Supreme Court grants interim bail to Asaram in 2013 rape case



NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Tuesday granted interim bail to jailed self-styled godman Asaram in a 2013 rape case on medical grounds till March 31. Notably, a bench of

Justices M M Sundresh and Rajesh Bindal directed Asaram not to meet his followers post release.

The top court said 86-year-old Asaram was suffering from various age-related health conditions besides a heart ailment.

The top court had sought Gujarat government's response on Asaram's plea for suspension of life sentence awarded to him by a Gandhinagar court in 2023.

The SC said it would only examine the issue on medical grounds.

On August 29, 2024. the Gujarat High Court rejected Asaram's plea seeking the suspension and found no case to grant him the reprieve.

The trial court in January, 2023, convicted Asaram in the 2013 case, filed by a woman who lived in his ashram near Gandhinagar when the alleged crime took place.

Asaram is currently lodged in a Jodhpur iail in Rajasthan in another rape case.

95 dead in powerful Tibet earthquake, tremors also felt in parts of India



BEIJING, Jan 7 (Agencies): A magnitude 6.8 earthquake rocked the northern foothills of the Himalayas near one of Tibet's holiest cities on Tuesday, Chinese authorities said, killing at least 95 people and shaking buildings in neighbouring Nepal, Bhutan and India.

The quake hit at 9:05 am (0105 GMT), with its epicentre located in

Tingri, a rural county known as the northern gateway to the Everest region, at a depth of 10 km (6.2 miles), according to the China Earthquake Networks Centre. The US Geological Service put the quake's magnitude at 7.1.

At least 95 people were known to have been killed and 130 injured on the Tibetan side, China's state-run television reported six hours later. There were no reports of deaths elsewhere.

Southwestern parts of China, Nepal and northern India are frequently hit by earthquakes caused by the collision of the Indian and Eurasian tectonic plates.

Tuesday's epicentre was around 80 km (50 miles) north of Mount Everest, the world's highest mountain and a

popular destination for climbers and trekkers.

Winter is not a popular season for climbers and hikers in Nepal, with a German climber the lone mountaineer with a permit to climb Mount Everest. He had already left the base camp after failing to reach the summit, Lilathar Awasthi, a Department of Tourism official, said.

Nepal's National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Authority (NDRRMA) said the tremors were felt in seven hill districts bordering Tibet.

"So far we have not received any information of any loss of life and property," NDRRMA spokesman Dizan Bhattarai told Reuters. "We have mobilised police, security forces and local authorities to collect information," he said.

Indo-Pak War Veteran Havaldar Baldev Singh passes away in Rajouri at 93



JAMMU, Jan 7 (Agencies): Veteran soldier Havaldar (retd) Baldev Singh, who fought four wars against Pakistan, passed away at his residence in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, a defence spokesman said on Tuesday. He was 93.

The revered war hero passed away due to natural causes in his hometown Naushera on Monday, the spokesman said, adding that his last rites will be performed with full military honours at his village later on

Tuesday.

Born on September 27, 1931, at Naunihal village, Singh was just 16 when he volunteered to join the Bal Sena Force under the leadership of Brigadier Usman, Commander of the 50 Para Brigade, during the battle of Naushera and Jhangar in 1947-48.

The Bal Sena, a group of local boys aged 12 to 16, served as despatch runners for the Indian Army in the critical moments of these

Reviving MSME Sector

The Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector plays a pivotal role in the Indian economy, contributing around 30% to the country's GDP and providing employment to over 110 million people. It is a key driver of economic growth, fostering innovation, entrepreneurship, and regional development. However, the sector faces significant challenges, including financial constraints, technological backwardness, and the lingering impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Reviving the MSME sector is essential not only for economic recovery but also for ensuring inclusive and sustainable growth.

One of the most pressing challenges for MSMEs is access to finance. Despite the presence of schemes like the Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE), many businesses struggle to secure adequate funding. A lack of collateral, insufficient credit history, and the perception of MSMEs as high-risk borrowers hinder their ability to access loans. This financial crunch often limits their capacity to invest in growth and modernization, creating a cycle of stagnation.

Another critical issue is the technological gap within the MSME sector. Many enterprises rely on outdated processes and machinery, reducing their productivity and competitiveness. In a rapidly digitizing world, the inability to adopt advanced technologies places MSMEs at a disadvantage, especially when competing with larger corporations or foreign firms. The lack of affordable technological solutions exacerbates this issue, preventing small businesses from fully leveraging the benefits of automation and digital platforms.

The regulatory and compliance burden is another significant hurdle. MSMEs often find themselves overwhelmed by complex regulations, multiple registrations, and frequent audits. These processes not only consume time and resources but also discourage many entrepreneurs from scaling their businesses. Simplifying these frameworks is essential to reduce the operational challenges faced by MSMEs.

The COVID-19 pandemic further compounded the challenges for MSMEs. Supply chain disruptions, declining demand, and prolonged lockdowns forced many businesses to shut down temporarily or permanently. While government interventions provided some relief, many MSMEs are still grappling with the financial losses and operational challenges brought about by the pandemic.

Despite these challenges, the government has launched several initiatives to support MSMEs. The Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, for instance, allocated 3 lakh crore under the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) to provide collateral-free loans. Other initiatives, such as the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme and the simplified Udyam Registration process, aim to enhance manufacturing, ease compliance, and improve market access for MSMEs. However, the effective implementation of these programs remains critical to achieving tangible results.

Expanding credit guarantee schemes like CGTMSE to include a broader range of MSMEs and encouraging digital lending platforms can improve credit flow. Promoting technology adoption is another crucial step. Subsidized programs for technology upgradation can help MSMEs modernize their operations. Digital literacy initiatives can enable businesses to leverage e-commerce platforms, expanding their reach and customer base. Additionally, establishing innovation hubs and incubators for MSMEs can foster a culture of entrepreneurship and innovation.

Simplifying regulatory frameworks is equally important. A single-window clearance system for registrations and compliance can significantly reduce bureaucratic hurdles. Regular reviews of existing regulations can ensure that they remain business-friendly and relevant to the current economic landscape.

Expanding market access is vital for the growth of MSMEs. Integrating MSMEs into e-commerce platforms and providing export incentives can help them tap into domestic and international markets. Trade fairs, buyer-seller meets, and digital marketplaces can serve as effective platforms for showcasing their products and services.

Addressing the skills gap is another critical area. Establishing skill development centers in industrial clusters and fostering industry-academia collaboration can bridge this gap. Tailored training programs that cater to the specific needs of MSMEs can enhance workforce productivity and officiency.

Finally, a focus on reviving sick units is essential for the sector's overall recovery. A one-time settlement scheme for MSMEs burdened with debt can provide much-needed relief. Setting up a dedicated fund to support restructuring and revival efforts can help struggling businesses get back on their feet.

