cies): Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee president Tariq Hameed Karra while debunking reports that the alliance with the National Conference is on the verge of a collapse, termed them as "malicious" and "concocted."

Karra, asserted that there was no truth in these reports and that Congress was committed to this alliance and in support of the present dispensation.

"These are just baseless, malicious, concocted, and constructed rumours. I don't have much to say about it. This is not a thing to respond to," Karra stated.

Karra, however, added that they have been reiterating their principal demand for restoration of statehood and that they would not be a part of the cabinet unless statehood is restored.

in Rajouri's Badhaal village RAJOURI, Jan 21 (Agencies): A high level inter-ministerial team continued its probe for the second day on Tuesday to ascertain the cause of death of 17 members of three families in Badhaal village of Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, officials said.

The central team headed by a directorrank officer in the Ministry of Home Affairs spent nearly six hours in the village on Monday as part of the probe.

The team returned to Badhaal village this morning from Rajouri and resumed their activities like collecting samples, and interacting with surviving members of three families and the villagers, the officials said.

Home Minister Amit Shah has ordered the constitution of the inter-ministerial team to ascertain the causes of death in the three

families linked to each other in the remote village, about 55 km from Rajouri town, between December 7 and January 19.

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah is likely to visit the village later in the day to take stock of the situation and interact with the bereaved families.

Earlier, a Jammu and Kashmir government spokesperson said investigations and samples empirically indicated that the incidents were not due to a communicable disease of bacterial or viral origin and that there is no public health angle. A Special Investigation Team was set up after certain neurotoxins have been found in the samples of the deceased.

Authorities recently sealed a spring in the village after its water tested positive for some pesticides/insecticides. The people in the village, having a mixed population, are hopeful

that the probe will unveil the mystery behind the sudden death of 17 villagers, including 13 children.

National Conference leader and local MLA

Javaid lobal Choudharv lauded the patience of the villagers in the face of such a big tragedy and their cooperation with the government and medical teams.

"Our villages are an example of communal harmony and all are praying that the investigators find a clue so that those who lost their members could know the reason for the deaths

Surjeet Singh Thakur, a local resident said the entire village is in the grip of fear and grief but "we are standing together in this testing time".



NEW DELHI, Jan 21 (Agencies): The Enforcement Directorate has attached two hotels, valued at about Rs 15 crore, in the tourist town of Patnitop in Jammu and Kashmir as part of a money laundering investigation.

The federal agency

attach the hotels under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The two immovable properties are valued at Rs 14.93 crore.

The money laundering case stems from a CBI FIR that was filed against various owners and directors of hotels, guest houses, resorts, cottages and residences in Patnitop area apart from PDA officials.

It was alleged in the CBI complaint that these hotels "indulged in" commercial use of residential buildings,

"The Special Investigation Team (SIT) is investigating the matter. The civil administration is also probing the situation, and the central government has constituted a team to look into it," CM told media

The Jammu and Kashmir administration had previously formed a Special Investigation Team (SIT) consisting of senior police officers and medical experts to probe the deaths. 

Screenwriter-author Mushtaq Shiekh, in Amritsar to talk about his latest book, Secrets Within, pours his heart out



There were boundaries, people are now crossing it and now we need to do some basic hygiene test (in terms of safety) that these things don't happen.' "The rush to have more, documenting the lives of celebrities, film stars, the culture of excess is going to lead us to such situations, whether it's on social media or the papparazi culture. We need to be ready for new challenges, re-think our safety norms." He also shared an incident when personal space of some film actor was invaded in public, without any concern for the reaction. "The actor was eating out with the family and some fans approached for a picture. They were politely asked if it could wait and the reply from the fan was, 'no, we are getting late'. I mean, it gets tedious for film stars as well after a while and when the lines between adoration and obsession blur, problem arises."

Of course, being friends with the King of Bollywood and star of stars, Shah Rukh Khan, has made Mushtaq privy to this fan-obsession. "People are obsessed with him. As a screenwriter, Mushtag says films are a collective process, where many people and their creatives are involved in completing the final product. "It is quite commerce driven, which books not necessarily are. But my storytelling also comes from films, as my mind works that way. The pace can be felt in the book. Today, most authors know that they need to sustain the readers' attention because they are competing with social media, OTTs as competition."

It was not just about the actors but also blossoming of writers and directors like Salim Khan-Javed Akhtar (who scripted "Sholay" and "Deewar"), Gulzar (directed "Aandhi") and Shyam Benegal (directed "Nishant").

