As per initial reports, the deceased have been identified Bantu Dogra, a resident of Himachal Pradesh, and Shubam Shrivastav, hailing from Uttar Pradesh. KINS reported that Police and emergency teams rushed to the spot and shifted the bodies for medico-legal formalities. A case has been registered, and an investigation is underway to ascertain the cause of the accident. Authorities have once again urged commuters to exercise caution while driving, especially during night hours on the highway.

Three dead, property damaged, NH blocked in cloudburst, Landslide hit Ramban

JAMMU, Apr 20 (Agencies): Three people have died in the cloudburst, while loss of property for some families due to hailstorm and flash floods, and the Jammu-Srinagar national highway is shut after a landslide triggered due to heavy rains in Ramban district of Jammu and Kashmir.

Officials here on Sunday said that the National Highway was blocked for vehicular traffic at Panthyal, Seri, and other areas of Ramban district, following heavy rainfall that triggered landslides, flash floods at several places in Ramban Dis-

trict. "Moreover, three persons are killed as a cloud burst wreaks havoc in the remote Dharamkund area of the district," they



said. "Because of constant landslides amid heavy rains, a complete rescue operation cannot be launched by the Quick Response Teams (QRT) and Police," they said. "Entire districts have

been affected due to the flash flood, and there are

Easter is a Christian festival celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ and it refers to the Easter holiday, a major celebration in Christianity that commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ .It is a time of joy and spiritual renewal for many Christians ,marking the end of Lent and triumph of life over death. While not directly an "offer" in the sense of commercial promotion, the term likely refers to the various activities and traditions that are associated with Easter celebrations ,such as church services, family gatherings ,and exchange of gifts. Easter is a central event in the Christian faith ,marking the resurrection of Jesus three days after his crucifixion. The week leading up to Easter is often referred to as Holy Week ,which includes Palm Sunday, Maundy, Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Easter celebrations vary across different Christian denominations and cultures ,but often include special Church services

,family gatherings, and the exchange of gifts such as Easter eggs. Easter is a movable feast ,meaning its date changes each year based on the lunisolar calendar .It is always the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox. Easter also called Pascha or Resurrection Sunday is a Christian festival and cultural holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial following his crucifixion by the Romans of Calvary c 30 AD. It is the culmination of the Passion of Jesus, preceded by Lent or Great Lent ,a 40-day period of fasting ,prayer , and penance. Easter –observing Christians commonly refer to the week before Easter as Holy Week ,which in Western Christianity begins on Palm Sunday [marking the entrance of Jesus in Jerusalem]includes Spy Wednesday [on which the betrayal of Jesus is mourned]and contains the days of the Easter Triduum including Maundy Thursday ,commemorating the Maundy and Last Supper, as well as Good Friday, commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus .In Eastern Christianity ,the same events are commemorated with the names of days all starting with "Holy" or "Holy and Great" ,and Easter itself might be called Great and Holy Pascha. In both Western and Eastern Christianity ,Eastertide ,the Easter or Paschal season ,begins on Easter Sunday and lasts seven weeks, ending with the coming of the 50th day ,Pentecost Sunday ,but in Eastern Christianity the leavetaking of the feast is on the 39th day ,the day before the Feast of the Ascension. Easter and its related holidays are movable feasts ,not falling on a fixed date, its date is computed based on a lunisolar calendar [solar year plus Moon phase]similar to the Hebrew calendar ,gen-

erating a number of controversies. The first Council of Nicaea [325]established on the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the vernal equinox . Even if calculated on the basis of the Gregorian calendar ,the date of that full moon sometimes differ from that of the astronomical first full moon after the March equinox. The English term may derive from the Anglo-Saxon goddess name Eostre, Easter is linked to the Jewish Passover by its name [Hebrew], Aramic are the basis of the term Pascha]by its origin [according to the synoptic Gospels, both the crucifixion and the resurrection took place during the [week of Passover] and much of its symbolism, as well as by its position in the calendar .In most European languages ,both the Christian Easter and the Jewish Passover are called by the same name ,and in the older English translations of the Bible ,as well ,the term Easter was used to translate Passover. Easter traditions vary across the Christian world ,and include sunrise services or latenight vigils ,exclamations and exchanges of Paschal greetings, following the cross ,the wearing of Easter bonnets by women, clipping the Church ,and the decoration .As Christians around the world celebrate Easter each year, they not only honor the resurrection of Christ but also embrace the hope and renewal it brings to their lives and communities. In brief Easter gives us the message of hope, positivity, compassion, for giveness and above all the eternal values of righteousness.

