JAMMU, Feb 2 (Agencies): A young army Captain died due to "medical conditions" in Akhnoor area of Jammu, officials said on Sunday.

They said the officer, Capt Rudra Pratap Singh, suddenly fell and was taken to Military Hospital Akhnoor late last evening. The officer, belonging to Varanasi, however died due to "medical conditions", they said.

"The last rites will be done at home town with full military honour tomorrow," they added.

SRINAGAR, Feb 2 (Agencies): A soldier returning to duty from home after holidays has gone missing, officials here said on Sunday.

Rifleman Abid Bhat had left his home in Chittergul in Anantnag district to report to duty at Rangreth on Saturday, the officials

They said the soldier did not report at the camp till this morning after which a missing persons complaint was lodged with the

Further details were awaited, they added.

J&K Police lodge FIR against fraudster, five unauthorised labs seized

SRINAGAR, Feb 2 (Agencies): Police in Jammu and Kashmir's Sopore town on Sunday lodged an FIR against a fraudster while five unauthorised dental laboratories were sealed in Pulwama town.

Officials said police in Sopore town acted swiftly against fraudulent activity by filing a case against Basharat Mehraj Shah, also known as Basharat Molvi.

He is accused of tricking Mehraj Ahmad Sheikh into paying a Rs 25,000 bribe, promising to secure the release of Sheikh's phone, which had been seized by law enforcement agencies for analysis.

An FIR has been registered at police station Dangiwacha under the applicable legal provisions and the investigation has been started.

Police have also issued an advisory to the public asking them to remain vigilant against such fraudulent activities. Citizens are cautioned not to fall victim to scams and fraudulent schemes, which can lead to financial losses and

Is privatization of power distribution on the cards in J&K?

Chief Secy to discuss the matter on Feb 5

SRINAGAR, Feb 2 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir government appears to be moving forward with plans to privatize power distribution in the Union Territory, following the implementation of smart metering.

Chief Secretary Atal Duloo has scheduled a meeting on February 5, 2025, which will include the agenda item of "privatization of power distribution" among other power sector reforms.

This meeting is set to cover several critical aspects impacting the power sector, including the status of the Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme (RDSS), hydel projects, power tariff collections, and the implementation of a system for monitoring



power availability. Invitations have been extended to various officials from the Power Department and associated organisations, highlighting the serious intent behind this agenda.

Representatives from the Jammu and Kashmir Electrical Engineer Graduates' Union (JKEEGA), under the leadership of President Peerzada Hidyattulah,

have voiced strong opposition to the proposed privatization.

Hidyattulah stated, "We are opposing the privatization of the power sector tooth and nail. In fact, we were the first to hold a convention of All-India engineers to oppose any privatization move. It will have a huge impact on the people; power tariffs will increase as private players won't offer any subsidy."

He elaborated that taxpayers money have invested vastly in the power sector, and it should not be handed over to private entities.

The prospect of privatization follows recent decisions by the government to privatize power distribution across Union Territories (UTs), as part of its broader strategy under the Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan. The central government believes that privatization will improve the operational and financial efficiencies of power distribution utilities, which have been performing sub-optimally.

In a written response to parliamentary inquiries, it was mentioned that the decision to privatize ultimately lies with

Mysterious Deaths in Rajouri: AIIMS Delhi team meets patients, records clinical history

NEW DELHI. Feb 2 (Agencies): A fivemember team of experts from AIIMS Delhi, including specialists in toxicology, has spoken to 11 patients who are undergoing treatment for a mysterious illness that has claimed 17 lives in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, and recorded their clinical history.

The team would visit Badhaal village on Sunday where three families suffered casualties due to the illness, and collect samples from their sealed homes and surrounding areas.

"The samples would tested to know the cause of toxicity. The experts will also interact with the other villagers," a source

The AIIMS team headed by its director Dr M Srinivas comprises Dr A Shariff, professor in clinical toxicology, Dr Shailendra Kumar, addi-



tional professor, anesthesia and critical care, Dr Jamahed Nayer, additional professor, emergency medicine, Dr Jagdish Prasad Meena, additional professor, pediatrics, and Dr Javed Qadri, assistant professor, clinical toxicology.

According to sources, the team arrived in Rajouri on Friday night, interacted with the patients and their relatives at the Government Medical College (GMC), and made several queries about the entire episode.

They also examined some of the patients who are under observa-

The doctors at GMC Rajouri are treating the 11 patients using Atropine, an anti-poison drug, the sources said. Besides the AIIMS

Delhi team, a team of experts from PGI Chandigarh is also investigating the cause of toxicity.

Meanwhile, no new case has been reported in the past nine days from Badhaal village, which was shaken by ■Turn to page 9

SRINAGAR, Feb 2 (Agencies): Jammu and Kashmir's summer capital Srinagar continued to feel the winter chill with the minimum temperature at 1.0 degrees Celsius on Sunday, as per India Meteorological Department (IMD).

The city is likely to experience partly cloudy sky becoming generally cloudy towards after-

noon or evening or night' today, as per the Met Department.

Upper reaches of Bhalessa in Doda district of the Union Territory received fresh snowfall, while the plains experienced rainfall, leading to a significant dip in temperatures. For farmers and orchard owners, this comes as a relief after a prolonged dry spell in the region.

Meanwhile, in a move to ensure safe passage amidst the snowfall and inclement weather conditions in Sonamarg in Kashmir, the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) has initiated snow clearance operations to enhance traffic flow in the area.





Rattan Lal Gupta terms Union Budget 2025-26 as **Balanced but Calls for greater focus on J&K**

JAMMU, Feb 2: Rattan Lal Gupta, Provincial President of the Jammu and Kashmir National Conference (JKNC), has termed the Union Budget 2025-26 as balanced but stressed that it requires more attention and focus on the development and prosperity of Jammu and Kashmir. While he lauded the Union Finance Minister for providing relief to the middle class in income tax, he expressed hope that the Central Government would prioritize J&K's pressing needs and ongoing

"As like Bihar State, Jammu and Kashmir being a backward and border state, should also receive more allocations in the Union Budget. There is no announcement of special projects or funds for the Union Territory, which is facing a severe economic crisis. Development projects are either halted or progressing at a snail's pace, while unemployment is at its peak in Jammu and Kashmir," he stated.

