Sports Budget Raised by **Over Rs** 350 Crore, **Khelo India Gets Biggest** Share

SRINAGAR, Feb 1 (Agencies): The government's flagship Khelo India programme to scout and nurture athletes at the grassroots level was the biggest beneficiary as the allocation for sports was hiked substantially by Rs 351.98 crore in the Union Budget presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman here on Saturday.

The ambitious scheme has been allocated Rs 1,000 crore for the financial year 2025-26. This is Rs 200 crore more than the grant of Rs 800 crore in 2024-25.

Overall, the Ministry for Youth Affairs and Sports was designated Rs 3,794.30 crore, an overall

jump of Rs 351.98 crore. The increase is substantial considering there is no major sporting event like the Olympics, Commonwealth or Asian Games lined up in the next one

The assigned amount for assistance to National Sports Federations has also been hiked marginally from Rs 340 crore to Rs 400 crore.

India is currently pushing through with an ambitious bid to host the 2036 Olympic Games for which a letter of intent has been submitted to the International Olympic Commit-

Punjab once again ignored in Union **Budget: CM Mann**



1 (Agencies): Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann expressed disappointment over the Union Budget on Saturday, claiming that the border state has been "ignored" once again and not given anything.

Describing it as an "election budget", the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader said it only made announcements for Bihar. Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented her eighth budget in Parliament on Satur-

day. Reacting to the budget, Mann alleged that Punjab has once again been "ignored" in the budget presented by the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Centre.

Nil tax for individuals earning up to Rs 12 lakh annually under new regime: FM

NEW DELHI, Feb 1 (Agencies): Individuals earning up to Rs 12 lakh annually will not have to pay any income tax under the new tax regime as Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday gave relief to middle class by raising exemption limit and rejigging slabs.

For salaried employees, this nil tax limit will be Rs 12.75 lakh per annum, after taking into account a standard deduction of Rs 75,000.

Higher exemptions and rejigs have been effected under the new income tax regime.

"I am now happy to announce that there will be no income tax payable up to income of Rs 12 lakh (i.e. average income of Rs 1 lakh per month other than special rate income such as capital



gains) under the new regime," the finance minister said.

"The new structure will substantially reduce the taxes of the middle class and leave more money in their hands, boosting household consumption, savings and investment," Sithara-

man said in her Budget speech. As per the rejig, for people earning more than Rs 12 lakh per annum, there will be nil tax for income up to Rs 4 lakh, 5 per cent for income between Rs 4 and 8 lakh, 10 per cent for Rs 8-12 lakh, 15 per cent for Rs 12-16 lakh.

A 20 per cent income tax will be levied on income between Rs 16 and 20 lakh, 25 per cent on Rs 20-24 lakh and 30 per cent above Rs 24 lakh per annum.

A tax payer in the new regime with an income of Rs 12 lakh will get a benefit of Rs 80,000 in tax. A person having income of Rs 18 lakh will get a benefit of Rs 70,000 in tax.

A person with an income of Rs 25 lakh gets a benefit of Rs 1.10

The budgetary figures show that there has been no increase in central assistance to J&K for the next fiscal in the Union Budget.

Of Rs 410000.07 crore allotted to J&K, Rs 40619.30 crore has been kept as central assistance for J&K to bridge its resource gap. According to budget documents, Rs 279 crore have been pro-



Dimple leads protest against disappointing Union Budget 2025-26

JAMMU, Feb 1: Sunil Dimple, President of Mission Statehood Jammu & Kashmir, led a protest against the 2025-26 Union Budget, calling it deeply disappointing for the people of Jammu & Kashmir, especially the youth. As a sign of strong opposition, Dimple and his supporters burnt copies of the budget, condemning it as an anti-poor, antiyouth, and anti-farmer policy document.

