Maid arrested for stealing jewellery from **Srinagar** home: J-K **Police**

SRINAGAR, Jan 17 (Agencies): Police on Friday said a maid was arrested for stealing jewellery from a house in the HMT area of Srinagar.

In a statement, a police spokesperson said that a complaint was received at Shalteng police station from a woman who alleged that unknown thieves struck at her parents' home while they were away for performing Umrah during the intervening night of January 15 and 16.

In her complaint, she said that some jewellery items were stolen.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 04/2025 under the relevant section of law was registered at Police Station Shaltang and an investigation was initiated,

read the statement. "During the course of the investigation, some suspects were called for questioning, and the role of one suspect, namely Janatul Begum (working as the maid) wife of Mohd Chotu resident of Ward No. 7 Kusthan Madhepur Bihar A/P HMT Srinagar, was ascertained in the commission of crime," added the statement.

"Upon her disclosure, the stolen Jewellery was recovered," said the spokesperson, adding that the case was solved within 24 hours.

Manu, Gukesh among four to receive Khel Ratna from President Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan



NEW DELHI, Jan 17 (Agencies): Double Olympic-medallist shooter Manu Bhaker and teenage chess world champion D Gukesh received a euphoric round of applause as they walked up to receive the prestigious Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna from President Droupadi Murmu in a glittering National Sports Awards ceremo

ny here on Friday. The other two recipients of the country's highest sporting honour were men's hockey captain Harmanpreet Singh and Paralympic goldwinning high jumper Praveen Kumar when the annual honours were bestowed at the Rashtrapati Bhavan here.

Harmanpreet was a part of the national sides that won bronze

medals in the Tokyo as well as Paris Olympics. Praveen, on the other hand, upgraded his silver at the Japanese capital to a gold last year in Paris. He was born with a short left leg.

Thirty-two athletes are being honoured with the Arjuna Award out of which an unprecedented 17 are para-athletes.

The athletes selected for the Arjuna award include Paris Olympics bronze medal-winning group of wrestler Aman Sehrawat, shooters Swapnil Kusale and Sarabiot Singh and the men's hockey team players Jarmanpreet Singh, Sukhjeet Singh, Sanjay and Abhishek.

The para-athletes outnumbered the ablebodied ones in the list of Arjuna winners this time due to the magnificent Paris Paralympics performance in which they returned with 29 medals. including seven gold and nine silver.

The 22-year-old Bhaker became independent India's first athlete to win two medals in a single edition of the Olympics with her bronze-winning show in the 10m air pistol individual and 10m air pistol mixed team events in August last.

The 18-year-old Gukesh became the youngest world champion ever by beating

Cold wave intensifies in Kashmir as mercury dips after snowfall

SRINAGAR, Jan 17 (Agencies): The minimum temperatures at most places in Kashmir have fallen after snowfall as the meteorological department forecast mainly dry weather over the next three days, offi-

cials said on Friday. The higher reaches of Kashmir as well as some areas in the plains of the valley received snowfall on Thursday.

Following the snowfall, cold conditions are prevailing in Kashmir as the night temperatures decreased at most places, they said.

The minimum temperature in Srinagar settled at minus 2 degrees Celsius on Thursday night, half a degree up from the previous night's minus 2.5 degrees Celsius.

The tourist resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir, known for skiing, recorded a minimum temperature of minus 7 degrees Celsius.

Pahalgam, one of the base camps for the annual Amarnath Yatra in south Kashmir, recorded a low of minus 11.8 degrees Celsius, over seven degrees





"The removal of Abdul Wahid & his colleagues from the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) highlights the risks faced by officials who challenge corruption. It exposes nexus between the corrupt & most powerful," Mufti said in a post

She said the act of "punishing the whistleblower" has revealed the Government's true intentions behind using various agencies including the ACB to raid properties of Kashmiris "under the guise of corruption investigations".

Startups are risky, especially when you're balancing them with academics. Identify challenges like time conflicts or limited funds and create backup plans.

For example, use time management techniques like time-blocking to schedule dedicated hours for your startup.

Partner with a co-founder who can step in during the exam season or keep an emergency fund to manage unforeseen costs. Also, protect your physical and mental health by scheduling regular breaks, practicing mindfulness or journaling, and celebrating small wins.

ASSEMBLE A WINNING TEAM Great ideas need great teams. Look for co-founders or collaborators with complementary skills. If you're a business major, pair up with someone who can code or design. University hackathons and startup clubs are fantastic places to find like-minded peers. As you are member of a team member, role clarity is essential. What features would they like to see improved? This feedback loop will help you refine your product without wasting time on unnecessary features.

BUILD A STRONG BRAND

Your startup's brand is more than just a logo. It's the personality of your business. Think about how you want your startup to be perceived: professional, approachable, or innovative? Launch a simple website or landing page using tools like Wix or WordPress. Use social media platforms like Instagram to connect with your target audience, start building a community and excitement.

A compelling story helps. Share why you started your business. For example, if you struggled to find tutors as a freshman, make that part of your narrative. Stories resonate with people and can make your brand relatable. MANAGE FINANCES WISELY

Money is often tight for student entrepreneurs. Start small and

focus on essential expenses like app development or marketing. Use free tools for bookkeeping and tracking spending. Learn to track your key financial metrics, like breakeven point and customer acquisition

costs, and lifetime value. Explore funding options like bootstrapping - using savings or small

GDC Akhnoor organizes hands-on training workshop on mushroom cultivation

AKHNOOR, Jan 17: With a goal to give hands-on training to students and staff, Department of Botany, GDC Akhnoor organized a workshop on "Cultivation technology of Oyster mushrooms (Dhingari)" on 18th of January. Oyster mushroom was chosen for this purpose because the cultivation technology of this mushroom, especially compost making is very simple as compared to other mushrooms. Moreover, this season is favourable for cultivation of oyster mushroom. The event started with a welcome address by Prof. Nidhi Jarngal, Assistant Professor Botany. She emphasized the importance of this training programme as an entre-

preneurial opportunity,

especially for the young students.

