Earthquake of magnitude 2.4 hits Kishtwar

KISHTWAR, Apr 16 (Agencies): An earth-quake of magnitude 2.4 struck the Kishtwar district of Jammu & Kashmir on Wednesday early morning, the National Centre for Seismology (NCS) reported.

As per the post shared by NCS on X, the earthquake occurred at around 5:14 am Indian Standard Time (IST), at Latitude 33.18 N and Longitude 75.89 E. The depth of the earthquake has been reported to be 5 km

"EQ of M: 2.4, On: 16/04/2025 05:14:52 IST, Lat: 33.18 N, Long: 75.89 E, Depth: 5 Km, Location: Kishtwar, Jammu & Kashmir," read the X post by NCS.

Additionally, earthquakes of magnitudes 5.9 and 2.9 hit Afghanistan and Bangladesh, respectively, on Wednesday early morn-

As per the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA), Afghanistan remains highly vulnerable to natural disasters, including seasonal flooding, landslides and earthquakes.

These frequent earthquakes in Afghanistan cause damage to vulnerable communities, which are already grappling with decades of conflict and under-development and have left them with little resilience to cope with multiple simultaneous shocks, UNOCHA noted. Afghanistan has a history of powerful earthquakes, and the Hindu Kush Mountain range is a geologically active area where quakes occur every year, according to the Red Cross. The country sits on numerous fault lines between the Indian and the Eurasian tectonic plates, with a fault line also running directly through Herat.

NEW DELHI, Apr 16 (Agencies): As the Supreme Court gears up to hear a batch of petitions questioning the constitutional validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 today, here's a comprehensive look at the petitioners and their arguments, as compiled by LiveLaw.in. The Act, passed by Parliament on April 4 and receiving presidential assent the following day, was brought into force on April 8. The legislation has sparked widespread concern, drawing legal challenges from political leaders, religious institutions, civil rights organizations, and even state governments.

Man dies of alleged medical negligence at CD hospital investigation taken up:

SRINAGAR, Apr 16 (Agencies): A 44-year-old man from Dalgate area of Srinagar allegedly died of medical negligence at Chest Disease (CD) hospital while the officials said that investigation has been taken up to ascertain the facts in this regard.

The family members said that Rafiq Ahmad, a resident of Dalgate area complained of chest pain on Wednesday morning and went to the CD hospital for medical checkup.

They alleged that the doctor, who was present at the hospital, didn't treat him well. "As we tried to seek proper treatment for Rafiq, the doctor misbehaved with us," they said, adding the doctor also ran away from the ward after the death of the patient. The family demanded investigation in this regard and action against the doctor. They have

Raid conducted in Balole Khad, Gujjar Basti: Police intensify crackdown on drug network



JAMMU, Apr 16 (Agencies): In a renewed effort to tackle drug trafficking, police conducted an early morning raid in Balole Khad, Gujjar Basti, under the jurisdiction of Bari Brahmana in District Samba. The operation, led by SDPO Bari Brahmana and SHO, was aimed at identifying and apprehending individuals involved in the local drug network and assailants responsible for attacking a police party in the same area few days back.

The police party thoroughly searched several Gujjar Kullas in the area, which has recently gained notoriety as a hotspot for narcotics activity. The action follows a previous violent encounter in the same locality, where suspected drug peddlers attacked a police party attempting to make arrests. That incident had left SHO Pushpinder Singh, Sub-Inspector Arar Mirza, and a police head constable injured.

According to official

sources, the raid was carried out based on actionable intelligence suggesting the continued presence of individuals connected to drug trafficking. Although the police have not disclosed the number of arrests or seizures made during today's operation, they have confirmed that the search was part of an intensified drive against drug peddling in the region. NC rejects Dulat's claims on Farooq Abdullah's stand on Article 370 SRINAGAR, Apr 16 the PDP and its leader-

SRINAGAR, Apr 16 (Agencies): National Conference (NC) Chief Spokesperson and MLA Zadibal, Tanvir Sadiq Wednesday rejected the claims made by former RAW Chief A.S. Dulat in his new book 'The Chief Minister and the Spy'. He termed the claims as contradictory and an attempt to create contro-

versy.

Dulat, in his book has alleged that NC president Farooq Abdullah privately backed the abrogation of Article 370 while publicly opposing

Tanvir Sadiq said the book contradicts itself and questioned the credibility of the author. "If you look at the book and what he writes in it, he contradicts his own



words. He writes that the Government of India waited for seven months to see Farooq Abdullah Sahib's reaction when he was in custody. If that was the case, then why did he promote the PAGD after coming out?" he said.

He added that the Peoples Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD) was formed after Abdullah's release and that it was not broken by the NC. Sadiq also questioned



ship. "The words he used about the PDP patriot are probably vulgar. I don't trust those things," he said. He added that Dulat had earlier made remarks against PDP founder Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, which he termed as a bid to stay relevant.

He said that the opposition had no issue to raise now and was trying to divert attention. "They can't say anything on the budget or other matters. So they are making up stories," he said. "We have bigger issues to deal with like the amendment bill and the reservation issue."





Dimple slams BJP over Statehood betrayal, warns against destabilization of J&K Alliance Govt

JAMMU, Apr 16: Addressing a press conference on Wednesday, Sunil Dimple, President of Mission Statehood Jammu and Kashmir, strongly criticized the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government for what he called a "betrayal of the people of Jammu and Kashmir." He accused the BJP of backtracking on the promise of restoring statehood and special status, and attempting to destabilize the current alliance government in the Union Territory through political horsetrading.

Dimple shared that he had telephonically congratulated Dr. Faroog Abdullah on the successful completion of six months of the alliance government, reaffirming his and his organization's support to the coalition. He said the alliance government, despite external pressures, will complete its full five-year term, and

hood President dismissed ongoing media reports about alleged defections within the National Conference and alliance parties, calling them "fabricated stories fueled by vested interests." He specifically held retired RAW chief A.S. Dulat responsible for spreading falsehoods about Article 370 and playing psychological games at the behest of the BJP to divide the alliance and mislead the public. Dimple alleged that these rumors were being circulated to promote Dulat's newly published book.

In his discussion with

Dimple raised concerns over media narratives suggesting that 10-18 National Conference MLAs, including MP Aga Ruhullah, were planning to leave the party. Both leaders reportedly dismissed such rumors as baseless and politically

motivated. Dimple also expressed frustration over the delayed restoration of Jammu & Kashmir's statehood and special status, calling it a denial of democratic rights. He demanded cancellation of the 84,000 domicile certificates issued to non-J&K residents and called for the revival of the original state subject system, warning that the region's identity, culture, and demography were

He went on to allege that the RSS and BJP were enemies of Maharaja Hari Singh's Dogra legacy, and accused them of systematically eroding the cultural roots and demographic makeup of Jammu and Kashmir. Dimple also criticized the BJP's silence on the issue of statehood, saying its MLAs remained "mum during meetings with the Home Minister," failing to represent the sentiments of the people.

