14-year-old girl rescued from child marriage in **Udhampur**

JAMMU, May 16 (Agencies): Police and the district task force on Thursday rescued a 14-year-old girl who was forced into child marriage in Jammu and Kashmir's Udhampur district, officials said.

The rescue operation was carried out at Pattangarh Latti in Udhampur district following a tip-off received at the the child helpline, they said. Despite prior advisories issued by Udhampur Police, the marriage was reportedly solemnised on May 5.

Acting on a recommendation by the Child Welfare Committee, the girl has been declared a "child in need of care and protection".

The girl has been shifted to a child care home for her safety and wellbeing, the officials said. An FIR will be registered under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, against all the individuals involved

in facilitating the illegal

marriage, police said.

Mehbooba warns against 'weaponizing water' after **Omar backs Tulbul Project**

SRINAGAR, May 16 (Agencies): Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister and PDP President Mehbooba Mufti on Friday strongly criticized J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah for advocating the revival of the Tulbul Navigation Project amid ongoing India-Pakistan tensions.

"At a time when

both nations have just stepped back from the brink of war-with Jammu and Kashmir once again paying the highest price through loss of innocent lives, destruction, and suffering—such provocative statements are deeply irresponsible," she said. Mehbooba empha-

sized that the people of J&K deserve peace and stability, not political moves that risk further conflict. "Weaponizing water-a source of lifeis not only inhumane, but it also threatens to internationalize an issue that must remain strictly bilateral," she added.

Earlier, Omar Abdullah had shared an aerial view of the Wullar barrage and suggested that the project can be revived as the Indus Water Treaty had been

'temporarily suspended'. The project started in the early 1980s had to be abandoned under

India set to sharpen military edge with Rs 50,000 cr budget surge post 'Operation Sindoor'

NEW DELHI, May 16 (Agencies): India's Defence preparedness may receive a major financial push, with government sources indicating a likely Rs 50,000 crore increase in the nation's military budget following the successful execution of 'Operation Sindoor'.

A report in NDTV quoting government sources stated, the additional funds are expected to be allocated through a supplementary budget later this year, potentially pushing the total Defence outlay beyond the Rs 7 lakh crore mark for the first time.



The Union Budget for 2025-26, presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on February 1, had already earmarked a record Rs 6.81 lakh crore for Defence. This figure marked a sig

nificant 9.2 per cent rise from the previous year's Rs 6.22 lakh

If the additional allocation is approved, it will further underscore the government's strategic priority towards military modernisation and national security.

Sources revealed that the extra funds will be channelled into key areas such as research and development, procurement of advanced weaponry, replenishment of ammunition stocks, and acquisition of state-of-the-art military hardware.

The proposal is likely to be tabled for parliamentary approval during the Winter Session.

Ambulance driver braves shelling to save lives in Rajouri

ongoing shelling, Wani, accompanied by a codriver and a nursing assistant, rushed to the location and evacuated the injured officer, who unfortunately succumbed to his injuries at the hospital.

Omar Abdullah slams Mehbooba Mufti over tulbul navigation issue

SRINAGAR, May 16 (Agencies): A war of words broke out on Friday between Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and PDP president Mehbooba Mufti over the former's call to revive the Tulbul Navigation Barrage project on Wullar Lake in view of the suspension of the Indus Water Treaty (IWT).

While Mehbooba termed Abdullah's remarks as "irresponsible" and "dangerously provocative", the chief minister hit back saying she refuses to acknowledge that the IWT was a "historic betrayal" with the people of J-K because of her "blind lust" to score "cheap" publicity points, and please some people across the border.

In a post on X on Thursday, Abdullah had wondered if work can resume on the Tulbul Navigation Barrage project on Wullar Lake in view of the suspension of the IWT.

"The Wular lake in North Kashmir. The civil works you see in the video is the Tulbul Navigation Barrage. It was started in the early 1980s but had to be abandoned under pressure from Pakistan citing the Indus Water Treaty. Now that the IWT has been 'temporarily suspended' I wonder if we will be able to



resume the project," Abdullah posted on his personal X handle.

He said the Tulbul project, if completed, can help in using Jhelum for navigation purposes.

"It will give us the advantage of allowing us to use the Jhelum for navigation. It will also improve the power generation of downstream power projects, especially in winter." he added.

The Centre had last month put the Indus Water Treaty — under which India and Pakistan used to share water — in abeyance in the wake of the Pahalgam terror

However, the PDP chief Friday took a dig at the chief minister, saying his call to revive the proj

only irresponsible but also dangerously provocative. "Our people deserve peace

as much as anyone else in the country. Weaponising something as essential and life giving as water is not only inhumane but also risks internationalising what should remain a bilateral matter," the PDP president said.

Following the remarks, Abdullah hit back, saying the PDP president's refusal to acknowledge that the IWT was a "historic betrayal" with the people of J-K was due to her "blind lust" to score "cheap publicity points" and "please" some people sitting across the border.

"Actually what is unfortunate is that with your blind lust to try to score cheap publicity points & please some people sitting across the border, you refuse to acknowledge that the IWT has been one of the biggest historic betrayals of the interests of the people of J&K," he posted on X.

The J-K CM said he has always opposed the treaty and will continue to do so.

"Opposing a blatantly unfair treaty is in no way, shape, size or form warmongering, it's about correcting a historic injustice that denied the people of J&K the right to use our water for ourselves," he added.

SRINAGAR, May 16: The security forces on Friday said that the swift and coordinated response by several security agencies following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack led to elimination of six terrorists in the last over 48 hours in Shopian and Pulwama districts.

