





The 19th of January 2025 marks 35 years since the Kashmiri Pandit community was forced into exile from the Kashmir Valley. This somber milestone reminds us of the challenges we continue to face as a displaced community.

To mark this occasion, Shri Vishwakarma Skill University (SVSU) and Whetstone International Consulting (WIN) have conducted an extensive research study and prepared a comprehensive Cultural Survey Report titled "Post-Exile Culture Survey: Challenges, Aspirations, and Preservation of Kashmiri

government-facilitated group settlements. Furthermore, 66.6%

of respondents still own properties in Kashmir, though 74.7% report these properties are unused or dysfunctional, debunking the myth of voluntary disengagement from ancestral land. Over 12% have even purchased new properties post-exile, underscoring enduring emotional and cultural ties

The report also highlights the prolonged instability faced by the community, with 61.3% having relocated up to three times and 48.6% still living in migrant camps. Economic and political marginalization remain significant

challenges, with 58.9% reporting political discrimination and 63% expressing dissatisfaction with rehabilitation efforts. These findings affirm the community's unwavering aspiration for a secure and dignified return to their homeland.

In light of the importance of this first-ever cultural survey, we respectfully request an audience with the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor on the morning or evening of 17th January 2025, coinciding with the 35th Holocaust Day, to formally present the report. Presenting the findings on this significant date underscores the urgency of implementing the recommendations to pave the way for meaningful societal change.

"We are confident that under the Lieutenant Governor's leadership, inclusive governance can address these long-standing issues and support the rehabilitation of the Kashmiri Pandit community. We look forward to your kind confirmation of the appointment," said Kiran Wattal.

Delhi kay Dangal Ka Shanknaad Aur Issmein Kiska Mangal

he election schedule that in specific means that the dates of whole election process of Delhi assembly elections has on 7th January Tuesday announced by the Election Commission of India .Thus it obviously means that the Shanknaad of Delhi Poll Dangal has now finally begun and the three cornered poll contest will be intense and very interesting to watch .The eyes of all political parties ,political leaders, political pundits and last but not the least of the people of Delhi and the country are set on these polls and all of them are watching the poll developments and how the political parties namely AAP, BJP and Congress have jumped in the poll fray and how their leaders will conduct themselves during the electioneering and at the end of the day which political party will be in a position to wear the crown of Delhi .Recently prime minister Narendra Modi has made his entry in Delhi election Dangal even before the announcement of the poll dates and schedule .PM's entry in the Delhi polls has led to a new dimension and meaning to the high profile poll process .Before his entry into the Delhi elections ,Kejriwal the convener of AAP thought that the Delhi polls will be an easy, smooth and almost a one sided affair .But now there is intense poll dangal as there is big fight between the BJP and APP and only time will tell which party will steal the show and be victorious in the elections.AAP Convener Arvind Kejriwal, the master of narrative building is now facing a narrative set by PM Modi and the BJP, Kajriwal and AAP have been cornered by the BJP over allegations of mismanagement in the extravagant renovation of the former Delhi CM's bungalow.AAP Convener Arvind Kejriwal has long been a maestro of shaping narratives ,often leaving his opponents scrambling to keep up .But before the Delhi assembly election ,that seemed to change as PM Modi branded the AAP as "aapda"disaster and called the AAP's 10 year tenure "aapda Kaal" [a period of disaster." Highlighting the "extravagant renovation of Kejriwal's former bungalow," dubbed the "Sheeshmahal" and contrasting it with the construction of 1,600 Sabhhiman Apartments for poor ,PM Modi and BJP have flipped the script .By making this the centerpiece of its attacks ,the BJP has formally entered into the Delhi Dengal even before the announcement of the election schedule .The BJP's pitch of infrastructure push in Delhi has also seen the AAP responding that these projects were joint efforts between the central government and Delhi governments ,and were made possible through collaboration .Moreover PM Modi has assured Delhities that the BJP would continue the existing welfare schemes against "AAP's lies ,"which have been the hallmark of the AAP government .Kejriwal ,on the other hand ,accused PM Modi and BJP of abusing the AAP and the Delhities .The BJP driven narratives have ensured that AAP , usually the one setting the agenda , is now responding , instead of shaping its own narrative ahead of the crucial Delhi election ,where it faces a decade -long anti-incumbency challenge. With the BJP's entry ,the ensuing election is set to be a tightly contested battle.PM Modi has attacked Kejriwal on Sheeshmahal ,BJP alleges Rs 80 crore splurge on the Bunglow of the former Chief minister Kajriwal .It amounted to the misuse of the taxpayers and public money and Kejriwal should answer for this lapse of AAP government .In Delhi polls ,Congress is isolated and has fallen singly .The INDIA alliance also is on the path of division and it is scattering .The Election Commission convened a press conference and announced the schedule of Delhi polls .The assembly elections in Delhi will take place in a single phase on February 5 and the votes will be counted on February 8, the ECI announced .The term of the 70-member Assembly ends on February 23, and elections have to be held before that to constitute a new house .The national capital has traditionally seen assembly elections in a single phase .The electioneering in the national capital –Delhi has got momentum after the announcement of election schedule and it has now become obvious that the Delhi assembly polls are becoming more intense and cutthroat .The Arvind Kejriwal -led Aam Adami Party -AAP is pushing hard for a third consecutive

