#### 15 injured in stray dog attack in Budgam, one referred to Srinagar hospital

BUDGAM, Jan 6 (Agencies): At least 15 people were injured by stray dogs in Central Kashmir's old Budgam town on Monday morning, causing panic among locals.Jammu

and Kashmir tourism Eyewitnesses said that the dogs appeared suddenly and went on a rampage, attacking several individuals in the old town, news

agency KNT reported. According to locals, around 15 people were injured after being attacked by the stray dogs who were immediately rushed to **Budgam District Hos**pital for medical treatment. One among the injured is said to be in critical condition and was referred to SMHS Hospital in Srinagar for

advanced care. A medico at the Budgam hospital confirmed that one person with severe injuries has been shifted to Srinagar hospital.

After the incident, locals called for immediate action to address the issue of stray dogs in the district.

He emphasized the importance of adhering to government-issued advisories on the safe use of heating equipment to prevent such tragic incidents.


#### **Flight** operations resume at Srinagar **International Airport: Officials**



The conference criticized Malaysia's Bhoomiputera policy for its bias against Indianorigin Hindus and called for either their inclusion in affirmative benefits or the policy's abrogation. Delegates also decried forced conversions of minor Hindu girls in Pakistan's Sindh province, highlighting complicity by local authorities.

The WHF proposed the creation of a self-governing Hindu homeland in Bangladesh to safeguard Hindu communities and preserve Bengali cultural heritage. It endorsed Nepal's return to a Hindu Rashtra to restore its Dharmic character and expressed concern over growing Hinduphobia in global academia, media, and policy circles. The event honored notable dignitaries, including Dr. Ajay Singh, WHF International President, and featured participants from over 20 countries. Twelve individuals were recognized as "Hindu Ratna" and six as "Hindu Gaurav" for their contributions to Hindu values.

The region's challenging geological conditions, including frequent landslides, earthquakes, and heavy snowfall, have necessitated the use of cutting-edge technologies. The Chenab Bridge, for example, is designed to withstand extreme weather and seismic conditions. Similarly, the Pir Panjal Tunnel, which spans over 11 kilometers, is equipped with advanced safety and ventilation systems to ensure smooth operations even in harsh winter conditions.

One of the most notable benefits has been the boost to tourism, as the improved connectivity has made it easier for tourists to visit popular destinations like Srinagar, Gulmarg, and Pahalgam. ## Can China & India restore Asian century momentum?

(Photo: File | PTI) As we enter 2025, we also enter the last year of the first quarter of the 21st century. Twenty-five years ago, many forecast the arrival of an "Asian Century", witnessing the rapid rise of post-war Japan, followed by the so-called "Asian tigers" --Hong Kong, South Korea, Singapore and Taiwan. They were then followed by the Southeast Asian economies of Indonesia and Malaysia and, finally, China. In the early 2000s, India too showed it could speed up. The 19th century was Europe's, the 20th century was America's and the 21st century would be Asia's, predicted economic soothsayers.

China's great moderniser, Deng Xiaoping, had already claimed that the rise of China and India would define the return of Asia to its historic place in the comity of nations. Singapore's founder Lee Kuan Yew borrowed an economic metaphor from Walt Rostow, whose "stages of growth theory" had defined the "takeoff" of an economy as a precursor to economic maturity, and declared that China and India were the twin engines of an Asian jet plane soaring into the skies.

The trans-Atlantic financial crisis of 2008-09, wrongly dubbed as a "global financial crisis", was the next milestone and for a few years after that the world saw Europe in crisis,

America bogged down in wars but China and India rising. China's rise was spectacular, India's was more subdued but Asian optimism was the flavour of the decade. Then came the Covid-19 pandemic. A fellow Hyderabadi and Osmanian, Vasuki Shastry, now at London's Chatham House, published a book in 2021 titled Has Asia Lost it? Dynamic Past, Turbulent Future, raising doubts about whether indeed the 21st century would be Asian. China had already started slowing down, and so had India. Japan has been on a downward slope through the 2000s. While Europe had also lost its coveted place in the global ranking of economies, it remains home to advances in science and technology. The United States had regained momentum.

Since the publication of Shastry's book China, Japan and India have slowed down even more. Most other Asian economies are in a tizzy adjusting to the emerging "new Cold War" between the United States and China and President Donald Trump's stated strategy of pursuing the geo-economic containment of China. Most Asian economies are caught in a trap in which they are dependent on the US for security but on China for prosperity. Has Asia "lost it"? Is the Asian rise running out of gas?