In a scathing attack, Dimple accused the BJP government of issuing domiciles to non-residents from states like Punjab, Delhi, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Maharashtra, and allowing them to purchase land and settle in J&K. He claimed that more than five lakh outsiders had already made their way into the region post the abrogation of Article 370, with flats being sold to them by the JDA and



Early Heatwave: Reminder of Climate Urgency

he sun has turned cruel too soon this year, as Northern India grapples with a blistering and premature heatwave that has scorched cities, drained rivers, and sent warnings echoing across the subcontinent. April, once a gentle prelude to summer, has morphed into an inferno in many states, with temperatures surging past 45°C — levels normally witnessed only in peak May and June. Meteorological experts and environmentalists are raising alarm bells over this early onset of extreme heat, linking it to broader patterns of climate change and its devastating ripple effects.

On April 13, the city of Barmer in Rajasthan recorded a searing 46.4°C — a temperature far above normal for this time of year. Several towns across Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, and Delhi are also reeling under intense heat. Many regions in the northwestern plains are witnessing temperatures 5 to 8 degrees Celsius above seasonal averages.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued red alerts for Rajasthan, Haryana, and parts of western Uttar Pradesh, indicating a severe heatwave condition that poses a significant health risk. The IMD has also forecasted more frequent and longer heatwaves in the coming weeks, cautioning that the summer of 2025 could be among the hottest India has ever recorded.

The early arrival of extreme heat is not an isolated phenomenon. Climate scientists warn that it is part of a larger, disturbing trend. The rise in global average temperatures, driven by humaninduced greenhouse gas emissions, is making heatwaves more frequent, intense, and unpredictable. According to recent studies, the frequency of severe heat events in India has tripled in the last 50 years, with northern and central India being the most affected.

Experts suggest that this year's early heatwave may also be linked to the weakening of the Western Disturbances — a key weather system that typically brings winter and early summer rains to north India. The absence of these rains has left the soil dry and the atmosphere parched, allowing temperatures to soar unchecked.

The human cost of such relentless heat is already being felt. Hospitals across affected regions have reported a spike in heatstroke cases, dehydration, and heat-induced exhaustion, especially among outdoor workers like construction laborers, farmers, and traffic police personnel. Schools in several districts of Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh have been advised to reduce working hours or switch to online classes during peak daytime heat.

Children and the elderly are particularly vulnerable. In rural areas, where access to healthcare is limited and awareness is low, the risk of fatalities due to heat-related illnesses remains high. Government advisories are urging people to stay indoors, drink plenty of fluids, and avoid strenuous activity — but for millions who live and work in harsh conditions, such precautions are often luvuries.

This early heat has also cast a shadow on agriculture, the backbone of rural livelihoods. Wheat, one of India's primary rabi crops, is especially sensitive to temperature spikes during the final stage of grain filling. The sudden heat stress may lead to a decline in wheat yields, affecting both farmers' income and food prices in the market.

Additionally, the demand for irrigation has increased sharply, putting pressure on already-stressed groundwater resources. With summer just beginning, concerns are mounting over water scarcity, especially in drought-prone regions.

Cities, with their heat-trapping concrete jungles, are turning into pressure cookers. Air conditioning units are running full blast, causing massive surges in electricity demand. Power outages and load shedding are already being reported in parts of Delhi and neighboring areas. The urban poor, living in slums with limited access to cooling, remain the worst hit.

Meanwhile, the heat is also taking a toll on infrastructure. Roads are buckling, railway tracks are expanding, and the risk of fires in densely populated localities has increased. Emergency services are on high alert.

The current crisis calls for immediate as well as long-term responses. Governments must expand access to public cooling centers, ensure the availability of clean drinking water, and equip healthcare facilities to deal with heat-related emergencies. Public awareness campaigns on heatwave preparedness, especially in local languages, are

But more importantly, this heatwave is yet another wake-up call for sustained climate action. From urban planning to energy policies, from forest conservation to international cooperation, India must prioritize environmental resilience. The heat gripping the land today is not just a meteorological anomaly — it is a glimpse into a warmer, harsher future unless urgent action is taken

As the sun blazes overhead, the message is clear: The time to prepare, adapt, and act is now. The heatwave may be early, but it must not catch us unprepared.

Protest against Waqf Amendment Act, Lawful Dissent, Not Lawless Rage

Thus their indulging in violence has no justification and so they should shed violence under the guise of protest against the waqf Amendment Act. Muslims should control their emotions and should appreciate reality that the Waqf Amendment Act has been passed by the parliament as per the provisions of the constitution and all legal formalities had been complied with while debating and passing the Waqf Amendment Bill 2025 and so the bill is valid constitutionally .However some political parties and Muslim organizations have challenged the constitutional validity of Waqf Amendment Act 2025 in the top Court of the country and it is hoped that the judiciary which is independent and supreme in the country will uphold the Waqf Amendment Act 2025. Supreme Court will not intervene with the legislative domain of the parliament and will uphold the concerned act which had been enacted for the efficient management and governance and administration of the

Waqf properties. Minority Affairs Minister of the country Kiren Rjiju has rightly remarked that he is confident that the SC will not venture into legislative matters. He further said," We have to respect each other .If tomorrow the government interferes into judiciary ,it won't be nice. The separation of powers is well defined ."We have seen it in the past that parliament is supreme and we have also appreciated that the verdict in Shah Bano Case has been nullified by the act of the parliament though under the influence and dictates of pseudo -secularism ,minoritism and vote bank politics by the then Congress government. Therefore it is hoped that the highest court of the land will not interfere with the legislative supremacy of the parliament and it will uphold the Waqf Amendment Law in the national interest. Coming to the title of this write up, it can be opined that the Common Muslims should not fall prey to the selfish and cunning politics of some political parties and they should as such desist from stoking communal tensions in several pockets of the country where they are in majority. he recently crafted rump on the part of the Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad is reported that there are 64.4% of women in the country's agricultural workforce, but just six to ten% of women are in top positions in agriculture and top companies related to it. This rapat has highlighted the deep gap between the role of women in the agriculture sector and their low presence in top positions. According to Rapat, the future of agricultural business is education to women, by increasing education, workplaces inclusion, and the medium of leadership development. In Rapat it has come to empower that 30-40% enrolment of women in agricultural education programmes is the case, but very few of these find employment in the formal agriculture sector. So need to do women in agriculture. The same partnership of addressing the challenges and obstacles they face can be enriched with agriculture sector only by supporting them. Only then will the benefit of this society be able to get all the members. Experts quoted Rapat say raising women's participation in agriculture sector will be. There are many strategies suggested to increase the participation of women in

