

SRINAGAR, Feb 11 (Agencies): A soldier reportedly shot himself dead at the Badami Bagh Cantonment in Srinagar by using his own service rifle.

As per initial reports, the reasons behind his extreme step remain unclear.

The deceased has been identified as Satyajeet Kandhol, a resident of Panipat, Hary-

He was serving with the 20 Rashtriya Rifles (RR) E Company at the time of the incident.

An inquiry has been initiated into the matter to ascertain the circumstances leading to his death.

Thieves make abortive bid to loot ATM in Kulgam

KULGAM, Feb 11 (Agencies): In an overnight burglary attempt, thieves tried to steal a cash-laden ATM machine in Arreh village of South Kashmir's Kulgam, officials said on Tuesday.

An official told news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) thieves used a cutter to loot money from the ATM but their attempt failed.

"The ATM has been

damaged to some extent, but the cash is safe." the official added. He said that the police have taken the cognizance and investigation

has commenced. "Forensic team is collecting samples. The CCTV footage is also being examined," he added.

PM Modi to inaugurate Kashmir train service on Feb 17: Sources



BANIHAL, Feb 11 (Agencies): Kashmir valley is finally getting connected with the railway network in the rest of the country, as the first direct train from Katra to Srinagar is likely to be inaugurated on Feb 17.

Sources told Greater Kashmir that the inauguration of Katra-Kashmir train service is set to take place on February 17, and that preparations are being made for

the historic inauguration event.

However, there was no official confirmation so far.

Sources further said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will flag off the Vande Bharat train from Katra.

They said that Railway officials have been asked to be prepare for 17 February for inauguration of the rail service. They said that no

leave will be sanctioned for railway employees during the next week in view of the historic inauguration.

With its commercial inauguration by PM Modi, the Vande Bharat train will chug on the most ambitious railway project ever built in India and one of the most difficult and challenging tracks in the world.

The Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project is a technological marvel that includes India's first cable-staved Anji Khad Bridge that has a 331metre high pylon.

The Chenab Railway Bridge is the tallest railway bridge in the world, standing 359 metres above the river bed. This bridge is also the world's highest arch bridge.

The USBRL includes over two dozen small and large tunnels that make the journey shorter for the Vande Bharat train, which has been designed with climatefriendly technology.

Designed for extreme cold conditions, this Vande Bharat train has special anti-freezing features. Unlike other Vande Bharat trains in the country, it is built to operate smoothly in temperatures as low as -20°C. It comes with advanced heating systems to ensure


Kashmir, the NC leader also advised PDP's Iltija Mufti to go through the history of Jammu and Kashmir, and behave like a matured politician.

Drones banned in Doda for two months

JAMMU, Feb 11 (Agencies): A ban has been imposed on the storage, use and transportation of drones in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir for a period of two months, a move aimed at stopping misuse of the flying objects by anti-national elements, officials said on Tuesday.

However, police and other security agencies were exempted from the purview of the ban, while government departments using such gadgets for various activities, including mapping, surveys, surveillance in construction works and agriculture, were directed to seek proper



permission.

Additional District Magistrate, Doda, Sudershan Kumar said those already in possession of drone cameras or

flying objects or similar gadgets are directed to deposit them in the nearest police station within a week's time of the issuance of this order against proper receipt. "Whereas, in the recent

'Irregularities in Dogri recruitment at Prasar Bharati Jammu raise concerns'

JAMMU, Feb 11: The Dogri language is a cornerstone of the cultural and linguistic identity of the Dogra community, and its representation in media and governance should reflect the highest respect.

However, recent irregularities in the 2024 recruitment process for Editorial Executive/ Newsreader cum Translator (Dogri) positions at Prasar Bharati's Regional News Unit (RNU) Jammu have raised serious concerns about the integrity of the selection process and its impact on the future of Dogri.

Among the most troubling revelations is the involvement of contractual employees, such as Jagmohan Sharma and Vijay Bajaj, in key stages of the recruitment process, including the voice tests. These tests are critical for candidates aiming to represent Dogri in the media, yet they were conducted by individuals whose employment status raises concerns about neutrality and objectivity. Contractual employees should not hold such



significant responsibility in a process that directly affects the future of the language. Additionally, an RTI response has revealed that Jagmohan Sharma, despite being part of the interview panel, did not participate in Mohd. Yaseen's interview. His non-participation, along with the selective involvement of other panel members, further questions the fairness of the evaluation process.

