#### **Soldier** shoots self at **Army Camp** in Ramban

JAMMU, Apr 6 (Agencies): A soldier allegedly committed suicide by shooting himself with his service rifle at an Army camp in Ramban district of Jammu and Kashmir in the early hours of Sunday, officials said. Sepoy Vijay Kumar, posted with 26 Rashtriya Rifles, was on sentry duty when he shot himself at Dharmund military hospital at 3.40 am, the officials said.

The reason behind his extreme step was not known immediately. The body has been shifted to Ramban district hospital for post-mortem, they said.

According to the officials. Kumar was a native of Rajasthan and had rejoined his duty on March 28 after availing almost two months of leave.

SRINAGAR, Apr 6 (Agencies): Cyber Police Station Kashmir Zone, Srinagar, has unearthed a sprawling and sophisticated network involved in the creation and management of mule bank accounts, which have become critical tools in the execution of largescale cyber fraud and

financial crimes. As per the statement issued by Police, A mule bank account is an account used to receive and transfer illicit funds on behalf of others, often in return for a commission. These accountsbelonging to individuals,

shell companies, and enterprises-are primarily scouted through social media platforms such as Telegram and Facebook, and are then remotely controlled by fraudsters operating from outside Jammu & Kashmir and even from overseas. Once these accounts

are set up, they are integrated into illegal payment gateways and used by criminal syndicates to collect deposits from victims on fake investment websites, offshore betting and gambling platforms, and fraudulent stock trading

portals. Funds received in these mule accounts are immediately layered and diverted to other accounts or converted into cryptocurrency to obscure the money trail. Bulk payout facilities provided by banks are also being misused in this process to distribute proceeds quickly. These accounts typically remain active for a short span-often less than a week-before being flagged due to suspicious transactions. However, within this brief window, transactions worth crores of rupees are executed and Turn to page 9





The triumvirate of Commerce ministry's secretary-level officer Rajesh Aggarwal, Foreign secretary Vikram Misri and India's ambassador to the US Vinay Kwatra is said to be exploring ways on how best to alleviate the concerns of US officials, so that both sides can "arrive at a win-win situation," the source said

As \$5.4 trillion is wiped from the US economy in the bloodbath over two trading sessions and China strikes back by imposing a 34 per cent return tariff on US goods, India's aim is to demonstrate an unshakeable resolve to protect its farmers, but at the same time agree to significantly reduce tariffs in the auto industry, for example, which are in any case beyond the ken of most people."If India opens up to the US auto industry, it is unlikely that Indian consumers are still going to buy American cars that are significantly more expensive than either the Maruti or cheaper Korean and Japanese cars," a source involved in the India-US negotiations told agency.

The sources said India is fully able and ready to answer US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick's recently question, "Why won't India buy even a single bushel of American corn?"

COLOMBO, Apr 6 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi departed for India on Sunday after concluding a "very productive" visit to Sri Lanka where he held extensive talks with President Anura Kumara Dissanayake and witnessed the signing of several agreements to boost cooperation in sectors such as defence, energy and digitalisation.

Modi arrived in the Sri Lankan capital from Thailand, where he attended a summit of the BIM-STEC (Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation).

"A very productive State Visit to Sri Lanka concludes. PM @ narendramodi emplanes for India," the Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X.

DUBAI, Apr 6 (Agencies): Suspected U.S. airstrikes killed at least two people overnight in a stronghold of Yemen's Houthi rebels, the group said Sunday, as a bombing video posted by U.S. President Donald Trump suggested casualties in the campaign may be higher than the rebels acknowledge.

The strikes in Saada killed two people and wounded four others, with footage aired by the Houthis' al-Masirah satellite news channel showing a strike collapsing what appeared to be a two-story building. The Iranian-backed Houthis aired no footage from inside the building, which they described as a solar power shop.

The intense campaign of airstrikes in Yemen under Trump targeting the rebels over their attacks on shipping in Mideast waters stemming from the Israel-Hamas war has killed at least 69 people, according to casualty figures released by the Houthis. However, the Houthis have not acknowledged any casualties from their security and military leadership something challenged after an online video posted by Trump.

Early Saturday, Trump posted what appeared to be black-and-white video from a drone of a group of several dozen people gathered in a had been killed in the strike Trump highlighted alongside his two brothers.

