Finance **Deptt asks DDCs to** furnish district plans **before April** 30

JAMMU, Apr 22 (Agencies): Finance Department today conveyed ceiling of Capex Budget including District Capex under Budget Estimate (BE) 2025-26 through BEAMS portal in favour of all departments and **District Development**

Commissioners. All the District Development Commissioners have been asked to furnish District Plans in consultation with DDC members and MLAs by or before April 30, 2025. Further, it has been clearly mentioned that the timeline for completion of new works/activities taken up for execution during the financial year 2025-26, should be between one to two years. In rare cases of mega-projects, the department may extend timeline up to three vears.

12 tourists injured in terror attack in Pahalgam

SRINAGAR, Apr 22 (Agencies): At least 12 tourists were injured in a terrorist attack in Pahalgam in Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday, officials

said. The attack took place at Baisaran, a meadow accessible only by foot or ponies, where a group of tourists had gone visiting this morning, they said.

According to an eyewitness, unidentified



gunmen opened fire on shot in the head while the tourists from close seven others were also range, resulting in injuinjured in the attack," ries to several persons. a woman survivor said "My husband was over phone.

The woman did not identify herself but pleaded for help in evacuating the injured to the hospital.



Ramban flash flood: Jammu-Srinagar highway closed for 3rd consecutive day

JAMMU, Apr 22 (Agencies): The strategic Jammu-Srinagar national highway remained closed for the third consecutive day on Tuesday, and officials said it would take five more days to restore the highway.

Engineers of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) said the highway is damaged at 22 locations, and restoration work is in full swing. Landslides triggered

highway as authorities stepped in to provide shelter and food to the stranded passengers. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, braving adverse weather, reached Kali Morh on the highway on Monday to personally supervise

the relief operation and assess the damage. He said the damage was huge, but the disaster happened at a local level and as such, it cannot be declared as a 'national disaster'.

Nitishwar Kumar among 7 **IAS officers** empanelled as AS, AS equivalents

JAMMU, Apr 22 (Agencies): Nitishwar Kumar, former Principal Secretary to the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, is among seven IAS officers who have been empanelled for holding posts of Additional Secretary (AS) or its equivalent at the Centre by the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet.

Wanted criminal dies in scuffle with police while trying to escape custody in Jammu

JAMMU, Apr 22 (Agencies): A wanted criminal died in a scuffle with cops while trying to escape from police custody along with an aide near here, an official said on Tuesday. Four cops escorting wanted criminal Mushtaq Ali alias Raj Ali alias Bacchu Don from Punjab to Jammu were also got injured in the incident, a

police spokesman said.

Sharing details of the incident, he said a police party from Jammu rounded up Ali and his associate, both wanted in a number of criminal cases in Jammu, Kathua and Samba, from the Baba Batala area of Amritsar with the help of Punjab Police on Monday.

While returning to Jammu, the accused insisted on halting the

vehicle to attend a call of nature but when they were brought down from the van, they "suddenly attacked the police personnel, tried to snatch their weapons and escape from their custody", the spokesman said.

"In a bid to escape, Ali fell on the road and got grievously injured. Four police personnel also sustained minor injuries

trying to prevent their escape," the spokesman said, adding that Ali was rushed to the GMC Hospital in Jammu where doctors declared him dead.

Police have requested Jammu district magistrate to form a board of doctors to conduct the autopsy of the deceased, the spokesman said.

Chenab River

JAMMU, Apr 22 (Agencies): Authorities on Tuesday opened the gates of the Salal hydroelectric power project dam to ease the heavy inflow of water into the Chenab river in the wake of continuous rains in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district, officials said.

Locals have been asked to remain vigilant and keep away from the banks of the river.

"Due to the high inflow and increasing trend in the Chenab River, the gates of the Salal Dam have been opened as a precautionary safety measure," a senior National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC) official said.

He said the discharge into the Chenab River is very high, causing the water level downstream of the Salal dam to rise.

"Due to this, it is not advisable for people, vehicles, livestock, and animals to approach the river. Therefore, the general public in the area is informed to take proper precautions and avoid going near the banks of the Chenab river during this period," he said.

The district administration has issued an alert in Reasi as water levels rise in river rise.

An official at the dam control said the water level in the river had Turn to page 9

Thirteen Candidates from J&K qualify UPSC 2025, Many already in **Government service**

SRINAGAR, Apr 22 (Agencies): Thirteen candidates from Jammu and Kashmir have cleared the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) Civil Services Examination 2025, with several of them already in government service, marking a significant showing for the region in this year's results.