have equal access to resources, implementing specially designed training programs for them, and motivating them for leadership by promoting inclusive workplaces. Experts say the agricultural landscape in the country presents a surprising contradiction. Women are an important part of agricultural workforce and educational groups, yet graduates are not able to enter a larger portion of formal employment structures. We have to find solutions avenues considering this situation seriously. In fact, women's participation in agriculture is a multi-dimensional process, which is influenced by many social, economic and political factors. Many challenges are yet to be resolved to promote the full and equal participation of women in agriculture. According to the hundreds of national sample survey office data, women in the agricultural labour force in India are in significant proportion. About 43% of the farmers and 52% of the agricultural labourers were women in the year 2010-11 period. But the participation of women in agricultural labour has increased in time. In the year 2002- -03, the ratio of female cultivators increased by 37% to 43% in the year 2010-11. In the same period, the ratio of women agricultural labourers 1143 increased from 48% to 52%.

The main challenges in this field also have discrimination and stereotypes, which limit women's access to resourc-

field. It is necessary to implement such policies and programs to solve these and promote equal participation of women in farming, which support promoting them in this field. This includes initiatives that are aimed at improving the reach of women to resources, knowledge and vel old thinking of people to change. For this, civil society can also play an important role in organizing agricultural sector women collectively, educating them about all their rights, extension services enabling their access to 1 and providing them training making sustainable livelihood". For this, women will have to provide equal access to land and other resources, including loans, extension services and storage facilities. It's a great pleasure to have you. Promotion of recognition and value of unpaid and informal labour of women in agriculture | Must give. The policies and programmes that support women's education and training in agriculture, including vocational training and expansion programmes, will have to be implemented. Women's participation in the process of making r decisions at all levels including farmer organisations, co-operative societies and other local entities will have to be promoted. The provision of technical support and funding will have to support the development of women-led initiatives and enterprises in agriculture. Women's land ownership will have to be promot-

ed, in order to help them gain benefits under various farm schemes undoubtedly the role of women in agriculture is key. They do many farming related work, like selection of seeds, ploughing fields, harvesting crops, cattle management, milking milk, collecting fodder etc. Their participation rates vary in different regions. But it is necessary to promote equality and improve stability and productivity of the area to increase the role of women. The agriculture sector will be able to prosper by supporting their equal participation. At the same time, women will be able to reach the leadership positions in agriculture and top companies related to it. Vision Kashmir: Filmmaker Faraz Ali's short film shows there is life in the Valley

Award winning filmmaker Faraz Ali's short film Obur is a revelation in more ways than one. Telling the story of a young boy in Kashmir, it neither trains its lens on military nor militancy. What's more, the entire film is shot on an I-phone. As Obur literally swept the Critics' Choice Awards this year, winning no less than four awards for best film, direction, cinematography and writing in short film category, Ali shares, "All through the making of the film, I prioritised storytelling over anything else." Encapsulating the tale of a mother and son and how power outage affects him, he wanted to draw attention to everyday issues of ordinary mortals.

Hailing from Allahabad, now Prayagraj, Ali was inadvertently drawn to The Valley often represented in broad strokes of beauty or terror. What struck him the most was, "There is life beyond the shadow of the gun. People have fun, why even we played cricked on its streets, and above all there is hope." In fact, the talented filmmaker's earlier feature Shoebox was on his hometown, Allahabad, which he has seen changing so much that it became a friend he grew up with, but could no longer relate to its changing characteristics. Truth of the city is interesting for him, "Allahabad is a fragment of my memory."

He shares how personification of a city is evident more impactfully in films like Garam Hawa. He observes, "The same city can be seen differently through the gaze of different filmmak-



ers. For instance, the Bombay seen in Ram Gopal Varma's movies is so different from the one in The Lunchbox. The one in Payal Kapadia's All We Imagine As Light is again markedly unique." Only he doesn't find much difference between the problems of people in different cities. Yes, even those living in the Valley face similar predicaments as any other.

More than facts, he feels its truth which will survive the test of time. Indeed, each person's vantage point is unique. He states, "Sky is blue is a fact. But I might see sorrow in it, whereas another maker might sense happiness." Hence, it's not 'seeing is believing' for him but feeling is. As he puts it, "Your gut instinct always tells you what is right." Interestingly, capturing the film on a mobile phone seemed the right choice for this advertising professional. For it

meant the crew didn't have to drag heavy equipment through snow-laden terrains and reach remote areas. "Choice of equipment complements your story." Since most actors were facing the camera for the first time, he reveals, "They were not intimidated by a mobile phone as

they were quite accustomed to

making reels on it."

Ali's background in advertising is not the reason why he turned to making films. His cinematic sensibility may not have been shaped by his vocation of making commercials. He opines, "To keep your artistic voice intact, you have to understand the economy of India, which is so different from that of Europe or the US. For, unlike the west we don't we have the culture of grants." So, he believes in the axiom, 'one for the soul and one for the kitchen', with the later invariably, feeding

his artistic integrity. He quips, "Why does a filmmaker have to die in penury?"

In the near future, he will once again be making a film on Kashmir, hoping to pull off a comedy, but in long term he does not want to burden himself with expectations of particular kind of films he would like to be known for. All he wants is, "To have a great time while making films and ensure that no one on his sets is having a bad time. While I am in the thick of action, my prime motive is to make films ethically." For him, means don't justify the end but are as important the final goal. Thus, to the aspirants from small towns desirous of taking a plunge into the world of filmmaking, he does not have any advice, only ready to offer a 'non- toxic environment', so when they work with him, the wonder of cinema is intact. Winning awards may not be sine qua non for keeping his sense of amazement or love for cinema alive. But as he states, "It puts the spotlight on you. Every filmmaker needs that attention. Success of each film decides what you make next. Besides, it might inspire someone writing a beautiful story sitting in Kashmir to make one."

Of course, beyond success or failure, curiosity for him is the real trigger. As Walt Disney said, "We keep moving forward, opening new doors and doing new things, because we're curious and curiosity keeps leading us down new paths." Rest assured, Ali will be forging new

CJI Khanna recommends appointment of Justice Gavai as next CJI

NEW DELHI, Apr 16 (Agencies): Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna on Wednesday recommended to the Centre the name of Justice Bhushan Ramkrishna Gavai as the next CJI.