term ,while the BJP has gone all out to turn the tables. Also in the fight is the Congress, which is going alone and targeting both the BJP and AAP ,which was its ally during the 2024 Lok Sabha polls .But the Congress is of insignificance because it has no mass base and appeal in the Delhi elections .So the electoral battle in fact is between the AAP and BJP.CEC Rajive Kumar said that 2024 was the year of elections globally when two-third of the world's population in democracies voted in different polls .It is in the fitness of things to mention that over 1.55 crore Delhi voters will vote in the Assembly election on February 8.A total of 13,033 polling stations will host the election for choosing members of the eighth Delhi Assembly .The AAP alleged that the BJP -led centre has snatched away the official residence of Delhi chief minister Atishi by cancelling the allotment .The Delhi BJP expressed confidence that the national capital will get a 'double --engine 'government on February 8, when the results of the Assembly elections will be announced .Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva said February 5 will be an important day as more than 1.55 crore voters will decide the future of Delhi."On February 5,1 crore 55 lakh and 24 thousand 858 voters will cast their votes to build a new Delhi', a better Delhi, and a beautiful Delhi, "he said. Sachdeva exuded confidence that the result on February 8 would pave way for a "double engine government" of the BJP in Delhi under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. It seems that AAP is making same rhetoric of poll freebies and it has no new programme and agenda as well as promises .This time AAP Convener Kejriwal has chosen to play a soft Hindutva card and thus has he promised to give salary to Hindu temple priests and Granthis of the Gurdwars in Delhi if AAP government comes to power .He has promised to provide a salary of 18,000 to them in case AAP wins the crucial Delhi assembly polls. CEC Rajive Kumar said that some states are unable to pay salaries due to the heavy cost of freebies promised during campaigning and admitted that the ECI's hands are tied on the issue of 'freebies' .Union Health Minister and BJP chief ,JP Nadda said ,I urge the

people of Delhi to chose a government that focuses on improving the standard of living ,combating corruption ,reducing pollution and providing quality services to make everyday life easier .Under the guidance of PM Narendra Modi, the BJP government has been continuously working towards the comprehensive development of Delhi and will further our efforts to turn the dream of a 'Viksit Delhi' a reality .The BJP is raising the anti-incumbency of the AAP government and is attracting the attention of the people of Delhi towards it AAP, BJP and Congress are filing nominations for contesting Delhi polls. Arvind Kejriwal filed his nomination papers from New Delhi constituency ,Parvash Verma of BJP filed his nominations papers from the New Delhi constituency against Kejriwal and former Chief minister Sheela Dikshit's son Sandeep Dikshit also filed his papers from this constituency. Besides this ,a number of politicians of all the three parties have filed the nomination papers.AAP is unearthing old and useless cupboards as it has raised the Batla terror encounter and BJP is using it to counter the anti-national narrative and it will boomerang on AAP . The electioneering and canvassing is on a high pitch as different politicians are busy in canvassing and influencing the voters .To conclude it can be said that this poll is not easy to win for the AAP given the tough fight between the AAP and BJP .Nothing can be said about the final outcome of the poll and only the time will reveal the true picture and so all have to wait and watch the counting of polls on 8 February 2025.So it is premature at present to forecast which party will adore the Delhi throne and so it is very uncertain to forecast precisely and correctly as to which party's Mangal will be scripted by the counting of votes on the day of counting. Thus Delhi Dangal Mein Kiska Hoga Mangal cannot be predicted accurately given the very tough fight in the crucial Delhi Polls as all the three main contenders of power that is the AAP,BJP &Congress are making great efforts to come victorious in the polls.

