CRPF personnel dies of cardiac arrest in South Kashmir

SRINAGAR, Feb 4 (Agencies): A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel posted with the E/37th Battalion at Nillow in South Kashmir's Kulgam died of cardiac arrest on Tuesday.

A senior police officer said that the CRPF personnel suddenly complained of chest pain and was immediately referred to the nearest healthcare centre.

However, he later succumbed to cardiac arrest. He has been identified as Vishnoo, a resident of Kaniyal district, Gujarat.

Meanwhile, the police have taken cognizance of the incident.

Light rains, Snowfall Expected in J&K Tonight; Weather to Improve After Feb 5: MeT

SRINAGAR, Feb 4 (Agencies): A fresh spell of light to moderate snowfall is expected across higher reaches of Jammu and Kashmir, with light snowfall likely in the plains and South Kashmir, according to weather forecasts.

In Jammu, light rainfall is predicted in the plains, while Chenab Valley is likely to receive light snowfall. The higher reaches of Central and North Kashmir are also expected to witness light snowfall, with the plains seeing a mix of light snowfall and rain.

The weather is expected to improve after tomorrow afternoon and remain dry until the night of February 9. However, another spell of snowfall and light rainfall is likely between February 9 and 10.

As Chillai Kalan, the harshest 40-day winter period, has ended, night temperatures have shown improvement in the Valley. A gradual rise in both minimum and maximum temperatures is expected in the coming days, with no significant drop anticipated.

200 Indians deported from US will land at Punjab's Amritsar airport

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): A US military plane is at present enroute to India, carrying a batch of 200 illegal migrants who are being deported. The plane is scheduled to land at Amritsar around 9 am on Wednesday, sources told the Tribune.

Most of those being deported are from Punjab or neighbouring states. This is first such deportation in Donald Trump's second tenure as US President. He took over on January 20.

The US is using a C-17 Globemaster military plane, which is expected to refuel at Ramstein air base in Germany during its journey before landing at Amritsar.

It is for the first time that the US is using a military plane to deport illegal migrants to India. In the past, all deporta-



tions to India have been on board commercial planes. The C-17 uses jet engines like regular commercial planes; has a toilet on board and seats are configured for movement of US troops. The Indian Air Force uses the same plane.

A US Embassy spokesperson in New Delhi said, "United States is

vigorously enforcing its border, tightening immigration laws, and removing illegal migrants. These actions send a clear message: illegal migration is not worth the risk."

In November 2024, the US has shared a list of 18,000 illegal migrants who need to be deported to India.

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has already made it clear that India does not bat for illegal migration. In January, when Jaishankar visited the US for Trump's swearing-in ceremony, he had said that India supports legal mobility because it believes in a global

Delhi Police book CM Atishi for Model Code of Conduct 'violation'

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): Delhi Police registered an FIR against Chief Minister Atishi, the AAP candidate from Kalkaji, for allegedly violating the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) and obstructing public servants on duty, an official said.

Police said Atishi was with AAP supporters who allegedly obstructed an officer from doing his duty at Fateh Singh Marg. Two AAP members allegedly assaulted a police constable, they said.

"We have registered an FIR against Kalkaji AAP candidate at the Govindpuri Police Station under various sections and further investigation is under process," said the police official.

Kulgam attack disputes centre's normalcy claims in J&K: Dr Farooq



SRINAGAR, Feb 4 (Agencies): National Conference (NC) president Dr Farooq Abdullah today said that attack carried out by unidentified terrorists in Behibagh village in south Kashmir's Kulgam district disputed centre's normalcy claims in Jammu and Kashmir.

He was speaking to reporters on the sidelines of an event held in Jammu.

"Question to those who are beating drums in and outside Parliament that militancy has been wiped out and normalcy has returned

to Jammu and Kashmir," Dr Farooq as per Greater Kashmir said.

On Monday terrorists shot dead a former army soldier and injured his wife and a niece in Behibagh area of Kulgam district.

Dr Farooq said if terror activities are still happening in J&K then government at the centre should come clean on the facts. "The union government day in and day out are claiming that terrorism has ended in J&K. But this is not the reality. The central government should come clean on the situation."

Hundreds detained in Kulgam for questioning as major probe underway into ex-soldier's killing

SRINAGAR, Feb 4 (Agencies): A massive operation has been launched in south Kashmir's Kulgam district following the targeted killing of a former soldier.

The security forces, including the Army, J&K Police, and CRPF, have intensified efforts to track down the attackers, conducting door-to-door searches and questioning scores of locals in the village and adjoining areas.

The attack took place late Monday evening when gunmen fired upon Manzoor Ahmad, a former soldier, in the Behibagh area. He sustained critical injuries and was rushed to a



nearby hospital, where he succumbed to his wounds. His wife and niece were also injured in the attack.

Following the incident, senior police and Army officials rushed to the spot to assess the situation. The area was immediately cordoned off, and reinforcements

were deployed to prevent the attackers from escaping.

In response to the attack, a large-scale search operation was launched in the village and surrounding areas. Security personnel are combing dense orchards, residential

wrote on X: "Endorsement of draft proposal prepared by Assembly secretariat regarding Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the House will be the most explicit and unforgivable ratification of August 5, 2019 changes."

"It will effectively end once and for all any scope for legal challenge to 5 August changes, in the future. While we dreamt of an unambiguous resolution by the new assembly rejecting 5 August 2019, and that becoming a reference point in any future

LIC employees oppose hike in FDI in insurance sector to 100%

JAMMU, Feb 4: LIC employees of Jammu and Kashmir under the banner of Northern Zone Insurance Employees' Association Srinagar Division held massive demonstration outside offices of LIC of India across Jammu Kashmir in the leadership of Comrade Pawan Gupta; Divisional Secretary of the Association against the central Govt.' move to increase FDI in insurance sector from 74% to 100%.

Speaking on the occasion at D.O.Cell Jammu, Com. Pawan Gupta said that this decision is unwarranted and carries with it serious consequences for mobilisation of precious resources for the development of Indian economy and meeting the obligation of the State towards its citizens. LIC employees condemn this decision and will mobilise the public opinion against this move.

The Insurance sector was denationalised with the passage of the IRDA Bill 1999. This Act permitted the Indian capital to operate in the insurance industry in partnership with the foreign companies.

The FDI was restricted to 26 percent; since then, it has been raised to 74%. A large number of private insurance companies with foreign

partners have been operating in both the life and non-life insurance industry. Capital has never been a constraint for these companies to run their businesses; as they are owned by big business houses partnering with top multinational companies.

Perhaps with the exception of one, no insurance company is anywhere near breaching the 74% FDI limit. In fact, the total FDI in insurance is only around 32% of the capital employed.

This being the case, it is surprising as to why the government has taken the step to give total freedom to foreign capital to operate in India.

This decision will also have serious consequences for the Indian companies and the Indian economy if the existing foreign partner decides to pull out to form a separate company.

The AIIEA is of the firm understanding that allowing total freedom and greater access to foreign capital could only retard the orderly growth of the insurance industry with the focus more on profits rather than providing the people and business the much needed security. It will have disastrous impact on the interests of the marginalised sections of the Indian soci-

ety. Moreover, foreign capital can never be a substitute to the domestic savings.

This being the case, handing over the domestic savings to foreign capital makes no economic or social sense. India being a welfare state must necessarily have greater state control over the savings for economic development which benefits all its citizens.

The AIIEA lodges its strong protest against the decision to hike FDI limit in insurance and demands withdrawal of this move.

J&K Congress president slams 'Govt's security claims', calls for introspection

SRINAGAR, Feb 4: Jammu and Kashmir Congress President Tariq Hamid Karra on Tuesday criticized the Centre over its 'claims of improved security in the Union Territory, stating that the recent terror incidents in Jammu and Kashmir expose the reality on the ground'.

Addressing the media here in Srinagar, Karra termed the latest security incidents as "unfortunate".

He asserted that while the government claims normalcy, the situation

on the ground tells a different story.

"The Congress party has repeatedly highlighted that the government's claims about security are contradictory to the actual situation. Not just in Kashmir but also in Jammu, such incidents continue to expose these claims," he said.

Referring to the recent attack in Kulgam on a former soldier he said that these events are a clear indication that the government's narrative of peace in Jammu and Kashmir is misleading. "The government must

introspect and present the true picture of the situation instead of creating a false narrative," Karra stated.

On the functioning of the Jammu and Kashmir administration, he stressed the need for clarity in business rules, arguing that confusion in governance negatively impacts the common people, particularly the poor.

"The biggest casualty of unclear rules is the common man, who is made to run from one office to another without answers. The govern-

ment must streamline governance for the welfare of the people," he added.