IAF's Surya Kiran pilots paint Ranchi sky with tri-colour

RANCHI, Apr 20 (Agencies): The Indian Air Force's Surva Kiran Aerobatic Team (SKAT) painted the skies above the Namkum Army Ground in Ranchi with vibrant streaks of saffron, white and green, leaving thousands of spectators spellbound on the final day of an air show on Sunday.

Minister of State for Defence Sanjay Seth, senior defence and administrative officials were present at the event.

The two-day air show began on Saturday in Ranchi, aimed at instilling passion among children and youths to fly high. A large number of people, school students and tourists gathered at the army ground since early morning on Sunday to experience the air show. In the composite phase, all

Damage control: Congress slams BJP after it distances itself from MPs' criticism of SC

NEW DELHI, Apr 20 (Agencies): The Congress on Sunday described the BJP disassociating itself from the criticism of the Supreme Court by its MPs Nishikant Dubey and Dinesh Sharma as "damage control" and asked why no action had been taken against the two.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said the distancing of the "outgoing BJP president" from the "atrocious remarks" made by two MPs on the Chief Justice of India (CJI) carried little meaning

"These MPs are repeat offenders when it comes to hate speech and are very often used by G2 to attack communities, institutions, and individuals. The outgoing BJP president's clarification is nothing but damage control," Ramesh said in a post on X. "It will fool nobody. This

is Entire Political Science reflecting itself as Entire Political Hypocrisy," he said. But the "outgoing BJP president" is totally silent

on equally unacceptable remarks on the judiciary that are continually made by one of its very distinguished appointees to a high constitutional position, Ramesh said and asked what he had to say about those

remarks and if the BJP subscribed to them. The former Union minister further asked, "If the continued silence of the prime minister on these repeated attacks on the Indian Constitution is

not tacitly supportive of

them, why has no action been taken against these two MPs? Has Nadda ji issued show cause notices to these two MPs?" The BJP on Saturday disassociated itself from Dubey and Sharma's criticism of the Supreme Court,

with party president JP Nadda calling the comments their personal views. He also affirmed the

ruling party's respect for the judiciary as an inseparable part of democracy.

"The BJP has nothing to do with the comments of MPs Nishikant Dubey and Dinesh Sharma on the judiciary and the chief justice. This is their personal comments but the BJP neither agrees with them nor does it ever support such remarks. The BJP



absolutely rejects them," Nadda said in a post on Х.

He said he had directed both the leaders and other members of the party not to make such comments.

Earlier on Saturday, Dubey — one of the more vocal BJP members in the Lok Sabha — launched a broadside against the Supreme Court, saying Parliament and state assemblies should be shut if the apex court had to make the laws.

He also took a swipe at CJI Sanjiv Khanna. Dubey had also alleged that CJI Khanna

was responsible for "civil wars" in the country. Sharma, a former deputy chief minister of Uttar Pradesh, was also critical of the Supreme Court, saying no one could direct Parliament or the president.

SP can never be 'true well-wisher' of Dalits due

LUCKNOW, Apr 20 (Agencies): BSP supremo Mayawati on Sunday launched a scathing attack on her rivals, particularly the Samajwadi Party, and said like the Congress and the BJP, it could never become a "true well-wisher" of Dalits-Bahujans due to flaws in its intentions and policies.

Mayawati's criticism came amid Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav's continued support for the party's Dalit MP Ramji Lal Suman over a controversy surrounding his remark on Rana Sanga.

In a series of posts in Hindi on X, the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP)

supremo said the Samajwadi Party, like the Congress and the BJP, instead of working for the uplift of Bahujans, especially Dalits, by giving them their constitutional rights, had no willpower to end their poverty, caste-based exploitation and injustice-atrocities.

Recalling the 1995 Lucknow guest house incident, she said, "The Samajwadi Party's betrayal of the BSP, murderous attack on its leadership on June 2 (1995), tearing the bill for reservation in promotions in Parliament, renaming new districts, parks, educational and medical colleges cre-



ated in honour of their saints, gurus and great men are such extreme casteist acts that are impossible to forgive." The former Uttar Pradesh chief minister

claimed that the BSP had been successful to a great extent in its mission of ending the caste system and creating an egalitarian society.