Some facts stand out. In Asia, Japan has certainly fallen back. In 2010 China overtook Japan to become the world's second largest economy. In 2025, India could well overtake Japan and secure the third place. Though the gap between number two and number three will still be huge, with China now five times bigger than India. A second fact that stands out is

that Europe is slowing down too. Europe's biggest economy, Germany, is in crisis mode. There's still some life left in Europe but it remains to be seen how much energy is in there to recover lost space. If in 2000 the Group of Seven (G-7) economies accounted for more than 50 per cent of world income, by 2020 their share was well below 50 per cent and that of Asia was well above 50 per cent. But, by 2024, the balance was tilting in G-7's favour only because the US has bounced back and China has slowed down. Going forward, both the US and China may take steps to retain their existing share of world income, even if they find it difficult to increase their shares by much. It would be the performance of Europe, in the West, and of India, Japan and the Asean economies in the East, over the next decade that would set the stage for whether indeed the 21st century would be Asian or not. During the forthcoming Donald Trump presidency we can expect the United States to take steps aimed at retaining its global dominance. The US has declared that the 21st century would also be defined by Pax Americana. On the other hand, China too would take steps to ensure that its economy regains momentum so that it can remain a close second to the US. China knows that it will take a long time for it to in fact overtake the US. Hence, we will live through a period of intense competition. It is in China's interest to ensure that competition with the West does not escalate into conflict. Hence, a rational strategy would be one in which China does not undertake any kinetic action to integrate Taiwan. The US, on the other hand, may be tempted to draw China into a

conflict in the western Pacific to slow down China's economic rise. The dynamics of US-China relations will define to a great extent whether the 21st century would be Asian. Going forward, India has an important role in defining the centre of gravity of the world economy in the 21st century. That centre had decisively moved East from the Atlantic and towards Asia. It will be the performance of the Indian economy that will drive that centre of gravity closer to the Indian Ocean. India is at present cruising at an annual average rate of growth around 6.0 per cent. It has to accelerate to at least 7.5 per cent, a record that was set during Manmohan Singh's decade in office, for India to play a role in how the 21st century is viewed. India will not only have to deal with competition within Asia, especially with China, but also competition with the West that is fighting back to regain space. The United States and the European Union will work hard to retain their share of world income and trade. They may provoke conflicts that slow down the rise of emerging economies. It is in Asia's interest to seek a decade of peace for its economies to regain momentum. Asian nations, big and small, have a role to play in this game. How Japan, South Korea and the Asean economies, especially Indonesia, Malaysia and Vietnam, perform will also play an important role in setting the stage for a resumption of Asia's rise. In 2021, Shastry was right to suggest that Covid had marked a shift from a dynamic past to a turbulent future for Asia. While Asia has recovered from that setback, America has recovered even faster. The race, once again, is on.

NEW DELHI, Jan 6 (Agencies): Chief Justice of India Sanjv Khanna on Monday recused himself from hearing two separate pleas pertaining to finalisation of the constitutions of the Indian Olympic Association and the All India Football Federation, both framed by former apex court judge Justice L Nageswara Rao.

At the outset of the proceedings, the Chief Justice of India (CJI), who was sitting on the bench with Justice Sanjay Kumar, said he would not be part of the bench to hear these cases as he had earlier taken up one of the pleas in Delhi High



Court.

"Let the pleas come before another bench headed by Justice PS Narasimha on February 10. I remember hearing this in Delhi High Court," CJI Khanna said.

The pleas were last taken up on March 19, 2024, by a bench headed by the-then CJI DY Chandrachud.

The bench had then permitted the All India Football Federation

(AIFF) to file its objections to the draft constitution proposed by Justice Rao.

"The amicus curiae will update the existing chart to reflect the objections of the AIFF," the bench had said.

It had also said that it would decide the issues raised about the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and the AIFF constitutions on the next date of hearing.

### Nithari killings: SC to hear on March 25 pleas against Surendra Koli's acquittal NEW DELHI, Jan ted them in the death

6 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Monday said it would on March 25 hear a batch of pleas against the acquittal of Surendra Koli in the 2006 Nithari serial killings case.

A bench of Justices B R Gavai and Augustine George Masih was informed by solicitor general Tushar Mehta that the case was over the "very serious and gruesome" killings in Nithari, UP.

Koli's counsel said the evidence against his client was a confessional statement, recorded several days after his police custody in the case.

The bench directed its registry to summon the trial court records in other connected matters



expeditiously and supply its copies to the lawvers appearing in the matter. The hearing was

posted on March 25. In 2024, the apex court agreed to examine separate pleas filed by the CBI and the UP government challenging the

Allahabad High Court's

decision acquitting Koli

on October 16, 2023. The bench had sought a response from Koli on the petitions and tagged it with similar pending pleas.

The top court in May, 2024, agreed to hear a plea filed by the father of one of the victims challenging the high court's acquittal verdict.

Koli was awarded death penalty on September 28, 2010 by the trial court.

Moninder Singh Pandher and his domestic help Koli were accused of rape and murder of persons, mostly children, in their neighbourhood in Nithari, UP.

The high court acquit-

penalty case and said the prosecution had failed to prove their quilt "beyond reasonable doubt" while calling it a "botched up" investigation.

Reversing the death sentence given to Koli in 12 cases and Pandher in two cases, the high court said the probe was "nothing short of a betrayal of public trust by responsible agencies".

The high court allowed multiple appeals filed by Koli and Pandher, who challenged the death sentence awarded by a CBI court in Ghaziabad. A total of 19 cases

were lodged against the duo in 2007, and the CBI filed closure reports in three cases due to lack of evidence.