Reacting to allegations from political rivals that discussing business rules implies acceptance of the revocation of Article 370, Karra refused to comment, saying, "That is their stand, I have nothing to say on it."

On the broader political landscape, he also addressed concerns raised by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi regarding electoral processes, stating that election outcomes reveal

ground realities only after results are declared. "Each state has a different scenario; Haryana and Maharashtra have shown different trends. The Congress party has formed a committee to take up election-related concerns with the Election Commission," he said.

When asked about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to the United States, Karra remarked, "PM Modi is going as an uninvited guest. Earlier, he was not invited; now, we will see how he is welcomed there."

Sunil Sharma raises concern over rising crime in Jammu with LG

Raman Suri slams critics, hails railway expansion in J&K, Ladakh

JAMMU, Feb 4: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) J&K Executive Member Raman Suri has strongly criticized those who have remained blind to the monumental development projects which are undergoing in Jammu and Kashmir under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Reacting to the successful trial run of the train between Jammu and Srinagar, Suri said, it is now Ladakh's turn to be connected to the rest of the country through rail services.

He pointed out that the Modi government has already allocated funds and initiated surveys for this ambitious project, further proving its commitment to infrastructural development in the region.

He expressed confidence that the BJP-led central government will leave no stone unturned in ensuring that both Jammu & Kashmir, and Ladakh receive world-class railway connectivity.

Taking a dig at the critics, Suri remarked that those who fail to acknowledge these transformative developments are either politically motivated or deliberately ignorant of the rapid progress taking place in the region under PM Modi's leadership.

Suri emphasized that after ensuring Kashmir's railway connectivity, the central government has now taken up the challenge of bringing rail services to Ladakh.

He noted that despite extreme weather conditions, rugged terrains, and logistical challenges, the survey for the Srinagar-Ladakh and Baramulla-Kupwara railway lines is being conducted at a fast pace.

The newly allocated Rs 844 crores in the Union Budget 2025-26 for railway sector in J&K and the overall allocation of Rs 2,52,000 crore to Indian Railways will play a crucial role in completing these projects, ensuring that Ladakh benefits from improved connectivity just like the rest of the country.

The BJP leader further

highlighted the strategic importance of the Srinagar-Ladakh railway line by saying that this railway track will not only facilitate civilian travel but will also serve as a crucial asset to the military, considering Ladakh's sensitive border areas.

He pointed out that road connectivity to Ladakh often gets disrupted due to heavy snowfall and adverse weather conditions, making railway connectivity an essential alternative.

Speaking about the railway expansion in Jammu, Raman Suri welcomed the formation of a new Railway Division in Jammu, which will oversee the development and enhancement of railway services in the region.

He hoped that the appointment of Vivek Kumar as the first Divisional Railway Manager (DRM) of the Jammu Division will further

Under his leadership, Jammu Tawi Railway Station will be upgraded with modern facilities, including a pollution-free greenfield area and a new foot-over bridge. This, Suri said, will significantly enhance the travel experience for passengers.

Raman Suri also dispelled the rumours and asserted that the Vande Bharat Express for Kashmir will originate from Jammu, reinforcing the city's position as a major railway hub.

While the Jammu Tawi railway station will undergo development, the Vande Bharat Express will initially operate between Katra and Srinagar, with direct services between Jammu and Srinagar starting soon.

The Railway Minister, he added, has assured that the timetable for Jammu-Srinagar train will be released shortly, marking another milestone in the government's commitment to improve railway infrastructure in J&K.

FM Nirmala Sitharaman— opened Her Pitara of Bonanza for Middle Class

Finally the long wait of the middle class and the salaried class has come to end on 1st of February 2025, when finance minister unveiled her new budget and gave a bonanza for the salaried class as well as middle class when she announced that the government has decided to exempt middle class from the tax on the yearly income of Rs 12,00,000. In fact in the new tax regime an employee earning up to Rs 12.75 lakh have to pay no income tax because Rs 75,000 is the standard deduction. It is in fact for the time in the history of Independent India that such a big relief has been announced for the middle class including salaried people. It is a great milestone and is historic that a gift of such a huge nature has been announced in 2025 union budget for the salaried people. The net effect of this big relief for the middle income group is that 95% population of the country is freed from pay income tax for this maiden time and this is no ordinary thing or a mean development. Thus it will benefit a great majority of the people of India. FM Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday unveiled a budget bonanza for taxpayers, particularly the middle class, which has been reeling under the double impact of a slowing economy and rising prices. PM Modi had strongly hinted at it on Friday and so did the president Droupadi Murmu. There will be a rebate on annual income up to Rs 12 lakh, compared with Rs 70,000 currently, and higher limits across slabs under the new regime. For the salaried, who also get standard deduction of Rs 75,000 under the new regime, the rebate will mean zero tax liability for those with income up to Rs 12.75 lakh. As a result of the sweeping changes in the tax structure and the exemptions, almost

1 crore of the 3 crore Indians who actually pay taxes will now legally escape the tax net—though they will still have to file IT returns to avail of the rebate. Those who will pay taxes will save amounts ranging from Rs 30,000 to Rs 1.1 lakh a year, depending on their income level. While vast of the middle class will gain, the big beneficiaries are those with taxable income of Rs 15,00,000-Rs 24,00,000, who were earlier in the highest slab of 20% and will now face levies of 15% to 25%. No taxes up to Rs 12 lakh annual income set to boost consumption spending stays the path on fiscal consolidation with fiscal deficit target of 4.4% in FY 26 farm economy in FM's focus too with a slew of measures. Finance minister N. Sitharaman on Feb 1 placed the bets firmly on India's vast consuming salaried and middle class to power the economy, announcing wide-ranging changes in income tax rates and slabs in the 2025-26 union budget in a plucky drive to push growth amid fast gathering global headwinds. Amid signs of moderation in the broader economy, Sitharaman unveiled measures to catalyze a swift recovery by putting more money in people's pockets, and amplifying their purchasing power. This predicted on the assumption that higher disposable income will stimulate demand for goods and services. This in turn could set off a cycle of investment as companies eventually start adding capacities to meet the extra demand. Under the proposed new slabs and rates, anyone with an annual taxable income up to Rs 12 lakh—excluding capital gains income will not have to pay any taxes. This, effectively means that those with annual income up to Rs 12.75 lakh will not have to pay any tax, including a standard deduction benefit of Rs 75,000. FM said, "Slabs and rates are being changed across the board to benefit all tax-payers. The new

tax structure will substantially reduce the taxes of the middle class and leave more money in their hands, boosting household consumption, saving and investment." The finance minister also rejigged slabs and rates. Under the proposed slabs, people earning more than Rs 12 lakh per annum, there will be nil tax for income up to Rs 4 lakh, 5% for income between Rs 4 and 8 lakh, 10% for Rs 8 to Rs 12 lakh, 15% for Rs 12 lakh to Rs 16 lakh, 20% for Rs 16 lakh to Rs 20 lakh, 25% on Rs 20 to Rs 24 lakh and 30% above Rs 24 lakh per annum. FM said, "Democracy, Demography and Demand are the key pillars in our journey towards Viksit Bharat. The middle class provides strength for India's growth. The government under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi has always believed in the admirable energy and ability of the middle class in nation building." FM's Budget speech is being seen as a "big relief" for middle class and salaried population. The announcement that there will be no tax on the annual income up to Rs 12 lakh and coupled with it the standard deduction of Rs 75,000, it is clear that salaried class will be exempt from income tax up to Rs 12.75 lakh annually. This announcement prompted a wave of joy among the middle-class salaried population, and as expected many took to social media to share happiness about the "big relief". In fact the Budget 2025 is a game changer for the middle class. "Slabs and rates are being changed across the board to benefit all tax payers. The new structure will substantially reduce the taxes of the middle class and leave more money in their hands." So under the new tax regime, the tax rate structure has revised. Budget exercise is a politico-economic tool and political economy has much importance for the government and governance

as well as the economic, social and political development of the country. The big bonanza of tax relief to the middle salaried class has won the hearts, minds and sympathy of the central government. The elections are happening in Delhi and in few months there will be assembly elections in Bihar and the governments big relief in income tax to middle class will boost the political fortunes of the BJP in Delhi Assembly elections and it along with the huge allocations for the state of Bihar will finally result in votes in the Bihar assembly elections in favor of NDA and its allies which are going to be held in few months. So FM's middle path will in fact lure Delhi and Bihar voters as it is most and accurate possibility. Delhi votes on 5th February that is Wednesday and Bihar in October or November this year. The Budget has gone the extra mile to woo them. For Delhi—Country's richest city by per capita income and with large middle class straddling government employees, private sector, and businesses—the big tax giveaway is a clear and loud message./signal. The fact is that AAP's core base is low income group and the lower middle class is wavering, the Modi government appears to be hoping to tip them over to their side. So for as Bihar is concerned, BJP and its ally Nitish's JDU political fortunes will be positively affected. To conclude one can say that FM's tax bonanza to middle class/salaried population is the gift of Modi sarkar to the middle class.