Highlighting the growing unemployment crisis in the region, Rattan Lal Gupta noted that except for tourism, J&K has no viable alternative for economic growth. "Tourism alone cannot sustain the entire population of Jammu and Kashmir. The majority of industries here are struggling, and there is an urgent need to revive and support them. The government must take proactive steps to establish public sector industries, such as



a rail coach factory, which could generate employment without harming the environment," he added.

The senior NC leader lamented that despite assurances in Parliament regarding industrialization in J&K, no substantial progress has been made. "It was promised that new industries would be set up in J&K, but not a single major industrial project has materialized. As a result, unemployment continues to rise daily, with no concrete plan in place to address it," he said.

Rattan Lal Gupta emphasized that the Union Budget should have included a special package for border dwellers, farmers, and fruit growers in J&K, who are facing immense hardships. "The expectations of the people of

Jammu and Kashmir have not been fulfilled. No relief has been announced for farmers and fruit growers, despite the challenges they face due to harsh climatic conditions and lack of infrastructure," he pointed out.

Speaking on financial support from the Centre, Rattan Lal Gupta said, "Earlier, when J&K was a full-fledged state, the Centre provided 90% grants and 10% loans for the region's overall development. However, now only 10% is given as a grant, while 90% comes as a loan, which will further burden the already struggling economy of Jammu and Kashmir." He demanded that this process be stopped and the old pattern of 90% grants and 10% loans be reinstated.

The Provincial President also stated that this Budget would contribute to inflation across the country, making it even more difficult for common people to sustain them-

Rattan Lal Gupta urged the Central Government to extend unwavering support to Jammu & Kashmir, recognizing its unique challenges as a backward and border state. Emphasizing the need for special financial packages, accelerated infrastructural development, and robust employment opportunities, he called for concrete measures to bridge the developmental deficit of the last 10 years and bring the region at par with the rest of the nation.

The outstanding feature of the budget 2025 will be that Mahlaxmi - the goddess of wealth and prosperity will shower her blessings on the middle income group. But finance minister Sitharaman has shown magnanimity and broadmindedness and announced a big bonanza and great relief for the salaried class and the general people and made income up to Rs 12,0000 lakh annually free & exempted from income tax and it is no less than the gift of finance minister to the salaried class and middle income group. By this announcement of far-reaching importance Modi government has won appreciation from the salaried class, middle income group and has won the hearts and minds of the majority of the people and this great relief to salaried and middle income group will boost the political fortunes of NDA/BJP as the elections in Delhi are underway and some state assem-

bly elections are near. .The new budget 2025 will be pro people and pro poor. The household consumption, demand and investment will grow up. The budget 2025 should focus on investment, employment generation and control of inflation. In the face and middle of global economic slowdown India economy is robust as its fundamentals are strong and it will continue its march towards Viksit Bharat and there are no two views about it. The union budget 2025-26 is expected to include measures to support the economy ,employment, and businesses. In the upcoming union budget ,the finance ministry may take steps to revive export -boosting schemes ,such as the interest Equalization Scheme -IES ,offer financial support to exporters, and enable flexibility for certain service sector units in special economic zones –SEZ's. PM has said that the new year budget will be historical as it will focus on the overall development of the economy while giving big relief to the middle income group and poor people. Since the IES expired on December 31,the commerce department is seeking approval for a slightly modified version of the scheme to cover at least micro, small and medium enterprises -MSME's. The IES is an interest -subvention scheme under which exporters are given benefits in the interest rates charged by banks on their pre-and post -shipment rupee export credits. Lenders are subsequently compensated by the government. The scheme was launched in 2015 for five years to reduce stress among exporters, especially in labor -intensive sectors and MSME's. Majority of the people are hoping for policy measures that will bring down prices of daily household items. Additionally youth are looking for announcements that will create more jobs ,while the salaried class is expecting income tax concessions. The inflation rate should be checked and government should focus on areas such as travel expenses as it is getting costlier. In new budget there should be better tax rebate. Train facilities should be made even better and frequency of trains should also be increased. It is hoped that there will be several announcements for the middle class ,poor people and farmers as the farmers are the back bone of the econ-

omy and president Droupadi Murmu in her address to the joint session of the parliament made several references to the middle class. The government is expected to continue its fiscal consolidation roadmap, bringing down the fiscal deficit from 4.9 percent in FY 25 to 4.8%, with a target of 4.5 % in FY 26.A major focus of budget 2025 is expected to be tax reform and simplification. The a government is likely to introduce modernized Direct Tax Code -DTC .replacing the 63-year old Income Tax Act -much like how GST revolutionized indirect taxation. The focus of the budget 2025 are on the following—A-Focus on Infrastructure Development B—Digital Economy & Innovation. C—Taxation Reforms for a Simplified System. C—Focus on Health and Education D—Support for Farmers and Agriculture. E—Green Growth and Climate Action .F -Strengthening Social Welfare Schemes G—Revitalization of the MSME Sector. The key highlights will shape the financial trajectory and financial landscape of the country in the coming year. One of the most significant thrust areas in Budget 2025 is infrastructure .The government has allocated a substantial increase in funding for key infrastructure projects aiming to drive long term growth and enhance connectivity across the country. How restoring forests can combat climate change and empower communities

Reforestation stands as both a climate action imperative and a cornerstone for building sustainable future

Amid escalating climate changes, reforestation has come to be one of the most effective, nature-driven methods to combat environmental degradation and enhance climate resilience. Beyond absorbing carbon dioxide, forests support livelihoods, stabilise ecosystems, and foster sustainable communities forests have a great role in countering global warming and providing essential resources that not only support communities but also manufacturing and trade.

However, as research indicates, India in the past two decades has lost nearly 414-kilo hectares of humid primary forest which made up 18 per cent of its total tree loss. This highlights an urgent need to prioritise reforestation, not just as a climate action tool but also as a cornerstone for community development.

