New criminal laws ensure transparency, accountability: **SSP Srinagar**

SRINAGAR, Feb 13 (Agencies): Senior superintendent of police, Srinagar, Imtiyaz Hussain Mir on Thursday said that the criminal justice system will be people-centric and that these new laws ensure transparency and accountability.

Speaking with reporters on the sidelines of an awareness progarmme, the SSP, said that the aim of programme was to make people aware and educate them about the transition of criminal laws from a colonial legacy to a democratic legacy.

Supreme Court grants bail to NCB Officer accused in a narco-terror case

NEW DELHI. Feb 13 (Agencies): The Supreme Court has granted bail to an officer of the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) recently, who has been in custody since March 1. 2021, facing serious charges under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS Act), the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), and various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). A bench of Justice Abhay S. Oka & Justice Ujwal Bhuyyan observed that the trial has made minimal progress, with only six witnesses examined to date. The court noted that the trial is unlikely to conclude within a reasonable timeframe. Furthermore, no prior

that is alleged to have cheated many investors through a "fraud" forex trading scheme.

QFX company and its directors were running an "unregulated" deposit scheme, promising high returns on investments to the investors, the ED alleged.

The agents of QFX group of companies ran a MLM (multi-level marketing) scheme under the name of QFX investment plan and created websites, apps and social media ads etc. to attract investors promising higher rate of return in the name of forex trading, as per the agency.

After the police FIRs were filed, the ED found, the name of the QFX scheme was changed to YFX (Yorker Fx) with same modus operandi "duping innocent investors by luring high rate of returns under the guise of forex trading." "In addition to QFX more fraudulent investment schemes are being run and controlled by Nawab Ali alias Lavish Chaudhary such as BotBro, TLC Coin, Yorker FX projecting them as forex trading apps/websites," it said.

The ED found various events were organised in India and Dubai to lure more customers. Probe found that multiple bank accounts of NPay Box Private Limited, Capter Money

team, comprising Sr. Adv. Shadan Farasat, Adv. Umair A. Andrabi, Adv. Tanisha, both from Jammu and Kashmir. and others argued that the evidence against their client was insufficient to justify continued

incarceration. The Supreme Court also expressed concerns over the investigative methods, particularly the reliance on a photo identification memo where witnesses were shown photographs of the appellant rather than participating in a proper Test Identification Parade (TIP). The bench remarked that this was a "very strange and doubtful procedure," though it refrained from

claim of recovering $\Box 9^{\circ}$ lakh from the appellant was also scrutinized, with the court noting that no evidence was presented to link the money directly to the alleged offences.

Applying the legal principles established in the judgment of the Supreme Court in K.A. Najeeb, the court concluded that the prolonged trial and lack of compelling evidence warranted the appellant's release on bail. The court directed that the appellant be produced before the trial court within a week to finalize the bail conditions

The house was completely damaged during an encounter on 6 July 2024, in which a para commando and two militants were killed. A joint security operation was carried out last year in Modergam village, leading to an intense gunfight that resulted in the death of