Qamarwari-Noorbagh Bridge to be opened for public in March: CE R&B

SRINAGAR, Feb 4: In a major relief for commuters battling congestion in the Qamarwari-Noorbagh area, the much-awaited Qamarwari Bridge is set to be thrown open for public use by March this year, Chief Engineer of Roads and Buildings (R&B) Central Kashmir, Sajad Naqeeb, confirmed on Tuesday.

The bridge, which has been under construction for over 14 years, is now in its final stages, with approximately 95 percent of the work already completed.

"Only about 20 to 25 days of work remain. The delay was primarily due to adverse weather conditions, which forced us to halt construction. Now that the weather has improved, we will complete the remaining work and open it for the public in March," Naqeeb told media.

The bridge, an extension of the historic Cement Bridge, was originally scheduled to open in January. However, sub-zero temperatures in the winter months slowed down construction efforts.

The construction of the Qamarwari-Noorbagh Bridge has been marred by repeated delays, causing significant inconvenience to residents and daily commuters.

Initially sanctioned in 2009, the project was expected to provide an alternative route to decongest the bottlenecked traffic flow between Qamarwari, Noorbagh, and adjacent areas of Srinagar.

However, a combination of funding constraints, contractor issues resulted in the project missing multiple deadlines.

The opening of the Qamarwari-Noorbagh Bridge is expected to significantly ease traffic congestion in one of Srinagar's busiest

corridors. Currently, thousands of vehicles navigate through an overloaded bridge in Qamarwari, often leading to long traffic snarls during peak hours. The new bridge is anticipated to serve as a vital link, reducing travel time and enhancing connectivity between central and northern parts of the city.

Local residents and business owners have expressed both frustration over the prolonged delay and optimism about the bridge's imminent completion. "We have been waiting for this bridge for over a decade. Every year, we were given new deadlines. We hope this time it will finally be completed and functional," said Mohammad Ashraf, a shopkeeper in Qamarwari.

Authorities have assured that all pending works, including finishing touches, road surfacing, and safety measures, will be completed within the stipulated time frame.

"AND WE ARE BACK LIKE A BAD PENNY Thank you everyone who helped! @XCorpIndia #Unuspended #Unhacked #Secured #ItsMe," she wrote on X.

Bhasker said her X account was permanently suspended due to alleged copyright infringements over two posts she shared on Republic Day.

"Two images from two tweets have been marked as 'copyright infringements'. Basis which my X account is locked / disabled, I can't access it and permanent suspension has been approved by your teams," she wrote.

The actor, known for films such as "Nil Battey Sannata", "Tanu Weds Manu"

franchise, and "Veere Di Wedding", had then shared a screenshot of the "email" she received from the team of X on Instagram and criticised the decision as "ridiculous" and "untenable".

The next day, in an Instagram post, Bhasker said the email that was sent "claiming suspension was fake".

"When I clicked those links my account got hacked... This is the fake email ID... Real email from X. And it's super scary because the fake link took me to a proper ditto lookalike site of X with the logo and everything and I even filled out an appeal form that asked for photo. ID!!!"

"Then I got this email which alerted me that the account had been hacked because I never delegated my account or granted access to anyone!!!" she wrote alongside the screenshots of the mails.

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday termed Rahul Gandhi's claim that "China is sitting in our territory" as "false" and said that the words that the latter had attributed to Indian Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi were not spoken by him at any point in time.

Gandhi, on Monday, while participating in a discussion on the President's address in the Budget Session, had said, "Chinese are inside the Indian territory. The Prime Minister had denied it, the Army Chief had contradicted him (the PM). Our Chief of Army Staff said that the Chinese are inside our territory."

Rajnath Singh posted on social media platform X, saying, "Rahul Gandhi in his speech in Parliament on February 3, 2025, made false allegations about the statement of the Army Chief on the situation on the India-China border."

The Army Chief's remarks –



made on January 13 at a press conference – referred only to the disturbance of traditional patrolling by both sides, he said. "He (the Army Chief) also mentioned that these practices have been restored to their traditional pattern as part of the recent disengagement. The government has shared these details in Parliament," the minister said.

"The words attributed to the Army Chief by Rahul Gandhi

were never spoken by him at any time," Rajnath Singh stated, adding that it was a "matter of deep regret that Rahul Gandhi should indulge in irresponsible politics on matters of national interest".

Rajnath then drew on history to put blame on the Congress saying, "If at all there is Indian Territory into which China has come, it is 38,000 sq km in Aksai Chin as a result of the 1962 con-

flict and 5,180 sq km that was illegally ceded by Pakistan to China in 1963."

Rahul Gandhi may consider introspecting about this phase of our history, the Minister added, without mentioning that the Congress was in power when the 1962 war with China happened.

Earlier on January 13, the Indian Army Chief, on being asked about the present situation, had said, "Since April 2020, both sides have doctored the terrain on their sides, have added troops, stocked up (arms and weapons) and added troop numbers. So in these terms, there is a degree of stand-off."

He had ruled out a reduction in troop-levels along the Line of Actual Control (LAC).

"Troop deployment directly depends on the trust factor (between the two armies) and the capabilities have been created on other side. The current capabilities across entail that we will need to maintain the troop levels."

Bottom line, India-EU relationship more important than even before: Jaishankar



NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on Tuesday said in a world that promises to be so volatile and uncertain, a stronger India-EU relationship can be an "important stabilising factor", as he asserted that the relationship between the two sides is more important than even before.

In his address at the inaugural session of the IIC-Bruegel annual seminar here, the EAM, without naming any country, also said that "in our own continent, international law has been disregarded with significant consequences".

"Even on a question like democracy and military rule, different standards have been applied to our neighbours in the east and our neighbour in the west," he said.

The second IIC-Bruegel annual seminar is being held at the India International Centre (IIC) from February 4-5.

"The world is currently witnessing two major conflicts, these are often presented as matters of principle. We are told that the very future of the world order is at stake. Yet, the record

shows how selectively and unevenly these principles have been applied," Jaishankar said.

In his address, he also touched upon the aspects of trade and digital technology, climate action, and their interplay with geopolitics.

He said today there is much talk about the world order unravelling. "The fact is that the consensus which underpinned it, has done so well before."

"There are North-South contradictions as much there is an East-West divide. In fact, even these broad characterisations are no longer tenable in an era of sharper nationalism," the external affairs minister said.

Both economic and political logic of an earlier era needs refreshing, Jaishankar said.

"Much of the architecture will undoubtedly continue because we are too deeply invested into it, but some of it, perhaps aspects that are critical and sensitive, will be more nationally driven," he added.

The EAM in his address asserted, "We are truly entering a time of multipolarity and rebalancing, the sooner we come to

terms with this reality, the better for all of us." He underlined that these are some of the questions that India and the European Union confront today.

"It is important that as we reflect on appropriate policies and responses, there is a quest for convergence as well as an honesty in conversations. We clearly have common interests and shared values, there may be some differences on prioritise and specifics, but what binds us is a sentiment much stronger," the Union minister said.

"At the end of the day, we are political democracies, pluralistic societies and market economies," he said.

The minister said as the two sides take stock of the changes underway, it is likely that "our meeting points will increase".

"Moreover, in a world that promises to be so volatile, so uncertain, a stronger India-EU relationship can be an important stabilising factor," Jaishankar said.

India is certainly cognisant of the greater strategic awakening of Europe in the last few years, that too can serve as a "driver of deeper engagement", he added.

"We already see that happening, for example, in defence and security and technology cooperation. The bottom line is that our India-EU relationship is more important than even before," the EAM said.

India has robust system to tackle pandemics: Health Minister

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): India has a very robust system to deal with future pandemics and public health emergencies, Union Health and Family Welfare Minister JP Nadda asserted in the Rajya Sabha on Tuesday.

Replying to supplementary questions in the Rajya Sabha, Nadda highlighted the steps taken by the government in the last 10 years to strengthen India's health system, especially in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic.

India has proven under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi that we have got a very robust system to address the issue of any pandemic that comes, the minister said.

Listing out India's capabilities, Nadda said the country has the

National Center for Disease Control (NCDC), which oversees and keeps surveillance.

"It is the apex body which takes care of the diseases and the pathogens, and the other emerging virus mutation, which takes place," he added.

Under the NCDC, he said the country has an integrated disease surveillance programme, a platform for disease surveillance.

"We have got the RRT, which is called the rapid response team, which is there in the states. And we have got very decentralised multidisciplinary teams for health control and containment.