Challenge of nutrition against progress

In today's interconnected world, exposing young individuals to diverse cultures, ideas, and global issues can broaden their horizons and instill a sense of purpose.

he report said that various study reports related to poverty and nutrition in India are highlighting the fact that poverty is continuously decreasing, but lack of nutrients in people's food remains a challenge. State Bank of India Research on Poverty continues to reduce poverty due to government assistance programs that directly benefit the poor. Whereas in the Status of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (Sofi) Report 2023, it has been said that the nutrition situation in Indiais challenging. Between 2020 and 2022, 74 million people were victims of undernutrition. The analysis of this report shows that as per the definition of two meals a day, the problem of hunger has comparatively reduced in India. This means that the grain related needs of a large section of the population are largely being met. But nutritional deficiency persists. Similarly, in the Global Hunger Index 2023, India has been ranked 111th among 125 countries. SBI Research report states that poverty reduction is greater in rural areas than in urban areas.It has happened more rapidly. While in the year 2011-12, rural poverty was 25.7 percent and urban poverty was 13.7 percent, in the year 2023-24, rural poverty has come down to 4.86 percent and urban poverty has come down to 4.09 percent. According to this report, due to increase in income in the last 14 years, while monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE) has increased by 3.5 times in cities, it has increased by almost four times in rural areas. Between 2009-10 and 2023-24, consumer expenditure in urban areas will increase from Rs 1984 to Rs 6996 and in rural areas it will increase from Rs 1054.It increased to Rs 4122. In such a situation, this expenditure is more in

villages than in cities. It is noteworthy that on January 4, while addressing the Rural India Mahotsav 2025, the Prime Minister had said that rural poverty is decreasing rapidly in the country. Last year it has reduced to less than five percent in 2024. Besides, the income and purchasing power of the villagers has increased. Lakhs of houses in villages are getting clean drinking water. People are getting better health services from 1.5 lakh Ayushman Arogya temples. Improvement with the help of digital technologyNeither doctors nor hospitals are connecting with the villages. Through PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, financial assistance of Rs 3 lakh crore is being provided to the farmers of the country. Agricultural loans have increased three and a half times in the last ten years. Now Kisan Credit Cards are also being given to cattle farmers and fish farmers. In the last ten years, the amount of subsidy given on crops and crop insurance has been increased. Prime Minister Modi distributes 65 Lakh Svamitva property cards

NEW DELHI, Jan 18 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday distributed around 65 lakh Svamitva property cards, and said it will bolster economic activities and help in poverty alleviation.

He also interacted with some beneficiaries through video conferencing, and said the scheme will help people in getting loans and benefits of Government schemes.

These property cards are being distributed to beneficiaries across more than 50,000 villages in 10 states - Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and two Union Territories off Jammu & Kashmir, and Ladakh.

"Around 2.24 crore beneficiaries in villages will now have Svamitva property cards after 65 lakh cards are distributed today," the Prime Minister said.

"Property rights is a major challenge across the world.



Years ago, the United Nations had held a study, which revealed people did not have legal documents for property rights in several countries. The UN has said property rights are important for poverty alleviation," he said.

The prime minister said an eminent economist had opined that property in villages is a "dead capital" because people cannot do anything with it, and it can't help increase their income.

"India was also impacted

by this challenge. People in villages have property worth lakhs of crores, but they did not have papers for it. There were disputes, properties were snatched, and even banks did not provide loans over it," he said.

"Previous Governments should have taken steps to do something about it but nothing much was done," he said. Modi said Dalits, backward classes and tribals were the worst affected by this.

"After getting legal property

rights, lakhs of people have taken loan. They have used this money to start their businesses. Many of these are farmers, for whom this property cards is a guarantee to financial security," he said. He also said Svamitva and Bhu-Adhaar will become the foundation of development of villages.