INDIA Bloc a Strange Alliance with Fissures

NDIA alliance and opposition bloc has taken birth before ■ 2024 general elections with the negative politics as its aim that was to defeat Modi in the Lok Sabha elections of that year .But the INDI bloc miserably failed to checkmate and defeat Modi juggernaut .This INDI alliance has no policy and no strategy except to defeat Modi and his BJP.INDIA bloc has turned into a very strange alliance where its partners are busy in opposing and fighting each her as was obviously seen in the recently held Delhi polls.Both Congress and AAP are the partners in INDIA bloc but they fought the crucial Delhi polls separately which is the negation of alliance dharma. Congress decided to go alone in Delhi elections and fielded its candidates against AAP contestants with the result AAP's share of votes decreased and it failed to defeat mighty BJP and in the just concluded Delhi polls BJP was successful with flying colors and it won significant 48 assembly seats and AAP had to content with mere 22 seats which is much short of the magic figure of 36 seats which are needed to form government .In fact Congress could not even open its score and it won zero seats which is big humiliation for the grand old party.AAP failed to win good number of assembly seats as congress has divided the votes of AAP and Arvind Kejriwal and other leaders of the AAP are openly saying that their defeat in polls is squarely due to the division of their vote share and this distribution of votes helped BJP to win maximum of seats. The election results and the message of Delhi struck the INDIA alliance as the partners which are at war and friction with each other ,now aggressively showed the fissures in the INDIA alliance .In Punjab there are intense infighting between the two constituents of the INDIA bloc as the Congress has claimed that 30 of the AAP, MLA's are in touch with the grand party and they are about to desert AAP in Punjab. Thus the existence and survival of the AAP government of Bagwant Maan is at stake. There are fissures from Delhi to Punjab and Punjab to Maharashtra and to West Bengal in INDIA alliance and all this suggests that the ship of INDIA alliance is about to sink. INDIA bloc will sink under its own weight as is obvious from the widening fissures in INDIA bloc at pan India level and this is very sad for the future of INDIA as this opportunistic, selfish and negative alliance will soon or later disintegrate and such a day will be doomsday for the whole opposition. In fact amid fissures in INDIA bloc unity ,congress leaders speak in different voices which is not good for the health of the opposition alliance. In west Bengal the chief minister Mamata Banerjee talks in different way which shows that all is not well for the INDIA bloc. The defeat of the two INDIA bloc partners which is demoralizing has led to the open contradictions among the congress leaders who seem not on the same page so far as the its alliance strategies is concerned. Some of the leaders of congress defended the party's position and were of the opinion that AAP was unwilling to forge an alliance in the assembly polls, while a good number of its leaders differed with the view calling for introspection and coherent political strategy. Congress leaders openly asserted that the INDIA bloc was constituted especially for the Lok Sabha elections in 2024 and in the different state elections ,there are state specific issues and so alliance in state elections is neither needed nor feasible and so the alliance partners can go all alone in the state assembly polls. Congress MP and whip in the LoK Sabha Manickam Tagore said that INDIA bloc was formed for general elections 2024 .In different states ,different strategies were evolved in those polls also. The AAP and congress had an alliance in past but not in recent Delhi polls ,but there was no such alliance in Punjab. INDIA bloc's future is in balance as Delhi

assembly results expose deep fissures in the opposition alliance. PM Modi criticized AAP's collapse as congress failed to win even one single seat. He questioned the opposition unity ahead of Bihar polls. It is pertinent to mention that entire INDIA alliance leaders landed in Delhi ,while they stopped congress ,they could not save APP.SP and TMC leaders campaigned for AAP candidates and not for congress. Congress won no seats ,but AAP's tally was far less than it won in 2020 Delhi polls.AAP won only 22 assembly seats. It led to consternation in the INDIA bloc, especially because the congress spoilt AAP's chances in 12 states. J&K chief minister of NC which is a partners of the INDIA bloc has rightly exclaimed 'Aur lado aapas mein !!!.D Raja of communist party said that the Delhi election results is a wakeup call to the constituents' of INDIA bloc especially for congress and dominant regional parties in various states. He further asserted that unity between the alliance partners should be both ideological as well as practical. Sanjay Rawt of the Shiv Sena -UBT said had the AAP and congress fought the polls jointly ,the results would have been completely different. Bihar is going to polls in November 2025, and it will be seen how the constituents' of grand alliance such as Left Front, Congress and RJD will behave in those elections as in all likelihood RJD which is a dominant force in Bihar will go for bargaining with congress and will like to contest from many more seats and leave less seats for congress. In all probability perhaps they cannot checkmate JD-U and NDA alliance in Bihar polls all this because there seems no unity between the various constituents of the Mahaghatbandhan. The Delhi poll results can influence the parliamentary behavior of the opposition parties as SP and TMC had indicated that they would not follow the congress strategy in parliament and will act as an independent pressure group of regional parties.TMC recently did not cooperate with the opposition alliance created pandemonium in parliament as it wanted to raise the issues of West Bengal in parliament ,but the continuous blockage of the parliamentary proceedings because of the obdurate attitude of the opposition alliance has not allowed Mamta's TMC MP's to raise the pressing issues of the West Bengal in parliament. This clearly shows the widening rift between the various constituents of opposition alliance. Mamata Banerjee -led party wanted the parliament to function so as it can raise the issues of the people of the West Bengal. But that did not happen and the stalemate in the parliament continued. The debacle of the three constituents of INDIA bloc in recently held assembly elections has thrown the groping into survival crisis. In fact the impatience with the congress among alliance partners of INDIA is growing with many pointing fingers at the largest opposition constituent of the grand alliance for contributing to the BJP's triumph in Delhi polls. The AAP defeat and the congresses' humiliating debacle in Delhi assembly polls has given birth to further challenges for the already -faltering INDIA bloc. All the above implies that all is not well with the INDIA bloc and there are deepening fissures and confrontations between various constituents of the opposition alliance and the ship of INDIA bloc may sink in future unless its constituents take appropriate remedial measures .INDIA alliance leaders should put their own combined house in order than negatively criticizing the NDA/BJP.