Reforestation's Dual Role: Climate Action and Community Resilience Forests have an immense capacity to capture and store carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, thus reducing the greenhouse effect.

The UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, established in 1988 estimates that reforestation and afforestation could account for up to 30 per cent of the carbon reduction

required to limit global warming. Additionally, forests regulate microclimates, mitigating the urban heat island effect and stabilising local weather patterns crucial for agriculture. Reforestation plays a crucial role in combating desertification, which poses a significant threat to food security, water availability and livelihoods. Forests help anchor the soil, replenish organic matter, and improve water retention, thereby enhancing agricultural productivity and water access, particularly in ecologically fragile regions. According to the India State of Forest Report 2021 (ISFR), tribal and rural communities living in these areas face high vulnerability but also exhibit remarkable climate resilience.

For these communities, reforestation is a game-changer as it can help prevent and even undo desertification by stabilising the soil using tree roots, which reduces wind and water erosion. Furthermore, forests help replenish organic material in the soil, leading to improved water retention and increased fertility which can lead to environmental regeneration and socio-economic stability.

Community-driven Reforestation: A Proven Model Even with rapid urbanisation, India's conservation ethos has a rich legacy of protecting nature. Be it the collective Chipko movement of the 1970s or the inspirational restoration of more than 1300 acres of Brahmaputra's Forest by Jadav Payeng,

the Forest Man of India, the success of any reforestation effort hinges on community and local participation.

With the input of individuals and stakeholders from communities, any conservation project remains culturally relevant, ecologically sound and economically beneficial. Take Aravalli Hills Afforestation Project as an example for instance. By involving Village Forest Protection Committees, the project rejuvenated over 151,390 hectares of degraded land and built nearly 200 water storage dams to support wildlife, boosting biodiversity and tiger populations in Sariska Sanctuary.

With an impressive 87 per cent tree survival rate, the initiative balanced environmental restoration with tangible social benefits such as job creation and improved livelihoods.

This model demonstrates that sustainable reforestation thrives on collaboration, community empowerment, and measurable impact. Partnerships for a Greener Future To scale reforestation efforts, collaboration is key. Governments, philanthropies, nonprofits and businesses must unite to amplify impact. For instance, non-profits can mobilise grassroots participation and bring cultural insights. Corporations can leverage resources for large-scale projects while fulfilling sustainability commitments.

Local governments can ensure policy alignment and provide

regulatory support.

Together, these stakeholders can create integrated strategies that combine ecological restoration with community upliftment. Initiatives like the National Afforestation Programme and the Green India Mission lay a solid foundation, but partnerships can catalyse progress. Reforesting for Generations to Come Reforestation offers a rare synergy-mitigating climate change while addressing critical challenges like water scarcity, food insecurity and rural poverty. It is not merely an environmental solution but a pathway to holistic development. By fostering meaningful partnerships with non-profits, businesses, and communities, and aligning efforts with governmental initiatives.

The time to act is now. With a shared vision and commitment, we can restore forests not just as carbon sinks but as vibrant ecosystems that sustain life and empower generations. A greener, more resilient future is within our reach

that underscore the exuberant prowess of


her dancing and voice," the synopsis added, as per the outlet.

Addressing a press conference, Kejriwal claimed that AAP is heading towards a "decisive win" in the February 5 polls, which has left BJP leaders, particularly Union Home Minister Amit Shah, "baffled and desperate".

"AAP is sweeping the polls, and Amit Shah is baffled. The BJP has resorted to hooliganism because they can sense defeat," Kejriwal alleged. He also accused BJP workers of threatening and assaulting AAP volunteers and supporters.

"Our leaders and supporters are being threatened to join the BJP or face arrest and attacks. But we cannot be scared," he said,



adding that Delhi will not tolerate such "intimidation tactics".

In response to the alleged threats, Kejriwal announced the launch of a new social media campaign with the hashtag 'AmitShahKi-Goondagardi' on X.

He urged people to share their experiences of being "attacked, threatened, or intimidated" using the hashtag.

"The BJP has no vision for Delhi. no chief ministerial candidate, no development agenda. All they have is hooliganism. They want to win through fear, not votes," Kejriwal claimed, as he urged Delhiites to unite against the BJP to ensure the safety and democratic integrity of the city.

The high-stakes Delhi Assembly elections are slated for February 5, and the results will be out on February 8.

The AAP is aiming for a third consecutive term, while the BJP is determined to reclaim the national capital after more than 25 years.

Fadnavis-Shinde 'discord' has hit Maharashtra's progress, claims Sanjay Raut

MUMBAI, Feb 2 (Agencies): Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde suspects his phone calls are being monitored, and central agencies are tracking his movements, amid growing tensions between him and Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, Shiv

Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut has claimed. "An MLA told me that Shinde is convinced that surveillance is being conducted on him and his associates," Raut wrote in his weekly column Rokhthok in Saamna, the Shiv Sena (UBT) mouthpiece.

Raut alleged that strained relations between Fadhavis and Shinde have paralysed the Maharashtra government despite its majority. He claimed Shinde has not come to terms with the fact that he was not reinstated as chief minister after the November 2024 assembly elections and is desperately trying to reclaim the position—a reality that Fadnavis fully understands.

In the elections, the Mahayuti alliance, comprising the BJP, Shinde-led Shiv Sena. and the NCP led by Ajit Pawar, secured 230 out of 288 seats.

"Our Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and the BJP-backed Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde have almost no real communication anymore, which has turned into a source of entertainment for the public," Raut charged.

According to Raut, Shinde's political control over his stronghold, Thane, is being systematically weakened by the BJP. The appointment of BJP minister Ganesh Naik as the guardian minister of the neighbouring Palghar district is allegedly part of this strategy.

"Naik was already a minister in the first Shiv Sena-BJP government when Shinde was just



a municipal councillor. He will not take orders from Sninge, Raut wrote.