"The Samajwadi Party

is trying to spoil it in every way to fulfil its narrow political interests," she said and urged people to be cautious.

The BSP, on the other hand, is dedicated and struggling to make the Bahujan Samaj the "ruling class", she added.

Acid attack: 'Alcoholic' man targets wife, daughters in UP village

SHAHJAHANPUR (UP), Apr 20 (Agencies): Suspecting that his wife was involved in an illicit relationship, a man allegedly attacked her and his two daughters with acid at Tikri village here, officials said today.

The incident on Friday night left the three — identified as 39-year-old Ramguni, 16-year-old Neha and 23-year-old Rachita — seriously injured.

Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP), Nagar, Devendra Kumar, said on Sunday that the victim resided in a rented house in Tikri village with her two daughters and a son, while her husband Ram Gopal lived in Shahabad Hardoi.

"On Friday night, Ramguni and her daughters were asleep when her husband allegedly jumped over the wall, entered the house and threw acid on them," the officer said.

At the time of the incident, Ramguni's son Ashu was staying with a friend. He subsequently filed a report against his father.

The injured have been admitted to the Government Medical College. Ashu told police that his father was an alcoholic and had sold his farmland in Shahabad area due to his addiction. Following this, Ramguni moved to Tikri village with her children. However, her husband suspected her fidelity and would frequently visit her.

Prime accused in Murshidabad double murder case held in Uttar Dinajpur's Chopra

KOLKATA, Apr 20 (Agencies): One of the prime accused in the murder of a man and his son in violence-hit Murshidabad district in West Bengal was arrested. police said on Sunday.

This was the fourth arrest in the killing of the two at Jafrabad in Shamsherganj, a senior officer said.

The arrested person, identified as Ziaul Sheikh, a resident of Sulitala Purbapara, the neighbouring village of Jafrabad, has been on the run since the crime took place on April 12. Sheikh was arrested by the Special Task Force (STF) of the West Bengal Police along with the Special Investigating Team (SIT) from his hideout in Chopra in Uttar Dinajpur district on Saturday, he said.

"This person is one of the prime accused who

had conspired and instigated a mob to carry out vandalism at the residence of the deceased and killed Haragobindo Das and his son Chandan Das on April 12," the officer told agency.

Trump administration urges Supreme Court to allow deportations under alternative laws

Following the Supreme Court's order, the US Justice Department argued that the justices should deny the request to halt deportations under the controversial wartime authority provided by the Alien Enemies Act.

WASHINGTON DC, Apr 20 (Agencies): After the US Supreme Court temporarily barred the deportation of migrants, President Donald Trump's administration has urged the apex court to allow the use of alternative laws to remove a group of Venezuelan migrants detained in Texas, agency reported.

Following the Supreme Court's order, the US Justice Department argued that the justices should deny the request to halt deportations under the controversial wartime authority provided by the Alien Enemies Act.

The Justice Department further urged the Supreme Court to provide clarity that it may remove at least some of the same migrants under less controversial immigration laws. The Supreme Court's order did

not distinguish between depor-



tations under the Alien Enemies Act and other laws, agency reported.

The court said, "The government is directed not to remove any member of the putative class of detainees from the United States until further order of this court."

Earlier, the White House said in a statement that "President Trump promised the American people to use all lawful measures to remove the threat of terrorist illegal aliens, like members of (Venezuelan gang Tren de Aragua), from the United States.'

"We are confident in the lawfulness of the Administration's actions and in ultimately prevailing against an onslaught of meritless litigation brought by radical activists who care more about the rights of terrorist aliens than those of the American people," said press secretary Karoline Leavitt, as reported by agency. Previously, a Federal Judge in Washington DC told lawyers for migrants in Texas who believed the Trump administration was about to swiftly deport them under the Alien Enemies Act that he did not have the power to pause the deportations, even though he was concerned about the administration's actions, agency reported.

The dispute between SC and the administration reflects Donald Trump's aggressive stance on deportations.

"No choice but to keep fighting...": Netanyahu vows to continue military operations in Gaza



TEL AVIV, Apr 20 (Agencies): Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has pledged to continue military operations in Gaza and emphasised that Israel must keep fighting to ensure its survival, despite increasing opposition, according to a report by agency.

In a pre-recorded video, Netanyahu said Israel has "no choice" but to keep fighting "for our very own existence until victory."