Even more concerning is the limited role of Professor Veena Gupta, a respected former Dogri professor, in creating the written examination paper as per the RTI reply. While her credentials and contributions to Dogri are beyond question, her minimal involvement raises important concerns about why her expertise was not fully utilized in this crucial recruitment process. The absence of other distinguished Dogri scholars further signals a lack of institutional commitment to proper linguistic evaluation.

These concerns were brought to light through an RTI response filed by Mohd. Yaseen (reference number PRBHA/ R/E/24/01019, dated December 11, 2024), following advice from Gulshan Raina, Assistant Director of RNU Jammu to file an RTI and to escalate the matter with higher ups.

Acting on the guidance of Raina, Yaseen escalated the issue by reaching out to senior Prasar Bharati officials and filing the RTI application to seek clarity on the matter which is in front of every Dogra.

Previous Govt neglected development of far-flung areas in **Udhampur: Sunil Verma**

Poll Freebies Brought Kejriwal to his Knees

he election fever, heat and dust have settled down with the culmination of the electioneering and subsequent counting and declaration of the poll results. The crucial Delhi poll outcome which is in favor of the BJP gave the saffron party thumping majority 48 seats after a long gap of 27 years and it is a historical win for the BJP. In this election AAP has been decimated as the party had to content with only meager 22 seats when it has won 62 assembly seats in 2020 Delhi elections. dust now that the poll results were absolutely not in his party's favor and individually Kejriwal and all the bigwigs of his party save the interim Chief Minister Atishi only could save her seat with mere 600 votes. All the tall claims of Kejriwal and his team of having developed Delhi so for as the schools, healthcare etc is concerned could not fetch him the needed votes to form the government and become the Sultan of Delhi for the record third time. Instead people of the national capital, this time rallied behind the BJP and voted in its favor and gave the saffron party significant number of 48 seats the figure much higher than the magic number to stake claim and thus form a government. One of the striking point which was evident in the Delhi polls is that the freebies of Kejriwal were eclipsed by the poll freebies announced by the BJP as the freebies of AAP could not stand in competition with the BJP's ravedies and the outcome is that AAP failed to make required impact upon its core vote constituency and the result was a big setback to AAP and it will now take many more years to the AAP to be saddled in the throne of Delhi. It seems that the current polls results which have gone in favor of the BJP will be a blow for the very survival of the AAP which was dreaming not only to occupy Delhi throne but was nursing the bigger dream of being a political alternative at the national level. The fact is that AAP has no pan footing and is a pigmy sized party confined to Delhi and Punjab only and it is very difficult for it to occupy the center stage of politics in India. Keiriwal and his team is living

now in fool's paradise if they ever dream of coming to power at the centre. Moreover, it will take a long time to Kejriwal to erect, stand up and be relevant in national politics. Besides, if the potential government of BJP will sincerely make efforts in the direction of cleaning Yamuna river and also to minimize the deadly air pollution in Delhi, the prospects of BJP will continue to rise, while the political fortunes of AAP will become insignificant and at the most this arrogant and deceitful party will have to contend with the role of opposition for many years as AAP's chances of once more regaining power in Delhi stand sealed and frozen. It is thus obvious that even the political survival, exiestance and relevance of AAP is in danger. While the political fortunes of the saffron right wing Hindutva party will show considerable rise in future Delhi polls as well if this party will try to fulfill all its poll promises made to Delhi voters. BJP's campaign of Judey Gay to Bachay Gay and ladangay to khatam hoygayangay and Hindu awakening has influenced Delhi voters and they have thus voted in favor of BJP in great numbers. Delhi people as well now consider BJP as the messiah of Hindu's and as party in whose veins is blood and mantra of good governance and development and all these positive and favorable developments catapulted BJP's poll prospects and thus gave it the absolute majority in assembly polls. Thus the very relevance of BJP is very high not only in Delhi alone but all over India. NDA at present is in power in 19 states and 2 UT's besides at the national level and the Delhi poll results will further strengthen its hold in the country and it will definitely have positive impact on Bhiar polls in November 2015, UP polls thereafter and many other state polls. 

NEW DELHI, Feb 11 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said India was the first country among G-20 nations to meet the goals of Paris Agreement.

The Paris Agreement is a landmark international treaty on climate change, adopted in 2015, which is aimed at limiting global warming and strengthening the global response to the climate crisis. The goals of the treaty include keeping the global average temperature rise this century well below 2 degrees Celsius above preindustrial levels and pursuing efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius. The treaty also aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and make finance flows consistent with a pathway towards low greenhouse gas

Besides India, G-20 countries include the UK, the US, Russia, France, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Germany, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea and Turkey.

said that representatives from more than 80 countries were likely to participate in the conclave and around 30 Defence Ministers in addition to Defence/Service Chiefs and Permanent Secretaries from friendly nations would attend the event.