The workshop was inaugurated by Prof. (Dr.) Romilla Malla Bhat, Principal of the college. Speaking on the occasion, she urged the participantsto opt this new 21st century crop for livelihood security. She further added that mushroom cultivation is one of the most profitable agri-business that can be started with a low investment making it an alternate source of income generation; especially in this region where the land is stonyand unfit for crop production.

Prof. Pooja Devi, HOD, Botany provided handson training for cultivation of Oyster mushrooms, commonly called Dhingari

She gave the practical demonstration on "substrate preparation for Oyster mushrooms" in which wheat straw was soaked in hot water overnight followed by draining of excess water from soaked straw.

After that, the process of Spawning (addition of mushroom seeds to the wet straw) was demonstrated and the spawned substrate was filled in polythene bags (60cmx40cm). The polythene bags were then incubated in a sterilized semi-dark room.

The polybags shall now be monitored on a regular basis for mycelial spread, pinhead formation and maturation of the oyster mushrooms. Harvesting of first crop of mushroom is expected within 35-40 days. About 50 students along with teaching and non-teaching staff members of the college attended this workshop.

At the end of the workshop, Prof. (Dr.) Romilla Malla Bhat, Principal of the college appreciated the efforts of Botany Department and encouraged the faculty to organize such activities in future also.

The workshop ended with formal vote of thanks presented by Dr. Ruhi Sharma, faculty of Botany department.

SMVDU students shine at International Conference on Advanced Research in Civil Engineering

This advanced tool, developed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, enables precise simulation of river hydraulics, sediment transport, and scour depth. The research addresses critical challenges in bridge design and maintenance, contributing to safer and more resilient infrastructure.

It is pertinent to mention that Samaira Sinha, Rishabh Kumar, and Subham Kumar Singh presented another paper titled "Discharge Estimation in Meandering Compound Channels using ETR and MARS Model."

This work integrated advanced data-driven models such as the ETR (Extreme Learning Machine) and MARS (Multivariate Adaptive

Regression Splines) to improve discharge prediction in meandering

river systems.

These innovative methodologies promise enhanced accuracy and efficiency in river flow management, supporting sustainable water resource utilization.

Saif Ali Khan recovering; Mumbai Police detain 1 person for questioning

The Mumbai Police on Friday said that the accused involved in the attack on Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan was last seen near Bandra railway station and that the search is on to nab him, an official said.

Police suspect that after the incident, he may have caught the first local train in the morning and headed towards Vasai Virar. Mumbai Police team are searching in Vasai, Nalasopara and Virar areas, an official said.

Earlier today, Mumbai Police said that they have taken possession of a portion of the blade extracted from Saif's back, while efforts to recover the remaining part are still underway.

Meanwhile, the Lilavati Hospital said that the actor's family and the doctors will decide on moving the actor to a normal ward from the ICU later in the day.

Bollywood Actor Saif Ali Khan was attacked by an intruder in his 11th-floor Bandra flat at around 2:30 am on Thursday. The incident occurred when an intruder allegedly confronted the actor's maid at his residence. As Saif attempted to intervene and de-escalate the situation, it escalated into a violent altercation, resulting in the actor sus-

taining several stab wounds.
Saif was immediately taken to
Mumbai's Lilavati Hospital after
being stabbed by the intruder.

He underwent surgery under the supervision of a team of doctors there. As per doctors, Saif sustained a major injury to the thoracic spinal cord due to a lodged knife in the spine, and surgery was performed to remove a 2.5-inch-long knife from the actor's spine and repair his 'leaking spinal fluid'. While Saif is "out of danger", doctors are continuing to monitor him. After surgery, he was shifted to ICU, where he is currently

recovering.

Mumbai police registered an FIR regarding the attack on the actor and recorded the statement of the complainant, who is the maid employed by the actor. In the complaint, it is alleged

In the complaint, it is alleged that the attacker demanded one crore rupees from the family. and went towards their (Saif Ali Khan's) son," the statement added.

She further said, "He attacked Saif with a wooden object in her hand and a hexa blade...

Saif with a wooden object in her hand and a hexa blade... We all ran out of the room and pulled the door and then we all ran towards him. Hearing the sound, Ramesh, Hari, Ramu and Paswan who were sleeping came out. When we took him to the room again, the door of the room was open." Mumbai Police is currently investigating the matter and have formed 20 teams to track down and nab the intruder who stabbed Saif.

Gedam said, "Last night, the accused used a fire escape staircase to enter Saif Ali Khan's house. It appears to be a robbery attempt. We working to arrest the accused. 10 Detection teams are working on the case. An offence has been registered in Bandra Police Station."

Heavy police outside cinema hall in Amristar; SGPC to stop screening of Kangana Ranuat's 'Emergency'



Amid demands to ban Kangana Ranaut's film 'Emergency', police personnel in heavy numbers have been deployed outside the PVR Suraj Chanda Tara Cinema in Punjab's Amritsar after Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) decided to protest against the film being produced by the BJP MP.

The film is being released today, January 17, which has invited strong opposition from the SGPC, where the committee has demanded it be banned in Punjab.

SPGC president Harjinder Singh Dhami wrote a letter to Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, accusing the film of being "politically motivated with an aim to defame Sikh community".

"In a letter to Chief Secretary of the Punjab Government, it was clearly stated that 'Emergency' film will not be allowed to be shown in Punjab, as it remains politically motivated with the aim to defame Sikhs," the letter read.

