

Executed assigned tasks with precision during operation **Sindoor: IAF**

NEW DELHI, May 11 (Agencies): The Indian Air Force on Sunday said it has successfully executed its assigned tasks with precision and in line with national objectives during Operation Sindoor.

The operation was launched on early May 7 to destroy seven terror infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistanoccupied-Kashmir in retaliation to the Pahalgam terror attack. All subsequent retaliations to Pakistani offensives were carried out under Operation Sindoor.

In a statement, the Indian Air Force (IAF) said the operation was "still ongoing".

"Since the operations are still ongoing, a detailed briefing will be conducted in due course. The IAF urges all to refrain from speculation and dissemination of unverified information," it said.







Security at Scientific installations along Western Border stepped up: Jitendra Singh

JAMMU / NEW DELHI, May 11 (Agencies): In the wake of an armed conflict with Pakistan, the government has decided to step up security at scientific installations across the country, particularly along the western border, Science and Technology Minister Jitendra Singh said.

Singh reviewed the security preparedness at scientific and technical installations across the country on Saturday and issued directions for an upgrade, particularly in the border areas of Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Rajasthan and Gujarat.

The sites of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) in Srinagar and Leh and the Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine in Jammu will also get a security upgrade, the minister said in a post on X.

The minister asked each institution to develop and circulate standard operating procedures (SOPs) for an emergency response to ensure that both the staff and local authorities are well-prepared.

To avoid putting students and researchers, who may have returned to their home states, at disadvantage, Singh said all upcoming examinations and research proposal calls are to be postponed until further notice.

JAMMU / CHANDI-GARH, May 11 (Agencies): Punjab Police on Sunday said it has arrested two persons for their alleged involvement in espionage activities linked to a Pakistani official posted at the High Commission in Delhi.

Acting on credible intelligence, one suspect was arrested for leaking sensitive information to a Pakistan-based handler regarding Indian Army movements, said Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav. "Based on disclosures have been recovered, and an FIR has been registered, said the DGP.

"This operation marks a significant step in dismantling cross-border espionage networks and reinforces our commitment to national security," said Yadav.

He added that further investigation will be undertaken as per established protocol, focusing on tracing the financial trail and identifying additional operatives and linkages within the network.

SIA raids 20 locations across South **Kashmir; busts sleeper cell modules**

SRINAGAR, May 11 (Agencies): the State Investigation Agency (SIA), Kashmir has on Sunday busted sleeper cell modules after raiding over twenty locations across the districts of South Kashmir.

During the raids, substantial incriminating materials have been seized, and the suspects have been rounded up for further questioning, official sources told the Greater Kashmir.

An official said, "Technical intelligence indicated that a host of sleeper cells in Kashmir were in direct contact with their handlers based in Pakistan and were involved in conveying sensitive and strategic information about security forces and vital installations via messaging apps including but not limited to WhatsApp, Telegram, Signal and so on."

PROTECTING PLANTS FOR FUTURE

lants are essential for life on Earth. They produce oxygen, absorb carbon dioxide, and form the base of most food chains. Humans depend on plants for food, clothing, shelter, medicine, and countless other resources. Plants also maintain ecological balance by supporting biodiversity, regulating the water cycle, preventing soil erosion, and stabilizing the climate. Despite their immense importance, plants are facing numerous threats due to human activities. Protecting them is not only about preserving nature, but also about securing the future of humanity.

One of the major threats to plants is habitat destruction. Forests and grasslands are being cleared at alarming rates for agriculture, urban development, and infrastructure projects. This destruction leads to the loss of countless plant species, many of which are not even scientifically documented. Deforestation also contributes to climate change, which further threatens plant survival by altering temperature and rainfall patterns. Climate change can push plant species out of their native habitats, affecting their ability to grow, reproduce, and survive.

