JAMMU, Apr 21: The Jammu and Kashmir Government has appointed Vikas Sharma, Special Secretary to the Government, Housing and **Urban Development** Department, as the new Mission Director for the National **Urban Digital Mission** (NUDM).

J&K Govt orders probe against SDA **Officials**

JAMMU, Apr 21: The Jammu and Kashmir Government has appointed Mir Nasrool Hilal Jeri, JKAS, as the Inquiry Officer to look into charges against officials of the Srinagar **Development Authority** (SDA).

Sufficient stock of essential supplies available: **Div Com Kashmir**

SRINAGAR, Apr 21 (Agencies): Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, V K Bidhuri Monday urged public not to panic over the availability of essential supplies in the Valley, including petrol, diesel, LPG, and food grains.

Speaking to reporters in Srinagar, Bidhuri as per the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO), said there is sufficient stock of food grains available, along with a buffer provision for over a year.

"For LPG, we have enough stock in advance, including seventeen days worth of supply, which is adequate," he said.

Talking about the fuel situation, the Divisional Commissioner stated that Kashmir consumes around 1,000 kilolitres of diesel per day, and currently, 12,500 kilolitres were available, which is enough for 12 to 13 days even though the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway is temporarily

closed. Regarding petrol, he informed that the daily consumption stands at 625 kilolitres, and the region currently has a stock of nearly 10,000

kiloliters. "There is no need to line up at petrol pumps or panic. The situation is normal and under control," Bidhuri said, urging the public to avoid hoarding or creating unnecessary fear.

Jammu-Srinagar highway may reopen in 5-6 days: NHAI



RAMBAN, Apr 21 (Agencies): The landslide-hit Jammu-Srinagar National Highway remained closed for a second day on Monday, with a senior NHAI official saying the road clearance operation, underway at 20 locations, was likely to take about six days.

Hundreds of vehicles were left stranded on the strategic 250-kilometre highway — the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country - on Sunday after heavy rainfall and cloudbursts triggered flash floods. landslides and mudslides in Jammu and Kashmir's

Ramban district.

Three persons, including two minor siblings, were killed and more than 100 people were rescued as the natural calamity caused massive damage to infrastructure, including roads and residential buildings. A number of vehicles were also buried under the debris. "We are faced with a

challenging situation due to massive deposits of muck on the highway at more than a dozen places, especially on the four-kilometre stretch between Seri and Maroog. The height of the sludge at some places is more than 20

feet," National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) project director Purshottam Kumar said.

The agency's major machinery, including earth movers, are buried under the debris, he added. "Despite limited avail-

able resources of our own, we have arranged machinery from private contractors and deployed those at 20 affected locations simul taneously to speed up the restoration work," he said, expressing satisfaction at the improved weather condition after two days of heavy rain.

However, Kumar said the highway was likely

to take five to six days to reopen for traffic.

The highway has suffered major damages near Panthiyal and Kela Morh, he added.

Meanwhile, stranded commuters, including two newlywed couples, were seen moving on foot to reach their destinations.

"The road is destroyed (at a number of places). The situation is very bad," Rajasthan native Devi Lal, who is heading home from the Magam area of central Kashmir's Budgam district, told PTI Videos in Ramban.

VATICAN CITY, Apr 21 (Agencies): Pope Francis has died, the Vatican said on Monday. The Pope passed away on Easter Monday, April 21, 2025, at the age of 88 at his residence in the Vatican's Casa Santa Marta. according to a statement from the Vatican.

At 9:45 AM on Easter Monday, Cardinal Kevin Farrell. Camerlengo of the Apostolic Chamber, spoke these words at



the Casa Santa Marta: "Dearest brothers and sisters, with deep sorrow, I must announce the death of our Holy Father Francis. At 7:35

this morning, the Bishop of Rome, Francis, returned to the house of the Father. His entire life was dedicated to the service of the Lord and of His Church. He taught us to live the values of the Gospel with fidelity, courage, and universal love, especially in favour of the poorest and most marginalised. CM to visit Ramban, Assure compensation through relief funds

SRINAGAR, Apr 21 (Agencies): Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday said that efforts are being made to restore the National Highway and the residential area in Ramban affected by the recent landslides triggered by heavy rainfall.

Talking to reporters, the Chief Minister said that he is himself visiting Ramban today to assess the ground situation and will chair a meeting in this regard.

"In some Ramban

areas, the situation has worsened. I had sent the Deputy Chief Minister and two other local MLAs to the spot to assess the situation," he said, adding that efforts are being made to restore the highway immediately, as well as the residential areas affected by the landslides.