Addressing the protesters, Dimple accused Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman of presenting a misleading and ineffective budget, which fails to address the real concerns of the people. He criticized the government for neglecting Jammu & Kashmir's economic and social needs and demanded the immediate restoration of J&K's statehood, asserting that the people of the region can manage their own affairs without depend-

ing on the Centre. Dimple strongly criticized the budget for

failing to address rising unemployment, inflation, and poverty. He alleged that no concrete steps have been taken to create job opportunities, despite earlier promises of providing two crore jobs per year. The budget, he argued, does not offer any relief to the common people, who continue to struggle with skyrocketing prices of essential commodities.

He further pointed out that 85 crore people in the country still depend on 5 kg free ration, questioning what measures the government has actually taken for their upliftment. Additionally, he slammed the budget for offering no relief on toll taxes, failing to return power projects to J&K, and ignoring the need for electricity bill waivers, which he said are crucial for easing the burden on the common

people. Dimple also criticized the lack of reforms in fuel pricing, stating that no steps were taken to bring petrol, diesel, and LPG under GST, despite repeated demands

from the middle-class families. The so-called income tax relief in the budget, he said, is nothing more than a hoax, misleading people into believing they will benefit while offering no real financial relief.

Highlighting the neglect of Jammu & Kashmir in the budget, he stated that there is no commitment to return power projects, restart the Darbar Move, or introduce railway and metro projects in the region. He also expressed disappointment over the lack of provisions for the recruitment and regularization of daily wagers, NYC, REK, Janglat, and Sehat workers, who continue to suffer without stable employment.

According to Dimple, traders, transporters, unemployed youths, and middle-class families have received nothing from this budget except disappointment. He accused the government of failing to control inflation and provide support to small businesses, which are already struggling due to high GST rates and lack of incentives

Laparoscopic Day: Honoring Advances in Modern Surgery

aparoscopic Day, celebrated every year on the last Sunday of January, is an event dedicated to recognizing and honoring the importance of advancements in surgical techniques, particularly the development and use of noninvasive, minimally invasive procedures. The day focuses on promoting awareness and education about the evolution of laparoscopic surgery, the benefits it brings to patients and how it has transformed the field of medicine. Laparoscopy, which involves using a small camera to perform surgery through tiny incisions, was first introduced in the 1960s and quickly gained recognition for its ability to reduce recovery time, minimize scarring and lower the risk of complications. However, as its use became more widespread, concerns arose regarding the risks and long-term effects, particularly in complex surgeries or in patients with certain conditions. These concerns spurred the creation of Laproscopic Day, which aims to foster discussions around alternatives to traditional laparoscopy, such as robotic-assisted surgery and natural orifice transluminal endoscopic surgery (NOTES).

Laparoscopy is a diagnostic and therapeutic procedure widely used in medicine. It involves the insertion of a laparoscope through small incisions, allowing surgeons to view the internal organs on a screen. This method is commonly employed for diagnostic purposes, such as identifying the cause of abdominal pain, infertility, or unexplained bleeding, as well as for therapeutic purposes, like removing the gallbladder, treating endometriosis, or performing bariatric surgeries. This approach reduces post-surgical complications such as infections, shortens hospital stays and leads to quicker recovery periods

The history of laparoscopy dates back over a century. Its origins can be traced to the early 1900s when German physician Georg Kelling performed the first experimental laparoscopic procedure on a dog. However, it wasn't until the 1960s and 1970s that the technique gained traction for human surgeries, thanks to advancements in medical technology and the development of more



introduction of video cameras in the 1980s revolutionized the field, allowing surgeons to view detailed images on monitors and perform more complex procedures with precision. Today, laparoscopy is a cornerstone of minimally invasive surgery, widely used across various medical disciplines.

Treatment through laparoscopy extends beyond diagnostics. The procedure allows surgeons to perform various operations, including removing cysts, tumors, or diseased organs, repairing damaged tissues and treating conditions like ectopic pregnancies. Robotic-assisted laparoscopy, a more recent innovation, enhances surgical precision, offering improved outcomes for patients. The recovery process is generally swift, with most patients returning to normal activities within a few days to weeks, depending on the complexity of the procedure. Postoperative care typically includes managing minor discomfort, monitoring for signs of infection and following dietary and activity guidelines.