Among the top performers is Iram Choudhary from Rajouri, who secured an impressive All India Rank of 40. Her rank places her among the country's top achievers in a year where more than a thousand candidates have been recommended for appointment to India's premier civil services. She had previously qualified with a rank in the 800s, has once again made it to the final list, reinforcing her consistent commit-

ment to public service. Mohammad Muneeb Bhat, currently serving in the Jammu and Kashmir Police Service, secured rank 131. His selection reflects a growing pattern of in-service officers in Jammu and Kashmir leveraging the UPSC route to transition into all-India services.

Other candidates from the region who feature in this year's list include Akshay Parihar with rank 261, Mohammad Haris Mir with rank 314, Manil Bejotra with rank 401, and Akash Gupta, whose rank is reported variously as 431 and 467. The list also includes Ghulam Haider at 633, Sadaf Malik at 742, Yassar Ahmad Bhatti at 768, Nazir Ahmed Bijran at 847, Vishal Deep Chandan at 810, Harjot Singh at 948, Turn to page 9

POJK Displaced Persons demand inclusion in ST II category, urge immediate action

JAMMU, Apr 22: Under a bright spring sky in Jammu district, the Youth Committee of the 1947 Poonch Occupied Jammu & Kashmir (POJK) Displaced Persons—ethnically Pahari and long exiled from their ancestral Poonch homes—held a spirited press conference today to highlight an urgent identity crisis.

Senior members of the community, Sarpanches, Panches, retired professionals, and social activists gathered to press the central government to extend Scheduled Tribe II (ST II) recognition to their people, who have waited over 75 years for full rehabilitation and equal rights.

Addressing a packed hall, the Committee's spokesperson painted a vivid picture of displacement and perseverance. "Our forebears were uprooted at Partition, and though we have built new lives here, our Pahari identity remains unrecognized," they said. "Granting us ST-II status would not only

acknowledge our suffering but unlock access to education, economic opportunity, and governmental protection that have eluded us for decades."

Throughout the conference, speakers laid out detailed documentation of the POJK DPs' demographic and cultural profiles, drawing parallels to other Pahadi communities already granted ST status. They argued these shared markers—language. customs, and historic marginalization-provide solid constitutional grounds for their inclusion, just as they have for peer groups in Himachal Pradesh and Utta-

the land," said a former Panch, voice resolute. "Our community deserves the same legal safeguards and development schemes that ST designation affords elsewhere."

The flash floods triggered by cloudburst in the early hours of Sunday caused much damage to Ramsoo-Banihal – Ramban stretch of the highway forcing the authorities to close the traffic on the highway. It resulted in the passengers being stranded and hundreds of the people have been rescued and taken to safe destinations. Many people are feared missing and the police is on the job to find them. The flush floods have wreck havoc in Ramban and left a trail of destruction across Ramban district .Several residential houses have been destroyed and a large number of taxis ,buses and loaded trucks were buried under the debris carried by flash floods. The 270Km vital Jammu-Srinagar highway has been washed away at several places in Ramban-Ramsoo –Banihal has been buried under landslides, leaving hundreds of vehicles and their passengers stranded at different

Nature's Fury in J&K's Ramban places .A cloudburst struck Seri Bagna village in Ramban district ,killing three people. More than 40 houses have been destroyed in the Dharam Kund village of Ramban due to flash floods. Several vehicles were washed away in the floods. Electricity supply was badly damaged and Ramban plunged into darkness ,however efforts are on to resume the electricity. Many people were marooned and the district administration and the security forces have lifted marooned people from flood water. The road and electricity supply has been severally damaged putting people to lot of trouble. There was hailstorm, multiple landslides and fast winds throughout the night in the Ramban region including the areas surrounding the Ramban town was the observation of MOS,PMO ,Dr Jitendra Singh who happens to the MP from this Udhampur-Doda constituency. Meanwhile chief minister Omar and LG Manoj Sinha have grieved over the deaths of the innocent lives and have asked the district administration to provide all possible help, relief and rehabilitation to the affected people of Ramban and its surrounding villages. The incessant rain also triggered landslides and mudslides at nearly dozen places between Nashri and Banihal along the strategic Jammu-Srinagar National Highway prompting traffic authorities to suspend traffic. More than 100 trapped villagers were rescued by the police personnel who rushed to the spot despite downpour and cloudbursts. Several vehicles were washed away in the floods caused by stream overflowing. There has been massive damage in the entire district due to heavy rain, cloudbursts, highvelocity winds, landslides and hailstorm. A stretch of the national highway near Panthiyal was also