The Chief Minister added that arrangements are being made for relief, while the PM relief fund and other funds will be tapped so

that people receive compensation.

However, he said, he wants to assure people that there is no shortage of essentials and there is no need for hoarding. "The government and officials have been strictly directed to act tough against black marketing and unnecessary price hikes. Police will also be involved to act against such persons, and if needed, arrests will be made in this regard."


Central, State GST officers detect 25,009 fake firms fraudulently passing Rs 61,545 Cr ITC in FY25

NEW DELHI, Apr 21 (Agencies): Central and state GST officers have detected 25,009 fake firms involved in fraudulently passing input tax credit (ITC) worth Rs 61,545 crore during 2024-25, officials said.

During the 2024-25 fiscal ending March 2025, Central and state GST officers recovered Rs 1,924 crore by way of blocking ITC and arrested 168 persons.

As per data on ITC frauds unearthed by Central and State GST officers, over the two years 2023-24 and 2024-25, 42,140 fake firms were detected, which were involved in fraudulently generating ITC of over Rs 1.01 lakh crore. Rs 3,107 crore was recovered by way of blocking of ITC, and 316 arrests have been made. "The Central and State Governments and GSTN have taken various steps to prevent fake ITC claims, including providing intelligence inputs, detecting fraudulent registration, and suspicious e-way bill activity," an official told Under the Goods and

Services Tax (GST) regime, ITC refers to the taxes paid by businesses on purchases from suppliers. This tax Turn to page 9

Five cannons of destruction: from education to tehsil

he failure of five institutions like education, health, medical, police station, and tehsil is a matter of serious concern. Education is no longer a market for knowledge; it has become a market for coaching and fees. Health services have fallen prey to privatization, where packages are sold more than treatment. The medical system has become a hub of profiteering. Police stations have become a center for bribery instead of justice, and tehsils have become a labyrinth of papers. These institutions need to be reformed.

**"Education, health, medicine, police station, and tehsil.

Everybody together is putting nails in the coffin.

These two lines are not mere embellishments but a strong proclamation of the despair that crushes the hopes of the common man and makes him a magnet for despair. These are the five pillars with which our society maintains the balance of its fragile soil—but, alas, they themselves have turned into stones.

Education: Where knowledge is being

Since childhood we have been taught that education builds a person's character. But now character is not sold anywhere but is found hanging on the walls of coaching centers. Be it the tenth board or medical admission, the question is not of merit but of favoritism and recommendation.

Uniformed teachers have turned into a magical entity where fee collection is more important than scholarship. Smart classrooms do not bring dusty textbooks but the sufferings of parents. A student dreaming of an NIT becomes an NPA (non-performing asset) because employers no longer demand a degree but practical skills—the only way to achieve these is by paying fees and pass-

The coaching center, which used to prepare students for entrance exams, now conducts exams for money. Every year, lakhs of parents are 'absorbed' strung' together in the garland of one coaching center and hung on the rope of another center. The result? The rays

Health: No service, service fee

On hearing the name of health care, one is reminded of the graveyard-like atmosphere of government hospitals. Where fans in the waiting room prepare to spread disease rather than air. Doctors are fewer in number, and private departments are more numerous. The patient has become just a 'cashcounter.'

Private hospitals have considered the sick customer as their 'target market.' Tests, MRIs, surgery-everything is sold in packages. Even a small cough attracts a procedure charge, while the bill for a night spent in a room is no less than a heart attack. If a poor person embraces death, he has to pay only 'dead body transport charges' for his last journey in a safe coffin.

A patient's stubborn breaths don't make anyone cry; only his bill does. Doctors are no longer life-giving humans, but life-giving income receipts. Instead of medical skills, deals are struck at the price of insurance company credentials. And when the disease gives up, the hospital also offers 'free discharge' advertisements—advertising the last 'salvation' of the poor.

Medicine: No cure, just a solution to the problem

The word chikitsa means the cure of disease, but now the market of mixfakes has come alive. General practitioners now play the role of agents of multinational pharmaceutical companies. Tablets for every cough, injections for every pain; the disease becomes an illusion.

Without an MRI or CT scan, no doctor can diagnose the disease. A patient comes to the dock when his medicine box disappears from his pocket. The 'spinal cord business' is flourishing with the injection of joint pain, and the 'war room' of kidney transplant is doing the surgery of bones. Every day a list of new diseases is deposited on the table of the CEO for approval.

