J&K Finance Department authorizes further funds for

2024-25

JAMMU, Jan 29 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir Finance Department has approved the release of additional funds under the Revenue Budget for the financial year 2024-25. As per the latest order,

departments with an expenditure of 70% or above will receive 100% of the Budget Estimates (BE) or Revised Estimates (RE), whichever is lower, while those below 70% will get 85%. Specific expenditure heads, including telephone, hospitality, advertisement, and seminars, will receive 90%, with an additional 10% for heads below 55%

Full funding is granted for electricity charges and similar credits.

However, allocations for LTC, vehicle purchases furniture, power, food grain costs, snow clearance, and the Disaster Response Fund remain withheld.

The release of funds is subject to austerity measures outlined in previous government orders.

SRINAGAR, Jan 29 (Agencies): As "Chillai Kalan' approaches its end, the Meteorological Centre in Srinagar has forecast a week of wet weather starting Wednesday afternoon in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said.

The 40-day-long harshest period of winter, known as "Chillai Kalan," in the Kashmir Valley is set to conclude on January 30. This phase largely remained dry, except for two brief spells of snowfall.

The MeT office said the weather will generally remain cloudy with the possibility of widespread rain and snow over Jammu and Kashmir this afternoon

It said there are chances of fairly widespread light to moderate rain, snow, and thunderstorms on Thursday

The weather generally will remain dry and cloudy with the possibility of light rain and snow over the isolated reaches on Friday while another fairly widespread spell of rain and snow is possible on Saturday, the MeT office said.

The wet weather will continue till February 4 with the forecast of widespread rain and snow over Jammu and Kashmir on February 3.

Meanwhile, the night temperature significantly improved amid cloud cover in the Kashmir Valley on Wednesday





ISRO's 100th launch marks quantum leap in India's Space journey: Dr Jitendra

Top News Report

JAMMU / NEW DELHI, Jan 29: In his first response to the Indian Space Research Organisation's successful 100th launch from Sriharikota this morning, Union Minister of State for Space Dr Jitendra Singh said, "the launch of GSLV-F15/NVS-02 Mission is not simply another landmark milestone but this launch, being the 100th one, marks a quantum leap in India's Space journey.

Dr. Jitendra Singh expressed his deep sense of privilege in being associated with the Department of Space at such a momentous time when the world is amazed by a series of extraordinary achievements registered by the ISRO one after the other and highlighted the remarkable transformation of ISRO under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Dr. Jitendra Singh emphasized that while ISRO was established in 1969, it took more than two decades to set up the first launch pad in 1993. The second launch pad came up only in 2004, marking another decadelong gap. However, in the last 10 years, India's space sector has undergone unprecedented expansion, both in terms of infrastructure and investment. "This 100th launch marks a



quantum leap in the space sector, which did not happen in the last six decades. We are now building a third launch pad in Sriharikota, and for the first time, expanding beyond Sriharikota with a new launch site in Tamil Nadu's Tuticorin district, where the foundation stone was laid by Prime Minister Modi last year in February," he stated.

The Minister also underlined the rapid rise of private sector participation in space. "In 2021, we had barely a singledigit number of space startups. Today, we are nearing 300, many of which are world-class enterprises and entrepreneurial success stories. India is positioning itself as a frontline player in the global private space sector," he noted. This growth has translated into real economic impact-investment

in the sector has surged, with Rs 1,000 crore invested in 2023 alone. The space economy, currently valued at \$8 billion, is projected to reach \$44 billion in the next decade, further cementing India's role as a global space powerhouse.

Dr. Jitendra also highlighted India's growing dominance in commercial space launches. "Today, 90% of foreign satellite launches are being carried out through ISRO, reflecting the global confidence in our capabilities," he said. The reforms initiated in the past decade, including the unlocking of the space sector for private players, have led to greater innovation, investment, and international collaborations.