And also, we have got an integrated health information platform where advanced data with analysis and analytical data and data modelling tools are there,"

the minister said. "We give real-time reporting for all the emerging pandemics or there are chances of having any pandemic."

The Indian Council for Medical Research (ICMR) has 150 labs, he said, adding that there are viral research diagnostic laboratories. India has a world-class National Institute of Virology in Pune.

"So, we have got a very robust system wherever any pandemic or any chances of the pandemic are there, these laboratories confirm what type of mutation is taking place, what change, what type of medicine or what type of treatment is to be given," Nadda said.

The minister further said the Prime Minister has taken one step forward and launched the National One Health



Mission. "We get diseases because of pesticides. We get diseases because of the environment.

We get diseases because of the nature of the plants, which is changing.

We get diseases because of the medicines that are being given to the animals. What is the impact altogether? So for that, we have also started (a programme), which is

known as the National One Health Mission," the minister said.

In a written reply, Nadda said the prevention of and preparedness against the pandemic is a shared global responsibility.

In order to better prepare against future pandemics/public health emergencies in the country, the ministry provides requisite support to states/UTs to enhance their capabilities.

Gujarat Govt forms committee to assess need for UCC, draft bill

GANDHINAGAR, Feb 4 (Agencies): The BJP Government in Gujarat on Tuesday formed a committee headed by a retired Supreme Court judge to assess the need for the Uniform Civil Code in the state and also draft a bill for the same.

The five-member committee, to be headed by former SC judge Ranjana Desai, will submit its report within 45 days, following which a decision about implementation of the UCC will be taken, Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel said addressing a press conference here.

The committee will also meet religious leaders, including from the Muslim community, to prepare the report, a senior Government official said.

"To assess the need for a Uniform Civil Code (UCC) and to prepare a draft bill for the same, we have decided to form a committee under the former judge of the Supreme Court," CM Patel said.

Other members of the committee include retired IAS officer CL Meena, advocate RC Kodekar, former vice chancellor of Veer Narmad South Gujarat University Dakshesh Thakar and social worker Gita Shroff.

Notably, the BJP-ruled Uttarakhand has already implemented the UCC. CM Patel said the Gujarat govern-



ment is committed to fulfil Prime Minister Narendra Modi's resolve of implementing the UCC across the country.

The five-member committee will examine various aspects related to the UCC and take views of the people from different walks of life to prepare its report, he said.

An "appropriate decision" will be taken after going through the report, the CM said.

Minister of State for Home Harsh Sanghavi said that the UCC, if implemented, will protect the rights of tribals.

"The UCC implemented by the Uttarakhand government presented a model before the country because it protects the customs and traditions of tribals. Our (Union) Home Minister Amit Shah has also clarified in Jharkhand that UCC will protect the traditions followed by tribals," Sanghavi said.

He said the committee will also meet religious leaders, including Muslim leaders, to prepare the report.

Private school in Karnataka receives hoax bomb threat through email

Upon translation into English, the email was found to discuss Tamil Nadu politics

KALABURAGI, Feb 4 (Agencies): A private school in the city received a bomb threat via email on Tuesday, following which the students were evacuated, police said.

An intensive search was carried out on the school premises, and it turned out to be a hoax, they said.

"A private educational institution in Kalaburagi

city received a threat email. As soon as the institute informed us, local police arrived at the scene and evacuated the students.

We immediately deployed an anti-sabotage team along with a bomb detection and disposal squad to thoroughly inspect and sanitise the area," Kalaburagi police commissioner Sharanappa S D said.



After a comprehensive screening, it was confirmed to be a hoax bomb threat email, he added. A case has been regis-

tered and the matter will be investigated, he said.

Sharing further details about the email, Sharanappa said the subject mentioned an RDX bomb blast in the school, but the entire content was in Tamil.

He said that upon translation into English, the email was found to discuss Tamil Nadu politics.

Akhilesh Yadav demands all party meeting on Maha Kumbh stampede

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): Samajwadi Party National President and Kannauj MP Akhilesh Yadav on Tuesday slammed the Central government over the stampede in Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj and demanded an all party meeting to ascertain the "root cause" of the incident.

Participating in the debate on the Motion of Thanks to the President's address in the Lok Sabha, Yadav said "When the government is continuously giving the budget figures, it also should give the figures of those who died in Maha Kumbh.

I demand an all-party meeting should

be called to give clarification about the arrangements for Maha Kumbh".

According to the figures provided by the Uttar Pradesh government, 30 people were killed and 60 injured in the stampede that occurred during the Mauni Amavasya at the Mahakumbh on January 29.

The SP National President also demanded strict action against those who are behind the stampede.

He said the figures for the deaths in Maha Kumbh accident, treatment of injured, availability of medicines, doctors, food, water, transport should be presented in



the Parliament.

For the Maha Kumbh tragedy, there should be strict punitive action against those responsible and those who have hidden the truth should be punished.

The Kannauj MP added that "The responsibility of Maha Kumbh disaster management and an AI-based lost and found centre should be given to the Army."

He questioned why provisions were not made to prevent such an incident when the government was prepared to host over 100 crore people in the Maha Kumbh festival.

On the President's address, Akhilesh said

"There was nothing new in the address. Nothing of significance was spoken during the address, she didn't raise any important issues during her speech."

Earlier, Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi gave an adjournment notice in the Lok Sabha over the issue of the Maha Kumbh stampede in Prayagraj.

"I rise to discuss the tragic incident that occurred during the Maha Kumbh at Prayagraj, where a horrific stampede resulted in the loss of numerous lives and left many others injured," Gogoi said.

Israel prepares for next round of ceasefire negotiations with Hamas

TEL AVIV, Feb 4 (Agencies): Following Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's discussions in Washington, Israel will dispatch a working-level delegation to Qatar at the end of the week to address technical aspects of the second phase of a ceasefire with Hamas, the Prime Minister's office said on Tuesday morning.

After returning from the US, Netanyahu will convene Israel's political-security cabinet to review the country's stance on the second phase of the deal, shaping future negotiations. Under the terms of the ceasefire that began on January 19, phase two talks were scheduled to begin on Monday. However, Netanyahu delayed the process until after



his meeting with US National Security Advisor Mike Waltz and US President Donald Trump's special envoy to the Middle East, Steve Witkoff. After returning from the US, Netanyahu will convene Israel's political-security cabinet

to review the country's stance on the second phase of the deal, shaping future negotiations.

The ongoing first phase of the ceasefire is supposed to see a total of 33 Israeli hostages freed over six weeks in exchange for

hundreds of Palestinian terrorists imprisoned in Israel. The exact number will depend on how many are alive. So far, 18 hostages -- 13 Israelis and five Thais -- have been released.

The fate of the remaining 65 hostages will be determined by negotiations to begin on the 16th day of the ceasefire. Critics say the phased approach condemns hostages not freed in the beginning to open-ended captivity and undermines Israel's war gains.

At least 1,200 people were killed, and 252 Israelis and foreigners were taken hostage in Hamas's attacks on Israeli communities near the Gaza border on October 7. Of the 79 remaining hostages, 35 have been declared dead.

China counters Trump, imposes 15% tariffs on coal, LNG



BEIJING, Feb 4 (Agencies): China's Ministry of Commerce announced Tuesday it was implementing counter tariffs against the US on multiple products, while announcing other trade-related measures, including an investigation into Google.

The government said it would implement 15

per cent tariff on coal and liquified natural gas products, as well as a 10 per cent tariff on crude oil, agricultural machinery, large-displacement cars.

"The US's unilateral tariff increase seriously violates the rules of the World Trade Organization," the statement said. "It is not only unhelpful in solving its own problems, but also

damages normal economic and trade cooperation between China and the US."

The 10 per cent tariff that President Donald Trump ordered on China was set to go into effect Tuesday, though Trump planned to talk with Chinese President Xi Jinping in the next few days.

China's State Administration for Market Regulation on Tuesday said it is investigating Google on suspicion of violating antitrust laws. While the announcement did not specifically mention any tariffs, the announcement came just minutes after Trump's 10% tariffs were to take effect.

Sri Lanka must unite to achieve economic freedom: Prez Dissanayake

COLOMBO, Feb 4 (Agencies): President Anura Kumara Dis-sanayake on Tuesday said that Sri Lanka must work in unison to achieve economic freedom rather than yield to vulnerabilities within the global economic system.

Addressing the 77th Independence Day celebrations of the island nation, Dissanayake said, "Collectively, we must persist in our struggle for freedom on behalf of this motherland."

"To secure our economic freedom, rather than succumbing to weakness in the global economic system and being overwhelmed by its every fluctuation, we must unite in our efforts for this motherland," said the 56-year-old president.

In keeping with his government's policy of minimizing state expenditures as the island nation struggles to emerge from the 2022 economic crisis, this year's celebrations saw a reduction in the usual pomp and pageantry.