So what propelled this creative surge in a landmark year?

"It was really a happy confluence of writers, directors and actors blooming in the era but particularly in 1975...," Anjum Rajabali, known for writing the screenplays of films such as "Rajneeti" and "Drohkaal", told agency in an interview.

"There were so many great films one after the other. Writers Salim-Javed, filmmakers Ramesh Sippy and Yash Chopra were coming of age ... And the spectrum is so different. On the one hand, you have an intense action drama like 'Deewar' and then you have 'Sholay', a perfect comic book story, and then 'Aandhi' which explores the relationship in the political context. I will use the term loosely but they are all the classics of popular cinema." Film historian, author and archivist S M M Ausaja added that many things got balanced in 1975. It was a year when commercial cinema was at its peak

Saif Ali Khan's attacker entered India seven months ago, used Bengal resident's Aadhaar card to get SIM: Police

MUMBAI, Jan 21 (Agencies): The Bangladeshi national arrested for the knife attack on Saif Ali Khan entered the country illegally seven months ago and used a West Bengal resident's Aadhaar card to procure a SIM before moving to Mumbai, police said on Tuesday.

Police on Sunday arrested the accused, Shariful Islam Shehzad Mohammad Rohilla Amin Fakir (30), from neighbouring Thane city for the stabbing incident at the Bollywood star's residence in Bandra. According to the police, Fakir, who changed his name to Vijay Das, crossed the Dawki River to enter India illegally seven months ago. An official said the accused stayed for a few weeks in West Bengal and used the Aadhaar card of a local man to procure a SIM card before moving to Mumbai in search of a job. He said the preliminary

probe revealed that the

SIM card used by the accused was registered in the name of one Khukumoni Jahangir Sekha of West Bengal.

The official said Fakir also tried to get an Aadhaar card for himself but failed.

He said in Mumbai, the accused chose to work at places where he didn't need to furnish documents, and labour contractor Amit Pandey helped him get housekeeping work in pubs and hotels in Worli and Thane.

On examining Fakir's cellphone, the police found he had made several calls to Bangladesh and used mobile applications to make calls to his family in the neighbouring country.

Khan (54) was stabbed repeatedly by the intruder inside his 12-floor apartment in the building on January 16, necessitating surgery.

Three persons, including wanted criminal gunned down by UP STF, cop sustains gunshot wounds

LUCKNOW, Jan 21 (Agencies): A wanted criminal and his three associates were gunned down in an encounter with the Special Task Force (STF) of the Uttar Pradesh Police in Shamli district, officials said on Tuesday.

An STF inspector also suffered multiple gunshots in the exchange of fire that took place in the Jhinjhina area of Shamli district during the intervening night of Monday and Tuesday, a senior police officer said.

"On the intervening night of January 20-21, Mustafa Kagga gang member Arshad along with three others -- Manjeet, Satish and one unknown accomplice -- were



injured in a police engagement with STF Meerut team.

They have succumbed to injuries during the encounter," said UP STF, Law and Order, Additional Director General of Police, Amitabh Yash.

"Arshad was wanted in a robbery case from Police Station Behat, Saharanpur. A reward of Rs one lakh was declared on him by the ADG of Meerut Zone. A dozen cases of robbery, dacoity and murder were registered against Arsad," he added.

Yash said that Inspector Sunil, who was leading the STF team, received multiple gunshot wounds during the encounter and was admitted to Amritdhara Hospital in Karnal.

Sunil was later referred to the Medanta in Gurugram, he added. Further legal proceedings in the case are underway, the police said.

The Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (STF), an elite wing of the state police, primarily deals with organised crime and criminals.

"He may have. Don't they leave it in the desk? I don't know," Trump said.

Trump thanked the journalist and said he would have not seen it, had the journalist not




pointed it out.

ANKARA, Jan 21 (Agencies): A fire broke out at a hotel at a ski resort in northwestern Turkey on Tuesday, killing at least at least 10 people and hospitalizing another 32 with injuries, officials said. The fire broke out overnight at the restaurant of a hotel in the resort of Kartalkaya in sheets.

There were 234 guests staying at the hotel, Aydin said.

Television images showed the roof and top floors of the hotel on fire. The cause of the fire was not immediately known.

Kartalkaya is a popular ski resort in the Koroglu mountains, some 300 kilometers (186 miles) east of Istanbul. The fire occurred during the school semester break, when hotels in the region are packed. Aydin's office said 30 fire trucks and 28 ambulances were sent to the site.

