Two killed in Nowyug **Tunnel** accident on JK highway

JAMMU, Apr 2 (Agencies): Two people injured in a road accident near the Nowyug Tunnel on the Jammu-Srinagar highway last evening succumbed to their injuries, an officials said here on Wednesday.

Around 8:40 pm Tuesday, a Hector vehicle traveling from Jammu to Srinagar lost control near the Nowyug Tunnel due to overspeeding and collided with a divider and a police barrier, they said. The crash left five people including a Special Police Officer (SPO) injured.

All Injured were shifted to Emergency Hospital Qazigund for treatment, where from they were shifted to Government Medical College Anantnag for further treatment.

"One injured person Zubair Ahmad Wani of Heerpora Shopian was declared dead on his arrival. A second person identified as Mushtag Ahmad Dalal, a resident of Shopian succumbed to his injuries during the night," officials said.

Police registered a case under section 281,125(a), 324(4) BNS in Police Station Qazidund Kulgam and took

up the investigation. Six days ago, an accident took place inside the Navyug Tunnel in which 17 people, including the driver, were injured after an SRTC bus overturned.

Property of drug peddler attached in Rajouri

JAMMU, Apr 2 (Agencies): Authorities on Wednesday attached immovable and movable properties of an alleged drug peddler in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district, officials said.

The residential and commercial buildings and a car owned by Haroon Rashid of Rajouri tehsil have been frozen under sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act (NDPS), 1985, officials said.

The action was taken as part of ongoing efforts to curb the narcotics menace in the region.

Rashid is allegedly involved in several cases of drug peddling.

Pakistan Army violates ceasefire after mine blast along loc in Poonch

JAMMU, Apr 2 (Agencies): Pakistani troops violated the ceasefire by resorting to unprovoked firing after a mine exploded along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir, a defence spokesman said on Wednesday.

He said the Indian army responded "effectively" to the ceasefire violation and continues to dominate the LoC where the situation is under control.

Official sources said the violation took place at 1.10 pm on Tuesday.

While the Indian Army made no mention of any casualty on the Pakistan side, the sources said five enemy soldiers were



injured in the explosion and the subsequent firing between the two sides

"On 01 Apr 2025, a mine blast occurred in Krishna Ghati Sector while the Pakistan Army was patrolling along the LoC. This was followed by unprovoked firing and ceasefire violation by Pakistan Army," Jammubased defence PRO Lt Col Suneel Bartwal said in a revised statement.

"Own troops responded effectively. The Indian Army continues to dominate the LoC. The situation is under control," he said.

The earlier statement had mentioned that "a mine blast occurred in Krishna Ghati Sector intrusion across LoC".

On February 21, India and Pakistan military held a flag meeting along the LoC in Poonch district in an effort to deescalate tension after several incidents of cross-border firing and an IED attack.

The brigade-commander level flag meeting, lasting 75 minutes, had taken place in the Chakkan-Da-Bagh crossing point area with both sides highlighting the need to maintain peace along the bor-

Employees entitled to 42-Day special casual leave for organ donation: Centre NEW DELHI, Apr 2 organ(s)," Union Minis-

(Agencies): Central government employees are entitled to get a maximum of 42 days of special casual leave for organ donation, the Lok Sabha was informed on Wednesday.

"The government of India has provided a maximum of 42 days special casual leave to central government servants for donating their ter of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh said in a written reply to a question.

Irrespective of the type of surgery for removal of a donor's organ, the duration of special casual leave will be a maximum of 42 days as per the recommendation of government registered medical practitioner/doctor, according to an order issued by the Personnel Ministry in 2023, when the provision was announced.

Special casual leave shall normally be taken in one stretch starting from the day of admission in the hospital, it had said.

However, in case of requirement, it can be availed starting maximum one week prior to

Sajad Lone Slams Proposed Waqf Law Amendments, Calls It an Attack on Muslim Rights

SRINAGAR, Apr 2 (Agencies): Peoples Conference President and Handwara MLA Sajad Lone has strongly opposed the proposed amendments to Wagf laws, calling them an attack on the religious rights of Muslims.

Sajad Lone in a post on X wrote, "Waqf by definition is the custodian of properties which are collectively owned by Muslims. It is an Islamic concept."

He asserted that the



move by Parliament was a direct assault on the religious autonomy of Muslims. "The proposed amendment by Parliament is a blatant interference in our faith aimed at divesting rightful custodians of their authority," he said.

Lone further described the bill as "yet another right-wing trespass," alleging that such measures were being taken to undermine the religious and institutional structures of Muslims.

The proposed Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, has sparked opposition from several political parties, with concerns raised over its impact on Wagf properties and Muslim religious affairs.



One of the primary concerns raised during the meeting was the regularization of daily wagers. The association demanded that CP, ITI, and Land Case Workers who have completed seven years of service be regularized under SRO-64 without any further delay. It was also stressed that all pending documentation should be completed to ensure timely wage disbursement in the future.

The meeting also highlighted the issue of pending wages, as workers have not received their salaries for 65-70 months (2014-2020). The association demanded that these longoverdue wages be released with interest, including dues for retired employees who have served 25-28 years in the department.