Netanyahu urged "perseverance and resilience" in defeating Hamas and rescuing the 59 hostages still held in Gaza. Netanyahu cited Hamas' refusal of a recent Israeli ceasefire proposal as a reason Israel will continue its bombardment of Gaza. Israel's proposal called for the disarmament of Gaza and did not include a permanent end to the war, both of which have been red lines for Hamas, agency reported.

"If we surrender to Hamas's demands now, all the tremendous achievements gained by our soldiers, our fallen, and our wounded heroes--those achievements will simply be lost," Israeli PM said.

Meanwhile, the Hostage Families Forum Headquarters criticised Netanyahu's latest address, accusing him of lacking a clear "plan" for securing the release of hostages. "Many words and slogans will not succeed in hiding the simple truth -- Netanyahu has no plan. It's no surprise there was no time for questions -- otherwise, he would have had to answer the most basic one: What exactly is the State of Israel doing to immediately bring back all 59 hostages," the forum said.

Earlier, Israeli soldiers had signed a letter calling for an end to the war in Gaza and speeding up negotiations for the return of native captives from the war-torn territory. Earlier this week, Al Jazeera cited Israeli Army Radio as stating that a group of 150 Golani Brigade members have joined the call to end the war, adding their names to thousands of others in a sign of dissent that has alarmed the Israeli government. Several petitions have been circulating within the Israeli military since last week. The first was signed by 1,000 Israeli Air Force reserves and was followed by others circulated among veterans and officers serving within the armoured corps, navy and other military units.

Hong Kong's oldest pro-democracy party to shut down amid intensifying crackdown by China

HONG KONG,, Apr 20 (Agencies): Hong Kong's oldest and most prominent pro-democracy party is preparing to shut down amid an intensifying crackdown by China.

The Democratic Party, which has been a key part of the city's opposition movement for over 30 years, has begun the process of disbanding after receiving strong warnings from Chinese authorities, according to two longtime members who spoke with agency.

Yeung Sum, a former chairman of the party, said the message from Beijing was clear: disband or face consequences. "The message was that the party has to be disbanded or there will be consequences,"





Zelenskyy condemns Russia for violating Easter ceasefire with 387 shellings

KYIV, Apr 20 (Agencies): Following President Vladimir Putin's announcement of a 30-hour ceasefire in observance of Easter, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy claimed that Russian forces carried out attacks, citing a total of 387 shelling incidents and 19 assaults.

Zelenskyy further said that despite Russia's declared truce, Ukrainian frontline units recorded 59 cases of shelling and 5 assaults, along with multiple combat engagements across the Donetsk, Starobilsk, and Zaporizhzhia sectors.

In a post on X on Sunday (local time), Zelenskyy wrote, "A report by Commander-

NEW DELHI, Apr 20 (Agencies): Ford Motor Co. has suspended exports of its SUVs, pickup trucks, and sports cars to China due to retaliatory tariffs imposed amid ongoing trade tensions under former President Donald Trump, agency reported.

This week, the automaker halted shipments of its F-150 Raptors, Mustangs, Michiganbuilt Bronco SUVs, and Kentucky-made Lincoln Navigators to the Chinese market, according to reports.

"We have adjusted exports from the U.S. to million in operating profit from its China operations last year, Ford Vice Chairman John Lawler said at a recent conference.

Ford's exports of USbuilt engines and transmissions to China are expected to continue despite the pause on exports of assembled vehicles.

Its Lincoln Nautilus model, which is manufactured in China, is also expected to have continued shipments, despite heavy tariffs.

In 2024, Ford shipped about 5,500 Broncos, F-150s, Mustangs, and Navigators to Chinaa sharp decline from the annual average of over 20,000 vehicles shipped over the past decade. While the company has halted exports of assembled vehicles, shipments of US-built engines and transmissions to China have continued, according to sources familiar with Ford's operations.

Eating almonds daily can help control blood sugar in Asian Indians: Study

NEW DELHI, Apr 20 (Agencies): Consuming almonds daily can help control blood sugar levels in specific populations, such as Asian Indians, according to a research article

Analysing previously published research on almonds and cardiometabolic health, an international team of researchers and physicians said almonds can help improve metabolic health by reducing 'bad' cholesterol and increasing beneficial gut bacteria.