The sound levels generated during rocket projection are high, which is harmful to both human and wildlife. itThe local environment has a profound impact and disrupts the natural habitat of wildlife. The animals and birds around the projection site are frightened by the rapid sound, which has a negative effect on their behavior and reproduction. The intensity of sound waves can also cause damage to the surrounding trees and flora. Excessive sound is harmful. This can harm the hearing ability. People present at the launch site may face mental stress, insomnia and other physical troubles, Extremely acute sound waves can damage the surrounding buildings and structures. When the rocket fly, its engine emits too much heat and gas, which contains harmful chemicals and heavy metals. These chemicals fall on the ground and join the soil. Which causes damage to its natural quality. The harmful chemicals present in rocket fuel (eg, hydrochloric acid and heavy metals) change the soil structure. Due to these chemicals, the pH level of the soil can be unbalanced, so that thereFarming and growth of plants are affected. Difficulty surviving micro -organisms and insects in polluted soils. It occurs, which affects the local ecosystem. The effect of these chemicals can remain on the soil for a long time, which reduces the fertile capacity of the ground. should be established areas where the environment has minimal impact, such as near the beach. , Launch sites should be kept away from sensitive ecosystem and densely populated areas. Organizations such as SpaceX have developed reusable rockets, such as Falcon 9, this technique eliminates the need for a new rocket for every launch. Nearly rocket projection is the backbone of modern science and space exploration, but its environmental impact cannot be ignored. Controlling pollution caused by projection is not a simple task, but it is not impossible either. We need technological innovation, policy formulation and global female cooperation to deal with problems like atmospheric pollution, ozone layer erosion, water and soil pollution and space debris. New technologies, such as: usable rockets and 'green propalents' and revolutionary steps to reduce environmental damage. SpaceX, NASA, and other space agencies are constantly trying in this direction, Following international cooperation and rules will ensure that all countries understand and comply with the importance of environmental protection. It should be our priority to maintain balance between technology and environment in the coming time. This is important not only for the present generation, but also for future generations.



In an apology video on X on Monday, Allahbadia admitted that his comment was not only inappropriate, but also not funny.

A day later, the controversial episode was removed by You-Tube following orders from the central government. "India's Got Latent", which premiered in June 2024, had aired 18 episodes.

But trouble for Allahbadia and Raina is far from over.

Besides widespread criticism, police complaints have been filed against both Allahbadia and Raina in cities, including the show. More than 40 people, including Allahbadia and Raina, have been summoned to join the probe.

Earlier this week, Shiv Sena MP Naresh Mhaske raised the issue in Parliament as he called for a law to regulate social media



NEW DELHI, Feb 13 (Agencies): It is essential for government departments to modernise their systems by making the best use of emerging technologies to cater to the ever-rising expectations of the public for efficiency in service delivery, President Droupadi Murmu said on Thursday.

Addressing a group of probationers from different government services, she asked them to keep abreast of advanced technologies, skills and strive to create more citizencentric, efficient and transparent governance systems.

The probationers from the Indian Civil Accounts Service, Indian Post and Telecommunication (Finance and Accounts) Service, Indian Railway Management Service (Accounts) and the Indian Postal Service had called on the president at the Rashtrapati

New Income Tax Bill more complicated than previous one: **Congress MP Manish Tewari**

NEW DELHI, Feb 13 (Agencies): Congress MP Manish Tewari on Thursday criticized the new Income Tax Bill, arguing that, contrary to Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's claims, the proposed legislation is more complex than the existing one.

"The Union Finance Minister had said that the new Income Tax Bill will be simpler than the previous bill. In the previous Bill, there were 296 sections. In the new Bill, there are more than 500 sections. In the previous Bill, there were 5 schedules. In the new Bill, there are 14 schedules," Tewari told agency. "The bill, which should have been more simple than the previous one, is

more complicated," he added. The new Income Tax Bill is set to be introduced in the Lok Sabha on Thursday.

The Centre is keen on detailed consultations, and the bill is expected to be referred to a Select Committee for further examination.

The Union Cabinet last week cleared the new Income Tax bill.

Sitharaman had indicated earlier that the bill would be sent to a parliamentary committee for scrutiny. "The process is the committee gives its recommendations, it comes back, and then the government, through the Cabinet, takes a call whether these amendments are to be taken in," she had said. In the July 2024 Budget, the gov-



ernment proposed a comprehensive review of the Income-tax Act, of 1961. The purpose was to make the Act concise and lucid and reduce disputes and litigation.

Sitharaman had said in her budget speech on February 1 that the bill will be soon introduced in Parliament.