Government Employees & Pensioners left in lurch

ment whereby it compensates its employees, pensioners and family pensioners by compensating for bearing the higher cost of living and rising prices. The government usually gives relief to its employees and pensioners by announcing increased dearness allowances preferably twice a financial year .The union cabinet had approved a 3% increase in the Dearness allowance of the central government employees and pensioners from January first 2024, thus making the total D.A 50% of the basic pay and now again the central government has increased D.A. of its one crore employees from July first 2024 by another 3 percent giving a big relief to its employees ,pensioners and family pensioners .There rates of D.A have also been given to its employees by various state governments and UT governments to its employees ,pensioners and family pensioners .But to great dismay the J&K UT government has not announced any increase of DA to its employees ,pensioners and family pensioners and so the two installments of dearness allowance at the rate of 3%due from first January 2024 and second installment of 3% due from first July 2024 is due but unfortunately pending troubling JK ,UT employees ,pensioners and family pensioners .So two installments of dearness allowance are outstanding by the JK,UT government .Non-announcement of dearness allowance by the Jammu and Kashmir government to its employees and pensioners has denied its due to the employees and pensioners ,thus troubling them and putting them to great inconvenience .The non-seriousness of the UT government of J&K has caught the government employees between the devil and deep sea. They are bearing the brunt of continuously rising prices of goods and services and the cost of living is increasing. But the pertinent question is why the UT government has not yet announced two installments of dearness allowance to its employees and pensioners? Thus the government employees and pensioners as well as the family pensioners are feel-

ing suffocation ,harassment and inconvenience as all of them are suffering because the Jammu and Kashmir government has failed to announce the two pending installments of the DA to its employees and pensioners, thus putting them to trouble for no fault of theirs .lt seems that the UT government of J&K is in no mood to announce the two pending installments of dearness allowance to its employees and pensioners .In these days of soaring prices, the employees and pensioners are finding it very hard to make both ends to meet .The Jammu and Kashmir government employees as well as its pensioners are hard pressed and they are facing financial difficulties in the face of non -announcement of the dearness allowances .It seems that even on the eve of new year the J&K government is shying away from announcing two pending DA dues to its employees ,pensioners and family pensioners so putting all of them to inconvenience .One feels that because of duel power centers in Jammu and Kashmir ,the DA has not been announced as yet thus troubling employees and pensioners .It sees that the LG's administration is passing the buck on the elected government so far as the release of the pending installments of DA are concerned .It is the ill luck of the people of Jammu and Kashmir ,that there are two power centers in UT of Jammu and Kashmir and people are the sufferers. LG administration feels that release of pending DA is the prerogative of the elected government and the vice versa and the end sufferers are the people and in this case of non release of the outstanding dearness allowances the government employees pensioners and family pensioners .Time and now the UT government of Jammu and Kashmir through its finance department is issuing orders and circulars concerning the pensioners and family pensioners and not few months ago in the scorching heat and humid climate the UT government had ordered its pensioners and family pensioners to undergo pension verification .For undergoing the pension verification the poor pensioners and

family pensioners were forced to have the rounds of visits to the Jammu and Kashmir Bank and the concerned treasury to get the pension verification done .That pension verification put the aged and old pensioners and family pensioners to unease and trouble. And few days after the pension verification ,the meek pensioners and family pensioners were again asked to give life certificates and present themselves in the JK Bank branch .Someone has rightly said that PPO is not pension payment order but it can be said to be Pensioners prisoner order .Ladakh government also had since released 3% DA to its employees and has also increased medical allowance to its pensioners to Rs 1,000. It seems that the UT government of Jammu and Kashmir is hell bent to put its employees especially its pensioners to untold sufferings .The government is twiddling its thumbs and making no efforts to decide to announce the pending DA to its employees and pensioners .The UT government ,LG Manoj Sinha and the elected chief minister and the finance minister all are requested and appealed to order the release of the two pending installments of DA to its employees and pensioners without any further delay and give some relief to them from soaring prices .But is any authority listening is the million dollar question ?.It can be opined that JK government Tas Se mas na hote hai so far as the decision to release the two pending installments of DA to its employees and pensioners is concerned .The government seems relentless so far as the order of the release of the pending DA is concerned .In short the UT government of J&K has left the employees and pensioners in lurch to fend for themselves and it has made the plight of government employees and pensioners plight deplorable.

They argued that the provocation came from Kanav Sharma when he allegedly dislocated Ravinder Singh's scooty without his knowledge

or approval.
Additionally, they said,
Kanav Sharma reportedly snatched the keys
of the scooty, showcasing what the family
describes as "dadagiri"
or hooliganism.

Instead of involving the police, the family claimed that Kanav Sharma called his friends and well-wishers to confront Ravinder Singh and teach him a lesson, escalating the situation further and taking the law into his own hands.

The family emphasized that the presence of Kanav Sharma's friends and a local crowd, who allegedly made life-threatening gestures, frightened Ravinder Singh, leaving him with no choice but to act in self-defense.

They stated that the gun was drawn to scare off the mob, not with the intent to cause harm. However, due to the chaotic nature of the confrontation, the gun went off accidentally when someone crashed into Ravinder Singh, as per his account.

The family maintained that Ravinder Singh had no intention to cause any physical harm to Kanav Sharma and that the incident was an unfortunate accident.

Furthermore, the family clarified that Ravinder Singh did not know the identity of Kanav Sharma but claimed that Kanav Sharma was aware of Ravinder Singh's identity as a government employee of the Power Development Department (PDD), who was on duty at the time of

The family argued that despite knowing this, Kanav Sharma still proceeded to confront Ravinder Singh and allegedly caused harm to him and his colleagues.

the incident.

In their appeal to the Power Development Department (PDD), the family urged the relevant authorities not to be swayed by rumours spread by unscrupulous elements aiming to defame the PDD employees.

They requested the department to provide legal assistance to Ravinder Singh so that he can clear his name of the allegations related to the gun assault.

The family asserted that the incident was an act of self-defense in response to an unruly mob intending to cause harm to Ravinder Singh and his colleagues.

Five houses damaged in fire in Srinagar's Nowhatta

Non-Gazetted Police Pensioners Welfare Forum holds protest, projects demands

JAMMU, Jan 7: A protest was held at Hari Singh Park, Jammu, under the leadership of Ajit Singh, Chairman of the Non-Gazetted Police Pensioners Welfare Forum

The protest aimed to raise several critical issues related to the discrimination faced by retired police pensioners and J&K Fire Services personnel in pay anomalies and other welfare matters.

The forum emphasized that the effect of the pay anomaly order is being applied only prospectively, starting from the date of the order October 17, 2014, instead of being applied retroactively from 1996, when the 5th Pay Commission was implemented. This has left many pensioners without due benefits, and some have even passed away. Surviving



pensioners are seeking these benefits.

The forum demanded that medical facilities, similar to those provided to paramilitary forces, be extended to the Jammu and Kashmir State Police, as the police now come under the Union Ministry of Home Affairs following the formation of the UT.

A request was made for a 10% reservation

in professional colleges and recruitment for the children of police pers, sonnel, recognizing their

service to the nation.
The forum sought the implementation of the recovery process for commuted pensions in line with the policies of Gujarat, Punjab, Haryana, and the Jammu High Court, which stipulate the cessation of recovery after 10 years

instead of 15 years.

There were concerns raised about the delayed processing of pension papers and formalities in the J&K Police Department. This delay causes financial hardship for retirees who are unable to access their pension and benefits immediately upon retirement.

Many retirees have not received their leave salary and gratuity for

over a year, and the forum urged the government to expedite the disbursement of these funds.

Despite the Central Government announcing a 3% Dearness Allowance (DA) increase for July 2024, J&K UT pensioners have not received it. Additionally, the DA increase for January 2025 is also pending, while Leh UT has already received its increase.

The forum highlighted a disparity in medical allowances between J&K UT and Leh UT. Leh UT increased the medical allowance to Rs. 1000, while J&K UT pensioners still receive only Rs. 300.

Ajit Singh, in his address, called for immediate attention to these issues and stressed the importance of fair treatment for retired police personnel and their families.



The SHO said police would make necessary arrangements for his visit.

The 'Pushpa' actor had earlier said that he remained deeply concerned about the boy, who is under constant medical care after the



incident. He wished the boy a speedy recovery and said he is looking forward to meeting him and his family, but was advised not to due to ongoing legal proceed-

"Jolie's extraordinary portrayal captures the heart and complexity of an artist whose life was as captivating as her music," said Nachhattar Singh Chandi, the Palm Springs International Film Festival's chairman, in a statement.