Koli was acquitted in three of the 16 remaining cases, and his death sentence in one case was commuted to life.

The killings came to light with the discovery of the skeletal remains of eight children from a drain behind Pandher's house at Nithari in Noida, bordering the national capital, on December 29, 2006.

Further digging and searches of drains in the area around the house led to more skeletal remains. Most of these remains were those of children and young women who went missing in the area.

The CBI took over the case within 10 days of the crime and its search resulted in the recovery of more human remains.

## Bengaluru shocker: Techie, wife kill their children, die by suicide

BENGALURU, Jan 6 (Agencies): A tragic incident of a software professional and his wife ending their lives after killing their two children was reported from Bengaluru on Monday.

The shocking incident took place in the limits of Sadashivanagar police station in Bengaluru.

The deceased have been identified as 38-year-old Anoop, a software professional from Uttar Pradesh, his wife 35-year-old Raakhi, their children five-yearold Anupriva and twoyear-old Priyansh.

The domestic help told the police that since the couple's eldest kid Anupriya was a child with special needs, the young parents were distraught.

According to police,

Anoop worked as a software consultant with a private company.

The house help told the police that till Saturday night, things had seemed normal and the couple looked happy.

The murder-cum-suicide came to light when the house help came on Monday morning and did not get any response from the family.

Police suspect that depressed by Anupriya's condition, the couple had taken the decision to end their lives and kill their children before

They first killed both the children by poisoning their food and later hanged themselves at their residence.

The family had three maids and Anoop had asked them to come



early on Monday as they were planning to visit Pondicherry city.

The couple had got the packing done by the staff on Sunday itself, police said.

Two of the staff were hired for cooking and one was kept to take care of the children.

The helpers were each getting a salary of Rs 15,000 per month as the

According to police, the incident had come to light when neighbours complained to the police that a foul smell was emanating from the apartment where the family lived.

In another incident, a 24-year-old techie working with a reputed IT company had committed suicide by inhaling helium gas in a hotel in Bengaluru on August 20, 2024.

## SpaDeX docking postponed to January 9: ISRO



BENGALURU, Jan 6 (Agencies): ISRO on Monday said the docking experiment of SpaDeX satellites scheduled for January 7 is now postponed to January 9.

The Bengaluru-based space agency said the docking process requires further validation through ground simulations based on an abort scenario identified on Monday

"The SpaDeX Docking scheduled on (January) 7th is now postponed to 9th. The docking process requires further validation through ground simulations based on an abort scenario identified today," ISRO said in a post on 'X'.

ISRO had successfully launched the ambitious Space Docking Experiment (SpaDeX) mission on December 30.

The PSLV C60 rocket carrying two small satellites, SDX01 (Chaser) and SDX02 (Target), along with 24 payloads, had lifted off from the first launchpad of the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, and about 15 minutes after liftoff, the two small spacecraft weighing about 220 kg each were launched into a 475-km circular orbit as intended.

According to ISRO, SpaDeX mission is a cost-effective technology demonstrator mission for the demonstration of in-space docking using two small spacecraft that was launched by PSLV.

This technology is essential for India's space ambitions such as Indian on Moon, sample return from the Moon, the building and operation of Bharatiya Antariksh Station (BAS), etc.

In-space docking technology is essential when multiple rocket launches are required to achieve common mission objectives. Through this mission, India is marching towards becoming the fourth country in the world to have space docking technology.

## Four killed, 32 injured as Kerala state bus bus falls into gorge in Idukki

IDUKKI, Jan 6 (Agencies): Four people lost their lives and 32 others sustained injuries when a Kerala State Road **Transport Corporation** (KSRTC) bus fell into a gorge near Pullupara on the Kottarakara-Dindigul national highway early Monday morning.

The bus, part of the KSRTC budget tourism cell, was returning to Mavelikkara in Alappuzha district after a tour of Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu. The accident occurred around 6.15 am near the Kallivayal

estate in Idukki district. The deceased were identified as Arun Hari (55), Rama Mohan (40), Sangeeth (45), and Bindhu Unnithan (59), all residents of Mavelik-



According to preliminary reports, the vehicle's brakes failed while navigating a sharp curve, causing the bus to spiral into a 70-footdeep gorge. The bus got lodged against a tree, potentially preventing further casualties.

Emergency responders, including local residents, police, and Fire and Rescue Services personnel, launched rescue operations. The injured were rushed to Mundakayam Medical Trust Hospital and Mar Sleeva Medicity in Pala for treatment.

Efforts are underway to recover the bus using a crane to ensure no one remains trapped. Officials stated that the

bus had departed from Mavelikkara on Sunday morning and was due to return early Monday. Investigations into the exact cause of the accident are ongoing.

#### RAIPUR, Jan 6 (Agencies): Eight District Reserve Guard (DRG) jawans and a driver were killed after Naxals blew up their

vehicle using an improvised explosive device (IED) in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district. The blast occurred on the Bedre-Kutru Road in the dis-

The security personnel were returning from an operation when the incident happened. The DRG is a unit of the state police.