Taking to social media, Dr. Jitendra Singh congratulated the Indian Space Research Organ-

isation (ISRO) for its unwavering commitment to excellence and its ability to consistently raise the bar in space exploration. He stated, "100th Launch: Congratulations ISRO for achieving the landmark milestone of 100th launch from Sriharikota. This technique is very useful, because in future India has to be made its own space center and while creating a space center.It is most important to specialize in the art of connecting the satellite to another, because no construction in space will be completed in one stroke, but will need to carry the desired material again and again for the space center. If it is difficult to install a large satellite into a space orbit, a large satellite can be prepared by adding small satellites. This success has demonstrated ISRO's innovation ability and ability to develop domestic advanced techniques, which has reduced dependence on external support. JAMMU, Jan 29: The Jammu and Kashmir Teachers Forum (JKTF), led by State President Mohd Ashraf Sheikh, has strongly criticized the recently introduced Unified Pension Scheme (UPS) under the National Pension System (NPS), describing it as a deceptive and inadequate scheme for employees. The forum's president argued that the scheme, notified on January 24, 2025, was not the pension scheme that had been promised, but rather an "Assured Pay Out" or "Family Pay Out" system, which lacks the security of the old pension system. One of the main concerns is that the UPS is a funding-based pension

to withdraw up to 60% of their funds has been omitted from the January 2025 notification, making it seem like a broken promise. Additionally, the scheme has strict eligibility criteria. Employees are only eligible if they have been superannuated or compulsorily retired at the time of their scheduled superannuation. If an employee wishes to voluntarily retire, they can only opt for the scheme after 25 years of qualifying service. Those with fewer than 10 years of service are excluded from the scheme. The scheme also offers an assured pay out, which is calculated as 50% of the last 12 months' average Basic Pay, but only if the employee has complet-

service. The family payout is capped at 60% of the assured pay out, but it does not include the minimum payout guarantee of Rs 10,000, which is applicable to the employee's pay out. In light of these issues, the forum rejected both the NPS and UPS, urging the Jammu and Kashmi government to implement the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) as promised in their election manifesto. Ashraf Sheikh emphasized that restoring the OPS is essential for the financial stability and dignity of employees after their years of service.

NEW DELHI, Jan 29 (Agencies): The Congress on Wednesday hit out at the Centre and the Uttar Pradesh government over the "stampede-like" situation at the Sangam, demanding that the Maha Kumbh management be handed over to a better administrator than Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and the movement of VVIPs there be stopped.

were feared after a "stampede-like" situation broke out at the Sangam on Wednesday amid the ongoing Maha Kumbh, as millions of pilgrims turned up for a holy bath on Mauni Amavasya, officials said.

In view of the incident, the akharas called off their traditional 'Amrit Snan' for Mauni Amavasya, even as devotees in large numbers continued to take a dip at Sangam and other ghats in the Mela area.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said that the news of "many people losing their lives" and many people getting injured due to the stampede on the banks of the Tirthraj Sangam during the Maha Kumbh is extremely heartbreaking.

"Our deepest condolences to the families of the devotees should be made keeping the convenience of the devotees paramount. The devotees are requested to perform the bath with patience and peace," she said. "May Maa Ganga

protect everyone," she added

In a post in Hindi on X, Congress' media and publicity department head Pawan Khera said, "The death of many devotees in the stampede during Kumbh bath in Prayagraj is very saddening.

The kind of crowd that was there and the halfbaked arrangements that were put in place, there was always a danger of such an accident happening," Khera said.

Many 'maha snans' are still left, so it is necessary that additional security forces be sent there and the responsibility of management be given to some other better administrator than Yogi Adityanath, Khera said and demanded that the movement of VVIPs be stopped.

North Korean leader Kim inspects nuclear facility as Pyongyang pressures Trump administration

SEOUL, Jan 29 (Agencies): North Korean leader Kim Jong Un inspected a facility that produces nuclear material and called for bolstering the country's nuclear fighting capability, state media reported Wednesday, as the North looks to increase pressure on the United States following the inauguration of President Donald Trump.

Kim's visit suggests a continued emphasis on an expansion of North Korea's nuclear arsenal, though Trump has said he's willing to talk to Kim again to revive diplomacy. Many analysts view North Korean weapons moves as part of a strategy to win sanctions relief and political concessions from the United States.

The official Korean Central News Agency reported that Kim visited the nuclear-material production base and the Nuclear Weapons Institute. It didn't say where those facilities are located, but North Korean photos of Kim's visit indicated that he likely visited a uranium-enrichment facility that he went to last September. That visit was North Korea's first disclosure of a uranium-enrichment facility since it showed one to visiting American scholars in 2010.