Other hotels at the resort were evacuated as a precaution.

Landslides and flash floods on Indonesia's Java island leave 16 dead and 9 missing

JAKARTA, Jan 21 (Agencies): Indonesian rescuers recovered the bodies of at least 17 people who were swept away in flash floods or buried under tons of mud and rocks that hit hilly villages on the country's main island of Java, officials said Tuesday. Eight people were missing.

Torrential rains on Monday caused rivers to burst their banks, tearing through nine villages in Pekalongan regency of Central Java province, as mud, rocks and trees tumbled down on mountainside hamlets, said Bergas Catursasi, who heads the local Disaster Management Agency.

He said rescue workers by Tuesday had pulled out at least 17 bodies in the worst-hit injured people managed to escape and were rushed to nearby hospitals, Catursari said.

Television reports on Tuesday showed police, soldiers and rescue workers used excavators, farm equipment and their bare hands to sift through the rubble looking for the dead and missing in devastated villages, while others carried victims on bamboo stretchers or body bags to ambulances or trucks.

"Bad weather, mudslides and rugged terrain hampered the rescue operation," Catursari said, adding that people who were fishing in the river and those who were taking shelter from the rain were swept away by flash floods. National Disaster

district. Seasonal rain from about October to March frequently causes flooding and landslides in Indonesia, an archipelago of 17,000 islands where millions of people live in mountainous areas or near fertile floodplains.

Last month, a landslide, flash floods and strong winds hit the Sukabumi district of West Java province, killing 12 people. In November a landslide and flash floods triggered by heavy downpours hit Indonesia's North Sumatra prov-

Taliban government announces prisoner swap with US

KABUL, Jan 21 (Agencies): The Taliban government said Tuesday it had released two American citizens from prison in return for an Afghan fighter held in the United States, in a deal brokered by Qatar. Discussions about the prisoner exchange were confirmed last year, but the swap was announced after outgoing US president Joe Biden handed over to Donald Trump, who was

inaugurated on Monday. "An Afghan fighter Khan Mohammed imprisoned in America has been released in exchange for American citizens and returned to the country," the Afghan foreign ministry said in a statement.

The ministry said Mohammed had been serving a life sentence in California after being arrested "almost two decades ago" in the

US nationals had been released, declining to provide any further details on the exchange. The family of US citizen Ryan Corbett, who was detained by the Tal-

iban in 2022, confirmed he was released and expressed "overwhelming gratitude" that he was coming home.

"Today, our hearts are filled with overwhelming gratitude and praise to God for sustaining Ryan's life and bringing him back home after what has been the most challenging and uncertain 894 days of our lives," the family said on their website.

They thanked both the Biden and Trump administrations, as well as Qatar, for Corbett's freedom, and called for two other Americans still held in Afghanistan to be released. US media named Wil-

liam McKenty as the

family had asked the US government for privacy in his case.

The New York Times said two other Americans remain in detention in Afghanistan, former airline mechanic George Glezmann and naturalised American Mahmood Habibi. In August 2024, the

US Federal Bureau of Investigation said it was seeking information about the disappearance of Afghan-American businessman Habibi two years previously.

Biden came under heavy criticism for the chaotic withdrawal of US forces from Afghanistan in 2021, more than a year after Trump presided over a deal with the Taliban insurgents to end US and NATO involvement in the twodecade war. New chapter

Taliban authorities have repeatedly said they want positive relations with every country since sweeping back to

power in 2021. No state has officially recognised their government, with restrictions on women's rights a key sticking point for many countries, including the

United States. The Taliban government on Tuesday called the exchange "a good example of resolving issues through dialogue, expressing special gratitude for the effective role of the brotherly country of Qatar in this

regard". "The Islamic Emirate views positively those actions of the United States that contribute to the normalisation and expansion of relations between the two countries," it added, using the Taliban authorities' name for their govern"an Afghan Taliban cell" and said he was arrested in October 2006 and sentenced in December 2008 to "two terms of life in prison on drug and narco-terrorism charges".

It was the first narcoterrorism conviction in a US federal court, the statement said.

Dozens of foreigners have been detained by the Taliban authorities since the group's return to power.

UK PM: Killing of 3 girls must spark 'fundamental change' in state protection

Prime Minister Keir Starmer says the killing of three girls at a Taylor Swift-themed dance class must lead to "fundamental change" in how the British state protects citizens

LONDON. Jan 21 (Agencies): Prime Minister Keir Starmer said Tuesday that the killing of three girls at a Taylor Swift-themed dance class must lead to "fundamental change" in how the British state protects citizens and a reckoning with new threats from violent individuals that test the traditional definition of terrorism.