In a video posted by the committee's handle on X, SGPC chief Dhami said that they have submitted a demand letter to the Deputy Commissioner of Amritsar, requesting him to stop the release of the film that "incorrectly" portrays Sikh characters.

"I don't know whether it's well-balanced or not, but it's not true that whatever is happening on the streaming services is good. There are some not so great scripts here also, but there are good scripts too.

As long as there is enough material which is engaging you and is satisfying you creatively, it's all good. Once that sort of dwindles, then it becomes a problem," she ends.

Four youths gang rape class 12 student in Bihar's Saran; one arrested

PATNA, Jan 17 (Agencies): A class 12th student was gang raped by four youths in Bihar's Saran district, prompting the police to arrest of one of the accused within 24 hours of the incident

Saran Superintendent of Police Kumar Ashish said that the victim reached the police station on Thursday and lodged a complaint with Bhagwan Bazar police station, accusing four individuals of outraging her modesty.

The victim told the police that she came in contact with one of the accused through social media. On January 16, her social media friend called her on her phone when she was returning from her school by a bus from Baniapur. On her boyfriend's request she alighted from the bus and met him. Later they reached near a college where his three friends were waiting.

Taking advantage of the situation, the four accused took turns to rape her. Being in a deserted place, her cries for help went unheard.

Later the victim reached Bhagwan Bazar police station and lodged a formal complaint against the accused. SP Kumar Ashish said that the girl was sent to Chapra Sadar Hospital for a medical examination. A forensic team also visited the place of occurrence and collected evidence to corroborate the victim's statement.

The SP said that a special team has been set up to conduct raids on suspected hideouts of the three remaining accused, who were absconding after the incident. "They will be brought to book at the earliest," he told the media.

The rape surviver got frightened after the incident as the accused threatened her with dire consequences if she reported the incident to the police.

"I somehow mustered courage and narrated the ordeal to the investigating officer," she added.

Judgement in rape-murder of R G Kar doctor tomorrow Nine killed as minivan

KOLKATA, Jan 17 (Agencies): The much-awaited judgement in the brutal rape and murder of an on-duty doctor at R G Kar Medical College and Hospital, which led to nationwide outrage and prolonged protests, will be delivered on Saturday.

Sanjay Roy, who was a civic volunteer with the city police, was charged with committing the crime on the postgraduate trainee at the state-run hospital in north Kolkata on August 9 last year.

The judgement will be delivered on Saturday, 57 days after the trial commenced before the court of additional district and sessions judge, Sealdah court, Anirban Das.

The Kolkata Police which was

investigating the case initially arrested Roy on August 10, a day after the medic's body was recovered from the seminar room of the hospital.

Later, the Calcutta High Court transferred the case to the Central Bureau of Investigation. The agency has sought the death penalty for the accused.

The in-camera trial in the rape and murder of the doctor commenced on November 12 and 50 witnesses were examined.

Hearing in the trial of Roy was concluded on January 9. Maintaining that other persons

were also involved in the crime, the parents of the victim have said that they expect that they will also be arrested and tried before the court.

The parents have also filed

an application before the court seeking further investigation into

The crime led to nationwide outrage and prolonged protests by junior doctors in Kolkata, demanding justice for the victim and stronger security arrangements in state-run hospitals.

Opposition political parties, including the BJP and the CPI(M), protested the gruesome crime, but apolitical movements demanding justice for the victim were more visible with members of the civil society being at the

Members of the civil society in Kolkata and some other cities of the state took out midnight rallies terming those as 'Reclaim the night' to demand justice for the victim doctor, whom some named "Abhaya", while others called her "Tilottama".

Disclosing the identity of a rape victim is prohibited by the

Supporters of archrival clubs of Kolkata - East Bengal, Mohun Bagan and Mohammedan Sporting - also took to the streets of the metropolis demanding justice for the victim.

The Supreme Court, which suo motu took up the matter concerning the rape and murder at R G Kar hospital, had formed a National Task Force (NTF) for suggesting a protocol for the safety of doctors and other medical professionals across the country.

The NTF filed a report before the apex court in November last

All nine occupants of the minivan were killed, he said, adding that further details were awaited.

NEET aspirant from Odisha dies by suicide in Kota, third case in 2025

KOTA, Jan 17 (Agencies): An 18-year-old NEET aspirant from allegedly hanged himself in his hostel room here, police said on Friday.

Officials said that no suicide note was recovered from the room. The incident occurred in Ambedkar Colony, Vigyan Nagar area on Thursday night.

According to police, Abhijeet Giri, hailing from Mayurbhanj district in Odisha, had been preparing for the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) at a coaching institute since April, 2024.



when a mess worker went to deliver food to Abhijeet's room, a police officer said.

Upon receiving no response, the mess worker along with a few hostellers forcibly opened the door and found him hanging from the ceiling fan, Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) Lal Singh Tanwar said.

A police team reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem, which will be conducted after his family arrives. They have been informed about the inci-

dent, the ASI added. He said that no suicide note was recovered from the room and the reason

behind the suicide is yet to be ascertained.

The ceiling fan in the hostel room was not equipped with suicide prevention device, mandated by the district administration to prevent suicides in student accommodations, the officer said.

Preliminary investigations suggest that Abhijeet was good in studies and attended his coaching classes regularly, he

This is the third suicide by a coaching student in Kota this year. The city, a prominent hub for coaching institutes, saw 17 such cases in 2024.

Netanyahu says deal to release hostages held in Gaza reached

PM's office had accused Hamas of reneging on parts of the agreement to gain further concessions

TEL AVIV, Jan 17 (Agencies): Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said on Friday a deal to return hostages held in the Gaza Strip has been reached, after his office had said earlier there were last minute snags in finalising a ceasefire that would pause 15 months of war.

