The Revision process was preceded by, rationalization of Polling stations of 77-Nagrota AC resulting in the increase of 5 Polling stations, thus raising the total number of Polling stations to 150 from earlier

"After six months, we are back to Srinagar Civil Secretariat office. The environment in which we were hoping the offices would open, expecting normal business did not happen. It has been seen that if situation remains conducive and peaceful, it improves functioning of the government," CM

"We need now to focus on things that are under our control and work to ease the difficulties faced by common people," the Chief Minister said in his opening

He directed officers to ensure that their efforts during this working season go beyond administrative offices. "We do not have to restrict our working to the Civil Secretariat as was the case during budget session. Now is the good opportunity to see implementation of projects on the ground," he stated.

He called upon all departments to concentrate on delivery and accountability.

"Let's focus on the deliverables. So that six months from now, when we have to move to Jammu, we can actually sit down with a list of all the positive developments and changes that in spite of the circumstances, we were able to make here." the Chief Minister observed.

Referring to the budget passed in the Legislative Assembly this year in March, CM Omar Abdullah said that while opinions may differ, the government's obligation lies in its execution. "But now it is our duty, that the budget that the assembly passed, the budget that this government brought to the assembly and got it approved, we will implement the budget decisions and review meetings shall be held with concerned departments and agencies," he remarked.

He underscored the importance of utilizing the budgetary allocations and implementing District Capex plan on the ground. "Because this is the works season, he said, noting the brief window available for developmental works. particularly in the winter zone.

The Chief Minister informed that a detailed review would be held with the Chief Secretary, Finance Secretary and departments.

"Where there would be obstacles, we will take the necessary decisions to remove those hurdles," he said, urging development departments - including Power, R&B, PHE, Health, and Social Welfare — to accelerate their pace of work.

Touching on the broader national support for J&K's development, CM Omar shared details of his recent meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saying that the highest level in government of India wants to see that in no way should Pahalgam attack derail the process of governance and development in Jammu and Kashmir.

"That is our responsibility which we will have to take care of," he stated.

Acknowledging the adverse impact of recent events on the tourism sector, the Chief Minister called for a collective effort to ensure a smooth Amarnath Yatra without any inconvenience to the pilgrims. He emphasized that the civil administration has its own responsibilities which we will have to

fulfill at any cost. On the much-anticipated Rail-to-Kashmir project, the Chief Minister expressed hope that the inauguration—originally scheduled for April 19 but postponed due to inclement weather would happen soon.

The DC instructed NHAI officials to promptly assess the extent of damage to affected houses and carry out the necessary repair work to restore their structural integrity. She stressed that repairs must ensure the houses are made safe and fit for habitation.

Mata Baglamukhi Temple

ata Baglamukhi Temple is a revered shrine dedicated to Goddess Baglamukhi, one of the ten Mahavidyas in Hinduism, symbolizing power, protection, and victory over enemies. Located at various places in India, some of the most famous temples are in Nalkheda (Madhya Pradesh), Kangra (Himachal Pradesh), and Datia (Madhya Pradesh). Each temple attracts thousands of devotees, especially during Navratri and other auspicious occasions, who come seeking the blessings of the powerful goddess. The name "Baglamukhi" is derived from the Sanskrit words "Bagla" (meaning bride) and "Mukhi" (meaning face or headed). However, spiritually, "Bagla" is also interpreted as "Valga" meaning "to rein in" or "to control." Thus, Baglamukhi is known as the goddess who has the power to paralyze enemies, stop negative energies, and grant victory in disputes and legal matters. She is often worshipped by those facing legal challenges, competitors, or adversaries in any field. The idol of Mata Baglamukhi is usually depicted in a striking pose, holding the tongue of a demon with her left hand and raising a club in her right hand to strike him. This imagery symbolizes the suppression of enemies' speech and actions, granting the devotee power to overcome harmful influences. Her yellow attire and the use of turmeric (haldi) in rituals signify her association with the yellow color, representing prosperity and auspiciousness. The temple's architecture typically follows traditional Hindu temple designs, with ornate carvings, a sanctum sanctorum (garbhagriha), and beautifully crafted idols. Many temples also have a yajna shala (ritual hall) where specific tantric rituals and havans are performed under the guidance of priests. It is believed that rituals performed here with devotion and proper methods yield quick and effective results. Devotees flock to the Mata Baglamukhi Temple for various reasons. Many seek relief from enemies, protection from evil forces, or victory in court cases. Others come to gain mental strength, courage, and the power to speak effectively. The temple is especially crowded on Thursdays, considered auspicious for the goddess, as well as during Navratri, when special prayers and night-long rituals are organized. Legends associated with Mata Baglamukhi narrate that she emerged during a great storm threatening the universe. To stop the chaos, she appeared and silenced the storm, symbolizing control over disorder. This legend reinforces her role as a goddess who stops negative forces and grants stability. Another belief is that worshipping her not only grants victory but also prevents future harm from arising. A unique aspect of Baglamukhi worship is the use of tantric rituals. Unlike other deities where simple prayers suffice, the sadhanas (spiritual practices) of Baglamukhi involve specific mantras, mudras, and offerings performed under strict guidance. Devotees often fast, wear yellow clothes, and use yellow offerings such as turmeric, vellow sweets, and vellow flowers. Some rituals are performed secretly at midnight for specific purposes. Apart from spiritual benefits, the Mata Baglamukhi Temple also promotes community gatherings, spiritual discourse, and charity. Many temples organize free meal services (bhandara) and educational or health camps for devotees and the local population. Pilgrims visiting the temple often express a deep sense of spiritual fulfillment and inner strength after darshan (sighting) of the goddess. In recent years, the popularity of Mata Baglamukhi worship has spread beyond India, with temples and devotees worldwide invoking her for protection against obstacles in both personal and professional life. The temple stands not only as a place of worship but also as a beacon of faith in the power of the divine feminine. Mata Baglamukhi Temple holds a unique place in Hindu spirituality. Whether one seeks victory over external enemies or internal fears, the goddess offers her blessings to those who approach her with sincerity and devotion. Visiting the temple is not just a religious act but a transformative experience, inspiring strength, courage, and unwavering faith.

"Fraud in the name of KCC: Predatory capitalism of private banks and looting of farmers"

hile giving loans to farmers under the KCC scheme, private banks quietly deduct money from their accounts in the name of insurance and policies. Recently, a similar act of Axis Bank was exposed in Rajasthan when a farmer made a video and exposed the truth. This is not just an incident but a frightening trend spread across the entire banking system. The inaction of the government and RBI makes it more dangerous. Now is the time for farmers to wake up, raise questions, and demand their economic rights.

India is an agricultural country. We have been learning this sentence in schools since the first grade, but the question is, does the heart of India really beat with the farmers? Do governments, banking institutions, and economic policymakers respect this agricultural dominance? Recently, a video from Rajasthan revived this question, where an educated farmer exposes the trick of Axis Bank, which is being done with lakhs of innocent farmers like him-money is deducted from their Kisan Credit Card (KCC) account in the name of insurance and policies without informing them. This incident is not just of one state but is part of an entire economic exploitation system.