Reiterating India's conviction on being strong to ensure peace, the Defence Minister said, "we have been working very hard, to bring about a transformation in our defence capabilities. '45 cr devotees took dip in Sangam in 29 days', Adityanath rubbishes opposition's 'VIP bathing' jab

LUCKNOW, Feb 11 (Agencies): Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday said that some people are trying to spread confusion by linking the Maha Kumbh to VIP bathing, but the truth is that it is a confluence of harmony and faith where devotees join hands by removing the barriers of caste, religion, language and region.

Addressing an event to mark the 57th death anniversary of Deendayal Upadhyay, Adityanath said, "Who are these people spreading negativity? These are the same people who took VVIP treatment from the government throughout their lives and tried to pave a path for their future generations. These are people who stand against India and Sanatan Dharma by creating negativity and spreading false propaganda." The chief minister's remarks came amid opposition leaders accusing the Uttar Pradesh government of "mismanagement" and "VIP culture" after at least 30 devotees were killed in a pre-dawn stampede in Prayagraj on January 29.

To mark the occasion, Adityanath paid floral tributes to Upadhyay and underlined the relevance of his thoughts, the Uttar Pradesh government said in a statement.

"In Prayagraj, 45 crore devotees have taken the dip of faith in the Sangam in 29 days, which is historic. Other than India and China, no country in the world has a population of 45 crore. What can be bigger than 45 crore devotees coming to take a dip in a temporary city? "Some people are trying to spread confusion by linking it to VIP bathing, but the truth is that Maha Kumbh is a confluence of harmony and faith, where all devotees join together by eliminating the discriminations of caste, religion, language and region." Upadhyay was the founder-member of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh — the forerunner of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) — and pioneer of Antyodaya and the integral humanism philosophy, the statement said.

9 returning from Maha Kumbh killed in 2 road accidents in MP

JABALPUR/MAIHAR, Feb 11 (Agencies): Nine persons returning from Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj were killed and five injured in two road accidents in Madhya Pradesh's Jabalpur and Maihar districts on Tuesday morning, officials said. A truck collided with

a mini-bus in Jabalpur, killing seven occupants of the passenger vehicle returning to Andhra Pradesh from Prayagraj (in Uttar Pradesh), Collector Deepak Kumar Saxena told agency.

The incident took place at around 8.30 am near Sihora town, located 65 km from the district headquarters, he said.

The truck was heading on a highway from the wrong side, leading to the accident, eyewitnesses claimed.

Seven persons died



on the spot, while several others were trapped inside the mini-bus, they said.

Following the accident, the collector and Jabalpur's superintendent of police left for the accident site.

In Maihar, two persons were killed and five others injured when an unidentified vehicle hit their SUV near Kanchanpur village on National Highway no. 30 at around 4 am, Nadan Dehat police station incharge KN Banjare said.

The sports utility vehi-

cle (SUV) was returning to Indore from the Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj, he said.

All the injured persons were referred to the Satna district hospital after initial treatment in Amarpatan, the official

said.
The two deceased have been identified as Manju Sharma (32) and Manoj Vishwakarma (42), he said.

Police were examining CCTV footage of the area to identify the offending vehicle, the official said.

Mr Puri pointed out that the energy transition is not about completely eliminating fossil fuels but about using them strategically while scaling up renewable energy sources to reduce emissions.

"For too long, we have framed energy transition as a linear journey - from fossil fuels to renewables, from past to future, from problem to solution," he stated.

Instead, he suggested a balanced approach where both renewable and traditional energy



sources work together to ensure a stable and sustainable energy system.

The minister also highlighted that Artificial Intelligence (AI) and clean cooking are emerging as major drivers of energy demand in the future.

EU vows tough countermeasures to US tariffs



BRUSSELS, Feb 11 (Agencies): European Union (EU) chief Ursula von der Leyen vowed on Tuesday that US tariffs on steel and aluminum "will not go unanswered", adding that they will trigger tough countermeasures from the 27-nation bloc.

"The EU will act to safeguard its economic interests," von der Leyen said in a statement in reaction to US President Donald Trump's imposition of tariffs on steel and aluminum the previous day.

"Tariffs are taxes — bad for business, worse for consumers," von der Leyen said. "Unjustified tariffs on the EU will not go unanswered — they will trigger firm and proportionate countermeasures."