Jolie has collected praise for her emotional portrayal of Maria Callas' final days in Paris in the 1970s. She garnered her biggest headlines last week when news broke that her and Pitt's lawyers officially signed

off on the pair's divorce, concluding eight years of strained negotiations that included a battle over custody of their six children as well as the \$164 million French estate and winery they shared. The actress filed for dissolution of marriage on September 19, 2016, citing irreconcilable differences mere days after a flight on a private plane on which Jolie has claimed Pitt was abusive to her and their six children. After an investigation at the time, authorities did not charge the actor and Jolie declined to press charges.

Amit Shah launches Bharatpol for international police assistance


Calls the portal, developed by CBI, a transformative step in dealing with transnational crimes

NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah, on Tuesday, launched Bharatpol, a portal developed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) which will significantly facilitate Indian law enforcement agencies to enable real-time information sharing for faster access to international police assistance.

"This is a step to take international investigation to a new level where every probe agency, every state police force can easily connect with the Interpol and can speed up their probe," Shah said.

Till now CBI facilitated international cooperation in criminal matters in collaboration with various agencies across the country, including law enforcement agencies.

At the Central, State, and Union Territory levels, this coordination is executed through INTERPOL Liaison Officers (ILOs), who are further linked to Unit Officers (UO's) at the level of Superintendents of Police, Commissioners of Police



and Branch Heads, within their respective organizations. Presently, communications among the CBI, ILOs, and UOs primarily rely on letters, emails and faxes

The growing footprint of transnational crimes necessitated rapid and real-time international assistance in criminal investigations. Following this, the CBI has now developed BHARAT-POL Portal, accessible through its official website, which will bring all the stakeholders on a common platform.

"This portal has been developed after a detailed exercise. I believe this portal will become a transformative tool for probe agencies in dealing with crimes and security challenges," Shah said

He said several criminals after committing crime in the country have for a long time remained out of the reach of Indian law as they fled to some other country.

"The time has now come that using a developed system, we

bring those criminals, who are sitting abroad after committing crime here, within the reach of Indian law," Shah said.

The Home Minister said that under the three new criminal laws, they have introduced "Trial in Absentia" provision. "With this provision, we can start a trial against any criminal who is sitting abroad. Moreover, if these criminals are convicted during the trial, then their process of deportation will also be become easy," he said.

Notably, "trial in absentia" refers to conducting a criminal trial without the presence of the accused person in court. Earlier, Indian law did not allow trial, conviction or sentencing of any person in absentia even for heinous offences.

Under Section 355 of the BNSS, the Judge or Magistrate may conduct a trial of an accused in his absence if it is deemed that the personal attendance of the accused is not necessary in the interests of justice, or if the accused persistently disturbs the proceedings in court.

Rajnath Singh to meet Maldivian counterpart, focus on strengthening defence ties



NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will hold a bilateral meeting with the Maldivian counterpart, Mohammed Ghassan Maumoon, in New Delhi on January 8. Maumoon will be on a three-day visit to India from January 8 to 10.

The bilateral talks will focus on reviewing and expanding various aspects of defence collaboration, including joint training, regular exercises, capacity-building initiatives, defence equipment supplies, and high-level workshops.

During the visit, Maumoon will also travel to Goa and Mumbai.

India and the Maldives share deeprooted ties rooted in spiritual, historical, linguistic, and ethnic connections. However, the relationship has experienced ups and downs. Political shifts in the Maldives have influenced the dynamics of bilateral relations in recent years.

During the presidency of Abdulla Yameen (2013–2018), the Maldives leaned towards China, raising concerns in India about Beijing's growing influ-

ence in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR). The election of President Ibrahim Solih in 2018 marked a positive turn in India-Maldives relations, with renewed focus on partnerships in areas like defence, infrastructure, and disaster management.

FOCUS ON DEFENCE COOPERA-TION

The upcoming meeting reflects ongoing efforts to deepen defence cooperation between the two nations. Key areas of collaboration include joint training, where the Indian Armed Forces enhance the operational capabilities of Maldivian personnel. India has also supplied patrol vessels and supported the modernization of the Maldives National Defence Forces. Regular bilateral exercises like "Ekuverin" further bolster interoperability between the two militaries.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP IN THE INDIAN OCEAN

As key players in the IOR, India and the Maldives share a commitment to maintaining maritime security and addressing transnational threats such as piracy, trafficking, and terrorism. Enhanced defence ties align with India's broader goals of ensuring peace and stability in the region while countering the influence of external powers.

The visit of Mohammed Ghassan Maumoon signifies the growing importance of defence and security as pillars of India-Maldives relations.

3 Miners dead inside flooded Assam mine, army divers, choppers deployed

GUWAHATI, Jan 7 (Agencies): Three miners were feared dead inside a flooded coal mine in a remote district of India's northeastern Assam state, authorities said on Tuesday, as rescue teams worked through the night to try to reach a total of nine men trapped inside.

Three bodies have been spotted by rescue teams but have not yet been recovered, the local government said

in a statement.

Army teams deployed divers, helicopters and engineers to

help rescue the nine men, who have been trapped since Monday in the mine in Assam's hilly Dima Hasao district, the army said in a statement.

"The mine got flooded yesterday — the source was internal. They (the miners) probably hit some water channel and water came out and flooded it," Mayank Kumar, district police chief in Dima Hasao told agency.

Kumar said rescue teams from the army, national and state disaster relief forces were working to reach the trapped miners.

Photographs shared by the army on social media showed rescue workers with ropes, cranes and other equipment standing at the edge of a large, vertical mine.

Coal mine-related disasters in the remote northeastern part of India are not uncommon. In one of the biggest disasters, in 2019, at least 15 miners were buried while working in an illegal mine in the neighbouring state of Meghalaya after it was flooded by water from a nearby river.

Two criminals killed in Patna police encounter, one arrested

PATNA, Jan 7 (Agencies): In the early hours of Tuesday, two notorious criminals were killed, and another was arrested following a gunfight with police in the Phulwarisharif area of Patna district.

A police sub-inspector, Vivek Kumar, sustained bullet injuries during the encounter and has been admitted to AIIMS-Patna for treatment.

Acting on a tip-off, a special police team cordoned off the Hinduni locality under the Phulwarisharif police station jurisdiction and launched a search operation. The criminals, hiding in a makeshift house after



parking their vehicle outside, opened fire on the police. In self-defence, the police retaliated.

Superintendent of Police Patna (West), Sharat RS, confirmed that two criminals sustained bullet injuries during the exchange of

fire and later succumbed.
They were rushed to a nearby primary health center, where doctors declared them dead.
The deceased were identified as Vivek and

Laldahin, both residents

of Nalanda district. The

police reported that the

duo was involved in several cases of house robbery and dacoity in the Patna and Nalanda districts.

Another gang member, identified as Mantoo, surrendered to the police. However, 8–10 other members of the gang managed to escape, taking advantage of the dense fog in the area.

A forensic team visited the scene to collect samples for examination. Police recovered several used and live cartridges, along with illegal pistols, from the site. According to the police, the criminals had gathered in Hindu-

ni village with plans to commit a dacoity at a nearby house.

This incident comes on the heels of another police operation on January 4, in which a notorious criminal, Sushil Mochi, was killed during a gunfight at Tarbari village in Purnea district. Mochi, who had a bounty of 2 lakh on his head, was wanted in over three dozen cases of murder, loot, and dacoity across Bihar and West Bengal.

Efforts are ongoing to apprehend the remaining gang members who escaped during the Phulwarisharif encounter.

Bijapur Naxal attack: Chhattisgarh, CRPF top cops visit blast site

BIJAPUR, Jan 7 (Agencies): Chhattisgarh Director General of Police Ashok Juneja and CRPF DG Vitul Kumar on Tuesday visited the site in Bijapur district where eight security personnel and a civilian driver were killed after Naxalites blew up their vehicle, officials said.