Inspector General of Police Kashmir, V K Birdi while addressing a press conference in Awantipora, said that after any terror strike, such operations are critical and the Pahalgam incident triggered an intensified combing and intelligence-led mission across south Kashmir.

"These operations were launched promptly and were based on credible inputs. Cooperation among security agencies and rapid



follow-up ensured that terrorists involved were swiftly tracked down and neutralised," he said.

General Officer Commanding (GOC) of the Army's Victor Force, Major General Dhananiav Joshi said that no matter where terrorists attempt to hide, whether in upper forested regions or in civilian residential areas, they will be tracked and eliminated.

He said that these two operations were different from each other and one in Keller area was in an upper area and it was very challenging given the difficult terrain, while in Tral it was in a residential area and operation was conducted after all civilians were safely

evacuated. "We will not allow terrorists to find safe havens in any part of the Valley. Our commitment is clear-we will go after them wherever they are hiding," he said.

He added that one of the 6 terrorists neutralised, namely Shahid Kuttay, was involved in two major attacks, including an attack on a German tourist.

Inspector General of CRPF, Mitesh also stressed that these operations would not be possible without the support and cooperation of the local population. He appealed to the public to continue their cooperation and help security forces with timely information.

"Public support is vital for the success of such anti-terror operations. Every piece of information matters. Our aim is not only to neutralise terrorism but also ensure that peace prevails permanently in the region," he said.

From Pulwama to Pahalgam India made to bleed

rom Pulwama tragedy to Pahalgam terror attack ,India was deeply wounded and made to bleed by Pakistan sponsored and supported terrorists. The modus operandi of Pakistan' states and its military policy of bleeding India by a thousand cuts has remained same from Pulwama to Pahalgam. Rightly Pulwama and Pahalgam terror attacks attracted widest condemnation and resolve to revenge the mayhem from its sponsors .In both the terror attacks ,India suffered gravely as in case of infamous Pulwama terror attack of February 14th ,2019 and the recent terror attack on innocent tourists on 22rd April 2025 after more than three year 's from Pulwama act and India responded decisively in both these terror attacks. Pulwama terror attack and the recent Pahalgam terror attack are very dastardly and despicable acts which hit our CRPF and unarmed and innocent tourists and the Pakistani involvement is crystal clear and Modi government and India's army has given a befitting replay and given a lesson to terrorists and their Pakistani sponsors. In Pulwama terror attack as well as Pahalgam carnage Pakistani terrorists have unleashed mayhem and killed our 40 CRPF Jawans and 25 innocent tourists respectively for no fault of theirs. People of India were shook by these dastardly and savage acts of terror which spilled blood of our CRPF men and unarmed and innocent tourists. Indians and its army has shown resilience and bravery and attacked the terrorist bases in POK and this time in Pakistan and POJK. Whole nation has grieved and were in anger and asked the government to take revenge and give justice to the martyred Jawans and martyred tourists. The 2019 Pulwama attack occurred on 14th February 2019, when a convoy of vehicles carrying Indian security personnel on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway was attacked by a vehicle -borne suicide bomber at Lethapora in the Pulwama district of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. The attack killed 40 CRPF personnel as well as the perpetrator -Adil Ahamd Dar who was a local terrorist from Pulwama. The responsibility of the attack

was claimed by the Pakistan -based Islamist terrorist group ,Jaish-e-Mohammed. Rightly India blamed neighboring Pakistan for the deadly attack. At that time the relations between the two countries of India and Pakistan nosedived and resulted into India Pakistan military standoff. Subsequently, Indian investigations identified 19 accused and by August 2021, the main accused along with six others have been killed and seven had been arrested. Indian military responded with what is called Balakot airstrike. On February 26, twelve Mirage 2000 jets of the Indian Air Force crossed the line of control and dropped bombs into Balakot ,Pakistan .India claimed that it attacked a Jeish-e-Mohammed training camp and killed a large number of terrorists reported to be between 300 and 350. Now after recent Pahalgam terror attack Indian defense forces carried "Operation Sindoor" and with missiles and drones attacked nine terrorist hideouts and camps in POJK and Pakistan killing over 100 terrorists including some dreaded terrorists. Thus India took the revenge of killing 25 innocent tourists in the world famous scenic spot Pahalgam and the dastardly attack was condemned by all irrespective of religion. All the political parties and people urged the government to take a stringent action against terrorism and bring the culprits of the Pahalgam attack to task by giving severest punishment to the inhuman savages who stooped so low and martyred our tourists with sadistic pleasure by identifying them on the basis of Religion. It is so savage that our sisters and mothers Sindoor was destroyed by killing their husbands before their wives and there cannot be more savage attack than this. Pahalgam terror attack was unparallel and unprecedented as it was perhaps the first time in the history of terrorist ravaged Kashmir, that tourists were killed after parading them on the basis of religion. India attacked the terrorist hideouts in POJK and Pakistan and that country instead of helping India in its fight against terrorism chose to strike our civilian localities in boarder areas and even in cities as well as our military installations and air bases. India defense forces responded to the Pakistani retaliation and destroyed its five air basis