swept away. Over two hundred houses were damaged some partially and some totally. Heavy rains have wrecked havoc in Ramban district and at some places in Reasi district. Many villages were displaced and their houses stand partially and several totally damaged and there is much loss to the government and private property. The landslide also hit the Sham Palace area of Ramban following heavy downpour. Several people and vehicles were feared trapped under the debris of damaged structures. Some people also took shelter at the rooftops of their houses amid the flood like situation. Jammu and Kashmir LG Manoj Shina has expressed anguish and grief on the loss of lives in flash floods in Ramban ,which were triggered by incessant rains in the hilly district which lies on the Srinagar-Jammu National Highway. Man is helpless on the nature's fury and he has no control over it. All that is required is that man should stop damaging ecological and environmental balance and in the alternative be ready to face the wrath of nature. Almighty is benevolent ,merciful and Kind but brings havoc when selfish and cunning human beings play with nature and destroy it and in turn are destroyed by the nature which becomes cruel because of the wanton destruction of the woods, jungles, rivers and riveluts. Punjab man calls Mumbai cops, informs them about 'death threat' to actor Tiger Shroff; held

A 35-year-old man hailing from Punjab has been apprehended for allegedly giving false information to the police control room in Mumbai regarding 'death threat' to Bollywood actor Tiger Shroff, an official said on Tuesday. However, after the police investigated the



matter, it was revealed Singh had given false information to the control room, according to the official.

The Mumbai police lodged a case against him in suburban Khar and contacted their Punjab counterparts, who detained Singh, he said.

The accused is being brought to Mumbai, informed the official.

In the past, Bollywood superstar Salman Khan has been the target of multiple death threats. Last week, a 'mentally unstable' man from a village in Gujarat's Vadodara district had issued a death threat to the 59-year-old actor, a Y-Plus-protectee.

Every word spoken by constitutional functionary guided by national interest: Dhankhar

NEW DELHI, Apr 22 (Agencies): Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Tuesday asserted that every word spoken by a constitutional authority is guided by supreme national interest, as he hit out at his critics for questioning his remarks on a recent Supreme Court order.

Dhankhar also said that efforts of forces working against the country to tarnish and run down institutions should be neutralised, "be it that of the presidency".

Asserting that Parliament is supreme, Dhankhar said, "There is no visualisation in the Constitution of any authority above Parliament. Parliament is supreme... Let me tell you, it is as supreme as every individual in the country."

A top court bench recently prescribed a three-month timeline for the president of India to decide on Bills reserved by governors for her nod.

Reacting to the directive, Dhankhar had said that the judiciary cannot play the role of a "super Parliament" and get into the domain of the executive.

Addressing a Delhi University event, he said every word spoken by a constitutional functionary is guided by the supreme sublime interest of the nation.

"I find it conceivably intriguing that some have recently reflected that constitutional



offices can be ceremonial or ornamental. Nothing can be far distanced from a wrong understanding of the role of everyone in this country — constitutional functionary or a citizen," he said.

Stating that everyone of them has a role, he said, "The soul of democracy resides and pulsates in every citizen. Democracy will blossom. Its values will get heightened. When citizen is alert, citizen contributes and what a citizen contributes, there is no substitute for that."

Dhankhar also said that there is no visualisation in the Constitution of any authority above Parliament.

"Part of 'We the People' is an atom in democracy and that atom has atomic power. That atomic power is reflected during elections and that is why we are a democratic nation," Dhankhar, who is also the Rajya Sabha chairperson, underlined.

Voicing concern over the recent Supreme Court ruling prescribing a timeline for the president to decide on Bills, Dhankhar on Friday said India had not bargained for a democracy where judges will legislate and perform executive functions and act as a "super Parliament". Earlier this month, the Supreme Court had, for the first time, prescribed that the President should decide on the Bills reserved for her consideration by governors within three months from the date such reference is received.

"There is a directive to the president by a recent judgement... We never bargained for democracy for this day. President being called upon to decide in a time-bound manner, and if not, becomes law," Dhankhar said.

The vice-president was criticised for questioning the judiciary, with critics terming his

remarks "unconstitutional". In an apparent response to Dhankhar's "super Parliamet" remark, a top court bench on Monday said that "as it is, we are alleged of encroaching upon the parliamentary and executive functions".