In their biggest strike on security forces in Chhattisgarh in two years, Naxalites on Monday blew up a vehicle using an improvised explosive device (IED), weighing 60 to 70 kg, near Ambeli village under the Kutru police station area of the district.

Eight security person-

nel, four each from the state police's District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Bastar Fighters units, travelling in the SUV and the vehicle's driver died on the spot, located around 70 km from the district head-quarters.

Chhattisgarh DGP Juneja and Central



Reserve Police Force (CRPF) Director General Kumar on Tuesday visited the site sepa-

rately and took stock of the incident, Bijapur Superintendent of Police

Senior citizen dies, another man hospitalised after fire in Mumbai highrise

MUMBAI, Jan 7 (Agencies): A senior citizen died and another person was hospitalised after suffering from suffocation following a fire in a multi-storey residential building in Mumbai's Andheri area, officials said on Tuesday.

The blaze erupted in a flat on the 11th floor of the 13-storey Sky Pan building in Oberoi Complex at 10 pm on Monday, they said.

It was doused after nearly four hours at 1:49 am on Tuesday, the officials

Two persons suffered from suffocation due to smoke following the fire and

they were rushed to the nearby Kokilaben Hospital.

One of them, identified as 75-yearold Rahul Mishra declared "brought dead", while the other person, Raunak Mishra (38), was undergoing treatment, he said.

The fire was confined to the electric wiring, electric installations and household articles in the flat, another official

Prima facie, the fire brigade suspects a short-circuit could have triggered the fire, but the exact cause was under investigation, he said.

Bajrang Dal leader held for raping woman in Kanpur

KANPUR (UP), Jan 7 (Agencies): Bajrang Dal leader Dilip Singh Bajrangi has been arrested for allegedly raping a woman on the pretext of marriage, police said here on Tuesday.

Additional DCP (South) Mahesh Kumar said Bajrangi was arrested after he attempted suicide by pouring kerosene on his face outside the Govind Nagar Police Station on Monday, alleging that he was implicated in a false rape case.

On November 5,



2024, a woman lodged an FIR at Collectorganj Police Station against Bajrangi alleging that he befriended her, took her to a hotel at Ghantaghar and raped her on the pretext of marriage, Kumar told agency on Tuesday.

The woman claimed

that Bajrangi also made obscene videos of her and uploaded them on social media.

Following this, a probe was launched in the matter.

However, Bajrangi, who was a former district convenor of the Bajrang Dal in Kanpur, went absconding, he said.

On Monday, Bajrangi along with his supporters and Bajrang Dal workers arrived at the Govind Nagar Police Station and attempted to set himself on fire while doing live streams on social media, the police said.

Bajrangi's self-immolation bid outside the police station amidst public prompted police to lodge another FIR on charges of obstruction in discharging official duties and suicide attempt, the officer said.

BPSC exam row: SC refuses to hear plea over alleged irregularities, police action

NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Tuesday refused to examine a plea over the alleged irregularities in the BPSC exam held on December 13, 2024, and the consequent police action

on protestors.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Sanjay Kumar and K V Viswanathan asked petitioner to move the Patna High Court with the grievances.

The counsel appearing for petitioner, Anand Legal Aid Forum Trust, urged the bench to consider the plea, saying the country witnessed Bihar police's brutally on peaceful protesters who sought cancellation of the contentious Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) exam.

"We are asking you to go to the Patna High Court," the CJI said. The counsel, however, said, "This paper leak is happening as a daily matter."

"We understand your sentiments attached...but we cannot be the court of first instance," the CJI said, "and we feel it will be appropriate and more expeditious that the petitioner approached the Patna High Court under Article 226

of the Constitution."

The lawyer informed the bench the place where police led a charge with batons on protestors was near the Patna High Court chief justice's official residence and a suo-motu

note could have been taken.

Bihar police allegedly used force to control civil service aspirants

who demanded the cancellation of the BPSC examination held on December 13, 2024.

The state public service commission ordered a re-exam held on January 4 at 22 centers in Patna for certain candidates.

Of the 12,012 candidates eligible for the retest, a total of 8,111 downloaded their admit cards, and 5,943 appeared for the examina-

Jan Suraaj founder Prashant Kishor, who was on an indefinite fast in Patna's Gandhi Maidan, raising the same demand was arrested and later released on bail. He was moved to the ICU of Medanta Hospital in the city on Tuesday over health complications.

North Korea confirms testing of hypersonic missile under Kim Jong-un's supervision

SEOUL, Jan 7 (Agencies): North Korea announced on Tuesday that it had successfully test-fired a new intermediate-range ballistic missile (IRBM) equipped with a hypersonic warhead, Yonhap News Agency reported, citing state media.

According to North Korea's state media Korean Central News Agency (KCNA), the missile travelled approximately 1,500 kilometres at a speed 12 times faster than sound during a test conducted the previous day under the supervision of North Korean leader Kim Jong-Un via a monitoring system.

Kim stated that the development of the missile was intended to enhance North Korea's nuclear deterrence by "making the weapon system to which no one can respond to the linchpin of strategic deterrence"

"The hypersonic missile system will reliably contain any rivals in the Pacific region that can affect the security of our state. The system can deal a



serious military strike to a rival while effectively breaking any dense defensive barrier," Kim said, according to KCNA

The KCNA reported that the hypersonic glide vehicle atop the IRBM reached its first peak at an altitude of 99.8 kilometres and a second at 42.5 kilometres, successfully completing a 1,500-kilometre flight path and striking its designated target in the sea.

This missile test, North Korea's first provocation in roughly two months, occurred less than two weeks before US President-

elect Donald Trump's inauguration on January 20.

However, the South Korean military dismissed the North's claim as a "deception," saying there was no second peak.

"The flight range analysed by South Korea, the US and Japan was around 1,100 kilometre and (the missile) did not reach a second peak," JCS spokesperson Col. Lee Sung-un told a regular press briefing, noting the North has a track record of "exaggerating," Yonhap report-

"North Korea probably intend-

ed to flex its muscle against the United States. As it said the latest launch was a test-firing, the weapons system does not appear to be completed, pointing to demand (to further develop) in terms of military technology," an official at South Korea's unification ministry told reporters.

Notably, North Korea fired a hypersonic missile into the East Sea on Monday. South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) reported detecting the launch of a suspected intermediate-range ballistic missile (IRBM) from the Pyongyang area around noon yesterday.

The missile travelled approximately 1,100 kilometres before landing in the sea, Yonhap reported.

Although the missile's flight range was below the typical 3,000 to 5,500 kilometres covered by IRBMs, a JCS official had noted that it appeared to share features with North Korea's intermediate-range hypersonic missiles tested in January and April last year.

"Since beginning of Kursk operation, enemy lost over 38,000 troops": Zelenskyy



KYIV, Jan 7 (Agencies): Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Tuesday highlighted progress in Ukraine's ongoing counteroffensive in the Kursk region, marking five months since the operation began.

Zelenskyy emphasised the creation of a buffer zone on Russian territory and the destruction of Russian military assets, noting motre than 38,000 enemy losses in the area, including approximately 15,000

"irrecoverable losses."
Sharing a post on X early Tuesday, Zelenskyy said, "Today marks exactly five months since the start of our actions in the Kursk region, and we continue to maintain a buffer zone on Russian territory, actively destroying their military potential there. During the Kursk

operation, the enemy has already lost over 38,000 soldiers in this single direction alone, with approximately 15,000 of them irrecoverable losses."

Zelenskyy added, "The Russians have deployed their strongest units to Kursk, including soldiers from North Korea. Importantly, all this manpower cannot now be redirected to other fronts--neither to the Donetsk region, nor against Sumy, the Kharkiv region, or Zaporizhzhia."

