BLSKS celebrates Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Jayanti with cultural fervour



SILENT CRIES

In the quiet corners of homes, behind the glowing screens of mobile phones, and beneath the loud laughter in school corridors, there exists a silence too heavy to ignore. Youth suicide is not merely a number or statistic—it is a heartbreaking reality unraveling in shadows. Each instance represents a story interrupted, a dream broken, and a voice that was never truly heard.

The youth, often celebrated as the vibrant architects of tomorrow, are finding it increasingly difficult to navigate the emotional storms of today. The age of adolescence, a beautiful blend of curiosity, chaos, and becoming, has slowly transformed into a battlefield of unseen emotional struggles. Depression, anxiety, social alienation, and identity crises have become deeply embedded in the experiences of the young. According to the World Health Organization, suicide is now the fourth leading cause of death among individuals aged 15–29—a grim statistic that underscores the urgency of the issue.

One cannot pinpoint a single cause behind this silent epidemic, for it is a result of complex and layered realities. The rise of digital platforms has amplified peer pressure and created illusions of perfection, leading many youth to feel inadequate. Social media, while connecting the world, has also alienated many by fostering unhealthy comparisons, online bullying, and a distorted sense of self-worth. The burden of academic performance and societal expectations further crushes their ability to breathe freely. The constant fear of failure, of not being good enough, of not fitting in, slowly chips away at their mental well-being.

What makes the situation even more distressing is the cultural silence that surrounds mental health, especially in many South Asian societies. Emotional struggles are often dismissed as a phase, a sign of weakness, or simply "attention-seeking." Young people are told to "stay strong" and "stop overthinking," leaving them feeling misunderstood and isolated. The stigma around mental illness discourages them from reaching out for help. As a result, many choose silence over support, burying their pain under smiles.

Yet, there is hope. Suicide is preventable. The change must begin with awareness and compassion. We must break the stigma around mental health and begin having open conversations. Schools should include emotional education alongside academics, and teachers must be trained to recognize early warning signs such as withdrawal, mood swings, and expressions of hopelessness. Parents too must cultivate environments of trust—where children are not afraid to speak up, cry, or falter. Accessible and affordable mental health services must be prioritized. Every school and college should have a counselor, and communities should run awareness campaigns that educate and empower. Social media platforms, too, can play a vital role by actively identifying and supporting users in distress. Strong anti-bullying policies, digital detox movements, and peer support networks can act as shields against the pressures youth face today. Families, most importantly, must listen not to respond, not to lecture, but to truly hear. The power of an empathetic conversation, a gentle hug, or a quiet presence can be life-saving. Ask twice when someone says they're fine. Be the sanctuary where emotions can be expressed without fear of judgment. Let love be louder than silence. Every suicide leaves behind a trail of whatifs. What if someone had noticed the signs? What if they had someone to talk to? What if their pain had been met with understanding instead of denial? Suicide is not about wanting to die—it is about not wanting to live in unbearable pain. But when that pain is acknowledged and supported, the darkness can give way to dawn. Let us, as a society, pledge to become more aware, more kind, and more proactive. Let us raise a generation that knows it is okay to not be okay, that asking for help is brave, and that healing is possible. Our youth are not broken—they are simply unheard. And now, more than ever, they need us to listen, to believe, and to walk with them into the light. In the echo of every lost life is a message a plea for change. Let's not wait for another obituary to light a candle. Let us be the candle. Let us be the voice that whispers, you matter, you are loved, you are not alone.

Policy induced uncertainty and the trust is simply gone

ne of US President Donald's Trump's favourite phrases is "I know all about it". The social media is full of the number of things that Mr Trump knows all about. Clearly, he was not aware that the bond market could pull the red carpet from under his feet. When some Japanese began selling American bonds, the alarm bells went on in Washington and the man who said world leaders had queued up to oblige him and "kiss his ass", suddenly retreated. Mr Trump's tariff tantrum began with a bang and ended with a whisper. It may not have ended as yet, but the fizz has gone out.

The world will no longer take President Trump seriously, unless of course he switches from trade to territory, occupying the Panama Canal and planting the American flag on Greenland. Mr Trump's destructive potential is still very high. After all, he is still the head of the most powerful government in the world. But with a head with not much to show for it. Any trickster can win an election. Running a government and managing a nation is an altogether different ball game.

A 90-day pause to hike in tariffs, with a 10 per cent across the board increase on all trading partners and a 145 per cent impost on China, remains in place. While this has brought some relief to the markets, it is not a reprieve from policy induced uncertainty. The whimsical manner in which President Trump has flip-flopped on a key policy instrument has had two consequences. It has created policy induced uncertainty on the economic front and broken trust between the United States and its allies and friends.