Another major demand was the implementation of the Minimum Wages Act. T

he association pointed out that while Leh UT has enhanced daily wage rates, the Lieutenant Governor of J&K has yet to take similar action. Currently, daily wagers in Jammu are paid a mere □311 per day, one of the lowest rates in the entire country. The association urged the government to align wage rates with those of Delhi UT to ensure

fair compensation for workers. A significant issue discussed was the acute shortage of staff in the department. Thousands of workers are needed to maintain newly commissioned water supply schemes, yet no provision has been made for their recruitment. Many schemes are now non-functional due to staff shortages, and daily wagers are being overburdened with additional work without proper wages. The association made it

clear that no worker should be forced to take on the duties of retired employees or new projects without proper staffing and compensation.

Additionally, the association demanded that the pending 2% DA (Dearness Allowance) be released immediately for UT employees, as the Central Government has already approved it. Som Nath appealed to the government to take immediate action and end the delaying tactics that have caused extreme hardship for daily wagers.

He urged authorities to fulfill these long-overdue demands and ensure that workers receive the rights and benefits they deserve. The meeting was attended by several senior leaders, including Vijay Kumar Sharma, Surai Parkash, Dinesh Kesar, Sham Singh, Karan Singh, Rattan Lal, Mohan Singh, Janit Ali, Puran Chand, Prabu Lal, and Shanker Dass, who all supported the demands put forth by the association.

Why "NO" action on pension updation of Bank Retirees even after 30 years?

ension is one of the important social security measure. It is based on the concept that it is the duty of the employers and governments to provide for a respectful and decent living to their workers after retirement, considering the services rendered to the institution and the country. Being a retired Senior Office from Bank, I would like to point out that the bank pension scheme, effective from November 1, 1993, remains unchanged, contrasting with other public sector schemes that have seen periodic revisions. Despite a Supreme Court ruling affirming pensions as a right, the push for pension revision in banks has not been prioritized. The justified demand of bank retirees was not fulfilled even after their representatives have met FM not less than four times in the past by All India Bank Pensioners & Retirees Confederation, an organization for banking sector retirees, by

and for retirees (AIBPARC)

viz they met twice late FM Shri Arun Jatley and the Present FM Nirmala Sitharaman. The bank pension scheme implemented from 01-11-1993 with retrospective effect from 01-01-1986, still continues without any change. This problem was faced in almost all pension schemes in the orga nised sector. But over the passage of time, a system of periodical revision came into practice in almost all areas, except banking. The present system of pension revision along with revision of salary is prevailing in Central Government service since the time of fifth pay commission in 1996.

Today, Officers and workmen retired from nationalised banks are much worried on "NO" action on 'provision for pension updation' is forthcoming even after 30 years of an agreement 'with enabling provision.' In Reserve Bank of India, however, the retiree pension was revised as per a circular dated March 7, 2019, which was followed up by another one dated July 13, 2023. Pension scheme in Banks is patterned on the lines

of the pension schemes of the Government and the Reserve Bank of India pensioners and that there is a robust pension fund of more than Rs 4.27 lakh crore including SBI as on March 2024.

The plight of thousands of retirees and pensioners, who after years of dedicated service to the country, are struggling to meet ends pending pension updation. No pension updation exercise was carried out for the banking sector in the past 30 years which is effectively depriving sources of sustenance after employees gave their best years to the organization they served.

Though the IBA and some other quarters argue to the contrary, it is a fact and realty that provision for pension is inbuilt in the Pension Regulations 1993 and there is no provision in it preventing the revision of pension. It is appropriate to note that the pension scheme in RBI was revised twice during this period and the pension scheme in banks are drawn in similar lines with that of RBI. It is a great prejudice that the authorities have

till date not showed any liking to do justice to their legal, social and moral obligation. The bank retirees are still subjected to this negligence and exploitation.

The demand of bank retirees was not fulfilled even though the All India Bank Retirees' Federation has met the Finance Minister four times in the past one and half years. The Union government must not forget the years of services rendered by the Bank retirees and they must be treated justly, enabling the retirees to lead a dignified life post-retirement. Government should not continue to ignore the demands, including that for an increase in pension, raised by retired bank employees who had a key role to play in the growth of public sector banks in the country.

Waqf amendment bill an unconstitutional assault on Muslim religious rights: Hakeem Yaseen

SRINAGAR, Apr 2: Hakeem Muhammad Yaseen, President of the Jammu and Kashmir Peoples Democratic Front (PDF) and former minister, has vehemently opposed the proposed amendments to the Waqf Act, terming them as a direct assault on the religious rights of Muslims and an infringement upon their faith.

He asserted that such amendments are unjustified and go against the secular ethos of the Indian Constitution.

"India is a secular country, and the Constitution guarantees freedom of religion to all its citizens. Muslims from Jammu and Kashmir and across the country have made immense sacrifices for India's independence, and the government must respect their rights and aspirations," PDF leader said.

Hakeem Yaseen expressed deep concern over the ruling government's claims of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas," highlighting that such moves only serve to create division instead of fostering national unity.

He questioned the rationale behind the selective targeting of Muslim religious institutions while other religious communities enjoy autonomy in managing their affairs.