Justice Gavai, the second senior-most Supreme Court judge after the incumbent CJI Khanna, is set to become the 52nd CJI on May 14 after the retirement of CJI Khanna on May 13.

Justice Gavai, who was elevated as a judge of the Supreme Court on May 24, 2019, would have a tenure of over six months as the CJI. He is due to retire on November 23, 2025.

CJI Khanna, who was sworn in as the 51st CJI on November 11 last year, recommended to the Union law ministry to appoint Justice Gavai as the next CJI.

The retirement age of Supreme Court judges is 65 years.

Born on November 24,

1960 at Amravati, Justice Gavai was elevated as an additional judge of the Bombay High Court on November 14, 2003. He became a permanent judge of the high

2005. Justice Gavai has been a part of several Constitution Benches in the apex court which delivered path-breaking verdicts.

court on November 12,

He was part of a fivejudge Constitution Bench which in December 2023 unanimously upheld the Centre's decision to abrogate provisions of Article 370 bestowing special status to the erstwhile state of

Jammu and Kashmir. Another five-judge Constitution Bench, of which Justice Gavai was a part, annulled the electoral bonds scheme for political funding.

He was a part of a five-judge Constitution bench which, by a 4:1 majority verdict, gave its stamp of approval to the Centre's 2016 decision



to demonetise Rs 1,000 and Rs 500 denomination currency notes.

Justice Gavai was part of a seven-judge constitution Bench, which by a 6:1 majority held that states are constitutionally empowered to make sub-classifications within the Scheduled Castes, which form a socially heterogeneous class, for granting reservation for the uplift of castes that are socially and educationally more backward among them.

A seven-judge Constitution Bench also having Justice Gavai ruled that the arbitration clause in an unstamped or insufficiently stamped agreement between parties was enforceable as such a defect was cur-

able and did not render

the contract invalid.

In an important verdict, a Bench headed by Justice Gavai laid down pan-India guidelines and said no property should be demolished without a prior showcause notice and the affected must be given 15 days to respond.

He is also heading the Bench which is hearing matters related to forests, wildlife and protection of trees.

He had joined the bar on March 16, 1985 and was the standing counsel for the Municipal Corporation of Nagpur, Amravati Municipal Corporation and Amravati University.

He was appointed as an assistant government pleader and additional public prosecutor in the Bombay High Court's Nagpur Bench from August 1992 to July 1993.

He was appointed as a government pleader and public prosecutor for the Nagpur Bench on January 17, 2000.

According to the memorandum of procedure -- a set of documents guiding appointment, elevation and transfer of high court and Supreme Court judges -- the law minister writes to the CJI to name his or her successor.

The MoP says the senior-most judge of the apex court is considered fit to hold the office of the CJI and the views of the outgoing head of the judiciary have to be sought "at an appropriate time".

National Herald case: BJP rejects Cong's charge of vendetta



NEW DELHI, Apr 16 (Agencies): Asserting that no one has a "license to loot", the ruling BJP on Wednesday dismissed the Congress' charge of vendetta after the ED chargesheeted Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case.

Former law minister and BJP leader Ravi Shankar Prasad asked the Congress to reply to the substance of allegations against the Gandhis instead of merely offering a political reaction, noting that the opposition party found no relief from the judiciary in its pleas against

the probe. Speaking to reporters, Prasad outlined the main charge against the Gandhis that as the 76 per cent share-holder of the Young India company they "misappropriated" thousands of crores of real estate owned by the Associated Journals Limited (AJL), which owned the

National Herald news-

He said the Congress has the right to hold 'dharnas' (to protest ED chargesheet against Sonia Gandhi and Rahul) but that right does not extend to misappropriating public properties given by the government to the National Herald.

He accused the Congress of issuing threats to the probe agency and asked if the party and Gandhi's believe in the due process of law or not.

"We condemn the threats from the Congress. There is Modi government in place. It will allow the law to take its own course." he said.

The Young India, he said, wrote off the Rs 90 cr loan that the Congress had given to the AJL and got the ownership of the company with a paltry investment of Rs 50 lakhs.

The land was given to the AJL by the government, he said, adding that the National Herald was allegedly used by

the Congress establishment to collect advertisement and proper-

He alleged, "A newspaper that was established in the freedom struggle to espouse the voice of those fighting the British imperialism degenerated into a money-minting exercise for the Congress party establishment." Taking a swipe, he said this is the "Gandhi model of development" as he noted the allegation against Sonia Gandhi's sonin-law Robert Vadra of pocketing a huge profit in land deal in Haryana with the collusion of the then Congress government in the state.

The National Herald was started in the 1930s as a voice of the freedom struggle with 5,000 shareholders but was reduced to a fief of the Nehru-Gandhi family, he alleged.

The Enforcement Directorate has filed a chargesheet against Congress leaders Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi and others before a special court here in the National Herald case, accusing them of allegedly laundering Rs 988 crore.

The Congress described the ED's chargesheet as vendetta politics and claimed seizing of assets in the case was a "state-sponsored crime masquerading as the rule of law".

We seem demoralised in Gujarat, but only Congress can defeat RSS-BJP: Rahul Gandhi

MODASA (GUJARAT), Apr 16 (Agencies): Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday said though party cadres seem demoralised in Gujarat, only his outfit can defeat the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the BJP.

On his second visit to Gujarat in a week, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha expressed his party's

resolve to finish the task of defeating the RSS and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which is in power in the western state for nearly 30 years.

He described Gujarat, where the Congress was once a powerful political force, as the most important state for the opposition party.

Gandhi was addressing booth-level Congress workers at

Modasa town in Arvalli district after launching a pilot project of strengthening district units as part of the grand old party's efforts to revamp the organisation in Gujarat, where assembly polls are due in late 2027.

"Gujarat is the most important state for the Congress party. We seem demoralised in Gujarat, but we will defeat them (BJP) in the



state. I am here to tell you that it is not difficult. We will definitely finish this task

Only the Congress party can defeat the RSS and the BJP," he told the gathering.

Murshidabad riots pre-planned; BJP, BSF, section of central agencies involved: Mamata

KOLKATA, Apr 16 (Agencies): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Wednesday termed the recent communal violence in Murshidabad as "preplanned" and accused a section of the BSF, central agencies, and the BJP of fanning tension by allegedly facilitating cross-border influx from Bangladesh.