A key objective of the discipline of economics is to reduce uncertainty in the sphere of economic activity

of both firms and households. The discipline has tried to address this task based on two very different premises and perspectives. Mainstream economics, liberal and neoliberal, addresses the challenge of uncertainty by developing theories and theorems about the behaviour of economic agents and the impact of economic instruments on human behaviour. Homo economicus is expected to respond, ceteris paribus or "all other things being equal", in certain predictable and rational manner to different economic signals.

An alternative view has been that the actions and reactions of a multitude of individuals and firms are unlikely to produce predictable outcomes. To reduce uncertainty in the flows of income, the supply of goods, in savings and investment and so on it is best for the government to step in, plan investment, assign prices and so on. A socialist, planned and regulated economy tries to reduce uncertainty by increasing the role assigned to the government in the economy. Even in market-based, private sector-dominated economies, a government is expected to intervene to reduce uncertainty. Yet, every now and then government intervention can have the consequence not of reducing uncertainty but of inducing uncertainty. The demonetisation of currency notes is one such intervention that destabilises economic activity by inducing uncertainty both for firms and households. Indians are familiar with the destabilising consequences of economic uncertainty induced by the demonetisation decision of November 2018. US President Donald Trump's flipflops on tariffs is another example of the head of government inducing uncertainty with whimsical decision-making. Political leaders are elected to public office not to cause greater distress to firms and households but to create an

environment of stability and predictability. Granted that President Trump wanted to disrupt rather than stabilise. Disruption, however, is a one-way street, and a journey without maps. An institutional response in most democracies to the likely disruptions that can be caused by whimsical and dictatorial governance has been to create checks and balances and due process in decision-making. This would not only give an opportunity for different views to get expressed, but also afford time to all actors to consider and calculate the likely impact of alternative policies. That is why the American Constitution requires major policy decisions to be vetted by the United States Congress, and the Indian Constitution has created an upper and lower house of Parliament. When authoritarian heads of even a democratic government circumvent democratic institutions, bypassing institutional checks and balances, and dramatically announce ill-considered policy decisions, they impose a cost on the economy and on all players, firms and households. In theory free market, private enterprise economies are supposed to have their own internal stabilisers but when policy induced uncertainty gets in the way, the markets get perplexed. Yet, it is market dynamics that finally forced President Trump's hand. Perhaps it is not just the bond market that held Mr Trump's hand. Consider the protests in cities across the United States. Even if Mr Trump could dismiss them as Democrats and their protests as a demonstration of Opposition frustration, as often happens in India with ruling political parties, even Republicans began to have second thoughts. The growing anger within the US Congress and the summary manner in which the Trump administration officials were being upbraided in congressional hearings did find

public resonance. Finally, there was global public opinion and the reaction of friends and allies to consider. India of course decided that discretion was the better part of valour. The Prime Minister, the minister for commerce and industries and the normally communicative external affairs minister chose to remain silent, making hopeful references to the early completion of an India-US bilateral trade agreement (BTA). Even as discussions on a BTA are going on, the 10 per cent tariff hike is now in place and on this much has not been said as yet, except a proforma statement by the commerce minister that India will not accept any "deal at gunpoint" and that it will adopt an "India First" policy. Finally, the most important political outcome of the Trump Tariff Tantrum has been a sudden and massive loss of global trust in the present American leadership. From neighbours Canada to distant partners Japan, from European allies to friends in Asia like Singapore, and indeed India, most countries are going to be very wary of imposing any trust in the Trump administration. The combination of arrogance and incompetence, that we often see in the Indian political leadership across the spectrum, has now come to define the Trump administration. Who would want to risk trusting such a whimsical leadership?



To no one's surprise, the nomination list was dominated by Punjabi singers, including AP Dhillon, Karan Aujla, Chani Nattan, Inderpal Moga, Jazzy B and Jonita Gandhi. 'Arul', a fusion album of Carnatic and hip-hop by Tamil artistes Yanchan Rajmohan and Sandeep Narayan, was the only other nomination. It was a testament to Punjabi music's growing prominence in the maple leaf country. Dhillon was the winner in this category.