The Kisan Credit Card (KCC) scheme was launched by the government to provide farmers with affordable credit so that they can meet their farming costs without falling into the trap of moneylenders. The soul of this scheme was easy, transparent, and reliable financial assistance. But when the same scheme goes

into the hands of private banks, they turn it into a marketable product. Farmers are forcibly given life insurance, accident insurance, and sometimes even mobile SIMs or other services in the name of KCC. The cost of all this is deducted directly from their account—without their consent, without their knowledge.

A video recorded by a farmer in Rajasthan unravels the layers of this entire system. The farmer asks Axis Bank on what authority money was deducted from his account. The bank employees have no clear answer. They talk about the policy but are unable to show any documents of consent. The video clearly shows that this is not a "policy" but meanness. The farmer's language, confidence, and factual preparation show that if the farmers become aware, this system will not last long.

It is not that only Axis Bank is involved in such activities. Many other private banks-ICICI, HDFC, IDFC, and even some cooperative banks—have also been accused by farmers' organizations. Thousands of rupees are deducted from the farmers' accounts every year in the name of insurance. Many times they do not even know that a policy has been started in their name. When they go to the bank to complain, they are either silenced or are told, "This is the rule," "It is deducted from the system," or "You signed the form." Here, signature means a form filled out forcibly, which the farmer is unable to understand.

This question is very important: What are the governments doing about this? Do they not have information that farmers are being cheated by banks? If yes, then why has no strict action been taken till now? Whether it is

Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi or loan waiver schemes, all these run in the name of farmers. But when their own money is silently deducted, then why do the same governments become silent? Has the government become a silent partner in this 'illegal earning' of private banks?

In recent years, farmers have filed PILs on this issue several times. The High Courts of some states have also paid attention to this, but no concrete policy has emerged at the national level. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued some guidelines, such as adding insurance or any other product only with the explicit permission of the customer, but the ground reality is completely opposite to this.

When an educated customer living in cities goes to the bank, he is told everything related to insurance, policy, and transaction. But when the same bank opens a branch in a village, the books of rules disappear there. Considering the rural customer as 'weak, illiterate, and naïve,' the attitude of the banks becomes 'looting and intimidating.' This is what we call economic inequality—where there are no facilities, only 'exploitation' reaches.

The government should organize digital and banking literacy camps at every panchayat level. It is important to explain to the farmer what he is signing and what its effect will be. Also, RBI should create an online portal where the farmer can know the reason for every rupee deducted from his account, and he should get the facility to lodge a complaint without going to the bank. If such complaints come from many branches of a bank, then the services related to farmer loans should be banned at that bank. Farmer awareness committees should be formed at the village level, which monitor banking fraud and boycott the bank if needed.

Today, the Indian farmer is not only fighting the weather, the land, and the market, but is also grappling with the hypocrisy of the banks. The banks that once promised to be his financial backbone are now stabbing him in the back. In such a situation, it is important that we are not just surprised by watching the video but adopt the consciousness of the farmer who asks questions, demands answers, and raises his voice for his rights.

The farmer should not be considered just a grain-growing machine. He is also a vigilant citizen. In a country where the budget is prepared in his name, those who empty his pockets cannot be forgiven. "Sanskaar (culture) has taught us to bow down, but not in front of anyone's arrogance"-do not limit this sentence to just a picture. This is the real story of the farmers' struggle. Now the time has come that every farmer, every citizen, every journalist, and every policy maker should understand this—if the farmer's voice is not heard, then tomorrow the field will go silent and so will the plate.

oth the Prime Minister Package Employees as well as the SC, ST, OBC Jammu based employees working across Kashmir valley are working in perpetual threat to their life, limb and dignity and they are made to work in most unfavorable and undesirable conditions. Both these groups of employees are made to lick the dust. In fact it is no exaggeration to say that these employees of the UT are made to work in continuous fear and risk to their lives and in fact are held as hostages and they can be targeted at any time by the Islamic terrorists and so they are working in risk to their life and the government is very unjust to both these categories of employees. So far as package employees are concerned they have to work in Kashmir Valley up to their superannuation and this is big injustice to these employees. These posts are supernumerary, as such are additional posts and they have to work when some JK employee is on leave but the height of injustice is that these package are made to work as regular employees and they are overburdened with the work, when justice demands and deserves that Package employees should be given work when any employees is away on leave. Most disgusting is the travesty of justice that these PM package employees posts were made non-transferable which is a big injustice with these hapless employees when the fact is that for all purposes they are like the other regular employees of Jammu and Kashmir. The height of injustice and unlawfulness is that these package

to the effect that they will not claim their transfer to Jammu division till their retirement. Thus to save them from the harassment, intimidation, fear and uncertainty the best and only course will be to allow them to work from home so that there is no harm done to their precious lives. So the LG administration should take a decision in this regard at the earliest so that it seems that the government thinks and cares for them. So they should not be given the feeling that they are kept as hostages by the government where there is risk and continuous threat to their life, limb and dignity. It is opportune and appropriate time to take the opportunity and order

side the work of the government will not suffer and on the other hand the lives of these soft targets are saved from the bullets of the savage terrorists. No delay should be made in this matter as it will prove counterproductive and harm the life, limb and honor of these employees. Therefore government should see the issue from humanitarian angle and make no further delay in ordering work for home for package employees and reserved category employees and in this lies the good of the powers ,government work and these employees. What has been written above is truth and undiluted and concentrated truth and nothing beyond that. But is there anybody listening is the million dollar question?



The Indian government has geoblocked the Instagram accounts of several Pakistani celebrities, including Hania Aamir, Mahira Khan, Ali Zafar, Sanam Saeed, Bilal Abbas, Igra Aziz, Imran Abbas and Sajal Aly, following the Pahalgam terror attack on April 22.

Indian users attempting to access these Instagram profiles are now shown the message: "Account not available in India. This content has been restricted in response to a legal request.'

Despite the block, many Indians have found workarounds by using VPN services to continue following their favourite Pakistani artists. Among those receiving a surge of online support is actor Hania Aamir.

One fan commented on her post, "Don't worry, humne VPN subscription liya hai apke liye (We have taken a VPN subscription for you)," to which Hania responded with, "Ro doongi (I'm going to cry)," followed by "Love you."

The digital restrictions are part of a series of measures taken by India following the terror attack.

According to government sources, India has also banned 16 Pakistani YouTube channels accused of spreading provocative, communally sensitive content and anti-India narratives targeting national security forces.

The move is part of a broader set of punitive measures taken by India in response to the attack, which killed 26 civilians and has been attributed to Pakistan-based terrorists. In addition to the online clampdown, India has suspended the Indus Waters Treaty, cancelled visas issued to Pakistani nationals, suspended bilateral trade, imposed a ban on Pakistani flights using Indian airspace, and halted certain exports as part of a comprehensive diplomatic and economic response.