Speaking at a meeting with Imams, Banerjee alleged that despite the volatile situation in neighbouring Bangladesh, the central government allowed illegal entry from across the border, and claimed

that the BSF and certain agencies played a role in triggering unrest in Bengal.

Banerjee urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi not to implement the "atrocious" Waqf Amendment Act and requested him to keep the Union Home Ministry, headed by Amit Shah, under control.

"I would request the Prime Minister to keep a check on Amit Shah, he is doing harm to the nation to serve his own political agenda." she

"I came across news claiming the role of elements from across the



border in Murshidabad unrest. Is it not the role of the BSF to guard the border? The state government does not guard the international border. The Central government must take responsibility," Banerjee said.

The CM announced a

compensation of Rs 10 lakh each for the families of three people killed during the violence and directed the state chief secretary to initiate a probe into the role of the BSF, alleging that the force opened fire which

led to the death of one

"I will find out whom the BSF had financed in the bordering areas by giving money to youths to pelt throw during the violence," she said.

Alleging that outsiders linked to the BJP entered the state and incited violence, Banerjee said, "Why did they allow BJP thugs from outside to come and create chaos before fleeing? Accountability must be fixed. They want to polarise and divide Hindus and Muslims. They want their Jumla government. Don't divide the country; unite all instead."

Two hardcore Naxalites killed in encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh RAIPUR, Apr 16

(Agencies): Two senior cadres of CPI (Maoist), carrying a bounty of Rs 13 lakh, were killed in an encounter with the security forces at Kilam-Bargum forest in Kondagaon district, about 250 km south of Raipur on Wednesday.

"Based on specific intelligence inputs about the presence of Maoists at the Kilam-Bargum forest region, a joint team of security forces comprising personnel from District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Bastar Fighters was out on the anti-Maoist operation on Tuesday. An encounter broke out between the Maoists and the security forces. Two bodies of Maoists have been recovered so far on Wednesday. The search operation in the area continues", a senior police officer The two Maoists

killed in an exchange



as dreaded rebel commander and Divisional Committee Member (DVCM) Haldar Kashyap and Area Committee Member (ACM) Ramey Sori of the East Bastar Division of the banned outfit CPI (Maoist). Haldar and Ramey were carrying rewards of Rs 8 lakh and Rs 5 lakh on their heads respectively, the officer added.

This year, 140 bodies of Maoists have been recovered so far in various encounters in Chhattisgarh, including 124 killed in the Bastar division.

One AK-47, a few arms, explosives and other items were recovered from the encounter spot. There has been no report of any security personnel sustaining injuries in the encounter.

Kondagaon is among the seven Maoist-affected districts of Bastar division in south Chhattisgarh. Union Home minister

Amit Shah has declared that the country will be Maoist-free by March 31, 2026. In this context, the series of encounters against the left-wing extremists remains a part of the renewed strategy to free the Chhattisgarh state from the influence of Maoist.

Three killed as civic body operated bus rams into vehicles, pedestrians at traffic signal in Rajkot

RAJKOT, Apr 16 (Agencies): A speeding bus operated by the local municipal corporation rammed into several vehicles and pedestrians at a traffic signal in Gujarat's Rajkot city on Wednesday morning, leaving three persons dead and two others injured, police said.

Closed-circuit television (CCTV) footage showed the electric bus hitting vehicles, including two-wheelers and cars, at the busy traffic signal.

"An electric city bus operated by the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) caused an accident, leaving three dead and two others injured at a traffic signal.

The bus hit several vehicles, including two-wheelers and four-wheelers, as well as pedestrians," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Zone -2), Jagdish



Bhangarva said.

The accident occurred at Indira Circle at around 10 am, Gandhigram police station inspector Sejal Meghani said. An irate mob vandalised the civic bus after it halted at some distance away

from the accident spot. Police resorted to baton charge to dis-

perse the crowd, officials said. The bus driver was detained and further probe was underway, they said.

3 workers killed as storage unit for pulses falls on them at Maharashtra mill

YAVATMAL, Apr 16 (Agencies): Three workers were killed and two others injured when a steel storage unit for pulses fell on them while they were working at a mill in Maharashtra's Yavatmal district, police said on Wednesday.

The incident took place at Manorma Jain Dal Mill located in the Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) area in Yavatmal on Tuesday

evening, they said. The storage unit broke and fell on five workers, a police official said.

Three workers were killed and two other workers suffered injuries and were undergoing treatment in a hospital, the official said.

Two of the deceased were from Madhya Pradesh and one hailed from Wardha district in Maharashtra, the police said.

Alcoholic man kills daughter-in-law with axe in UP's Shahjahanpur

SHAHJAHANPUR, Apr 16 (Agencies): A man allegedly hacked his daughter-in-law to death with an axe in Uttar Pradesh's Shahjahanpur district, police

Superintendent of Police Rajesh Kumar Dwivedi said the incident took place in Hathipur Kuria village under Kant police station limits on Tuesday.

said on Wednesday.

Rajpal Saty, who allegedly murdered his daughter-in-law Sumitra (30), is absconding and a team has been formed to nab him, the police said.

A team rushed to the spot received information about the incident on Wednesday morning.

Quoting preliminary findings and statements from villagers, SP Dwivedi said the accused was known to be a habitual drinker and had likely gotten into an argument with the victim.

In a fit of rage, he allegedly struck her with an axe kept in the house, resulting in her death. Sumitra's husband, a

truck driver, was away for work at the time of the incident, the officer The body has been

sent for post-mortem and the axe used in the attack recovered, the police said, adding that a case has been registered and investigation is underway.

Gaza rescuers say children among 11 killed in Israeli air strikes

GAZA, Apr 16 (Agencies): Gaza's civil defence agency reported that Israeli air strikes in the early hours of Wednesday killed at least 11 people, including women and children.

Israel resumed its aerial and ground offensive across Gaza from March 18, ending a two-month ceasefire that had largely halted hostilities in the territory.

A pre-dawn air strike in Gaza City killed 10 people, including several women and children, according to civil defence agency spokesman Mahmud Bassal. He said the strike targeted the home belonging to the Hassouna family in the AlTuffa neighbourhood of Gaza City.

"Our teams transferred 10 martyrs and several wounded to Al-Shifa hospital after the Hassouna family's home was targeted," Bassal said.

In a separate attack, a child



was killed in the southern city of Khan Yunis, rescue teams said.

Top Israeli officials, including Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, have repeatedly stated that military pressure is the only way to secure the release of hostages still held in Gaza by Hamas.

On Wednesday, Defence Minister Israel Katz reiterated that Israel would continue to "relentlessly strike Hamas terrorists and terror infrastructure" in Gaza.