"If Sikh, Hindu, and Christian religious institutions enjoy autonomy, why are exclusive laws being framed to regulate Muslim institutions? This is blatant discrimination and interference in the religious affairs of

Muslims. The Bill should be reconsidered in the spirit of fairness and justice," he said.

The senior leader did not mince words in his criticism, calling the Bill a serious attack on the Indian Constitution. "Through this Bill, the government aims to dilute constitutional rights, defame minority communities, divide Indian society, and disenfranchise minorities."

Hakeem Yaseen also warned that any move to interfere with religious autonomy could have serious repercussions. He urged the central government to withdraw the proposed amendments and respect the religious autonomy of all communities.

He emphasized that such unilateral decisions without proper consultations would only deepen the existing trust deficit between the government and minor-



ity communities.

"India thrives on its diversity and pluralism. Any attempt to disrupt this harmony will only weaken the country. The government must reconsider its stance and engage with all stakeholders before making such significant

changes," he asserted.
The former minister called upon political parties, religious scholars, and civil society organizations to come forward and oppose the proposed amendments collectively.

He reiterated that protecting the rights of religious institutions is crucial for maintaining the social fabric of the nation and ensuring equal treatment of all communities.

Shah's 12 crore workers versus 5 family men retort to Akhilesh's BJP chief poll delay jibe

NEW DELHI, Apr 2 (Agencies): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday hurled a "dynastic parties" salvo at Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav who asked why the ruling BJP was finding it hard to elect its new president.

"In our party 12 crore workers have to elect a president. On your side five people in one family have to select. Because we have to elicit opinion from crores of workers it takes time," said Shah after Yadav rose to speak on the Waqf Amendment Bill 2025 being debated in Lok Sabha today.



Shah also told Yadav, "I can declare sitting here today that

you will be your party's president for 25 years, no one can

replace you."

Yadav quickly deflected the issue and said: "there's one more thing about a certain yatra and whether it was meant to extend the retirement age beyond 75 years".

Yadav's reference was to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to RSS headquarters in Nagpur on March 30 and claims of Shiv Sena UBT leader that Modi had gone there to announce his retirement as per the party's rule to retire leaders at 75 years.

Modi will turn 75 on September 17 this year.

Rail accidents came down to 81 in FY25: Vaishnaw



NEW DELHI, Apr 2 (Agencies): Railway safety has improved with the number of rail accidents coming down significantly to 81 in the last financial year from the 400 earlier, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw asserted on Wednesday.

During the Question Hour in the Lok Sabha, he also said that continuous efforts are being made, including by way of technological and procedural changes and training methods, to further bring down the rail accidents in the country.

Vaishnaw said there has been a very significant improvement in railway safety.

"During Lalu ji time, there were around 700 accidents per year, during Mamata Ji's time, there were around 400 accidents, during Kharge ji's time, there were around 385 accidents...In the just closed financial year (2024-25), the number has reduced from 400 to 81, there has been a very significant improvement," he said.

Lalu Prasad Yadav, Mamata Banerjee and Mallikarjun Kharge had served as railways ministers.

To a query about instances of delay in filing of FIRs for crimes related to railways, the minister said the GRP (Government Railway Police) of each state and RPF (Railway Protection Force) continuously have discussions and implementation of the system for zero FIRs will help address the issues.

Waqf bill attack on Constitution's basic structure, INDIA bloc opposes it: Gogoi

NEW DELHI, Apr 2 (Agencies): Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi on Wednesday said the INDIA bloc will oppose the proposed changes to the Waqf law and called the bill an attack on the basic structure of the Constitution with an aim to dilute its provisions, defame minorities, disenfranchise them and divide the Indian society.

Hitting back, former Union minister and BJP leader Ravi Shankar Prasad said when large number of Waqf properties are lying vacant and being looted, the government has all powers to bring a law to regulate it.

He told Gogoi that while he cited Constitution, he did not present a complete picture on its various provisions authorising government to bring laws on various issues, including Waqf properties.

Initiating the debate on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, Gogoi accused the government of misleading Parliament, referencing past discussions on the matter. "This bill is an attack on the basic structure of our Constitution, an attack on our federal structure, and has four primary objectives: to dilute the Constitution, to defame minority communities, to divide Indian society, and to disenfranchise

minorities," he alleged.
"The claim that the
2013 UPA government
did not act on this issue
is false. Repeated alle-

gations have been made," Gogoi said, questioning the necessity of the amendments. He further argued that the bill had not been adequately discussed with minority represen-

tatives.

"In 2023, four meetings of the Minority Commission were held, and yet, there was no mention of the need for a Waqf amendment bill. I ask the government — was this bill drafted by the Minority Affairs Ministry or some other department?" The opposition MP also raised concerns over Clause 3, which defines individuals practising Islam.

"Minorities are now being forced to prove their religious identity with certificates. Tomorrow, will people from other faiths also have to do this? This is against Article 26 of the Constitution," he said.