Certain groups of patients are more likely to require laparoscopic treatment due to the nature of their medical conditions. Women suffering from gynecological issues, such as endometriosis, ovarian cysts, fibroids, or infertility, are common candidates for laparoscopy. It allows doctors to diagnose these conditions and, in many cases, treat them during the same procedure. Patients with abdominal or pelvic pain of unknown origin may also benefit from laparoscopic exploration to determine the cause of their symptoms. Additionally, those with gastrointestinal problems, such as appendicitis, gallstones or hernias, may need laparoscopic surgery for diagnosis or treatment. Laparoscopy is also a valuable tool in oncology for ing biopsies to guide further treatment.

Another group that often requires laparoscopic intervention includes individuals with obesity or metabolic syndrome opt for weight-loss surgeries, such as laparoscopic gastric bypass or sleeve gastrectomy. These procedures are minimally invasive and have been shown to significantly improve health outcomes for people struggling with obesityrelated complications like diabetes, hypertension and sleep apnea. Similarly, patients with chronic diseases, such as inflammatory bowel disease or liver cirrhosis, may require laparoscopic procedures to assess the severity of their conditions or manage complications.

Despite its benefits, laparoscopy has been surrounded by taboos and misconceptions, particularly in the early days. Some skeptics doubted its efficacy, believing that small incisions might compromise surgical outcomes. Others feared that the technique was too complex or risky compared to traditional open surgery. In certain cultures, taboos about medical interventions, particularly those involving internal organs, have further complicated the acceptance of laparoscopy. Over time, education, awareness campaigns and success stories have dispelled many of these myths, leading to its widespread acceptance as a safe and effective surgical method.

Laproscopic Day, celebrated on the last Sunday of January each year, plays a pivotal role in addressing these challenges and promoting awareness. This day is not about opposing laparoscopy; rather, it celebrates the evolution of surgical techniques that have surpassed or complemented traditional laparoscopic methods. The day highlights the importance of continuous innovation in the medical field, fostering discussions about the limitations of laparoscopy and the potential of newer, non-invasive procedures. It is also an opportunity to educate patients and healthcare providers about the importance of choosing the right surgical approach based on individual needs and conditions.

The celebration of Laproscopic Day is significant for several reasons. First, it recognizes the transformative impact of minimally invasive surgery on modern medicine. By reducing the physical and emotional burden of traditional surgery, laparoscopy has improved the quality of life for countless patients. The day also emphasizes the need for ongoing research and development to overcome existing challenges, such as the steep learning curve for surgeons and the high cost of advanced equipment. Furthermore, it serves as a platform to dispel lingering taboos and misconceptions, ensuring that patients make informed decisions about their healthcare.

In conclusion, laparoscopy represents a remarkable advancement in medical science, offering a safer, less invasive alternative to traditional surgery. Its ability to diagnose and treat a wide range of conditions with minimal disruption to patients' lives underscores its importance. However, like any medical procedure, it has its limitations and risks, which necessitate careful evaluation and patient education. Laproscopic Day serves as a reminder of the progress made in surgical techniques and the importance of continuing innovation in the field. By celebrating this day, we acknowledge the milestones achieved and inspire future advancements that will further revolutionize patient care.

Initiative involve AI-Powered cameras, Google-assisted navigation & a chatbot ,digital lost and found centre which are operating for security, convenience and ease of crores of devotees .To tackle a concern among people that has been long associated with the Kumbh Mela -that of getting lost during one of the largest religious gatherings expected to be attended by around 40 crore people in January 2025 in Prayagraj. The primary goal of digitizing is to help the largest number of the people participating in this year's Maha Kumbh Mela so that they feel ease at the Prayagraj for the first time. This grand pilgrimage held cyclically at four