Putin dials Modi, conveys Russia's full support to **India's fight against terrorism**

Says perpetrators of Pahalgam terror attack and their supporters must be brought to justice

NEW DELHI, May 5 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin called Prime Minister Narendra Modi and expressed full support to India in its fight against terrorism, following the recent terror attack in Pahal-

Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal shared details of the call on social media platform X.

"Putin strongly condemned the terror attack in Pahalgam, India. He conveyed deepest condolences on the loss of innocent lives and expressed full support to India in the fight against terrorism. He emphasised that the perpetrators of the heinous attack and their supporters must be brought to



justice," Jaiswal said. Both leaders reiterated their commitment to further deepen the India-Russia special and privileged strategic partnership.

PM Modi conveyed greetings to President Putin on the celebration of the 80th anniversary of Victory Day (May 9) and invited him for the annual summit to be held in India later in the year. Last week on May 2, External Affairs Minister S Jaishan-

kar, had spoken to his Russian

counterpart Sergey Lavrov and conveyed the perpetrators, backers and planners of the Pahalgam attack must be brought to justice.

Jaishankar posted on social media platform that he had discussed the Pahalgam terrorist attack with Lavrov. "Its perpetrators, backers and planners must be brought to justice," the post said.

The Russian side also issued its account of the telephone conversation with the Russian Embassy in New Delhi stating, "They (Lavrov and Jaishankar) discussed the aggravation of Indian-Pakistani relations following the terrorist attack near Pahalgam."

'Understand Pakistan's reality': Himanta's message to 'Aman ki Asha' group

NEW DELHI, May 5 (Agencies): Senior BJP leader and Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma on Monday cautioned peace seekers with Pakistan about what he described as the "grim realities" of the neighbouring country.

"To those in India who continue to preach 'Aman ki Asha' without grasping the ground reality — understand this: In Pakistan, talking about peace with India is treated as a crime," Sarma said on X.

His remarks came on the same day when Pakistan demanded closeddoor consultations at the **United Nations Security** Council (UNSC) to discuss rising tensions with India following the Pahalgam terror attack on April 22

Sarma said, "In India, talking about peace with Pakistan is tolerated, debated — even promoted in mainstream platforms. But romanticising Pakistan while enjoying Indian freedom is not idealism it is ignorance at best, hypocrisy at worst and a betrayal of your own motherland.'

Sarma argued his case by mentioning Pakistan's treatment of pro-India voices.

"They resort to surveillance and profiling. Every post, tweet or article with a pro-India sentiment is tracked by Pakistan's intelligence agencies, especially the ISI. Students, activists, and journalists are routinely placed on watchlists." he said.

Sarma also accused Pakistan of censorship.

"The Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) actively blocks and removes any content deemed favourable to India.

Even hashtags promoting peace or dialogue are erased without explanation. Under the draconian PECA, people are arrested for expressing anything seen as pro-India. Vague charges like 'anti-state' and 'glorify-



ing the enemy' are used to silence voices of reason," he said.

The senior BJP leader added that Pakistan citizens have been picked up by intelligence agencies, tortured, and jailed without trial-often for something as harmless as a poem, peace appeal or balanced article.

Sarma also said dozens, especially Baloch, Pashtun and Sindhi activists, have vanished without a trace for expressing support for India or challenging Pakistan's military narrative.

Congress, its allies acting like 'fifth column' against Indian armed forces, alleges BJP

NEW DELHI. May 5 (Agencies): The BJP on Monday alleged that the Congress and its allies have become a "fifth column" working to lower the morale of armed forces after the Uttar Pradesh Congress president took a 'toy Rafale' jibe at the government over its response to the Pahalgam terror attack.

BJP national spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi sought to draw a parallel between Pakistani army and leaders of INDIA bloc, saying the former is bombarding the Indian armed forces from across the

border by violating the ceasefire while opposition leaders are targeting them with their comments from within.

The ruling party's fresh attack on opposition parties, especially the Conaress, came following **Uttar Pradesh Congress** president Ajai Rai's taunting remarks for the alleged lack of action by the government against terrorists.

4 Killed, 6 injured in car-bike collision in Madhya Pradesh

BHOPAL, May 5 (Agencies): Four lives were lost in a tragic accident when a car collided with a bike near Pidoura village on the Etawah-Uttar Pradesh highway that passes through Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh, leaving six others with severe inju-

The incident occurred at around 1 a.m. on Monday in the Barohi police station area of Bhind district

The police reached the spot and sent the victims for post-mortem examinations

A local legislator from Bhind, Narendra Singh Kushwaha, who was passing through the highway, first saw the injured lying on the road. He took the injured to the district hospital of



Bhind in his vehicle.

Among those killed, three were riding the bike, while the fourth victim was a passenger in the car.

Of the three injured, all are in critical condition, they were later referred to Gwalior for further treatment.

Narendra Singh Kushwaha, when he came upon the scene, said the injured were strewn across the road. He halted his journey and took immediate action, arranging for their transport to the district hos-

The legislator not only ensured their admission to the hospital but also personally oversaw their treatment.

As reports emerged about the gravity of the accident. Mr Kushwaha took to social media to express his commitment: "After admitting all the injured victims in the road accident near Pidoura village to Bhind hospital, I personally reached the hospital and took stock of the condition of the victims and on that basis, arranged for

their proper treatment and sent the more seriously injured victims to Gwalior for treatment," wrote the legislator on his X handle.

The deadly head-on collision between the car and the bike resulted in instantaneous deaths, with the sheer impact claiming four lives on the spot.

This incident serves as yet another grim reminder of the pressing need for enhanced road safety measures.

According to police, the victims, who were riding the bike, have been identified as Biharilal Baghel (40), a resident of Kathma village, along with his uncle Sujan Singh Baghel (50) and cousin Rishikesh Baghel (22) and the car occupant Mehmood (23).

The bikers had attended a pre-wedding ritual in Bhind and were returning home late at night.

Rishikesh was at the helm of the bike when the incident occurred The high-speed collision left the car uncontrollable, causing it to overturn by the roadside. Among its passengers, Mahmood (23), son of Hamid Khan from Porsa village, succumbed to his injuries instantly. Other occupants of the car who received injuries include Suraj (19), Kallu (22), Anshu (22), Shakeel (24), and Chalu (22) -- were gravely injured and transported to the District Hospital, Bhind via ambulance and critical patients were later shifted to Gwalior, the police said.

Japan backs India's fight against terrorism



NEW DELHI, May 5 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Monday hosted his Japanese counterpart Gen Nakatani for wideranging talks touching upon the scourge of terrorism and ways to expand bilateral defence ties in the wake of China's military posturing in the Indo-Pacific.

Gen Nakatani, whose visit to India comes amid its heightened tensions with Pakistan in the wake of the Pahalgam attack, condemned the terrorist attack and expressed solidarity with India in the fight against terrorism.