"Which community do you want to mislead? The same community that fought for India's independence? The community that sacrificed alongside Mangal Pandey in 1857? You want to tarnish the reputation of a community in which 2 lakh ulema were martyred? You seek to defame the community that supported us during the Quit India Movement? You want to stain the name of the community that supported the Dandi March on April 6, 1930?" Gogoi said.

"You wish to malign the community that opposed the British policy of divide and rule in 1926? You aim to taint the community whose leader, Maulana Hussain Ahmad Madani, demanded complete independence?" he added.

Gogoi also accused the government of spreading misinformation about the bill's impact on women's rights.

"There is an attempt to create the illusion that the existing law discriminates against women. In reality, the law already has provisions for the protection and empowerment of women, including widows," he said.

He also claimed that the Joint Parliament Committee did not take any suggestions of the Opposition into consideration. Gogoi noted the reduction in revenue allocation from 7 per cent to 5 per cent, arguing that instead of reducing it, the government should consider increasing it to 11 per cent to strengthen the Wagf Board. He also claimed that provisions on imprisonment had been diluted. "There is a clear attempt to take control of Waqf properties. Today, their eyes are on one minority group; tomorrow, they will target another. We support necessary reforms, but this bill will only lead to increased litigation and more prob-

lems," he said.

Countering the Opposition attack, Prasad



said the church community is also in favour of Waqf amendment bill as churches too are facing the problem of encroachment by Waqf bodies.

He said the government cannot watch silently as corruption on Waqf properties continue unabated.

"Waqf is not a religious body; it is a statutory body. There are over 8 lakh Waqf properties, including schools, hospitals, and orphanages. Shouldn't there be a mechanism to ensure proper governance? The opposition is politically bound to oppose reforms, but they must look within themselves," he added.

Prasad said that the amendments were necessary to ensure transparency and fairness in Wagf administration.

"The Waqf Bill is about regulating properties, not about targeting any community. If the bill provides more representation to backward Muslims in Waqf affairs, why is the opposition objecting? If Waqf properties are being misused or illegally occupied, the Constitution allows for corrective legislation,"

he said.

Prasad said the Congress has over the years only paid lip service to the cause of minorities but did nothing to empower them.

He also referenced the Shah Bano case, accusing the Congress of undermining legal reforms for political gains.

"When the Supreme Court ruled in favour of Shah Bano, the Rajiv Gandhi government overturned the decision for vote bank politics. Congress had 400 seats then but never got a majority after that. Today, they continue to oppose necessary reforms for political reasons," he said.

According to the bill, trusts created by Muslims under any law will no longer be considered Waqf, ensuring full control over them.

Only practising Muslims (for at least five years) can dedicate their property to Waqf, restoring the pre-2013 rules. Also, women must receive their inheritance before Waqf declaration, with special provisions for widows, divorced women and orphans, the bill proposes.

India's media ecosystem doesn't need validation from foreign bodies: Govt

NEW DELHI, Apr 2 (Agencies): India has a vibrant press and media ecosystem which does not need validation from foreign organisations, the government told the Lok Sabha on Wednesday.

Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting L Murugan said this in a written response to a question from Congress MP K Sudhakaran, who asked about "India's decline in the Global Press Freedom Index ranking in 2024".

"India has a vibrant press and media ecosystem, which does not need validation from foreign organisations," he said.

In its report published last year, global media watchdog Reporters Without Borders (RSF) ranked India 159th out of 180 countries based on journalists' ability to work and report freely and independently.

India was ranked below Turkey, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, which

stood at 158th, 152nd, and 150th positions, respectively. RSF has consultative

status with the United Nations, UNESCO, the Council of Europe and the International Organisation of the Francophonie. Asked about steps

taken by the government to safeguard press freedom and journalists' rights, the minister said freedom of speech and expression is protected under Article 19 of the Constitution.

He added that India has a robust judicial system that ensures the enforcement of constitutional provisions.

The minister also said the Press Council of India (PCI), an autonomous statutory body set up under the Press Council Act, 1978, and headed by a retired Supreme Court judge, adjudicates complaints from journalists about curbs on press freedom, physical assaults and attacks on journalists.

Under Section 13 of the Press Council Act, 1978, the PCI can also take suo motu cognisance of urgent issues related to press freedom and maintaining journalistic standards. Similarly, he said

press freedom in electronic media is ensured through a self-regulatory mechanism under the Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1995.

2 women Naxalites killed in police encounter in Madhya Pradesh's Mandla district

BHOPAL, Apr 2 (Agencies): Two women Naxalites were killed in an encounter with the police in Madhya Pradesh's Mandla district on Wednesday morning, a senior official said.

The gun battle took place under Bichhiya police station limits, Director Gen-

eral of Police (DGP) Kailash Makwana said.

An SLR rifle, an ordinary rifle, wireless set and some items of daily use were recovered from the spot.

The search was on for other Naxalites, the DGP said.

IMPHAL, Apr 2 (Agencies): Former Manipur chief minister N Biren Singh on Wednesday said that thousands of refugees settled in the state since 1960s with the knowledge of the authorities and those people were provided assistance for rehabilitation.

Singh, who resigned as the chief minister in February leading to imposition of President's Rule in the restive state, also wondered what happened to those families and whether those people were added to the electoral roll.