"Over the past 10 years, our Government has implemented several reforms for the convenience of taxpayers, such as (1) faceless assessment, (2) taxpayers charter, (3) faster returns, (4) almost 99 per cent returns being on selfassessment, and (5) Vivad se Vishwas scheme. Continuing these efforts, I reaffirm the commitment of the tax department to trust first, scrutinize later. I also propose to introduce the new income-tax bill next week," she said in the budget speech.

Four labourers dead, 16 injured as van overturns in **UP's Shahjahanpur**

SHAHJAHANPUR. Feb 13 (Agencies): Four labourers died and 16 others got injured when their van overturned after being hit by an unidentified vehicle, police said on Thursday.

Additional Superintendent of Police (Rural) Manoj Kumar Awasthi said the accident occurred late Wednesday night near Vichola village.

The van, carrying labourers and their families, was en route to Haryana.

It overturned after being hit by the unidentified vehicle, resulting in the immediate deaths of two passengers - Shyamwati (60) and Samila (26).

The police rescued others and rushed them to Farrukhabad district hospital, where Ram Kumari (35) and Lavkush (30) succumbed to injuries during treatment, Awasthi said.

The official further stated that 16 people sustained severe injuries are currently undergoing treatment at the hospital. Those killed were residents of Sitapur district and were travelling to Haryana for labour work in a hired van.

Efforts are on to trace the unidentified vehicle involved in the accident, Awasthi added.



Madhya Pradesh businessman's 6-year-old son kidnapped by bike-borne miscreants in broad daylight

BHOPAL, Feb 13 (Agencies): The son of a local businessman was abducted in broad daylight by unidentified bike-borne men in Morar town of Gwalior district in Madhya Pradesh

The six-year-old boy, studying UKG, accompanied by his mother Arti Gupta was waiting for school van around 8.10 am on Thursday near their house in CP Colony locality when the incident took place. According to sources, two unidentified men emerged out of nowhere on a motorcycle, stopped close to the mother and child. Subsequently, one of them approached the mother, threw chili powder in Arti Gupta's eyes, snatched the boy from the mother's hands and fled with his accomplice on the motorbike. "We were waiting for

the school van. Sudden-

ly a man approached me, threw chili powder in my eyes, pushed me down and kidnapped my son," Arti Gupta said. "I tried to chase the motorcycle, but they sped away," she added. The entire incident was captured in the

CCTV camera installed close to the spot of the crime.

Shocked by the incident, the local traders have called for a shut down in Morar town as a mark of protest against the abduction.

Rahul Gupta, father of the abducted child, is a member of the Madhya Pradesh Chamber of Commerce and Industries (MPCCI), the office bearers of the traders' body met with the Gupta family and expressed concern over the incident.

Rahul Gupta said he had no enmity with anyone. The police have formed multiple teams

to track and rescue the boy.

A reward of Rs 30,000 has been announced by the IG-Gwalior Range, Arvind Saxena for getting clinching information about those involved in the broad daylight crime.

"Multiple police teams have been constituted and Rs 30,000 bounty has been declared from my level on arresting the unidentified accused. Our teams are analyzing the inward and outward movements of the two men who were involved in the kidnapping. Our priority is to recover the kidnapped minor safely as soon as possible. We're also checking for any possible linkage between the Thursday morning kidnapping in Gwalior and a similar crime in the past in adjoining Morena district," Saxena said, after meeting the family of the

Four dead, seven injured in Taiwan department store blast

TAIPEI, Feb 13 (Agencies): An explosion in a Taiwan department store on Thursday killed four people and left another "without vital signs", authorities said, with videos showing large pieces of debris raining on the street.

Seven people were injured in the blast in the food court on the 12th floor of the Shin Kong Mitsukoshi department store in the city of Taichung, the National Fire Agency said. The floor was believed to be closed for construction work at the time of the incident, the agency said.

Video posted on social media and verified by agency showed the moment of the explosion, with cladding and other debris flying off the building and dust billowing from inside.

DUBAI, Feb 13 (Agencies): Elon Musk called Thursday to "delete entire agencies" from the United States' federal government as part of his push under President Donald Trump to radically cut spending and restructure its priorities.

Musk offered a wideranging survey via a videocall to the World Governments Summit in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, of what he described as the priorities of the Trump administration interspersed with multiple references to "thermonuclear warfare" and the possible dangers of artificial intelligence. "We really have here rule of the bureaucracy as opposed to rule of the people - democracy," Musk said, wearing a black T-shirt that read: "Tech Support." He also joked that he was the "White House's tech support," borrowing from his profile on the social platform X, which he owns. "I think we do need to delete entire agencies as opposed to leave a lot of them behind," Musk said. "If we don't remove the roots of the

"If hypothetically, AI is designed for DEI, you know, diversity at all costs, it could decide that there's too many men in power and execute them," Musk said.