Pollution is another serious issue. Air pollution, soil contamination, and water pollution weaken plant health and reduce their ability to reproduce. Invasive species, often introduced by humans, can outcompete native plants and disrupt local ecosystems. Overharvesting of plants for medicinal, ornamental, and commercial use can also drive some species toward extinction, especially when collection is done without sustainable methods. Urbanization adds further stress by consuming natural areas and replacing them with buildings and roads.

To protect plants, several strategies need to be implemented. First, conserving natural habitats is essential. This includes creating and maintaining protected areas such as national parks, wildlife sanctuaries, and conservation reserves. These areas allow native plants to thrive in their natural environments, undisturbed by human activity. Botanical gardens and seed banks also play an important role in preserving endangered plant species outside their natural habitats. These ex-situ conservation methods act as a backup in case species go extinct in the wild.

Sustainable agriculture and forestry practices can greatly reduce damage to plant life. By minimizing chemical use, rotating crops, and planting trees responsibly, we can protect both cultivated and wild plants. Laws and international agreements such as the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and CITES regulate the trade and use of endangered plant species. These legal frameworks must be enforced effectively to prevent illegal exploitation. Raising public awareness and educating people about the importance of plants is equally important. When communities understand the value of local plants, they are more likely to protect and conserve them. Community-driven efforts such as reforestation programs, local seed saving, and home gardening can have a significant positive impact. Scientific research and monitoring are also crucial. By studying plant behavior, genetics, and environmental responses, scientists can develop better strategies to conserve plant biodiversity. Modern technology offers valuable tools for plant conservation. Geographic Information Systems (GIS), satellite imaging, and remote sensing help track changes in plant habitats and detect threats early. Biotechnology, including tissue culture and genetic modification, can be used to propagate endangered plants and improve their resistance to diseases and changing climates. Digital databases and herbariums help share information globally, allowing better coordination among researchers and conservationists. Ultimately, protecting plants is a shared responsibility. Governments, organizations, industries, and individuals must work together. Everyone can contribute—by planting native trees, avoiding the use of harmful chemicals, supporting conservation projects, and reducing their ecological footprint. Global cooperation is also necessary, especially in tackling climate change, which is a major driver of plant extinction. Plants are fundamental to life on Earth. Their protection must be a priority if we are to preserve biodiversity, fight climate change, and ensure sustainable development. Pakistan's Propaganda War This is not just misinformation -it is a calculated ,coordinated campaign designed to distort reality, mislead the public, and manipulate perceptions across the region. There are many instances of false information by Pakistan. One of the most prominent examples is a viral image falsely claiming that the Pakistani Army had shot down an Indian Rafale jet near Bahawalpur. The image, however, was debunked by PIB fact check, which confirmed that it was actually from a MIG -21 crash in Moga ,Punjab ,in 2021 entirely unrelated to current events. Another brazen piece of misinformation surfaced in the form of a video falsely claiming that the Indian Army raised a white flag and surrendered at Chora Post. This fabricate narrative was amplified by Pakistan's Minister Attaullah Tarar ,who publicly endorsed the claim without a shred of evidence. By lending official weight to an unverified and clearly false story, Mr Tara not only misled his own citizens but also actively contributed to the propaganda campaign. In another misleading post, a video was circulated with the claim that the Pakistani Air Force targeted the Srinagar airbase .In reality, this footage was traced back to sectarian clashes in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa ,Pakistan that occurred in early 2024. The video has no connection to Kashmir or any recent air strike. After Pakistan's targeting of a Gurdwara in Poonch by a missile ,that country gave a false and wrong information that it was Indian air forces which targeted Gurdwara in their own territory which is a false information made with the bad intention of causing hurt in the Sikh community and also aimed to instigate Sikhs against India and its army. Not only this Pak is giving false and blatant misinformation that Indian forces have attacked Golden temple in Amritsar which is totally wrong and the Indian Sikhs know it well that Indian defense forces cannot do such a sacrilegious