and thus crippled the enemy. After three days of retaliations and counter responses Pakistan requested America to ask India for ceasefire. Accordingly Trump telephoned PM Modi and PM Pakistan Sarief and its military chief general Munir .After this development Pakistan DGMO contacted Indian DGMO and requested for a ceasefire. Pakistan foreign minister and Indian defense minister Rajnath Singh agreed on a ceasefire and the governments of India and Pakistan fixed the date of 10 May 2025 and 5pm as per Indian standard time as the time to implement ceasefire. India agreed on ceasefire on its own terms and made it crystal clear that any terrorist act in future in which Pakistani involvement is identified will be construed as an act of war and India will have the right to strike Pakistan and POJK. Hardly had the ink on the ceasefire agreement dried ,Pakistan again resorted to unprovoked missile and drone attacks at many places and military installations of India and to such acts, India responded with full force and might and strike so deep inside the territory of Pakistan and made her to lick the dust. Now from two ,three days there is completed ceasefire from both sides and Pakistan has not thereafter violated the ceasefire agreement. But Pakistan cannot be trusted and she cannot be taken at her face value. Thus Modi government has categorically stated that Indian government has only paused the strikes on Pakistan and she can resume it in future after observing the Pakistani attitude and her violation of the ceasefire agreement. Rest the IWT will continue to remain suspended and it implies that India and PM Modi is very tough on Pak terrorists and they can cross boarders if Pakistani forces will violate the sanctity of the ceasefire agreement in future and in that case India will be within its right to strike Pakistan. India has only paused its Operation Sindoor and has not ceased this operation fully. After violating ceasefire just within few hours on 10 May, she is now implementing it strictly and it seems that chief of Pak army general Munir is on his knees and it will be seen how will the India respond to any ceasefire violations by Pakistani army and how maximum punishment is accorded to Pak sponsored terrorists

and their Pakistani backers. Modi has unequivocally stated a number of times after the ceasefire that India reserves the right to respond to any retaliation and it will be the Pak army bases which will be targeted in case that country violates the current ceasefire. Pakistan has seen the might and power of the operation Sindoor and in future we will continue it to target the fountains of terrorism and the terrorist acts on our soil by the local terrorists and Pakistani handlers will also be dismantled and these terrorists will have to pay a heavy price for any act of terrorism. Whole world including Pakistan has seen the power of Sindoor and now it is hoped that sanity may prevail on Pakistan so that she will desist from sponsoring and exporting terror to India. India should also follow the policy of bleeding Pakistan with a thousand cuts and an eye for eye and tooth for toot should be applied in case Pakistan tries to violate ceasefire in future and therefore tit for tat should be our response to any misadventure by Pakistan and then and then only our interests and sovereignty is upheld and we cannot take any risk so far as Pakistani attitude is concerned. We have full faith in our defense forces as they have shown their strength in India-Pakistan standoff and war recently. Rest from Pulwama to Pahalgam ,it is our blood which has spilled and socked our land with blood of the innocents. Enough is enough, no more bloodbath in future and for this all of us should cooperate with the government and break the back of terrorism and for that if we have to cross the LOC and IB no problem should be there .India has the prowess and might that it can wipe out Pakistan from the map of the globe. So Pakistan should mend its behavior and desist from backing terrorism in India and that will be the litmus test for Pakistan's reformed attitude.

ecently, a forest harvesting spread over about four hundred acres in the Kancha Gachibowli area of Telangana drew the attention of the entire country to its attention and attention. The Supreme Court took suo moto cognizance of this sensitive issue. A bench of Justices BR Gavin and Justice Agustin George Christ made a sharp note in the matter asking the state government a number of stern questions and banned any kind of activity in the area until the next hearing. Those photographs also clarified that this work was being carried out at night. The location is the Hyderabad University Pass, where the Telangana government was planning a construction plan of a grand iti park, but the same area is also the natural habitat of many types of wildlife, including peacocks, deer and other protected species. A heartbroken video on social media came into the spotlight, with dark bulldozers moving and hearing fearful sounds of the morons around. It shocked the conscience of

the entire ecosystem is being brutally murdered. This forest was not merely a group of green trees but a shelter of thousands of organisms. The court said that cutting large numbers of trees is worse than killing a human being, so no mercy should be shown on those who harm the environment. The apex court had admitted to the rampage of the Central Empowered Committee (CEC) in that case, saying that 454 trees were cut in Dalmia Farm, Mathura-Vrindavan, which is a serious environmental crime. The committee had recommended a fine of Rs. one lakh per tree (total Rs. 4.54 crore) for this act. These observations of the Supreme Court of the country on the harvesting of trees illegally at large put forth the protection and environmental responsibilities of trees across the country. The Supreme Court initiative has expected that such destructive efforts will be held strongly and will curb the tendency to sacrifice nature in the name of development. The court has made a

clear message from these decisions of itself that the felling of trees should not be taken lightly. These court decisions are also messages for areas in the country where trees are being indiscriminately harvested. Pollution situation in Delhi has become critical due to the felling of trees.

Human life is dependent on trees only because from these we get oxygen. Oxygen present in the atmosphere is considered to be oxygen. According to environmental experts, we must plant so many trees around us so that at least for our family, we can fulfill oxygen ourselves. A person needs a considerable amount of oxygen throughout the day, that's why environmentalists say plantation tax is necessary to produce oxygen for ourselves otherwise just as we drink water by buying a water bottle today, our coming generation will be constrained to buy pure air bottles in the coming time. If there will be no oxygen in the atmosphere, life will end on the earth, so it is a great demand for time to emphasize more and more plantation." According to a rapt, a healthy tree leaves so much oxygen every day, giving six-seven people an oxygen, but in the absence of enough trees, the same tree now has to give oxygen to about 20 people. In fact, the amount of oxygen used to be in the atmosphere earlier has come down to ten percent in the absence of trees. As a result, the lungs have started causing infection problems with asthma and heart disease due to not getting enough oxygen. Large shady trees like neem, banyan and peepal, who are 50 years old or older, get up to 140 kg of oxygen daily. According to