Netanyahu said he would convene his security Cabinet later on Friday and then the government will approve the long-awaited hostage deal.

Netanyahu's pre-dawn statement appeared to clear the way for Israeli approval of the deal, which would pause the fighting in the Gaza Strip and see dozens of hostages held by militants in Gaza released in exchange for Palestinian prisoners held by Israel.

The deal would also allow hundreds of thousands of displaced Palestinians to return to the remains of their homes in Gaza. Meanwhile, Israeli airstrikes killed at least 72 people in the war-ravaged territory on Thurs-

Netanyahu said he had instructed a special task force to prepare to receive the hostages returning from Gaza, and that their families had been informed the deal had been reached.

Israel had delayed a vote on Thursday on the ceasefire, blaming a last-minute dispute with Hamas for holding up approval as rising tensions in Netanyahu's government coalition raised concerns about the implementation of the deal just a day after US President Joe Biden and key mediator Qatar announced it was complete.

Netanyahu's office had accused Hamas of reneging on parts of the agreement in an attempt to gain further concessions. In a briefing on Thursday, David Mencer, an Israeli government spokesman, said Hamas' new demands dealt with the deployment of Israeli forces in the Philadelphi corridor, the narrow strip bordering Egypt that Israeli troops seized in May.

Hamas denied the claims, with Izzat al-Rishq, a senior Hamas official, saying the militant group "is committed to the ceasefire agreement, which was announced by the mediators."

The ceasefire agreement has drawn fierce resistance from Netanyahu's far-right coalition partners, which the Israeli prime minister depends on to remain in power. On Thursday, Israel's hard-line national security minister Itamar Ben-Gvir threatened to quit the government if Israel approved the ceasefire. There was no immediate comment



from Ben-Gvir following Netanyahu's statement the hostage deal had been reached.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty called on Israel and Hamas to implement a Gaza ceasefire plan "without any delay" in an exclusive interview on Thursday. Egypt has been a key mediator between the enemies for years and a leading player in ongoing ceasefire negotiations.

The deal announced on Wednesday would pause the fighting with a view to eventually wind down a 15-month war that has destabilised the Middle East and sparked worldwide protests.

Hamas triggered the war with its October 7, 2023, cross-border attack into Israel that killed some 1,200 people and took 250 others hostage.

Israel responded with a devastating offensive that has killed over 46,000 Palestinians, according to local health officials, who do not distinguish between civilians and militants but say women and children make up more than half of those killed.

The military campaign has levelled vast swaths of Gaza, and pushed about 90 per cent of Gaza's population of 2.3 million from their homes. Hundreds of thousands are struggling with hunger and disease in squalid tent camps on the coast.

Netanyahu faces heavy internal pressure

The Israeli prime minister has faced great domestic pressure to bring home the hostages, whose families have pleaded with Netanyahu to prioritise the release of their loved ones over politics.

But Israeli divisions over the deal were on stark display on Thursday, as Ben-Gvir, a key coalition partner, threatened to resign, saying the ceasefire was "reckless" and would "destroy all of Israel's achievements."

The departure of Ben-Gvir's Jewish Power party would reduce the number of the ruling coalition's seats in the Israeli parliament, or Knesset, from 68 to 62 — leaving Netanyahu's government with just the slimmest of majorities. Ben-Gvir said his party would return to

the coalition if Israel resumes

Ben-Gvir's resignation would not bring down the government or derail the ceasefire deal. But the move would destabilise the government at a delicate moment and could lead to its collapse if Ben-Gvir is joined by other key Netanyahu allies.

Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, for instance, is vehemently opposed to the agreement and has demanded that Netanyahu promise to resume the war against Hamas after the first phase of the ceasefire as a condition of his party staying in the coalition.

A night of heavy Israeli strikes Palestinians in Gaza reported heavy Israeli bombardment on Thursday as people were celebrating the ceasefire deal. In previous conflicts, both sides have stepped up military operations in the final hours before ceasefires as a way to project strength.

"We were expecting that the (Israeli) occupation would intensify the bombing, like they did every time there were reports of progress in truce talks," said Mohammed Mahdi, who is sheltering in Gaza City.

Gaza's Health Ministry said Israeli strikes killed at least 72 people since the ceasefire deal was announced. It said the toll from Thursday's strikes only includes bodies brought to two hospitals in Gaza City and the actual toll is likely higher.

"Yesterday was a bloody day, and today is bloodier," said Zaher al-Wahedi, a Health Ministry official.

The Israeli military said it had struck approximately 50 militant targets across the Gaza Strip over the past day, including weapons storage facilities and rocket launch sites.

Anxiety spread across Gaza on Thursday with the news of last-minute quarrelling between Hamas and Israeli officials.

"We ask our brothers in Hamas to communicate with mediators to end the war," said Omar Jendiya, in Deir al-Balah. "Enough with the destruction and killing."

A phased withdrawal and hostage release with potential pitfalls

Under the deal reached on Wednesday, 33 of some 100 hostages who remain in Gaza are set to be released over the next six weeks in exchange for hundreds of Palestinians imprisoned by Israel. Israeli forces will pull back from many areas, hundreds of thousands of Palestinians would be able to return to what's left of their homes. and there would be a surge of humanitarian assistance.

The remainder of the hostages, including male soldiers, are to be released in a second - and much more difficult phase that will be negotiated during the first. Hamas has said it will not release the remaining captives without a lasting ceasefire and a full Israeli withdrawal, while Israel has vowed to keep fighting until it dismantles the group and to maintain openended security control over the

Ceasefire leaves questions about Gaza's future unanswered

US President-elect Donald Trump's Mideast envoy joined the talks in the final weeks, and both the outgoing administration and Trump's team took credit for the breakthrough.