Even Ayurveda and Unani are being sold at luxury-branded counters. Instead of effective herbal formulas, medicines are being sold at prices equivalent to a pile of tea leaves and SUV wheels. The patient is reduced to just a 'certificate of success,' whose real value

he realizes only when he sits down to write a 'suicide note' in a bank branch. Police stations: No justice, but a mon-

ey-printing machine

In our imagination, the police were the 'guardians of justice,' but now they have become the 'messengers of attack.' Police stations are not dusty, but bribery is organized. After bargaining, the case is registered or rejected. The complainant has to first take permission, and if money is not given, then along with the permission, 'silence' is also handed over.

Even if you collide with a Maruti car, the charge sheet paper is recovered before the hassle of court. Instead of fast-track, a fast-payment tracking system has been started. Despite getting a huge budget, the only fund of the police station has become 'money of money.' Man has become so small that before registering a complaint, his 'ration card' is asked.

And even when justice is delivered, it drowns in 'petition fees.' Once caught in the infallible police machinery, it is not leaves but money that flies.

Tehsil: The paper jungle of democracy Tehsil is a palace where a person gets lost in the crowd of documents. Be it land division or caste certificate, a gathering of 'slips' is arranged for everything. Government stamp papers, e-signatures, and online portals—all are complications in the name of moder-

While travelling in the jungle of papers, a man forgets whether it is his house or a brokerage of papers. The sweat dries up in the line for land registration, but the committee fee does not. The magician of backdated documents for caste certificates becomes a hero. A mistake leads to cancellation of the document, and then a new document means a new bill.

Here, in the name of 'innovation,' 'digital imaging' is being sold like a Flipkart costume—but in reality, a person's soul dries up while checking messages on mobile. In 'online application,' 'credit card' plays a role instead of currency. And the one who pays a hefty fee remains a spectator in the real 'court.' When will the nails be changed?

These five pillars, which were the basis of our faith, have today become the nails of the coffin. There are disorders in every society, but where the disorder becomes the soul of the system, there the call for change resounds. But will our call be able to break the silence?

Our responsibility is

Build community knowledge centers instead of private coaching malls for education.

Rebuild health services based on the principle of humanity rather than profit. Prevent medical commercialization through regulation—make treatment, not profit, the norm.

Enact police reform laws-don't let the sentinel of justice become a bribery machine.

Turn the 'paper jungle' into a 'golden garden' by bringing transparency to tehsil and administrative services.

Till then the blows of fate will continue, but we will germinate the seeds of justice, service, and dignity with the pen of farming. Only then, perhaps, will these nails be separated from the coffin, and the soul of the country will flutter again.

JAMMU, Apr 21: The social and political activists tributed the reverence Bimla Kashmiri commanded in her era, recalling 'Back then, other female leads were simply referred to as heroines, but Bimla Kashmiri was the one and only one 'actress dancer ' -a title she earned with her extraordinary talent and dedication.

BJP Activist R.L.Kaith while throwing light on her life and activities said that she was born as 'Gulabi' in a Sargotra family of Batwal Community at Bermean, a small village in Udhampur district of Jammu and Kashmir.

She had four sisters and one brother. She spent her early life in the village. She challenged the regressive practice of child marriage when she was about to be married off with a Nandan caste boy of Narwal Pain at



the tender age of twelve. She, however, insisted that she would like to become a dancer. After the untimely demise of her parents while she was in her teens, she was raised by her brother. After the partition of India, during October-November 1947 when a large number of people died in communal rioting, her family moved to Jammu and lived in a refugee camp. One day she alongwith other fans went to Hotel Premier at Residency Road to see Indian film actors who were staying over there. During their audience

performing dance continuously for eight hours and very soon her name conjured up an image of an eminent Indian Bimla also acted in

many Hindi films in her career as actress, supporting actress and dancer. Some of her noted films were Fuji Lama (1952), CID (1956), Harishchandra Taramati (1963), Magic Carpet (1964) and Truck Driver (1970). The then Indian Prime Minister Morarji Desai had praised her dancing and acting.

Bimla did court marriage with a south indian, Madho Rao at the age of 40 and lived with him happily. Bimla had not a child of h

er own but had adopted her niece. Mala whom she raised as a daughter and provided her with the best music education. It pained her when she having married a Muslim boy, ran away from home. This

December 1978, she fell unconscious and ill. She was immediately flown to Bombay hospital by her husband.

After thorough investigation, she was diagnosed with cancer which had spread throughout her body to her brain and lungs. After a brave fight with the fatal disease, this great inimitable artist died in January 1979 at the age of 48. Her last words said to her husband were, "Money can't buy life". The film industry deprived of one of the greatest performers.