"The strikes have expanded significantly, hitting multiple goveronates simultaneously, alongside telecommunications infrastructure, command nodes, properties tied to senior Houthi leadership and previously untouched tunnel networks in mountainous areas," al-Basha told The Associated Press.

"We've also seen direct targeting of Houthi force gatherings, indicating a more aggressive and evolving shift in the targeting strategy," al-Basha said. An agency review has found the new American operation against the Houthis under Trump appears more extensive than those under former U.S. President Joe Biden, as Washington moves from solely targeting launch sites to firing at ranking personnel and dropping bombs on cities.

The new campaign of airstrikes started after the rebels threatened to begin targeting "Israeli" ships again over Israel blocking aid entering the Gaza Strip. The rebels have loosely defined what constitutes an Israeli ship, meaning many vessels could be targeted.

The Houthis targeted more than 100 merchant vessels with missiles and drones, sinking two of them and killing four sailors from November 2023 until January of this year. They also launched attacks targeting American warships without success.

The attacks greatly raised the profile of the Houthis, who faced economic problems and

#### **UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy calls** Israeli detention of two MPs "unacceptable, counterproductive"

LONDON, Apr 6 (Agencies): United Kingdom Foreign Secretary David Lammy expressed concerns over the detention and refusal of entry of two British MPs on a parliamentary delegation to Israel, calling it "unacceptable" and "counterproductive."

Lammy further emphasised the UK government's commitment to supporting the MPs and reiterated its focus on achieving a ceasefire and engaging in negotiations to "stop the bloodshed, free the hostages and end the conflict in Gaza.'

"It is unacceptable, counterproductive, and deeply concerning that two British MPs on a parliamentary delegation to Israel have been detained and refused entry by the Israeli authorities. I have made clear to my counterparts in the Israeli government that this is no way to treat British Parliamen-



tarians, and we have been in contact with both MPs tonight to offer our support," the UK government quoted Lammy in a statement.

"The UK government's focus remains securing a return to the ceasefire and negotiations to stop the bloodshed, free the hostages and end the conflict in Gaza," the statement added.

Notably, two British parliament members who support anti-Israel policies were denied entry to Israel today, Times of Israel reported,

citing the country's Population and Immigration Authority.

The Labour Party MPs, Abtisam Mohamed and Yuan Yang, were barred entry after questioning revealed that the purpose of their visit was "to document Israeli security forces and spread hateful rhetoric against Israel," the population authority in a statement said. During their interrogation, the two

MPs claimed that they had arrived as part of an official UK parliamentary delegation.

However, this claim was disproven as no Israeli authority had confirmed the arrival of such a delegation.

Interior Minister Moshe Arbel, therefore, decided to deny entry to all four individuals "in accordance with the law and ordered their removal from Israel," the population authority said, Times of Israel reported.

Cyber Police Kashmir cracks down on rising trend of cyber frauds

Cyber Police Kashmir has also discovered that several local kingpins are managing the operations of these accounts, acting as recruiters and handlers. These individuals onboard peopleoften from economically weaker sections-by offering commissions for account access.

In response to a request by Cyber Police Kashmir, the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (i4C), MHA, New Delhi has shared a list of 7,200 mule bank accounts operating from the Kashmir Valley alone-created since January 2025. This figure is expected to be

much higher as the investigation progresses. To date, Cyber Police Kashmir has registered 04 FIRs, and more are underway. Preventive security action has been initiated against 21 individuals, 19 of whom belong to Srinagar district. The hotspots for mule account activity include areas like Mehjoor Nagar, Natipora, Nowgam, Lasjan, Padshahibagh, Nowhatta, Khanyar, Rainawari, Soura, Batmaloo, Noorbagh, Qamarwari, Parimpora, Mujgund, Bemina, among others. Similar activities have been reported in other districts including Ganderbal, Kangan, Sumbal, Bandipora, Baramulla, Pulwama, Anantnag, Kulgam, and Shopian. Cyber Police Station Kashmir Zone, Srinagar, has strongly advised citizens not to sell or rent their bank accounts, company registration certificates, or Udhyam Aadhaar registration documents

to any individual or entity. Any such involvement in laundering illicit funds could result in serious legal consequences, including arrest under provisions related to organized crime and cyber fraud.

Banks are being encouraged to strengthen checks to detect misuse of accounts for illegal payment gateways. Citizens are urged to report any suspicious cyber activity immediately via helpline 1930 or online at www.cybercrime.gov. in. Cyber Police Kashmir remains fully committed to dismantling these networks and securing the financial ecosystem of the Valley.