Longer-term questions about postwar Gaza remain, including who will rule the territory or oversee the daunting task of reconstruction.

Israel has come under heavy international criticism, including from its closest ally, the United States, over the civilian toll in Gaza. It also blames Hamas for the civilian casualties, accusing it of using schools, hospitals and residential areas for military purposes

Hamas has come under overwhelming pressure from Israel's invasion of Gaza's largest cities and towns and seizure of the border between Gaza and Egypt. Its top leaders, including Yahva Sinwar, who was believed to have helped mastermind the 2023 attack, have been killed.

But its fighters have regrouped in some of the hardest-hit areas after the withdrawal of Israeli forces, raising the prospect of a prolonged insurgency if the war continues.

Pakistan court convicts Imran Khan and his wife in 190 million pound Al-Qadir Trust case

ISLAMABAD, Jan 17 (Agencies): The court on Friday convicted former Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan and his wife. Bushra Bibi, in the 190 milllion pound Al-Qadir Trust case with the PTI founder being sentenced to 14 years in prison while seven year jail term has been handed over to his wife, Dawn reported.

The verdict, delayed three times previously, was announced by Judge Nasir Javed Rana in a makeshift courtroom at Adiala Jail. The court asked Imran Khan and his wife to pay a fine of amounting to Pakistani Rupees (PKR) 1million and PKR 500,000, respectively. Failure to pay the fines would cause six months in

The judge announced the verdict amid tight security outside Adiala Jail. Following the announcement of the verdict, Bushra Bibi was arrested from the courtroom. The couple was indicted in the case on February 27 last year, shortly after the elections were held on February 8.

Before the hearing, PTI chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan, while speaking to reporters outside Adiala Jail, had said, "You can guess the injustice that have occurred over the last two years." He said, "If a fair decision is made, Imran and Bushra will be acquitted.

The case alleges that Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi obtained billions of rupees and land worth hundreds of kanals from Bahria Town Ltd for legalising PKR 50 billion that was identified

and returned to Pakistan by the UK during the PTI government, Dawn reported.

On December 23, when the verdict was supposed to be announced, an Islamabad accountability court postponed the verdict in the case till January 6 due to winter vacations.

On January 6, the verdict was not announced as Judge Nasir Javed Rana, who has been hearing the case, was on leave. During the hearing on January 13, the judge said that Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi's absence in the accountability court at the Adiala Jail was the reason for the delay in announcing the verdict.

In 2023, PTI founder was arrested in various legal claims, which he has termed "politically motivated." In 2024, he was acquitted in the cypher and Iddat cases. However, he was charged in the Toshakhana 2 case.

In December 2023, the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) had registered a corruption case against Imran Khan and seven others, including his wife, in relation to the Al-Qadir University Trust, Dawn reported.

The case filed by NAB alleged that Imran Khan, who is currently in prison, played a "pivotal role in the illicit transfer of funds meant for the state of Pakistan into an account designated for the payment of land by Bahria Town, Karachi." It claimed that despite given multiple opportunities to share information, the accused intentionally did not provide information on one pretext or another.

The suspects in the

case include property tycoon Malik Riaz Hussain and his son Ahmed Ali Riaz, Mirza Shehzad Akbar, and Zulfi Bukhari. However, instead of joining the investigation, they absconded and were subsequently declared proclaimed offenders (PO), Dawn reported.

Bushra Bibi's close friend Farhat Shahzadi and Ziaul Mustafa Nasim, a legal expert for the PTI government's Assets Recovery Unit, were also declared POs. Subsequently, the properties of all six accused had been frozen.

According to the case, Riaz's son transferred 240 kanals of land to Shahzadi, while Bukhari obtained land under a trust, which NAB stated did not exist at the time of the transfer. According to the prosecution, the trust was formed only after the adjustment of 190 million pound, raising doubts regarding its purpose and legitimacy.

In July 2024, Pervez Khattak, a PTI leader back then who left the party in 2023 after the May 9 riots, said in court, that he also attended the meeting in December 2019, where then-accountability adviser Mirza Shahzad Akbar presented a confidential deed in a sealed envelope for cabinet approval.

Khattak said that when he asked details regarding the document. Akbar said that it was an agreement between the Pakistani government and UK's National Crime Agency for the refund of crime proceeds, as per the report.

Davs later, Imran Khan's then-principal testified that Akbar brought a note to ask for Imran Khan's approval to present the confidential deed in the cabinet meeting. Pakistan's then-minister of defence production, Zubaida Jalal, in the court, said that ministers were "kept in the dark" on the transfer of "crime proceeds" to Malik Riaz.

Death toll rises to 5 in rocket and gun attack on an aid convoy in restive northwestern Pakistan

PARACHINAR, Jan 17 (Agencies): The death toll from a rocket and gun attack on an aid convoy in restive northwestern Pakistan has jumped to at least five, local authorities said Friday.

The attack happened Thursday when trucks carrying food, medicine and other relief supplies for hundreds of thousands of besieged residents were heading to Kurram, a district hit by sectarian violence in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Authorities initially said a security officer was killed in the attack. but Shaukat Ali, a district administrator in Kurram, said on Friday that another officer had died at a hospital and the bodies of three missing truck drivers had been found.



He said five drivers were still missing and their trucks had been burned by the attackers.

No one has claimed responsibility for the attack in Kurram, which has been the scene of violence between Shiite and Sunni tribes since July 2024.

The violence surged in November when attackers opened fire on vehicles carrying passengers, killing 52 people, mostly Shiites. Since then, at least 130 people have died in violence there.

Thursday's attack came weeks after the government secured a ceasefire deal between tribal leaders.