"If Hamas continues to refuse (to release hostages), operations will intensify and move to the next stage," Katz said in a statement, without specifying what the next stage would entail.

Also on Wednesday, the Israeli military announced it had

recently killed a militant involved in a 2014 attack that resulted in the deaths of five soldiers.

Mahmud Ibrahim Abu Hisirah was reportedly part of group of militants that infiltrated Israel through a tunnel in July 2014 and killed five soldiers, the military said.

In recent years, he had served as a close aide to Ezzedine Haddad, a senior militant from Hamas' armed wing, the Ezzedine Al-Qassam Brigades, the military added.

Since Israel resumed its offensive in Gaza in mid-March, at least 1,630 people have been killed, according to the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory.

Israel's military assault has killed at least 51,000 people in Gaza, the majority of them civilians, according to the health ministry.

6.6-magnitude earthquake strikes under Indian Ocean far off Australian coast

MELBOURNE, Apr 16 (Agencies): A 6.6-magnitude earthquake struck far off southwest Australia on Wednesday, but no tsunami warning was issued.

The epicentre was in the Indian Ocean 2,069 km southwest of Albany

on the southwest tip of Western Australia state at a depth of 10 km, the US Geological Survey said.

The Joint Australian Tsunami Warning Center said there was no tsunami alert for Australia or Antarctica.

Earthquake of magnitude 5.9 jolts Afghanistan

KABUL, Apr 16 (Agencies): An earthquake of magnitude 5.9 has struck Afghanistan, as reported by the National Centre for Seismology (NCS).

The earthquake occurred in the early hours of Wednesday morning at 04:43 AM Indian Standard Time (IST).

The NCS shared the details in a post on X, saying that the earthquake occurred at Latitude 35.83 N, Longitude 70.60 E.

As per the NCS, the earthquake occurred at a depth of 75 kilometres.

As per the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA), Afghanistan remains highly vulnerable to natural disasters, including seasonal flooding, landslides and earthquakes.

These frequent earthquakes in Afghanistan cause damage to vulnerable communities, which are already grappling with decades of conflict and under-development and have left them with little resilience to cope with multiple simultaneous shocks, UNOCHA noted.

Earthquake of magnitude 4.2 jolts Tibet

TIBET, Apr 16 (Agencies): An earthquake of magnitude 4.2 on the Richter Scale struck Tibet on Wednesday at 3:50 am (IST), the National Centre for Seismology (NCS) said on Wednesday.

According to NCS, the earthquake struck at a

depth of 26 kilometres. The NCS said that the earthquake occurred at latitude 27.87 N and longitude 87.65 E.

Earlier on Tuesday, an earthquake of magnitude 3.5 on the Richter Scale struck Tibet at 11:01 am (IST), a statement by the NCS said.

As per the NCS, the earthquake struck at a depth of 10 kilometres, making it susceptible to aftershocks.

Earlier on late Monday night, another earthquake of magnitude 4.1 on the Richter Scale struck Tibet at a shallow depth of 10km.

Israeli defense minister says troops will remain in Gaza, Lebanon and Syria indefinitely

JERUSALEM, Apr 16 (Agencies): Israel's defense minister said Wednesday that troops will remain in so-called security zones in the Gaza Strip, Lebanon and Syria indefinitely, remarks that could further complicate talks with Hamas over a ceasefire and hostage release.

Israeli forces have taken over more than half of Gaza in a renewed campaign to pressure Hamas to release hostages after Israel ended their ceasefire last month.

Israel has also refused to withdraw from some areas in Lebanon following a ceasefire with the Hezbollah militant group last year, and it seized a buffer zone in southern Syria after rebels overthrew President Bashar Assad in December.

"Unlike in the past, the (Israeli military) is not evacuating areas that



have been cleared and seized," Defense Minister Israel Katz said in a statement. The military "will remain in the security zones as a buffer between the enemy and (Israeli) communities in any temporary or permanent situation in Gaza — as in Lebanon and Syria."

The Palestinians and both neighboring countries view the presence of Israeli troops as military occupation in violation of international law. Hamas has said it will not release dozens of remaining hostages without a complete Israeli withdrawal from Gaza and a lasting ceasefire.

Israel says it must maintain control of such territories to prevent a repeat of Hamas' Oct. 7, 2023 attack, in which thousands of militants stormed into southern Israel from Gaza, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting 251.

Israel's offensive has killed over 51,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not say how many were civilians or combatants but says women and children make up more than half of the dead. Israel says it has killed some 20,000 militants, without providing evidence.

Israel's bombardment and ground operations have left vast areas of the territory uninhabitable and have displaced around 90% of the population of roughly 2 million Palestinians.

Many have been displaced multiple times, and hundreds of thousands are crammed into squalid tent camps with dwindling food after Israel sealed off the territory from all imports more than a month ago. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed to annihilate Hamas and return the 59 hostages still in Gaza — 24 of whom are believed to be alive. He has said that Israel

will then implement U.S. President Donald Trump's proposal for the resettlement of much of Gaza's population in other countries through what Netanyahu refers to as "voluntary emigration."

Netanyahu helms the most nationalist and religious government in Israel's history, and his coalition partners have called for the reestablishment of Jewish settlements in Gaza. Israel withdrew from Gaza in 2005 and dismantled its settlements there.

Palestinians and Arab countries have universally rejected Trump's proposal, which human rights experts say would likely violate international law. Palestinians in Gaza say they don't want to leave, and fear another mass expulsion like the one that occurred during the war surrounding Israel's creation in 1948.

Earthquake of magnitude 2.9 hits Bangladesh

DHAKA, Apr 16 (Agencies): An earthquake of magnitude 2.9 has struck Bangladesh, as reported by the National Centre for Seismology (NCS).

The earthquake occurred in the early hours of Wednesday morning at 05:07 AM Indian Standard Time (IST).

Sharing the details in a post on X, the NCS said that the earthquake occurred at latitude 24.89 N and longitude 91.16 E.

As per the NCS, the earthquake occurred at a depth of 14 kilometres.
As per the website of NCS, previously



an earthquake of magnitude 4.0 had occured on April 11 in Bangladesh at a depth of 10 kilometres.

"Ask US side for specific tax rate figures": China reacts to 245% tariff levied by US

BEIJING, Apr 16 (Agencies): Reacting to the White House's statement claiming China now faces up to 245 per cent tariffs on imports to the US, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian said they should ask the US side for the "specific tax rate figures."