Bimla left behind her a huge property that included her having two bungalows one on Warden Road and another at Ganeshpuri, one hotel at Brijeshpuri, one restaurant, one dance school and three luxury cars. The Actor Dharminder when went to Bombay to have his earlier pictures taken in 1952, stayed in her bungalow.

It reminds me that we're all just navigating the same storm—just on different ships." That duality—of performer and planner runs deep in him. Raised in Makrana, Rajasthan, his roots are strong, but his gaze has always been outward. "My dad ran a video library. I grew up watching world cinema. That exposure planted the seed."

From modeling to Fear Factor India, where he once hoisted the national flag atop the Kuala Lumpur Tower, Rizwann's path has been anything but ordinary. "Fear Factor gave me visibility. It made me fearless—not just in stunts but in life."

But transitioning from reality TV to acting came with its own struggles. "People saw me as just a reality star. My first serious role had barely any dialogue. But that's where I learned—less is more. That performance changed how the industry saw me; Ekta Kapoor ma'am noticed me too," he says with gratitude in his voice.

His television days from Kasauti Zindagi Kay to Kayamath taught him discipline, but his heart beats for characters with depth. "I'm drawn to vulnerability. To love, loss, longing. Emotional truth is what I chase.'

And he isn't afraid to aim high. "I'd love to do something like Edward Scissorhands or Pirates of the Caribbean. Or something intense like My Left Foot. Even a Bond-style film-I've always wanted to play that kind of role.'

Off the screen, Rizwann stays sharp with sports, fitness and parkour. "I incorporate my athletic side into my shoots—jumping from rooftops, climbing water tanks. It adds thrill and truth to the visuals."

But through it all fame, fear, fatigueit's the inner fire that keeps him going. "It's hard sometimes. But I believe in two thingsthe hunger inside and the light within. That light gets me through the darkness."

Rohith Vemula was a 26-year-old Dalit PhD scholar at the University of Hyderabad, whose tragic death by suicide in January 2016 sparked nationwide outrage. In his heart-wrenching suicide note, Vemula highlighted the deep-rooted caste-based discrimination he faced in academic spaces, bringing attention to the harsh realities that many students from marginalised communi-

The Congress party is now pushing for the Rohith Vemula Act, a proposed legislation aimed at curbing caste-based discrimination in educational institutions.

Taking to social media, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, wrote, "Unless every student receives respect, security, and equal opportunity without discrimination, our education system cannot be fair to all. After writing a letter to Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah ji, I have written to Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu ji and Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy ji, urging them to implement the 'Rohith Vemula Act'. As the needs and aspirations of citizens evolve rapidly, civil services must also adapt to contemporary challenges.

He claimed that India

has undergone transformative changes in the past ten years. "We are no longer just focused on growth, but on setting benchmarks in governance, transparency, and innovation. Our G20 Presidency is a strong example of this," he asserted, adding that over 200 meetings were held across more than 60 cities, creating an inclusive footprint never before seen in the history of the G20. "This reflects our truly holistic approach."

Touching upon the success of development initiatives, PM Modi said, "We have often discussed aspirational districts, but the success of aspirational blocks is equally important. This programme was launched in January 2023, and within just two years, unprecedented changes have been seen in key indicators-health, social development, and basic infrastructure.'

Eight Naxals including one with bounty of Rs 1 cr killed in Jharkhand encounter

RANCHI, Apr 21 (Agencies): Eight Naxals, including a top rung central committee member of the extremists carrying a bounty of Rs 1 crore on his head, were killed in an encounter with CoBRA commandos of the CRPF and police in Bokaro district of Jharkhand on Monday, officials said.

The exchange of fire started around 5.30 am in Lugu Hills of Lalpania area of the district, they said.

The troops of 209 Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) along with state police conducted the operation in which eight Naxals were killed and an AK series rifle, three INSAS rifles, a self-loading rifle (SLR), eight country-made guns and a pistol were seized, officials said.

Those killed include central committee member of the extremist outfit Prayag Manjhi alias Vivek, special area committee member



Arvind Yadav alias Avinash, zonal committee member Sahebram Manjhi alias Rahul Manjhi, Mahesh Manjhi alias Mota, Talu, Ranju Manjhi, Gangaram and Mahesh.

Vivek carried a bounty of Rs 1 crore, Arvind Yadav had a reward of Rs 25 lakh and Sahebram Majhi Rs 10 lakh.

They were booked by the police in various cases of violence, the officials said.

The central committee is the top decision-making body of the Maoist organisation, they said. No injuries have been reported among the

GORAKHPUR, Apr 21 (Agencies): Six people were killed and two others injured when a car rammed into a tree in Kushinagar district in

Uttar Pradesh, police said on Monday.

