

SRINAGAR, Mar 1 (Agencies): The Sub Judge/Special Mobile Magistrate, Kathua, has sought an Action Taken report (ATR) from Billawar Police over the death of Gujjar youth from Billawar due to suicide following alleged custodial torture.

The report has been sought in the complaint filed by the father and wife of deceased Makhan Din and advocates Mohammad Anwar Chowdhary and Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed. The petitioners said that they were forced to move the court as no FIR was registered in the case.

Earlier the Civil society members in Jammu criticised the administration for its inaction and rued that " despite widespread outrage, neither a judicial inquiry has been ordered nor any compensation provided to the bereaved family, raising serious concerns about justice and accountability."

A candlelight protest and dharna were organised at Mecca Dharna, Bathindi, calling for a CBI probe into Makhan Din's case.

Inordinate delay in nominating MLA's to J& K Legislative Assembly

s per the recommendations of the delimitation commission four members are to be nominated to the legislative assembly for giving proper representation to certain groups of the people of Jammu and Kashmir. Accordingly two persons from the displaced Kashmiri Pandits that must include one women from this community and two persons from the POJK refugees should be nominated by the government to legislative assembly to give democratic representation and political rights to these two sections of people. Delimitation commission recommended additional seats in the legislative assembly for Kashmiri Pandits and Displaced persons from POJK. The central government approved these recommendations regarding the nominations of persons from these two sections of the people. Thus the centre government decided that the J&K LG will appoint three persons from Kashmiri Pandit migrants to the legislative assembly necessarily one women from this section and two persons will be nominated from displaced persons from the POJK to the legislative assembly. The delimitation commission raised the total number of the elected legislative assembly seats to 90 and the five nominated seats will increase the total number of MLAs to 95. The new legislative assembly members were elected on October 8,2024. Omar Abdullah was sworn as the first chief minister of the Jammu and Kashmir UT on 16th October 2024 and the new assembly came into being after 8th October 2024.But to great dismay the government of JK UT has not still nominated the five MLAs to the

new house. J&K's first Assembly session was held on November 4,2024 .However those sections of people who were recommended to be given representation in Legislative Assembly are not nominated up to this time, thus delaying their nomination to the legislative assembly and thus defeating the very purpose of their nomination as recommended by the delimitation commission and approved be the centre government. The budget session of Jammu and Kashmir assembly will commence on 3rd March 2025 and new budget will be unveiled in the assembly on March 7. The five MLA's should have been nominated before the budget session of the assembly so that they could raise their issues and allocations before the government so that funds would be earmarked for the development of these sections of the people .But alas! no nomination from these groups of people has been made, thus defeating the very purpose of their nomination. Section 15,15 A and 15 B of the J&K Reorganization Act 2019 authorize the LG to nominate five members to the assembly potentially altering the elected body's composition. There five nominated members will have the same powers and position as the other elected MLA's. Supreme Court had earlier declined to consider the plea challenging the authority of the LG to nominate five members to legislative assembly and has asked the petitioners to go to the high Court in this regard. The petition challenging the powers of the LG to nominate members to assembly is sub-judice in the UT's high Court and the hearing on this plea will commence on March 20.It is very unfortunate that the genuine matter of nominating 5 members to the legislative assembly

has wrangled in legal battle .It shows that the regional political parties such as NC,PDP and even national party Congress is averse to giving some representation to migrant KP's and displaced persons from POJK and thus they are trying to scuttle the move of nominating 5 members by the LG. The fact of the matter is that NC, PDP, Congress and other like that the 5 members should be nominated by the elected government headed by the chief minister Omar Abdullah. Whatever it is, the sufferers are the migrant KP's who are living as refugees in their own country for last more than three decades and there is no say for them in the legislative assembly and the government. In fact it is within the jurisdiction of the LG to nominate five members to the legislative assembly and there is no wrong in it as per the provisions of the reorganization act 2019 and so the issue should not have been snowballed into a political slugfest and controversy but it has happened and the high court is seized of the matter. The High Court should decided on the petition challenging the authority of the LG to nominate 5 members to the soon so that the groups of people get political rights and they are heard in the assembly and the government. Thus the High Court should decide the plea immediately so that the interests of those sections to be represented by nominated MLA's are not affected. Since the budget of the new government will be tabled in March 2025, and the marginalized sections such as the migrant KP's and displaced refugees from POJK will not be represented and there will be no one to plead their needs and aspirations and the funds to be allocated to these groups of people. The best course in this