In Germany, home to the EU's largest economy, Chancellor Olaf Scholz told parliament that "if the US leaves us no other choice, then the European Union will react united," adding that "ultimately, trade wars always cost both sides prosperity"

Trump is hitting foreign steel and aluminum with a 25 per cent tax in the hope that they will give local producers relief from intense global competition, allowing them to charge higher prices. He imposed similar tariffs during his first presidency but the move damaged relations with key US allies and drove up costs for "downstream" manufacturers that buy steel and aluminum.

It is not clear what countermeasures would seek to apply, but officials and observers have said they would target Republican states and traditionally strong US exports.

After Trump imposed steel tariffs in 2018, the EU imposed counter-tariffs on US-made motorcycles, bourbon, peanut butter and jeans, among other

EU Commission vice-president Maroš Šefcovic said on Tuesday that the tariffs are "economically counterproductive, especially given the deeply integrated production chains established through our extensive transatlantic trade and investment ties".

"We will protect our workers, businesses and consumers," Šefcovic said, but added that "it is not our preferred scenario. We remain committed to constructive dialogue. We stand ready for negotiations and to find mutually beneficial solutions where possible.'

The EU estimates that the trade volume between both sides stands at about \$1.5 trillion, representing some 30 per cent of global trade. "There is a lot at stake for both sides," he told the EU legislature.

While the EU has a substantial export surplus in goods, it says that is partly offset by the US surplus in the trade of services

The EU says that trade in goods reached 851 billion euros (\$878 billion) in 2023, with a trade surplus of 156 billion euros (\$161 billion) for the EU. Trade in services was worth €688 billion (\$710 billion) with a trade deficit of 104 billion euros (107 billion) for the EU.

Turkey detains 10, widening crackdown on Istanbul's opposition-held districts

ANKARA, Feb 11 (Agencies): Turkish police on Tuesday detained 10 senior officials of district municipalities in Istanbul over their alleged links to Kurdish militants, the state-run Anadolu Agency reported, widening a crackdown on opposition-held districts in the city

The detainees include the deputy mayors of the districts of Kartal and Atasehir, along with eight district municipal council members, Anadolu reported. All suspects are members of Turkey's main opposition Republican People's Party, or CHP.

They were detained on suspicion of appointing people with alleged connections to Kurdish militants to municipal positions, thereby allowing the Kurdistan Workers' Party, or PKK, to infiltrated the municipalities, Anadolu reported.

Critics view the detentions as part of a government campaign to discredit Istanbul Mayor Ekrem Imamoglu, seen as a potential future challenger to President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, along with other opposition figures in the city.

Erdogan's government rejects allegations that it puts pressure on the courts, insisting the judiciary operates inde-

The CHP made significant gains in Istanbul and across the country in local elections last year, in a major setback to Erdogan's ruling party.

There was no immediate comment from the CHP's leadership. Imamoglu blamed the detentions on Erdogan, maintaining in a post on social media platform X that the move was the result of the "whims of one person who considers himself to be above the will of the people.'

Imamoglu is facing possible jail terms over a series of charges brought against him, including for criticizing legal investigations targeting him and other mayors. In 2022, he was sentenced for insulting public officials after he spoke out against a 2019 decision to annul the initial round of local elections, which he had won.

If a higher court upholds his conviction, he could be banned from politics for five years.

Last year, the mayor of Istanbul's Esenyurt district was arrested over alleged links to the PKK, while the mayor of Besiktas district, was arrested earlier this year over allegations of bid-rigging and bribery. The two have rejected the accusations.

Since the local elections, the government has ousted several elected mayors from the pro-Kurdish People's Equality and Democracy Party for alleged ties to the PKK and replaced them with state appointees. The party denies accusations of links to the banned group.

Concerned about ISIS-K's capabilities to plot, conduct attacks in Afghanistan, Pak: US tells UN

UNITED NATIONS. Feb 11 (Agencies): The United States said it remains concerned about terror group ISIS-Khorasan's (ISIS-K) capabilities to plot, conduct attacks and sustain recruitment campaigns, particularly in Afghani-

stan and Pakistan.

These remarks were made at the Security Council by Ambassador Dorothy Shea, Charge d'Affaires ad interim at the US Mission to the UN in her briefing on 'Threats to International Peace and Security by Terrorist Acts.

Shea also said "Countering ISIS and other terrorist groups around the world is a top priority for the Trump administration...President Trump's message is clear: The United States always stands ready to find and eliminate terrorists who threaten the United States and our allies."

She noted that ISIS affiliates in Central Asia, most notably ISIS-Khorasan, also pose a significant global threat.