Only 1,800 military personnel were deployed in the parade, a reduction of over 1,500 personnel from last year. From last year's 19 aircraft, this morning's celebrations featured only three aircraft.

Dissanayake, who was elected president in a narrow win in September's presidential election, created history for his National People's Power (NPP) party in the parliamentary election held in November last year.

His party won two-thirds of control in the 225-member assembly and more significantly, overwhelming support in the Tamil regions.

The Tamils had eschewed support for

the main Sinhala community political parties in Sri Lanka's political history.

This was the first time that a government had won two-thirds control or over 150 seats in a parliamentary election held since 1989.

Dissanayake inherited an economy battered by the 2022 crisis. He has completed the long-drawn-out-debt restructuring of the island's external debt -- a process all but completed by his predecessor Ranil Wickremesinghe before last year's presidential election.

The island nation, in April 2022, declared its first-ever sovereign default since gaining independence from Britain in 1948.

US, Philippine fighter aircraft jointly patrol disputed shoal region guarded by China

MANILA, Feb 4 (Agencies): U.S. and Philippine fighter aircraft staged a joint patrol and training Tuesday over a disputed South China Sea shoal where Chinese fighter jets fired flares last year to drive away a Philippine aircraft, Philippine officials said.

The joint patrol and air-intercept drills over the hotly disputed Scarborough Shoal off the northwestern Philippines were the first by the longtime treaty allies since U.S. President Donald Trump took office again.

Trump's "America First" foreign policy thrust has sparked concerns among Washington's allies in Asia about the scale and depth of U.S. commitment to the region in his new term. His predecessor, Joe Biden, had moved to strengthen an arc of security alliances in the region to counter China's increasingly assertive actions.

Two U.S. Air Force B-1 bomber aircraft and three Philippine Air Force FA-50 fighter jets joined the brief patrol and training, which involved practicing how to intercept a hostile aircraft, Philippine air force spokesperson Maria Consuelo Castillo said in a news briefing.

It was not immediately known if the joint patrol encountered any challenge from Chinese forces guarding the Scarborough Shoal.

"The exercises focused on



enhancing operational coordination, improving air domain awareness and reinforcing agile combat employment capabilities between the two air forces," the Philippine Air Force said.

In August last year, two Chinese air force aircraft flew close then fired flares in the path of a Philippine air force plane on routine patrol over the Scarborough Shoal in actions that were strongly condemned and protested by the Philippine government, military officials said.

All those aboard the Philippine air force NC-212i turbo-prop transport plane were unharmed, the Philippine military said.

The Southern Theater Command of the Chinese People's Liberation Army said then that a Philippine air force aircraft "illegally" entered the airspace above the shoal and disrupted

training activities by Chinese forces. It warned the Philippines to "stop its infringement, provocation, distortion and hyping-up."

The Philippine military chief, Gen. Romeo Brawner, said at the time that the incident "posed a threat to Philippine air force aircraft and its crew, interfered with lawful flight operations in airspace within Philippine sovereignty and jurisdiction and contravened international law and regulations governing safety of aviation."

China and the Philippines have had increasingly alarming faceoffs in the shoal, which is called Bajo de Masinloc by the Philippines and Huangyan Island by China.

"We are always prepared for any contingency, it's part of the training," Castillo said when

asked if the allied forces had prepared to address any challenge by Chinese aircraft.

"It already happened before and, as I have said, whatever the coercive, aggressive actions of any foreign party, the Philippine air force will not be deterred to perform its mandate," Castillo said.

The U.S. military has reported encountering such dangerous maneuvers by Chinese air force planes in the past over the disputed waters, where it has deployed fighter jets and navy ships to promote freedom of navigation and overflight.

China has bristled at U.S. military deployments in the disputed region, saying these have endangered regional security.

Aside from China and the Philippines, Brunei, Malaysia, Vietnam and Taiwan have overlapping territorial claims in the busy sea passage, a key global trade and security route, but hostilities have particularly flared in the past two years between Chinese and Philippine coast guard and navy forces in the Scarborough Shoal and another fiercely contested atoll, the Second Thomas Shoal.

Washington has repeatedly warned that it's obligated to defend the Philippines, its oldest treaty ally in Asia, if Philippine forces, ships and aircraft come under an armed attack, including in the South China Sea.

Pak to send registered Afghan refugees back to their country

ISLAMABAD, Feb 4 (Agencies): The Pakistan Government has devised a plan to move registered Afghan refugees out of Islamabad and Rawalpindi and gradually repatriate them back to their country.

Authorities have also been directed to implement the plan without making any public announcement, Dawn newspaper reported quoting sources.

It reported that the plan was finalised in a series of meetings presided by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif last week.

One of the meetings was also attended by Chief of Army Staff Gen Syed Asim Munir, a source in the prime minister's office confirmed.

Under phase I of the relocation plan, Afghan nationals having the Afghan Citizens Card (ACC) will be "immediately" moved out of Islamabad and Rawalpindi.

They will then be sent back to Afghanistan alongside illegal and undocumented refu-

gees.

ACC is an identification document issued to registered Afghan nationals by Nadra.

According to the UN's International Organisation for Migration (IOM), ACC gives temporary legal status to Afghans during their stay in Pakistan.

However, the federal government makes the decision on the duration for which the ACC would remain valid.

Afghan nationals who have a Proof of Registration Card (PoR), which allows them to stay anywhere in Pakistan legally, will be repatriated in the second phase of the plan.

They would be "moved out" of Islamabad and Rawalpindi, but wouldn't be deported immediately, sources said, adding that the cabinet had allowed POR-holding Afghans to remain in the country till June.

The total number of Afghans living in Pakistan with PoR and ACC is estimated to be 1.3 million and 700,000, respectively.



Meanwhile, Afghans awaiting resettlement in third countries will be moved out of Islamabad and Rawalpindi by March 31.

According to sources, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will coordinate with embassies and other global organisations to expedite the resettlement process.

Any Afghans who couldn't be resettled in a third country will also be sent back to Afghanistan.

According to Shawn VanDiver, the founder of #AfghanEvac, a leading coalition of resettlement and veterans groups, 10,000 to 15,000 are in Pakistan waiting for visas or resettlement in the US.

It is unclear what number of these Afghans live in Islamabad and Rawalpindi. However, the decision to move them out of the twin cities is expected to create a host of logistical challenges for the refugees, many of whom have to visit foreign missions and offices of global humanitarian organisations in Islamabad.

Many of the Afghan nationals awaiting resettlement to a third country are also enrolled in language centres in the federal capital.

The Ministry of Interior will lead the relocation and deportation plans, and intelligence agencies, IB and ISI, will monitor their implemen-

tation.

Pakistan started a nationwide crackdown in 2023 to deport millions of Afghans, which the government said were living illegally in the country. According to IOM, 805,991 Afghans have returned to their country since September 15, 2023.

Human rights activists and civil society members have criticised the forced repatriation and filed a petition in the Supreme Court.

The petition was last heard by a seven-judge bench headed by Justice Amin-ud-din Khan on January 7. During the hearing, the federal government assured the court that all registered Afghan refugees, including those having PoRs or ACC, would be provided full legal protection and not be apprehended or deported.

However, in a report last month, IOM said hundreds of Afghan nationals were arrested and detained in Islamabad in the last two weeks of December, according to Dawn.

Japanese man who threw pipe bomb at ex-PM Kishida tells court he didn't intend to kill



TOKYO, Feb 4 (Agencies): A man who threw a homemade pipe bomb at former Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida at a 2023 campaign event denied that he intended to kill the politician as his trial began Tuesday at a court in western Japan.

Ryuji Kimura, 25, is charged with attempted murder for the April 15, 2023 attack on Kishida at a small fishing port in the city of Wakayama, as well as four other charges including violations of laws controlling explosives and deadly weapons.

The then-prime minis-

ter was unhurt, but two people sustained minor injuries. Kimura was arrested on the spot.

At Tuesday's trial at the Wakayama District Court, Kimura pleaded not guilty to attempted murder, saying he didn't intend to kill Kishida, according to Japan's NHK public television and other media. They said Kimura admitted to making the bombs and other charges.

A ruling is expected later this month.

The attack on Kishida came about a year after the assassination of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe during

a campaign speech in Nara, another city in western Japan. That attack shocked the nation and prompted greater protection for dignitaries.

Gun-related crime is rare in Japan because of strict gun control laws, but there has been a series of high-profile knife attacks in recent years on subways and elsewhere, and there is growing concern about homemade guns and explosives.

Prosecutors said the bomb Kimura threw at Kishida was one of two he brought to the campaign event.

Social media postings later suggested Kimura had grievances about Japan's election system.