Dhillon, Aujla and new entrant Sukha featured across other categories as well. Aujla, who won the TikTok Juno Fan Choice award last year, was again nominated for the award. Dhillon was nominated in the Breakthrough Artiste or Group of the Year category. The proceedings at the ceremony began with a performance by Jazzy B, Chani Nattan and Inderpal Moga. If Diljit Dosanjh is the trailblazer behind the global appeal of Punjabi music, and Aujla has successfully synergised Bollywood and Punjabi music, it's the new generation of artistes that is charting a fresh course. These youngsters may not have any formal training, but they are gaining global recognition and creating waves in the industry. Take Sukha, a rising star from Toronto. His songs '8 Asle' and 'Godfather' have resonated with audiences far and wide. His unique blend of traditional Punjabi sounds with modern beats is captivating listeners, while the signature dastar (turban) adds to his distinct style. Harkirat Sangha of 'Gucci Gucci' fame may soon gain glory like the late Sidhu Moosewala, who also started his journey to stardom from Canada. Sangha blends classic Punjabi melodies with contemporary beats, creating music that appeals to both the traditional and the modern audiences. Not far behind is the Punjabi pop duo of Grewal and Pathaania, better known as Zehr Vibe. The two young artistes are already creating an impact. They fuse traditional Punjabi elements with modern influences, making their music accessible to a broader audience. Boom & Boon The Punjabi music scene in Canada is witnessing an explosion, with many young talented artistes coming from diverse backgrounds. They are experimenting with a fusion of styles,



often incorporating western music elements such as hiphop, R&B and electronic music into traditional Punjabi music. inis blending of genres is not only refreshing, but is also reflective of the multicultural fabric of Canadian society.

Canada-based Punjabi artistes have also been able to blend traditional Punjabi sounds because of their broader exposure to Gen Z influences and slangs, creating a fresh, engaging sound that gels with younger audiences. This balance is something that artistes in Punjab often struggle to achieve, as many still rely on chaste Punjabi.

These collaborations are not only introducing Punjabi music to new audiences (mostly white), but also enriching the artistes' creative process, allowing them to draw from each other's strengths.

"Their hard work has strengthened the BJP in Haryana, and I am proud that the BJP is extremely serious and working to fulfil the dream of 'Viksit Haryana, Viksit Bharat'," he said in his public address after launching the first commercial flight from Hisar to Ayodhya and laying the foundation stone of terminal-2 building at the Maharaja Agrasen Airport in Hisar that is expected to be completed within two years.

The airport terminal will be built at an estimated cost of over Rs 410 crore and is part of PM Modi's vision to make air travel safer, more affordable, and accessible to all.

Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, along with several state ministers, attended the event.

PM Modi said, "Before 2014, there were 74 airports in the country, but today there are over 150 airports...Imagine 74 airports in 70 years?... Every year, there are record airline



passengers in the country. On one the hand, our government is working on connectivity, and on the other, ensuring the welfare of the poor and social justice." The inauguration of the Hisar

airport marked a significant milestone in the state's development. It will boost regional connectivity and catalyse economic growth across the state.

Saying the Congress has only appeased fundamentalists, he said, "Haryana is that state where the youth in significant numbers join the army and serve the nation. The Congress for decades cheated regarding OROP."

He said that lakhs of hectares of land are in the name of Waqf. "Now, under the new Waqf law, this Waqf Board will not be able to touch any tribal's land or property in any corner of India. The new provisions will respect the sacred spirit of Waqf. The poor and Pasmanda families of the Muslim society, women, especially Muslim widows, and children will get their rights, and their rights will also be protected. This is real social justice."

The Prime Minister said the Congress government in Karnataka took away the rights of SCs, STs, and OBCs and gave reservations based on religion. "But Babasaheb, Ambedkar clearly stated that religionbased reservation will not be facilitated. The Congress' politics of appeasement has not helped the Muslim community, it has only harmed them. Congress chose to appease a few radicalists only."

The Congress, he said, stabbed the dream that Baba Saheb Ambedkar had seen -the provision for social justice that he had made in the Constitution -- and turned the provisions of that Constitution into a means of appeasement.

PM Modi said the Congress turned the Constitution into a mere tool for gaining power. "Whenever they felt that power slipping from their hands, they trampled upon the Constitution, just as they did during the Emergency."

"The spirit of the Constitution clearly says that there must be one common civil code for all citizens, which I call a secular civil code. But Congress never implemented it. In Uttarakhand, we have implemented a secular civil code, but the Congress continues to oppose it," PM Modi said.

He said the Congress treated SCs, STs, and OBCs as second-class citizens in this country. "While Congress leaders enjoyed luxuries like swimming pools, only 16 out of every 100 households in villages had access to piped water, and among those affected, the most were SCs, STs, and OBCs," PM Modi added.

Modi goverment only pays lip service to Ambedkar, BJP-RSS his enemies: Kharge



NEW DELHI, Apr 14 (Agencies): Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday accused the Modi government of paying only "lip service" to B R Ambedkar's legacy but doing nothing to fulfil his wishes, and claimed the BJP-RSS were "enemies" of the architect of the Constitution.