His comments, made in a lengthy post on X, came a day after BJP MLAs of Manipur sought a "review" of the 2001 Census and implementation of the NRC before carrying out delimitation exercise in the state.

Singh, when he was the CM, and the Centre accused illegal immigrants from Myanmar of largely being respon-



sible for the ethnic violence in the state which left more than 250 people dead since May 2023. "Official records show

that even before we became a full-fledged state, thousands of refugees were settled here with the knowledge of the authorities at the time. As early as the late 1960s and early 70s, documents reveal the presence of over 1,500 families who had crossed over and were provided assistance for rehabilitation," Singh

said in the post.

Manipur became

a Union Territory on November 1, 1956, and was granted full statehood on January 21, 1972.

Singh asked, "What happened to those families? How were they integrated? How many generations have grown since then?... Were they eventually granted full rights? Were they added to electoral rolls?" These questions have never been fully addressed in the public domain and the issue has remained

largely unspoken, even as the demographic structure of the state changed over the years, the BJP leader claimed.

Paokai Haokip, then Member of Parliament from Manipur, wrote a letter to KC Pant, Minister of State for Home Affairs, informing him about the presence of over 1,500 refugee families who settled in Manipur by 1967, Singh said in the post, sharing a copy of the letter.

"His correspondence is just one among several that confirm how deeply rooted and long-standing this issue is," the former chief minister said.

Wondering whether Manipur was "a dumping ground for refugees from the very beginning", Singh said it is important to ask whether there were legal mechanisms in place to ensure these individuals remained in refugee status.

"Were they extended benefits meant for indig-

enous communities? These are not small matters; they touch the core of our identity, our social balance, and the direction we're heading in as a society," he said.

Singh said it is time to revisit this chapter and not to assign blame, but to understand what happened, reflect on its implications, and chart a fair and balanced path forward, as the issue has far-reaching consequences and will shape the state's present and future.

"From my experience in active politics and high office, I understand the weight it carries to a representative of the people. It's easy to go with the tide, but true responsibility lies in standing firm on facts. We owe it to our people to be truthful, defend their dignity, and be forward-looking. That's what it means to be a statesman, not just a politician," he said.

JAUNPUR, Apr 2 (Agencies): A final-year BSc student of biotechnology at Veer Bahadur Singh Purvanchal University allegedly committed suicide by hanging herself in her hostel room soon after talking to her fiance over phone, police said on Wednesday.

The incident took place in Jaunpur on Tuesday night when Shivangi Mishra (22), who was set to tie the knot with her fiance on November 25, reportedly took the extreme step, Superintendent of Police, Kaustubh, said.

pur village under the Jalalpur police station limits, Mishra was staying in room No. 35 at Laxmibai Women's Hostel.

According to her hostelmates, Shivangi was engaged in a loud conversation around 11 pm. When the noise subsided, they called her but she did not respond.

After repeated knocks on her door went unanswered, the other students alerted the hostel warden who informed the university authori-

As they broke open the

door, Mishra was found hanging from the ceiling fan with a 'dupatta' tied around her neck, the SP said.

She was immediately rushed to the district hospital, where doctors declared her dead on arrival, the officer said, adding that the body has been shifted to the mortuary for autopsy.

"Preliminary inquiries suggest that she may have been under stress over her upcoming wedding.


However, police are probing the case from all possible angles," the SP said.

US will boom: Trump rejects stagflation fears as experts warn of economic crisis

WASHINGTON, Apr 2 (Agencies): United States President Donald Trump on Wednesday brushed aside concerns about stagflation, insisting that America's economy is on the verge of a major resurgence.

When asked whether he was worried about stagflation — a combination of stagnant economic growth, high inflation, and rising unemployment — Trump responded, "I haven't heard that term in years. I don't know anything about it. This country is going to be more successful than it ever was. It is going to boom. We're going to have a boomtown. We're going

The President's remarks came at a time when economic analysts have raised alarms about the risk of stagflation - a scenario where economic growth slows while inflation remains high and unemployment rises. Historically, stagflation has

experts, Trump remained confident that the US economy would thrive, calling his ongoing term a 'golden age' for America. He also vowed to bring manufacturing and production back to the United States, emphasising economic self-sufficiency.

"We are going to bring manufacturing and products back to America. For instance, we need pharmaceuticals for our country

- we don't want to buy them from other countries. Similarly, we have our own lumber, we have our own energy. We don't need energy from Canada, we don't need lumber from Canada. In fact, we don't need anything from Canada. I believe this will be a golden age for America," Trump said during a press gaggle aboard his Air Force One flight.

With the impending rollout of Trump's reciprocal tariffs, economists are warning of a looming stagflation crisis in the United States.

Experts cite Trump's economic policies — tariffs, mass public sector layoffs, and government program shutdowns — as key drivers of these concerns. They said warning signs are already emerging, including declining consumer sentiment, falling stock markets, and persistent inflation.

Israel expands military operation in Gaza, plans to seize large areas

JERUSALEM, Apr 2 (Agencies): Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz announced a major expansion of the military operation in Gaza on Wednesday, saying large areas of the enclave would be seized and added to the security zones of Israel.