Union Minister of Panchayati Raj Rajiv Ranjan Singh 'Lalan', Union Minister of State for Panchayati Raj S P Singh Baghel and Ministry of Panchayati Raj Secretary Vivek Bharadwaj were also present at the event.

It was attended virtually by several chief ministers, Union Ministers and State Ministers. Events are also being organised in over 230 districts for physical distribution of property cards. It is expected that around 13 Union ministers will physically join from designated locations from across the country, to oversee regional distribution ceremonies of property cards.

KOLKATA, Jan 18 (Agencies): A Kolkata court on Saturday declared Sanjay Roy "guilty" of raping and murdering an on-duty doctor at the staterun RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, a heinous crime that sparked nationwide outrage and prolonged protests.

The Sealdah court, where Roy's trial was held, will declare his sentence on Monday, Anirban Das, the additional district and sessions judge, said.

The judgement was pronounced nearly two months after the in-camera trial commenced in November last year and 162 days after the heinous crime was committed on August 9, 2024.

Roy was found guilty under Sections 64 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita that governs rape, and Sections 66 and 103 (1) of the Act, which deals with punishments for death and murder.

Section 103 (1) of BNS entails a possible punishment of death or life imprisonment.

the gruesome rape and murder of the postgraduate trainee at the state-run hospital.

The Kolkata Police, which was investigating the case initially, arrested Roy on August 10, a day after the medic's body was recovered from the seminar room of the hospital.

The Calcutta High Court later transferred the case to the CBI, which had sought death penalty for the accused.

The in-camera trial in the rape and murder of the doctor commenced on November 12, and 50 witnesses were examined.

Hearing of the trial concluded on January 9.

The crime led to nationwide outrage and prolonged protests by junior doctors in Kolkata, demanding justice for the victim and stronger security arrangements in staterun hospitals.

Opposition political parties, including the BJP and the CPI(M), protested the ghastly crime, but apolitical movements demanding justice were more visible, with members of the civil society being at the forefront. Members of the civil society in Kolkata and some other cities of the state took out midnight rallies, calling those 'Reclaim the Night' to demand justice for the doctor, who was christened 'Abhaya' by some and 'Tilottama'

77-Year-old woman thrashed, forced to drink urine on suspicion of black magic

AMRAVATI, Jan 18 (Agencies): A 77-yearold woman was allegedly thrashed, forced to drink urine and branded with an iron rod on suspicion of practising black magic in a village in Maharashtra's Amravati district, police said on Saturday.

While the incident occurred on December 30, a police complaint was lodged earlier this month, and the victim's son and daughter-in-law approached senior officials on Friday demanding action, an official said. The victim is a resident of Retyakheda village in Chikhaldara taluka, he said.

In a letter to the district collector and superintendent of police, the complainants alleged that the woman was alone at home on December 30 when her neighbours caught hold of her, alleging that she practised black magic, the official said

Villagers allegedly hit the victim with a wooden stick and slapped and thrashed her. She was



also branded with hot iron rods on her hands and legs, the complainants have alleged. As per the complaint,

the woman was forced to drink urine and consume dog excreta, following which she was paraded with a garland of slippers around her neck.

The victim's son and daughter-in-law, who were away for work, found out about the incident on January 5 and lodged a police complaint.

Talking to agency,

Amravati Superintendent of Police Vishal Anand said the incident was serious, and the complainants spoke to him on Friday.

Israel govt approves Gaza ceasefire and hostage accord, due to take effect Sunday

With the accord bitterly opposed by some Israeli cabinet hardliners, reports say 24 ministers in Netanyahu's coalition government voted in favour of the deal while 8 opposed it

JERUSALEM/CAIRO, Jan 18 (Agencies): Israel's cabinet approved a deal with Palestinian militant group Hamas for a ceasefire and release of hostages in the Gaza Strip, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said on Saturday, a day ahead of the agreement's scheduled start.

In the early hours of Saturday after meeting for more than six hours, the government ratified the agreement that could pave the way for an end to the 15-month-old war in the Palestinian enclave, which Hamas controls.