act and thus Pakistan failed in their nefarious designs. How come it that Indian air force will target its own Gurdawara. The Indian Air Force -IAF on May 10 struck eight military sites in Pakistan ,including radar units and ammunition dumps, with air –launched precision weapons , in response to Pakistan's brazen attacks on civilian and military in India. Increasing Health Hazards from Contaminated Rivers

here will be no exaggeration if the present era is called the era of environmental crisis. Growth, urbanization, industrialization and the pressure of growing population has put the burden on natural resources, the result has been clearly visible before us today. The crisis of water resources is also a defiant form of these problems. India's culture and civilization evolved along the rivers, but today he is battling to save the existence of rivers. Canada researchers have exposed a worrying situation in terms of India's rivers in a recent study published. As per the study, almost eighty percent of the rivers of India are facing severe environmental and health crisis due to pollution. This research tested the presence of 72's 877 river sites 21 general antibiotic and found that the situation is extremely frightening in countries like India, Pakistan, Nigeria, Ethiopia and Vietnam. Antibiotic pollution means-Uncontrolled, irregular, and unnecessarily emitted in the environment of portions of medicines used in human, veterinary, or agriculture. When these fractions enter water, soil or air, these also affect aquatic and overall ecosystem, not just terrestrial life. Highly levels of many drugs have been found especially in India. The presence of 'Cefixime' among these has been found to be widespread in Indian rivers. These facts themselves have confirmed this. According to the findings of the current study that there are serious errors in the use and disposal of antibiotics, about 31.5 crore people in India are residing in areas where hydrosources are affected by antibiotic residues. This fact is extremely serious as contaminated water poses a direct threat to human health. The concentrations of antibi-

otics in rivers water in major metros like Delhi, Lakhan, Goa and Chennai have been found to be two to five times the safe limit set by the World Health Organization. In this context it is necessary to understand that the antibiotic residue present in water is directly affecting not only human life, but also aquatic animals, microorganisms, and the entire food chain. Antibiotic in the environment are diverse sources of potic pollution. | Major drug industries include waste water generated, which is flowed into water sources without being treated. Many pharmaceutical manufacturing units in India combine waste water into rivers, violating environmental standards. In addition, excessive and uncontrolled use of antibiotics in human and veterinary medicine is also a major cause for this crisis. It is often seen that medicines are bought only without consulting a physician and the tendency of self-medicals has become common. This not only increases the unnecessary intake of drugs, but their remains also contaminate water sources by exiting the body.

Antibiotics are also highly used to increase growth rates and protect against diseases in animal husbandry and agriculture sector. As a result, soil and water are polluted. The ill-effects of antibiotic pollution are extremely widespread. When water sources have an excess of antibiotic residue, it has an adverse effect on microbiological communities. Microorganisms have an important role in maintaining balance in the aquatic ecosystem. The imbalance of these can affect the entire ecosystem. species of aquatic organisms, special tax fishes prawns etc., are extremely sensitive to antibiotic pollution. This has a negative impact on their biodiversity, which also affects the food chain in the long-term. Its

side effects are extremely severe even on human health. Continuous exposure to antibiotic residue increases the risk of waterborne diseases. Intake of contaminated water or through irrigated crops can penetrate the antibiotic into the human body, causing intestinal infections, allergies, immune system debility, liver and kidney problems. The most severe effect comes out as antibiotic resistance. When bacteria remain in contact with sustained antibiotics, they become resistant against them, making it harder to treat normal infections. Currently the World Health Organization has declared antibiotic resistance to one of the global health crises. About twenty-eight thousand newborns died annually in India due to this. underscores the severity of this crisis. Agriculture was also having a direct impact on the crisis. Thus antibiotic pollution has also become an economic and social problem, not just environmental problem, which is resolved urgently. The Government of India has made some efforts in this direction. Programs such as Ganga Rejuvenation Scheme, Namami Gange Abhiyan, Jal Jeevan Mission have also issued guidelines asking water resources for quality sutures, are being run to improve the quality of resources. The Central Pollution Control Board has set up some of the pharmaceutical industries under which the installation of waste water treatment plants has been made necessary. Additionally, industrial units are being monitored by the National Green Tribunal. But the success of these efforts is limited. The lacility in compliance with the laxity of surveillance systems and environmental regulations can be clearly observed. The solution to this crisis demands a multilateral, coordinated, and long-term outlook. First of all, it is imperative to make pharmaceutical manufacturing