"The security personnel were returning to the base camp from a joint operation of Dantewada, Narayanpur, and Bijapur

when, at around 2.15 pm on January 6, unidentified Maoists detonated an IED near Ambeli village in the Kutru police station area of Bijapur district," Inspector General of Police (IGP) Bastar said.

"We will soon release a detailed statement on this," the official added.

This is the biggest strike on security personnel by Naxalites in the last two years, an official said.

On April 26, 2023, ten police personnel and a civilian driver were killed after Naxals blew up their vehicle, which was part of a convoy carrying security personnel in neighbouring Dantewada district. Chhattisgrah Chief

Minister Vishnu Deo Sai expressed condolences over the death of the security personnel and called the incident "extremely painful".

"My condolences are with the families of the martyrs. I pray to God for peace to the souls of the martyred soldiers and to provide strength to the bereaved families," he said.

"The Naxalites are frustrated with the ongoing Naxal eradication campaign in Bastar and are perpetrating such cowardly acts out of frustration. The martyrdom of the soldiers will not go in vain, our fight to end Naxalism will continue strongly," he added.

Chhattisgarh Assembly Speaker and former Chief Minister Dr Raman Singh reacted to the incident and said, "Whenever big operations are conducted against them, these Naxalites resort to cowardly attacks. I express my condolences to the families of the soldiers who lost their lives in this attack. The significant steps being taken by the Chhattisgarh government and the central government will continue to move forward."

In a latest update, an NIA team will soon visit Bijapur, according to sources. The team will be sent from the Raipur NIA branch. The NIA forensic team will also be present.

This comes a day after five Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Bastar. The gunfight broke out on Saturday evening (January 4) at a forest in south Abujhmaad along the border of Narayanpur and Dantewada districts when a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxalite operation.

## **Biden says Americans shouldn't forget Capitol** attack—but that there won't be a repeat this time

Biden spent much of 2024 warning voters that Trump was a serious threat to nation's democracy

WASHINGTON, Jan 6 (Agencies): President Joe Biden is decrying what he calls an "unrelenting effort" to downplay a mob of Donald Trump supporters overrunning the US Capitol in an attempt to block certification of the 2020 election — seeking to contrast that day's chaos with what he promises will be an orderly transition returning Trump to power for a second term.

In an opinion piece published in The Washington Post, Biden recalled Jan. 6, 2021, writing that "violent insurrectionists attacked the Capitol." "We should be proud that our democracy withstood this assault," Biden wrote. "And we should be glad we will not see such a shameful attack again this year." Congress will convene amid snow in Washington on Monday to certify Trump's victory in November's election - in a session presided over by the candidate he defeated, Vice President Kamala Harris. No violence, or even procedural objections, are expected this time, marking a return to a US tradition that launches the peaceful transfer of presidential power.

That's despite Trump continuing to deny that he lost to



Biden in 2020, already musing publicly about staying beyond the Constitution's two-term White House limit, and promising to pardon some of the more than 1,250 people who have pleaded guilty or were convicted of crimes for the Capitol siege.

In his opinion piece, Biden says of the certification process, "After what we all witnessed on Jan. 6, 2021, we know we can never again take it for granted." He doesn't mention Trump directly but says "an unrelenting effort has been underway to rewrite — even erase — the history of that day." "To tell us we didn't see what we all saw with our own eyes," Biden wrote. "We cannot allow the truth to be lost." He vowed that the "election will be certified peacefully. I

have invited the incoming presi-

dent to the White House on the

morning of Jan. 20, and I will be

present for his inauguration that

afternoon," even though Trump

skipped Biden's inauguration in

2021. "But on this day, we cannot forget," Biden added. "We should commit to remembering Jan 6, 2021, every year. To remember it as a day when our democracy was put to the test and prevailed. To remember that

democracy — even in America - is never guaranteed."

The published piece followed Biden telling reporters at the White House that the history of what occurred on Jan. 6, 2021, "should not be rewritten" and adding, "I don't think it should be forgotten." Biden spent much of 2024 warning voters that Trump was a serious threat to the nation's democracy. And this past week, the president awarded the Presidential Citizens Medal to Liz Cheney and Bennie Thompson, leaders of the congressional investigation into the Capitol riot.

As he did with his opinion piece, Biden used comments to reporters to stress that his administration is overseeing a peaceful handover of power unlike the last one.

"I've reached out to make sure the smooth transition," Biden said of Trump's incoming administration. "We've got to get back to basic, normal transfer of power." When asked if he still viewed his soon-to-be successor in the White House as a threat to democracy, Biden responded, "I think what he did was a genuine threat to democracy. I'm hopeful we're beyond that now."

## South Korea's military says North Korea fired missile into eastern sea

SEOUL DC, Jan 6 (Agencies): North Korea on Monday fired a ballistic missile that flew 1,100 kilometers (685 miles) before landing in waters between the Korean Peninsula and Japan, South Korea's military said, extending its heightened weapons testing activities into 2025 weeks before **Donald Trump returns** as US president.