environmental experts, trees of about

two hundred years old peepal, neem, banyan, etc. secrete enough oxygen daily. In such a situation, it is not hard to predict how heavy damage the environment is caused by cutting such a shady old tree. That is why such shady trees have been the ancient Indian tradition of planting in their surroundings. Neem, Banyan and Tulsi, etc., leave oxygen for more than 20 hours a day, while Peepal then secretes oxygen for more than 22 hours a day. Bamboo trees produce 30% more oxygen than any other tree. Depending on the price of oxygen found from a healthy tree, the tree costs several lakh rupees annually. Lack of clean air In people are trapped in the trap of diseases, their fertility is bearing. Functionality is also affecting cancer, heart disease, asthma, bronchitis, lung infection, pneumonia and number of paralysis patients are increasing rapidly. Large share of people's earnings costs only on treatment. Nonetheless, given the rapidly occurring climate change and the decaying state of pollution, it now needs to understand that the greatest contribution in the oxygen present in our atmosphere is that of tree-plants itself. So they have to be saved.

Anurag Kashyap slams Netflix, Prime Video content: They're worse than television

Filmmaker Anurag Kashyap, who believed that streaming platforms like Netflix and Amazon would bring creative freedom to Indian cinema, has now expressed disappointment with their current state. In a recent interview, Kashyap remarked that the content being produced is "worse than television" and shared insights into the kind of feedback he often receives.

Anurag Kashyap directly named streaming giants like Netflix and Prime Video and how they are primarily focused on subscriptions and profits, strictly following algorithm-driven decisions.

In an interview with agency, the director looked back on his collaborations with Netflix, the crime drama series 'Sacred Games' and 'Lust Stories'. He said, "When we did 'Sacred Games' and 'Lust Stories', when Netflix came in, we thought this was an opportunity. And it seemed like an opportunity; we created some very good work



with them. And then, slowly, roughly around the time of Covid, everything turned around again. Now what they're doing is worse than television. Now you go in there, and they want to dumb you down. At the end of the day, all these companies, whether it's Netflix or Amazon or Apple, they're coming to India because data is the new oil."

"Subscription is what they're looking for. With a 1.4 billion

population, they want to maximize their subscription. They want to reach out to everyone, they don't want to offend anyone. They don't want to create art or cinema, they're creating content. They're creating content to feed to everybody, the man on the street. And they're very happy that people are watching their shows on a cellphone," he added.

Anurag Kashyap previously

revealed that a third season of 'Sacred Games' was in the works but was scrapped by Netflix following the backlash faced by Prime Video's 'Tandav'. He was also working on an adaptation of the book Maximum City, a project close to his heart, which was unfortunately cancelled too, leaving him disappointed.

In the same interview, the director was also asked about the current state of the industry, to which he said, "The industry is very confused. If there was a dependency on the Khans still, then it would be working. They aren't doing anything original, and they don't know what to do right now. They're still figuring their path out, and when you hit rock bottom is when you start to evolve. Bollywood is in a downward phase, and it'll evolve."

On the work front, Kashyap's last directorial 'Kennedy' is awaiting an Indian release date, while he was recently seen as an actor in 'Rifle Club' and 'Viduthalai Part 2'.

AICWA, FWICE urge film industry to boycott Turkey, Azerbaijan over its pro-Pakistan stance; filmmakers weigh in

Indian film bodies have urged the industry to stop shoots in Turkey and Azerbaijan after both countries expressed solidarity with Pakistan during the recent Indo-Pak tensions.

The All Indian Cine Workers Association (AICWA) and the Federation of Western India Cine Employees (FWICE) have also issued press releases asking to boycott shooting in Turkey and also its artistes from working in India. The FWICE has further gone ahead and sent letters to the I&B Ministry and OTT giants in India, demanding the removal of Turkish shows.

Bollywood's tryst with Turkey

Several Indian films like Guru (2007), Race 2 (2013), Dil Dhadakne Do (2015), Tiger Zinda Hai (2017) were shot in Turkey, giving the country a boost in economy and tourism. A source reveals, "When an Indian film is shot in Turkey, even a schedule of 2-4 days costs somewhere around 5 crore to 6 crore. With big stars and huge production houses, the cost can go up to 30 crore to 40 crore. The cost largely depends on the location



they choose but this is a blanket amount."

Speaking about the call for a boycott, Suresh Shyamlal Gupta, President, AICWA tells us, "AICWA has only one demand that Indian films should not be shot in Turkey or Azerbaijaan. Secondly, anyone from Turkey or Azerbaijaan who is working in India, we should ban them and their visas should be cancelled. We will also write to India's Foreign Ministry regarding this

matter.' BN Tiwari, President, FWICE, says, "Our first principle is nation first. You are giving weapons which are harming people who are innocent. We cannot tolerate all this. Humne io letter likha hai wo puri film industry ko bheja hai and our plan is to write a letter to the government too that Turkish artistes jo yaha kaam karte hai unko turant bhagaya jaaye yaha se. If someone (from within the industry) supports them, we will boycott them and issue a non cooperation notice."

Meanwhile, filmmakers

too weighed in on the call for a ban. Director Anil Sharma, known for his blockbuster film Gadar, says that no amount of creative satisfaction is bigger than love for the country. "Yeh appeal nahi bhi ho toh bhi filmmakers ki responsibility hai to stand for India. Jo bharat ke saath hai, hum uske saath hai. Main ek script likh raha tha (son) Utkarsh ke saath and usme Turkey was a location but after this incident we decided we won't go. It is a very beautiful country and as a filmmaker it is worth shooting there but no creative satisfaction is bigger than India's interest and the love for our country."