Praising the Ukrainian forces for their efforts, Zelenskyy said, "I thank all our warriors who are bringing the war back home--to Russia--and giving Ukraine more security and strength."

Ukraine on Sunday carried out a counterattack in Kursk, warning that Moscow is "getting what it deserves," CNN reported.

Andrii Kovalenko, the head of the Ukrainian Center for Countering Disinformation, an official body, announced that Ukrainian forces had launched surprise attacks against Russian forces in various locations in Kursk, months after conducting its incursion in the region.

In a short post shared on Telegram, the head of the Ukrainian Presidential Office, Andriy Yermak said, "Kursk region, good news, Russia is getting what it deserves."

The Ukrainian military first conducted an incursion into Kursk in August and has held much of the territory it took, despite efforts made by Russian forces and recently deployed North Korean soldiers to send back Ukrainian troops across the border.

In a statement shared on Sunday, the Russian Defence Ministry said that the Ukrainians had conducted counterattacks to stop a Russian offensive, CNN reported, citing TASS news agency. It said that both had been repelled and added that the Ukrainian assault including two tanks and 12 armoured vehicles was defeated near Berdin village, which is located some 15 kilometers from the border.

National Sheriffs' Association backs Kash Patel for FBI Director

WASHINGTON DC, Jan 7 (Agencies): The National Sheriffs' Association (NSA) has endorsed Kash Patel as the director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in a letter to Senate Judiciary Committee leaders that also railed against the state of law enforcement under the Biden administration.

"We are pleased to give our enthusiastic endorsement of Mr. Patel's nomination to be the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and urge the Committee hold hearings expeditiously. We believe there will be broad support for Mr. Patel and we look forward to his swift confirmation by the full United States Senate," NSA President Kieran Donahue wrote in a letter Monday to Sens. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa, and Dick Durbin, D-III., the chair and ranking member of the Senate Judiciary Committee, respec-

The NSA is a professional association that boasts roughly 10,000 active members.

President-elect Trump nominated Kash Patel as FBI director in November. Patel is an outspoken crusader against the "deep state." In a book published last year, he explicitly called for revamping the FBI in a chapter dubbed "Overhauling the FBI," and moving the FBI's head-quarters out of Washington, DC.

In his letter to the senators, Donahue lauded Patel's resume as evidence he has the "credentials, skills, temperament, commitment, and experience for this critical position."

Patel hit the national radar during Trump's first administration, including when he worked as the national security adviser and senior counsel for the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence under committee Chair Rep. Devin Nunes, R-Calif.

"Mr. Patel's service will

undoubtedly prioritize the restoration of confidence in the Bureau through increased transparency, integrity, collaboration, and commitment to excellence. Mr. Patel promised NSA - if confirmed - his unwavering dedication to working hand in glove with local state tribal and federal law enforcement at the rank-and- file and leadership levels. His commitment to the reciprocity of accessto-advise is essential to combating the most serious security and policing challenges ahead. We are certain Mr. Patel's engagement will result in vital and effective partnerships nationwide to protect communities large and small." Donahue wrote.

The sheriff group's leader also took direct aim at policies affecting law enforcement that were rolled out under the Biden administration, which he said has "undermined the rule of law and burdened our

e nation with great risk e and vulnerability."

"Equally detrimental are the border policies that permit unchecked access to our homeland. These two factors have sadly but predictably granted domestic and international criminals unprecedented opportunity to victimise or endanger the citizens and residents of our nation. As a result, countless communities across America are under siege. Through the exploitation of these vulnerabilities, complex criminal and terror schemes are taking hold and flourishing. The blind spot created by inadequate border control and law enforcement policies has facilitated criminal activity that falls under multiple jurisdictions and therefore demands a robust and coordinated response. he wrote to the senators.

The sheriff continued that local law enforcement agencies want to work more closely with federal leaders in order to combat the infiltration of cartels and organized crime groups in the US, but have "been denied direct unfiltered access to the President" in the last four years.

"As a result, there is a perception within law enforcement and the public that our national leaders do not comprehend the ground truth about criminal trends and lack the will, policy tools, and resources to thwart the criminal activities undermining the security of our nation,"



he wrote.

"Our federal law enforcement hierarchy, armed with knowledge gained through local collaboration, must be heard by the decision makers in Washington. In this time of uncertainty, it is critical the Federal Bureau of Investigation be led by someone who has the complete confidence of the President." he continued.

Patel previously

served as a public defender in Florida's Miami-Dade area, where he tried "scores of complex cases ranging from murder, to narcotrafficking, to complex financial crimes in jury trials in state and federal courts," according to his Defence Department biography. He also won a DOJ award in 2017 under the Obama administration for his prosecution and conviction of 12 terrorists responsible for the World Cup bombings in

Patel served as the former Chief of Staff to Acting Secretary of Defense Christopher

Miller and is responsible for leading the Secretary's mission at the Department, including his executive staff and providing counsel to the Secretary on all matters concerning the Department's operations, according to the US Department of Defence.

Previously, Patel

served as the Deputy Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Counterterrorism (CT) at the National Security Council (NSC). In that capacity, Patel oversaw the execution of several of Trump's top priorities, including eliminating ISIS and Al-Qa'ida leadership such as al-Baghdadi and Qasem al-Rimi, and the safe repatriation of numerous American hostages.

Patel also served as Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence, where he oversaw the operations of all 17 intelligence community agencies and provided the President's Daily Briefing.

Britain to make creating, sharing sexually explicit "deepfakes" a crime

LONDON, Jan 7 (Agencies): Creating and sharing sexually explicit "deepfakes" will become a criminal offence in Britain, the government said on Tuesday, in a bid to tackle a surge in the proliferation of such images, mainly target-

ing women and girls.
Deepfakes are videos, pictures or audio clips made with artificial intelligence to look real, and such technology can be used to digitally alter pornographic images into the likeness of someone else.
Publishing intimate

photos or videos without consent and with the intent to cause distress - so-called revenge porn - was criminalised in Britain in 2015, but that legislation does not cover the use of fake images.

Data from UK-based Revenge Porn Helpline showed image-based abuse using deepfakes has increased more than 400% since 2017.
Under the new offence to be introduced by the government, perpetrators could be charged and face prosecution for

both creating and shar-

ing these images.

"There is no excuse for creating a sexually explicit deepfake of someone without their consent," the justice ministry said in a statement.

The previous Conservative government, which lost power to the Labour Party in July, announced similar plans to make sexually explicit deepfakes a criminal offence. Under its proposal, offenders would face fines and even jail time.

The justice ministry

said further details of the new offence would be set out in due course.

The government said it would also create new offences for the taking of intimate images without consent and the installation of equipment with

intent to commit these offences. Those found guilty could face up to two years behind bars.

"This demeaning and disgusting form of chauvinism must not become normalised," said Victims Minister Alex Davies-Jones.

Technology minister Margaret Jones said tech platforms hosting abusive images would face tougher scrutiny and significant penalties.

"Intimate-image abuse is a national emergency that is causing significant, long-lasting harm to women and girls who face a total loss of control over their digital footprint, at the hands of online misogyny," said campaigner Jess Davies.

The new offences will be included in the government's Crime and Policing Bill, which will be introduced to parliament. A date is yet to be

Taiwan holds military drills as concerns rise over possible defense budget cut

HSINCHU, Jan 7 (Agencies): Taiwan began three days of military drills on Tuesday as concerns rose over potential cuts to the defense budget due to legislative wrangling between the island's

two major political parties.

The drills began in the north with tank maneuvering at a base in Hsinchu featuring outmoded CM-11 tanks, which are gradually being replaced by newly purchased Abrams M1A2T from the U.S. The replacement marks a huge upgrade despite some complaints over the weight of the new tanks and their likely effectiveness at preventing a possible Chinese landing.