industries responsive. Comprehensive public awareness campaigns must be carried out to avoid unnecessary use of antibiotics. Through schools, colleges, health centres and village gatherings, people should be told how abuse of antibiotics leads to long-term crises. Also, the drug selling mechanism will also have to be controlled to curb the trend of self-therapy. Animal husbandry and agriculture sector also need to create clear guidelines for antibiotic use and ensure their rigorous compliance. It is our collective responsibility to provide pure water, safe food and healthy environment to future generations. If the decisive steps were not taken today, tomorrow this crisis will raise a question mark on the existence of our civilization. Rivers are not just water sources, but also our cultural heritage, economic lifeline and axis of ecology balance. Conservation of these is similar to protection of humanity. So by not assuming antibiotic pollution to be just a health problem or an environmental problem, it should be accepted by a wide life crisis I accept and the whole society should play an active role in this direction. Only then will we be able to realise the imagination of the India where rivers will flow clean, life will be safe and growth will be continuous and inclusive.

S.O.S. Int'I defers PoK March, condemns India's Ceasefire with Pakistan as a missed opportunity for National Security



JAMMU, May 11: S.O.S. International, a prominent organization advocating for the rights of refugees displaced from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoK), convened an urgent meeting of its office bearers and district heads on Sunday at Jammu, focused on the organization's response to the India-Pakistan ceasefire and the ongoing struggle for the liberation of PoK.

On May 6, 2025, S.O.S. International, led by Chairman Rajiv Chuni, announced a peaceful march from Jammu to PoK to demand reclamation of ancestral lands from Pakistan's illegal occupation. Mr. Chuni highlighted Pakistan's use of PoK as a terrorist hub, enabling cross-border attacks that have killed countless Indians.

"PoK is not just a territory; it is our homeland," he asserted. The announcement galvanized PoK refugees and supporters who saw this as a matter of justice and sovereignty. However, military tensions between India and Pakistan forced a halt to the plan.

After India's targeted military strikes on terrorist camps in Pakistan and PoK, war erupted between the nations, compelling S.O.S. Inter-



national to postpone the march for safety. "Our intention was to assert our rights peacefully, but the outbreak of war necessitated a temporary pause," said Chuni. On May 10, 2025, India and Pakistan agreed to a ceasefire, halting hostilities. Though the ceasefire ended active conflict, it was met with outrage from PoK refugees and S.O.S. International, who saw it as a premature compromise that ignored the core issues of occupation and terrorism. At the Rehari Colony meeting, Chuni expressed deep disappointment over the ceasefire, stating it was accepted without achieving the liberation of PoK or dismantling

Pakistan's terror infra-

structure. a historic opportunity to reclaim PoK and eradicate the terror ecosystem that threatens our security. The government has prioritized short-term political interests over long-term national welfare and justice for PoK refugees," he said. Chuni guestioned the rationale behind the ceasefire, highlighting that Pakistan's occupation and terror support remain untouched. "Why did our government stop short of smashing the terror camps and reclaiming our land?" he asked. "This decision

central leadership had "This war presented vowed to sacrifice their lives for PoK, and now, after 78 years, a genuine opportunity had emerged to retrieve it but all in vain

"The leadership has always said Kashmir is our internal issue-then why has India allowed US interference this time? Most of the people killed in cross-border firing in Poonch were refugees from PoK. That means we are just living to die. This is clearly not acceptable to us," he stated.