In his opening remarks at the delegation-level talks that followed a one-on-one meeting, Singh said, "I would like to thank the government of Japan for their strong expression of solidarity with India in wake of the Pahalgam terrorist attack"

"Both sides condemned terrorism in all forms and emphasised the need for enhanced collaboration and joint efforts to counter cross-border threats." Singh said Nakatani expressed solidarity with India in the wake of the Pahalgam attack and offered "full support" to India.

It is learnt that the two sides also deliberate on ways to boost India-Japan defence industrial cooperation.

The two ministers also

exchanged "views and ideas" on the current regional and international security situation.

It was the second meeting between the two defence ministers within six months after their maiden interaction in November on the sidelines of the ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus at Lao PDR.

At that meeting, Singh and Gen Nakatani deliberated on a reciprocal provision of supply and services agreement for greater interoperability between their militaries.

The reciprocal supply and services pact, if sealed, would provide for the militaries of the two countries to use each other's bases for repair and replenishment of supplies, besides facilitating the scaling up of overall defence cooperation.

It is learnt that the two sides also reviewed the situation in the strategic waters of East and South China Seas where Beijing has been increasing its military posturing.

Congress spreading rumours about Waqf Amendment Act: **Union Minister Bhupendra Yadav**



NEW DELHI, May 5 (Agencies): The rights of Muslim groups and individuals to create, manage and regulate Wagf will remain intact. Union Minister Bhupendra Yadav said on Monday, and alleged that the Congress is spreading rumours about the Waqf Amendment Ãct, 2025.

Addressing a press conference at Delhi BJP office, the Union minister said that Prime Min-

ister Narendra Modi has come up with various reforms in the fields of social justice, economic growth, transparency and gender equality.

"The Waqf Amendment Ãct, 2025 recently passed by Parliament is an important milestone of this progressive journey," he asserted.

The Congress is spreading rumours that the rights of Muslims will end due to the Act, he alleged, adding that it was not for the first time that the Act was amended.

Some issues like transparency and management in Waqf affairs remained unaddressed in the last amendment in 2013, which have been taken care of now by the Waqf Amendment Act, 2025, he said.

The latest amendments to the Waqf Act were discussed and consulted in detail when the government referred the subject to the Joint Parliamentary Committee to incorporate all views, he said.

5 of family killed in fire at 5-storey building in Kanpur

KANPUR, May 5 (Agencies): A couple and their three minor daughters died in a blaze that broke out in a five-storey building in Chamanganj area here, police said on Monday.

Huge flames engulfed the building in the Prem Nagar area that houses shoe manufacturing units on its first and second floors, they said.

The bodies of Mohammad Danish, 45, his wife Nazneen Saba, 42, were retrieved from the fourth floor at around 1 am, while those of their daughters -- Sara, 15, Simra, 12, and Inaya, 7, -were found on the same floor at around 6 am, said Additional DCP (Central) Rajesh Srivastava.

It took firefighters several hours to gain access to the fourth floor, officials said, adding that the victims were taken to the Ursula Horseman Memorial Hospital, where the doctors declared them brought dead.

According to police, the neighbours noticed huge flames and thick smoke emanating from the building on Sunday night and alerted the fire department

Assistant Commissioner of Police (Seesmau) Manjay Singh said an investigation had been launched to determine the cause of the fire.

Preliminary probe suggests that the fire started in the basement and engulfed the first and second floors



before being noticed by the neighbours the ACP added.

"Initial suspicions point towards a possible short circuit or faults in the internal wiring, potentially originating from the floors where the shoe factory was operating," the ACP said.

"The fire led to blasts in a couple of domestic LPG cylinders that worsened the situation," he added.

State Disaster Response Force teams were also called to help the firefighters in the relief operations to extinguish the blaze completely, said ACP (Colonelganj) TB Singh.

"People from over half a dozen neighbouring buildings were evacuated to ensure their safety," he added.

The officials have been instructed to investigate the building's legality and fire safety status and take action accordingly, a senior official said.

Trump orders 100 per cent tariff on all movies produced outside US

WASHINGTON, May 5 (Agencies): A US President Donald Trump has announced that he has directed the Department of Commerce and the US Trade Representative to immediately start the process of imposing a 100 per cent tariff on all movies coming into the US that are produced in other nations.

He said that the movie industry in the US is "dying" a very fast death and added that other nations were offering incentives to draw the American filmmakers and studios away from the US and termed it a "national threat."

In a post shared on his social media platform Truth Social, Trump stated, "The Movie Industry in America is DYING a very fast death. Other Countries are offering all sorts of incentives to draw our filmmakers and studios away from the United States. Hollywood, and many other areas within the U.S.A., are being devastated.



This is a concerted effort by other Nations and, therefore, a National Security threat. It is, in addition to everything else, messaging and propaganda! Therefore, I am authorizing the Department of Commerce, and the United States Trade Representative, to immediately begin the process of instituting a 100% Tariff on any and all Movies coming into our Country that are produced in Foreign

Lands. WE WANT MOVIES MADE IN AMERICA, AGAIN."

Trump's decision comes amid the ongoing tariff war between the US and China. On April 10, China announced that it has decided to "moderately reduce" the release of Hollywood films in the Chinese market. China's National Film Administration directly connected its decision to tariffs imposed by the US on Chinese products.

In a statement, China's National Film Administration said, "The wrong move by the US government to abuse tariffs on China will inevitably further reduce the domestic audience's favourability towards American films," Al Jazeera reported.

It stated, "We will follow market rules, respect the audience's choice, and moderately reduce the number of American films imported."

Notably, China accepts 10 films a year from Hollywood, and the Chinese market was once considered a key source of revenue for the American film industry.

Reacting to China's decision, Trump had said that he was untroubled by China's National Film Administration's decision to target the film industry, Al Jazeera reported. In response to a question, Trump had said, "I think I've heard of worse things."

Tourist boats capsize in sudden storm in southwest China, leaving 9 dead, 1 missing



BEIJING, May 5 (Agencies): Four boats capsized in a sudden storm on a river in southwestern China, leaving nine people dead and one missing, state media said Monday.

More than 80 people fell into the water when strong winds hit the scenic area in Guizhou province on Sunday afternoon, state broadcaster CCTV said.

The boats capsized after a sudden rain and hail storm hit the upper reaches of the Wu River, a tributary of the Yangtze, China's Ion-

gest river. In one video shared by state media, a man could be seen performing CPR on another person, while one of the vessels drifted upside down.

Initial reports said two tourist boats had capsized, but state media said on Monday that four boats were involved. The other two boats had no passengers, and the seven crew members were able to save themselves, CCTV said.

Guizhou's mountains and rivers are a major tourism draw, and many Chinese are travelling during a five-day national holiday that ends Monday.

Chinese President Xi Jinping called for "allout efforts" to find the missing and care for the injured, the official Xinhua News Agency said on Sunday.

Noting a recent series of fatal accidents, Xi underscored the importance of strengthening safety at tourist attractions, large public venues and residential communities, as well as for the rush of people returning at the end of holidays.