regards would have been not to politicize the genuine issue of nomination of five members to the LA. It is very disturbing that everything is seen through the prism of mere and cheap politics. The betterment, ensuring political interest and welfare of the migrant KP's and POJK refugees should be above petty politics. It seems that the regional parties such as NC,PDP and others do not like these sections to be given representation and so they are creating impediments in the way of nominating five members .If there is no direction from the honorable high court to the government ,the LG should at the earliest opportunity nominate five members from migrant KP's and displaced persons from POJK so that these groups of people will put forward their issues before the legislative assembly and the government in order to give some relief to these sections of the people. Therefore without any delay either high court should decide the matter or in the alternative the LG should use his power under the provisions of the J&K reorganization act 2019 and nominate five members to give fair representation to these sections of people so that they are heard and their issues are solved. No further delay should be made in nominating the members to the legislative assembly otherwise the very purpose of the nomination will be defeated and that would be the doomsday for these sections of the people.

Kangana Ranaut, Javed Akhtar settle defamation case; actor apologises for inconvenience to lyricist

Ranaut's lawyer Rizwan Siddiquee and Akhtar's advocate Jay Kumar Bhardwaj said matter was settled through hour-long mediation before special magistrate court in Bandra

Actor Kangana Ranaut resolved the over fouryear-long defamation case filed against her bv veteran lyricist Javed Akhtar through mediation, with the BJP MP apologising for the "inconvenience" caused to the screenwriter.

The duo appeared before a special court here and informed it of their decision to withdraw the complaints they had filed against each other. After the court appearance, the actor also posted a photo on her social media platform along

with Akhtar, stating that they have resolved the legal matter.

The court will pass a formal order on this later in the day.

The actor said she made the statement against Akhtar due to misunderstanding, and apologised for the inconvenience caused to him due to it.

Akhtar had filed a complaint against Ranaut in 2020, alleging that she had defamed and damaged his 'immaculate reputation' by dragging his name into actor Sushant Singh Rajput's

death in an interview with a news channel in July that year.

Ranaut had later filed a cross complaint against Akhtar, alleging criminal intimidation and insult to modestv.

She had claimed that during her meeting with Akhtar at his residence in 2016, he criminally intimidated her, demanding that she apologise to a co-star.

Ranaut's lawyer Rizwan Siddiquee and Akhtar's advocate Jay Kumar Bhardwaj said the matter was settled through an hour-long



mediation before a special magistrate court in Bandra.

Ranaut stated before the mediator that she

made the statement due to misunderstanding and she has decided to withdraw it, Bhardwaj told agency.

Ranaut has apologised to Akhtar for inconvenience caused to him due to her statement, he said, adding that she has undertaken not to make such a statement in future.

Siddiqque said, "We were looking for mediation for a long time. We had exchanged drafts also.

Finally we have resolved the case." "There were no issues, only the wordings were to be decided, which was done today. We prepared the draft, signed it and both the cases

were withdrawn today," he added.

The case was initially heard by a magistrate court in Andheri.

NEW DELHI, Mar 1 (Agencies): Union Minister for Home Amit Shah on Saturday issued directions to the administration and security forces in Manipur to ensure free movement of people on all roads in the troubled state, which is under President's Rule, beginning March 8, officials said.

While chairing a highlevel security review meeting on violencehit Manipur, the Home Minister has also given instructions to the state authorities to take strict action against anyone attempting to obstruct movement on the roads, they said.

The meeting, which was held here, mainly discussed ways and means to restore peace and normalcy in the northeastern state, which has been struggling with ethnic violence since May 2023. The Home Minister chaired the first such review meeting since the imposition of President's Rule in the state.

The Home Minister also held the meeting in the wake of an ultimatum issued by Governor Bhalla on February 20, urging all individuals in possession of illegal and looted weapons to surrender them.

During the seven days following the Governor's ultimatum, more than 300 weapons were surrendered. mostly in the valley districts. Around 246 firearms were turned in by the Meitei group Arambai Tenggol. However, on Friday,

in response to requests from people in both hill and valley areas, the Governor extended the deadline for surrendering illegal and looted arms until 4 pm on March 6.

Huge number of weapons had been looted from police stations across Manipur during the initial phase of ethnic violence and the Centre has since been working to retrieve these arms as part of its broader strategy to stabilize the region.

President's Rule was imposed in Manipur on February 13 following the resignation of Chief Minister N Biren Singh. The state assembly, which is set to run until 2027, has been suspended.

The case relates to the suspects targeting a Mohali-based property dealer and demanding Rs 50 lakh from him in January 2025.