sacred riverbanks of the Ganges ,Yamuna, and Sarsawati, Haridwar along the Ganges, Nashik on Godavari, and Ujjain on the Shipra-is not merely a contemporary spectacle but a tradition steeped in profound historical significance. As we embark on a journey through time, we unravel the layers of history that have shaped the sanctity and prominence of the Kumbh Mela. The roots of the Maha Kumbh Mela can be traced back to ancient Hindu scriptures and mythological narratives. The ancient references to a similar pilgrimage are found in the Rigveda, one of the oldest sacred texts of Hinduism. The Rigveda speaks of a divine event called the "Sagar Manthan" or churning of the cosmic ocean ,which is considered as the genesis of the Maha Kumbh.Legend has it that during the cosmic churning a pot -kumbh emerged .The celestial struggle for possession of this divine nectar ensued, leading to a celestial battle that spanned twelve divine days equivalent to twelve human years. Drops of nectar fell on four locations on earth, marking the sites where the Kumbh Mela is celebrated today . The Kumbh mela finds its first historical references during the Maurya and Gupta periods ,approximately from the 4th century BCE to 6th century CE. During this period, the great Indian emperor Ashoka is said to have played a pivotal role in the establishment & promotion of Buddhism. .Historical records suggest that the Maha Kumbh Mela in its nascent form attracted pilgrims from various corners of the Indian sub-continent. In the contemporary era, the Kumbh Mela has transformed into a global phenomenon, drawing not only millions of domestic pilgrims but also attracting international attention .The UNESCO recognition of the Kumbh Mela as an intangible cultural heritage of humanity in 2017 further underscored its historical and cultural significance. The Kumbh Mela today is a manifestation of India's rich cultural and religious heritage. It serves as a testament to the resilience of ancient traditions in the face of modernity. The historical evolution of the Maha Kumbh Mela from ancient scriptures to the present day ,reflects its ability to adapt and thrive ,preserving its sanctity and spiritual essence. The main objectives of digitalization of Maha Kumbh are to improve security, increase visibility, monitor activities ,and ensure efficient service delivery .The UP government has introduced a digital plan to help people navigate the Kumb Mela 2025 with ease . This initiative, supported by Prime Minister Nar-

endra Modi and chief minister UP Yogi Adityanath, aims to provide a modern digital experience for both attendees and those unable to visit in person .The chief minister has also launched a new website and app, offering detailed information on key areas such as ghats, akharas, religious sites, and travel options to enhance the overall experience .In an interview with the Times of India ,Kumbh Mela Adhikari Vijay Kiran Anand stated," Work is being done for the chatbot through this ,devotees will easily reach the camp where they want to go .They will not have to wander anywhere. "For the first time ,advanced technologies like artificial intelligence has been implemented during the Maha Kumbh .The Prayagraj Mela authority will also be able to track services provided at the event, including the Ganga Aarti Puja ,through online platforms .For added convenience ,3D images of all camps are being uploaded to the official website ,offering visitors a clear view of facilities and accommodation .To ensure security and cleanliness during the Maha Kumb2025,100AI cameras have also been installed at the Mela .These cameras are monitoring activities and alert the police to any issue. Scanners have also be installed in all toilets to track their cleanliness and maintenance in real time. During chief minister Yogi Adityanath's visit to Prayagraj ,an agreement was signed between the UP government and Google .This partnership has enable Google to offer an online view of the entire tent city. Visitors are also able to access detailed information about attractions such as laser shows ,water sports, and more through the official website .For the first time, cutting -edge technologies ,including chatbots ,Google navigation ,and artificial intelligence AI ,are used during the Maha Kumbh .Through internet platforms ,the Prayagraj Mela authorities are also be able to monitor services offered throughout the event ,such as the Ganga Aarti Puja .All camps have 3D photo posted to the official website for visitors convenience, providing a clear glimpse of the amenities and lodging .One hundred artificial intelligence cameras have been set up in the Mela to guarantee cleanliness and security during the Maha Kumbh 2025. set up a Digital Kumbh Museum to showcase the cultural heritage of India and offer insight into the mythological and historical significance of the Kumbh .To leverage its religious and spiritual tourism potential, the UP government is pitching for global branding of Maha Kumbh Mela 2025, one of the world's largest congregations of pilgrims ."Maha Kumbh 2025 will represent India and UP before domestic and international tourists .It is therefore imperative that visitors carry back a bouquet of pleasant memories of their stay .Therefore we are going all out in our preparations ."Although Kumbh is essentially the religious event, it has a major socioeconomic footprint and the state is on the job to promote maha kumbh to harness its religious ,spiritual ,and cultural tourism potential for job creation ,socioeconomic growth and cultivating a positive image for UP, which is aspiring to become India's first one trillion dollar economy. To host an enormous congregation of devotees ,a gargantuan 4,000-hectare tent city has been set up in Prayagraj .It will has been illuminated with 67,000 streetlights ,and comprise 2,000 tents and 25,000 public accommodations for different categories of tourists. About 23,000 CCTV cameras and AI -based surveillance will complement the security paraphernalia of the tent city at the bank of Sangam, the confluence of Ganga, Yamuna and mythical Saraswati in Prayagraj .The state budget for Kumbh has jumped 78% from Rs 4,200 crore in Kumbh Mela 2019 to Rs 7,500 crore for Maha Kumbh 2025 .Main religious ritual is a holy dip in the waters at the Sangam -the confluence of the three sacred rivers .Prayagraj is considered as the holiest of the holy pilgrimages in Hinduism and a holy dip there is believed to give salvation to devotees .In short the Maha Kumbh Mela has been digitized and let us pass on our cultural spiritual and religious legacy to the future generations and keep ourselves aware of our rich cultural and religious roots .Kumbh Mela in fact symbolizes the spiritual ,cultural and religious legacy of India.