The South's Joint Chiefs of Staff said the missile was fired from an area near the North Korean capital of Pyongyang and that the launch preparations were detected in advance by the US and South Korean militaries. It denounced the launch as a provocation that poses a serious threat to peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula.

The joint chiefs said the military was strengthening its surveillance and defense posture in preparation

for possible additional launches and sharing information on the missile with the United States and Japan.

The launch came as US Secretary of State Antony Blinken was visiting Seoul for talks with South Korean allies over the North Korean nuclear threat and other issues.

Blinken's visit comes amid political turmoil in South Korea following President Yoon Suk Yeol's short-lived martial law decree and subsequent impeachment by parliament last month, which experts say puts the country at a disadvantage in getting a steady footing with Trump ahead of his return to the White House.

In a year-end political conference, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un vowed to implement the "toughest" anti-U.S. policy and criticized the Biden administration's efforts to strengthen security cooperation with Seoul and Tokyo, which he described as a "nuclear military bloc for aggression." North Korean state media did not specify Kim's policy plans or mention any specific comments about Trump. During his first term, Trump met Kim three times for talks on the North's nuclear program.

Many experts, however, say a quick resumption of Kim-Trump summitry is unlikely as Trump would first focus on conflicts in Ukraine and the Middle East. North Korea's support for Russia's war against Ukraine also poses a challenge to efforts to revive diplomacy, experts say.

Before his presidency faltered over the ill-conceived power grab, Yoon worked closely with U.S. President Joe Biden to expand joint military exercises, update nuclear deterrence strategies and strengthen trilateral security cooperation with Tokyo.

## **Death toll from the German Christmas market attack** rises to 6

BERLIN, Jan 6 (Agencies): The death toll in the attack on a Christmas market in the German city of Magdeburg last month has risen to six as a woman succumbed to her injuries, prosecutors said Monday.

Prosecutors in Naumburg said the 52-yearold woman died in a hospital, German news agency dpa reported. Authorities have said that the others who died were four women aged 45, 52, 67 and 75, and a 9-year-old boy.

More than 200 people were injured in the Dec.



20 attack.

Authorities have identified the suspect, who was arrested immediately after he drove a rented car through the crowded market early on a Friday evening, as a Saudi doctor who arrived in Germany in 2006 and had received permanent residency.

They have said he doesn't fit the usual profile of perpetrators of extremist attacks. The man described himself as an ex-Muslim who was highly critical of Islam, and on social media expressed support for the far-right.

## 'Detain President Yoon', South Korea anti-graft agency asks police to execute warrant

SEOUL, Jan 6 (Agencies): South Korea's anti-corruption agency said on Monday that it had asked police to take over the execution of an arrest warrant for impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol.

The request comes after a failed attempt to execute an arrest warrant on Friday following a tense stand-off with presidential guards who formed a human chain to block access by the investigators.

A joint team of investigators from the Corruption Investigation Office for High-ranking Officials (CIO) and police are probing allegations that Yoon masterminded insurrection with his



short-lived imposition of martial law.

The CIO sent a notice to police to request the takeover, the anti-corruption agency said in a statement to reporters.

The move comes amid frustration among Yoon's critics towards the CIO for failing up

to now to execute the arrest warrant, which is due to expire at midnight on Monday (1500 GMT). A police official told the Yonhap news agency

that they were "review-

ing the law internally"

following the request

from the CIO. Yoon's lawyers have argued that the antigraft force leading his criminal investigation has no authority under South Korean law to investigate any case involving insurrection accusations.

The Seoul Western District Court on Sunday dismissed the injunction filed by Yoon's legal team seeking to invalidate the warrants to arrest the president and search his official residence, according to Yonhap.

Amid the ongoing political tensions, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken is visiting South Korea this week where he is due to meet senior government officials to reaffirm the alliance with Seoul, according to the US State Department.

His visit comes after Yoon's short-lived declaration of martial law last month sent South Korea into political chaos, drawing rare rebuke from officials in Washington.

The CIO is an independent agency launched in January 2021 to investigate high-ranking officials including the president and their family members, but it does not have authority to prosecute a president.

Instead it is by law required to refer the case to the prosecutors' office to take any action including indictment once the questioning is over.

## Bangladesh court issues second arrest warrant for ex-PM Sheikh Hasina

DHAKA, Jan 6 (Agencies): A court in Bangladesh has issued a second arrest warrant for former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on charges of enforced disappearances during her rule, the chief prosecutor said on Monday. Dhaka has already issued an arrest warrant for Ms Hasina on charges of crimes against humanity.

According to Tajul Islam, chief prosecutor of the domestic International Crimes Tribunal (ICT), a new warrant has been issued for Sheikh Hasina and 11 others, including her military adviser, military personnel, and other law enforcement officials.

He said that the court wanted to go ahead with the trial, and said, "We want to ensure the trial concludes as soon as possible, but that doesn't mean we will break the law or impose a verdict without due process.

Over 500 people were

allegedly abducted by Bangladeshi security personnel during her reign, with some detained in secret facilities for years.