Gaurav Yadav said that following the disclosures of 'Maxi,' a police team led by DSP Dera Bassi Bikramjit Singh Brar was taking him to a spot where he had confessed to have concealed a .32 Calibre Pistol on Zirak-



pur-Ambala Highway in a bid to harm the property dealer.

Tourist from Maharashtra dies in fire in Shimla bed and breakfast accommodation, two more injured



SHIMLA, Mar 1 (Agencies): Three tourists from Maharashtra sustained burn injuries, one of whom died, following a fierce fire in a private accommodation offering bed and breakfast in the Kachighati area of Shimla city, police said on Saturday. All three tourists from Maharashtra were sleeping when the fire broke out around 11.30 pm on Friday night.

While two of them managed to escape, Ritesh, a resident of flames. However, tourists staying in other rooms were safely rescued. Three rooms of the hotels were engulfed in the fire and there was a loss of property worth lakhs, police said.

Preliminary investigations suggested negligence on the part of the owner and a case under sections 106 (causing death by negligence) and 125 (endangering life) of BNS has been registered.

The family members of the deceased have been informed and the body would be handed over to them after the post-mortem is conducted, police said.

The exact cause of the fire is being investigated and fire safety measures in the accommodation are being examined, they said.

Russian Foreign Ministry says Trump, Vance displayed "miracle of restraint" against Zelenskyy

Zakharova accused Zelenskyy of speaking lies and said that his biggest lie was his statement in the White House about Kyiv regime being without support in 2022.

MOSCOW, Mar 1 (Agencies): Russian Foreign Ministry Maria Zakharova has said that US President Donald Trump and US Vice President JD Vance displayed a "miracle of restraint" by refraining themselves from hitting Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, whom she called "scumbag," Al Jazeera reported.

Zakharova accused Zelenskyy of speaking lies and said that his biggest lie was his statement in the White House about Kyiv regime being without support in 2022, Al Jazeera reported.

In a statement on Telegram, the Russian foreign ministry official Zakharova wrote, "I think Zelenskyy's biggest lie of all his lies was his assertion in the White House that the Kyiv regime in 2022 was alone, without support."

"How Trump and Vance held back from hitting that scumbag is a miracle of restraint," she said

Zakharova's statement followed Zelenskyy's verbal sparring with US President Donald Trump and Vice President Vance at the White House's Oval Office on Friday (local time). This shouting match between the leaders was witnessed by White House officials, mediapersons and other Ukrainian officials.

Meanwhile, Russian Security Council deputy head Dmitry Medvedev stated that Trump had given Ukraine a "strong slap on the wrist." Medvedev, who is also former Russian President,



said, "Trump told the cocaine clown the truth to his face."

He said, "For the first time, Trump told the cocaine clown the truth to his face: The Kyiv regime is playing with the Third World War. And the ungrateful pig received a strong slap on the wrist from the owners of the pigsty. This is useful. But it's not enough - we must stop military aid to the Nazi machine," Al Jazeera reported.

The Oval Office meeting began with warm exchanges and handshakes, with Trump at one point saying of Zelensky: "I think he's a great guy." But matters took an ugly turn after Zelensky attempted to explain Russian President Vladimir Putin's lack of diplomacy to Vance in a heated confrontation in front of live cameras and journalists. US Vice President accused Zelenskyy of "litigating" in front of the world's press, criticized him for taking part in photoops with Democrats during the 2024 campaign, and said his remarks were "disrespectful" to

the administration. Raising his voice, Trump called the Ukrainian president "disrespectful" and told him he should be thanking the US, saying, "You don't have the cards." "You are either going to make a deal or we're out and if we are out, you will fight it out. I don't think it's going to be pretty," he added. Following the Oval Office meeting, Trump said that the Ukranian President was not willing to pursue an immediate ceasefire in the ongoing conflict with Russia. Zelenskyy left the White House earlier than planned without signing a muchanticipated minerals agreement or attending a scheduled press conference with Trump.

Speaking to reporters after the meeting, Trump said, "He (Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy) says that he wants to come back right now, but I can't do that...They should have an immediate ceasefire...A ceasefire could take place immediately. If you want to end the war, you sign up for an agreement that's going to take a period of time. It takes time."

He reiterated that he wants the war to end immediately: "I want it to end immediately, and I think if you had a ceasefire, it would be a ceasefire, a real one that would end it," he said. "He [Volodymyr Zelenskyy] doesn't want to do that...I want it to end immediately. I want a ceasefire now," he added.

According to Trump, Zelenskyy's position is influenced by the support he receives from the United States. He said, "Well, all of a sudden, he is a big shot because he has the US on his side. Either we're going to end it or let him fight it out, and if he fights it out, it's not going to be pretty easy as without us, he doesn't win."