Producer Tanuj Garg adds, "As Indian filmmakers, we are mindful not just of the creative and logistical aspects of shooting abroad, but also the larger sentiment at home. While countries like Turkey and Azerbaijan have much to offer, we believe that it's important to align our choices with the mood and sensitivities of our audience and nation. Until there's a more positive shift in sentiment and bilateral warmth, we will be cautious about pursuing shoots in these regions.

The Kashmir Files director Vivek Ranjan Agnihotri too agrees with this decision as he says, "I think it is a just decision and this is how everybody should behave in war. In modern times, war is not when the armies are marching inside each other's borders. War is also at various levels like info war, cyber war, narrative war. So, in that case obviously if we are calling Pakistan an enemy country, so anybody who is supporting them in traditional terms of combat, they are termed as enemy countries." Vivek adds, "I don't see why we should shoot in countries which are not even relevant. We are not going to lose anything. I think its the right decision. This (boycott) should be done by lots of voluntary organisations, travel agencies, and the people of India. Stand up for India, stand united. Wars are not won at only borders today, wars are won at the narrative playing field."

Filmmaker Onir says he has a "mixed point of view" and wonders why is there's a call for boycotting just Turkey and Azerbaijaan and not China? "I have mixed response because in any conflict there will be different sides. China has also been supplying arms. How come we are not banning everything with China? If you see Pakistani weaponry. doesn't the ban have to be uniform because it's from China and the US."

He adds, "At the same time I was extremely hurt as an Indian citizen that at the time of the war, Turkey was supplying arms to Pakistan. In this war, without any camouflage, China has been supporting Pakistan. So why only Turkey and Azerbaijaan are being banned? As a filmmaker or tourist I would not be comfortable going to a country that supports Pakistan directly during the time of conflict."

India contributing to climate action with the urgency it demands: Bhupender Yadav

NEW DELHI, May 16 (Agencies): India is deeply committed to contributing to climate action with the urgency it demands, despite its minimal role in the climate crisis, Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav said on Friday.

Addressing the first edition of 'Sagarmatha Sambaad', a global dialogue on climate change and its impact on mountainous regions, the minister said the global carbon budget is rapidly being depleted with developed nations continuing to disproportionately grab the meagre remaining share.

The global carbon budget is the amount of carbon dioxide that can be emitted into the atmosphere while keeping the rise in average global temperature since the industrial revolution below 1.5 degrees Celsius.

Yadav said the developed countries' commitments to providing climate finance, technology transfer and capacity building have been profoundly neglected, intensifying the climate crisis for which they bear far greater responsibility.

The dialogue, he added, is not just a forum for discussion but a call for collective concerted action.

"India, under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji, is deeply committed to contributing to climate action with the urgency it demands, despite our minimal role for the crisis it faces," Yadav said.

He said that India is walking the talk on climate action, integrating sustainability into the very fabric of its develop-



ment paradigm, guided by Mission LiFE, an initiative focusing on the sustainable and mindful use of resources.

The minister said the Himalayas bear a significant part of the burden of the environmental crisis

"We in India, with our significant Himalayan territory, witness these impacts firsthand. We share the concerns of the mountain states and their people. Our environmental futures are intrinsically linked," he said.

But, he stressed, these futures also depend on the collective action of all nations in mitigating greenhouse gas emissions, in line with the principles of equity and common but differentiated responsibilities and

respective capabilities. He said that South Asia has been responsible for only 4 per cent of global cumulative carbon dioxide emissions until 2020, despite being home to nearly 25 per cent of the global population.

The minister expressed hope that the dialogue

would pave the way for enhanced scientific cooperation on climate change in mountain regions, building climate resilience and ensuring adequate and predictable climate finance for mountain nations.

He said India is committed to working closely with Nepal and all Himalayan nations, as well as with other global partners, on the issue.

Yadav also mentioned that as part of the 'Ek Ped Maa ke Naam' campaign, 1.42 billion saplings have been planted in India, including 72.1 million trees in the Indian Himalayan Region.

The country also has a dedicated national mission focused on sustaining the Himalayan ecosystem, promoting climate-resilient agriculture and enhancing disaster preparedness.

SC dismiss PIL alleging circulation of deepfake videos of Col Sofiya Qureshi



NEW DELHI, May 16 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Friday refused to entertain a PIL alleging circulation of Al-generated deepfake videos of Colonel Sofiya Qureshi. The PIL sought setting up of a court-monitored expert panel for drafting a model law to deal with such online content.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh agreed with the petitioner-in-person Narendra Kumar Goswami that it was a "serious issue" but said that similar issues are being dealt with by the Delhi High Court by a bench headed by the chief justice.

"We are not saying that it was not a serious issue but the Delhi High

Court has been hearing this issue for a couple of years. If we entertain this petition, the high court will stop hearing the pending matter and all its hard work over the years will go in vain. It will be appropriate, if you approach the Delhi High Court," the bench said.

Goswami said he was disturbed with the circulation of deepfake videos of Qureshi, who was part of the team which gave briefing on Operation Sindoor.

He submitted that numerous fake videos of the Army officer were being circulated online.

The bench said that these cyber criminals are so faster than the regulating authorities that before the petitioner goes out of the courtroom, a new video will come up.

The top court asked the high court to accord audience to the petitioner and hear his suggestions on the issue.

"We do not deem it necessary to entertain this petition and initiate a parallel proceeding. The petitioner is relegated to Delhi High Court with liberty to seek his impleadment as intervenor and assist in the pending matter," the top court said while dismissing the PIL.