LUCKNOW, Feb 1 (Agencies): Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath visited Prayagraj on Saturday, marking his first visit since the tragic stampede at the Mahakumbh during Mauni Amavasya, which claimed at least 30 lives.

CM Yogi inspected the site of the mishap at the Mauni Amavasya ghat and questioned officials about the circumstances leading to the tragedy. He also conducted an aerial survey of the roads approaching the Mahakumbh mela premises.

Speaking at the spot, the Chief Minister said, "Some forces are misguiding people continuously and conspiring against Sanatan. But they will never be able to damage Sanatan in any way."

Following his inspec-

tion, CM Yogi visited

the Sangam Nose, Satua Baba Ashram in Sector 21, and Bharat Seva Shram Camp in Sector 5. He later met 118 representatives of Heads of Mission from 77 countries at the Mela Circuit House. The delegation, comprising diplomats, their spouses, and other officials, also took a holy dip at the Sangam.

Meanwhile, in preparation for the third Amrit Snan on Basant Panchami (3 February), the Mela administration has declared the entire Mela area a no-vehicle zone until 4 February.

All VIP passes have been cancelled, and pontoon bridges have been opened for free movement to manage the anticipated rush of devotees. Additionally, vehicles are being stopped at the border of Sangam city to control crowd influx.

Since the Mahakumbh's inauguration on 13 January, approximately 33 crore devotees have bathed in the Sangam, with 1.20 crore taking a dip by 12 noon on Saturday alone.

A three-member judicial commission, formed to investigate the stampede, visited Swaroop Rani Nehru Hospital in Prayagraj, where many of the injured are being treated. The panel will examine the causes and circumstances of the tragedy and submit its report within a month.

Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar is also expected to visit the Mahakumbh later on Saturday.

Elderly couple killed in Kerala house fire, son arrested for suspected arson

ALAPPUZHA, Feb 1 (Agencies): An elderly couple died in a fire that broke out at their house in Alappuzha district, Kerala, in the early hours of Saturday.

The deceased, identified as Raghavan (96) and his wife Bharathi (86), lived in Chennithala village.

ala village.
Police have taken their son, Vijayan, into

custody on suspicion of setting the house on fire. According to sources, Vijayan had ongoing disputes with his parents over property matters.

The fire was first spotted by an autorickshaw driver around 3.30 am, prompting villagers to alert the police and Fire and Rescue Services. The authorities managed to extinguish the

blaze, but by then, the house was completely gutted, and the charred bodies of the couple were recovered.

The Mannar police apprehended Vijayan from a nearby plot and are investigating the cause of the fire. A senior police officer confirmed that further details would be released after the investigation.