Starmer said the government must also answer "tough questions" about how authorities failed to stop a violence-obsessed teenager before he stabbed three young girls to death in the seaside town of Southport in July.

In a televised statement, the prime minister said that a public inquiry would tackle failings in the case of Axel Rudakubana, who injured another eight children, their instructor and a passer-by.

"The tragedy of the

Southport killings must be a line in the sand for Britain," Starmer said. Rudakubana, 18, unexpectedly changed his pleas to guilty on Monday, the first day of his trial at Liverpool Crown Court. He is due to be sentenced on Thursday.

His guilty plea means that details that had been withheld from the public to try to ensure a fair trial can now be reported. They include the fact that Rudakubana was referred three times to the government's anti-extremism program, Prevent, when he was 13 and 14, and was in contact with multiple state agencies all of whom failed to spot the danger he posed. The attack occurred

on the first day of summer vacation when two dozen little girls were in a class to learn yoga and dance to the songs of Taylor Swift. What was supposed to be a day of joy turned



to terror and heartbreak when Rudakubana, armed with a knife, intruded and began stabbing the girls and their teacher.

He killed Alice Da Silva Aguiar, 9, Elsie Dot Stancombe, 7, and Bebe King, 6. Eight other girls, ranging in age from 7 to 13, were wounded, along with instructor Leanne Lucas and John Hayes, who worked in a business next door and intervened.

The killings in the northwest England town triggered days of anti-immigrant violence across the country after far-right activists seized

on incorrect reports that the attacker was an asylum-seeker who had recently arrived in the U.K.

Rudakubana was born in Cardiff to Rwandan parents.

Critics have accused Starmer's government of withholding information about the suspect in the aftermath of the attack. Starmer said there was no conspiracy of silence, just a desire to see justice done.

"The only losers if the details had been disclosed would have been the victims and the families because it ran the risk the trial would have collapsed," he said. Police and prosecutors also face questions about why the case was not labeled terrorism, despite Rudakubana facing charges of possessing an al-Qaida manual and the poison ricin alongside charges of murder and attempt-

ed murder. Starmer said the case showed that "terrorism has changed" and the law might need to be changed to deal with "a new threat ... (from) acts of extreme violence carried out by loners, misfits, young men in their bedrooms.3 "It is a new threat, it's not what we would have usually thought of as terrorism when definitions were drawn up when guidelines were put in place, when the framework was put in place and we have to recognize that here today," he

said. "It's clearly extreme violence. It's clearly intended to terrorize."

JBM expresses concern over transformation of Jammu into hub for liquor, drugs

"I remember in 2014 when I came to KKR for the first time. Since then, till today, after 10-11 years, I never thought that I would ever lead India. But today, standing on this ground, thinking that I'm going to lead because this is also a historic stadium.

It's fun to think about it and has been a beautiful journey," the right-hand batter added.

Youngsters Abhishek Sharma, Tilak Varma, Nitish Kumar Reddy, and Dhruv Jurel have retained their place in the 20-over squad. Seamer Harshit Rana who was in the T20I squad against South Africa but couldn't make it into the playing eleven has also been named in the 15-member lineup for the upcoming series.

One of the main talking points will be Shami's inclusion in the Men in Blue squad. The 34-yearold seamer will be donning the blue jersey after 2023. Last year, Shami returned to domestic cricket with Bengal after undergoing ankle surgery that kept him sidelined for nearly a year. Shami had also been a part of Bengal's squad for the Vijay Hazare Trophy.

MELBOURNE, Jan 21 (Agencies): Top German tennis player Alexander Zverev advanced to the semifinal of the ongoing Australian Open 2025 after sealing a 7-6(1), 7-6(0), 2-6, 6-1 triumph over Tommy Paul on Tuesday.

Zverev also became the first semi-finalist in the ongoing tournament. The 27-year-old will take on the winner of the match between Carlos Alcaraz and Novak Djokovic.

Today's match marked Zverev's third appearance in a Grand Slam quarterfinal and his second set, and I'm up two sets to love all of a sudden and I need only one more set," Zverev was quoted by ATP as saying.

"The fourth set was definitely the best that I've played and I'm obviously extremely happy to be back in the semifinals now," he added.