Australian police foil anti-semitic attack involving explosives

SYDNEY, Jan 29 (Agencies): Australian police said on Wednesday they had foiled a planned anti-semitic attack after discovering a caravan containing explosives, in an escalation of threats against the Jewish community that authorities called terrorism.

The caravan was discovered on January 19 in Dural, a suburb some 36 km (22 miles) northwest of the centre of Sydney, New South Wales Deputy Police Commissioner David Hudson said.

"That caravan contained an amount of explosives and some indication that those explosives might be used in some form of anti-semitic attack," he said.

The threat had been fully contained and there was no further threat to the Jewish community, the official added. Hudson said arrests had been made but did not disclose how many or what the charges were. New South Wales Premier Chris Minns said over 100 officers were investigating the incident under a joint counter-terrorism operation involving state and federal police.

14 members of Australian religious group convicted over diabetic girl's death

BRISBANE, Jan 29 (Agencies): Two bereaved parents and 12 fellow members of an Australian religious congregation accused of killing an 8-year-old girl by withholding her diabetes medication were found guilty on Wednesday of manslaughter.

Elizabeth Rose Struhs died on January 7, 2022 at her family's home in Toowoomba in Queensland state after six days without her prescribed insulin shots for type-1 diabetes.

Her father, Jason Richard Struhs, 53, and the leader of the family's religious group called "The Saints", Brendan Luke Stevens, 63, had been charged with the more serious crime of murder, but Queensland Supreme Court Justice Martin Burns found both guilty of her manslaughter.

Burns also found another 12 members of the congregation, including the victim's mother, Kerrie Elizabeth Struhs, 49, and the victim's bother Zachary Alan Struhs, 22, guilty of manslaughter. No one charged escaped conviction.

All 14 were remanded in custody to appear in court for sentencing on February 11. Each faces a potential maximum sentence of life in prison.

The victim's adult sister, Jayde Struhs, told reporters outside court that she welcomed the verdicts.

"Although we had a good outcome today, I have to acknowledge the system failed to protect Elizabeth in the first place," Jayde Struhs said.

Steering Committee approves Ladakh State Action Plan on Clean Air

LEH. Jan 29: The Administration of UT Ladakh has achieved a significant developmental milestone with the approval of the State Action Plan on Clean Air and the launch of the Online Consent Management & Monitoring System (OCMMS) by the Ladakh Pollution Control Committee (LPCC), under the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India.

Additionally, a Pictorial Guide on Bio-medical Waste Segregation and Disposal, aligned with the Bio-medical Waste Management Rules, 2016, was unveiled to promote effective waste management practices. In a key meeting held at the Civil Secretariat in Leh yesterday, Dr. Pawan Kotwal, Advisor to UT Ladakh and Chairman of the State Action Plan on Clean Air, granted approval to the State Action Plan on Clean Air. This comprehensive plan, prepared by the Air Quality Monitoring Committee (AQMC), was finalized after detailed discussions with the Steering Committee

Dr. Kotwal commended the relatively better air quality in Ladakh compared to other parts of the country. He directed the LPCC to install two prominent



digital display boards in Leh and Kargil districts at locations such as the main bazaars and airports to showcase Ladakh as a "clean air region."

Additionally, he emphasized the need for rigorous efforts to procure electric buses and hydrogen buses for public transportation to reduce pollution and provide convenient transit options.

Dr. Kotwal also issued directives for the timely disposal of phased-out diesel generator (DG) sets and the adoption of retrofitting equipment for diesel machinery and vehicles, in line with existing guidelines, to minimize carbon emissions. He instructed the Transport Department to develop a policy for setting vehicle age limits for both private and commercial vehicles, along with a vehicle scrapping policy tailored to the unique requirements of the region. Furthermore, he urged the concerned departments to expedite necessary approvals for solid waste management initiatives in Leh and Kargil.

Brij Mohan Sharma, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Member Secretary of the LPCC, presented a detailed overview of the action plan during the meeting. He shared air pollution analysis data for Leh and Kargil, which included average particulate matter (PM-10 and PM-2.5) levels from 2019 to November 2024. The data indicated that particulate matter levels have remained consistent over this period. Following the meeting, Dr.