India enriched enormously by integration of Sikkim: Jairam Ramesh

NEW DELHI, May 16 (Agencies): On the 50th anniversary of Sikkim's statehood, Congress leader Jairam Ramesh on Friday said India has been enriched enormously by the integration of Sikkim and the state has a number of impressive achievements to its credit.

The Congress gener-

al secretary in-charge communications said the 36th Constitution Amendment Bill was passed by the Lok Sabha on April 23, 1975, and by the Rajya Sabha three days later. Subsequently after the President's assent, the 36th Amendment was enacted and on May 16, 1975—exactly fifty years ago-Sikkim became the 22nd state of India with special provisions for it and its people



enshrined in Article 371-F of the Constitution, he recalled. "The Republic of India has been enriched enormously by the integration of Sikkim. The state has a number of impressive achievements to its credit," Ramesh said.

CRPF officer killed, three injured as lightning strikes during anti-naxal operation in Jharkhand

Sources said the lightning struck while the team was moving through the Saranda forests of Chaibasa during an anti-Maoist operation.

RANCHI, May 16 (Agencies): In a tragic turn of events, a CRPF officer lost his life after being struck by lightning during an anti-Maoist operation in the Saranda forests of Chaibasa. The incident occurred around 5:30 pm on Thursday while it was raining heavily.

The officer, M Prabo Singh (46), a second-in-command of the 26th battalion, was seriously injured in the lightning strike and later died during treatment on Friday at MKCG Medical College and Hospital. He had recently been posted in Jharkhand and was a resident of Manipur.



Three other personnel were critically injured in the same incident. They include CRPF Assistant Commandant Subir Mandal and two Assistant Sub-Inspectors from the Jharkhand Jaguar force, Sudesh and Chandlal Hansda. All four were part of a

joint team of CRPF and Jharkhand Police on an operation in the Maoistaffected Baliva forests of Chaibasa.

Sources said the lightning struck while the team was moving through the area. After hearing their screams, nearby personnel

rushed to help and found the injured officers on the ground. They were first taken to the hospital in Paralakhemundi, and later, those in critical condition were shifted to MKCG Hospital.

Locals reported that the forest is a known hideout for Maoist commanders, and thousands of IEDs have been planted in the region to prevent the entry of security forces. Since the operation began in November 2022, six security personnel have died, and 20 others have been seriously injured in blast-related incidents. Nearly 22 civilians have also lost their lives due to IED explosions in the

region.

Despite the dangers, police officials said that the joint forces are continuing their mission and have already established several temporary camps in Maoistcontrolled areas. The operation was launched after intelligence reports suggested that senior Maoist leaders, including Misir Besra and Patiram Maihi alias Anal Da. are hiding in the strategically important Kolhan forest area.

"We are trying to locate the relatives of the family to determine the reason and circumstances leading to the incident," police said.

Nitish Kumar flags off 166 deluxe buses in Bihar, 20 reserved for women

PATNA, May 16 (Agencies): In a major boost to Bihar's public transport system, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Friday flagged off 166 new deluxe buses, including 20 exclusively reserved

for women passengers. The ceremony took place at the CM's official residence at 1 Anne Marg in Patna, in the presence of Deputy Chief Ministers Samrat Choudhary and Vijay Kumar Sinha, and Road Transport Minister Sheela Kumari.

Of the total fleet, 20 buses have been earmarked exclusively for women and will operate in Patna and select other districts, offering a safer and more inclusive travel option for female commuters.

The remaining 144 buses will run across inter-regional routes, serving both male and female passengers throughout the state.

The fleet comprises both AC and non-AC buses, designed to offer enhanced comfort,



affordability, and reliability. Ahead of the inauguration, the Chief Minister personally inspected the buses to review safety and comfort features.

"This initiative is part of the state government's commitment to making public transport more accessible and inclusive, particularly across rural, urban, and semi-urban areas," said a senior official from the transport department.

The new buses are expected to strengthen inter-district connectiv-

ity, reduce commuter congestion, and provide upgraded services to daily passengers. The introduction of womenonly buses also reflects the state's growing focus on gender-sensitive infrastructure and wom-

en's empowerment.

The Bihar government plans to further expand its public transport network in the coming months, with a focus on safety, punctuality, and

digital integration.
In parallel, the Nitish
Kumar-led government

is also prioritizing road infrastructure. The Rural Works Department alone is set to invest Rs 25,000 crore in road repairs in 2025. The Chief Minister stressed the importance of continuous monitoring, prompt grievance redressal, and rigorous maintenance to ensure quality roads.

The state's Road Construction Department is also undertaking several key infrastructure projects to improve connectivity across Bihar.

Israeli strikes kill at least 64 people in Gaza as Trump wraps up his Middle East visit

At least 48 bodies were taken to the Indonesian Hospital, 16 to the Nasser Hospital, after overnight strikes hit near Deir al-Balah and Khan Younis, health officials said.

GAZA, May 16 (Agencies): Israeli strikes across the Gaza Strip on Friday killed at least 64 people, hospitals said, as U S President Donald Trump wraps up his Middle East visit that skipped Israel and offered no prospect for a ceasefire in the war-battered territory.

At least 48 bodies were brought to the Indonesian Hospital and another 16 bodies were taken to Nasser Hospital, health officials said, as strikes overnight into Friday morning hit the outskirts of Deir al-Balah and the city of Khan Younis.

A doctor at the Indonesian Hospital in the northern city of Beit Lahia, who requested anonymity, told agency that 30 dead and dozens of wounded, mostly children and women, had arrived at the hospital.