Shiite Muslims dominate parts of Kurram, although they are a minority in the rest of Pakistan, which is majority Sunni. The area has a history of sectarian conflict, with militant Sunni groups previously targeting minority Shiites.

lawyers who once represented the late Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny were jailed Friday in Russia as part of the Kremlin's crackdown on dissent that has reached levels unseen since Soviet times. Vadim Kobzev, Igor

Sergunin and Alexei Liptser were jailed from 3 1/2 to five years by a court in the town of Petushki, about 100 kilometers (60 miles) east of Moscow. They were arrested in October 2023 on charges of involvement with extremist groups, as Navalny's networks were deemed by author-

The case was widely seen as a way to increase pressure on the opposition to discourage defense law-



yers from taking political cases

At the time, Navalny was serving a 19-year prison term on several criminal convictions, including extremism. He died in a Russian prison camp in February 2023.

The independent Russian newspaper Novaya Gazeta reported that Kobzev said in his final statement in court on Jan. 10 that "we are being tried for transmitting Navalny's thoughts

to other people." Navalny's networks

were deemed extremist following a 2021 ruling that outlawed his organizations — the Foundation for Fighting Corruption and a network of regional offices — as extremist groups.

That ruling, which exposed anyone involved with the organizations to prosecution, was condemned by Kremlin critics as politically motivated and designed to stifle Navalny's activities.

According to Navalny's allies, authorities using their position to pass information from him to his team.

accused the lawvers of

Navalny, an anti-corruption campaigner and outspoken opponent of President Vladimir Putin, was arrested in 2021 upon his return from Germany, where he was recuperating from a nerve agent poisoning he blamed on the Kremlin. He was ordered to serve 2 1/2

years in prison. After two more trials, his sentence was extended to 19 years. He and his allies said the charges were politically motivated and accused the Kremlin of seeking to jail him for

In December 2023, Navalny was moved from a penal colony in the Vladimir region east of Moscow to one above the Arctic Circle, where he died in February at the age of 47 under still-unexplained circumstances. His widow, Yulia Navalnaya, and members of his team alleged he was killed on orders from the Kremlin. Officials have rejected the accusation.

CABI officials meet Director Agriculture Jammu to strengthen plant health initiatives

JAMMU, Jan 17: A team of senior officials from the Centre for Agriculture and Bioscience International (CABI) Dr. Pia Ellison, Program Support Manager, PLANTWISEPLUS, CABI Switzerland; Dr. Vinod Pandit, Regional Director South Asia, CABI; and Dr. Manju Thakur, Crop Health Advisor, CABI visited the Directorate of Agriculture Jammu today for a meeting with Director Agriculture Jammu, S. Arvinder Singh Reen. The discussion focused on strengthening the Plant Health Clinics in the Jammu Division, enhancing surveillance for new pest invasions, and improving pest management practices in the region.

During the meeting, Director Arvinder Singh Reen emphasized the importance of educating pesticide dealers and farmers to ensure effective pest manage-



ment. He suggested the design of a comprehensive awareness campaign targeting pesticide dealers, Agriculture Extension officers and farmers, which would include crucial information on plant health and pest management. The Director also stressed the need for strong ties between Plant Health Clinics and pesticide dealers, allowing them to seek assistance from plant doctors for proper diagnoses. He acknowledged CABI's significant role in reducing the irrational use of pesticides, helping farmers to adopt recommended dosages at appropriate times. Director Agriculture

also highlighted the critical role of Plant Health Clinics in mitigating crop pest and disease problems. He called for regular updates from CABI on pest management strategies, which would include proper sampling techniques, data collection, online validation, weather-based agroadvisory services, and analysis of data to guide plant doctors and stakeholders. Additionally, he underscored the importance of promoting biocontrol methods as part of an effort to maintain ecological balance.

The meeting further discussed the ongoing efforts by the Agriculture Department in implementing Integrated Pest Management (IPM) strategies. Director A.S Reen emphasized the need for training more Plant Doctors, facilitating real-time data sharing, and providing further training to enhance their expertise.

Dr. Pia Ellison, Program Support Manager, PLANTWISEPLUS, CABI Switzerland elaborated on CABI's role in promoting sustainable plant health practices. She discussed the potential for reducing pesticide use to cultivate organic products that meet international export standards. Dr. Ellison also emphasized the importance of transitioning to climate-smart plant health practices, which would not only ensure the supply of safer food but also contribute to local production of plant protection products

As part of her visit, Dr. Pia Ellison also visited the Plant Health Clinic at Krishi Bhawan Talab Tillo, gaining valuable insights into its operations. Following that, she visited the Plant Health Clinics in Vijaypur, District Samba, to further assess the functioning and impact of these clinics in the Jammu Division.

The leaders appealed to the displaced community to unite in their efforts to return to the valley, reconnecting with their lost culture, ancestral properties, birthplace, and even

cremation grounds. They also urged the majority community in the valley to join them in pressing the Central and UT Governments for the repatriation of displaced Kashmiri Hindus, emphasizing the restoration of the centuries-old harmonious culture of the region, often referred to as Reshiwari.

The statement further urged the elected UT Government, led by the Chief Minister, to prioritize the return and rehabilitation of displaced Kashmiri Hindus. The leaders expressed hope that the restoration of statehood to J&K would enable the community to regain their lost rights and foster a renewed sense of belonging in their homeland.

They called for a 60% quota for officials from the J&K cadre, arguing that such individuals have a deeper understanding of the region's geography and demographics compared to officials from other

The leaders proposed conducting elections for reserved seats for displaced community members rather than nominating representatives from specific sections.