The incident took place at Shukla Bhujauli crossing on Sunday night when the occupants of the car were on their way to Devgaon village to attend a wedding.

Police rushed the occupants of the car to a hospital with the help of locals, officials said.

Doctors declared six of them dead on arrival, while the remaining two are undergoing treatment, they said.

Kushinagar Superintendent of Police Santosh Kumar Mishra said a detailed investigation into the incident is underway. The deceased have been identified as brothers Harendra Maddheshia and Yogendra Maddheshia, along with Ranjeet, Mukesh, Bheem Laxman Yadav. and the car driver, Om Prakash. All the victims were aged between 25 and 40 years, police said.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath expressed deep condolences to the bereaved families and directed district officials to ensure prompt and adequate treatment for the injured, an official statement said.

2 shot dead, 5 injured as argument over paking at wedding turns violent in Bihar

ARA, Apr 21 (Agencies): Two persons were shot dead and five others injured after an altercation over parking turned violent at a wedding in Bihar's Bhojpur district, police said on Monday.

The incident happened in Laharpa village in the Garhani police station area around 9.30 pm on

Sunday, they said. A heated argument between two

groups over parking vehicles at a wedding escalated, following which one side opened fire on the other, police said in a statement.

"While one person died of bullet injury on the spot, another was declared brought dead by the doctors at the hospital," they said.

The deceased were identified as Luvkush and Rahul. Five others sustained gunshot wounds and are undergoing treatment at a hospital in Ara, the district headquarters of Bhojpur, police said.

"A case has been registered and an investigation is underway. Bodies of the deceased have been sent for the post-mortem examination," the statement said.

Police said they are trying to ascertain the identities of the accused involved in the firing.

12 killed, 30 injured in fresh US strikes on Yemeni capital Sanaa, say Houthis

SANAA, Apr 21 (Agencies): The Houthi rebels' health ministry said early Monday that new US air strikes on the Yemeni capital Sanaa killed at least 12 people and wounded 30.

The Houthi-run Saba news agency cited the ministry as saying the dead and injured had come from overnight strikes "by the American enemy" on a market and a residential zone in Sanaa's Farwa district.

Other raids were reported late Sunday in the central province of Marib, Hodeida in the west and the Houthi bastion of Saada in the north, Saba said.

US Lawmaker reaffirms commitment to Taiwan, warns against China threat

TAIPEI, Apr 21 (Agencies): Amid rising tensions in the Taiwan Strait, US Representative Seth Moulton has reaffirmed Washington's commitment to bolstering Taiwan's defence capabilities against potential aggression from China, Taiwan News reported.

In comments made during an interview with Taiwan News, Moulton stressed that the US is determined to help Taiwan deter a Chinese invasion and preserve peace in the region.

"Neither Taiwanese nor Americans want to have a war with China," Moulton said. "Therefore, the US is going to do whatever we can to deter that and prevent it from happening, and where that means tighter security cooperation in the name of deterrence, in the name of peace, we're happy to do that."

Moulton emphasised that Washington's support is rooted in the goal of ensuring stability and preventing conflict through increased defence collaboration.

While making clear

that he did not want to see conflict arise, Moulton praised Taiwan for "thinking much more creatively" about how to strengthen its defensive posture. Based on his visits to Taiwan in recent years, he said there had been a "dramatic improvement" in how the country has adopted

an asymmetric defence strategy to resist China, as per reports by Taiwan News.

He noted that the United States has been actively encouraging partners to prioritise asymmetric approaches, and that "Taiwan is fully embracing it now."

Beyond defence, Moulton said that the US Congress is also aiming to deepen economic ties with Taiwan. "There's a lot of push behind the scenes for a free trade deal," he said, signalling bipartisan support for strengthening bilateral economic engagement.

Addressing broader concerns, Moulton warned about the rise of isolationist tendencies in US foreign policy, call-



ing it "not a good historical trend for the United States." He added that adversaries have exploited such isolation in the past.

However, he remained optimistic, saying that "Democrats and Republicans are much more united behind the scenes," and even within the Trump admin-

istration, many senior officials oppose isolationism, Taiwan News reported.

Moulton serves on the House Armed Services Committee and is the ranking member on the Subcommittee on Strategic Forces. He last visited Taiwan in February as part of a US congressional delegation.