"The Government has approved the framework for the return of the hostages. The framework for the hostages' release will come into effect on Sunday," Netanyahu's office said in a brief statement. In Gaza itself, Israeli warplanes have kept up heavy attacks since the ceasefire deal was agreed. Medics in Gaza said an Israeli airstrike early on Saturday killed five people in a tent in the Mawasi area west of Khan Younis in the enclave's south.

This brought to 119 the number of Palestinians killed by Israeli bombardment since the accord was announced on Wednesday. After the Israeli cabinet approval, lead US negotiator Brett McGurk said the plan was moving forward on track. The White House expects the ceasefire to start on Sunday morning, with three female hostages to be released to Israel on Sunday afternoon through the Red Cross



"We have locked down every single detail in this agreement. We are quite confident... it is ready to be implemented on Sunday," McGurk said on CNN from the White House.

Under the deal, the threestage ceasefire starts with an initial six-week phase when hostages held by Hamas will be exchanged for prisoners detained by Israel.

Thirty-three of the 98 remaining Israeli hostages, including women, children, and men over 50, were due to be freed in this phase. Israel will release all Palestinian women and children under 19 in Israeli jails by the end of the first phase.

The names of 95 Palestinian prisoners to be turned over on Sunday were announced by the Israeli Justice Ministry on Friday.

After Sunday's hostage release, McGurk said the accord called for four more female hostages to be released after seven days followed by the release of three further hostages every seven days thereafter. HARDLINERS OPPOSE

CEASEFIRE

With the accord bitterly opposed by some Israeli cabinet hardliners, media reports said 24 ministers in Netanyahu's coalition government voted in favour of the deal while eight opposed it.

The opponents said the ceasefire agreement represented a capitulation to Hamas. National Security Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir threatened to resign if it was approved and urged other ministers to vote against it. However, he said he would not bring down the government.

His fellow hardliner, Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, also threatened to quit the government if it does not go back to war to defeat Hamas after the first six-week phase of the ceasefire

After a last-minute delay on Thursday that Israel blamed on Hamas, the Israeli security cabinet voted on Friday in favour of the ceasefire accord, the first of two approvals required.

Israel began its assault on Gaza after Hamas attacks on Israel on October 7, 2023 during

which some 1,200 people were killed and 250 were taken hostage, according to Israeli tallies. The war between Israeli forces and Hamas has razed much of heavily urbanised Gaza, killed more than 46,000 people and displaced most of the enclave's pre-war population of 2.3 million several times over, according to local authorities

If successful, the ceasefire could also ease hostilities in the Middle East, where the Gaza war spread to include Iran and its proxies - Lebanon's Hezbollah, Yemen's Houthis and armed groups in Iraq as well as the occupied West Bank.

Gaza civilians have faced a humanitarian crisis due to hunger, cold and sickness. The ceasefire agreement calls for a surge in assistance, and international organisations have aid trucks lined up on Gaza's borders to bring in food, fuel, medicine and other vital supplies.

Palestinian relief agency UNRWA said on Friday that it has 4,000 truckloads of aid, half of which are food, ready to enter the coastal strip.

Palestinians waiting for food in the southern Gaza Strip on Friday said they hoped a truce will mean an end to hours of queuing to fill one plate.

"I hope it will happen so we'll be able to cook in our homes and make whatever food we want, without having to go to soup kitchens and exhaust ourselves for three or four hours trying to get (food) - sometimes not even making it home," displaced Palestinian Reeham Sheikh al-Eid said.

In a post on X. Chandra Arya stated, "Today, we submitted the \$50,000 compliance deposit to the Liberal Party for the leadership contest (the deadline is January 23). We have received more than 1,000 endorsements (well above the required 300) from across Canada. Additionally, we have secured over 200 endorsements from each of three different provinces (exceeding the requirement of 100 endorsements per province)." On January 13, Chandra Arya said that he is running for the position of Canada's PM and said that the nations faces structural challenges that need toguh solutions. He stressed that bold decisions need to be made to secure prosperity for children and grandchildren of Canada.

"I am running for the position of Prime Minister of Canada. Our



nation faces structural challenges that require tough solutions. We must make bold political decisions to secure prosperity for our children and grandchildren. Impeached South Korean president arrives for arrest warrant hearing

SEOUL, Jan 18 (Agencies): Impeached South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol arrived at court for the first time Saturday to attend a hearing that will decide whether to extend his detention as investigators probe his failed martial law bid.