Authorities found parts of the pipe bomb stuck in a container 60 meters (65 yards) away from the venue. Prosecutors say that it was potentially lethal.

No new grave dug Post-Article 370 abrogation in J&K due to violence: Altaf Thakur slams NC MP Aga Ruhullah

SRINAGAR, Feb 4: Senior BJP leader and Jammu & Kashmir spokesperson Altaf Thakur launched a scathing attack on National Conference (NC) Member of Parliament Aga Syed Ruhullah for his recent remarks, where Ruhullah claimed that the abrogation of Article 370 has "choked Jammu & Kashmir's economy" and that Muslims across India are facing increasing threats.

Countering these claims, Thakur stated emphatically, "Not a single new grave was dug due to violence after the abrogation of special status." He highlighted that the move to revoke Article 370 in August 2019 has ushered in an era of unprecedented peace and stability in Jammu and Kashmir, with a significant decline in incidents of violence



and militancy-related activities.

"Today, peace prevails in every corner of Jammu and Kashmir. The atmosphere of fear and unrest that existed for decades has been replaced by hope, stability, and security," Thakur said. He pointed out that the region has witnessed record voter turnout in both Lok Sabha and parliamentary elections since the abrogation, reflecting the people's growing faith in democratic processes and governance.

Refuting Ruhullah's allegations about threats to Muslims in India, Thakur asserted that the Narendra Modi-led

government is committed to the principle of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas", ensuring inclusive development for all citizens, irrespective of caste, color, or creed. "There is no threat to any community in India. The government's focus is on inclusive growth, economic development, and ensuring equal opportunities for everyone," he added.

Hitting back at Ruhullah's demand for the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's pre-1953 position, Thakur criticized it as "an outdated and separatist agenda" that has no place in today's progressive and unified India. "Such demands only serve to mislead the people and align with separatist narratives that the people of Jammu and Kashmir have rejected. The focus now is on peace, development, and integration with the rest of the country," Thakur stated.

Artisans, weavers raise concerns over JKTPO's stall allotment, high fees in Trade Fair

JAMMU, Feb 4: The Jammu and Kashmir Trade Promotion Organization (JKTPO) is facing growing criticism from local weavers and artisans regarding the stall allotment process for various exhibitions, particularly the upcoming Delhi Trade Fair.

The organization has been accused of arbitrarily allotting stalls in a way that overlooks deserving artisans from Jammu province, raising concerns about fairness and transparency. Local weavers and artisans are especially frustrated with the high stall rental fees imposed by JKTPO.

Many argued that the charges are prohibitively expensive and unsustainable for small-scale artisans, who may be forced to skip the opportunity to exhibit their products at



prominent events like the Delhi Trade Fair.

They are urging the authorities to review the fee hike and consider returning to last year's rental rates. If the rates remain unchanged, many believe the growth and promotion of Jammu's handloom and handicraft sector will be hindered.

In contrast, other states that organize exhibitions in New Delhi and other parts of the country, as well as central government departments like Handloom and Handicrafts, offer much lower stall rental fees. This disparity has added to the growing frustration

among Jammu weavers and artisans, who are demanding a similar approach to stall allotment at affordable rates.

Another critical issue raised by the community is the lack of clear criteria for the allocation of stalls.

It has been reported that the quota of stalls allocated by the central government to Jammu and Kashmir often gets diverted to the Kashmir Directorate of Handloom/Handicrafts, leaving the Jammu Directorate with insufficient stalls to meet the demand from Jammu's weavers and artisans. As a result, many weavers are unable to show-

case their products at important exhibitions. Local stakeholders have called on the government to develop a fair and transparent allocation system that ensures both Jammu and Kashmir provinces receive their equitable share of stalls.

Furthermore, there is a growing need for a dedicated space or art and craft market for Jammu weavers and artisans. It has been proposed that such a market be created along the National Highway, which is frequented by tourists and pilgrims.

This would provide weavers with a permanent place to showcase their products. A few years ago, the Government of India had proposed the construction of two Urban Hatts, one in Jammu and one in Kashmir, with allocated funds for the project. However, these funds have not yet been uti-

lized.

In addition to these issues, local weavers and artisans have also been neglected when it comes to receiving sponsorships for important craft events such as the Surajkund Craft Mela (Haryana), Toshali Craft Mela (Odisha), Delhi Haat Master Creations, and Agra Mohotsav Mela. Due to the negligence of the Department of Handloom/Handicrafts, many Jammu artisans have been unable to participate in these high-profile events, further limiting their exposure and opportunities for growth.

Local artisans and weavers are urging the government and concerned authorities to take immediate action, ensuring fair treatment, financial support, and equal opportunities for Jammu's craft community.

Hajj Applications on the Decline, Not Only in Kashmir but Across the Country: Executive

starting shortly a month after the conclusion of Hajj 2024, only 4,150 applications were received, and many of the applicants have since withdrawn, reducing the final number of confirmed pilgrims to 3,622, as per HC.

"This year, we have seen a sharp decline in applications for the Hajj pilgrimage, not just in Jammu and Kashmir but nationwide," said the Executive Officer of the J&K Hajj Committee. "A decade ago, we used to receive between 3 to 3.5 lakh applications, but now, the total has dropped to just 1.5 lakh, leading to an under-fulfillment of our Hajj quota."

Several factors contribute to this reduced interest. "Many people are increasingly inclined towards performing Umrah, with around 20,000 to 30,000 pilgrims opting for it annually instead of Hajj," the Executive Officer explained.

The rising cost of Hajj, driven by inflation, has also made the pilgrimage more financially burdensome. Furthermore, extreme summer temperatures in Saudi Arabia during the Hajj season have become a significant factor as well.

In response, the Hajj Committee of India has introduced various measures to ensure the safety and preparedness of pilgrims.

"We have advised the pilgrims to focus on both physical and mental preparedness. It is essential for them to engage in daily exercises, such as long-distance walking of up to six kilometers, to be ready for the challenges of the pilgrimage," advised the Executive Officer.

The first group of pilgrims is scheduled to depart on April 29, 2025, marking the beginning of the the sacred journey this year.

Women ignored under NC rule in J&K: Rajni Sethi

JAMMU, Feb 4: The statement of National Conference (NC) President regarding the empowerment of women in society appears to be more of a political stunt rather than a genuine commitment to women's rights, stated Rajni Sethi.

Rajni Sethi, spokesperson, J&K BJP was accompanied by Dr. Pardeep Mahotra, Media Incharge, J&K BJP, while she addressed a press conference at party headquarters, Trikuta Nagar, Jammu.

"If the NC government truly believed in women's empowerment, why did they not ensure equal rights for women in Jammu and Kashmir when they were in power in the past?", said Rajni Sethi.

For decades, women in J&K were deprived of fundamental rights due to discriminatory laws under Article 370 and Article 35A. A J&K woman who married an outsider was denied the right to inherit property from her parents,

whereas men faced no such restriction. Furthermore, women from marginalized communities like the Valmiki Samaj, West Pakistani refugees, and Gorkhas were denied voting rights and government jobs. If NC truly stood for women's rights, why did they never address these injustices?

Rajni Sethi said that it was only after the abrogation of Article 370 and 35A by the Modi government that women of all communities in J&K received equal rights. Now, whether a woman marries within J&K or outside, she retains her inheritance rights. Women are also participating in local governance through 33% reservation in BDC and DDC elections, and a historic bill has been passed in Parliament ensuring 33% reservation for women in assembly and parliamentary elections. Additionally, the BJP ensured 33% reservation for women in its organizational structure up to the state level. In contrast, the NC has failed to provide simi-

lar representation to women within its own party.

NC President Farooq Abdullah's statement on women's rights seems hollow when we look at the past injustices against Kashmiri women under his government. One critical question that remains unanswered is: Did the NC government take any concrete steps to deliver justice to Kashmiri Pandit women who were subjected to violence, rape, and displacement during the 1990s insurgency? Did they form any committee or appeal to displaced Kashmiri Pandit women to return and live safely in their homeland? The answer is no. Instead of addressing these historical wrongs, NC leaders have often engaged in mere rhetoric, while real reforms and justice for women in J&K have been achieved only under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Rajni Sethi further added that Farooq Abdullah's sympathy for women appears selective and politically motivated. If he is truly committed to women's empowerment, he should begin by ensuring equal representation for women in his own party and acknowledge the contributions of the current government in securing equal rights for all women in J&K.

Balvinder Singh meets Sakina Itoo, calls for urgent healthcare reforms

JAMMU, Feb 4: Prominent RTI and social activist Balvinder Singh met with Minister for Health & Medical Education, Sakina Masood Itoo, to discuss key healthcare challenges and propose critical reforms aimed at improving patient care management.