Hitting out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi over his criticism of the Congress' treatment of Ambedkar, Kharge cited a letter by Ambedkar in which he blamed S A Dange and V D Savarkar for his defeat in the elections of 1952. Speaking to reporters on the occasion of Ambedkar's birth anniversary, Kharge stressed the need for a nationwide caste census as well as implementation of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs in private educational

institutions. He said the Constitution is a gift from Ambedkar to citizens as it gives them the right of social, economic and

political justice. "In the AICC session, we have taken this forward. We forwarded the ideas of social justice in the AICC session," he said.

Situation in violence-hit areas of Murshidabad peaceful: Police

KOLKATA, Apr 14 (Agencies): The situation in violence-hit areas of Murshidabad district, mainly Suti, Samserganj, Dhulian and Jangipur, was peaceful and under control on Monday, a senior police officer said.

Prohibitory orders under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) remain in force in the violence-hit pockets where the roads wore a deserted look and shops downed their shutters.

The internet remains suspended in the affected areas while security forces are conducting checks on vehicles along the main roads.

Three people have died and several others injured in the violence which raged in Suti, Dhulian, Samserganj



and Jangipur areas since Friday afternoon but there was no report of any fresh incident from anywhere in the district.

A total of 180 people have been arrested in connection with the violence following protests against the Waqf (Amendment) Act till Saturday afternoon, he said.

"The situation in and around these disturbed areas is peaceful and under control. There is no report of any untowshut with people choosing to stay indoors. Eighteen police personnel were injured in the clashes and were undergoing treatment in different hospitals, he said.

Several vehicles, including police vans, were set on fire, stones were hurled at security forces and shops, and police kiosks burnt down during the rampage.

Hundreds of people affected by communal violence in Murshidabad district have crossed the Bhagirathi river and taken shelter in adjoining Malda, officials said. local administration has arranged for accommodation and food for the fleeing riot-hit families and sheltered them in schools, while deploying volunteers at the river bank to assist those arriving in boats.

No one is "getting off the hook", Trump after US appeared to dial down on China

WASHINGTON DC, Apr 14 (Agencies): US President Donald Trump has said that no one is "getting off the hook" on trade after his administration appeared to dial down pressure on China by issuing a notice exempting certain high-tech products from his "reciprocal" tariffs, Al Jazeera reported.

Trump said that there were no exceptions to the tariffs, as smartphones, laptops and other products were still subject to an existing 20 per cent duty and the items were being moved to a different tariff "bucket", as per Al Jazeera.

"We will not be held hostage by other Countries, especially hostile trading Nations like China," Trump said in a post on his Truth Social platform.

Speaking to reporters on board Air Force One, Trump said he would announce new tariffs on semiconductors over the next week.

"The tariffs will be in place in the not distant future," Trump said, adding that there would be flexibility for some companies in the sector.

The letter was delivered by Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber, Minister of Industry and Advanced Technology and UAE Special Envoy to Japan, during a meeting on Monday at the Prime Minister's Office in Tokyo. The meeting was also attended by Noura bint Mohammed Al Kaabi, Minister of State, and Shihab Al Faheem, UAE Ambassador to Japan.

Al Jaber conveyed the greetings of President Sheikh Mohamed to the Japanese Prime Minister and expressed the UAE's wishes for Japan's continued progress and prosperity, along with his hopes for the success of Expo 2025 Osaka-Kansai.

Prime Minister Ishiba, in turn, conveyed his greetings to President Sheikh Mohamed and expressed his hopes for the UAE's continued development and growth.

The two sides discussed ways to enhance bilateral relations under the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership signed in 2022.

Al Jaber reaffirmed the UAE leadership's commitment to strengthening cooperation and advancing ties to new strategic levels. He highlighted the potential for deepening collaboration across vital sectors, including economy, trade, energy, industry and advanced technology, and space--areas that support sustainable development goals in both nations.

He also noted the enduring friendship between the UAE and Japan, which dates back to before the founding of the UAE, referencing Abu Dhabi's participation in Expo 1970 in Osaka.

Greece signs deal to buy 16 anti-ship missiles from France

ATHENS, Apr 14 (Agencies): Greece signed a deal Monday to purchase anti-ship missiles from France as it seeks to bolster its defenses in a procurement program aimed mainly at addressing tensions with neighboring Turkey.

Greece's Defense Minister Nikos Dendias signed the agreement for the 16 Exocet missiles with his French counterpart Sébastien Lecornu, who was on a one-day visit to Athens. The two did not disclose the cost of the deal.