Troops arrived on armored personnel carriers, while Apache and S-70 helicopters whirled over-

head, providing reconnaissance and covering fire.

With the equipment Taiwan currently operates, the communication officer is on the ground to coordinate airborne attacks, said Army Captain Chuang Yuancheng of the 542 Armored Brigade in Hsinchu county just south of the capital of Taipei. That allows them to guide the helicopters so that "ground fire and airborne fire

On Wednesday, the army will show off its Patriot III anti-missile system aimed at countering one of China's most potent weapons against the island of 23 million. And on Thursday, anti-submarine exercises will be held off of Taiwan's largest port of Kaohsiung, considered China's best conduit

are synchronized," Chuang said.



for resupplying its troops should it establish a beachhead in the heavily defended region.

The annual drills are held in the run-up to the Lunar New Year holiday to reassure the population of Taiwan's ability to meet China's

threats and to boost recruitment. Taiwan has a backlog of orders from the U.S. for about \$20 billion in weapons systems, while it upgrades its M-16 fighters and develops its own submarines. It has also extended compulsory

military service to one year.

However, the government has warned that new legal amend-

warned that new legal amendments being considered could force a 28% cut in the defense budget by altering the way funds are distributed between the central and local governments.

That in turn could reduce the willingness of the U.S. and its allies such as Japan and the Philippines to assist Taiwan in the event of an armed clash with China, National Security Council Secretary-General Joseph Wu told legislators last

The legislation is being pushed by the main opposition Nationalist Party, which has joined with the tiny Taiwan People's Party to oppose the ruling Democratic Progressive Party's legislative agenda.

Taiwan currently spends about 2.4% of its GDP, or roughly \$20 billion, on the military annually.

China has responded furiously to all U.S. arms sales to Taiwan, saying unification with the island is inevitable and warning that Washington is "playing with fire." However, apart from regularly sending planes and warships into areas near the island, it has done little more than blacklist companies and executives involved in the production and sales of such equipment.

Neither military intimidation, economic coercion nor appeals to their common Chinese ancestry seem to be working on Taiwan's population, the vast majority of whom favor the current status of de-facto independence.

Pausha Putrada Ekadashi Vratto be observed on Jan 10: Mahant Rohit Shastri

JAMMU, Jan 7: The fast of Pausha Putrada Ekadashi, a significant religious observance, will be observed on Friday, January 10, 2025.

This fast, observed annually on the Ekadashi of the Shukla Paksha (waxing phase of the moon) in the month of Pausha, is especially important for women, who pray for the long life and well-being of their children.

Mahant Rohit Shastri, Jyotishacharya, and President of Shri Kailakh Jyotish avim Vedic Sansthan Trust, provided insights on the importance of the fast. According to him, Pausha Putrada Ekadashi holds a unique significance as it is believed to bless devotees with virtuous offspring. Devotees observe the fast to honor Lord Vishnu, the preserver of the universe.

This year, the Ekadashi tithi of Pausha Shukla Paksha will begin on Thursday, January 9, at 12:23 PM and end on Friday, January 10, at 10:20 AM. The fast will be observed on January 10, 2025, as the Ekadashi falls on sunrise that day. Pausha Putrada Ekadashi is one of the two times this fast is observed each year, the other being during the Shukla Paksha of Shravan month.

Mahant Shastri

emphasized that the Ekadashi fast teaches devotees how to maintain balance in life by rising above material desires and following the path of dharma, ultimately attaining moksha (salvation). The fast can be observed by both men and women, and it can be kept either without food (nirahar) or with fruits (phalahar). After performing Lord Vishnu's worship in the evening, devotees may consume fruits. The fast is broken on Dwadashi (the following day), and it is customary to offer food to a needy person or a Brahmin and make donations.

Religious scriptures advise against consuming rice, tamasic (impure) food, alcohol, and intoxicants on Ekadashi. Only sattvic (pure) food should be consumed to maintain the spiritual sanctity of the fast.

Mahant Rohit Shastri provided guidance on the rituals for Pausha Putrada Ekadashi. He emphasized the importance of maintaining both mental and physical purity. The worship should begin in the morning with the husband and wife together praying to Lord Lakshminarayan. After a bath, they should prepare a clean altar in the puja room or a sacred space in the house, placing idols or pictures of Lord Ganesha and Lord Lakshminarayan. The altar should be purified with Gangajal (holy water) or cow urine.

A Kalash (sacred pot) made of silver, copper, or clay should be placed on the altar, filled with water and covered with a coconut, marking the Kalash Sthapana (installation). Worship should include offerings to the deities present in the Kalash, the Navgrahas (nine planets), Yoginis, and city deities.

The devotees must take a vow for the fast and perform Shodashopachara (16-step worship), which includes offerings such as invocation, seat, water for washing feet, arghya (holy water offering), water sipping, bathing, clothes, sacred thread, sandalwood, turmeric, flowers, incense, lamps, naivedya (food offerings), fruits, betel leaves, Dakshina (monetary offering), aarti, circumambulation, and mantra-pushpanjali (flower offerings with chants).

Chanting the Santan Gopal Mantra and narrating or listening to the fasting story completes the puja, followed by the distribution of prasad (sacred food).

95 dead in powerful Tibet earthquake, tremors also felt in parts of India

which are sparsely populated, are remote and can only be reached by foot.

The impact of the quake was felt across the Shigatse region of Tibet, home to 800,000 people. The region is administered by Shigatse city, the traditional seat of the Panchen Lama, one of the most important figures in Tibetan Buddhism.

Chinese President Xi Jinping said all-out search and rescue efforts should be carried out to minimise casualties, properly resettle the affected people, and ensure a safe and warm winter.

More than 1,500 local firefighters and rescue workers have been dispatched to the affected areas, China's Xinhua news agency reported.

Some 22,000 items including cotton tents, cotton coats, quilts and folding beds have also been sent to the quake-hit region, it

Villages in Tingri, where the average elevation is around 4,000-5,000 metres (13,000-16,000 feet), reported strong shaking during the quake, which was followed by dozens of aftershocks with magnitudes

of up to 4.4. Crumbled shop fronts could be seen in a video on social media showing the aftermath in the town of Lhatse, with debris spilling out onto the road.

Reuters was able to confirm the location based on nearby buildings, windows, road layout, and signage that match satellite and street view imagery. There are three townships and 27 villages

within 20 km (12 miles) of the epicentre, with a total population of around 6,900, and more than 1,000 houses have been damaged, Xinhua reported. Local government officials were liaising

with nearby towns to gauge the impact of the quake and check for casualties, and China closed the Everest region to tourists after the quake, it added. The Tingri tremor was caused by a rup-

ture in what is known as the Lhasa block in an area under north-south compression and west-east stress, CCTV reported, citing Chinese experts. Since 1950, there have been 21 earth-

quakes of magnitude 6 or above in the Lhasa block, the largest of which was the 6.9-magnitude quake in Mainling in 2017, according to CCTV. Mainling is located in the lower reaches of

Tibet's Yarlung Zangbo river where China is planning to build the world's largest hydropower dam. A magnitude 7.8 tremor struck near

Nepal's capital Kathmandu in 2015, killing about 9,000 people and injuring thousands in the country's worst ever earthquake. Among the dead were at least 18 people killed at the Mount Everest base camp when it was hit by an avalanche. On Tuesday, tremors were felt in Kath-

mandu, some 400 km (250 miles) from the epicentre, and residents in the city ran out of their houses.

"The bed was shaking and I thought my

child was moving the bed ... I didn't pay that much attention but the shaking of (a) window made me understand that it's an earthquake," said Kathmandu resident Meera Adhikarii. "I'm still shaking out of fear and am in shock."