On AI, Musk said he believed X's newly updated AI chatbot, Grok 3, would be ready in about two weeks, calling it at one point "kind of scary." He criticised Sam Altman's management of OpenAl, which Musk just led a USD 97.4 billion takeover bid for, describing it as akin to a nonprofit aimed at saving the Amazon rainforest becoming a "lumber company that chops down the trees." Musk also announced plans for a "Dubai Loop" project in line with his work in the Boring Company which is digging tunnels in Las Vegas to speed transit. However, he and the Emirati government official speaking with him offered no immediate details of the plan.

"It's going to be like a wormhole," Musk promised. "You just wormhole from one part of the city - boom - and you're out in another part of the city."

Taiwan detects 6 Chinese aircraft, 8 vessels operating near its waters

TAIPEI, Feb 13 (Agencies): Taiwan on Thursday detected six sorties of People's Liberation Army (PLA) aircraft, eight People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) vessels, and one official ship operating around the island as of 6 am (UTC+8).

According to Taiwan's Ministry of National Defence (MND), four of the six aircraft sorties crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's northern Air Defense Identification Zone (ADIZ).

In a post on X, MND wrote, "6 sorties of PLA aircraft, 8 PLAN vessels and 1 official ship operating around Taiwan were detected up until 6 a.m. (UTC+8) today." It added, "4 out of 6 sorties crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's northern ADIZ. We have monitored the situation and responded accordingly.

On Wednesday, 30 PLA aircraft, seven PLAN vessels, and one official ship were detected around Taiwan's territory. Of the 30 aircraft, 23 crossed the median line into Taiwan's northern, southwestern, and eastern ADIZ. Additionally, the MND

said that two US naval vessels sailed through the Taiwan Strait from north to south on February 10. On Tuesday, MND had

detected 32 aircraft from

the PLA, eight vessels from PLAN, and one official ship operating nearby its shores as of 6 am (UTC+8). The MND noted that 22 of the aircraft crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's northern and southwestern ADIZ. It also detected two balloons from China.

In recent weeks, China had visibly increased its capacity to conduct amphibious assaults on Taiwan's beaches with new naval equipment. This included the formal launch of an advanced landing helicopter assault (LHA) vessel, unique in the world, and the mass production of floating bridge docks to aid ship unloading



during beach landings. The Taiwan-China conflict remained a longstanding geopolitical issue centred on Taiwan's sovereignty. While Taiwan functioned as a de facto independent state with its own government, military, and economy, Beijing considered it a breakaway province under the "One port.

China" policy. Since the Chinese Civil War (1945-1949), when the Republic of China government retreated to Taiwan, China had used diplomatic, economic, and military measures to pressure Taiwan, which continued to assert its independence with strong domestic sup-

Pakistan: HRFP demands justice for blasphemy accused Farhan Masih, others

FAISALABAD, Feb 13 (Agencies): Human **Rights Focus Pakistan** (HRFP) on Thursday condemned the ongoing violations of minority rights in Pakistan, where religious minorities, particularly Christians and Hindus. face severe persecution and discrimination.

The HRFP said that the communities are subjected to forced conversions, abductions, and physical violence, with the abuse of blasphemy laws intensifying their vulnerability.

"Human Rights Focus Pakistan (HRFP) strongly condemns the violations of minority rights across Pakistan, where religious minorities continue to face severe persecution and discrimination," HRFP said in a statement.

It added, "Religious minorities are routinely subjected to forced conversions, especially targeting young women and girls belonging to Christian and Hindu families, while the misuse of blasphemy laws has created an atmosphere of fear and vulnerability as there is an addition of recent case of Christian youth Farhan Masih who has been accused on 26 January 2025 by local



Islamic cleric Muhammad Bilal Khan with another man Tasleem Khan in district Sahiwal." HRFP further said that a FIR was registered at the local police station on the same day, stating by the complainant that Farhan Masih had used desecrated against Muslims and Islam under the charges of 295A/298A and 7-ATA of PPC. Section 295 A calls

for imprisonment of up to 10 years for deliberate and malicious acts intended to outrage religious feelings of any class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs; and 298 A with a punishment of up to 10 years in prison for disrespecting and companions of the prophet of Islam; and Section 7 of the Anti-Terrorism Act, includes a clause related to causing civil commotion or unrest and is punishable by a minimum five years

jail term, HRFP further elaborated.