They suggested reserving two seats in each district of the valley for displaced Kashmiri Hindus in panchayat, local bodies, and municipal elections. Additionally, they advocated for one reserved seat for each displaced camp in Jammu, with provisions for establishing a panchayat or town area committee for each

The leaders highlighted the poor living conditions in camps and stressed the need for regular monthly meetings with camp residents to address their grievances.

They also proposed for allocating leased land within camps for overaged, educated, and unemployed youth to establish businesses and entrepreneurial ventures, supported by subsidized loans; and announcing a special recruitment policy for 20,000 posts, including the creation of five police battalions with relaxed eligibility norms.

Furthermore, they demanded the integration of Prime Minister's Package employees with UT Government employees, abolishing their supernumerary status. They noted that 23,700 posts left vacant by fleeing employees during the exodus were filled by valley residents, depriving displaced vouth of employment opportunities.

The leaders appealed to all displaced political parties, social activists, and organizations to unite and fight for a one-time comprehensive resettlement and rehabilitation package. They urged collective efforts to restore the rights and dignity of the displaced community, ensuring their rightful place in the valley.

BCCI issues new policy guidelines for Team India to limit Travel, baggage, family visits

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has issued strict guidelines for the Senior Men's Cricket Team, aiming to enhance discipline, streamline logistics, and promote team unity during domestic and international tours.

NEW DELHI, Jan 17 (Agencies): The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has issued strict guidelines for the Senior Men's Cricket Team, aiming to enhance discipline. streamline logistics, and promote team unity during domestic and international tours.

The new guidelines include travel, baggage limits, family visits, and team dynamics.

Players are expected to travel with the team for all matches and practice sessions. Separate travel arrangements with families are discouraged to maintain discipline and team cohesion. Any exceptions must be pre-approved by the head coach and chairman of the selection committee.

"All players are expected to travel with the team to and from matches and practice sessions. Separate travel arrangements with families are discouraged to maintain discipline and team cohesion. Exceptions, if any, must be pre- approved by the Head Coach and Chairman of the Selection Committee," BCCI stated.

To streamline logistics and avoid challenges, the BCCI has set specific baggage limits for players and support staff. For away tours lasting more than 30 days, players are allowed 5 pieces of luggage (3 suitcases and 2 kit bags) or up to 150 kg, while support staff can bring 3 pieces (2 large suitcases and 1 small) or up to 80 kg. For away tours shorter than 30 days, players are permitted 4 pieces (2 suitcases and 2 kit bags) or up to 120 kg, and support staff are allowed 2 pieces (2 suitcases) or up to 60 kg. During home series, both players and support staff are limited to 4 pieces (2 suitcases and 2 kit bags) or up to 120 kg for players, and 2 pieces (2 suitcases) or up to 60 kg for support staff.

"Excess Baggage Limit Players are required to adhere to the



specified baggage limits shared with the team. Any excess baggage costs will need to be borne by the individual player. This policy helps streamline logistics and avoid unnecessary expenses.

Baggage policy:-

Away long-duration tours (more than 30 days):

Players - 5 pieces (3 suitcases + 2 kit bags) OR upto 150 kgs. Support staff - 2 pieces (2 big + 1 small suitcases) OR upto

Away short duration tours (less than 30 days):

Players - 4 pieces (2 suitcases + 2 kit bags) OR upto 120 kgs. Support staff - 2 pieces (2 suitcases) OR upto 60 kgs. Home series:

Players - 4 pieces (2 suitcases + 2 kit bags) OR upto 120 kgs. Support staff - 2 pieces (2 suitcases) OR upto 60 kgs.

Players must adhere to these limits, with any excess baggage costs being borne individually.

The presence of personal staff, such as managers, chefs, assistants, and security personnel, is restricted on tours and series. Any exceptions require explicit approval from the BCCI. This measure aims to ensure team focus and minimize logistical complications.

"Restriction on Individual Staff on Tour/Series Personal staff (e.g., personal managers, chefs, assistants and security) are to be restricted on tours or series unless explicitly approved by the BCCI. This ensures that the focus remains on team operations and minimizes logistical challenges. - this has to be done away with," BCCI said in a state-

Players must coordinate with team management regarding the transfer of equipment or personal items to the Centre of Excellence in Bengaluru. Any costs incurred due to separate arrangements will be the responsibility of the player.

"Sending bags separately to the Centre of Excellence Players must coordinate with team management regarding equipment and personal items being sent to the Centre of Excellence, Bengaluru. Any additional costs incurred due to separate arrangements will be the player's responsibility," BCCI stated.

The family travel policy is designed to balance players' personal well-being with team commitments. Players who are away from India for more than 45 days during overseas tours are eligible to have their partners and children (under 18) join them for one visit per series, with a maximum duration of two weeks. The BCCI will cover shared accommodation with the player during the visitors' period, while all other expens-

es must be borne by the player. Visits should be coordinated to occur at a single time, with dates agreed upon by the coach, captain, and GM Operations. Any exceptions to this policy must be pre-approved by the coach, captain, and GM Operations, and additional expenses beyond the visitors' period will not be covered by the BCCI.

"Family Travel Policy The family travel policy ensures a balance between players' personal well-being and team commitments:

* Eligibility: Players absent from India for more than 45 days during overseas tours can be joined by their partners and children (under 18) for one visit per series (format-wise) of up to a two-week period.

* Provisions: The BCCI will cover shared accommodation with the player for the Visitors' Period. All other expenses are to be borne by the player.


* Coordination: Visits must be scheduled at a single time during dates agreed upon by the Coach, Captain, and GM Operations.

* Exceptions: Any deviation from this policy must be preapproved by the Coach, Captain and GM Operations. Additional expenses outside the visitors' period will not be covered by the BCCI.

Players are required to stay with the team until the scheduled end of a match series or tour, even if matches conclude earlier than planned. This ensures team unity, bonding, and consistent team dynamics.