# India 10th with \$1.4 bn pvt investment in AI: UN

(AI).

UNITED NATIONS, Apr 6 (Agencies): India and China are the only developing countries in the world with significant private investments in Al in 2023, according to a UN report. India ranks tenth.

The 2025 Technology and Innovation Report, issued by UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD), also states that India ranked 36th in 2024 on the 'Readiness for Frontier Technologies' index, improving its position from 48th in 2022.

India ranks 36th out of 170 nations on a global index measuring a country's readiness for frontier technologies, improving its ranking from last year, according to the report.

The index combines indicators for ICT deployment, skills, research and development (R&D) activity, industrial capacity, and access to finance.

India ranks 99th for ICT, 113th for skills, 3rd for R&D, 10th for industrial capacity, and 70th for finance.

Bhutan, India, Morocco, the Republic of Moldova and Timor-Leste improved their positions in human capital due to more years of schooling and a greater share of high-skill employment in their working populations, the report said.

The report also notes that China, Germany, India, the United Kingdom, and the United States show scientific strength in the field of Artificial Intelligence report said.

The US leads the world in terms of private investment in AI, at USD 67 billion in 2023, or 70 per cent of global AI private investment.

The only developing countries with significant investments were China in second position, with USD 7.8 billion, and India in tenth position, with USD 1.4 billion, according to the report. The report noted that AI is expected to reach USD 4.8 trillion in market value by 2033, becoming a prominent force in digital transformation.

However, access to AI infrastructure and expertise remains concentrated in a few economies. Only 100 firms, mainly in the US and China, account for 40 per cent of global corporate R&D spending. Al could impact 40 per cent of jobs worldwide, offering productivity gains but also raising concerns about automation and job displacement. The benefits of AIdriven automation often favour capital over labour, which could widen inequality and reduce the competitive advantage of low-cost labour in developing economies. However, Al is not just about replac-

Developing countries need to prepare themselves for a world that is rapidly being reshaped by AI and other frontier technologies. A useful measure in assessing national preparedness to use, adopt, and adapt frontier technologies is the UNCTAD Frontier Technologies Readiness Index.

"Developed countries lead the ranking, but some developing countries, notably Singapore, China, and India, hold prominent positions." The report stated that with regard to the top 10 economies in terms of cloud infrastructure services from major providers, China and the United States have more services than the rest of the world combined; India and Brazil are two developing countries on the list, along with Singapore. The United States has the most GitHub developers, followed by India and China.

Study identifies brain areas that influence political intensity

ILLINOIS, Apr 6 (Agencies): A person's level of political engagement can be influenced by a variety of factors, including education and environment. A new study led by Northwestern University and Shirley Ryan AbilityLab, has for the first time revealed which brain networks control political passion. The study analyzed Vietnam War veterans with and without brain injuries. By comparing people who had very localized brain lesions with those who didn't, the study team was able to identify the brain structures that can modify the intensity of political feelings. Damage to the prefrontal cortex, a region responsible for cognitive control and reasoning, led to an increase in the intensity of political feelings. Conversely, damage to the amygdala, a brain structure involved in emotional processing, decreased political intensity in participants. These findings held true even after accounting for factors like age, education, party affiliation, personality traits and other neuropsychiatric symptoms. "While most people have not sustained brain injuries akin to those experienced by the veterans in the study, our findings tell us what neural circuits are at play for the population at large," said senior author Jordan Grafman, professor of physical medicine and rehabilitation at Northwestern University Fein-

berg School of Medicine and director of brain injury research at Shirley Ryan AbilityLab.

study since his time in the U.S. Air Force decades ago. Between 2008 and 2012, neuroscientists conducted extensive behavioral questioning on these veterans, assessing various aspects of their political beliefs and intensity of feelings -- roughly 40 to 45 years after their injuries. Participants reported both their current political behavior and their recollections of pre-injury political behavior. The study included 124 male U.S. military veterans with penetrating head trauma and 35 combat-exposed control participants who had not sustained brain injuries. Prior to the questioning, scientists had already mapped the veterans' brain lesions using lesion network mapping, a neuroimaging technique that identifies the broader brain circuitry connected to a given lesion. They then analyzed whether specific brain networks were linked to political beliefs based on the behavioral data. Grafman, who has also studied links between the biological and cognitive underpinnings of religious fundamentalism, says understanding the brain's role in shaping beliefs "allows us to better assess meaningful aspects of life for patients and healthy individuals." Additionally, he says, "we expect this research will point to ways we can assist patients in recovering from brain injuries."