Further, Trump has criticized Zelenskyy, stating, "That was not a man (Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy) that wanted to make peace, and I am only interested if he (Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy) wants to end the bloodshed."

"Zelenskyy got to say, I want to make peace. He doesn't have to stand there and say about Putin this, Putin that, and all negative things. He's got to say, I want to make peace. I don't want to fight a war any longer, his people are dying," he added.

US Representative Chris Smith condemns Thailand govt's decision to deport Uyghur refugees to China, calls for sanctions



WASHINGTON DC, Mar 1 (Agencies): US Representative Christopher Smith, a senior member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee and co-chair of both the Congressional-Executive Commission on China and the Uyghur Caucus, has blamed Thailand Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra for the deportation of Uvghur refugees to China and called on the US to impose sanctions against her.

In the statement, Smith stated, "The government of Thailand forcibly repatriated 45 Uyghur refugees to Communist China in violation of its obligations under the Convention against Torture. Culpability for this lies directly with Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra. The United States must sanction her and her family, including via Treasury sanctions."

"As the Chinese Communist Party will likely subject the renditioned Uyghurs to forced labor, Thailand's complicity in this should also be reflected in Thailand's tier ranking in the Trafficking in Persons report. When coupled with tolerance for sex tourism and backpedaling on enforcing protections for labor trafficking in the fishing sector, the Government of Thailand has forfeited any goodwill generated at trafficking reform," stated Smith.

It was the first reaction from the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) after Ocalan this week called for the dissolution of the group and asked it to lay down arms after fighting the Turkish state for over four decades.

The PKK said on Saturday it was ready to convene a congress as Ocalan wanted but "for this to happen, a suitwas made until October when a hardline nationalist ally of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan offered a surprise peace gesture if Ocalan rejected violence.

While Erdogan backed the rapprochement, his government cranked up pressure on the opposition, arresting hundreds of politicians, activists and journalists. Erdogan on Friday said Ocalan's appeal was a "historic opportunity". He said Turkey would "keep a close watch" to make sure the talks to end the insurgency were "brought to a successful conclusion".

"When the pressure of terrorism and arms is eliminated, the space for politics in democracy will naturally expand," Erdogan promised.

Iraq has welcomed Ocalan's call, saying it was "a positive and important step towards achieving stability in the region".

The PKK's presence in Iraq has has been a recurrent source of tension between Baghdad and Ankara.

The maximum price per liter of unleaded 95 octane gasoline for the consumer at a self-service station in Eilat (excluding VAT) will not exceed 6.13 Shekels (USD 1.71) per liter, a decrease of 0.06 Shekels from the previous update. Champions trophy 2025: Washout seals semi-final spot

Chasing 274 for victory, Aussies hit 109-1 in 13 overs as rain plays spoilsport

LAHORE, Mar 1 (Agencies): Australia entered the semifinals of the Champions Trophy after their crucial Group B clash against Afghanistan was called off due to rain here.

The match was halted by a downpour when Australia were 109 for 1 in 12.5 overs, chasing a target of 274.

Despite the ground staffs' efforts to clear the field, several pools of water remained on the pitch and the umpires ultimately declared the match abandoned after an inspection.

The interruption came just an hour before the cut-off time for completing the match.

With the game called off, Australia advanced to the semifinals with four points. Their last match against South Africa in Rawalpindi was also abandoned.

At the time of interruption, Travis Head was in superb form, having scored 59 runs off 40 balls, including nine fours and one six.

His knock came after a lucky reprieve when Rashid Khan dropped him on six, diving at mid-on off Fazalhag Faroogi. Head capitalised on this opportunity and dominated the Afghanistan bowlers, particularly taking 28 runs off Farooqi's 17 balls.

Skipper Steve Smith was at the other end, playing a more measured knock with 19 not out from 22 balls, including two boundaries

With no result from this match, Afghanistan's chances are slim and would depend on the result of Saturday's match between South Africa and England.

If South Africa win, they will top the

group with five points. If England emerges victorious, South

Africa and Afghanistan will both finish on three points, leading to a net run-rate (NRR) calculation. Earlier in the day, Afghanistan posted

a competitive total of 273, largely due to Sediqullah Atal's gritty 85 and Azmatullah Omarzai's explosive 67.

Atal then took charge, initially struggling against Johnson's movement, but settling in with crisp cover drives and flicks.