Findings, published as a consensus article in the journal Current Developments in Nutrition, reinforce almonds' role as a hearthealthy, weight-supporting, and

"The most current meta-analyses on almond consumption and various health-related endpoints suggest that almond consumption does not result in weight gain and results in small reductions in LDL cholesterol and diastolic blood pressure, as well as improved glycemic responses in certain populations (i.e. Asian Indians)," the study said.

Dr Misra said, "These benefits aid weight loss efforts by helping stabilise energy levels and reduce appetite fluctuations. When paired with balanced nutrition and physical activity, almonds can be a health-promoting part of a weight loss plan."

increasing the production of shortchain fatty acids.

"These changes support better metabolic health and can contribute to reductions in excess body fat," the author said.

Rich in proteins, fibre and hearthealthy unsaturated fats, almonds can play a crucial role in one's balanced diet, by bringing together essential nutrients, such as magnesium, potassium, and vitamin E.

"While almonds can be easily included in snacks and salads, the best time to consume them — with breakfast, afternoon snack, postworkout or on-the-go — depends on one's routine and goals," Dr Misra said in response to PTI's question about how to get the most out of almonds. He added that almonds or oatmeal in breakfast can boost protein and fibre intake, providing steady energy through the day. However, consuming them mid-morning or in the afternoon can be a healthy alternative to unhealthy snacks. Post-workout, the proteins in almonds have shown to help with muscle recovery. "When on-the-go, simply keep almonds in your bag or car for a convenient, nutritious snack to help you feel energised when you're shuttling around or running errands," Dr Misra said.

Preventing vision loss in children

NEW DELHI, Apr 20 (Agencies): The fact that a newborn can only see a blur up to 8 to 12 inches from its face is not commonly known. The newborns must be exposed to their surroundings to develop normal eyesight. The most crucial period for this exposure, first observed in newborn kittens, is within the first 3 months after the eyes open. The neural cell network in the brain's visual cortex is relatively flimsy and highly plastic

Of the 2.5 crore children born every year in India, 20,000-40,000 are born with cloudy crystalline lenses (cataracts) that impair light entering into their eyes. Congenital (present at birth or within the first year of life) and developmental cataracts are among the most common causes of childhood blindness.

A few years ago, Chandigarh-based expert Dr IS Jain and another group of experts from Madurai could not find any apparent at birth, and it needs to cause of cataracts in half of the affected children. Interestingly, both found hereditary factors in nearly one-fourth of the cases. Dr Jagat Ram and Dr Jaspreet Sukhija, both from the PGI, believe that consanguineous marriages (between blood relatives who share a common ancestor) are the leading cause of hereditary cataracts that affect eyes. Antenatal ultrasonography can discover opacities in the crystalline lens, which may not be apparent in newborns. Despite highly aggressive MMR (measles, mumps and rubella-German measles) vaccination campaigns for preventing these infections, nearly 15 per cent of Indian women of childbearing age remain susceptible to contracting rubella during pregnancy, with consequent congenital cataracts, deafness, heart anomalies and maldevelopment of several other organs. Before planning pregnancy, it is advisable for women to go for an MMR vaccine if not vaccinated earlier, at least four weeks prior to conception. Nearly 30 per cent cases of childhood cataracts, often occurring in one eye in school-going male children, result from eye injuries while playing.

(IOL) in adults is highly standardised and successful, it is a major challenge in newborns and infants. According to Dr Ram, who specialises in paediatric cataract surgery, there is no consensus on the optimal age for surgery. While some experts may wait until the child is at least 2 months old and is better able to withstand anaesthesia and surgery, others perform surgery as early as 28 days. The eye loses its ability to focus on

vent a lazy eye and follow-up care for several years to monitor for any potential complications that may arise later.

Unfortunately, parents often stop bringing these children for follow-up after a few months of surgery.

Sheela Devi and colleagues from London University interviewed parents of nearly 750 children admitted to nine eye hospitals across India between 2015 and 2016. Most came from rural areas and belonged to low socio economic strata. They noted staggering delays of 4 to 8 years in reporting for diagnosis and surgery. Recently, Dr Savleen and Dr Sukhija also noted a significant delay in the presentation and surgery of these children. Early detection and treatment of childhood cataracts can prevent permanent vision impairment. A simple red reflex test, performed by paediatricians or ophthalmologists worldwide for decades, involves shining a direct ophthalmoscope light into each eye and comparing the reflected light from both eyes. This test can detect the presence of cataracts or any other visual disability. Although not highly sensitive, even at home, parents can use a mobile camera with a flash to take a picture of their toddler in a dark room, looking into the camera, seated at a distance of half a metre. A white, yellow, or black reflex, or a difference in the reflex between the two eyes, should prompt a visit to the ophthalmologist. While universal eye screening has been mandated in newborns in India since 2017, a simple red reflex test to detect common eye abnormalities in children is yet to catch up, losing the critical time to prevent permanent vision loss.

gut-friendly food, the team said.