Victims have begun coming forward since Hasina's ouster with harrowing accounts of their ordeals, according to a report by agency. The 77-year-old

Hasina fled to India on August 5 after her regime was toppled by a student-led revolution. In December, Bangladesh asked India to send her back to face trial, a demand to which Delhi declined to respond.

Dozens of her allies have been taken into custody since her government collapsed, accused of involvement in a police crackdown that killed more than 700 people during the unrest that led to her ouster after 15 years of iron-fisted rule.

TEL AVIV. Jan 6 (Agencies): A shooting attack on a bus carrying Israelis in the occupied West Bank killed at least three people and wounded seven others on Monday, Israeli medics said.

Israel's Magen David Adom rescue service said those killed included two women in their 60s and a man in his

Violence has surged in the West Bank since Hamas' Oct. 7, 2023 attack out of Gaza ignited the ongoing war

The attack occurred in the Palestinian village of Al-Funduq, on one of the main east-west roads crossing the territory. The identities of the attackers and those killed were not immediately known. The military said it was looking for the attackers, who fled.

Palestinians have carried out scores of shooting, stabbing and car-ramming attacks against Israelis in recent years. Israel has



launched near-nightly military raids across the territory that frequently trigger gunbattle with militants.

The Palestinian Health Ministry says at least 835 Palestinians have been killed by Israeli fire in the West Bank since the start of the war in Gaza.

Israel captured the West Bank, Gaza and east Jerusalem in the 1967 Mideast war, and the Palestinians want all three territories for their future state.

Some 3 million Palestinians live in the West Bank under seemingly open-ended Israeli military rule, with the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority administering population centers. Over 500,000 Israeli settlers live in scores of settlements, which most of the international community considers illegal.

Meanwhile, the war in Gaza is raging with no end in sight, though there has reportedly been recent progress in long-running talks aimed at a ceasefire and hostage release.

The war began when Hamas-led militants stormed across the border in a massive surprise attack nearly 15 months ago, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting around 250. Some 100 hostages are still inside Gaza, at least a third of whom are believed to be dead.

Israel's air and ground offensive has killed over 45,800 Palestinians in Gaza, according to local health authorities, who say women and children make up more than half of those killed. They do not say how many of the dead were militants. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 fighters, without providing evidence.

The war has destroyed vast areas of Gaza and displaced 90% of the territory's population of 2.3 million, often multiple times. Hundreds of thousands are enduring a cold, rainy winter in tent camps along the windy coast. At least seven infants have died of hypothermia because of the harsh conditions, according to Gaza's Health Ministry.

Aid groups say Israeli restrictions, ongoing fighting and the breakdown of law and order in many areas make it difficult to provide desperately needed food and other assistance.

# Former players feel Rohit has 'lot of cricket' left in him

Test captain needs to go 'back to basics' to revive batting form

SYDNEY, Jan 6 (Agencies): Rohit Sharma's form in Tests may be a cause for serious worry for the national selectors and coaches but there is a strong view that there is still some cricket left in the Indian skipper subject to his sorting out his physical and technical issues.

Sharma had a horrid run in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy wherein he featured in three of the five Test matches. He scored 31 runs in total, with a highest score of 10, at an average of 6.20. The swords are out, especially with vice-captain Jasprit Bumrah leading India to their lone win in the series — in the Perth Test in which Sharma did not feature. Both Sharma's captaincy and his batting have drawn criticism with the former lacking inspiration and latter being woefully out of sorts. As he sat himself out of the fifth and final Test match in Sydney, the huzz

As he sat himself out of the fifth and final Test match in Sydney, the buzz over his international cricketing future grew louder. Is it time for him to call it quits or should the selectors go for a new full-time captain in Bumrah has been the big debating point. Team India coach Gautam Gambhir is unwilling to take a call yet on the future of not just Sharma but also Virat Kohli, the other embattled biggie in the team.

Speaking to the media after the loss in the fifth Test, Gambhir said, "I can't talk about the



future of players, it is still up to them but yes they still have the hunger and passion and both Virat and Rohit are tough people. Hopefully, they can continue to take Indian cricket forward but also as we all know whatever they plan they will do so keeping in mind the best interest of Indian cricket."

He further added that "Test cricket is all about improving every day."

Former Mumbai and West Zone coach Balwinder Singh Sandhu said that given Sharma's talent, he should have

scored more runs in Test cricket.

"I first saw Sharma in a Deodhar Trophy match. Ravindra Jadeja too was there in the West Zone side. Sharma played so coolly. I told Parthiv Patel, who was the West Zone skipper, that

Sharma should bat at No. 3. He came at that position and scored 150. He played amazing shots. So he had the potential to be a big player from the very begin-

ning. He then got into India A,"

he said.

"He is so talented he should have scored more runs in Test cricket. He was more talented than Virat Kohli but Kohli worked hard on his game and fitness. Kohli was more disciplined," he

Speaking about Sharma's technical woes, Sandhu said, "He has been bowled out, has been given leg before too. Suryakumar Yadav had the same problem and I told him his trigger movement was an issue. The same issue is with Sharma. He has to work on his trigger movement. He has to also work

on his fitness. There is a lot of cricket left in Rohit."