He found a steady partner in Hashmatullah Shahidi, and together they stitched a 68-run stand, navigating Australia's spinners on a sluggish pitch. Atal brought up his second ODI fifty in style, launching Maxwell over mid-on for a six.

He later dismantled Zampa with two more sixes but fell 15 short of a maiden hundred, chipping a Johnson delivery to Steve Smith at short cover in the 32nd over.

His dismissal at 159/4 triggered a collapse, with skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi (20 off 49) falling soon after, and Mohammad Nabi getting run out in a bizarre fashion.

From 182/6, Afghanistan struggled to keep the momentum, and at 235/8 after Rashid's departure, they were staring at a modest total. All-rounder Omarzai, fresh from a match-winning 5/58 haul and 41-run contribution against England, then took charge.

Unfazed by the situation, the No. 6 batter played with calm assurance, reaching his eighth ODI fifty off 54 balls with a single off Dwarshuis in the 48th over.

Pakistani pitches flat, Dubai slower, but India in good shape

NEW DELHI, Mar 1 (Agencies): Former India opener Robin Uthappa believes that the Indian team has a "familiarity" advantage of playing all their Champions Trophy campaign matches at Dubai International Stadium. "I will not say it's a home advantage, but there is definitely an advantage of familiarity. I heard an interview where former India opener Wasim Jaffer was saying that there could have been one match in Abu Dhabi, one in Dubai, and one in Sharjah, and definitely that could have been done so that other teams couldn't find a reason to complain," said Uthappa. He further added, "However, we must ask why we didn't go to Pakistan? Because of the geo-political situation. And each country has their right to decide if they don't want to travel to a particular nation. If one country ends up playing in one venue, then so be it. India could have complained that

had they played on flat Pakistani pitches, their record could have been nicer. Each batsman would have got an opportunity to score heavily. You may say whatever, but at the end of the day, cricket is a contest between bat and ball, and the team which plays well on that day wins. And those who complain, you can sense their mental state. It becomes so obvious."

Uthappa and current UAE head coach Lalchand Rajput have a reunion ahead of the India-New Zealand game in Dubai.

The duo, who was part of India's inaugural 2007 T20 World Cup winning team under the leadership of MS Dhoni, spoke at length about the importance of happiness in life. They spoke at the launch of a book - Life Lessons from Cricket. The book has been written by senior journalist Vimal Kumar along with Ashish Ambasta. The foreword of the book has been written

by former India coach Greg Chappell, and the preface by 2011 World Cup winning support staff Paddy Upton. Meanwhile, on India's preference for semifinal opponent, the former opener added: "Genuinely, as a cricketer, it does not matter to us who is going to be our opponent. We as a team should focus on our form, strength, and the mood of the team, which is more important than who we are going to face or the pitches we are going to play on. They will concentrate on what we are going to do to win the game.'

Rajput Rajput also seconded Uthappa and maintained that Pakistani pitches are flat. "See, there is definitely an advantage as one team is playing all matches in one venue. But if you look closely, Pakistani pitches are flat while Dubai is on the slower side, and it will take some effort to get used to these conditions quickly," he said.

On the upcoming clash with New Zealand, Rajput added: "See, for a coach, there is nothing called an inconsequential game, as you want your team to win every match and want to play your best players unless there is an injury or workload management. When you are having a good run, it's important to maintain the momentum. Sometimes when you qualify and make changes, and if we lose, then in the next game there is the same kind of pattern (like lack of rhythm), and hence when you are having a good time, we have to finish, we should always be on top." He also appreciated Virat Kohli and Indian skipper Rohit Sharma. "To be very honest, I had predicted very early that he (Kohli) would break Sachin Tendulkar's record. He still has got the same hunger and passion, and 300 is a lot of games. He is still so fit and every run is so important for him, and he values

his wicket. That is why he is number 1," he added. "As a captain, he (Rohit) is the best so far with young players. He keeps the dressing room very happy. Because he allows the batsmen to perform well and doesn't put any pressure, and he is a jolly mood fellow. He keeps the mood very light, and that is what you saw in the West Indies when India won the T20 World Cup. Apart from the captain, he is also a friend, philosopher, and guide for many players. So, I think this CT will be another feather in his cap. And the way India has played so far, I do believe that there is another global trophy India can win."

Former India opener VVS Laxman and IPL chairman Arun Dhumal have spoken glowingly about the book. Besides the topic of Life Lessons from cricket, both guests spoke on some important topics of the ongoing Champions Trophy in Dubai.

Illegal 'constructions' going on in Qazigund; Admin silent


Matter taken up with higher ups for necessary action: Tehsildar **Top News Report**