7 dead after cruiser car plunges into canal due to dense fog in Haryana

FATEHABAD, Feb 1 (Agencies): At least seven people died, two were injured, and several remain missing after a cruiser car carrying 14 passengers plunged into the Bhakra canal amid dense fog in Haryana's Fatehabad on Friday night. Rescue operations continued late into the night, with officials managing to save a 10-year-old boy and recover the body of a 55-year-old man. Most of the missing passengers are believed to be women.

The passengers were returning after attending a wedding in Punjab. Around 10 pm, while crossing a bridge near Sardarewala village, the driver reportedly lost control due to poor visibility due to the thick fog. As a result, the vehicle veered off the bridge and fell into the canal.

"We rescued 3 people at night. One of them succumbed at night itself and the rest of the two are alive...we have recovered 5 more bodies...our team is still on it and the operation



is still underway. A few more people are still missing," Sub-Divisional Magistrate Jagdish Chandra said.

The driver of the vehicle, identified as Jarnail Singh, jumped out of the vehicle just before it

plunged into the water, escaping unhurt.

However, other passengers were still inside the vehicle when it fell into the canal. Rescue teams managed to save a 10-year-old, while the body of Balbir Singh, 55,

was recovered from the canal.

While speaking after the accident, the 10-year-old said that the driver mistakenly assumed the canal was a road due to poor visibility and drove straight into the water.

After getting the information about the accident, local residents, along with police, rushed to the site to assist in the rescue efforts. Divers and rescue personnel continued their search throughout the night.

Budget is an attempt to 'dupe' people: Kharge

NEW DELHI, Feb 1 (Agencies): Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Saturday said the government is busy garnering praises for the Union Budget when the entire country is struggling with problems of inflation and unemployment, and asserted that the Budget is an attempt to "dupe" the people.

He said the Budget is aptly described by the Hindi proverb 'Nau sau choohe khake billi hajj ko chali' (roughly translated to seeking to be pious after committing a number of sins).

In a post on X in Hindi, Kharge said that in the last 10 years, the Narendra Modi government has collected Rs 54.18 lakh crore of income tax from the middle class, and now the exemption is being given to those earning up to Rs 12 lakh.

The finance minister has herself stated that there will be a saving of Rs 80,000 per year,



Kharge said and pointed out that is only Rs 6,666 per month.

"The whole country is struggling with the problem of inflation and unemployment, but the Modi government is bent on garnering false praises," he said.

In this 'announcementmaking' budget, Make in India has been changed to National Manufacturing Mission to hide its flaws, Kharge said.

"All other announcements are almost like this. There is nothing for the youth. Modi ji had promised yesterday that he would take a big step for the empowerment of women in this budget, but nothing like that happened in the budget," he said.

No roadmap to double farmers' income and no concession in GST rates on agricultural inputs, Kharge said.

"There is no plan for health, education or scholarship for Dalit, tribal, backward class, poor and minority children. There are no reform measures to increase private investment. Their failures have been hidden by saying a few superficial things on export and tariff," he said.

Kharge said that nothing has been done to increase the income of the poor and not a single step has been taken to address the continuously falling consumption.

"Despite skyrocketing inflation, the budget of MGNREGA remains the same. Nothing has been done to increase the income of workers. There is no mention of any reform in the Multiple Rates of GST. To reduce unemployment, there was no talk of cre-

Earlier, on Saturday, IDF confirmed, three kidnapped Israelis Yarden Bibas, Ofer Kalderon and Keith Siegel are back in Israel after 484 days in captivity, according to TPS.

Israel Defense Forces (IDF) Spokesperson was cited by TPS as saying: "Ofer Calderon and Jordan Bibas arrived at the initial absorption point in the Gaza Strip.