Mohammed Saleh, acting director of Al-Awda Hospital in Jabalia, told AFP that the hospital had received five dead and "more than 75 injured" as a result of the bombardment.

"The Israeli occupation bombed the house next to mine. hitting it directly while its residents were inside," Yousef Al-Sultan, 40, from the al-Salatin area, west of Beit Lahia, told agency, reporting "air strikes, artillery shelling and gunfire from quadcopter drones."

"There is a massive wave of displacement among civilians.



Fear and panic grip us in the middle of the night," he said.

The widespread attacks across northern Gaza come as Trump finishes his visit to Gulf states but not Israel.

There had been widespread hope that Trump's regional visit could usher in a ceasefire deal or renewal of humanitarian aid to Gaza. An Israeli blockade of the territory is now in its third month.

The Israeli military had no immediate comment on the strikes

The strikes lasted hours into Friday morning sending people fleeing from the Jabaliya refugee camp and the town of Beit Lahiya and followed days of similar attacks that killed more than 130 people, according to Gaza's health ministry.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu vowed earlier in the week to push ahead with a promised escalation of force in Israel's war in the Gaza Strip to pursue his aim of destroying the Hamas militant group, which

governs Gaza. In comments released by Netanyahu's office Tuesday, the prime minister said Israeli forces were days away from entering Gaza "with great strength to complete the mission. It means destroying Hamas."

It was unclear if Friday's bombardment was the start of the operation.

The attacks come as Israel enters its third month of blockading Gaza, preventing food, fuel medicine and all other supplies from entering, worsening a humanitarian crisis.

Israel claims that the blockade aims to pressure Hamas to release the hostages it still holds and that it won't allow aid back

in until a system is in place that gives it control over distribution. Hamas still holds 58 of the roughly 250 hostages it took during its Oct. 7 attack on Israel, with 23 believed to still be alive, although Israeli authorities have expressed concern for the status of three of those.

Israel's retaliatory offensive has killed more than 53,000 Palestinians, many of them women and children, according to Gaza's Health Ministry. Almost 3,000 have been killed since Israel broke a ceasefire on March 18. it said.

Earlier this week, a new humanitarian organisation that has US backing to take over aid delivery in the Gaza strip said it expects to begin operations before the end of the month after what it describes as key agreements from Israeli officials.

A statement from the group, called the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation, identified several US military veterans, former humanitarian coordinators and security contractors that it said would lead the delivery effort.

Many in the humanitarian community, including the UN, said the system does not align with humanitarian principles and won't be able to meet the needs of Palestinians in Gaza and won't participate it.

Want to meet Putin as soon as we can set it up: Trump

Trump underscored that current diplomatic efforts will likely stall unless he and Putin engage directly



WASHINGTON, May 16 (Agencies): US President Donald Trump on Friday said he plans to meet with Russian President Vladimir Putin "as soon as we can set it up," suggesting that his personal involvement is essential to resolving the Russia-Ukraine war, agency reported.

Speaking at the end of his West Asia tour, Trump underscored that current diplomatic efforts will likely stall unless he and Putin engage directly.

His remarks came just ahead of a scheduled meeting between Russian and Ukrainian officials in Turkey--the first in-person talks since the

early stages of the conflict. Despite the significance of the event, the United States has downplayed the possibility of any real breakthrough, and Trump expressed similar doubts.

"Nothing" is going to happen on Ukraine until he and Putin meet, he said, positioning their meeting as a turning point in the stalled peace process, reported agency.

"I think it's time for us to just do it. I said, you know, they all said Putin was going and Zelenskyy was going. And I said, If I don't go, I guarantee Putin is not going, and he didn't go. I understand that -

but we're going to get it - we're going to get it done. We're going to get it done. 5,000 young people are being killed every single week on average, and we're going to get it done," Trump said, citing the human cost of the war. When asked when

the meeting could take place, Trump replied, "As soon as we can set it up. I was going to - I would actually leave here and go. I do want to see my beautiful grandson, and we'll be doing that." His daughter Tiffany Trump gave birth on Thursday, marking his 11th grandchild, agency reported.

Trump also weighed in on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's absence from Thursday's talks. "He didn't show up because he heard Putin wasn't going," he said.

Trump added, "He wasn't going if I wasn't there and I don't believe anything's going to happen, whether you like it or not, until he and I get together."

Expedition organizers say two climbers have died on **Mount Everest**

KATHMANDU, May 16 (Agencies): An Indian and a Filipino climber have died while climbing Mount Everest as hundreds of climbers are attempting to scale the world's highest peak, expedition organizers said Friday.

The Indian climber, identified as Subrata Ghosh, died on Thursday just below the 8,849-meter (29,032foot) summit of the peak while he was returning from the top.

The other climber, identified as Philipp Santiago, 45, from the Philippines, died Wednesday while he was headed to the summit. He had reached Camp 4, which is the highest camp on the mountain, and was preparing for the final bid to reach the summit. Bodha Raj Bhandari of



the Nepal-based Snowy Horizon Trek and Expedition, which equipped and organized the expedition, said the bodies were still on the mountain and it was yet to be decided if and when they would be brought

down. Retrieving bodies is both expensive and difficult as it takes many people to drag them down the icy slopes of the mountain.

The spring climbing season began in March and ends at the end of

May is the best month to climb the peak and climbers get only a few opportunities when the weather conditions improve, allowing just time for them to try attempt scale the peak.

Everest was first climbed in 1953 by New Zealander Edmund Hillary and Nepali Sherpa Tenzing Norgay. More than 300 people have died on Everest since then.