"We didn't find brain networks tied to liberal or conservative ideology, but we identified circuits that influence the intensity of political engagement across the political spectrum," Grafman added. "This suggests that factors like emotion shape how pre-existing political beliefs are expressed, rather than determining ideology itself."

Recognizing these brain mechanisms can help guide people in productive political engagement. For instance, one strategy would be to engage with others while reducing emotional attachment, or to take the position of an adversary in a discussion. Another approach would be to collaborate on a project both sides support.

The findings also have clinical implications. Currently, neuropsychiatric assessments rarely include questions about shifts in political behavior, but Grafman suggests they should. "Like other aspects of social behavior, assessments should consider asking whether a patient has experienced changes in their political attitudes since their brain injury,"

he said. Grafman and his team studied Vietnam veterans with and without brain injuries as part of the Vietnam Head Injury Study, a long-term project on the neurobehavioral effects of combatrelated brain injuries.

After scoring 205/4, the visitors kept Punjab to 155/9. Nothing worked for the Kings during their chase but the partnership between Nehal Wadhera (62 off 41 balls) and Glenn Maxwell (30 off 21 balls) as the duo braved the Royals' attack to keep Punjab in the fight.

The Royals performed well with both bat and ball to give the Kings a reality check. The Kings have now won only two of their last 15 home games.

Despite it being the highest total at this ground, it was not going to be easy to defend the target for the Royals, given the conditions and the depth in the Kings' batting. However, English pacer Jofra Archer got to work right away. A stunning 144.6kph thunderbolt sent back Kings' Impact Player Priyansh Arya on the first ball of Punjab's chase. The opener, who had posted an impressive 47 off 23 against Gujarat Titans, failed to read the delivery that scattered his bails. Kings skipper Shreyas lyer joined the crease and hit Archer for two fours but the pacer had the last laugh. Iver gave himself room to play a big shot but



missed Archer's full delivery that rammed into the stumps. Struggling at 11/2, there was more bad news for the home side as Marcus Stoinis (1) was caught by Sandeep Sharma off his own bowling. Local boy Prabhsimran Singh — who had scored 69 off 34 in their last outing against Lucknow Super Giants — was playing well until his mis-hit off Impact Player Kumar Kartikeya landed in the safe hands of Wanindu Hasaranga.

At 43/4, the Kings' innings was revived by Wadhera and Maxwell with an 88-run stand off 52 balls. However, with the required run-rate climbing, Maxwell perished in an effort to clear the rope with Yashasvi Jaiswal taking an easy catch off the bowling of Maheesh Theekshana. Off the very next ball, Wadhera also exited after Dhruv Jurel took a stunning catch off Hasaranga. The Kings' innings had nothing left in the tank after the fall of these two wickets as they accepted their first defeat of the season. Earlier, Jaiswal (67 off 45 balls) scored his first half-century of this JPL to give RB the perfect

this IPL to give RR the perfect start. Jaiswal and Samson (38 off 26 balls) were right on the mark with an 89-run stand in 10 overs. Lockie Ferguson dismissed the skipper, whose poorly-timed shot went right in the hands of lyer at mid-off. Samson threw his bat in frustration.

While the Kings were celebrating the skipper's wicket, Jaiswal continued. The 23-year-old, who had endured a lean patch in the opening three games with scores of 1, 29 and 4, roared back to form with a fluent halfcentury. However, he fell going after Ferguson, missing a welldisguised slower delivery that rattled his stumps.

Nitish Rana (12) got out cheaply but Shimron Hetmyer (20 off 12 balls) and Riyan Parag (43 off 25 balls) provided the late fireworks to lift the Royals past the 200-mark. The Royals plundered 55 runs in the final three overs to finish strongly.

"I thought that we would be conceding around 180-185 that would have been a great total to chase," lyer said.

"We gave away a few extra runs, were not able to execute according to our plans. Glad that the defeat happened at the start of the season. It was a decent pitch to bat on, it was holding a bit. We were trying to hit the deck and not give them much pace. We could have built a few partnerships and taken it a little slow, rather than over-attacking. Many things to learn from this game."