China sends back new Boeing jets as steep US tariffs take a toll

BEIJING, Apr 21 (Agencies): A second Boeing (BA.N), opens new tab jet intended for use by a Chinese airline was heading back to the US on Monday, flight tracking data showed, in what appears to be another victim of the tit-for-tat bilateral tariffs launched by President Donald Trump in his global trade offensive

The 737 MAX 8 landed in the US territory of Guam on Monday, after leaving Boeing's Zhoushan completion center near Shanghai, data from flight tracking website AirNav Radar showed.

Guam is one of the stops such flights make on the 5,000-

mile (8,000-km) journey across the Pacific between Boeing's US production hub in Seattle and the Zhoushan completion center, where planes are ferried by Boeing for final work and delivery to a Chinese carrier.

ed with the livery for China's Xiamen Airlines made the return journey from Zhoushan and landed at Seattle's Boeing Field. It is not clear which party made the decision for the two aircraft to return to the US

On Sunday a 737 MAX paint-

Boeing could find a replacement buyer in Malaysia Airlines, however, which has said it was talking to the manufacturer about acquiring jets that may become available should Chinese airlines stop taking deliveries.

Trump this month raised baseline tariffs on Chinese imports to 145%. In retaliation, China has imposed a 125% tariff on US goods. A Chinese airline taking delivery of a Boeing jet could be crippled by the tariffs, given that a new 737 MAX has a market value of around \$55 million, according to IBA, an aviation consultancy.

The plane flew from Seattle to Zhoushan just under a month

ago.

Boeing did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

The return of the 737 MAX jets, Boeing's best-selling model, is the latest sign of disruption to new aircraft deliveries from a breakdown in the aerospace industry's decades-old duty-free status.

The tariff war and apparent U-turn over deliveries comes as Boeing has been recovering from an almost five-year import freeze on 737 MAX jets and a previous round of trade tensions

Confusion over changing tariffs could leave many aircraft deliveries in limbo, with some airline CEOs saying they would defer delivery of planes rather than pay duties, analysts say.

China warns countries against trade deals with US that harm Beijing's interests



BEIJING, Apr 21 (Agencies): Amid the ongoing trade war, China on Monday has warned that it firmly opposes any trade deals with the United States at the expense of Beijing's intests, state media reported, adding that it will slap countermeasures in "resolute and reciprocal manner" against coutries which strive to "appease" Washington.

Under the guise of so-called "reciprocity," the United States has been recently arbitrarily imposing tariffs on all its trading partners while pressuring them to engage in socalled "reciprocal tariff" negotiations, an official spokesperson for China's Ministry of Commerce said, according to news agency.

The spokesperson was responding to reports that the United States is preparing to pressure other countries to restrict trade ties with China in exchange for tariff exemptions.

"This is essentially using the banner of 'reciprocity' as a pretext to pursue hegemonic politics and unilateral bullying in the field of international economy and trade," the spokesperson said as per the Chinese media outlet.

While the Donald Trump administration has imposed 10 per cent tariff on various countries, it has put duties of upto 145 per cent on many products from China. Beijing has retaliated by slapping duties of 125 per cent on US goods.

The Chinese spokesperson said that pursuing short-term, self-serving interests by harming others' interests in exchange for so-called "exemptions" is akin to making a pact with the tiger for its skin - it will ultimately leave all parties empty-handed, harming others without benefiting oneself, the spokesperson said.

China warned against international trade returning to the "law of the jungle" and said that it is willing to strengthen solidarity and coordination with all parties, join hands to deal with them, jointly resist unilateral bullying, safeguard its legitimate rights and interests, and defend international justice.

Philippines refute China claims of expelling Manila vessel from Scarborough Shoal

MANILA, Apr 21 (Agencies): A Philippines naval official on Monday refuted claims that the Chinese military had driven away a Philippine naval vessel, which, according to Beijing, had illegally intruded into the contested Scarborough Shoal in the South China Sea.

West Philippine Sea Rear Admiral Roy Vincent Trinidad told the Philippine News Agency (PNA) that China's claim is just part of Beijing's "malign information or shaping operations more likely intended for their internal audience."

He added that only the Philippine Navy and the country's maritime law enforcement vessels have the authority to challenge foreign ships intruding into the country's maritine zones, the news outlet said.

A spokesperson for the Chinese military's Southern Theater Command on Sunday had said that it had organized navy vessels to track, monitor, issue warnings, and drive away the Philippine vessel, which it identifid as the Apolinario Mabini corvette, that had "entered the territorial waters of Huangyan Dao without authorization from the Chinese government."

Chinese military spokesperson Senior Captain Zhao Zhiwei said in a statement that the actions by the Philippine side "severely violated China's sovereignty and contravened both Chinese law and relevant provisions of international law," agency reported.