Justice B R Gavai, who was heading a bench also comprising Justice Augustine George Masih, made a similar observation in another matter.

While one matter was over the recent violence in West Bengal during anti-Waqf law protests, the other plea sought a direction to the Centre to take appropriate steps to prohibit streaming of sexually explicit and pornographic content on OTT and social media platforms.

While hearing the plea on online content, Justice Gavai said. "Who can control it? It is for the Union (government) to frame a regulation in that regard."

Gavai is set to be the next chief justice of India.

In a related development, Rajya Sabha MP Kapil Sibal on Tuesday said everything the apex court said was consistent with the country's constitutional values and guided by national interest.

Sibal's remarks in a post on X came soon after Dhankhar asserted that every word spoken by a constitutional functionary was guided by supreme national interest.

NEW DELHI, Apr 22 (Agencies): The verdict granting "deemed assent" to 10 Tamil Nadu bills didn't cover the issues raised by Kerala Government against the state Governor allegedly sitting over bills passed by the state Assembly, the Centre asserted before the Supreme Court on Tuesday.

"The Tamil Nadu judgment does not cover certain issues of this (Kerala) case on facts. We would like to show those differences," Attorney General R Venkataramani told a Bench of Justice PS Narasimha and Justice Joymalya Bagchi.

There were certain "factual differences" between the two cases, Venkataramani submitted.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Kerala Governor's office, supported the Attorney General. "I am examining the judgment," Mehta said, seeking time to revert. The submissions of the two top law officers came after senior counsel KK Venugopal submitted on behalf of the Kerala Government that the judgement delivered by a Bench headed by Justice JB Pardiwala in the Tamil Nadu case has framed guidelines and set timelines for gover-

tice JB Pardiwala had declared that the 10 bills would be deemed to have received the Governor's assent when they were presented to him for the second time after having been passed by the state leg-

The Bench - which also included Justice R Mahadevan - had set a three-month deadline for the President to decide on Bills reserved by Governors for her assent.

It had also said that the President should obtain the advisory opinion of the top court on Bills referred to her "by way of a reference under Article 143 and act in accordance with the same to dispel any apprehensions of bias. arbitrariness or mala fides.

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has openly criticised the top court's verdict on Tamil Nadu Bills and the Centre was likely to seek a review of the judgment.

Ruling that Governors don't have discretion while exercising powers under Article 200 of the Constitution in dealing with bills passed by state Assemblies presented to them, the Supreme Court had said that they must abide by the advice of the Council of Ministers.

"Once the Bill is passed by the state legislature and presented to the Governor for assent, he must act on the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers as a general rule and only in exceptional situations... should he reserve it for the consideration of the President," Justice Pardiwala had said while deciding on Tamil Nadu Government's petition against the Governor for sitting over Bills.



KOLKATA, Apr 22 (Agencies): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday asserted that "outsiders" were responsible for the violence that erupted in parts of Murshidabad over the Wagf Act, and said she would visit the troubled areas in the first week of May to evaluate the situation.

Ms Banerjee also said her government would "soon expose the conspirators" behind the riots that took place in

two wards of Dhulian in the district.

"The violence was unfortunate. We do not want riots. Some outsiders orchestrated it, but we will expose them and their conspiracy," she said at an administrative programme in Midnapore.

"I have promised the families of those killed in the violence to give a compensation of Rs 10 lakh each. We will also rebuild their houses under the 'Banglar Bari'

scheme... I will be going there in the first week of May and evaluate the situation," Ms Banerjee said.

8 killed, 6 injured as SUV falls off bridge onto riverbed in MP's Damoh district

DAMOH, Apr 22 (Agencies): Eight persons were killed and six others sustained injuries after an SUV fell off a bridge onto a dry river bed in Madhya Pradesh's Damoh district on Tuesday, police said.

The accident occurred near Simri village under the Nohata police station area around 11 am, an official said. Superintendent of Police (SP) Shrut Kirti Somwanshi said the SUV driver

lost control over the wheels, and the vehicle fell off the bridge onto the dry riverbed of the Sunar river.

He said eight of the occupants died, and six others sustained injuries.

The official said the victims were part of a group of residents from Jabalpur district who were travelling in two SUVs



from Ghat Pipariya village in Damoh, and one of the vehicles met with an accident

He said the injured persons were sent to the district hospital for treatment.