CCTV said the capsized boats each had a maximum capacity of about 40 people and were not overloaded.

An eyewitness told state-owned Beijing News the waters were deep but that some people had managed to swim to safety. However, the storm had come suddenly and a thick mist obscured the surface of the river.

Nepal Parliament orders Government to advance high-level diplomatic dialogue with India to probe KIIT student death

KATHMANDU, May 5 (Agencies): Nepal's lower house of Parliament on Monday has asked the country's Government to advance high-level diplomatic dialogue with India to probe the death of a Nepalese student at the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) in Odisha.

A day ago, the National Assembly, Nepal's Upper House of Parliament had passed a similar directive for the government.

Speaker of the lower House of Representatives or the Pratinidhi Sabha, Devraj Ghimire, on Monday issued a ruling to the government to advance high-level diplomatic dialogue with India

"The serious attention of the House has been drawn to the issue raised by the honourable members at an urgent time regarding the death of Prisa Sah, a Nepali student studying at the Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) in Odisha, India. The incident of mysterious deaths one after another of students who had gone abroad to study with dreams of a bright future is also a serious issue related to the sensitivity and responsibility of the nation. I direct the government to take deep interest in this incident and to initiate diplomatic dialogue at the highest level with the Indian government to find out the truth and provide necessary legal assistance to the family," Ghimre said.

The first-year BTech, Computer Science student who was said to be planning to return back home for vacation in mid of this month, was found dead inside her hostel room on May 1. This is the second incident of the death of a Nepali female student at the same university reported within a span of three months.

Earlier this year, a Nepali student from the same university was found dead in the hostel on February 16, triggering protests from Nepali students. The protesting students had alleged that a fellow student had harassed her and that the college had failed to act despite multiple complaints. Later, the accused student was arrested on February 17.

"Before it was the death of Prakriti Lamsal. Before we recover from the pain of losing her another female Nepali student's untimely death has left us deranged. Female student enrolled in B. Tech First year at Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT) in Odisha, India, Prisa Sah had to give up her life. My tribute to her and condolences to the family. She held telephonic conversation with her father at around 3 PM the same day but she took her life in the evening. An estimated 1200 Nepali students are enrolled in that varsity, these kinds of incidents are just coincidence or there is some other reason behind? I would demand for serious investigation onto the topics," Devendra Paudel, also the former Education Minister said. Amresh Kumar Singh, an independent lawmaker in Nepali parliament also demanded action by the Nepal's Govern-

ment and Foreign Min-

istry over the issue.

"This incident is not a coincidence. About three months back, another female student from Butwal- Prakriti Lamsal also had similar incident. Our government at that time showed readiness but now it has remained silent now just because the student is from Madhesh. I want to ask the Government and Foreign Ministry.. do they have a duty to safeguard and raise concern for its citizens abroad? Be it any place across the globe, I demand a judicial investigation into the case. Why do our Cheli-Beti always face ordeals in the same university and eventually end their lives?" Singh said.

Following the death of a Nepali female student at Odisha's Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA)

on May 2 had expressed its deepest condolences and stated that the Odisha government has extended support for the family, and a thorough investigation is being conducted by the state police.

The MEA in a statement said, "We are deeply saddened by the tragic demise of a Nepali student of KIIT University, Bhubaneswar. We extend our heartfelt condolences to the bereaved family during this difficult time."

"Ministry of External Affairs has been in constant touch with the Odisha State Government since we became aware of the tragic incident. The State Government of Odisha has extended full support to the family of the deceased, and a thorough enquiry is currently being conducted by the Odisha Police," it said.

The MEA further said that the safety, security and well-being of all international students is a priority for the Indian government. "Government of India takes the safety, security and well-being of all international students very seriously. We remain in close contact with the Nepali authorities, the Odisha State Government as well as KIIT management to ensure real-time communication and coordination in this matter," the statement read.

Israel plans to capture all of Gaza under new plan, officials say

TEL AVIV, May 5 (Agencies): Israel approved plans on Monday to capture the entire Gaza Strip and remain in the territory for an unspecified amount of time, two Israeli officials said, in a move that if implemented would vastly expand Israel's operations in the Palestinian territory and likely bring fierce international opposition.

Israeli Cabinet ministers approved the plan in an early morning vote, hours after the Israeli military chief said the army was calling up tens of thousands of reserve soldiers.

The new plan, which the officials said was meant to help Israel achieve its war aims of defeating Hamas and freeing hostages held in Gaza, also would push hundreds of thousands of Palestinians to southern Gaza, what would likely exacerbate an already dire humanitarian crisis.

Since a ceasefire between Israel and Hamas collapsed in mid-March, Israel has unleashed fierce strikes on the territory that have killed hundreds. It has captured swathes of territory and now controls roughly 50% of Gaza. Before the truce ended, Israel halted all humanitarian aid into Gaza, including food, fuel and water, setting off what is believed to the be the worst humanitarian crisis in nearly 19 months of war.

The ban on aid has prompted widespread hunger and shortages have set off looting.

Israel is trying to ratchet up pressure on Hamas

The Israeli officials said the plan included the "capturing of the strip and the holding of territories." The plan would also seek to prevent the militant Hamas group from distributing humanitarian aid, which Israel says strengthens the group's rule in Gaza. It also accuses Hamas of keeping the aid for itself to bolsters

its capabilities. The plan also included powerful strikes against Hamas targets, the officials said.

The officials said Israel was in touch with several countries about President Donald Trump's plan to take over Gaza and relocate its population, under what Israel has termed "voluntary emigration" yet which has sparked condemnations from Israel's allies in Europe and the Arab world.

One of the officials said the plan would be implemented gradually. Both officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were discussing military plans.

For weeks, Israel has been trying to ratchet up pressure on Hamas and prompt it to show more flexibility in ceasefire negotiations. But international mediators trying to bring the sides toward a new deal have struggled to do so. Israel's measures do not appear to have moved Hamas away from its negotiating positions.

The previous ceasefire was meant to lead the sides to negotiate an end to the war, but that goal has been a repeated sticking point in talks between Israel and Hamas. Israel says it won't agree to end the war until Hamas is defeated. Hamas meanwhile has demanded an agreement that winds down the war.

The fighting has displaced more than 90% of Gaza's population, often multiple times, and turned Gaza into an uninhabitable moonscape.

The memo says that the U.S. government has voiced clear support for Israel's plan, but it's unclear who would provide funding for the private military companies or the aid.

COGAT and the U.S. Embassy in Jerusalem did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Earlier this week, the AP obtained dozens of documents about aid groups' concerns that the hubs could end up permanently displacing Palestinians and forcing them to live in "de facto internment conditions".

Meanwhile, Israeli strikes across Gaza continued overnight, killing at least 17 people in northern Gaza, according to hospital staff. Strikes hit Gaza City, Beit Hanoun and Beit Lahiya and among the dead were eight women and children, according to staff at the Shifa hospital, where the bodies were brought.