The Scarborough Shoal is an atoll located some 125 nautical miles (about 230 kilometers) west of the Philippine island of Luzon and has been disputed by the two countries for decades.

Although Manila claims it as part of its exclusive economic zone (EEZ), the uninhabited feature is effectively controlled by Beijing, which has maintained a constant coast guard presence there since 2012.

Under the "nine-dash line," Beijing maintains a claim to some 90 per cent of the resource-rich South China Sea, overlapping with the claims of Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei, Indonesia and the Philippines.

Chinese and Philippine vessels have engaged in multiple collisions and face-offs over the past year as tensions elevated around hotspot areas of contention, agency reported.

In March, China conducted a patrol in the South China Sea, deploying two longrange H-6 bombers around the shoal ahead of US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth's visit to the Philippines. Also coiniciding with the US Defence Secretary's visit the United States, Japan and the Philippines held naval drills in the South China Sea.

Central. State GST officers detect **25,009 fake firms** fraudulently pass**ing Rs 61,545 Cr ITC**

in FY25

can be claimed as a credit or deduction at the time of paying the final output tax.

Dealing with fake ITC has been a major challenge for the GST administration as unscrupulous elements were creating fake firms just to claim ITC and defraud the exchequer.

To deal with this, the GST registration process has been made stringent with checks on risky applicants.

While non-risky businesses are to be granted GST registration within 7 days, physical verification and Aadhaar authentication are mandatory for those granting registration to those applicants who are flagged as risky by data analytics. As a measure to track down the

masterminds, the GST Act provides for punishment for wrongly availed ITC, suspension or cancellation of registration of taxpayers involved in fake ITC cases; blocking of ITC in electronic credit ledger; and provisional attachment of property/bank accounts, etc. for the recovery of government dues.

So far, two national conferences of enforcement chiefs of State and Central GST Formations have been held with respect to activities being undertaken by the enforcement formations and the importance of maintaining ease of doing business.

Here's why Panchkula lost out on hosting Neeraj Chopra Classic event, know where it's shifted

CHANDIGARH, Apr 21 (Agencies): The inaugural 'Neeraj Chopra Classic', a marquee javelin throw event named after India's Olympic champion, will now be held in Bengaluru instead of Panchkula, owing to some technical issues raised by World Athletics.

The event is a World Athletics Category A competition and was scheduled for May 24 at the Tau Devi Lal Stadiumthe same stadium where Chopra practiced during the early days of his career.

Chopra, while talking to the media, confirmed that after World Athletics officials raised some technical issues (such as lighting not up to the 600-lux standard, open field layout, and other concerns), the event has now been shifted to the Sri Kanteerava Outdoor Stadium, Bengaluru.

It will feature top javelin throwers from around the world, including Chopra, the Olympic champion.

"Initially, it was planned for Panchkula, but after spotting some technical requirements, it has now been shifted to Bengaluru this year," said Chopra, who maintained that this will now be an annual event to be held in India.

"I am very excited. There will be many international javelin throwers participating in it. I have also invited Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem for the event. He will discuss the same with his coach and revert," said Chopra.

"There were a lot of questions going around... people asking what's next after the Olympics, Diamond League, World Championships and all... so this (the tournament) is my ultimate excitement point now," he added.

Chopra also opened up about his deeper involvement in the organisation of the event.

"I have never gone into such details whether lights should be adequate for live telecasting, what food should be served, how to organise the medal ceremony, or whether the washrooms and changing rooms are comfortable for international javelin throwers. I've never considered such things while playing. But since I'm one of the hosts now... I'm trying to make it happen in a very professional manner," said Chopra.

He also reflected on the change in venue and the upcoming plans.

"Everything was planned in Panchkula. However, since the event is now being shifted, the plans—seating, ticket pricing, timings—will be finalised in a couple of days. The weather in Haryana remains hot in May; hopefully, Bengaluru will be pleasant enough. I've spent some good time in Bengaluru, experienced some exciting football games at the same stadium... so I'm excited to be coming back," he added.

Jyothika Sri Dandi likely to miss **World Relays Championships**

NEW DELHI, Apr 21 (Agencies): One of the premier women's quarter milers of the country is in danger of sitting out of the World Relays, after the Athletics Federation of India rejected her entry to National Federation Senior Athletics Championships.

Jyothika Sri Dandi, who took part at the Paris Olympics, and one of the prominent runners to help India qualify, did not meet AFI's qualifying standards to take part in the meet that is starting in Kochi from today.

The AFI rule stipulates that Indian athletes has to participate in one domestic event, including the Grand Prix, in order to participate in the Kochi meet.