"We remain concerned about ISIS-K's capabilities to plot and conduct attacks, as well as sustain recruitment campaigns, particularly in Afghanistan and Pakistan," she said.

In his remarks to the briefing, Under-Secretary-General United Nations Office of Coun-

ter-Terrorism Vladimir Voronkov said that ISIL-K continued to pose a significant threat in Afghanistan, the region and beyond.

He said that in addition to attacks in Afghanistan, ISIL-K supporters plotted attacks in Europe and were actively seeking to recruit individuals from Central Asian States. "There were also reports of small numbers of foreign terrorist fighters continuing to travel to Afghanistan," Voronkov said.

Voronkov recalled Secretary-General Antonio Guterres' "appeal to all member states to unite to prevent Afghanistan from again becoming a hotbed of terrorist activities.

In her remarks, Executive Director at the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED), Assistant Secretary-General Natalia Gherman said that beyond the Middle East, "Da'esh remains agile, taking advantage of ongoing conflicts and regions experiencing growing instability."

Significantly, in her remarks Gherman also referred to the 'Delhi Declaration' that was adopted during India's 2021-22 tenure in the Security Council on countering the use of new and emerging technologies for terrorist pur-

"As mandated by the Delhi Declaration, the Counter-Terrorism Committee just last month adopted the non-binding guiding principles on "preventing, detecting and disrupting the use of new and emerging financial technologies for terrorist purposes", also known as the 'Algeria Guiding Principles'," she said.

The guiding principles have been prepared with the support of the CTED, highlight the importance of a comprehensive and risk-based approach, and provide practical guidance to Member States, Gherman added

In October 2022, the Security Council Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC), chaired by India that year, organised a Special Meeting in New Delhi and Mumbai on the overarching theme of 'Countering the use of new and emerging technologies for terrorist purposes'.

As an outcome of the special meeting, the Committee adopted the 'Delhi Declaration' on countering the use of new and emerging technologies for terrorist purposes.

India, during its 2021-22 tenure as a non-permanent member of the UN Security Council, had assumed the chair

of the CTC in 2022.

The meeting of UNSC CTC took place on October 28 in Hotel Taj Mahal Palace in Mumbai, the site of the horrific 26/11 Mumbai attacks and in Delhi on October 29, where the Delhi Declaration was agreed upon. Shea added that ISIS

has expanded the frequency and lethality of its attacks in the Sahel, making this region the global epicentre for fatalities from terrorist attacks. As such, ISIS-Somalia, ISIS-Sahel, and ISIS-West Africa collectively pose a significant threat to stability and prosperity in Africa.

She asserted that accountability for terrorist attacks and other terrorist activity is key to the fight against terrorism and to deterring such acts from taking place in the future. "In that vein, we urge the members of this Council to take action and agree to list more ISIL and al-Qa'ida affiliates in the 1267 Sanctions Committee, so that they will be subject to a worldwide asset freeze, travel ban, and arms embargo."

The US also called on Member States to play an active and timely role in updating and implementing UN 1267 sanctions to counter ISIS and al-Qa'ida.

"Money is the lifeblood of terrorists. We must bolster our collective efforts to stem the flow of funds to terrorists and terrorist groups," she said.

Voronkov further said that the terrorism landscape is evolving and demands collective, multilateral action, as terrorist attacks threaten life, well-being and the fundamental rights and freedoms of individuals.

He voiced concern that despite steady counterterrorism efforts by Member States, and international and regional partners, Da'esh continues to demonstrate resilience and adapt its modus operandi.

He added that the resilience of terrorist groups underscores the need for sustained international collaboration. Member States must prioritise comprehensive, longterm responses that address the conditions conducive to terrorism while strengthening the rule of law and upholding international human rights and humanitarian

"Terrorism remains a significant and evolving threat to global peace and security, one that no State can confront in isolation. Sustained multilateral cooperation remains essential to countering terrorism effectively," Voronkov said.

3 killed as explosive device strikes car in W. Afghanistan

FARAH, Feb 11 (Agencies): Three people were killed and two others sustained injuries as an explosive device struck a car in Pushtkoh district of western Afghanistan's Farah province on Monday, deputy district chief Mawlawi Masrori said Tuesday.

The explosive device, which had been left over from past wars, struck a car on Monday evening, killing three commut-

ers on the spot and injuring two others, according to the official.

Afghanistan is reportedly one of the most landmine-contaminated countries in the world. Dozens of people, mostly children, are killed or maimed every month due to blasts of explosive devices left over from more than four decades of war and civil unrest in the

MANILA, Feb 11 (Agencies): Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. thanked Cambodia's king on Tuesday for granting a royal pardon last year to 13 Filipino women who were convicted of illegally serving as surrogate mothers in the Southeast Asian kingdom.