The war in Gaza began when Hamas-led militants attacked southern Israel, killing 1,200 people and taking about 250 hostages. Israel says 59 captives remain in Gaza, although about 35 are believed to be dead.

Israel's offensive has killed more than 52,000 people in Gaza, many of them women and children, according to Palestinian health officials, who do not distinguish between combatants and civilians in their count.

Israel occupied Gaza in the 1967 Mideast war and withdrew troops and settlers in 2005. Two years later, Hamas took over and has controlled the territory since.

For years, residents of Sheikh Mohalla in Saimoh had struggled with access to their community graveyard. On more than one occasion, funeral processions had to pass through Pushvinder Singh's old house yard, situated adjacent to the cemetery. "The lack of a proper entrance to the local graveyard was causing problems, and this need had been under discussion for a long time," Singh told local reporters.

After attempts by the administration to find a solution failed, Singh decided to take the initiative himself. "I provided a strip of land measuring 6 feet by 90 feet in front of my house. It was the only viable solution acceptable to everyone, both villagers and officials," he said. The district administration later developed the route, paving it with tiles.

The gesture, simple yet deeply symbolic, has become a beacon of communal harmony in the region. Singh, who contested the 2024 Assembly elections from Tral as one of the nine independent candidates backed by the All Parties Sikh Coordination Committee (APSCC), had promised to serve people of all communities.

"All the land around the graveyard was fenced. There was no clear way left for the funeral processions to pass. This was a matter that affected everyone emotionally and spiritually," Singh said. His act, he added, is in keeping with the Sikh spirit of service and the broader idea of communal unity: "Hindu-Muslim-Sikh Ittehad is not a slogan, it is a way of life."

The river Chenab's water level rose on May 2 following heavy rainfall in the Akhnoor sector of Jammu and Kashmir.

Earlier Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on April 28 hailed the decision to put the Indus Waters Treaty in abeyance, as a bold step under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

Speaking to ANI, CM Dhami emphasised that today's India knows how to maintain both friendship and enmity.

"This is a very good decision under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Blood and water can't flow together. Today's India knows how to maintain both friendship and enmity," he said.

The Indus Waters Treaty was signed in 1960, following nine years of negotiations between India and Pakistan, with the assistance of the World Bank, which is also a signatory. Former World Bank President Eugene Black initiated the talks.

Recognised as one of the most successful international treaties, it has endured frequent tensions, including conflict, and has provided a framework for irrigation and hydropower development for over half a century. Former US President Dwight Eisenhower described it as "one bright spot ... in a very depressing world picture that we see so often."

The Treaty allocates the Western Rivers (Indus, Jhelum, Chenab) to Pakistan and the Eastern Rivers (Ravi, Beas, Sutlej) to India. At the same time, the Treaty allows each country certain uses of the rivers allocated to the other. The treaty gives India 20% of the water from the Indus River System and the rest 80% to Pakistan.

The attack in Pahalgam is one of the deadliest attacks in the Valley since the 2019 Pulwama strike, in which 40 CRPF jawans were killed. Following the Pahalgam terror attack, India has taken strong measures against Pakistan for its support of cross-border terrorism, including the abeyance of the Indus Water Treaty.

Detained for Pahalgam attack..

foul play in the death of Imtiyaz Ahmad Magray, whose body was fished out from the Adbal stream in the Aharbal area of the district on Sunday morning.

Police have taken cognisance of the incident and launched an investigation to ascertain the exact cause of death, officials said.

A drone footage, which surfaced hours after Magray's body was recovered, showed a youth jumping into the gushing Adbal stream and getting washed away.

Police claimed that Magray, who "confessed" to being

an overground worker (OGW) for terrorists, tried to escape while leading security forces to a hideout in a forest area.

Sakina Ittoo has called for a judicial probe, claiming there was nothing against the deceased in police records.

"There should be a judicial probe (into Magray's death) so that the truth comes out," she said.

"The Pahalgam attack was very sad and unfortunate. We all are aggrieved by it. However, an atmosphere of fear has been created. I request the lieutenant governor (Manoj SInha) that instructions be given to the home department to ensure that innocent people are not harassed and harmed," Ittoo added.

In a press release, National Conference MP Mehdi said he was deeply worried by the recovery of Magray's body.

"According to credible reports, Magray was picked up by security forces days ago, and today he was returned to his family lifeless.

"Kashmiris cannot be treated as collateral damage in the aftermath of the Pahalgam attack. Arbitrary detention, custodial killings and torture are violations of every democratic and legal principle," Mehdi said.

The Lok Sabha member from Srinagar also said that the family's demand for a swift and independent investigation into Magray's death and full accountability for all those involved must be upheld.

"We cannot allow a culture of impunity to destroy what little trust remains," he added.

In a post on X, Mehbooba Mufti said, "Yet another body has been recovered from a river in Kulgam, raising serious allegations of foul play. Local residents allege that Imtiyaz Magray was picked up by the army two days ago and now his body has surfaced mysteriously in the river."

The former chief minister also said the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, which killed 26 people on April 22, appeared to be a "calculated attempt" to derail the "fragile" peace and disrupt tourism in Kashmir, and undermine communal harmony across the country.

"If a single act of violence can shake the entire system, triggering arbitrary arrests, home demolitions and the targeting of innocent civilians, the perpetrators have already achieved their objective," she claimed.

Calling for an impartial probe into Magray's death, Mufti said, "Allegations of misconduct -- be it the Bandipora encounter or this latest incident in Kulgam -- are deeply troubling and warrant a thorough impartial investigation."

All the ready-to-use IEDs, weighing between half-a-kg and five kg, were destroyed in a controlled explosion on-the-spot, thwarting terrorist plans to set off explosions in the border district, the officials said.

The hideout was busted during a joint search operation by army and special operations group of J-K police at Suranthal in Marhote area of Surankote late Sunday evening, the officials said.

While two IEDs were found planted inside steel buckets, three others were packed in tiffin boxes, the officials said. In addition, the officials said two wireless sets, five packets contaiing urea, one five litre gas cylinder, one binocular, three woolen caps, three blankets and some trousers and utensils were recovered from the hideout.

"As I said before, as a position of principle, we strongly condemn any act of terrorism and this is what we did" on the "heinous terrorist attack" that took place in Pahalgam in which innocent civilians died, Sekeris had said.

In the weeks following the Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir in which 26 civilians were killed, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar spoke with all Council members, with the exception of China and Pakistan. In his calls, Jaishankar underlined that "its perpetrators, backers and planners must be brought to justice." He also spoke with UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy, French Foreign Minister Jean-Noel Barrot and South Korean Foreign Minister

DHARAMSALA, May 5 (Agencies): Prabhsimran Singh was in his element as he smashed a 48-ball 91 to not only help Punjab Kings defeat Lucknow Super Giants by 37 runs but also surpass the 200run mark at the HPCA Stadium after 14 years in the IPL.