IDF personnel and medical personnel are accompanying the returning civilians, and they will undergo an initial medical assessment. As per TPS, IDF representatives are also accompanying family members waiting at the hospital and providing them with regular

updates. Bibas, 35, was abducted from Kibbutz Nir Oz along with wife Shiri, and their two sons, Ariel and

Russian drone and missile attacks kill 4 in Ukraine

KYIV, Feb 1 (Agencies): At least four people died overnight as Russian drone and missile strikes continued to pound Ukraine's towns and cities, local officials said Saturday. Meanwhile, Moscow's troops continued their grinding advance through the country's east. A Russian missile strike on an apartment block in the Ukrainian city of Poltava killed at least three people and injured 10 more, Ukraine's emergency services

Some 21 people were rescued from the five-story building, which partially collapsed following the attack, said the Poltava region's acting governor, Volodymyr Kohut. Rescue teams remain at the site.

Elsewhere, a 60-year-old woman was killed by falling debris from a downed drone in the Kharkiv region, local Gov. Oleh Syniehubov wrote on social media.

The bombardment comes as Russian forces continue their monthslong campaign to capture the key Donetsk strongholds of Pokrovsk and nearby Chasiv Yar, fighting their way across farm fields and woodland and engulfing small rural settlements. "Last night. Russia launched an attack on our cities using various types of weapons: missiles, attack drones, and aerial bombs,"

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy wrote on social media Saturday.

"Every such act of terror proves that we need greater support in defending against Russian terror. Every air defense system, every interceptor missile means a life saved." The fullscale war between Russia and Ukraine, which began nearly three years ago and shows no signs of ending, has killed more than 10,000 Ukrainian civilians, according to the United Nations.

Many have been evacuated from areas along the roughly 1,000-kilometer (600-mile) front line where Ukrainian defenses are straining to hold the bigger Russian army at bay.

Civilians have also endured hardship caused by Russian attacks on the power grid that have denied them heating and running water.

Saturday's missile attack prompted emergency power grid shutdowns in seven Ukrainian regions, including Poltava, state energy company Ukrenergo

Köhler, who was head of state from 2004 to 2010, died Saturday morning in Berlin after a short illness, surrounded by his family, the office of current German President Frank-Walter Steinmeier said in a statement.

Köhler was little known to most Germans and a stranger to front-line politics before he won the presidency. His nomination was greeted by the mass-circulation daily Bild with the headline "Horst Who?"

However, he built up high popularity ratings once in the job, something that he achieved in part by positioning himself as an outsider to the country's political elite.

He occasionally refused to sign bills into law due to constitutional concerns and didn't always make himself popular with the government of Chancellor Angela Merkel, whose choice he was for the presidency — a largely ceremonial job but often seen as a source of moral authority.

Köhler was elected before Merkel came to power, at a time when Germany was struggling to come to terms with



labor market reforms and welfare state cuts. He said Germans must not rest on past achievements, and said he was "deeply convinced Germany has the strength for change."

In July 2005, Köhler agreed to dissolve parliament and grant struggling then-Chancellor Gerhard Schröder an unusual early election. He declared that Germany faced "giant challenges" and that "our future and the future of our children is at stake."

Merkel won power, but nearly blew a huge poll lead after her talk of deeper reform turned off voters. Köhler also talked less of economic change in later years and was strongly critical of financial markets during the banking and economic crisis describing them as a "monster" that hadn't

In that broadcast, he said that for a country with Germany's dependency on exports, military deployments could be "necessary ... in order to defend our interests, for example free trade routes."

That was taken by many as relating to Germany's unpopular mission in Afghanistan, although his office later said he was referring to anti-piracy patrols off the coast of Somalia.

Many wondered whether that was the real reason for the sometimes thin-skinned Koehler's resignation, with critics speculating that he had simply become fed up with a lack of backing from Merkel — for whom his resignation was an embarrassment.

In foreign policy,

Köhler won praise for trying to draw attention to the needs of Africa. He became the second German president to address Israel's parliament, telling the Knesset: "I bow my head in shame and humility before the victims" of

the Holocaust.

Poland, making it the first foreign destination of both of his two terms and saying he would like the country to become as important a partner for Germany as France. Köhler, the son of ethnic German farm-

ers from Romania, was born on Feb. 22, 1943, in Skierbieszow, in Nazi-occupied Poland. His family fled to Germany after the war first to Leipzig in what became communist East Germany, then to West Germany in 1954. Before rising to the presidency, Köhler had a long record as an efficient behind-the-scenes

official. Starting in the early 1980s, he worked for more than a decade in the Finance Ministry under Chancellor Helmut Kohl, who once called him "a treasure" and relied on him in economic diplomacy.