S.O.S. International stressed that the ceasefire impacts all of India, not just PoK refugees. Allowing Pakistan to retain control of PoK and its terror infrastructure, they argued, undermines national security

and betrays the sacrifices of the armed forces. "The nation has united around 'PoK is ours' and 'zero tolerance for terrorism.' This ceasefire, without tangible gains, weakens those resolves," said Chuni.

He also warned against political motivations behind the ceasefire, cautioning that while such gains may be temporary, the consequences of missing this chance to secure PoK and eliminate terrorism will be long-lasting. Chuni urged the Gov-

ernment of India to reconsider its stance in future talks with Pakistan, saying, "We will not rest until PoK is reunited with India and the scourge of terrorism is eradicated."

He also appealed to the people of India to stand in solidarity with PoK refugees and support their struggle. "This is not just our fight; it is a fight for the soul of our nation. PoK belongs to India, and we must ensure that no compromise undermines our sovereignty or security," Chuni said.

Centre approves final survey for new railway line bringing Sikkim closer to national network

NEW DELHI, May 11 (Agencies): In a landmark move that brings Sikkim one step closer to realising its long-cherished dream of rail connectivity, the Ministry of Railways has approved the Final Location Survey (FLS) for a new railway line from Melli to Dentam via Jorethang and Legship.

The ambitious project, set to be executed by the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR), has been allocated a sanctioned budget of around Rs 2.25 crore. Sharing the update with this the TNIE, ED (I&P) at Railway Ministry, Dileep Kumar on Sunday said, "This move marks a major step forward in expanding rail connectivity to the southern and western regions of Sikkim".

Highlighting the strategic

significance of what would be Sikkim's second railway line, Kumar added that the rail route is designed to bridge a crucial infrastructure gap linking remote areas such as Dentam, located near the Indo-Nepal border at Chiwabhanjyang, with the national railway network.

Kumar further said that Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw has personally directed the initiation of the survey and expedited the process to bring this long-pending demand closer to reality. The push for this line has been a consistent effort by Sikkim's Lok Sabha MP Indra Hang Subba, and the Modi government's approval of the survey has added a pace forward on this project.

The initial feasibility studies

estimate the new line will cover an estimated 75 km rail route. "This project is envisioned as a strategic extension of the underconstruction Sivok-Rangpo railway line, which is expected to be operational tentative by 2027," said Kumar.

He also added that Melli, a vital entry point into southern and western Sikkim, is expected to become a key junction for this new extension ensuring better integration of the region with the national transport grid.

"The FLS (Final Location Survey) will provide detailed technical and feasibility insights necessary to guide the final alignment, engineering design and cost estimation for the project," said Kapinjal Kishore Sharma, chief spokesperson of NFR under which jurisdiction areas of proposed new rail line fall in Sikkim.

Underlining the economic implications, Sharma further said, "This new connectivity project is expected to act as a catalyst for economic growth in the region, especially in Gyalshing and surrounding areas, by enhancing access, promoting tourism, boosting trade, and creating employment opportunities". Once completed, the new rail line is projected to significantly improve mobility for people and goods, offering a transformative lifeline for communities in West Sikkim.

"Work tenders related to the execution of the survey are expected to be floated shortly," Sharma said.

MOSCOW, May 11 (Agencies): Russian President Vladimir Putin proposed restarting direct talks with Ukraine in Istanbul on May 15 "without preconditions". Speaking to reporters in the Kremlin in the early hours of Sunday, Putin proposed to "restart" the peace talks Russia and Ukraine held in 2022.

His remarks came after leaders from four major European countries threatened to ratchet up pressure on Putin if he did not accept an unconditional 30-day ceasefire in Ukraine that they offered on Satureral three-day ceasefire, declared for the 80th anniversary of victory over Nazi Germany expires on Saturday, and Ukraine says Russian forces have repeatedly violated it. In March, the United States proposed an immediate, limited 30-day truce, which Ukraine accepted, but the Kremlin has held out for terms more to its liking.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, speaking to reporters alongside the European leaders in Kyiv, called their meeting "a very important signal".