One person was injured in Kathmandu when he jumped off the top of a house after feeling the strong tremors, Nepal Police spokesman Bishwa Adhikari said. The man was being treated in hospital.

The quake also jolted Thimphu, the capital of Bhutan, and the northern Indian state of Bihar which borders Nepal.

So far, no reports of any damage or loss to property have been received, officials in India and Bhutan said.

Indo-Pak War Veteran Havaldar Baldev Singh passes away in Rajouri at 93

Throughout his career, Singh received numerous honours for his service, including recognition by Nehru. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, former vice-president Hamid Ansari, and several other distinguished leaders, he said, adding that Singh's contributions to the nation serve as an inspiring testament to patriotism and courage.

"Singh's legacy lives on as a living legend, deeply respected for his service to the country," the spokesman said.

Microsoft to invest \$3 billion in India, to train 10 million people in AI by 2030

BENGALURU, Jan 7 (Agencies): Microsoft Chairman and CEO Satya Nadella on Tuesday announced \$3 billion investment in India over the next two years for cloud and Al infrastructure.

Speaking at the company's AI (artificial intelligence) event here in Bengaluru, Nadella said the investments reaffirm our commitment to making India AI-first, and will help ensure people and organisations across the country benefit broadly. India



is rapidly becoming a leader in AI innovation, unlocking new opportunity across the country, he said.

He also announced that the company will train and skill 10 mil-

lion people in AI skills in India by 2030. This training is part of the second edition of its ADVANTA(I)GE India program.

Last year the company launched the ADVANTA(I)GE India initiative with the goal of training two million people in Al skills by 2025.

It has now surpassed this target with 2.4 million individuals trained in within a year. About 65% of the participants were women, and 74% came from tier II and tier III cities.

Microsoft will also expand its cloud and Al infrastructure across datacenter campuses in India. It has three datacenter regions in the domestic market, and the fourth will go live in 2026.

Its investment in the country aims to develop a scalable AI computing ecosystem to meet the growing demands of the country's rapidly expanding AI start-ups and research community, the company said.

Talking about GitHub platform, the CEO said India will have the largest developer community on GitHub by 2028. The country's contributions to GenAl projects stands at 30,594, next to the US.

Diet, lifestyle influences chances of age-related brain disorders: Study

WASHINGTON, Jan 7 (Agencies): The scientists at the Allen Institute for Brain Science have identified the molecular changes that occur in the brains of ageing mice and located a hot spot where most damage is centralized. The cells in the area are also connected with metabolism, thus suggesting a connection between diet and brain health.

identified specific cell types in the brains of mice that undergo major changes as they age, along with a specific hot spot where many of those changes occur. The discoveries are published in the journal Nature.

Scientists at the Allen Institute have

The study found that in ageing brains, genes associated with inflammation increased in activity while those related to neuronal structure and function

"Our hypothesis is that those cell types are getting less efficient at integrating signals from our environment or from things that we're consuming," said Kelly Jin, Ph.D., a scientist at the Allen Institute for Brain Science and lead author of the study.

"And that loss of efficiency somehow contributes to what we know as ageing in the rest of our body. I think that's pretty amazing, and I think it's remarkable that we're able to find those very specific changes with the methods that we're using.'

Through this study, scientists discovered a possible connection between diet, lifestyle factors, brain ageing, and changes that can influence our suscep-



tibility to age-related brain disorders.

They found a specific hot spot combining both the decrease in neuronal function and the increase in inflammation in the hypothalamus. The most significant gene expression changes were found in cell types near the third ventricle of the hypothalamus, including tanycytes, ependymal cells, and neurons known for their role in food intake, energy homeostasis, metabolism, and how our bodies use nutrients.

To conduct the study, funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), researchers used cutting-edge singlecell RNA sequencing and advanced brain-mapping tools developed through NIH's THE BRAIN Initiative to map over 1.2 million brain cells from young (two months old) and aged (18 months old) mice across 16 broad brain regions.

The aged mice are what scientists consider to be the equivalent of a late middle-aged human. Mouse brains share many similarities with human brains in terms of structure, function, genes, and cell types.

The scientists believe that the result of this study could pave the way for future therapies to slow or manage the ageing process in the brain.

Why patients worry more after seeing incomprehensible medical test results

NEW YORK, Jan 7 (Agencies): Medical reports worldwide are not written with patients in mind, which increases their overall level of worry as they find test results hard to understand, according to researchers.

For example, a standard pathology report is written by a pathologist for a clinical specialist like a surgeon or a cancer doctor or for other pathologists to read, said Cathryn Lapedis, of the Department of Pathology at University of Michigan Health in the US.

In a study published in the journal JAMA, Lapedis and her colleagues tested whether people could understand standard pathology reports and whether a patient-centred report might improve patient understanding.

A patient-centred pathology report gives important information on the patient's diagnosis in a clear format that minimises medical terminology, she said.

For example, a standard pathology report will include a term like prostatic adenocarcinoma, but the patientcentred report will simply call it prostate cancer.

The team recruited 2,238 adults, aged 55 to 84, who had a prostate but no history of prostate cancer. Participants were provided with a hypothetical scenario in which they were seeking care due to troubling urinary symptoms, received a biopsy and then would receive results from that test through their patient portal.

They were also asked to report their level of worry based on the results.

"We found that most people cannot get basic information — like whether or not they have prostate cancer from standard pathology reports. For example, in our participants reviewing the standard University report, only 39 per cent could accurately identify that the report showed cancer," said Lapedis.

However, 93 per cent of those who received the patient-centred pathology report accurately identified that the report showed prostate cancer.

Participants' level of worry was more closely associated with their risk level.

The study authors recommend that hospital systems consider including patient-centred pathology reports with standard reports to improve patient understand-

Anti-obesity class of drugs related with fewer post-surgery complications: Study



NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): Taking the 'GLP-1 receptor agonist' class of antiobesity drugs is related with lower rates of postsurgery complications in people with diabetes, according to a study.

GLP-1 receptor agonist, or GLP-1 RA, drugs help treat diabetes by weight loss, improving blood glucose levels and increasing insulin sensitivity, low levels of which are a risk factor for diabetes.

Researchers, led by those at Weill Cornell Medicine, the US, analysed hospital records of over 74,400 surgical procedures performed from February 2020 to July 2023 on nearly 22,000 patients with diabetes.

Patients taking the anti-obesity drugs had about 12 per cent lower risk of hospital re-admission within a month of surgery, compared to those not taking these medications, according to the findings published in the journal 'Annals of Surgery'.

The team also found 29 per cent lower risk of wound re-opening within six months of surgery, and about 56 per cent lower risk of haematoma-when blood collects in a tissue due to an injury at the surgery site-in this group of

patients. "These findings from such a large number of patients and procedures suggest that taking these drugs shouldn't worsen overall postsurgical complications, and may even reduce the likelihood of some of them," senior author

Dr Jason Spector, chief of the division of plastic and reconstructive surgery and a professor of surgery at Weill Cornell Medicine, said.

For the analysis, the researchers recorded the rates of 30-day hospital re-admissions and post-surgical adverse events during the follow-up period of at least six months. The rates were compared among patients with and without active GLP-1 RA drug prescriptions.

The results showed that the patients who were prescribed GLP-1 RA drugs were modestly less likely to require hospital re-admission within 30 days of surgery, implying fewer overall complications.

"An active perioperative GLP-1 RA prescription in patients with diabetes was associated with significant reductions in risk-adjusted readmission, wound dehiscence (re-opening), and haematoma, and no difference in infection and bleeding rates," the authors wrote.