Yoon, who has claimed his arrest is illegal, threw the nation into chaos on December 3 when he attempted to suspend civilian rule, citing the need to combat threats from "antistate elements".

Yoon's die-hard supporters gathered outside the court building Saturday, even trying to surround the blue van carrying the suspended leader, agency reporters saw.

Yoon's martial law bid lasted just six hours, with lawmakers voting it down despite the president ordering soldiers to storm parliament to stop them.

Yoon was subsequently impeached by parliament and resisted arrest for weeks, holed up in his guarded residence until he was finally detained Wednesday in a dawn raid. South Korea's first sitting president to be detained, Yoon has refused to cooperate during the initial 48 hours detectives were allowed to hold him.

But the disgraced president remains in custody after investigators requested a new warrant Friday to extend his detention.

A judge at Seoul Western District Court



was set to review the request at a 2:00 pm (0500 GMT) hearing, with her decision expected Saturday night or early Sunday.

Before the hearing, Yoon's lawyer Yoon Kab-keun told agency the president would attend "with the intention of restoring his honour".

If approved, the new warrant would likely extend Yoon's detention by 20 days, giving prosecutors time to formalise an indictment.

The Corruption Investigation Office (CIO) is probing Yoon for insurrection, a charge that could see him jailed for life or executed if found guilty.

Yoon said Wednesday he had agreed to leave his compound to avoid "bloodshed", but that he did not accept the legality of the investigation.

His supporters have gathered in front of the court since Friday, holding South Korean

and American flags and demanding judges dismiss the request to extend the president's detention.

The court closed its entrance to the public Friday evening, citing safety concerns.

Yoon has refused to answer investigators' questions, with his legal team saying the president explained his position when detained on Wednesday.

The president has also been absent from a parallel probe at the Constitutional Court, which is mulling whether to uphold his impeachment.

If the court rules against Yoon, he will lose the presidency and elections will be called within 60 days.

He did not attend the first two hearings this week, but the trial, which could last months, will continue in his absence.

Although Yoon won the presidential election in 2022, the opposition Democratic Party has a majority in parliament after winning legislative polls last year.

The Democratic Party has celebrated the president's arrest, with a top official calling it "the first step" to restoring constitutional and legal order.

As challenges against the embattled leader mount, parliament passed a bill late Friday to launch a special counsel probe into Yoon over his failed martial law bid.

Russian attack kills 4 in Ukraine's Kyiv

KYIV, Jan 18 (Agencies): Russia attacked the Ukrainian capital with a barrage of drones and missiles in the early morning on Saturday, leaving at least four people dead.

Russia launched 39 Shahed drones, other simulator drones and four ballistic missiles, according to Ukraine's Air Force.

Kyiv's mayor Vitali Klitschko said in Shevchenkivskyi district, windows were broken and there was smoke at the entrance of a residential building, adding that a water supply pipeline was also damaged.

AP journalists at the scene saw a man lying dead amid the debris in a pool of blood. Water flooded the streets as firefighters put out the blaze from the attack.

Klitschko also said the Lukyanivska metro station was shuttered after the attacks damaged its glass entrance.

Drones and missiles were shot down across Ukraine, in the Poltava, Sumy, Kharkiv, Cherkasy, Chernihiv, Kyiv, Khmelnytskyi, Zhytomyr, Kirovohrad, Dnipropetrovsk, Kherson and Donetsk regions.

As per ESPNcricinfo, Kohli is suffering from a pain in his neck. Kohli informed the BCCI medical staff that he took an injection on January 8 but still, there is a pain in his neck because of which he had to miss Delhi's upcoming clash against Saurashtra in Rajkot.

The 36-year-old's last appearance in Ranji was back in November 2012 against Uttar Pradesh, in which he was dismissed for 14 and 42 runs in both innings by pacer Bhuvneshwar Kumar. In 155 first-class matches, Virat has scored 11,479 runs at an average of 48.23, with 37 centuries and 39 fifties in 258 innings,



with the best score of 254*. On the other hand, KL Rahul is dealing with elbow issues because of which he is set to miss Karnataka's next-round fixture against Punjab in Bengaluru. The right-handed wicketkeeper-batter made his last Ranji appearance in 2020 March for Karnataka against Bengal, scoring 26 and 0 during the semifinal, which his team lost. BCCI on Thursday released new policies for Team India, making it "mandatory" to participate in domestic matches to remain "eligible" for selection in the national team and for the central contracts. In the policy, BCCI stated that

taking part in domestic cricket will remain connected to the cricket ecosystem. The statement added that any exceptions to taking part in domestic cricket will be considered only under extraordinary circumstances.