In a joint statement, as published on Zelenskyy's official website, the five leaders called for a ceasefire "lasting at least 30 days" from Monday, to make room for a diplomatic push to end the war.

Smriti Mandhana hits 11th ODI hundred in Tri series final vs Sri Lanka



COLOMBO, May 11 (Agencies): Star India batter Smriti Mandhana brought up her 11th ODI century against Sri Lanka in the Tri series final on Sunday, May 11 at R.Premadasa Stadium, Colombo. Mandhana played a scintillating innings of 116 (101) with the help of 15 fours and two sixes. The southpaw also climbed to the third spot in the list of most centuries in Women's ODIs surpassing England's Tammy Beaumont, who has ten centuries to her name.

Only Meg Lanning (15 centuries) and Suzie Bates (13 centuries) are now ahead of Mandhana in the list. The opening batter began her innings cautiously after India captain Harmanpreet Kaur won the toss and opted to bat first. She got off the mark on her fourth delivery and scored his first boundary two balls later with a flick off his pads.

Mandhana cleverly mixed caution with aggression as she unleashed her release shots time to time to unsettle Sri Lankan bowlers. She stitched a 70-run stand for the first wicket with Pratika Rawal off 89 deliveries as the duo began taking taking more risks after a cautious start.

After losing Rawal for 30 (49), Mandhana turned aggressor to not let the pressure mount on Harleen Deol. She brought her up second successive half century off 55 balls and took India's score past 100 in the 22nd over. After the 24th over, Mandhana guickly shifted gears and began a barrage of boundaries taking on Piumi Badalge and Dewmi Vihanga. The intent rubbed on to Deol as well as India reached the 150-mark in 29 overs


Batting on 88* (89) in the 30th over, Mandhana took on Sri Lanka captain Chamari Athapaththu and hit her for four successive fours. As a result, she brought up her hundred off 92 balls and brought India into a commanding position.

Mandhana was finally dismissed for 116 while searching for a third consecutive boundary against Dewmi Vihanga but holed out at point. Her dismissal also brought an end to a massive 120run stand off 106 balls for the second wicket with Harleen Deol (47 off 56).

Triple century maker Bob Cowper has died at age 84: Cricket Australia

MELBOURNE, May 11 (Agencies): Bob Cowper, who scored test cricket's first triple century on Australian soil, has died at the age of 84 due to an undisclosed illness, Cricket Australia said Sunday. Cowper played 27 test matches for Australia between 1964 and 1968, with a record of 2,061 runs at an average of 46.84, including five centuries, while also taking 36 wickets with his part-time offspin.

The left-hander was renowned for both his stroke-play and steadiness, particularly during his most famous innings — a 12-hour, 589-ball 307 against England at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in February

UAE becomes first team in history of cricket to retire out all 10 batters during T20I game

NEW DELHI, May 11 (Agencies): The United Arab Emirates women's team registered a unique record as they became the first team in international cricket to retire out all 10 batters during a T20I game, as reported by Olympics.com

Playing against Qatar in the ICC Women's T20 World Cup Asia Region Qualifier 2025 at the Terdthai Cricket Ground in Bangkok, UAE, posted 192 without loss in just 16 overs before voluntarily ending their innings in a highly unusual yet tactical move.

Since declarations are not permitted in limited-overs cricket, the batters ran onto the field one by one and declared themselves retired out - a first in the sport's international history. Under overcast skies and with rain threatening to disrupt play, the UAE management made a



calculated decision to accelerate the match.

At the end of the 16th over, with a commanding total already on the board, head coach and former international all-rounder Ahmed Raza opted to end the innings.

Believing the 192-run opening stand was more than sufficient,

the team retired all 10 batters to expedite the game and give themselves a better chance of securing a result before any weather interruptions.