Tommy gave a tough fight to the German in the first two sets of the game, however, the world number 2 kept his nerve and clinched a win. In the third set, Tommy prevailed and sealed a thrilling win. However, Zverev made a solid comeback in the fourth set and won it by 6-1 with sheer dominance.

Earlier in the fourth round of the tournament, Zverev extended his remarkable streak against left-handed opponents to 26 consecutive victories as he overcame Ugo Humbert 6-1, 2-6, 6-3, 6-2 to secure his place in the Australian Open quarterfinals. The World No. 2, who is still chasing his first Grand Slam title.

Coco Gauff loses to Paula Badosa in Australian Open quarterfinals

MUMBAI, Jan 21 (Agencies): The most talented and upcoming players from across the globe will be seen in action at the fourth edition of the Mumbai Open in February 2025.

The event will be organised by the Maharashtra State Lawn Tennis Association (MSLTA) and will be held at the Cricket Club of India (CCI). The tournament will commence on February 1st with the qualifying round, the Main Draw of the event will begin on 3rd February with the finals scheduled on 9th February at the Cricket Club of India, as stated in a release from Mumbai Open.

Sanjay Khandare and Pravin Darade, both IAS officers and Core members of the Organising Committee, said that it will be an exciting week of tennis for fans in Mumbai.

"We are delighted to open our doors for the Mumbai Open for a fourth time. After a fantastic three editions in the previous years, we are looking forward to witnessing riveting contests through the week. Mumbai is the city of dreams, and the fans always make it special for the players who come here, and we are confident of more of the same this season too. The courts at CCI have played host to some of the top names, and we are confident that this year will be an eventful one as well," they were quoted in a release from Mumbai Open as

n- saying. id Among the top names ng involved in the WTA 125 ns tournament is Tatjana

Maria, who is ranked 89 in the world, and will be looking to clinch her fourth singles title in her career. The right-handed Tatjana, who has achieved a career-high ranking of 42, reached a Wimbledon semi-final as the sixth female player in the Open Era over the age of 34 in 2022. She has also won the 2023 and 2024 Copa Colsanitas WTA 250 Event in Colombia on clay.

Along with her, Rebecca Marino from Canada, with a world rank of 98 will headline the singles draw. She achieved her highest WTA singles ranking of world No. 38 in 2011 and will be gunning for her second WTA



singles title. In November 2024, she won the Dow Tennis Classic in the USA on hard court. Spain's Nuria Parrizas-Diaz (World Rank 104) has been ranked as high as world no. 45 in her career and has won three WTA Challenger titles in her career. Parrizas-Diaz, who has overcome a lengthy battle with a career-threatening shoulder injury in 2016, has had some of her best results on the hard courts. Nuria started the year on a strong note having reached the semi-final of the WTA 125 Workday Canberra International and will be hoping to build on her momentum in Mumbai. 2024 Mumbai Open champion Latvian Darja Semenistaja, who cur-

rently holds a rank of 120, will also be back to defend her crown. In a well-fought final, Semenistaja had defeated the Australian Storm Hunter 5-7, 7-6, (8-6), 6-2. Harriet Dart (World Rank 113), who previously played a Wimbledon Mixed-doubles final in 2021, and helped Great Britain reach the semi-finals of the Billie Jean King Cup in 2022 and 2024. Not alien to the courts in Mumbai, Dart is aiming for her first WTA 125 title ever. Among the Future stars 19-year-old Alexandra Eala of the Philippines who has been selected by Rafael Nadal to train at his academy is also one to watch out for. Ranked 138, Alexandra has won one singles and two

doubles Junior Grand Slams and is the highest ranked Filipino player ever. She had an early crash out in the Australian Open this year but will be hoping to bounce back at the Mumbai Open in February. Petra Marcinko Former World No 1 Junior from Croatia and a former Australian Junior Double crown winner is one of the young guns to have entered the event Ranked 133, Jil Teichmann, who has secured two singles and two doubles titles on the WTA Tour. in addition to one WTA 125 doubles

While the outdoor hard-court tournament was won by the Latvian Darja Semenistaja in the Singles draw, the doubles crown went to the pair of Dalila Jakupovic and Sabrina Santamaria.

This is the fourth edition of the Mumbai Open with past singles champions including world No 2 Sabalenka (2017) and Thailand's Luksika Kumkhum (2018).



The camp offered services such as new Aadhaar enrollments, biometric


updates for children, corrections, mobile number updates, and photograph changes.