During the meeting, Singh presented several recommendations/suggestions, including: Ensuring Nutritious Diets for Patients: Introducing strict conditions in the new tender process to guarantee patients receive nutritious meals, including eggs and milk. Enhancing Transparency in Diet Distribution: Implementing stringent monitoring to ensure fair distribution of meals. Incentivizing Rural Postings for Doctors: Doubling the Housing Rent Allowance (HRA) for doctors serving in peripheral areas to make rural postings



more attractive. Establishing an online, uniform, and transparent transfer system ensuring that doctors who complete rural postings are automatically transferred to urban areas and vice versa—free from bureaucratic and political interference. Mandatory Rural Service for Doctors: Introducing a five-year compulsory service bond for doctors seeking admission to post graduate and super-specialty courses in government Medical colleges, with a penalty clause of 50 lakh for violations. Singh emphasized that since taxpayer money is used

while rural areas face severe doctor shortages. As a result, patients in remote regions compelled to travel over 50 km for treatment. Singh criticized the government's unnecessary expenditure of lakhs of rupees on UHCs with two to three Medical Officers and 5-10 staff members, despite their limited utility.

"Singh also updated the Minister regarding his petition pending in the Hon'ble High Court of J&K concerning the shortage of doctors. He filed this petition after obtaining information under RTI in 2018, which revealed a shortage of 50 to 55 Medical Officers (MOs) and 35% shortages of Non-Gazetted and Class IV employees in the Jammu region.

Additionally, Singh raised serious concerns over the exorbitant pricing of medicines at AMRIT Pharmacies within state-run hospitals, citing RTI data.

He also flagged irregularities in procurement via GeM (Government e-Marketplace), exposing a nexus between suppliers and buyers, who allegedly manipulated the process to purchase items at rates higher than prevailing market prices. Singh said his revelations were substantiated by Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) who on the basis of my Press Conference regarding the scam in GeM procurement, constituted a team under AIG (Policy) ACB who after verifying the facts issued an Alert Note vide No: ACB-E-218491 dated September 19, 2022.

Minister Sakina Masood Itoo assured the RTI Activist that his recommendations / suggestions would be thoroughly examined, and any measures beneficial for strengthening healthcare delivery and management would be seriously considered for implementation.

From selling water bottles at Attari-Wagah border to topping Hockey India League charts, a peep into Jugraj's inspiring journey

Born in Attari, Punjab, Jugraj's journey has been one of perseverance and grit.

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): In an inspiring turn of events, Indian men's hockey team player Jugraj Singh, who once sold Indian flags and water bottles at the Attari-Wagah border to support his family, emerged as the top scorer in the recently concluded Men's Hockey India League (HIL) 2024-25, while playing for Shraichi Rarh Bengal Tigers, the newly crowned champions of the elite tournament.

Born in Attari, Punjab, Jugraj's journey has been one of perseverance and grit.

When his father, who served as a porter in the Indian Army, fell ill, Jugraj took on the responsibility of earning for his family at a young age. Recalling those challenging days, Jugraj said as quoted by an HIL press release, "I never once questioned why I was doing it. At that time, my family was my top priority, and I knew that my hard work was the only way to support them and ensure we had food on the table."

"Selling water bottles and flags was my way of supporting my family when we had no other income. I believed that hard work, in whatever form, would pave the way for my future, and it did," he added.

Despite these early challenges, Jugraj's passion for hockey, inspired by his elder brother, never wavered as he began playing hockey at the age of seven. "My brother played hockey in our village, but when our father's health deteriorated, he gave up the game to take on our father's job. However, he



encouraged me to never stop playing and pushed me to excel in the sport. He deserves all the credit for where I am today."

Jugraj's perseverance culminated in an outstanding performance during his first-ever HIL season, where he netted 12 goals and played a pivotal role in his team's triumph. His memorable hat-trick in the final against Hyderabad Toofans was the icing on the cake.

Reflecting on the moment, Jugraj said, "Scoring a hat-trick in a final is something every player dreams of. I didn't plan it, but once I scored two goals, I felt in my zone and went for the third. Winning the top-scorer award in my maiden HIL season is a huge personal milestone, which I will cherish for a lifetime."

28-year-old defender Jugraj made full use of the HIL as a platform to showcase his talent. "I knew the HIL was a big opportunity for me to show what I'm capable of. I wanted to prove

that I could be a reliable goal-scorer and penalty corner converter not just for Shraichi Rarh Bengal Tigers but also for the Indian team. This tournament has given me the perfect stage to demonstrate my skills."

Jugraj attributes his success in Hero HIL to his meticulous preparation and dedication to self-improvement. "I always focused on reading the opposition goalkeepers before each match, which helped me convert penalty corners. I have made it a point to learn from every tournament, every game, and every player, whether senior or junior. I constantly work on improving myself, and will continue to do so till the day I'm playing hockey."

As he looks forward to upcoming international tournaments, Jugraj is keen to carry his form into the upcoming FIH Pro League in Bhubaneswar. "The HIL has given me a massive confidence boost. I am in good form, and if given the opportu-

nity, I will carry this momentum into the FIH Pro League and give my absolute best for the Indian team. It's a big tournament, and I want to keep pushing my limits."

Jugraj's journey from the Attari-Wagah border to becoming one of India's top hockey talents is a powerful testament to the importance of resilience and perseverance. "I have faced my share of obstacles, but I have always believed that hard work can overcome anything. I will continue to work hard as long as I have the strength to play for my India, because this country has given me everything."

He also expressed gratitude to his Shraichi Rarh Bengal Tigers Captain, Rupinder Pal Singh, for trusting him with crucial penalty corners in the Hero HIL, saying, "Rupinder's faith in me allowed me to prove my worth on the field. He guided me throughout the tournament, and I owe a lot of my success to his mentorship."

Looking ahead, Jugraj has set ambitious goals for his future in hockey. His eyes are firmly fixed on achieving success at the World Cup, the Asian Games, and the next Olympics, where he hopes to bring glory to India. That is my next big goal, and I will continue to work hard and prepare myself for these challenges."

I wanted to lead MI CapeTown the way I led Afghanistan in T20WC: Rashid



GQEBERHA, Feb 4 (Agencies): Rashid Khan said he wanted to lead MI Cape Town in the same manner as he led Afghanistan during the T20 World Cup and credited his improved leadership this season to his familiarity with the team, which helped secure a spot in the SA20 playoffs.

After two forgettable seasons, MI CapeTown now sits at the top of the points table with 30 points from nine matches ahead of the playoffs.

The 26-year-old led Afghanistan to a historic victory over Australia in the Super Eight stage of the T20 World Cup 2024, following which the team made it to the semifinals.

"I wanted to lead MI CapeTown the way I led Afghanistan in the T20 World Cup. Coach Robbie Peterson also encouraged me in this direction," Rashid, who captained MI Cape Town in the first season but missed out last

season due to injury, said in a media interaction ahead of the first qualifier against Paarl Royals.

"I think this year I knew the players quite well and spent more time with them so I had the knowledge about which bowler to use at what point of time.

"The most important thing was to have clear communication with the players. To have what is happening in the mind of the captain and to know what is going through in their minds. I think I could have done better in the first year but you just keep learning."

Rashid noted that every player has taken responsibility and risen to the occasion, marking a major shift from the previous seasons.

"In the last couple of years, we played good cricket, but it was just about that we haven't finished well. You know, we haven't hit those points where it was a matter of going to the

result," he said. "I feel like this year we just have done that well. It's an overall team effort. Whoever got the opportunity, they have contributed for the team. Even if it's like he goes for one ball or two balls to hit there, he did it for the team."

Praising the contribution from the bowlers, Rashid said, "Everyone has been contributing with the ball as well. So, I feel like this year, this is a massive difference. The biggest thing is we're enjoying ourselves. You know, we're having fun and we're not much thinking about what the result will be."

Rashid emphasised the importance of having a leadership group in the team.

"It's very important for a captain to have a leadership group around as you always need support. Especially while coming from overseas and leading the team was not an easy job for me as a captain," he said.

"But to have that leadership is something that stood for us this year. Everyone knows their role and responsibilities which made my job easier."

"It's not just about me making decisions. It's about listening to the experienced players who have played extensively in these conditions. They know the local conditions better than anyone else, and their input is invaluable."

Suryakumar, Dube included in Mumbai squad for Ranji Trophy quarterfinal against Haryana

MUMBAI, Feb 4 (Agencies): India's T20 captain Suryakumar Yadav and Shivam Dube have been included in Mumbai's 18-member squad for their Ranji Trophy quarterfinal clash against Haryana, starting from February 8.

Both Suryakumar and Dube, who took part in the recently-concluded India-England five-match T20I series which the hosts won 4-1, have played one game each in Mumbai's title defence of the Ranji Trophy this season.