LUCKNOW, Apr 22 (Agencies): Bahujan Samaj Party chief Mayawati on Tuesday expressed concern over the alleged incidents of atrocities against Dalits and desecration of statues of their icons. warning that if strict action is not taken against the offenders, the affected communities will never forgive the authorities. In a post on X, the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) supremo said, "During the birth anniversary celebrations of Bharat Ratna and Constitution-maker



Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar, incidents of desecration of his statues and attacks by feudal elements on rallies and programmes in several states were extremely shameful. These events exposed

the double standards of the governments."

Referring specifically to the violence in Madhya Pradesh's Morena district, Mayawati termed the killing of a Dalit youth reportedly during an Ambedkar

Javanti procession and the injuries sustained by several others "highly condemnable".

Alleging that the lack of strict action against the culprits raises questions about the role of the state government, Mayawati said, "The government's complicity in the matter cannot be ruled out." She also urged both the Centre and all state governments to take these incidents with utmost seriousness.

"If strict measures are not taken to stop the atrocities against Dalits and to prevent the disrespect of their great saints, gurus and icons, these communities will never forgive the authorities." she warned.

"These caste-based incidents make it clear that the programmes organised by the central and state governments on occasions like Ambedkar Jayanti are nothing but a deceptive move to woo Dalit voters," she alleged. She also appealed to

Dalits to stay alert and not fall for the "doublefaced character and tactics" of such political parties.

Trainer aircraft crashes in Gujarat's Amreli district, pilot killed

AMRELI, Apr 22 (Agencies): A trainee pilot was killed when a trainer aircraft belonging to a private aviation academy crashed in a residential area in Gujarat's Amreli district on Tuesday afternoon and caught fire, a police official said.

The plane fell on a tree before crashing into an open plot.

The aircraft crash-landed

into a residential area in the Giriya Road area of Amreli town at around 12:30 pm due to unknown reasons, killing the trainee pilot on the spot, said Amreli Superintendent of Police, Sanjay Kharat.

The pilot was flying solo. The aircraft had taken off from the Amreli airport, he added.

After it crashed near Shastri Nagar area, the plane

caught fire and engulfed in flames, said Kharat.

"After taking off from the Amreli airport with a male trainee pilot, the trainer aircraft of an aviation academy, which operates from the airport, crashed into a residential area.

The trainee pilot, who was flying solo, died in the crash while the aircraft was gutted in flames. No one else was injured in the accident," said Kharat.

He said a Delhi-based aviation academy provides pilot training from the Amreli airport.

The SP said local police have started the process to lodge a case of accidental death and investigation to find out the exact cause of the crash.

Four teams of local fire

brigade rushed to Shastrinagar upon learning about the plane crash and resultant fire in the aircraft, said fire officer SC Gadhvi.

"Though the plane crashed into a residential area, no one else was injured because it first fell on a tree and then crashed into an open plot. The fire was eventually brought under control by our teams," he said.

Australia Election: Early voting begins as Albanese takes lead over Dutton

Early voting has begun in Australia's federal election, with PM Albanese's Labor holding a slim lead over Peter Dutton's conservatives, as Dutton faces criticism over Trump-style policies.

CANBERRA, Apr 22 (Agencies): Early voting in the Australian election began on Tuesday, with Prime Minister Anthony Albanese's centre-left Labor party holding a slim lead over the conservative opposition coalition.

A steady increase in early and postal voting means as many as half of eligible Australians will cast their ballots before the May 3 election date, according to data from the country's election commission

The beginning of voting coincides with a slump in popularity of the opposition Liberal Party leader Peter Dutton, who has struggled to shake off perceived ideological closeness to U.S. President Donald Trump.

Dutton was forced to abandon a policy that would have required federal government



workers to return to the office full time while cutting tens of thousands of public sector jobs, seen as taking inspiration from Trump and his Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), set up by Elon Musk. Albanese has surged in the polls from a deficit of six points against Dutton's conservative coalition as recently as January to a lead of as much as nine points earlier this month.

Polling from Newspoll released on Sunday showed Labor held a four-point lead over the opposition when votes from smaller parties are redistributed as

part of the country's preferential voting system where voters rank their choices.

"There's no complacency from my camp, I assure you of that," Albanese told a press confer-

ence. "This election is certainly up for grabs."

He pointed to the 2019 federal election, when some betting firms paid out early on a Labor victory, in an election that was ultimately won by Liberal leader Scott Morrison.