It was in 2011 when Punjab Kings (previously Kings XI) posted 232/2 against Royal Challengers Bangalore. It was a repeat of that performance by Punjab as Prabhsimran made full use of a lifeline, hitting seven sixes and six fours, to lead the hosts to 236/5. It is the second-highest IPL total at this ground. With this win, the Kings now jumped to the second spot with 15 points. Meanwhile, LSG suffered their third consecutive loss to stay in seventh place.

Playing his first match after two years, left-arm pacer Akash Singh tried his best to stop the Punjab Kings toporder. However, an expensive two-over spell by Mayank Yadav undid Akash's good work and helped the hosts to build a strong foundation.

While Yadav leaked 36 in two overs, Akash conceded 20 in

Injury blow for SRH as Smaran ruled out, Harsh **Dubey named replacement**

HYDERABAD, May 5 (Agencies): Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) have suffered another setback in their disappointing Indian Premier League (IPL) 2025 campaign, with 22-year-old Karnataka batter R Smaran ruled out due to injury. Smaran, who had replaced Australian spinner Adam Zampa in the squad earlier this season, will now be replaced by Harsh Dubey, according to ESPNcricinfo.

22 year old Dubey is a left-arm spinning allrounder from Vidarbha. He made headlines during the 2024-25 Ranji Trophy season by taking a record 69 wickets--breaking Ashutosh Aman's previous mark of 68 wickets in a single season. His impressive performance helped Vidarbha lift the Ranji title this year.

Dubey joins SRH at his base price of INR 30 lakh, but while he has shone in red-ball cricket, his performances in limited-overs formats have been modest so far. He has taken 21 wickets in 20 List A matches at an average of 34.66 and nine wickets in 16



T20 innings with an economy of 6.78. Still, his Ranji success has boosted his reputation ahead of this IPL stint.

been far from ideal. After reaching the IPL 2024 final, they have managed just three wins in ten matches this year and sit ninth on the table. Even if they win their remaining four matches, they can only reach 14 points, meaning their playoff hopes rely on other teams' slipping. To make things worse, their net run rate of -1.192 is the worst among all teams, including already-eliminated Chennai Super Kings (CSK) and Rajasthan Royals (RR).

Ahead of their match against Delhi Capitals (DC), Sunrisers Hyderabad head coach Daniel Vettori clarified

that there are no fitness concerns about an outof-form pacer Mohammed Shami and that the veteran is working hard SRH's season has in the nets to turn things around for himself.

Shami came to the IPL after a solid ICC Champions Trophy winning campaign for India, taking nine wickets in five matches at an average of 25.88 with a five-wicket haul to his name. Since his return after more than an year from an injury, Shami has managed 14 wickets in nine international games at an average of 27.64.

However, Shami's IPL numbers have been dissapointing, having taken just six scalps in nine matches at an average of 56.16, leaking runs at an economy rate of

Playoff favourites Mumbai Indians, Gujarat Titans face off in high-intensity IPL battle

MUMBAI, May 5 (Agencies): Gujarat Titans' on-song top three will face a stern test against Mumbai Indians' potent bowling attack when the two teams that are favourites to reach the Indian Premier League playoffs clash here on Tuesday.

With the best Net Run Rate among all teams, third-placed MI need two wins from remaining three matches to ensure a direct spot in the final four.

The five-time winners will play two of these games at home. where they have won four out of five matches.

GT, who are ranked fourth. have four matches left of which two will be at their home-ground in Ahmedabad where they too have won four out of five times.

The Shubman Gill-led side essentially needs two more wins to sail into the playoffs.

The top order troika of B Sai Sudharsan (504 runs), Jos Buttler (470) and skipper Gill (465) have dominated the tournament like no other, setting up many a wins for the Titans.

But the outcome of Tuesday's contest could be determined by how they perform against arguably the best bowling attack in the competition with Trent Boult (16 wickets), Hardik Pandya (13), Jasprit Bumrah (11) and Deepak Chahar (9) ensuring tough times for opposition bat-

Ever since MI began their winning streak, which has swelled to an impressive six matches on



the trot, they have not conceded a total in excess of 200 either at home or away even once. It is enough to ring alarm bells in the Titans' camp, whose winning formula has largely been based on piling up heavy totals batting first.

But MI will also be wary of Titans' impeccable record while chasing as they have won each of their three games batting second by heavy margins.

But while GT's top three have dominated the batting charts, the others naturally have not got much time in the middle barring Sherfane Rutherford (201 runs), which means MI's bowlers would look to strike hard and early in order to gain the upper-hand.

Only three seasons ago, Hardik led the Titans to a title win in their maiden appearance but this year, he is at the helm of Mumbai Indians' robust revival after early blips which included a loss to GT in Ahmedabad.

Perhaps no other all-rounder in the tournament has floated through his roles and performed as admirably as Pandya (157 runs, 13 wickets), providing MI with a lot of spunk.

Rohit Sharma's (293 runs) readiness to switch gears in the middle to build long innings and Suryakumar Yadav (475) getting into his elements are indeed the greatest worrying signs for MI's opponent.

Ryan Rickelton (334) has banished a slow start for impressive scores of late while taking pressure off Rohit to attack first up.

Will Jacks is also getting into his rhythm as an all-rounder while Tilak Varma (239) and Naman Dhir (155) provide solidity to that batting line-up.

To their credit, Gujarat Titans' bowlers have also done a splendid job in the absence of Kagiso Rabada, who has linked back after admitting that he served

Dr Jitendra calls for AI led innovations, deep-tech StartUps

NEW DELHI, May 5: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science and Technology; Earth Sciences and Minister of State for PMO, Department of Atomic Energy, Department of Space, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Dr. Jitendra Singh on Monday chaired a comprehensive review of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), calling for bold new directions in science-driven growth, including Al-led innovations, deep tech StartUps and enhanced infrastructure sharing.

The meeting saw the Minister focus particularly on the evolving role of the newly constituted Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), as well as ongoing national missions like the Geospatial initiative.

Dr. Jitendra Singh held detailed discussions with Prof. Abhay Karandikar, ANRF's newly appointed CEO, Dr. Shivkumar Kalyanaraman and other senior officials of the Ministry. During the meeting, Dr. Kalyanaraman presented an ambitious vision for the ANRF, promising catalytic funding mechanisms, deep integration with private industry, and strategic missions modeled on globally successful institutions such as the National



Science Foundation (NSF) and DARPA.

In a significant step aimed at boosting indigenous innovation, ANRF is preparing to launch a "Small Business Deep Tech Innovation" programme, which will empower startups and MSMEs to scale breakthrough technologies for real-world applications.

Recognising the need to better utilise existing national research infrastructure, the Minister reviewed ANRF's plan to create a "Cloud of Research and Innovation Infrastructure," a digital platform that would offer deep-tech startups and academic institutions access to underused scientific equipment and facilities across the country. This move is expected to democratise research capabilities, especially for smaller

players who often lack access to high-end lab tools.

Among the major scientific thrusts discussed, the ANRF's "Al-for-Science" initiative took centre stage. The programme aims to leverage artificial intelligence to accelerate discoveries in physics, chemistry, and biology by using machine learning to model complex scientific equations.