With her entry rejected, the Andhra runner will not be able to be selected for the Asian Championships that is to be held in Gumi, South Korea, next month, as the Senior Athletics Championships was a qualification meet. Further, Jyothika is now nervous about being selected for the World Relays that is to be held



in Guangzhou, China, again in the month of May.

While her entry form was rejected, Jyothika claimed that she sent her entry by mistake, as she is currently undergoing rehabilitation.

"I know my entry has been rejected but I was not supposed to take part in the Kochi meet as I am in rehab as I have some pain in my quads (quadriceps muscle). I should not have sent my entry at all. It was a mistake on my part," Jyothika told The Tribune.

When asked about the World Relays, she said it is in the hands of the federation. "I am hopeful to get selected in

the team for the World Relays but if you ask me about my chances, I will say 'unlikely' since I have missed the Kochi

event," she added.

"I failed to see the circular and now my entry has been rejected. I have to accept it and move one," he said. Overall, the AFI has rejected over 40 entries for the Kochi meet.

IPL 2025: Delhi eye capital gains from openers against confident Lucknow Super Giants

LUCKNOW, Apr 21 (Agencies): Delhi Capitals (DC) will expect a more productive effort from their openers when they visit the 'City of Nawabs' to face an increasingly confident Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) in an IPL match here on Tuesday.

The Capitals' opening has been a bit of roulette so far this season with Faf du Plessis, Jake Fraser-McGurk, Abhishek Porel and the latest entrant Karun Nair coming in at the pole position.

In fact, in the last five matches they had three different opening combinations between those four batters, producing partnerships of 23, 34 0, 9, 0.

It also had to do with the injury of Du Plessis, and the South African's fitness will be closely watched ahead of this match.

Thus far, it looked like a minor glitch because the Capitals have won five of their seven matches and the middle-order under the aegis of KL Rahul too worked like a well-oiled machine.

But Lucknow's com-



petent bowling unit of Digvesh Rathi, Ravi Bishnoi, Avesh Khan and Shardul Thakur, though he is a bit expensive, has choked the opposition without much fanfare.

The way Avesh excelled in the 18th and 20th over against Rajasthan Royals in LSG's two-run win is an example of that.

It's easy to start doubting yourself, but I don't do it: Rohit Sharma

MUMBAI, Apr 21 (Agencies): Star batter Rohit Sharma asserted that he never doubted his abilities amidst a prolonged lean patch, and termed the glorious fifty against Chennai Super Kings as a validation of the faith he has in his skill sets.

'Player of the Match' Rohit slammed four boundaries and six maximums in his unbeaten 45-ball 76 to guide Mumbai Indians to a nine-wicket win over the Super Kings.

It was Rohit's first fifty of this IPL season after scores of 0, 8. 13, 17, 18, and 26 in the previous matches.

"After being here for a long time, it's easy to start doubting yourself and start doing different things. It was important for me to practice well,

hit the ball well. When you are clear in your mind, things like this can happen," said Rohit.

The former MI skipper said pressure would mount if a player began to doubt his own abilities.

"It has been a while (getting a big score) but if you doubt yourself, you put pressure on yourself. It is important to balance how you want to play. Today I wanted to hit the ball but it was also important to hold the shape and extend the arms

"And then if the ball is in the arc, I want to try what I always do. It has not been happening consistently but I am not going to doubt myself," he added.

With one of the stands at the Wankhede Stadium to be built in his



honour, Rohit, who played most of his formative cricket here, said it was a "huge honour" for him.

"Looks pretty far! Huge honour. I used to come here as a kid and watch the game. We were not allowed to come here at some stage. I grew up playing at this ground, now to have that stand, huge honour.

"Don't know how I will

react when it actually comes up. Satisfying part was to finish the game."

Mumbai Indians have jumped to sixth spot on the table with four wins and Rohit said the team was building up the momentum.

"We are peaking at the right time, winning three on the trot. Winning back-to-back is important, we stand in a good

position," he said. MI skipper Hardik Pandya said he was never overly perturbed by Rohit's lack of runs as he knew they would come soon.

"The way Rohit and Suryakumar bat, it is a relief from outside. You don't have to worry about Rohit's form. He's gonna come good like this.

"We knew when he comes good, the opposition will be out. SKY (Surya) complimented him," Hardik said.

"Percentage cricket is high, we are not trying magical stuff and sticking to simple cricket. Knew they (CSK) were behind the game and wanted to keep it tight. The fast bowlers went for runs and we knew 175 was below par," said Pandya.