Marcos expressed his gratitude in a meeting with Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet, who was visiting Manila for talks on expanding trade, agricultural, tour-

The Philippines and Cambodia both belong to the 10-nation Association of Southeast Asian Nations, a regional bloc that promotes economic integration but is divided on other issues, including countries whose security alignments is with the United States

or China. Marcos has strengthened his country's treaty alliance with the United States to boost the Philippines' external defense

actions in the disputed South China Sea. Cambodia has long been known as a key backer of China in the region.

The 13 Filipino women were convicted in December in Cambodia on human trafficking-related charges for acting as surrogates for a criminal syndicate selling babies to foreigners for cash.

The women, who were in various stages of pregnancy, were each



sentenced to four years in prison by a Cambodian court, but they avoided imprisonment and a royal pardon granted by Cambodian King Norodom Sihamoni.

"We will never forget this act of magnanimitv from His Majesty, a testament to the strong relations between our two countries," Marcos said before a closeddoor meeting with the Cambodian premier and his delegation in Manila.

"We will continue to stand with you in the fight against transnational crimes and their

munities," Marcos said.

The Filipino women were charged for violating a Cambodian law against human trafficking and sexual exploitation which was updated in 2016 to ban commercial surrogacy. Cambodia has become a popular destination for foreigners seeking women to give birth to their children.

It has a bad reputation for human trafficking, especially in connection

foreigners work under conditions of virtual slavery and help perpetrate online criminal fraud that victimize citizens in other countries. Several agreements

were signed after Hun Manet's meeting with Marcos, mostly aimed at boosting trade, investment, tourism and agricultural engagements. One agreement aims to prevent looting and illicit trafficking of cultural artifacts.

AHMEDABAD, Feb 11 (Agencies): A big knock from Virat Kohli's currently silent bat along with a series clean-sweep over England will be on Team India's wish-list when the two teams square off in the third and final ODI in Ahmedabad on Wednesday, marking the end of their Champions Trophy buildup. While India hold an unassailable 2-0 lead with identical four-wicket wins in each of the first two ODIs, Rohit Sharma's men will be extra motivated to get a win here at the Narendra Modi Stadium where they had suffered a crushing ODI World Cup final loss in 2023

Needless to say, having their batting mainstay Kohli among runs and a win would be perfect culmination to the home side's Champions Trophy preparations. The eight-team competition gets underway from February 19 in Karachi with India starting against Bangladesh the next day in Dubai as per a hybrid model of hosting.

The team has already got a shot in the arm by Rohit's return to form. His 90-ball 119 in the second ODI was a source of relief to both the side and to him after a prolonged run of poor scores.

Kohli hasn't looked completely out of touch but hasn't stayed at the crease for long enough to give himself a chance for a big knock either.

If he manages to click, Kohli is in with a chance create another record. He is 89 runs short of becoming only the third batter in history to score 14,000 runs in the format which arguably has been the run-machine's favou-

India don't seem to have put a foot wrong in this series as they continue to make the most of



their rich reservoir of talent.

The addition of Varun Chakravarthy has given additional ammunition to their lethal spin attack which will be vital for the Champions Trophy and Mohammed Shami's return after lengthy injury layoff has been seamless

Shami's successful comeback has certainly been assuring given that the Indian team management will spend an anxious day on Tuesday awaiting news on their premier fast bowler Jasprit Bumrah, whose availability for the Champions Trophy is still under doubt.

As per the original time-line, Bumrah was slated for a comeback in the Ahmedabad ODI, but the ace pacer is currently toiling at the National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru under the watchful eyes of specialists aiming to make the final squad that is set to be unveiled on Wednesday.

Bumrah's guile on varied pitches and conditions is something that no team across the world possesses and India would be desperate to have their trump card back in the mix as they chase another ICC trophy.

Both India and England will enjoy an off day on Tuesday as

they have skipped training and

other pre-match routines to rest

and recuperate. Having ended his troubled run with the bat with a characteristic hundred in Cuttack, Rohit's confidence will certainly rub off

on the rest of the side. While Yashasvi Jaiswal could continue to warm the bench, India will expect better application and results from wicketkeeper-batter KL Rahul, who is going through a lean patch himself.

But it would not be a surprise if India give the flamboyant Rishabh Pant a crack to get some game time and have another left-handed batter in the mix to try out additional combinations.