In a statement, Katz said there would be large-scale evacuation of population from areas where there is fighting, and urged Gazans to eliminate Hamas and return Israeli hostages as the only way to end the war.

He did not make clear how much land Israel intends to seize, how-

It has already set up a significant buffer zone within Gaza, expanding an area that existed around the edges of the enclave before the war and adding a large security area in the socalled Netzarim corridor through the middle of Gaza.

At the same time, Israeli leaders have said they plan to facilitate voluntary departure of Palestinians from the enclave, after **US** President Donald Trump called for it to be permanently evacuated and redeveloped as a coastal resort under US

control

Israel resumed air strikes on Gaza and sent ground troops back in this month, after two months of relative calm following the conclusion of a US-backed truce to allow the exchange of hostages held by Hamas for Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails.

Efforts led by Qatari and Egyptian mediators to get back on track talks aimed at ending the war have failed to make progress yet.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said the application of military pressure is the best way to get the remaining 59 hostages back.

Fire kills 3 in S Vietnam

HANOI, Apr 2 (Agencies): At least three people were killed in a fire at a two-story house in south Vietnam's Ho Chi Minh City early Wednesday morning, Vietnam News Agency

At around 3 a.m., the fire engulfed the 60-square-meter house located in a small alley in the city's district 8, the state-owned news agency reported.

When the fire broke out, there were eight people in the house. five of whom escaped in time, and three were trapped and died, according to the media

Japan launches new research institute for future pandemics

TOKYO, Apr 2 (Agencies): Japan has launched a new infectious diseases research institute, the Japan Institute for Health Security (JIHS), in an effort to prepare for future infectious disease crises.

The new institute was established through the merging of the National Institute of Infectious Diseases and the National Center for Global Health and Medicine, and will be responsible for information analysis, research and crisis response related



to infectious diseases. The JIHS will collect information on infectious diseases and conduct risk assessments in normal times while reporting scientific findings to the Government.

In the event of an infectious disease outbreak, the organization will work with the Government to develop drugs and vaccines and draw up guidelines for medical treatment.

China conducts military drills focusing on **Taiwan Strait**

TAIPEI. Apr 2 (Agencies): China conducted military drills around Taiwan for a second day Wednesday focusing on the Taiwan Strait separating the self-governing island democracy from China that is a crucial conduit for international trade.

The Strait Thunder-2025A drills were held Wednesday morning in the middle and southern areas of the Taiwan Strait, a People's Liberation Army spokesperson

Taiwan's military said it was closely monitoring the drills but there was nothing unusual on the island of 23 million people that China claims as its own territory.

Wednesday's exercises "focus on subjects of identification and verification, warning and expulsion, and interception and detention



so as to test the troops' capabilities of area regulation and control, joint blockade and control, and precision strikes on key targets." Eastern Theater Command spokesperson Shi Yi was quoted as saying on the Chinese Defense Ministry's Weibo social media account.

Taiwan on Wednesday reported 76 military aircraft, and 19 naval or government ships had entered waters and airspace near the island

over the past 24 hours, with 37 of the planes crossing the center line in the 160-kilometer (110-mille) wide Taiwan Strait that forms an unofficial border, but which China refuses to acknowledge.

China's Shandong aircraft carrier group also entered into Taiwan's air defense identification zone, a self-defined area tracked by the mili-

Beijing sends warplanes and navy vessels toward the island on a daily basis, and in recent years it has stepped up the scope and scale of these exercises. Taiwanese officials have recently warned that China could launch a sneak attack under the guise of military exercises.

Any conflict could draw in the U.S. which maintains a series of alliances in the region, provides Taiwan with high-tech arms and is legally bound to respond to threats to the island.

"Once again, China's aggressive military activities and rhetoric toward Taiwan only serve to exacerbate tensions and put the region's security and the world's prosperity at risk," State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce said.

"In the face of China's intimidation tactics and destabilizing behavior, the United States' enduring commitment to our allies and partners, including Taiwan, continues," Bruce said in a statement.

Taiwan has set up a central response group to monitor the latest exercises, according to Taiwan's Defense Minister Wellington Koo.

China's Taiwan Affairs Office said the exercises were directed at Lai Ching-te, Taiwan's strongly pro-independence president. Polling shows the overwhelming majority of the island's residents reject the possibility of Chinese rule and back their current state of Taiwan independence.

Taiwan and China split amid civil war 76 years ago, but tensions have risen since 2016, when China cut off almost all contacts with Taipei.

Myanmar earthquake victim rescued after 5 days, over 2,700 killed

MANDALAY, Apr 2 (Agencies): Rescuers on Wednesday pulled a man alive from the rubble five days after Myanmar's devastating earthquake, as calls grew for the junta to allow more aid in and halt attacks on rebels.

The shallow 7.7-magnitude earthquake on Friday flattened buildings across Myanmar, killing more than 2.700 people and making thousands more home-

Several leading armed groups fighting the military have suspended hostilities during the quake recovery, but junta chief Min Aung Hlaing vowed to continue "defensive activities" against "terrorists".

UN agencies, rights groups and foreign governments have urged all sides in Myanmar's civil war to stop fighting and focus on helping those affected by the quake, the biggest to hit the country in decades.