Shastri, Ponting question Shami's injury management, say his inclusion could have boosted India

SYDNEY, Jan 7 (Agencies): Questioning Mohammed Shami's injury management, former greats Ravi Shastri and Ricky Ponting said the veteran pacer could have tilted the series in India's favour had he been added to the squad in the second half of the five-match Border-Gavaskar series.

India's decade-long stranglehold on the Border-Gavaskar Trophy ended after they went down by six wickets in Sydney to lose the series 1-3.

The pacer, after recovering from an ankle injury, returned to action for his home state Bengal and impressed in all the three formats—Ranji Trophy, Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 and Vijay Hazare one-dayers, raising hopes of a late inclusion.

But he was officially ruled out before the fourth Test in Melbourne with the BCCI medical team citing a knee swelling, though both Ponting and Shastri believe a trip to Australia and a return late in the series could have been pushed.

"To be honest, I was very surprised with the communication going on in the media as to what exactly happened to Mohammed Shami," the former Indian head coach stated in The ICC Review.

"Where is he when it comes to recovery? He's been sitting in the NCA for I don't know how long. Why can't proper communication come out on where he



stands? A player of his ability, I would have brought him to Australia."

"Absolutely, there's no question about that (Shami could have tilted the series in Melbourne or Sydney)," Shastri added.

The 62-year-old further said it would have been beneficial if Shami had, at least, travelled with the group in Australia.

"I would have kept him part of the team and made sure that his rehabilitation was done with the team." said Shastri.

"And then if we thought by the third Test match that no, this guy can't play the rest of the series, I would let him go. But I would have brought him with the team,

kept him, monitored him with the best of the physios and best of the advice even from international physios who are in Australia and seeing how he went. But I would have kept him in the mix." Shastri believes the fast bowler could have provided adequate

"When you asked me (in an earlier The ICC Review) at the start about what I thought the result would be, I said 3-1 Australia because Shami wasn't there. That was the first thing I said. That's how important I felt he was to India."

"If Shami, Bumrah and Siraj

were in their starting team, I think things could have been completely different here in Australia." Shami is currently playing in the domestic one-dayers for the Vijay Hazare Trophy and it remains to be seen if he's included for the England home series ahead of the ICC Champions Trophy in February.

Don't feel I was in race for opener's slot in Border-Gavaskar Tests: Renshaw



SYDNEY, Jan 7 (Agencies): Australian Test batter Matt Renshaw said on Tuesday that he had no idea if he was in the race to replace retired opener David Warner in the recently-concluded Border-Gavaskar series against India, which the hosts won 3-1.

Several names, including Cameron Bancroft, Marcus Harris, Nathan McSweeney, Sam Konstas and Renshaw, were discussed by Cricket Australia as potential options for opening the innings.

McSweeney and Konstas made it to the playing XI, with the former playing the first three Tests and the latter getting included in the

last two.
Renshaw felt he figured way down in the Australian selection pecking order for the opener's slot.

"I probably wouldn't say that I got caught up in the opener race. I don't think I was in it at all," Renshaw told SEN Radio.

"I'm probably further away than a few of the boys (to be selected) but most of my Tests have been in Asia so I've got a fair bit of experience there if called upon," added Renshaw, who would be fancying his chances as Australia select the squad for the Test series against Sri

Lanka later this month.
Renshaw said he just wants to enjoy his cricket without bothering too much about selection issues.

"It's been me trying to play my cricket the way I want to and I've really enjoyed it. (I'm) feeling really good about my cricket and how my batting is going and obviously there's aspirations there but I'm really enjoying my cricket right now."

Renshaw, 28, who has played 14 Tests, said opening the batting was a specialists' job and not everyone is cut out for the role.

"Opening is a specialist position, it's one of the toughest jobs in world sport," said Renshaw who last played a Test in February 2023 in the tour of India.

"If Steve Smith goes up the top and doesn't have the experience he would like, you can tell it's pretty difficult. I feel like I could bat anywhere if that opportunity came but I'll keep opening for Queensland because it brings me the most satisfaction when you succeed."

Asian Games gold medallist Bahadur Singh Sagoo elected as new Athletics Federation of India President

NEW DELHI, Jan 7 (Agencies): Bahadur Singh Sagoo has been elected as the new president of the Athletics Federation of India (AFI) on Tuesday.

The Asian Games shot put medallist replaced the outgoing Adille Sumariwalla as the president of the Indian athletics federation. Sagoo was elected as the new president during the Annual General Assembly Meeting of the federation in Chandigarh.

With the arrival of Sagoo, Sumariwalla's stint as the AFI president, which lasted for more than a decade will conclude. The 67-year-old became the AFI president in 2012.

Sagoo is a one-time Asian medallist and two-time national champion. The 51-year-old won a gold medal in the 2002 Busan Asian Games in the shot put. He also competed in the 2000 and 2004 Olympics. His best attempt of 20.40m came in 2004 in Koncha-Zaspa, Kyiv.

Home whitewash bigger than BGT loss; unfair to target Rohit, Virat: Yuvraj

DUBAI, Jan 7 (Agencies): World Cup-winning former all-rounder Yuvraj Singh has said that being whitewashed at home by New Zealand was a bigger low for Team India than the loss of Border-Gavaskar Trophy but refused to join the chorus of criticism against embattled veterans Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli.

India have endured a difficult last few months in the five-day format, going down 0-3 to an under-strength New Zealand at home, which was a first in the team's Test history. This was followed by a 1-3 drubbing by Australia in the away edition of the

Border Gavaskar series. Both the debacles have been largely attributed to the team's batting frailties, especially

those of Rohit and Kohli. "According to me, losing (to) New Zealand is more hurting (sic). Because they are losing 3-0 at home. You know, that is not acceptable. This (losing BGT) is still acceptable because you have won two times in



Australia. And this time you lost," Yuvraj told agency in an interview here.

"Australia has been a dominant side for the last so many years, that is my thought," the 43-year-old hero of India's 2011 World Cup triumph said.

While Kohli managed at least a hundred during the series despite continuing to be dismissed whenever he was baited outside the off stump,

Rohit was worse with a tally of just 31 runs and had to drop himself from the final Test.

But Yuvraj said it is unfair to lambast the duo given their past achievements.

"We are talking about our greats, Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, we are saying very bad things about them," he said.

"...people forget what they have achieved in the past. They are one of the greatest cricketers of this time. Okay, they lost, they did not play good cricket. They are getting hurt more than us," he added.

Hopeful that India would bounce back strongly, Yuvraj said he has full faith in not just Rohit and Kohli but also new head coach Gautam Gambhir, who was his former teammate as well.

"I feel that Gautam Gambhir as a coach, Ajit Agarkar as a selector, Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli, Jasprit Bumrah, they are the best minds in cricket right now," he asserted.

"And they have to decide what's the way for Indian cricket in future," he said.

The big-hitting former batter also lauded Rohit for dropping himself from the Sydney Test, saying it was a selfless act. "I think it is a big thing. I have never seen in the past that the captain's form is not going well and he himself has gone out. And this is Rohit Sharma's greatness that he has kept

the team ahead of himself," Yuvraj said.

"I think he is a great captain. Whether win or lose, he will always be a great captain. And in his captaincy, we have played the (ODI) World Cup final. We won a T20 World Cup. We have achieved a lot," he pointed out.

He urged the critics to exercise restraint while dissecting the team's performance.

"I was a student of the game and now I am a student of the game. The amount of cricket I have played, they have played more cricket than me," said the man, who played 304 ODIs, 40 Tests and 58 T20 Internationals for India, amassing 11,000 runs across formats.

"I can give my opinion. And my opinion is that when players are not performing, it is easy to say bad about them. But it is very difficult to support them. Media's job is to say bad about them. My job is to support my friends and brothers. For me, they are my family. Simple," he signed off.