The Minister directed the ANRF leadership to kickstart a few select projects under this initiative and demonstrate tangible outcomes in the near term. He also encouraged the CEO to engage with university Vice Chancellors to raise awareness about the ANRF mission and opportunities for collaboration.

opportunities for collaboration. In another key direction, Dr. Jitendra Singh asked the ANRF to explore the possibility of helping medical colleges establish their own medical research parks — a move that could boost clinical innovation and local biotech entrepreneurship. The Minister further underscored the importance of building an indigenous "India Al Open Stack" — a foundational Al architecture embedded with science and engineering models tailored for Indian researchers. This, he noted, could position India as a global frontrunner in Al-driven scientific applications.

Dr. Jitendra Singh also revisited the concept of "deep science-to-deep tech acceleration," urging the ANRF to focus on converting academic research — such as publications and patents — into commercial technologies. He emphasized the need for partnerships with toptier industry players and the creation of venture-builder models to ensure that discoveries don't remain confined to laboratories.

The Minister concluded by asking the ANRF to prioritise key areas of national relevance, including climate forecasting, material science, aerospace, biochemistry, and drug development. He stressed that the time has come for India to move from isolated innovation to a more integrated, impact-driven ecosystem that links research, startups, and industry.

JAMMU, May 5: The Non-Gazetted Police Pensioners Welfare Forum today held a protest at Hari Singh Park, Jammu under the chairmanship of Ajit Singh, voicing strong concerns over discrimination in pay anomaly and benefits faced by retired personnel of the J&K Police and J&K Fire Services.

Addressing the gathering, Ajit Singh outlined key demands on behalf of the forum, urging the Jammu & Kashmir UT Government to resolve long-standing grievances.

The forum criticized that the effect of the order was applied prospectively (from the date of issuance), instead of retrospectively from 1996 when the 5th Pay Commission was imple-

mented across the state.
"Our department was

unjustly left out; many affected pensioners have passed away waiting for justice. The surviving members deserve the rightful arrears," Singh emphasized.

Currently, only retirees post-2019 receive the ECH (Extended Contributory Health) Card benefits. The forum demanded that all retirees, irrespective of their date of retirement, should be extended this health facility.

Singh highlighted the plight of retired officers/ officials who are summoned for court appearances as witnesses or accused in cases but receive no travel allowance (TA) or financial support despite relying solely on their pension.

The forum demanded Higher wages for SPOs

(Special Police Officers) in line with Punjab Police SPOs, Provision of uniforms, mess facilities, and regularization policies for SPOs, Parity for Village Defence Committee (VDC) paid members with SPOs, including entitlement to risk allowance, medical benefits, and ration money at par with Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs).

Singh further informed that the Tribunal Court has already passed orders in their favor, and the forum now awaits prompt implementation of the verdict.

ZEO Ghat defies orders from DSE Jammu, CEO Doda Top News Report

DODA, May 5: In a glaring example of administrative non-compliance, the Zonal Education Officer (ZEO) Ghat, Doda district (J&K), has reportedly defied direct orders from the Director School Education Jammu (DSEJ) and Chief Education Officer (CEO) Doda, raising serious concerns about governance and accountability in the education sector.

An inquiry report by a three-member committee headed by the Joint Director School Education Doda—constituted under Order No. 693-DSEJ of 2023, dated 03-01-2023—has exposed a fraudulent appointment scam involving 18 Rehbar-e-Taleem (ReT) teachers in Zone Ghat. The committee found that these individuals secured appointment orders without any sanctioned vacancies, advertisements, selection panels, or approvals from competent authorities.

The report, submitted to the Director School Education Jammu under No: JD/UR/U/29 dated 01-06-2024, named the following as beneficiaries of these alleged backdoor appointments Mohd Iqbal, Gh. Mohd, Shahid Iqbal, Perveena Begum, Saleema Begum, Mohd Ashraf, Waseem Raja, Mohd Irfan, Pinkey Devi, Farhat Raiz, Indira Devi, Mohan Lal, Hamidullah, Santosh Kumar, Deepak Kumar and Usha Devi

Following a thorough review, the Commissioner/Secretary of the School Education Department J&K and the Director School Education Jammu took serious note of the fraudulent appointments, issuing immediate termination orders for the 18 individuals under Order No: DSEJ/Legal/21366-67 dated 09-09-2024. Subsequently, the CEO Doda directed the ZEO Ghat, via communication No: CEO/D/Legal/2024/394 dated 13-09-2024, to implement these termination orders within three days. However, the ZEO Ghat failed to comply, allegedly under the influence of vested interests. Instead of acting, the office reportedly enabled the appointees to obtain a status quo order from the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) Jammu on 20-09-2024 (MA No: 921/2024, OA No: 1047/2024), effectively stalling the terminations. This inaction has been viewed as a deliberate subversion of official directives, collusion with fraudulent appointees, and a blatant misuse of office. According to reports, the fraudulent appointments have caused an estimated loss of over □65 lakh to the Union Territory exchequer through unauthorized salary disbursements

Outstanding Sportspersons of J&K appeal for immediate publication of Non-Gazetted Merit List, Appointment under SO 12, SO 412

JAMMU, May 5: The outstanding sportspersons of Jammu & Kashmir brought to the urgent attention of the Government the unprecedented delay in the publication of the non-gazetted merit list and subsequent appointment of candidates under SO 12 read with SO 412. Despite the finalization of non-gazetted recruitment rules

non-gazetted recruitment rules on October 4, 2024, officially published in the government gazette, the merit list for the non-gazetted cadre remains unpublished for nearly a year. This delay continues even though all recruitment formalities for the non-gazetted cadre have been completed, leaving 225 deserving sportspersons in limbo, they said in a press con-



ference.

"We are deeply concerned that the entire recruitment process has come to a standstill due to pending approval of recruitment rules for just 10 gazetted posts, while the fate of 225 non-gazetted positions, which require no further policy clarification, remains unjustly tied to it. Official sources confirm that files are being moved from table to table within the Civil Secretariat, leading to bureaucratic stagnation and prolonged

uncertainty for us athletes who have excelled at state, national, and international levels," they said.

It is disheartening that the provisional list of eligible players was published on July 19, 2024, and yet, almost a year later, no final list has been released nor appointments made. This unnecessary delay has severely impacted our lives and professional futures. Many of us have crossed the upper age limits or missed other opportunities

due to this prolonged wait, they added.

They submit that recruitment under SO 12 and SO 412 is not merely a job opportunity but a recognition of our hard work, dedication, and the pride we have brought to Jammu & Kashmir through our sporting achievements. The continuous postponement is a grave injustice, eroding our trust and morale.

They earnestly appeal to the Lieutenant Governor and the concerned authorities to immediately publish the final merit list of non-gazetted posts without linking it to pending gazetted recruitment rules and issue appointment orders to all eligible outstanding sportspersons under SO 12 and SO 412 without further delay.