He helped draft the legal framework for Europe's single currency, the euro, and played a role in negotiating German reunification in 1990.

He later served as president of the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development.

In 2000, Köhler emerged as Schröder's backup choice for the IMF leadership. He won American support after Berlin's first candidate, **Deputy Finance Minister** Caio Koch-Weser, was

rejected by the United States as too lightweight.

U.S. Treasury Secretary John Snow later praised Köhler's tenure, saying that "he transformed the institution in terms of its transparency ... and worked to develop better crisis prevention tools and more effective crisis management."

Merkel, then Germany's opposition leader, brought him back to Germany as her surprise choice for the presidency four years later, securing his election by a parliamentary assembly.

In a letter of condolence to Köhler's wife, Eva Louise, President Steinmeier wrote Saturday that "many people in our country will mourn with you. For in Horst Köhler we have lost a highly esteemed and extremely popular person who achieved great things — for our country and in the world."

"It was above all his approachability, his infectious laughter and his optimism, his belief in the strength of our country and in the energy and creativity of its people that won him so many hearts. But it was also his often clear and by no means always comfortable admonitions and speeches that won him recognition," Steinmeier wrote.

Köhler is survived by his wife, daughter Ulrike and son Jochen.

Moscow court arrests Rusnano top manager Kasenkova on charges of abuse of power

MOSCOW, Feb 1 (Agencies): The Meshchansky District Court of Moscow has arrested Russian state nanotech company Rusnano's top manager Marina Kasenkova on charges of abuse of power, the court told Sputnik on Saturday.

"The court has ruled in favor of the request from the preliminary investigation authorities to impose a preventive measure of detention on Marina Anatolyevna Kasenkova accused of committing a crime under Part 3 of Article 285 of the Criminal Code of Russia (abuse of power)," the court said.

The term of arrest has been set at 1 month and 28 days.

According to the investigation, in order to hide the company's poor economic performance in 2017, three Rusnano employees reclassified financial liabilities. Using distorted data, they provided false information about the supposedly satisfactory financial position of the company, which made it possible to avoid the withdrawal of previously issued state guarantees, as well as raise additional funding - "as a result, the state had to allocate over 43 billion rubles [\$437 million] to the corporation in 2022-2024."

The Russian authorities are currently investigating all instances of illegal activity, including its circumstances, witnesses, and accomplices.

Mooney achieved this feat during the one-off Women's Ashes Test against England at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG).

MELBOURNE, Feb 1 (Agencies): Australian wicketkeeper-batter Beth Mooney made history on Saturday, slamming her maiden Test century and becoming the first-ever women's player from her country to have centuries across all formats.

Mooney achieved this feat during the one-off Women's Ashes Test against England at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG).

In the first innings in reply to 170 scored by England who were put to field first, Australia's Mooney more than half the deficit herself, making 106 in 173 balls, with seven fours. Her runs came at a strike rate of over 61.

In eight Tests, Mooney has made 559 runs in 13 innings at an average of 43.00, with a century and four fifties.

Having played 82 ODIs, Mooney has also scored 2,553 runs at an average of 47.27 at a strike rate of over 85, with three centuries and 18 fifties in 75 innings. Her best score is 133.

In 109 T20Is, Mooney has scored 3,215 runs at an average of 41.21 and a strike rate of over 124, with two centuries and 25 fifties. Her best score is 117*.

She has a total of six centuries in international cricket.

Mooney's ton sees her join an elite company of women's players with all format tons, England's Heather Knight and Tammy Beaumont, and South Africa's Laura Wolvaardt. Overall, she has also become fourth Australian to become an all-format centurion after Shane Watson, Glenn Maxwell and David Warner, as per cricket.

Mooney also joined Annabel Sutherland as the only women on the MCG Test century honour board, with the duo stitching a massive 154 run stand.