Kotwal officially launched the

Online Consent Management & Monitoring System (OCMMS). This new platform will serve as a single-window system for stakeholders across public and private sectors, enabling them to obtain pollution-related consents and authorizations seamlessly without paperwork.

The Advisor also unveiled the Pictorial Guide on Bio-medical Waste Segregation and Disposal, developed by the LPCC. This guide aims to raise awareness about proper bio-medical waste management, ensuring compliance with the Bio-medical Waste Management Rules, 2016, and fostering sustainable waste disposal practices.

MELBOURNE, Jan 29 (Agencies): Cricketer Firooza Amiri says her team will "represent millions of women in Afghanistan who are denied their rights" when the side reunites after more than three years for an exhibition game in Australia on Thursday.

An Afghanistan Women's XI will play a **Cricket Without Borders** XI in the match at Melbourne's Junction Oval. It will bring together 21 female players who were formerly contracted by the Afghanistan Cricket Board (ACB) before the Taliban regime re-took control in August 2021.

Since fleeing Afghanistan, the women cricketers banned from playing in their home country have been based in Canberra and Melbourne and playing for various club teams in local competitions. Amiri and Nahida Sapan, who will captain the Afghanistan Women's XI, thanked the Australian government and Cricket Australia for their support in promoting women's sport. "It's very special for all of us to get back together after three years, leaving everything and losing everything back home in Afghanistan and come together



again," Amiri said this week.

Amiri was forced to flee her home country when the Taliban took control. She and her family first traveled to Pakistan and then were evacuated to Australia.

"I also want to express deepest gratitude for everyone who support us. Your support means the world to us," Sapan said. "Together we are building not just a team. We are building a movement for change and improvement."

"This is a very historic moment for all of Afghan women. This match can open doors for Afghan women for education, sport and our future.' Sapan told the BBC in 2023 that her family received death threats from government officials after the Taliban re-took power. The threatening messages included: "If we find you, we will not let you live." Cricket Australia chief executive Nick Hockley praised the resilience of

the players. He said it

was a powerful moment when they were presented with their team shirts for the exhibition match. "To see their playing shirts for the first time with their names and numbers on the back, you can see how much it means to them." Hockley said. "I'm just inspired by their resilience, their love for the game." Hockley said CA would continue to "advocate" for change at a global level through discussions with the International Cricket Council (ICC). He said

Cricket Board cannot field a national women's team because the country's laws forbid women from playing sport, studying and medical education, moves that have been criticized by world groups including the International Criminal Court.

Afghanistan is a full member of the ICC and a condition of that status should require it to have a women's side.

England and Australia are refusing to participate in direct series against Afghanistan in to boycott their match against Afghanistan in the same tournament. When asked why Australia was prepared to play a men's game against Afghanistan in an ICC event, but not in a bilateral series, Hockley said CA was "duty-bound" to play all its scheduled fixtures at ICC events.

"We're really trying to do everything we can in our power to make a difference," Hockley said. "We've played Afghanistan in other ICC events. You have to draw a line somewhere and I think we've made our stance pretty clear.'

Mohammad Nabi and Rashid Khan from Afghanistan's men's national cricket team have posted support of women's education on social media after the Taliban closed training institutes for nursing and midwives. Hockley said he hoped Thursday's match, the format for which was not announced, would become an annual one and that it would "promote lots of conversations.' "You need moments like this to prompt real change. The first piece is awareness," Hockley said. "Hopefully this game just raises awareness. I think it's a real beacon of hope."

Recapping the third T20I of the fivematch series, Men in Blue skipper

"It's such a complex situation. It's bigger than cricket." Under Taliban rule, the Afghanistan protest, but continue to play against it in ICC events, such as next month's Champions Trophy global event in Pakistan. England cricket cap-

tain Jos Buttler said last week that his side should not boycott a match against the Afghanistan men's team when they are scheduled to play in the Champions Trophy on Feb. 26 in Lahore. South Africa's sport minister, however, has urged the Proteas

England's Kate Cross to miss one-off Women's Ashes Test against Australia at MCG

MELBOURNE, Jan 29 (Agencies): England will miss the services of right-arm seamer Kate Cross or the one-off Test against Australia at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG), while two important Australian players make comeback in the squad in order to seek a series whitewash, as per the ICC official website.