Notably, Naik recently said he wants the saffron party to flourish in Thane, hinting at a possible power struggle. He also announced plans to hold public grievance meetings in the city, fuelling speculation that the BJP is preparing to challenge Shinde's dominance.

Raut claimed Shinde's role in the government has diminished significantly. He is frequently absent from key cabinet meetings and, when present, is often late.

"On 30 January, he arrived two-and-a-half hours late for a District Planning Committee meeting at the World Trade Centre," he

Quoting a senior MLA from Shinde's faction, Raut claimed Union Home Minister Amit Shah had promised Shinde that the 2024 assembly elections would be fought under his leadership and that he would continue as chief minister.

Encouraged by this assurance, Shinde is believed to have spent enormous amounts of money during the campaign. However, when the time came, Shah allegedly did not keep his word, leaving Shinde feeling deceived and politically cornered.

A senior BJP minister recently dismissed reports of tensions, stating there were no "major differences" between Fadnavis and

However, Raut countered, "Similar claims were made before the Shiv Sena split (in June 2022). What happened after that is something the entire country witnessed."

He further claimed that many MLAs in Shinde's camp are now "uneasy", with some considering joining the BJP under Fadnavis' leadership, while others contemplate returning to the Thackeray-led Sena (UBT). However, the fear of central agencies has left them hesitant to act.

"Shinde's leadership is no longer secure," Raut alleged, adding that even the BJP is working against him.

He also claimed the RSS has deployed its own people as personal assistants to ministers from both the Shinde and Ajit Pawar camps to monitor their activities and curb corruption.

Unlike Shinde, Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar is in a much more stable position, Raut said.

"Aiit Pawar understands his limitations and has built a stronger working relationship with Fadnavis," he wrote.

Raut claimed Pawar allied with the BJP to avoid action by the Enforcement Directorate in certain cases, recover assets worth Rs 1,000 crore, and secure the deputy chief minister's post as an additional benefit.

"Unlike Shinde, Pawar has no aspirations of becoming chief minister and is content with a politically safer position," he added.

5 killed, 35 injured as bus carrying pilgrims falls into gorge in Gujarat

DANG, Feb 2 (Agencies): Five people were killed and 35 injured as a private bus carrying pilgrims on a trip to various religious places fell into a gorge in Gujarat's Dang district on Sunday morning, police said.

Among the injured, 17 were seriously hurt, they said.

The accident took place at 4.15 am when the bus driver lost control over the wheel near the Saputara hill station, Superintendent of Police SG Patil said.

The bus, carrying 48 pilgrims, broke the crash barrier and fell into a depth of about 35 feet, he said.

"Five people died on the spot and 17 suffered serious injuries. The seriously injured have been rushed to the civil hospital at Ahwa. Some others have sustained minor injuries. The rescue operation is nearly over," the official said.

The bus driver was among the deceased, which comprised three men and two women,



according to police.

A total of 35 passengers were taken to the nearby community health centres, where 17 were referred to the civil hospital at Ahwa in the district, Patil said.

The passengers started at night for Dwarka in Gujarat from Trimbakeshwar, a religious

place in Maharashtra's Nashik district. They made a brief stop at Saputara for tea break before resuming their journey when the accident occurred 2.5 kilometres from the hill

station, the official said. The pilgrims, hailing from Guna, Shivpuri and Ashok Nagar districts in Madhya Pradesh, had set out on four different buses on December 23, 2024 on a trip to religious places across various states, he said.

Dang Collector Mahesh Patel said the unfortunate incident occurred after one of the four buses carrying the pilgrims fell into

"As per the passengers, they had tea and breakfast at Saputara before resuming their journey. It is likely that the driver lost control of the vehicle due to brake failure. Medical staff are working diligently to treat the injured," he said.

The deceased have been identified as bus driver Ratanlal Jatav, Bholaram Koswa, Bijroni Yadav, Guddibai Yadav and Kailashbai

Yadav, according to police. A team of locals and police personnel conducted the rescue operation. They brought out the passengers from the bus and rushed them to the CHCs.

Bihar woman strangles stepdaughter to death, sets body ablaze, conceals it in gunny bag

BUXAR, Feb 2 (Agencies): A woman has been arrested for allegedly strangling her eight-year-old stepdaughter to death, setting the body on fire and then stuffing the charred remains in a gunny bag in Bihar's Buxar district, police said on Sunday.

The charred body of Aanchal Kumari was found stuffed in a gunny bag concealed in a wooden box in her house in Naya Bhojpur area under the jurisdiction of Dumraon police station on Saturday night.

Police have arrested the woman on

charges of killing her stepdaughter. Speaking to agency, Buxar Superintendent of Police Shubham Arya said, "The victim's family had lodged a miss-

ing complaint on Saturday. Police immediately launched a search operation to trace the girl."

"When police searched the house, they found the charred body stuffed in a gunny bag concealed in a wooden box in a room. During preliminary investigation, the victim's stepmother confessed to have committed the crime," he said. She told the police that she strangled

her stepdaughter to death and then set the body on fire. Later, she stuffed the body in the gunny bag and concealed it in the

wooden box, he added. "Based on the woman's confessional statement and evidence collected from

the spot, police arrested her. The body has been sent for the sci-

entific examination. She did not tell the police the reason behind committing the crime. The victim's father lives in Delhi. The matter is being examined," the SP added.

Sharing a post on X, Trudeau addressed the situation following the announcement, stating, "We did not want this, but Canada is prepared."

He noted that he had met with the Premiers and the Cabinet earlier in the day to discuss the matter and would be speaking with President Sheinbaum of Mexico shortly.

"The United States has confirmed that it intends to impose 25 per cent tariffs on most Canadian goods, with 10 per cent tariffs on energy, starting February 4. I've met with the Premiers and our Cabinet today, and I'll be speaking with President Sheinbaum of Mexico shortly," he said.

This was done through the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) because of the major threat of illegal aliens and deadly drugs killing our Citizens, including fentanyl. We need to protect Americans, and it is my duty as President to ensure the safety of all. I made a promise on my Campaign to stop the flood of illegal aliens and drugs from pouring across our Borders, and Americans overwhelmingly voted in favour of it," Trump wrote on Truth Social.