Openers Esha Oza and Theertha Satish led the innings with a dominant 192-run stand. Oza smashed 113 off 55 balls, including 14 fours and five sixes,

while Satish contributed 74 off 42 deliveries.

With no wickets lost and four overs remaining, the UAE lineup chose to withdraw from the crease, forcing the remaining eight players - none of whom faced a ball - to also retire out. In response, Qatar collapsed for 29 runs in 11.1 overs. Only three batters managed to score, with Rizpha Bano Emmanuel accounting for nearly all of Qatar's runs with a knock of 20 from 29 balls.

The UAE vs Qatar cricket match saw a record 15 ducks. the most in a women's T20 International history.

Nikhat may headline key meet in Hyderabad next month



CHENNAI, May 11 (Agencies): Though there have been a few noteworthy events - domestic and international - here and there, the sport of boxing in the country has largely been subdued so far this season. With some key competitions including the World Championships on the horizon, that could change. Even star boxer Nikhat Zareen could possibly return to competitive action soon. The World Boxingled Interim Committee is looking to organise the Elite Women Boxing Tournament in Hyderabad next month. The committee has requested the Telangana Boxing Federation (TBF) to conduct the tournament. If things go as per committee's proposal, the event could witness some elite boxers fighting for a spot in the national camp.

"The tournament will feature participation from the Top 12 ranked State/Board teams of 8th Elite Women Nationals, 1 SAI NCOE Combined Team, and the Host team, making it a highly competitive and significant tournament in the national boxing calendar. This

tournament serves as a separate pathway to provide opportunities for boxers to enter in national coaching camp," the Interim Committee, in a letter addressed to TBF, said. A copy of this letter (dated May 8) is with The New Indian Express.

However, the event comes with an asterisk. Given the ongoing cloud surrounding the sport due to delay in conduct of elections and subsequent recognition issue with the sports ministry, it remains to be seen if the event will go smoothly as per plan. The TBF has to respond within mid-June. As per the letter, the event is scheduled to be conducted from June 23 to June 27. If things fall in place, this upcoming event is quite significant ahead of some key international events, including the World Championships that is scheduled to be held in England in September. Going by the selection policy in place, even Lovlina Borgohain could take part in the Telangana meet. However, that is far from certain due to the current climate in the BFI. Due to division within the governing body of the sport in the country, several top boxers including Lovlina had missed the women's national championship in Greater Noida earlier this year in March. That had meant Lovlina, who participated in the National Games 2025, and several other elite boxers had missed out on a pathway to representing India in international events. The boxers, who finished in the top-four at Greater Noida, are currently part of the national camp in Patiala.

According to the BFI Selection Policy 2025-26, the national championship is the main pathway for the boxers aspiring to be part of the national camp. Having missed that boat, now it's a chance for Lovlina and other boxers to earn that spot as the gold and the silver medallist from the Telangana meet will be given the right to join the already-selected bunch in the national camp. Preeti Pawar, who was part of the Paris Games, is another name that could feature.

"This upcoming event is a chance for all the boxers who have missed out so far including the youth boxers. It's a second chance for those talented boxers who might have faced a gold medallist early on and gotten knocked out. We want to have a big bench strength going into the 2028 Olympics," a federation source told this daily.

"They (big names) should ideally be taking part. Nikhat is also well aware of this," the source added.

Nikhat, competed in the 50kg category in the 2024 Paris Olympics, had also skipped the aforementioned national event and is now expected to be the star attraction at her home state. With the update in women's categories for the Los Angeles Olympics, Nikhat will now be trading blows in the 51kg category. She departed for Uzbekistan for a training camp on Friday night. Before this, Nikhat had kept herself active by training at the Army Sports Institute in Pune.

According to the selection policy, the top-ranked boxer will be part of the Asian Boxing Championship while the No 2-ranked boxers are expected to take part in the World Boxing Cup, which is scheduled to be held in India in mid-November.