Hopes of finding more survivors are fading, but there was a moment of joy on Wednesday as a man was pulled alive from the ruins of a hotel in the capital Naypy-

The 26-year-old hotel worker was extracted by

team shortly after midnight, the fire service and junta said.

conscious, the man was pulled through a hole in the rubble and put on a stretcher, video posted on Facebook by the Myanmar Fire Services Department shows. Call for peace

Min Aung Hlaing said Tuesday that the death count had risen to 2,719, with more than 4,500 injured and 441 still missing.

But with patchy communication and infrastructure delaying efforts to gather information and deliver aid, the true scale of the disaster has yet to become clear, and the toll is likely to rise.

Relief groups say that that response has been hindered by continued fighting between the junta and the complex patchwork of armed groups opposed to its rule, which began in a 2021 coup.

Julie Bishop, the UN special envoy on Myanmar, called on all sides to "focus their efforts on the protection of civilians, including aid workers, and the delivery of life-saving assistance". Even before Friday's

earthquake, 3.5 million

a joint Myanmar-Turkish people were displaced by the fighting, many of them at risk of hunger, according to the United Dazed and dusty but Nations.

> Late Tuesday, an alliance of three of Myanmar's most powerful ethnic minority armed groups announced a one-month pause in hostilities to support humanitarian efforts in response to the quake.

> The announcement by the Three Brotherhood Alliance followed a separate partial ceasefire called by the People's Defence Force -- civilian groups that took up arms after the coup to fight junta rule.

> But there have been multiple reports of junta air strikes against rebel groups since the quake.

> "We are aware that some ethnic armed groups are currently not engaged in combat, but are organising and training to carry out attacks," said Min Aung Hlaing, mentioning sabotage against the electricity supply.

> "Since such activities constitute attacks. the Tatmadaw (armed forces) will continue to carry out necessary defensive activities," he said in a statement late Tuesday.

Thailand toll rises

Australia's government decried the reported air strikes saying they "exacerbated the suffering of the people"

"We condemn these acts and call on the military regime to immediately cease military operations and allow full humanitarian access to affected areas," Foreign Minister Penny Wong

Amnesty International said "inhumane" military attacks were significantly complicating earthquake relief efforts in Myanmar.

"You cannot ask for aid with one hand and bomb with the other," said the group's Myanmar researcher Joe Freeman.

Hundreds of kilometres (miles) away, in the Thai capital Bangkok, workers continued to scour a pile of rubble that formed when Friday's tremors collapsed a 30-storey skyscraper.

The structure had been under construction at the time, and its crash buried dozens of builders -- few of whom have come out alive.

The death count at the site has risen to 22, with more than 70 still believed trapped in the rubble.

Most immigrants at risk of deportation from US are Christian, report finds

WASHINGTON, Apr 2 (Agencies): As many as four in five immigrants at risk of deportation from the United States are Christian, according to a new report that calls on their fellow believers to consider the impact of the Trump administration's aggressive deportation policies.

The report says about 10 million Christians are vulnerable to deportation and 7 million US citizens who are Christian live in households where someone is at risk of deportation.

The report, under the auspices of maior Catholic and evangelical organisations, draws on a range of data, including percentages of religious affiliation in various migrant and national populations and on an advocacy group's analysis of US census data on migrants.

"Though we're deeply concerned about fellow Christians, we're not exclusively concerned with immigrants who happen to share our faith," said Matthew Soerens, vice president of advocacy and policy at World Relief, an evangelical humanitarian organization that cosponsored the report.

"As Christians, we believe that all people, regardless of their religious tradition or nationality, are made in God's image with inherent dignity," Soerens said in a video statement. But he added that many Christians in the US may not realise that most of those who could be deported share their faith. Other groups that helped produce the report include the National Association of Evangelicals, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Migration and the Centre for the Study of Global Christianity at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Massachusetts.

While the report doesn't advocate any political positions, it mainly seeks to raise awareness of the

issue among Christians, and some of its sponsoring groups have individually advocated for reforms that would give some categories of immigrants a path to legal status. Immigrants at risk of deportation range from those who crossed the border illegally to those who may have some sort of legal status that could be revoked.

For example, the Trump administration has taken steps to end temporary protected status, held by many from Venezuela and Haiti, as well as humanitarian parole that had been granted for others from those troubled countries as well as Cuba and Nicaragua.

President Donald Trump enjoyed wide support from certain Christian blocs in all three of his campaigns. In 2024, he was supported by about 8 in 10 white evangelical Christian voters, about 6 in 10 white Catholics and just over half of Latino evangelicals, according to AP VoteCast, a sweeping survey of more than 120,000 voters.

While the report doesn't directly refer to that support, it says it seeks to raise awareness of the potential impact of Trump's immigration crackdown. Even the fear of deportation could cause people to avoid going to public places — such as worship services. In an era when a growing number of people in the U.S. don't have a religious affiliation, many immigrants who are Christian have helped reenergise churches and spur their growth, said Walter Kim, president of the National Association of Evangelicals. "They're coming from parts of the world where the church is actually thriving," Kim said. "Not only are they bringing that thriving faith and contributing to America, they're also contributing to the vibrancy of the church in America." Mass deportation would amount to a government-fostered "church decline strategy," Kim said.