Sandhu added that Sharma should go back to domestic cricket to sort out his batting woes

Former India spinner Harbhajan Singh, who has been Sharma's teammate in the past, said that Sharma alone cannot be blamed for the team's downfall.

"In my eyes this is not the Rohit Sharma we know. I think that the selectors, coaches and players should sit together and discuss how 2024 was for all. It is not about one particular player but the entire team. The yardstick should be same for all players and not Sharma alone," he said.

Singh further stressed that it is not the player's call to pick and choose which series to play, which Sharma and Kohli have done in the past. "I don't think players should say they are available for a particular series or not, it is the selectors' job to pick or not pick them," said Singh.

Finally, Singh said that Sharma needed to get back to the basics to solve his batting woes. "He needs to get back to basics. If he is not playing domestic cricket he can go and play county cricket. Cheteshwar Pujara, Ravichandran Ashwin and even I myself went and played county cricket to get back among the runs and wickets. As far as retirement is concerned it is entirely Sharma's call," he said.

## There should be no excuse for not being able to play Ranji Trophy: Gavasakar tells senior players



SYDNEY, Jan 6 (Agencies): Legendary Sunil Gavaskar urged Indian batters to play in the Ranji Trophy without offering any excuses to iron out technical deficiencies that led to their peril in two successive series against New Zealand and Australia.

Gavaskar said it was worrying to see the Indian batters churning out underwhelming efforts against New Zealand at home and in the just-concluded series against Australia Down Under.

India succumbed to the Kiwis 0-3 before surrendering to the Aussies 1-3.

"On January 23, there is the next round of the Ranji Trophy. Let's see how many players from this squad play. There

should be no excuse for not being able to play," Gavaskar said. "If you do not play those matches, Gautam Gambhir will have to take a few tough decisions against those who are not available for the Ranji Trophy," he added.

"Gambhir should be saying: 'You do not have that commitment. We need commitment. You are not playing. Whatever you want to do, do it, but for the Indian cricket, you cannot return to the Test squad." Gavaskar said flaws had crept into Indian batsmen's approach because of not playing domestic cricket on available

opportunities.
"What I saw were technical deficiencies. If you have been making the same mistakes, and I am not just talking about

this series — I am talking about the New Zealand series as well — what did you do against New Zealand in India?" Gavaskar said domestic cricket assumed importance in view of the upcoming 2025-2027 WTC cycle.

"And that's why now, because the next cycle will start in June, we have not qualified for the World Test Championship. From now on, we should be ready for it. If we have to take tough decisions, then we will have to take them," he said.

With the next WTC cycle in focus, Gavaskar said India should now focus more on young cricketers such as Yashasvi Jaiswal and Nitish Kumar Reddy. "They are hungry to earn a name for India and themselves. Such players are needed. You need such players who will protect their wicket like their life," he said.

"That's why I'm interested that on January 23, in the Ranji Trophy matches, who will play? I want to see that. Because at that time, there will be T20 matches against England. But those who are not playing T20, will they play Ranji Trophy matches or not?" he said.

## Injured Bumrah likely to miss majority of home white-ball series against England

SYDNEY, Jan 6 (Agencies): Pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah, who sustained back spasms, is likely to be rested for the majority of India's home white-ball series against England, keeping an eye on the ICC Champions Trophy, starting from February 19.

Bumrah, who was India's stand out player with 32 wickets in their 1-3 thrashing at the hands of Australia in the just-concluded Border-Gavaskar Trophy, couldn't bowl in the final innings of the series here after suffering back spasms.

The 30-year-old Bumrah who bowled more than 150 overs in the series.

The injury has a direct link to his excessive workload in the series, and the BCCI medical team will try to ensure the new Test captain is ready for the ICC showpiece where his presence is mandatory to India's fortunes.

According to sources privy to the development, the grade of Bumrah's back spasm has not yet been ascertained.

India will open their Champions Trophy campaign against Bangladesh on February 20 in Dubai.

If Bumrah's injury is in grade 1 category, then it will take a minimum two to three weeks of rehabilitation before Return to Play (RTP).

In case of Grade 2 injury, the recovery can go up to six weeks while Grade



3, the most severe in nature, requires a minimum three months of rest and rehabilitation programmes.

It was always known that Bumrah will not play T20I bilateral series as this is not the World Cup year, but with the Champions Trophy around the corner, he would have certainly played two if not three ODIs against England as its the 50-over format.

But now, the grade of his injury will decide whether Bumrah plays the England series at all or at least the last match at his home ground in Ahmedabad on February 12 to check on his fitness.

India will face England in five T20Is and three ODIs from January 22.

"I had thought that it (winning the World Championship) would be somewhat similar to the Candidates, but obviously it's much more. I'm grateful for all the attention and recognition.

"I guess one thing is to manage these things with the training. But after the (World Championship) match, I also need some recovery period. I've started training a bit. But it will be more serious soon," he explained.

Five-time world champion and Gukesh's mentor Viswanathan Anand said his ward's

victory has brought the attention firmly back to chess.