"Participation in Domestic Matches is mandatory for players to remain eligible for selecguidelines. Dushmantha Chameera then broke through with the wicket of Jason Roy in the seventh over for 26 runs. Coming in at number three, Avishka Fernando came to life in the ninth over tearing into Gulbadin Naib for a six and two fours in consecutive deliveries.

UAE's Rohan Mustafa also chipped in with 17 runs and vital boundaries until he was Chameera's second wicket of the night bringing the score to 132/3 in 12.1 overs.

Avishka Fernando showcased sheer dominance as he shattered the ILT20 record for the fastest half-century, racing to the milestone in just 16 balls. (The previous record, set by Desert Vipers' Azam Khan, stood at 18 balls.)

Fernando then struck three consecutive sixes against Gulbadin Naib in a 27-run over, also marking the most runs conceded in an over in ILT20 history. Fernando's assault finally subsided when Obed McCoy scalped him, caught behind in the 16th over.

Luke Wells remained composed to put up 31 runs in 17 balls to help the Warriorz sail home comfortably.

In the first innings, the Dubai Capitals made the most of the fielding restrictions. Ben Dunk showcased his intent early, smashing two fours and a six, while Hope complemented him with three crisp boundaries. However, Dunk's promising innings came to an end when an acrobatic effort from Kemo Paul off Adam Milne's bowling saw him depart. The Capitals reached a solid 50/1 at the end of the powerplay.

Brandon McMullen continued the momentum before he was picked up by Adil Rashid on 22 runs in 14 balls. Captain Sikandar Raza joined Hope, and the pair ensured the run rate didn't drop with a 67-run stand in 37 balls. Shai Hope brought up a 36-ball halfcentury that saw three fours and two sixes, in the 14th over. Raza departed for 27 runs in 20 balls, when he holed out to a sharp catch from Adam Milne, off Karim Janat.

Rovman Powell unleashed a barrage of sixes against the Warriorz, racing to 28 runs in 15 balls, including an 18-run over against Karim Janat. Meanwhile, Hope continued his sensational form smashing two consecutive sixes in of Adam Milne in the 19th over as well

DFSS stages protest against negligence surrounding deaths in Rajouri

JAMMU, Jan 18: The mysterious illness has claimed 16 lives so far, including children. Among the victims were Mohammad Fazal and his four children, who passed away on December 8, 2024. Tragically, this was followed by the deaths of three children from Mohammad Rafiq's family, along with his pregnant wife on December 23, reportedly due to medical negligence.

Amid the growing crisis, workers of the Dogra Front & Shiv Sena (DFSS), under the leadership of their president, Ashok Gupta, staged a massive rally in Jammu City to protest against the negligence surrounding the deaths in Badhaal village.

Gupta strongly criticized the Omar Abdullah-led government for its inadequate response to the crisis. He highlighted the failure of ministers who visited Kotranka for meetings



but did not address the ground realities in Badhaal. He called this approach a clear indication of the government's lack of seriousness in tackling the situation.

Gupta also raised concerns about the inability of the Government Medical College (GMC) to identify the root cause of the mysterious illness. He questioned why samples had not been sent to premier medical institutions like AIIMS Delhi or PGI Chandigarh for analysis. According to him, the GMC's lack of proactive measures cost precious lives, which could have been saved with timely refer-

rals.

The protest leader also dismissed the government-formed Special Investigation Team (SIT) as an "eyewash" and demanded the case be handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). He pointed out that the suspected cause of death could be a neurotoxin, requiring expert investigation.

The protest witnessed the participation of numerous individuals, including Abhishek, Ganesh, Prem, Vivek, Vikky, Bantu, Naresh, Shiv, Rampal, Vinay, and Garu, along with many others, who voiced their concerns and solidarity with the affected families.