It is the latest in a series of purchases of military equipment from France, with Greece having already bought two dozen Rafale warplanes and three Belharra-class frigates.

Dendias said discussions are progressing for the addition of a fourth frigate, adding that France is also providing Greece with NH-90 military helicopters.

Athens has said it will spend 25 billion euros (\$27 billion) over the next decade to adapt its military to evolving high-tech warfare technologies. Although NATO allies, Greece and Turkey

have long-standing disputes over boundaries in the Aegean Sea and eastern Mediterranean that have brought them close to war several times in recent decades. "Greece does not threaten, but is threat-

ened," Dendias said in

Greece's modernization drive — launched after years of defense cuts during the 2010-2018 financial crisis - already includes all branches of the armed forces and focuses on cooperation with France, Israel, and the United States.

IHC issues notice to authorities on Bushra Bibi's plea for better facilities

ISLAMABAD, Apr 14 (Agencies): The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Monday issued notices to jail authorities on a petition filed by Bushra Bibi, seeking improved facilities in prison, agency reported.

Justice Raja Inaam Ameen Minhas presided over the hearing. Lawyers Usman Gul and Zahir Abbas represented Bushra Bibi, wife of the incarcerated former Prime Minister Imran Khan.

The court issued notices to the Interior Secretary and the Superintendent of Adiala Jail, directing them to submit their responses. The hearing was adjourned for two weeks. Earlier on April 7. Bushra Bibi approached



the Islamabad High Court (IHC) for improved jail facilities, agency reported.

She filed a petition through her lawyers, who argued that as a former first lady who resided in the Prime Minister's House, she is entitled to better facilities under the law due to her standard of living and lifestyle.

Bushra Bibi's lawyers claimed she requested better facilities from jail authorities, but received no response. The lawyers said that her husband, Imran Khan, is also receiving better facilities in the same Adiala jail.

petition cited the Jail Rules 1978, seeking court direction for the respondents to fulfill

their legal responsibilities and provide better jail amenities to Bushra

Bibi. The federal government, Superintendent Adiala jail and the Islamabad Chief Commissioner were made parties in the plea, as per agency.

Earlier, Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi filed petitions in the Islamabad High Court (IHC), seeking suspension of conviction in the £190 million case, agency reported. petitions, filed through their lawyer Barrister

Salman Safdar, argued that the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) had misused its authority and the conviction was based on incomplete investiga-

tions.

The petitions stated that the failure to obtain a declaration from the National Crime Agency (NCA) was a significant omission and that the NCA officials were not even investigated.

Furthermore, the petitions claimed that the prosecution had failed to present complete evidence and the conviction was rushed. The petitions requested that the conviction be suspended and that Imran Khan and Bushra Bibi be granted bail until the final decision on their

appeal. petitions assured the court that the accused would be present at every hearing of the appeal after the suspension of their conviction.

10 terrorists, including two Sikh men, arrested in Pakistan's Punjab

LAHORE, Apr 14 (Agencies): Two Sikhs are among 10 terrorists arrested by the law enforcers in Pakistan's Punjab province, police said on Monday.

According to a spokesperson of the Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) of Punjab police, it foiled a major terrorist plan by arresting 10 terrorists during operations in different areas of Punjab.

"Among the arrested terrorists are two Pakistani Sikhs — Suraj Singh and Badal Singh. Both Sikhs have been arrested from Rawalpindi. They hail from Nankana Sahib



district of Punjab and are active members of Jaey Sindh Muttahida Mahaz, a separatist political party advocating separation of Sindh province from Pakistan.'

The spokesperson further said it conducted 189 intelligence-based operations in different districts of the province last week and arrested the 10 terrorists and recovered weapons, explosives and other prohibited materials.

JKPDP pays rich floral tributes to Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar on his birth anniversary

R S PURA, Apr 14: Senior PDP leaders Narinder Sharma and Karan Singh along with other prominent leaders and workers today paid rich floral tributes to Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar on his birth anniversary at Panchayat Kotli Shah Doula, RS Pura constituency.

Popularly known as one of the architects of India constitution, Narinder paying tributes said that born into a poor Dalit family on April 14, 1891, BR Ambedkar was independent India's first Law Minister, the principal architect of the Indian Constitution and a founding father of the Republic of India. He also campaigned against the social discrimination of Dalits and inspired the Dalit Buddhist Movement in 1956. He was was awarded the Bharat Ratna posthumously in 1990, said Narinder.



"Whenever I get the chance I want to make the most of it. I just want to focus on my process and the rest is not in my hands," said MI spinner Karn Sharma, who was named the Player of the Match.