Trump has repeatedly said he will follow through with his threat to hit imports from Canada and Mexico on 1 February.

During the election campaign, Trump threatened to hit Chinese-made products with tariffs of up to 60 per cent, but held off on any immediate action on his first day back in the White House, instead ordering his administration to study the

Mexico responds to US tariff announcement with proposal for collaboration



MEXICO CITY, Feb 2 (Agencies): Mexico's President Claudia Sheinbaum Pardo has rejected US President Donald Trump's accusations of Mexico's alleged alliances with criminal organizations. She emphasised Mexico's commitment to combating crime and drug trafficking, highlighting the need for cooperation between neighbouring countries.

Sheinbaum emphasised the importance of collaboration between neighbouring countries, stating, "Mexico does not want confrontation. We start with collaboration between neighbouring countries. Mexico not only does not want fentanyl to reach the United States but anywhere."

This comes after **US President Donald** Trump announced a 25 per cent tariff on imports from Canada and Mexico, as well as a 10 per cent tariff on goods from China, citing concerns over illegal immigration and the smuggling of drugs,

including fentanyl. Pardo strongly rejected the White House accusations, stating, "Problems are not resolved by

imposing tariffs." Highlighting the need for joint efforts to combat criminal groups involved in drug trafficking, she affirmed, "If the United States wants to combat criminal groups that traffic drugs and generate violence, we must work together in an integrated manner, but always under the principles of shared responsibility, mutual trust, collaboration and, above all, respect for sovereignty, which is not negotiable. Coordination, yes; subordination, no."

She proposed creating a working group with top public health and security teams from both countries to address shared concerns.

"To this end, I propose to President Trump that we establish a working group with our best public health and security teams. Problems are not resolved by imposing tariffs, but by talking and dialoguing, as we did in recent weeks with your State Department to address the phenomenon of migration; in our case, with respect for

human rights," she said. Mexico's team had been in constant communication with the US to address migration concerns.

"The graph that President Trump has been posting on social media about the decline in migration was created by my team, which has been in constant communication with his," said the President.

"I instruct the Secretary of Economy to implement Plan B that we have been working on, which includes tariff and non-tariff measures in defence of Mexico's interests. Nothing by force; everything by reason and right," she

Sheinbaum showcased Mexico's efforts to combat drug trafficking, citing the seizure of over 40 tons of drugs and the arrest of thousands linked to criminal groups. She emphasized that problems cannot be resolved through tariffs, but rather through dialogue and cooperation.

She stated "We categorically reject the White House's slander against the Mexican government for having alliances with criminal organizations, as well as any intention of intervention in our territory. If such an alliance exists anywhere, it is in the United States armouries that sell highpowered weapons to these criminal groups, as demonstrated by the United States Department of Justice itself in January of this year."

"In four months, our government has seized more than 40 tons of drugs, including 20 million doses of fentanyl. It has also arrested more than ten thousand people linked to these groups," she added.

including four crew. aboard a commercial airliner of American Airlines died Wednesday night after it collided with a military Black Hawk helicopter in midair near Reagan

UNITED NATIONS, Feb 2 (Agencies): As the United Nations turns 80 this year, it is imperative for it to be fit for purpose, **UN General Assembly President** Philemon Yang has said, calling on all member states to "engage actively" and commit to reform, including of the Security Council.

As the UN marks its 80th anniversary we must acknowledge the need to adapt to the change of times, to a manifestly different geopolitical context to that of 1945," Yang told agency in an exclusive interview

In response to a question on UN reforms, particularly of the powerful 15-nation body on which the needle has not moved much over the past few decades, he said there is no doubt that the calls for reform have been loudest about the UN Security Council.

"Again here, the Pact for the Future provides us with a boost of political momentum for the success of the intergovernmental negotiations during this session. I am fully supportive of the membership to follow through with ambition and determination, particularly at a moment where we see a deadlocked UN Security Council on matters of key importance for the maintenance of international peace and security," Yang said in the written interview ahead of the


Yang added that the Pact emphasises the importance of making the Council more representative.

"This includes addressing the historical injustice against Africa as a priority and improving the representation of underrepresented and unrepresented regions and groups. I am hopeful that we will be able to see a consolidated model being agreed to at the end of this session and I call on all member states to engage actively and commit to reform an institution that is vital for our collective

At the landmark Summit of the Future during the high-level General Assembly session in September last year, world leaders had adopted by consensus the ambitious Pact of the Future along with the annexes – the Global Digital Compact and the Declaration on Future Generations.

On UN reform, Yang further said that in this regard, the General Assembly has played and continues to play a key role.

"In fact, since the end of the Cold War, the General Assembly has been constantly reviewing



its effectiveness and efficiency through the process of revitalization of the work of the Assembly."

Yang emphasised that as the most representative body in the United Nations system, the General Assembly has the potential to lead the way into the future. As it was exemplified in September 2024, at the Summit of the Future, the Assembly was able to adopt by consensus the Pact and its annexes, charting the way forward for

India has been at the forefront of years-long efforts to reform the Security Council, saying the UN body does not reflect current geopolitics realities and underscored that it rightly deserves a permanent seat at the horse-shoe table. India last sat at the UN high table as a non-permanent member in 2021-22.

In response to a question on

how nations and leaders should ensure implementation of the roadmap laid out in the Pact as the world confronts challenges and conflicts, Yang said the 80th anniversary of the founding of the United Nations is a key moment for the international community to not only reflect on the collective achievements of the organisation since its foundation but to highlight those areas where urgent action is needed.

The Pact provides a perfect lens through which the international community can undertake this exercise, he said adding that the Pact marked a major step towards the realisation of a renewed international system that is responsive to the realities of today's world and the challenges of tomorrow.

It is also a powerful tool to accelerate the process of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals

and the 2030 Agenda, he said. "Its implementation requires collective efforts by all relevant stakeholders—member states,

international and regional organizations, civil society, and the private sector. Nations and their leaders must work hand in hand to address complex challenges and leverage innovation," he said.