Kim said his organisation has long advocated for reforms that would distinguish between those convicted of violent crimes and "the much larger share of immigrants who are contributing to our communities and to our churches, and who are serious and eager" to stay in the country.

Many studies have found immigrants are less drawn to violent crime than native-born citizens.

The recent report said Catholics in particular represent more than half of all those vulnerable to deportation in the United States, noted Bishop Mark Seitz, chair of the Committee on Migration of the bishops' conference. The deportations would likely

separate family members, Seitz said. "We know the impact of tearing apart the family unity and also the tremendous threats that are faced by people who are summarily deported to their home countries, which they fled in the first place because of the tremendous threats they were living under there," said Seitz, who heads the Diocese of El Paso, Texas.

They face danger from government oppression and organized crime in their home countries, Seitz said.

"People are going to die if this deportation effort continues at the level it is," he said.

The report's methodology included calculating the percentages of Catholics, evangelicals and other Christian groups in the countries from which immigrants originated, based on self-reported affiliations. The report then applied those percentages to immigrant populations within various categories of immigrants. While such methods include numerous assumptions, many regions of origin for major immigrants and refugee groups, including Latin America, sub-Saharan Africa and Ukraine. have large Christian populations.



"Digvesh Singh admitted to the Level 1 offence under Article 2.5 and accepted the Match Referee's sanction." an IPL media advisory stated.

"For Level 1 breaches of the Code of Conduct, the Match Referee's decision is final and binding.'

The controversial celebration took place on the penultimate ball of the third over during PBKS' chase of 172.

Digvesh bowled a short and wide delivery, which Arya attempted to pull without much foot movement, only to topedge the ball. Shardul Thakur sprinted from mid-on and completed a running catch.

As Arya walked back to the pavilion after scoring eight off nine balls, Digvesh, his teammate from the Delhi T20 League, mimicked writing a letter — an act seemingly directed at Arya.

The umpires took note of the gesture and had a word with the bowler as it also drew immediate comparisons to West Indies pacer Kesrick Williams, who popularised the 'notebook' celebration after dismissing opponents, including a famous spat against Virat Kohli during a 2019 bilateral series.

Cricket legend Sunil Gavaskar and Mohammed Kaif, while doing commentaries, did not appreciate Digvesh's antics.

The leg-spinner was the pick of the LSG bowling lineup, picking up 2/30 runs in his four overs.

However, the rest of the LSG bowling attack failed to make an impact as PBKS chased down the 173-run target in just 16.2 overs

The win propelled PBKS to second place in the IPL 2025 points table. PBKS, RCB, and DC currently have four points each, having won their first two matches.

JAMMU Apr 2: MSME-Development Nucleus Cell, Ladakh the field office of Union Ministry of MSME implements various schemes and activities for the benefit of MSMEs of Ladakh.

Cluster Development Programme is a scheme under which Common Facility Centre projects with Project Cost of up to 30 Crs can be taken up for implementation for the benefit of MSEs with 15% beneficiary contribution and remaining 85% as grant. As per the scheme guidelines the scheme may be implemented with close co-ordination with Government of Ladakh.

The objectives of the scheme are to enhance sustainability, Competitiveness and growth of MSEs by addressing common issues such as improvement of technology, skills & quality, market access, etc. Common Facility Centre can also be established for testing, training center, raw material depot, effluent treatment, complementing production processes. The detailed guidelines can be accessed at https://msmedijammu. gov.in/Resource/CDP-06-22.pdf

Ladakh region as a whole has a long tradition of growing horticulture produce unique to its Geo climatic condition. Apricot cultivation is done in more than 900 hectares as per department of horticulture with an annual production estimated above 5000 MT. Next to apricot is the Apple crop grown in Ladakh with cultivation area of more than 500 hectare with an annual production of above 3000 MT.

The apricot produced in Ladakh often fails to reach market in the same quality which is expected by the buyers due to various reasons including unscientific way of collection, drying method etc. Though the apricot crop from Ladakh reaches to various countries like Singapore, Mauritius, Vietnam, Dubai, USA, Bangladesh, Oman etc, still a lot of scope for improvement in value addition is available. Cluster Development Programme can be helpful for the entrepreneurs of Ladakh. G.Velladurai IEDS Joint Director of MSME DFO Jammu visited Khalsae in proposed Sham district of Ladakh to meet the entrepreneurs of the region to disseminate the awareness of MSE. CDP. To reap the benefit of the scheme Land for the proposed Common Facility Centre was found to be the bottle neck for which Namgyal of Khalsae has agreed to offer the Land for the proposed CFC. Detailed Project Report for the CFC is to be prepared with the inputs from all the stake holders.

The facilities proposed in the common facility center includes Drying of apricot, Apricot oil extraction, breaking seeds of apricot and option to use the facility for drying apples and other produce including horticulture production.

As per the scheme guidelines, projects with project cost up to 10 Crs can also be considered with beneficiary contribution of only 5% in case of Ladakh.