India will need Shreyas lyer's presence in the middle-order which has been bolstered by robust batting performances from Axar Patel. The 31-yearold all-rounder has shown immense maturity at No.5 in pressure situations of both the ODIs so far with knocks of 52 and 41 not out.

Patel's exploits with the bat have taken some pressure off Ravindra Jadeja, who has chipped away at England with six wickets so far, exploiting the spin-friendly conditions perfectly to warm-up for similar set-ups in the Champions Trophy.

But for Jos Butter's England. this tour has raised more questions than they would have expected.

England have suffered repeated implosions in their core batting line-up across the T20Is and ODIs which has undone the impressive work that the opening pair of Phil Salt and Ben Duckett has been putting up.

Buttler maintains his team remains a work in progress but exit of the talented Jacob Bethell due to injury hampers them fur-

Harry Brook has blown hot and cold in ideal conditions for batting and Joe Root's impressive returns haven't got the adequate support from others.

Among bowlers, Adil Rashid has exploited the conditions perfectly but the onus will be on England batters to produce a unified show.

Ranji Trophy quarters: Ajinkya Rahane hits hundred to celebrate special 200 in style

Ajinkya Rahane celebrated his 200th first-class appearance by hitting a match-defining hundred against Haryana in the quarter-final at Eden Gardens in Kolkata



KOLKATA, Feb 11 (Agencies): Ajinkya Rahane led Mumbai from the front with the bat in their Ranji Trophy quarter-final against Haryana in Kolkata, scoring a second-innings century on Tuesday, February 11. Rahane, who was unbeaten on 88 overnight, reached his 29th first-class century during the morning session.

It was Rahane's 200th first-class match, and the seasoned batter marked the milestone in style, all but guaranteeing Mumbai's progress to the semi-final. The defending champions extended their lead beyond 300 runs before Rahane was dismissed for 108 by Anuj Thakarai. Rahane now has a total of 41 first-class centuries, including 12 in Test cricket. The right-handed batter is also closing in on 14,000 runs in the redball format.

Rahane struck 13 boundaries during his 180-ball 108, which was his first century of the ongoing Ranji Trophy season. The Mumbai captain forged a 129-run partnership with India's T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav on Monday before the latter fell for 70.

All-rounder Shivam Dube contributed 48 as Mumbai's top and middle order stepped up after a poor first innings. Rahane's 31 had been

the lone bright spot in the top order as Mumbai relied on Shams Mulani (91) and Tanush Kotian (97) to recover from 113 for 7 and post a total of

With the ball, Mumbai fought back strongly. Shardul Thakur picked up six wickets to trigger a Haryana collapse, reducing them from 257 for 4 to 301 all out, conceding a crucial 14-run first-innings lead.

RAHANE IN FINE **FORM**

Rahane has scored 437 runs in 12 innings in the 2024-25 Ranji Trophy season, including a century and two fifties. The star batter, who has not played Test cricket for India since July 2023, has remained consistent in domestic cricket. Earlier this season, he made an impression in the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 tournament, amassing 469 runs in nine matches at an average of 58.62 and a strike rate of 164.56 setting the stage for the Indian Premier League 2025 season.

Rahane, who represented Chennai Super Kings in the 2023 and 2024 seasons, will return to Kolkata Knight Riders for the 2025 season, which is set to commence on 21

MUMBAI, Feb 11 (Agencies): For a nation where cricket is followed like a religion by millions, tennis-ball cricket sets the foundation for many. Every street sees young aspiring cricketers weave their dreams with a tennis ball.

The Indian Street Premier League (ISPL) has been giving those dreams a platform to shine.

In its ongoing second edition, the league has captivated the attention from across the country while bringing together a spectacular mix of young talent and experienced campaigners. With the playoffs set to fire up the season 2, Dadoji Kondadev Stadium in Thane sees excitement rising day by day.

Among the many greats who were impressed by the exceptional talent and format of the league is Rohit Sharma's childhood coach Dinesh Lad.

A former cricketer and Dronacharya Awardee, Dinesh Lad hails the importance of tennisball cricket in a cricketer's formative years and the potential the league holds for players.

others," he added. Lad, who trained India captain Rohit Sharma in his childhood days, reflected on the impact tennis-ball cricket had on him

"He used to practice with a wet tennis ball; it would skid down the lane. The way Rohit plays straight shots and then pull shots, I think it was his practice with a tennis ball that helped

him better his shots." Lad said.

Lad, who started as a bowler with a tennis ball in his early days before transitioning to leather ball, sees ISPL as a great starter for budding cricketers.

"There are already various tournaments in leather ball cricket, but it is great to see a tennis ball league like ISPL being organized for the second consecutive year.