The findings also reveal how almonds can potentially benefit specific populations such as Asian Indians, where rising rates of cardiometabolic diseases are a concern, study author Dr Anoop Misra, chairman of Fortis Centre for Diabetes, Obesity and Cholesterol, told agency.

Consuming almonds was found to lower LDL, or 'bad' cholesterol by five units, and diastolic blood pressure in small but significant amounts of 0.17-1.3 mmHg.

For Asian Indians with pre-diabetes, eating almonds daily can help reduce fasting blood glucose and HbA1C, the researchers said.

In the article, the authors also wrote that "there was some evidence that almond consumption of (more than) 50 grams per day may have led to small reductions in body weight in some study participants." They said the result debunks the myth that almonds can contribute to weight gain.

Dr Misra said, "Almonds can support weight loss efforts due to their nutrient composition - protein, fibre, and healthy fat content - which helps people feel satisfied for longer periods and may reduce overall calorie intake." Further, almonds have been shown to benefit one's gut by promoting the growth of healthy gut bacteria and

New human 'multi-zonal' liver organoids improve injury survival rate in rodents

WASHINGTON DC, Apr 20 (Agencies): One of the reasons our livers excel at clearing waste from our blood system is because the organ functions according to three key "zones" that perform specific major tasks.

So, if scientists hope to create self-growing patches of liver organoid tissue that could help repair damaged organs, it's important that the lab-grown tissue faithfully reproduces such zones. In a groundbreaking paper published, a team of organoid medicine experts at Cincinnati Children's reports achieving just such a milestone -- made from human stem cells.

When these humanised organoids were transplanted into rodents whose own liver-bile duct system had been disconnected, the improved organoids nearly doubled the rodents' survival rate. "The research community has

long needed a better model for



studying human liver biology and disease, because there are outstanding hepatocyte diversity and associated functional orchestrations in the human liver that do not exist in rodents," says Takanori Takebe, MD, PhD, the study's corresponding author.

"This new system paves the way for studying, and eventually treating, a wide range of otherwise fatal liver disorders.

Takebe is Director for Commercial Innovation at Cincinnati Children's Center for Stem Cell and Organoid Medicine (CuSTOM).

He has been studying methods for growing liver organoids for over 13 years.

Breakthroughs from his lab include producing the first connected set of three organoids grown together, a novel way to mass produce liver organoids for research purposes, and gene-engineered liver organoids that may someday help treat severe jaundice.

In the short term, these multizonal liver organoids will help scientists shed new light on diseases including diabetes, drug-induced liver injury, alcohol-related liver disease, and viral hepatitis. In turn, such work could accelerate drug development and other approaches to restore liver health.

Longer-term, for people on waiting lists for liver transplantation, this study moves the medical community one step closer to "growing" a patient's own liver replacement tissue instead of relying on organ donation

be strengthened and refined through visual experiences. If the light entering the eye is partially or entirely blocked at birth, its connections in the brain die, resulting in permanent vision impairment, commonly referred to as a lazy eye (amblyopia). The critical period for vision development in young children may extend up to the first 7 to 8 years. However, children lose the faculty of depth perception forever if they cannot simultaneously perceive objects from both eyes within the first 2 years of age. Early detection and intervention to remove any blocks in the path of light entering the eyes are thus of paramount importance in babies.

While replacing the cataractous crystalline lens with an artificial intraocular lens implant

There is a general agreement that children over 2 years can also have an IOL, but it remains controversial for children under 6 months. In children under 2, the IOL power calculation is highly inaccurate

Dr Sukhija recently reported that if the size of the bag, critical for fixing the IOL, is small, it is safer to leave the eye without a lens (aphakia) or perform a bicapsular placement of the IOL. The aphakic eye's power can be corrected with thick glasses or with a contact lens placed on the cornea as a temporary arrangement until an IOL implantation is

done at a later age.