Yang underscored that it has been made clear time and time again that "we can only make progress through collaboration and partnership. World leaders must ensure that the commitments in the Pact are implemented in a comprehensive and sustainable manner.

"The success of the Pact lies in translating those commitments into tangible, transformative outcomes, especially at the national level. My message to the leaders of the world is clear: we have no time to lose."

As Cameroon's Prime Minister, Yang visited Delhi to attend the CII-EXIM Bank Conclave on Africa in March 2013.

To a question on how he sees India's outreach to Africa, Yang said that over the years, India's relationship with African countries has gained momentum across various areas, including trade, investment, sustainable development and people-to-people ties.

On strategic partnerships and global governance, India is strengthening alliances with Afri-

can nations to enhance cooperation on security, counterterrorism, and combating climate change.

"India champions Africa's voice in global forums, advocating for reforms in international institutions to better reflect African interests." he said.

Yang highlighted that India's support for the Common African Position on UNSC reform and efforts to include the African Union as a full member of the G20 during its Presidency are clear examples of this partnership.

Yang noted that following his 2013 visit to India, Indian company Africur Pharmaceuticals opened a pharmaceutical manufacturing unit in 2018 in Douala, with an investment of approximately 26 million dollars. In the same vein, several Indian companies have become involved in the field of electricity supply in Cameroon.

He added that Indian companies are investing in various sectors across Africa helping to create jobs and fuel economic growth.

For decades, India has also provided development assistance, including grants and loans for infrastructure projects, capacity building, and education, through its Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme.

"Overall, India's outreach to Africa reflects a growing recognition of the continent's potential and a desire to foster mutually beneficial relationships," he said.

their children's screen habits. "The parents must encourage their children to participate in enriching activities that inculcate learning and creativity," he said.

Similarly, noted paediatrician Dr

Kaisar said that internet overuse has become a widespread issue. He called it a "pandemic" that requires collective action from parents, teachers, doctors and society as a whole.

"Children should be engaged

in alternatives that provide them with more joy and fulfillment than mobile phones, while parents must take responsibility by investing quality time with their children to prevent addiction," Dr Kaisar said. Both experts said that mobile phones should be completely avoided for children up to five years of age, and beyond that, strict content filtering and time restrictions should be implemented. They compared mobile phone usage to electricity—essential in today's world but something that should only be used when necessarv.

The doctors called for limiting mobile use to half an hour in the morning and half an hour in the evening to ensure that children do not develop an unhealthy attachment to digital devices.

Another crucial point they raised was the behaviour of parents themselves, saying that excessive mobile use by adults in front of their children normalises screen addiction. Parents need to set an example by limiting their own screen time, promoting interactive family activities, and encouraging outdoor play, they said.

Beyond personal responsibility, both doctors highlighted the need for a societal approach to address-

ing digital addiction. They said the government, in collaboration with educators, healthcare professionals, the media and other stakeholders must take an active role in spreading awareness about the responsible use of mobile devices.

This includes ensuring that children are primarily exposed to educational and informative content while keeping them away from harmful and non-productive digital influences, they added.

Dr Sushil and Dr Kaisar said the psychological effects of prolonged screen time on children are concerning. They cited studies showing increased risks of anxiety, poor attention spans, disrupted sleep patterns and social isolation.

To combat this growing crisis, they said the focus should be on creating a balanced environment where children can benefit from technology without falling into its trap.

Cannabis in excess could damage 'working memory', study finds

NEW DELHI, Feb 2 (Agencies): Heavy use of cannabis could affect a human's working memory, which is how the brain retains and uses just-learnt information to perform tasks, according to a new study.

Working memory helps a person follow instructions they've just been given or to mentally visualise and manipulate information, like solving a math problem.

Researchers, including those from the University of Colorado, US, analysed the effects of cannabis use in more than 1,000 young adults aged 22 to 36. MRI brain scans of the participants were taken while they performed tasks that tested working memory, reward, emotion, among other cognitive func-

The study, published in The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) Network Open, found that cannabis had a significant effect on brain function during working memory tasks, and a less significant one while performing other tasks.

"In this study of young adults, lifetime history of heavy cannabis use was associated with lower brain activation during a working memory task," the

authors wrote

"As cannabis use continues to grow globally, studying its effects on human health has become increasingly important. By doing so, we can provide a well-rounded understanding of both the benefits and risks of cannabis use, empowering people to make informed decisions and fully comprehend the potential consequences," first author Joshua Gowin, an assistant professor of radiology at the University of Colorado, said.

For the study, young adults who had used cannabis more than 1000 times were considered 'heavy users'. In the study group, 88 were classified as heavy cannabis users, 179 as moderate and 736 as non-users.

While performing working memory tasks, heavy users of cannabis showed a reduced activity in brain regions involved in important cognitive functions, such as decision-making, memory, attention and emotional processing, the researchers said.

"These findings identify negative outcomes associated with heavy lifetime cannabis use and working memory in healthy young adults that may be long lasting," they wrote.

Anatomic lung resection linked to improved survival for early-stage lung cancer: Study

ILLINOIS, Feb 2 (Agencies): New research presented at the 2025 Society of Thoracic Surgeons (STS) Annual Meeting reveals that anatomic lung resections, such as lobectomy and segmentectomy, are associated with better long-term survival than wedge resection for patients with early-stage nonsmall cell lung cancer (NSCLC).

The study analysed outcomes for more than 32,000 stage 1A NSCLC patients using data from the STS General Thoracic Surgery Database (STS GTSD), with long-term follow-up linked to the National Death Index and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services database, which provides up to 10 years of survival data.

Lobectomy for stage 1A NSCLC offered the highest survival rates, with a 5-year overall survival (OS) of 71.9 per cent and 10-year OS of 44.8 per cent. Segmentectomy, which resulted in a 5-year OS of 69.6 per cent and a 10-year OS of



44.2 per cent, proved to be a viable alternative. Both lobectomy and segmentectomy demonstrated better outcomes than wedge resection, which had a 5-year OS of 66.3 per cent and a 10-year OS of 41.4 per cent.