Campaigning in the election, where voting is compulsory for Australians over 18, is expected to be subdued on Tuesday following the death of Pope Francis.

Dutton and Albanese are due to meet in a third and final televised election debate on Tuesday evening.

GAZA, Apr 22 (Agencies): Gaza's civil defence agency said Tuesday that seven people were killed in fresh Israeli air strikes across the Hamas-run territory.

"The occupation launched violent air strikes on Gaza City and the towns of Beit Lahia. Beit Hanoun. and Khan Yunis, killing seven civilians," civil which did not immediately comment, has intensified its aerial bombardments and expanded its ground operations in the Gaza Strip since it resumed its offensive in the besieged Palestinian territory on March 18.

Gaza's civil defence agency on Monday accused the Israeli military of carrying out "summary executions" in the killing of 15 rescue workers last month, rejecting the findings of an internal probe by the army.

At least 1,691 people have been killed in Gaza since the military resumed its offensive. bringing the total death toll since the war erupted to at least 51,065, according to the health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza.

GENEVA, Apr 22 (Agencies): The case of Baloch human rights activist Dr Mahrang Baloch has been officially accepted for review by the United Nations Working Group on Arbitrary Detention, as reported by agency.

The case was submitted by Kurtulus Bastimar, an international legal advisor representing Dr Baloch. He confirmed the development in a statement on social media. "I am glad to inform you that the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention is going to start examining the individual application that I submitted on behalf of my client Mah-



rang Baloch," he said in a post on X, as reported by agency

Bastimar mentioned that he would head to Geneva to communicate directly with UN agencies concerning the case.

South Korea and China over

South Korea mulls "necessary facility" in Yellow Sea after China erects steel structure in disputed waters

SEOUL, Apr 22 (Agencies): South Korea is contemplating the establishment of a "necessary facility" in its overlapping territorial waters with China in the Yellow Sea as a response to Beijing's deployment of a steel structure in the region, as reported by agency.

Reports from South Korean media indicate that the structure, measuring 50 meters (164 feet) in both height and diameter, is the latest of three Chinese installations in the area. Beijing has asserted that all of the structures are intended for aquaculture.

"From the standpoint of safeguarding our maritime territory, we take this matter very seriously in terms of a proportional response," stated South Korea's oceans minister Kang Do-hyung, adding that the government must first determine "what type of facility is necessary at which level," as quoted by agency.



"We are lodging a strong protest with China through diplomatic means. We regard this issue with the highest seriousness, considering its significance and our commitment to protecting our maritime territory," Kang remarked, as cited by agency.

The pictures were taken in the chapel of the Casa Santa Marta, Pope Francis's residence at

the Vatican. The Holy See Press Office announced today that Pope Francis' funeral Mass will take place on Saturday, April 26 at 10:00 AM in St. Peter's Square, the open ground in front of St Peter's Basilica. Cardinals had met this morning to decide on the date of the funeral. The dean of the College of Cardinals, Giovanni Battista Re, will lead the funeral service. At the end of the funeral, Cardinal Re will deliver the final commendation -- a concluding prayer in which the Pope will be formally entrusted to God--and the body will be moved to St. Mary Major for burial

On Wednesday, the coffin containing the Pope's body will be carried from the chapel of the Casa Santa Marta to St. Peter's Basilica for the faithful to pay their

Active sports champions like freestyle skiing ace Eileen Gu and football World Cup winner Paulo Dybala rubbed shoulders with sports legends like Nadia Comaneci and Chris Hoy, while alpine skiing star Lindsey Vonn returned as the ceremony host for the second time in four years. The night began with

last year's World Sportsman of the Year, Novak Djokovic, presenting the award to three-time nominee in the same category, Swedish pole vaulter Armand 'Mondo' Duplantis. The athletics star became the first back-to-back men's pole vault champion at the Olympic Games in more than half a century when he defended his Tokyo 2020 title at Paris 2024, while also break-

Jiang Yuyan of the People's Republic of China, also known as the 'Flying Fish', was named the Sportsperson of the Year with a Disability. Kelly Slater, widely considered the greatest surfer of all time. received the Laureus Lifetime Achievement award, joining the ranks of sports greats such as Pele, Billie Jean King,

The USA surfer was first nominated for a Laureus award in 2006 as the Action Sportsperson of the Year and won in this category in 2007, 2009, 2011, and 2012. "You have a commit-