Infants who undergo surgery with IOL before the age of 6 months and especially those developing complications often require high myopic glasses by the age of 5, the change being less substantial in those corrected with thick glasses or contact lenses. While replacing contact lenses to adjust to the changing requirements of the eye is easy, the contact lenses are expensive, not readily available and require utmost care, posing a logistical challenge in low-income settings. Regardless, all children who undergo surgery require treatment to pre-

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, Apr 20 (Agencies): Kerala Blasters FC (KBFC) endured a difficult Indian Super League (ISL) campaign this season, finishing outside the playoff spots for the first time in four years. Hopes were high at the start under new head coach Mikael Stahre, especially following the high-profile signings of Noah Sadaoui and Jesus Jimenez. However, an opening-day defeat set a challenging tone for the season. While the team briefly regained momentum with two wins and two draws in their next four matches, they ultimately struggled to maintain consistency, as per the official website of ISL.

Then came the real slump. The Blasters suffered six defeats in their following seven games -- a dismal run that led to the departure of Stahre, with assistant coach TG Purushothaman stepping in as interim head coach.

Under his guidance, the Kochi-based side showed signs of revival, collecting 10 points out of a possible 15. But once again, consistency eluded them. In their final seven games, they managed only two wins and two draws, ultimately finishing seven points behind sixthplaced Mumbai City FC and missing out on a playoff berth.

Kerala Blasters played 24 matches this season, winning 8, drawing 5, and losing 11, finishing the campaign with a total of 29 points. Despite the struggles of the season, there have been glimpses of hope for Kerala Blasters FC. The presence of talented players like Jesus Jimenez and Noah Sadaoui has brought moments of flair and brilliance. Alongside the new foreign duo, young talent Korou Singh has made a name for himself, stepping up in crucial moments and showing that the future could be bright despite recent setbacks. His energy and creativity have often sparked the team's attack, suggesting that the Blasters have promising assets in their ranks moving forward.

Unfortunately, the positives have been few and far between, overshadowed by a series of persistent issues. The season has been marked by an alarming number of losses, including disappointing defeats to top teams such as Mohun Bagan Super Giant and FC Goa. The inability to convert draws into wins -- like in their matches against Jamshedpur FC and Hyderabad FC -- further hurt their chances of competing at a higher level, ultimately leaving them in the bottom half of the table.

A lack of consistency plagued their campaign, while problems with team cohesion and defensive structure made things worse. Frequent defensive lapses led to soft goals at key moments, and the midfield often looked disconnected, struggling to provide the necessary link between defence and attack.

Amid the chaos, Jesus Jimenez has stood out as Kerala Blasters' best player this season and a fitting successor to last season's Golden Boot winner, Dimitrios Diamantakos. The 31-yearold Spanish forward has been vital both in scoring and creating chances, ending the campaign with 11 goals and one assist. His presence up front has often been the only ray of hope for a struggling side. On several occasions, his link-up play with Noah Sadaoui brought muchneeded goals, while his leadership and composure inspired teammates to lift their game in difficult moments.

On the other end of the spectrum, 18-yearold Korou Singh has been a breath of fresh air. Singh has shown maturity beyond his age. His dynamic contributions in both attack and defence underline his versatility and immense potential. With two goals and four high-quality assists to his name, he leads the list of Indian goal contributors for the Blasters this season. His emergence is a promising sign not only for the club but also for Indian football as a whole.

Kerala Blasters have appointed David Catala as their new head coach ahead of the Kalinga Super Cup, where they'll look to put the disappointments of the season behind them and make a fresh start, beginning with a tough opening fixture against reigning champions East Bengal FC.

Beyond the tournament, however, the Blasters must craft a clear strategy to address the shortcomings revealed during their ISL campaign. Reinforcing the backline should be a top priority to offer better protection for the goalkeeper and cut down on goals conceded.

Bringing in players who align with the philosophy of the new coach is important, and nurturing budding talents could foster a more competitive environment within the squad. Holding on to crucial players and continuing to develop promising youngsters like Singh will also be vital if the Blasters are to bounce back and re-establish themselves as a serious contender in the ISL.



RAMBAN, Apr 20: Devraj Thakur, National Joint Secretary of Akhil Bhartiya Rashtriya Shakshik Mahasangh (ABRSM), expressed deep concern over the alarming flood situation in Ramban district.