Cross has failed to recover from the back injury that forced her to watch on from the sidelines during the ODI component of the ongoing Ashes series against Australia, with the veteran set to be replaced in England's XI by fellow pacer Ryana MacDonald-Gay or additional spinner.

"Kate Cross is unfor-

tunately not going to be playing. She's been amazing. She's worked so diligently to try and get over her (back) injury. Worked really hard, but she hasn't quite been able to get back to her pace and her performance level. Really gutted for her, because she's a key member for us, and it's been really great to have her back around the group actually the last couple of days, she's a huge member of the team and a leader in this group," England captain Heather Knight confirmed on Wednesday as quoted by ICC.

The news is better for Australia as they look to complete a clean sweep of their arch-rival in the multi-format Ashes



series, with skipper Alyssa Healy and star all-rounder Ash Gardner both likely to play in the Test match that commences at the MCG on Thursday

Gardner has been passed fit to return from her calf niggle, while Healy has shaken off her foot complaint and is set to captain the side in Melbourne.

Healy fronted the media at the MCG on Wednesday and said she expects to play in the one-off Test.

"I'm good to go. We'll make a final decision on what the XI looks like over the next little period ... but I feel like I'm ready to go, so we'll wait and see what happens. The final XI hasn't quite been decided upon just yet,

but I'm standing here in front of you without a moon boot, saying I'm ready to go," Healy said. 'People get the Government they deserve' Democratic rights of people of Delhi were crushed by BJP through ordinance against SC verdict, Bill on services matter: Rao

JAMMU, Jan 29: Sr. AAP leader, J&K, Jammu, Mr. Kuldeep Kumar Rao, in a press statement issued here has strongly criticized the BJP for undermining democratic processes and federal values.

He hailed the Supreme Court's verdict in the Chandigarh Mayor election as a landmark victory for democracy and justice. The Supreme Court declared AAP councilor & INDIA bloc candidate, Kuldeep Kumar, the rightful winner of the Chandigarh Mayor election, overturning Officer Anil Masih, who had invalidated eight ballots cast in favour of the AAP candidate. The Court ruled that the invalidation was deliberate and unjustified.

A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala, & Justice Manoj Misra physically examined the ballots on February 21 and confirmed they were not defaced. The Court's decision reversed the earlier declaration of BJP candidate Manoj Kumar Sonkar as Mayor on January 30, making the first time such an incident has occurred in India's electoral history. Mr Rao commended the Judiciary for upholding democratic values and ensuring justice. This is a major victory of "good over evil" and a moment to thank the Supreme Court for safeguarding democracy, he said.



Rao strongly condemned the BJP-led central government's ordinance & the subsequent Delhi Services Bill, which nullified the Supreme Court's earlier judgment granting the Delhi government control over officers dealing with subjects outside public order, police and land. He accused the BJP of bypassing the elected government's mandate and attempting to centralize power through unconstitutional means. He described the passage of the bill as a "cowardly act" that undermines federal values and warned Delhites that the BJP's backdoor tactics show contempt for the electoral mandate. He added, "Even if BJP loses in elections, they aim to rule undemocratically through such ordinances & bills"

Highlighting BJP's failure, Rao stated,

"The BJP government has a disaster on all fronts. It has brought nothing but misery to the common people instead of delivering on its promises of Achhe Din. Unemployment has reached record levels, rising sky-rocketing prices of eatables, LPG prices have skyrocketed from 450 to 1100, and the Modi government has failed to create the promised two crore jobs per year." He pointed out that Jammu & Kashmir has suffered the most under BJP's governance, citing rising unemployment & inflation as key issues. Rao warned that the BJP's policies are pushing the country toward a dangerous path of centralization and dictatorship, undermining democracy and federalism. He accused the ruling dispensation of adopting a policy that benefits the wealthy elite at the expense of the common people, threatening the unity and integrity of the nation.

Concluding his statement, he predicted that BJP would face another electoral defeat in the Delhi Assembly election 2025, similar to the losses in 2015 and 2020. He urged the people of India to stand united against anti-people policies and defend the country's democratic values. "This Supreme Court decision holds immense significance for democracy and we must remain vigilant to protect our Institutions and rights," Rao asserted.