This research highlights the profound effect of using real-world data to provide critical

insights that complement findings from randomised controlled trials (RCTs). While RCTs suggest an equivalence between lobectomy and sub-lobar resections, this real-world study offers clinicians additional insight. It provides a broader perspective applicable to diverse patient populations and healthcare set-

tings.

"This study reinforces the need for nuanced decision-making, integrating both RCTs and real-world data to deliver the highest quality of care," said Christopher Seder, MD, a thoracic surgeon at Rush University Medical Center, Chicago. "By analyzing outcomes in a variety of healthcare settings, we can offer informed recommendations, ultimately improving patient outcomes across the board."

The findings come at a pivotal time when cardiothoracic surgical practices are evolving rapidly, integrating innovative tools and approaches that prioritize patient safety and longterm health. Dr Seder added, "This research is a significant step forward in understanding the long-term implications of surgical choices for lung cancer patients. Using real-world data to complement RCT findings offers surgeons additional context for tailoring treatment strategies."

"As the authors highlight, postacute sequelae of severe acute respiratory coronavirus 2 infection significantly affects quality of life, often leading to severe disability. This effect is particularly pronounced in women, who already experience higher rates of cognitive impairment after menopause. By understanding underlying factors, we can better address these challenges and work to mitigate the cascade of symptoms that follow," says Dr Monica Christmas, associate medical director for The Menopause Society.

Researchers in this latest

study, based on secondary analysis of data from the Women's Health Initiative, sought to better understand preexisting risk factors that may make certain adults--especially older postmenopausal women--more vulnerable to more serious ongoing symptoms. Specifically, they examined whether leukocyte count (a widely available clinical marker of systemic inflammation) was associated with COVID disease outcomes.

Based on the results, the

researchers concluded that leukocyte count is an independent predictor of COVID symptom severity in postmenopausal women. These results extend the evidence that low-grade inflammation is not only an outcome of COVID symptom severity but may also precede the acute Covid-19 infection. Additional research in this area is necessary, but the initial work is promising because leukocyte count represents an easily accessible, inexpensive clinical

marker.

Antibody treatment helps prevent severe bird flu in monkeys: Study

WASHINGTON DC, Feb 2 (Agencies): The antibodies target a stable part of the bird flu virus, ensuring that the immune protection can resist new variants and offer long-term protection against the globally spreading airborne infection. It helps in preventing severe bird flu in monkeys.

A prophylactic antibody-based immune therapy protects monkeys against severe disease caused by H5N1 avian flu, University of Pittsburgh and NIH Vaccine Research Center researchers report in Science.

The broadly neutralizing antibody, which recognizes a relatively stable region of the bird flu virus, is less prone to losing its efficacy than antibodies targeting influenza's more mutation-prone structures.

This feature ensures that the immune protection can withstand the possible emergence of virus variants, akin to the SARS-CoV-2 mutants that evolved during the COVID-19 pandemic, and provide lasting protection against a globally spreading airborne infection.

"This type of prevention can be very useful in controlling infection outbreaks and containing the bird flu pandemic," said co-corresponding author Douglas Reed, Ph.D., associate professor of immunology at Pitt's School of Medicine and the Center for Vaccine Research.

"In our testing, the antibody performed beautifully. The antibody could be useful as a prophylactic of severe disease in vulnerable populations, and it also helped us establish the testing threshold for antibody levels in the blood, which would be useful for judging the immune protection generated by

a universal flu vaccine." In a new study, monkeys pre-treated with a moderate dose of a broadly neutralizing MEDI8852 antibody were universally protected against severe disease and death.

addition to confirming the antibody's efficacy in preventing serious adverse health outcomes, scientists were also able to establish its minimum serum concentration required for protection -- a measurement useful for establishing the protective threshold of a potential universal flu vaccine.

The research sets the stage for the development of medical countermeasures against future influenza virus pandemics.

Serum levels of MED18852 sufficient for protection remained stable for 8 to 12 weeks.

It suggests that, if given early, it could protect first responders and others caring for patients at the beginning of an outbreak of H5N1.


"He has added a lot of maturity....": **Haddin lauds Allan Border Medal** favourite Travis Head

MELBOURNE, Feb 2 (Agencies): Australia's hard-hitting batter Travis Head is shaping up to be a favourite to win the Allan Border Medal for the Most Outstanding Male Australian Cricketer of the Year, with his domination extending to all formats.

During the voting period starting from Australia's home series against West Indies in the 2023-24 season till the end of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy against India, the lefthander made 1.427 runs in 29 matches and 36 innings across all formats, at an average of 43.24, with four centuries and five fifties. His best score is 154 and has emerged as the team's top-run-getter in this phase.

The batter has had strong outings whenever it mattered the most, be the in franchise cricket during the Indian Premier League (IPL), in the ICC Men's T20 World Cup or the Border Gavaskar Trophy.

Former Australian captain Brad Haddin has heaped praises on the big-hitting southpaw, saying that he has grown into a wonderful cricketer "over the last couple of years", a



him break the hearts of Indian fans with matchwinning tons in ICC World Test Championship final, ICC Cricket World Cup final and the Border-Gavaskar Trophy.

"I do not think it's just been 12 months with Travis Head, I think he has grown into a wonderful cricketer over the past couple of years," he said as quoted by Fox Cricket.

Matthew Kuhnemann (5/63) took his second Test fifer, while Nathan Lyon got three scalps. Mitchell Starc also got two to become the fourth Australian to complete 700 international wickets.

Sri Lanka could not remove the 489-run deficit in the second innings, as by day four, they were bundled out for 247 runs, with Jeffrey Vandersay (53 in 47 balls, with seven fours and two sixes scoring maiden Test fifty and Dinesh Chandimal (31 in 49 balls, with three fours), Angelo Mathews (41 in 59 balls, with six fours), Kamindu Mendis (32 in 26 balls, with four boundaries and a six), skipper Dhananjaya de Silva (39 in 50 balls, with eight fours) and Kusal Mendis (34 in 47 balls, with four boundaries) throwing away their wickets after getting starts.