Credit goes to Suraj Samat for initiating this league. There was a time we felt like tennisball cricket was over. I also used to bowl well during my days with a tennis ball, but my performance got affected when I transitioned to a leather ball. I think now, it's a good opportunity for the players to do better as the league progresses," he said.

On being asked wheth-

er tennis cricket leagues like ISPL has the potential to give India players like Rohit Sharma in future, Lad said the potential cannot be

"There are possibilities

that the league can produce great players who can play at the national as well as international levels. We've witnessed some great action, especially the bowlers have been restricting the batsmen to play big shots. In countries like West Indies, tennis cricket enjoys great popularity. Even great players like Vivian Richards also transitioned from tennis-ball cricket. If one does well consistently, then there is potential. I personally think the league carries more potential for the batsmen as they can better their pull shots, square cut etc. with a tennis ball," Lad said .

In its second season, ISPL has seen some great action from the players. Since its start on January 26, the six teams have been locking their horns for some hard-hitting display of tennis ball-cricket as spectators cheered for their favourites. With the Qualifier 1 scheduled for February 12 between Majhi Mumbai and Falcon Risers Hyderabad, fans can look forward to a thrilling penultimate showdown. The season 2 will culminate with the grand final on February 15.

ICC World Test Championship 2023-25: League stage recap, road to final



NEW DELHI, Feb 11 (Agencies): The league stage of the ICC World Test Championship (WTC) 2023-25 concluded with Australia securing a historic series victory in the subcontinent, defeating Sri Lanka by nine wickets. With this triumph, Australia sealed their spot in the final, where they will face South Africa at Lord's in June. According to ICC, let's look at how each team fared in this cycle.

South Africa finished at the top of the league stage with a points percentage of 69.44. They dominated at home, securing series wins against Pakistan and Sri Lanka while drawing against India. Their away form was equally impressive, with victories over West Indies and Bangladesh. Their only setback came in New Zealand, where they were missing a host of their firstchoice stars. Winning eight out of 12 matches and drawing one, the Proteas secured their place in their first-ever ICC World Test Championship Final.

Australia earned the opportunity to defend their title with a points percentage of 67.54, finishing second in the league standings. They began their campaign by drawing the Ashes in England before dominating Pakistan 3-0

at home. A minor setback came when West Indies held them to a series draw, but victories over New Zealand and Sri Lanka, along with a historic home triumph against India, secured Australia's place in the final against South Africa

India narrowly missed out on a third consecutive World Test Championship final, finishing third with a points percentage of 50. They began their campaign with a series win in the West Indies, followed by a hard-fought draw in South Africa. Momentum picked up with dominant home victories against England and Bangladesh. However, a shocking home whitewash against New Zealand and a challenging tour of Australia ultimately derailed their hopes of

reaching the final. New Zealand finished fourth in the standings with a points percentage of 48.21, experiencing a rollercoaster campaign with seven wins and seven losses from 14 matches. Impressive victories against South Africa and India were offset by defeats to Australia and England, keeping the Kiwis just out of reach of a spot in the

final at Lord's. England played the most matches in the cycle, an impressive 22, and secured 11 victories. However, over-rate penalties proved costly. with Ben Stokes' side losing a total of 22 points due to slow over rates. Despite series wins against Sri Lanka, New Zealand, and West Indies, these deductions kept them from climbing higher, ultimately finishing fifth with a points percentage of 43.18.

Sri Lanka played 13 matches in the cycle, winning five and losing eight, which saw them finish sixth in the standings. Their only series victories came against Bangladesh and New Zealand, as they struggled to produce major upsets. This left them with a points percentage of 38.46 and a sixth-placed finish.

Bangladesh endured a challenging campaign, finishing seventh with a points percentage of 31.25 and failing to win a home series in this cycle. Their highlights included series draws against New Zealand and West Indies, along with a historic whitewash of Pakistan away from home. However, heavy defeats to India, South Africa, and Sri Lanka kept them out of conten-

tion for a spot in the final. West Indies endured a disappointing campaign, struggling to compete with their opponents and finishing eighth with a points percentage of 28.21. Their only bright spots were series draws against Bangladesh, Australia, and Pakistan. However, heavy defeats to India, South Africa, and England saw them slip to the second-lowest position in the standings.

Pakistan had a turbulent campaign in this World Test Championship cycle, finishing last with a points percentage of 27.98. They endured heavy away defeats to Australia and South Africa, along with a shocking home whitewash by Bangladesh. While they managed a series draw against the West Indies and a significant victory over England, it wasn't enough to lift them from the bottom of the table.