While addressing a press briefing on Wednesday, Lin said that China has repeatedly stated its solemn position on the tariff issue. He said that the tariff war was initiated by the US and that Beijing has taken countermeasures to protect its legitimate rights and interests and international fairness and justice, terming it completely "reasonable and legal.

He noted that tariff and trade wars have no winner. However, he said that China does not want to fight these wars but is not scared of them. He expressed China's commitment to joining hands and removing barriers.

Earlier in a statement shared on X, Lin Jian stated, "In a world full of uncertainties, China remains committed to

joining hands, not throwing punches; removing barriers, not erecting walls; promoting connectivity, not pursuing decoupling."

While sharing the statement on X, Lin wrote, "China is the world's market and a source of opportunities for every country."

Lin Jian's statement came after the White House fact sheet stated that China's retaliatory actions have resulted in up to a 245 per cent tariff on imports to the United States. Prior to the latest revision, a 145 per cent tariff was being levied on Chinese exports to the United States.

Earlier this month, US President Donald Trump imposed reciprocal tariffs on dozens of countries with which the country has a trade deficit. Later, Trump decided to pause the tariffs for 90 days after many countries initiated talks with the US administration for a trade deal."

More than 75 countries have already reached out to discuss new trade deals," the White House fact sheet said.

"As a result, the individualised higher tariffs



are currently paused amid these discussions, except for China, which retaliated," the fact sheet added.

For the time being, a baseline tariff of 10 per cent would be applicable on US imports. Trump imposed a 10 per cent tariff on all countries and individualised reciprocal higher tariffs on nations with which the US has the largest trade deficits to level the playing field and protect America's national security.

On Tuesday, White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt responded to questions on China during the press briefing. When asked if Trump would reduce tariffs on China to complete the TikTok deal, Leavitt said that Trump's position on China is "quite clear."

In her remarks, Leavitt

said, "The President has made his position on China quite clear, although I do have an additional statement that he just shared with me in the Oval Office. The ball is in China's court. China needs to make a deal with us. We don't have to make a deal with them."

She elaborated, "There's no difference between China and any other country, except they are much larger. And China wants what we have, what every country wants, what we have -- the American

consumer, or to put it another way, they need our money."

She further added, "So the President again has made it quite clear that he's open to a deal with China, but China needs to make a deal with the United States of America"

Trump unveiled the "Fair and Reciprocal Plan" on trade to restore fairness in US trade relationships and counter non-reciprocal trade agreements. Trump's reciprocal tariffs have led to a broad-based fall in global financial markets, with markets plunging in Asia and Europe.

The reciprocal tariffs

have set off a sell-off in equities globally, and the US itself is no exception. Investors fear that the moves concerning global trade may raise inflation, risking economic growth. Since assuming office for his second term, Donald Trump has reiterated his stance on tariff reciprocity, emphasising that the US will match tariffs imposed by other coun-

tries, including India, to

ensure fair trade.

South Korean police raid former president's office

Police said Wednesday they had "initiated the execution of a search and seizure warrant at the presidential office and the



SEOUL, Apr 16 (Agencies): South Korean police raided Wednesday the office of former president Yoon Suk Yeol and his security detail, as part of a spiralling criminal probe into the impeached leader.

resisted arrest for weeks in a criminal probe.

After a lengthy standoff, in which his security detail played a key role, he became South Korea's first sitting head of state to be arrested released on procedural grounds.

Police said Wednesday they had "initiated the execution of a search and seizure warrant at the presidential office and the presidential residence complex."

Police seized encrypted phone servers and raided the office of Yoon's presidential security detail, plus his chief of security's house, in what they said was part of a probe into "alleged obstruction of an arrest warrant execution".

Yoon spent weeks holed up in his compound in January, pro-

tected by members of the Presidential Security Service who had remained loyal to him.

His guards had installed barbed wire and barricades at the residence, forcing hundreds of police officers and investigators to use ladders and scale perimeter walls to reach the main building.

At the time, he was booked on charges of obstruction, with police saying this week that "in principle" an investigation would be necessary.

Police also seized CCTV footage from the presidential office, as part of a separate probe into former interior minister Lee Sang-min, they said.

Govt bans manufacture. Sale of 35 fixeddose combination drugs

include painkillers, nutrition supplements and anti-diabetics.

They have also been asked to review their approval process for such fixed dose combination drugs (FDC) and ensure strict compliance of the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940 and rules.

FDC drugs are those which contain a combination of two or more active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) in a fixed ratio.

The regulator issued the directions after it found that certain FDC drugs have been licensed for manufacture, sale, and distribution without prior evaluation of safety and efficacy, posing a serious risk to public health and safety.

In a communication sent on April 11, Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) Dr Rajeev Raghuvanshi referred to the letter issued by his office on January 2013 where concerns were raised regarding the grant of manufacturing licenses for sale of FDC drugs that fall under the definition of a "New Drug" in the country without due approval from DCGI.

The same concern has been raised from time to time and multiple letters have been issued to the respective state licensing authorities that granted permission for manufacturing and marketing of unapproved FDCs. The most recent such letter was issued in February this year.

"It has come to the notice of this directorate that certain FDC drugs have been licensed for manufacture, sale, and distribution without prior evaluation of safety and efficacy as per the provision of NDCT Rules 2019 under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940. This poses a serious risk to public health and safety," the letter stated.

The approval of such unapproved FDCs compromises patient safety and may lead to adverse drug reactions, drug interactions, and other health hazards due to the absence of scientific validation, the letter underlined.

Upon issuance of show cause notices to the manufacturers, they have stated that these licenses were granted by the respective drug licensing authorities and have not violated any rules, it said.

This has resulted in a lack of uniform enforcement of the provision of NDCT Rules 2019 under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940 across the country, the letter pointed out.

"In view of the above, all state and union territory drug controllers are requested to review their approval process for such FDCs and ensure strict compliance of the

provisions of the act and rules," the letter said.

The letter also listed out 35 unapproved FDCs which were earlier licensed by state/ UT drug controllers for manufacture, sale and distribution without evaluation of safety and efficacy by Central Drugs Standard Organisation (CDSCO) and later on cancelled by Drug Licensing Authorities (SLAs) or voluntarily surrendered by manufacturers following the issuance of show cause notices for reference.

Rashtriya Bajrang Dal protests against attacks on Hindus in Bengal, demands President's Rule

Speaking at the protest, Rakesh Bajrangi, President of Rashtriya Bajrang Dal, Jammu and Kashmir, claimed that in Murshidabad, more than 500 Hindu families have been forced to flee due to violent attacks

"Houses were burnt, Hindu families assaulted, temples vandalized, and shops looted-all while the government remained a silent spectator," he said.