"Players returning home if matches end early then players are required to stay with the team until the scheduled end of the match series or tour, regardless of whether matches conclude earlier than planned. This ensures unity, fosters team bonding, and avoids disruption to team dynamics," as stated in the policy by BCCI.

Yuvraj Singh backs Rohit Sharma despite two consecutive Test series loses against New Zealand, Australia

NEW DELHI, Jan 17 (Agencies): Former allrounder Yuvraj Singh backed India skipper Rohit Sharma's leadership skills despite two consecutive series losses against New Zealand and Australia in Tests at home and away respectively.

As a captain, Rohit has seen some embarrassing lows as of late. Just before the Test series against Australia, India lost their first home Test series in 12 years, to New Zealand by 0-3. This was also their first-ever whitewash in a home Test series of three matches or more.

"Gautam Gambhir needs to be given more time as he has just come into the system. Rohit won us the T20 World Cup and he was the captain when India reached the World Cup (ODI) final. Mumbai Indians won 5 IPLs under Rohit's captaincy. He stepped down in the last Test (of BGT) to give someone else the chance, how many captains have done that in the past? I look at what he has done in the last 3-5 years, one tournament can't decide. For me, the series defeat at home was more disappointing as India



Zealand was tougher," Yuvraj Singh said during an event. Rohit's captaincy has

been a mix of memorable highs and some extremely disappointing lows. Be it a 10-match winning streak during the 2023 ICC Cricket World Cup at home, which concluded with a loss to Australia in the final or India's redemption with an ICC T20 World Cup title win in 2024 at Barbados, Rohit's captaincy has given fans plenty of positives. Under him, the team also made it to the final of the ICC World Test Championship 2023, where they lost to Australia

However, since the second half of 2024, luck seems to have both as a batter and captain. In the 2024/25 Test season which started with the home series against Bangladesh, Rohit scored just 164 runs in eight matches and 15 innings at an average of 10.93 with the best score of 52. During the recently-concluded Border-Gavaskar Trophy, he could make just 31 runs in three Tests with best score of 10. His form struggles were such that he opted out of the final Test at Sydney.

In the 2024 calendar year, Rohit lost six Tests, including four matches at home. This led to a decline in Rohit's Test record as captain, winning 12 and losing nine, while three ended in a

draw.

HOBART, Jan 17 (Agencies): Australia moved within touching distance of retaining the Ashes after Ashleigh Gardner's maiden inter-

national century and Alana King's 5-wicket haul powered them to a dominant 86-run victory over England in Hobart. The win gives Australia a commanding 6-0 lead in the series, needing just two more points to secure retention. Gardner's exceptional

knock, a run-a-ball century, rescued Australia from a precarious spot as they were reduced to 59 for 4 after opting to bat first. Supported by Beth Mooney and Tahlia McGrath, Gardner turned the innings around. McGrath, under scrutiny for her recent form, delivered a timely 38-ball fifty, while Georgia Wareham, returning to the side, propelled Australia past 300 with a blistering late cameo.

England's chase began on shaky ground when Megan Schutt struck in the first over, dismissing Maia Bouchier. A sharper blow followed as captain Heather Knight edged behind



to Alyssa Healy. Tammy Beaumont and Nat Sciver-Brunt mounted a recovery with an 89-run stand, but the mounting required run-rate kept England under constant pressure. Beaumont brought up a gritty halfcentury before being bowled off her pads in Wareham's impactful first over, marking her ODI return since March.

Sciver-Brunt, as so often the backbone of England's batting, reached a 53-ball fifty but was undone by a skidding delivery from Wareham that crashed

into her stumps. England's hopes briefly flickered when Danni Wyatt-Hodge and Amy Jones struck four consecutive boundaries, but their momentum was snuffed out by a moment of brilliance. Wyatt-Hodge attempted an ambitious shot over the off-side, only for Phoebe Litchfield to sprint back from cover and execute a stunning diving catch over her shoulder.

From there, England collapsed, losing six wickets for just 22 runs. Alana King starred with the ball, claiming

a career-best 5 for 46, taking her tally to nine wickets in the last two matches. To cap a sensational day, Gardner also produced a remarkable boundary catch at deep midwicket, tossing the ball back over the rope before diving forward to complete the grab.

Gardner's century, only the second ODI ton ever scored from No. 6 or lower, was a masterclass in pacing an innings. Coming to the crease with Australia in trouble, she brought up her century in 100 balls, accelerating through the 90s with consecutive boundaries off Sciver-Brunt. Her partnership with McGrath, who joined her with Australia teetering at 154 for 5, was crucial. Together, they added valuable runs in what were the best batting conditions of the series. In the final 10 overs, Australia hammered 104 runs, showcasing their extraordi-

nary batting depth. The frenetic start to the match saw England burn both DRS reviews within four overs, though they successfully overturned

a call to dismiss Litchfield, who edged behind after a bright start. Ellyse Perry's dismissal soon after, caught flicking to short fine leg, and a lean series for Annabel Sutherland, who fell cheaply again, left Australia in trouble.

However, Gardner's counter-attack, including a towering six off Sophie Ecclestone, steadied the innings before McGrath and Wareham added the finishing touches. Ecclestone, England's key spinner, endured a torrid outing, conceding 17 runs in the final over to record the secondmost expensive figures of her ODI careerthree of her worst outings now coming against Australia.

For England, the task of chasing over 300 required a performance akin to Gardner's brilliance, but no batter could replicate her controlled aggression. With this win, Australia inches closer to retaining the Ashes, leaving England needing victories in all three T20Is and the Test match to regain the trophy for the first time since 2014.

Book on Dogri Sahitya Academy Awardees hit market