Kuhnemann and Lyon took four wickets each, crushing the Lankan Lions by an innings and 242 runs.

Khawaja took home the 'Player of the Match' title.

Bangladesh cricket board panel to probe premier league corruption allegations

DHAKA, Feb 2 (Agencies): The Bangladesh Cricket Board has established an independent inquiry body to assist its Anti-Corruption Unit in probing a slew of corruption allegations over the last couple of weeks in the Bangladesh Premier League.

This marks the first official corruption investigation in the BPL since 2013 as the league faces challenge with delayed player payments and ticketing controversies.

"As part of its ongoing efforts, the BCB is in the process of establishing an Independent Inquiry Body to further support the ACU in its investigations," a BCB press release said.

"The BCB remains dedicated to ensuring



a fair and transparent cricketing environment, and will continue to take all necessary actions to safeguard the integrity of the sport in Bangla-

Recent media reports have alleged instances of corruption, naming specific players and matches, although these claims have not yet been substantiated by the BCB's ACU.

"The BCB has also come across media coverage regarding potential anti-corruption concerns about the BPL. The Board reiterates its firm commitment to upholding the integrity and spirit of the game," added the release.

"The BCB strictly adheres to the ICC AntiCorruption Code for Participants and maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards corruption in any form.

The BCB anti-corruption unit is continuously monitoring all matters relating to integrity within Bangladesh cricket, addressing them with due confidentiality and discretion."

Gene therapy promises individualised management of disease for each patient: Dr Jitendra

JAMMU, Feb 2: "Gene therapy promises individualised management of disease for each patient. Even if two individuals suffer from the same condition—be it cancer. kidney disease, or any other ailment-the treatment could be different in each case, guided by the individual's unique genetic makeup, pre-existing susceptibilities and inherited vulnerabilities.", stated Dr. Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science and Technology; Earth Sciences and Minister of State for PMO, Department of Atomic Energy, Department of Space, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, while inaugurating the Centre for Advanced Genomics & Precision Medicine at AIIMS Jammu.

Set up in collaboration with 4 base Care, the Centre aims to usher in a new era of personalised medicine, leveraging cutting-edge genomic research to provide targeted treatment based on individual genetic profiles.

Underscoring the transformative potential of gene therapy, the Minister emphasised that with genomic advancements, doctors would no longer rely on a one-sizefits-all approach but would tailor treatments to maximise efficacy and specificity for each individual.

The newly launched Centre for

Advanced Genomics & Precision Medicine places AIIMS Jammu among the frontrunners in India's medical research landscape. By integrating genomic data with Aldriven diagnostics, the centre aims to enhance early disease detection, optimise treatment strategies, and reduce the trial-and-error

approach in medical prescriptions.

Experts at the event noted that this

facility would play a pivotal role in advancing precision oncology, cardiovascular genomics, and genetic

screening for rare disorders. Dr. Jitendra Singh pointed out that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, India has prioritised technology-driven progress in the healthcare sector. He cited the government's efforts in promoting indigenous research

and biotechnology, highlighting the exponential growth in India's bio-economy—from a mere \$10 billion in 2014 to nearly \$130 billion today, with an ambitious target of \$300 billion in the near future. He further stated that with over 9,000 biotech startups compared to just 50 in 2014, India is rapidly emerging as a global leader in medical innovation.

The Minister stressed the need for an India-specific genomic database, highlighting the country's unique genetic diversity. "India is a subcontinent in itself, with over 4,600 distinct demographic groups. Our gene sequencing efforts, which have already mapped 10,000 healthy individuals across 99 communities, will help create a robust dataset tailored to Indian-specific health challenges," he said. He reaffirmed the government's commitment to completing one million genome sequences in the coming years to enable more accurate disease prediction and personalised interventions

Dr. Jitendra Singh also pointed out the resurgence of infectious diseases alongside the rise in noncommunicable diseases, urging a hybrid approach combining traditional diagnostics with genetic insights. "India has already proven itself in preventive healthcare, pioneering innovations like the world's first DNA-based COVID-19 vaccine and the HPV vaccine. With this new centre, we will further strengthen our ability to prevent, diagnose, and treat diseases using cutting-edge technology," he said.

A key objective of the centre is to make precision medicine affordable and accessible to the masses. While personalised treatments have traditionally been costly, AIIMS Jammu aims to leverage indigenous research and government-backed biotech initiatives to bring down costs and integrate precision medicine into public healthcare programs.

The Minister highlighted initiatives like Ayushman Bharat, which has provided health coverage to millions, and the recently launched Bio-E3 policy, which focuses on biotechnology for economic growth, environmental sustainability, and employment generation. He stated that the government's National Research Foundation (Anusandhan) will play a crucial role in funding next-generation research in genomics and personalised medicine.

Dr. Jitendra Singh elaborated on how Precision Medicine could be a game-changer for cancer treatment, enabling doctors to design targeted therapies instead of relying solely on conventional chemotherapy and radiation. He cited India's recent success in conducting the first-ever genetic therapy trial for haemophilia at CMC Vellore, where patients showed a 60% improvement in clotting factor production, with zero bleeding episodes. The trial, acknowledged globally and published in the New England Journal of Medicine, underscores India's rising stature in genetic research.

He also noted that genomic medicine would play a crucial role in tackling lifestyle diseases such as diabetes, which is now affecting younger age groups in India. A recent study found that the prevalence of Type 2 diabetes in Jammu is slightly higher than the national average, making AIIMS Jammu's research even more critical in developing effective intervention strategies.

Dr. Jitendra Singh concluded his address by reaffirming the government's vision of a Viksit Bharat by 2047, where healthcare is not only curative but also predictive and preventive. "This is just the beginning. The future of medicine is personalised, and India is well on its way to leading the world in genomic healthcare," he said.

Earlier, in his welcome address, Director AIIMS Jammu, Dr Shakti Gupta was all praise for Dr Jitendra Singh for his support in the setting up and continuous upgradation of AIIMS Jammu.
