7. "It was the most watched day of cricket throughout the whole year all around the world. Imagine if that now happens in a grade game. What's gonna happen? I think people are gonna think that's almost acceptable now," he added.

The view was shared by Mark Waugh while dong commentary for 'Fox Sports'. "You can't change direction and shoulder

charge. It is just not on. Virat Kohli will look

back on that and say, 'I've done the wrong thing'. I think the penalty is extremely lenient," he insisted.

He warned that such incidents have the potential of flaring if not dealt with strictly.

"If you put this situation where there might be a volatile crowd for example, and players are more volatile on the field it could end up in a place you don't want to see on a cricket field. "I think he is lucky not to get away with a suspension and if he has got a fine it should have been at least a 75 per cent fine. It has to be a deterrent. 20 per cent is nothing. There is no doubt Sam Konstas rattled the Indians," he said, referring to Rs 3 lakh fine that Kohli would be paying from his Rs 15 lakh match fee.

Former Australia coach Justin Langer, however, criticised the Australian media for being "brutal".

The media, whether in Australia or elsewhere, can be brutal. They target highprofile individuals, and this is no different. I've experienced it firsthand, it's not about India or Kohli specifically; it's just how the media operates now," he said.

Gavaskar, meanwhile, cited three similar incidents in the past one year to highlight consistency in penalties.

"Last December, Ireland's Josh Little was fined 5 per cent of his match fee for physical contact with a batter in a game refereed by Andy Pycroft, the same referee in this

"Jasprit Bumrah was reprimanded for physical contact with England's Ollie Pope, and Nepal's Arjun Kumar faced penalties for a repeat offense. Kohli has received the maximum punishment (under the rules),' he recalled.


In addition to the procession, every year, the Sangat pays obeisance on this pious occasion,