Rakesh Bajrangi drew parallels between the

present situation in Bengal and the exodus of Kashmiri Pandits in 1990, calling it "a planned conspiracy to drive Hindus out of the

region." He questioned those who dismissed the truth of The Kashmir Files, asking what they now have to say about the emerging "Bengal Files." He further alleged that

jihadist elements are systematically targeting Hindus across the country. Referring to a recent

incident in Nashik, Bajrangi said that violence erupted over the tomb of Aurangzeb, leading to attacks on Hindu households.

He also condemned the recent attack on a police party in Bari Brahmana, Jammu, in which Inspector Pushpendra Singh and three other officers were seriously

"These types of incidents are increasing rapidly, and political parties that stay silent or lend support to such violence are equally responsible," Bajrangi said. The Rashtriya Bajrang Dal demanded that the Central Government immediately impose President's Rule in West Bengal, take strict action against rioters, and ensure the safety and security of Hindus in the state.

He emphasized that Hindus, who have always upheld the Constitution and spoken for national unity, are now being persecuted in their own country.

"Hindus are being pushed to the edge, he warned. "If these attacks do not stop, the Hindu community will not remain silent—it will

Bumrah's form in spotlight as Mumbai Indians, **Sunrisers Hyderabad search for consistency**

31-year-old will face stern test against fearsome Sunrisers line-up comprising Travis Head, Abhishek Sharma, Ishan Kishan and Heinrich Klaasen

MUMBAI, Apr 16 (Agencies): An inconsistent Mumbai Indians will hope that ace pacer Jasprit Bumrah returns to his menacing best, which is essential for them to stop an explosive Sunrisers Hyderabad batting unit in its tracks in a potentially high-scoring IPL match here on Thursday.

Coming off a three-month long injury layoff, Bumrah is yet to find the accuracy which makes him a tough customer to deal with.

After a rather tidy outing against Royal Challengers Bengaluru, Bumrah struggled to nail his yorkers and was taken apart by Delhi Capitals' Karun Nair as he leaked 44 runs in that game.

The 31-year-old will face a stern test against a fearsome Sunrisers line-up comprising Travis Head, Abhishek Sharma, Ishan Kishan and Heinrich Klaasen.

But the five-time champions will also want former captain Rohit Sharma to get back to his run-making ways at the earliest as his current tally is an underwhelming 56 runs from five matches at an average of 11.20.

It has played a massive role in them languishing at the seventh place in the points table with just two wins, and those results were largely built around the contributions of Suryakumar Yadav and Tilak Varma.

Rohit, who has persisted with his ultra-aggressive approach, has struggled against left-arm pace but there could be some respite given SRH don't have any frontline left-arm seamer



unless they bring in Jaydev Unadkat.

While Suryakumar has still not been at his brutal best, being retired out against Lucknow Super Giants served as a wakeup call for Tilak.

After that difficult outing in Lucknow, Tilak has responded with scores of 56 (29b) and 59 (33b) to indicate his return to form.

Naman Dhir remains a vital cog for MI as he has been given the role of an aggressor with the bat in the death overs, but otherwise he has been their best fielder this season.

The way MI clinched a win from Delhi with accurate fielding might just ignite the missing spark in their camp.

Interestingly, both MI and SRH were able to snap their disappointing run with impressive wins in their previous outings. But it remains to be seen if they are able to attain consistency, which will define their future in the competition.

SRH's struggles

Chasing, SRH scored nearly 250 runs to beat PBKS by eight wickets with their batters, especially Abhishek, finding their lost rhythm collectively after the 2016 winners lost four matches on the trot.

Coming off a splendid 55-ball 141. Abhishek will look to draw confidence from his last outing

here at the Wankhede Stadium in February this year when he took apart England's bowling to score 135 in the fifth T20I for India.

Kishan too would be eager to make this outing against his former franchise count on what had been his home ground for several seasons.

The nature of the Wankhede Stadium pitch often ensures tall totals here, but the bowlers can look forward to some bounce off the surface.

Suruchi Singh wins back-to-back WC gold; silver for Manu Bhaker

China's Yao Qianxun took the bronze



LIMA, Apr 16 (Agencies): Teenaged shooter Suruchi Inder Singh produced yet another sterling performance in the 10m air pistol event here to clinch her second consecutive ISSF World Cup gold, while Paris Olympics medallist Manu Bhaker bagged the silver to ensure India's domination in the competition.

The Jhajjar-based Suruchi, 18, who had won her maiden World Cup gold in the season's inaugural global event recently, tallied 243.6 in the 24-shot final, to leave Manu 1.3 points behind

China's Yao Qianxun took the bronze. Suruchi and Manu's podium finish meant that India collected one medal of each colour on the day, with men's 10m air pistol marksman Saurabh Chaudhary earlier winning a bronze

India's exploits in the women's 10m air pistol competition in the Peruvian capital has taken the country to the top of the standings with three medals, followed by China, which has won the men's air pistol gold.

There were clear indications during the 60-shot qualification round that the Indian duo would comfortably make it to the finals from a 28-strong field. Suruchi took the second spot with a regulation 582, while Manu was fourth with 578. Sainyam, the third Indian in the fray,

was 11th with 571 Suruchi was at a different level in the final, carrying on her superb form in the last few months to quickly move to second after the first series of five

Yao had taken an early lead and Manu was fourth with Uruguay's Julieta Jimenez, who shot a good final, in third at that stage.

After the second five-shot series, Yao had compatriot Meng Yufei breathing down her neck, just 0.1 behind, while Suruchi moved down to third with Manu

holding on to her fourth position. The Indians, Suruchi in particular, then came into their elements as Meng had a meltdown of sorts. A couple of high 10s ensured that after the 13th single shot, it was an Indian 1-2 with the Chinese

falling out of the top-two contention. Manu then had a couple of mid to low 9s for her 16th and 17th shots, which probably cost her the gold in the end. Suruchi emerged as the more consis-

tent shooter on the day. Yao then had a good run and dethroned Julieta for bronze, but with the final two shots left, it was Suruchi who was ahead of Manu by 0.7 points.

The teenager scored better on the last two shots to beat the more experienced Manu and extend a sensational run of form, which began with the nationals in December last year.

Suruchi had also won the 10m air pistol mixed team bronze with Saurabh in Buenos Aires.

He questioned the hospital's preparedness to nangle emergencies, such as injuries from ceasefire violations, given its current state.

Urging immediate action, Kundan requested the administration to urgently address the deficiencies at Arnia hospital. He warned that failure to do so would lead to strong protests.