"I think it brings back the spotlight to chess. If you project this forward, it's possible that in every single tournament there is some Indian playing that you can look forward to watching.

"So I hope a lot of the dots are connected. The audience numbers in India are very good. Now, we have regular broadcasts and everything. So, I think it will be a sport in the main line.

"Of course, Gukesh will spearhead that, especially as being the world champion. But now people are interested to see if there will be Indians playing in a tournament. So there's a lot of excitement at all stages.

"The hospital administration seems more concerned with generating revenue than with

serving the needs of the community," the release said.

The Sangathan has demanded that the hospital authority take immediate steps to address the concerns raised.

The Sangathan demanded that hospital authority should ensure equal treatment and timely medical attention for all patients, regardless of their socioeconomic status.

The hospital authority should also increased transparency and accountability, implementing measures to enhance transparency in hospital operations and hold staff accountable for any negligence or discrimination, the release added

### Rao appeals for completion of left over work on road projects of Sub-Division Thathri

JAMMU, Jan 6: President Thathri Development Front, District Doda. Kuldeep Kumar Rao, has appealed to the Chief Minister. Umar Abdullah, concerned MP & MOS in Prime Minister office, Jatinder Singh Rana, Dy. Chief Minister. Kumar Chauc hary, MLA Bhadarwah, Daleep Singh Parihar, MLA Doda -52 Mehraj Malik, to look deep into the left over work on the road -projects of the area and issue directions to the concerned to take immediate necessary steps to complete the below mentioned very small projects, on priority bases, so that a population of about 5 Tehsils, comprises of Tehsils, Kahara, Thathri, Phaqsoo, Bhella & Chirrala, is benefited giving an end to the age-old hardships to the people besides the area also comes on tourism maps, again benefiting the whole population of all these Tehsils.

They further said that for achieving full advantage of the Tourism development schemes in erstwhile Doda District and for ensuring greater opportunities of employment, the left-over work on some roads needs to be completed on priority. They said that Kahara -Jai road project, which is complete up to Joura Kalan (85% of the total length), needs to be completed from Joura to Jai (9 kms length).

It will not only provide employment to the poor people of the area but also boost tourism. It is one of the links in the circuit network. The 19 Kms sanctioned Thathri-Chirra road project is complete from its initial point Jangalwar Nallah to Chirra (length 14 Kms) & the remaining 5 Kms from Chirra to Gallu Top be kindly constructed immediately.

Further, if Gallu Top is linked to Joura (2kms only) on Kahara-Jai road, 90% link between tourist



places will be achieved. Still further, if Joura Khurd (road already complete) is linked to Chirala- Panshaee road by only a 5 kms stretch, which is tree less Forest land & the circuit of roads will be complete. It will greatly boost tourism and also provide employment to thousands of unemployed people.

Rao has appealed to the



Daleep Singh Parihar & MLA Doda -52, Mehraj Malik, that two of the above mentioned Joura to Jai and Chira to Gallu Top (sanctioned projects) be kindly taken up immediately on priority. Kahara-Jai road is perhaps the longest pending project in erstwhile Doda District & this fact should be given due consideration, without any further delay. He has de-cried over step motherly treatment in all walks of life, with the poor public of Sub-Division Thathri at the hands of successive state & central governments.


He further said that the Sub-Division Thathri, has its own 5 Tehsils, Moreover Drabshalla Tehsil, of District Kishtwar is only at a distance of 4 kms from the office of Sub-Division Thathri, where as it is not less than 26 kms from District Head Quarter Kishtwar & the Tehsil Head Quarter of Mohalla Tehsil of District Doda is at a distance of 14 kms from the office of Sub-Division Thathri, where as it is not less than 25 kms from District Head Quarter Doda.

If these two Tehsils are also included in Sub-Division Thathri it will be easily accessible to the public of these two Tehsils than Kishtwar or Doda. Then it will be a sub-Division of 7 Tehsil & hence highly deserving for a District status. The Sub-Division Thathri also deserves separate Assembly Constituency & also a separate tourism Authority as all the existing Districts & Assembly Constituencies in the state have hardly 2 or 3 Tehsils. But the Sub-Division Thathri has been in-genuinely ignored by the successive state & central governments, Mr. Rao said & added that the Sub-Division Thathri was first divided in Bhadarwah & Inderwal Constituencies & now it is attached with Doda Constituency because of which the whole Sub-Division Thathri is lacking the basic facilities. Sub-Division Thathri is the most backward and undeveloped Sub-Division of Jammu & Kashmir UT, whose 90% population is situated in

villages in the rural area. The benefits of independence & democracy are yet to reach this area as it has all along been neglected in the past as well as present by the successive Central & state governments till date. Mr. Rao, has appealed to the Central Government & also to the State government to create two new Districts Bhadarwah & Thathri for Justice for population wise equality in J&K UT.

In Kashmir Division there are Districts with hardly two or three Tehsils while in Jammu Division there are Districts like District Doda having 17 Tehsils, is not only in genuine but also ridiculous. So it is appealed to make number of Tehsils equal or almost equal in every District after reorganization of Tehsils & the creation of New Districts is of paramount importance.