Mumbai qualified for the quarterfinals after their crushing victory by an innings and 456 runs against Meghalaya, while Jammu and Kashmir is the other team to make it to the knockouts from Elite Group A.

Suryakumar was a part of the Mumbai side



in their clash against Maharashtra in October, whereas Dube was a member of the star-studded hosts' side that included India Test and ODI skipper Rohit Sharma as well as Yasasvi Jaiswal, and which lost to J&K at home last month.

The 42-time winners Mumbai will travel to Rohtak where they will take on Haryana, who had finished at the top of Group C, at Chaudhary Bansi Lal Cricket Stadium in Lahli. Among other inclu-

sions in the side is the uncapped Harsh Tanna, who has so far played four List A matches.

If he keeps getting out like this, Samson's mind will play tricks with him: R Ashwin

NEW DELHI, Feb 4 (Agencies): Former India spinner R Ashwin has expressed concern at T20 batting star Sanju Samson's lack of form, saying his mind will start "playing tricks" with him if he does not find a way out of the current rut.

The 30-year-old Samson, who will be out of action for a month due to a fracture in his right index finger, endured a terrible series against England's express pace and short balls.

He managed a mere 51 runs in the five-match contest that India won 4-1.

"...if Sanju keeps getting dismissed like this, as a batter, the mind will be playing tricks," Ashwin said.

"(It will force you to think) the bowler is bowling a certain way and I am getting dismissed like this, is the bowler bowling well or do I have a shortcoming? Will I be able to adapt? Once so many questions arise, then it becomes difficult," he explained.

Ashwin also advised out-of-form skipper Suryakumar Yadav to change his approach to come out of the form slump that he is also enduring right now.



Suryakumar could only manage 28 runs in the just-concluded series against England.

"I can understand it happening in one or two games, but it is quite surprising," Ashwin said on his Hindi YouTube channel.

"...when you know you are being attacked in a certain way, there should be a different approach to that ball or just avoid it and force the bowler to bowl at your strengths."

"Suryakumar Yadav is a very experienced guy. He has a lot of ability. One can say he brought about a change of guard in Indian batting, showing the way.

But the time has come for him to take some time out and change his approach," he added.

Ashwin said Samson, who has blown hot and cold throughout his run in international cricket, should take responsive actions to ensure that doubts don't creep into his subconscious mind.

"But Ashwin cited legendary Sachin Tendulkar's advice during last week's BCCI Naman Awards that players should use their subconscious mind too.

"Sachin Tendulkar also said during the (BCCI) awards function that (you must) do so many repetitions that you allow the subconscious mind to take over," he said.

"But if so much confusion comes over on the subconscious mind, then batting becomes a different ball game altogether." Ashwin said failing in T20 cricket is not the problem but the manner of dismissals can be a cause of concern.

"As an experienced cricketer I will not focus on someone failing in T20 cricket but on how is he getting out, what is his decision making is like, I will focus

on that. They are good enough players to find solutions and they will think over it," he said.

Ashwin said a player is always rated on his ability to handle pressure in the shortest formats.

"T20 cricket is (all) about failures, you are bound to fail. You will not be able to play percentage cricket. As per this, I will think (about) the player who can handle pressure and can deliver wins," he said.

"Those players can be given long rope because T20 cricket is not about consistency, it's about excitement, putting fear in the opposition." Ashwin also expressed surprise at England's approach across formats, saying they are losing more than they are winning due to their aggressive strategy.

"...if I was England, I would be really worried, because they play Bazball, one-day and T20 cricket... all that is fine," he said.

"One can talk about it as much as they want, sometimes they pull off wins too. But I think they are losing more than they are winning so it is a serious matter of concern."

Veteran Sri Lankan batter Dimuth Karunaratne to retire after playing 100th Test

Karunaratne has scored 7,172 runs at an average of just under 40, with 16 centuries and 34 half-centuries in 99 Tests in over nearly 14 years

GALLE, Feb 4 (Agencies): Former Sri Lanka captain Dimuth Karunaratne is set to retire from international cricket after playing his 100th Test, which will be the second and final match against Australia starting here on Thursday.

The 36-year-old, one of the most prolific batters for Sri Lanka, has scored 7,172 runs at an average of just under 40, with 16 centuries

and 34 half-centuries in 99 Tests in over nearly 14 years. He has also featured in 50 ODIs, scoring 1,316 runs with one century and 11 fifties.

"It is difficult for a Test player to keep himself motivated to play 4 Tests for a year and maintain his form," Karunaratne, who made his Test debut in 2012, was quoted as saying by 'Daily FT'.

"In the last two-three

years after the WTC (World Test Championship) was introduced, we have been having very little bilateral series. My current form is another reason; completing my 100 Tests, the end of the WTC cycle (2023-25), I thought is the right time to retire," he said.

Karunaratne plans to relocate to Australia with his family next month. Having made his first-class debut for Sinhalese Sports Club



(SSC) in 2008, he will play his final match for them against NCC in the SLC Major Club three

-Day Tournament from February 14-16.

"I have some personal plans of my own.

I've decided to retire after speaking to other senior players like Angie (Angelo Mathews) and Chandni (Dinesh Chandimal)," he said.

"Rather than the three of us retiring at the same time, it will be better for us to go one by one. I thought I will retire first because I know I cannot go for my next target - 10,000 runs - with the lesser number of Tests being played.

"I am happy with what

I have achieved so far. I want to announce my retirement with a happy moment like playing in my 100th Test," Karunaratne said.

He has been struggling for form of late, managing scores of 7 and 0 in the first Test against Australia in which Sri Lanka slumped to an innings and 242 run defeat to go 0-1 down in the two-Test series.

"Any cricketer's dream is to play 100 Tests and

score 10,000 runs. It's a big achievement. When you start playing cricket, you don't think of those targets, but when you continue playing, you come across different targets," Karunaratne said.

"But as Sri Lanka are playing less Test matches for a year, getting to 10,000 runs seems far away. Appearing in 100 Tests I feel is an achievement," he added.

JKTF submits 12-point memorandum to School Education Department

JAMMU, Feb 4: The Jammu & Kashmir Teachers Forum (JKTF), a prominent body representing educators across the Union Territory, has submitted a detailed 12-point memorandum to Shantmanu, Administrative Secretary, School Education Department, J&K. Led by State President Mohd Ashraf Sheikh, the delegation highlighted urgent concerns affecting the education sector and called for transformative reforms.

The memorandum emphasizes the need for immediate intervention to resolve key issues impacting both teachers and student learning outcomes. JKTF reaffirmed its dedication to quality education, teacher welfare, and alignment with national policies such as the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and NIPUN Bharat. The delegation urged the administration to take swift action to improve the overall efficiency of the education system in the region.

Among the key demands, JKTF stressed the need for expedited promotions for teachers, ensuring a smooth transition from Teacher to Master and

Master to Headmaster. A structured and time-bound promotion policy is crucial to prevent administrative inefficiencies. The forum also highlighted the urgent requirement to fill vacant posts, particularly in rural schools, where acute teacher shortages severely impact learning outcomes.

The memorandum further addressed the teacher rationalization process, advocating for a fair redistribution policy to address disparities in staffing. A specific concern was raised regarding Rehbar-e-Taleem (ReT) teachers, many of whom have been stationed in the same schools for over two decades, restricting career growth. JKTF also urged the government to implement a timely career progression and promotion system, in line with NEP 2020, to retain skilled educators.

Another critical issue was the repatriation of teachers assigned to non-teaching duties, as their expertise is better utilized in classrooms rather than administrative roles. Additionally, the forum called for the streamlining of the Midday Meal (MDM) scheme, citing irregular fund disbursement that has placed teachers in difficult situations.

Annual Transfer Drives (ATD) and hardship postings were also discussed, with a specific demand for immediate relocation of teachers posted in Zone 5 (hard zones).

JKTF further emphasized the need for strengthening teacher training through District Institutes of Education & Training (DIETs), which currently suffer from severe staff shortages. Lastly, the forum urged the administration to clear pending promotions for Headmasters and Lecturers to ensure better school management and leadership.

State President Mohd Ashraf Sheikh stated that resolving these long-standing concerns is crucial for the future of education in Jammu & Kashmir. General Secretary Mir Bashir Ahmad added that delays in policy implementation and promotions have slowed progress in the sector.

The Administrative Secretary, School Education Department, provided a positive response and assured the delegation that these issues would be addressed in a time-bound manner. The JKTF delegation expressed gratitude for the constructive discussion and hoped for swift action that would benefit both teaching and non-teaching staff.

The delegation included General Secretary Mir Bashir Ahmad, UT Press & Publicity Secretary Jalil Ahmed, Provincial President Jammu Sanjeet Sharma, and Executive Farooq Ahmed Mir.