Nepal PM Oli underlines need for global collaboration to save mountain ecosystem

KATHMANDU, May 16 (Agencies): Nepal Prime Minister K P Sharma Oli on Friday underscored the need for honest dialogue, sharing of mutual knowledge, and taking collective action to prevent the effects of climate change, especially in the mountainous region.

Oli was speaking at the inaugural session of the three-day Sagarmatha Sambaad (mountain dialogue) themed 'Climate Change, Mountains and the Future of Humanity' being organised here. More than 350 national and international personalities, including India's Minister for Environment Bhupender Yadav, were present at the event.

He said the event was held with the understanding that preserving the Himalayas means preserving the Earth, the oceans, and humanity itself.



"Our homes are being washed away by landslides. Floods and droughts arrive unexpectedly, yet we remain strong. Our emissions are low, but our contributions to environmental conservation are significant. We hope that this dialogue becomes high—high in moral clarity, strong intellectual courage, and a firm shared vision to create a beautiful future," Oli said, as he underlined the need for global collaboration to save the mountain ecosystem.

In her opening remarks, Foreign Minister Arzu Rana Deuba hoped that the event would foster greater cooperation and political will and result in impactful action for combating the spectre of climate change.

"The tragedy is that the Himalayas are facing an unprecedented stress test in real time today, exposing not only the fragile nature of our mountain ecosystems but also glaring evidence of the lack of meaningful global climate action.

"Mountain communities everywhere are especially vulnerable as they depend on nature for their daily lives. Climate-induced disasters are shaking the very foundation of their existence and livelihood." she said. Noting that the cascad-

ing impacts of global warming and climate change far exceed "our capacity and resources to mitigate them," Deuba called for "predictable and adequate climate finance as we require greater resources to implement our national and local action plan".

India's environment minister Yadav underscored the need for transboundary cooperation between Nepal and India in the area of conservation of big cats, including snow leopards, "considering the importance of highaltitude biodiversity and mountain landscape" of both countries.

He noted that South Asia is "responsible for only 4 per cent of cumulative global carbon emissions despite being home to almost 25 per cent of the global population".

In his keynote speech, Mukhtar Babayev, representative of the President of Azerbaijan, said, "Melting glaciers and ice sheets are causing sea level to rise at an alarming rate, posing a risk for 10 per cent of the world population in the coastal area from South Asia to South Sahara in Africa. It is threatening the very existence of small islands in the Pacific and the Caribbean."

Over 300 participants, including climate experts, environmental activists, government officials, diplomats, and media persons, will attend the three-day event, which will conclude on Sunday.

New Jersey Transit train engineers go on strike, leaving some 350,000 commuters in lurch

NEW JERSEY, May 16 (Agencies): New Jersey Transit train engineers went on strike Friday, leaving an estimated 350,000 commuters in New Jersey and New York City to seek other means to reach their destinations or consider staying home.

The walkout comes after the latest round of negotiations on Thursday didn't produce an agreement. It is the state's first transit strike in more than 40 years and comes a month after union members overwhelmingly rejected a labour agreement with management.

the willingness to come to a solution.

Murphy said it was important to "reach a final deal that is both fair to employees and at the same time affordable to New Jersey's commuters and taxpayers".

"Again, we cannot ignore the agency's fiscal realities," Murphy said.

The announcement came after 15 hours of non-stop contract talks, according to the union. Picket lines are expected to start at 4 am Friday.

NJ Transit — the nation's third-largest transit system — operates buses and rail in the state, providing nearly 1 million weekday trips,

including into New York City. The walkout halts all NJ Transit commuter trains, which provide heavily used public transit routes between New York City's Penn Station on one side of the Hudson River and communities in northern New Jersey on the other, as well as the Newark airport, which has grappled with unrelated delays of its own recently.

The agency had announced contingency plans in recent days, saying it planned to increase bus service, but warned riders that the buses would only add "very limited" capacity to existing New York commuter bus routes

in close proximity to rail stations and would not start running until Monday. The agency also will contract with private carriers to operate bus service from key regional park-and-ride locations during weekday peak periods.

However, the agency noted that the buses would not be able to handle close to the same number of passengers — only about 20% of current rail customers - so it urged people who could work from home to do so if there was a strike.

Even the threat of it had already caused travel disruptions. Amid the uncertainty, the transit agency canceled train and bus service for Shakira concerts Thursday and Friday at MetLife Stadium in New Jersey. The parties met

Monday with a federal mediation board in Washington to discuss the matter, and a mediator was present during Thursday's talks. Kolluri said Thursday night that the mediation board has suggested a Sunday morning meeting to resume talks.

Wages have been the main sticking point of the negotiations between the agency and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and Trainmen that wants to see its members earn wages comparable to other passenger railroads in the area. The union says its members earn an average salary of \$113,000 a year and says an agreement could be reached if agency CEO Kris Kolluri agrees to an average yearly salary of \$170,000.

NJ Transit leadership, though, disputes the union's data, saying the engineers have average total earnings of \$135,000 annually, with the highest earners exceeding \$200,000.

Kolluri and Murphy said Thursday night that the problem isn't so much whether both sides can agree to a wage increase, but whether they can do so under terms that wouldn't then trigger other unions to demand similar increases and create a financially unfeasible situation for NJ Transit.

Congress has the power to intervene and block the strike and force the union to accept a deal, but lawmakers have not shown a willingness to do that this time like they did in 2022 to prevent a national freight railroad strike.

The union has seen steady attrition in its ranks at NJ Transit as more of its members leave to take betterpaying jobs at other railroads. The number of NJ Transit engineers has shrunk from 500 several months ago to about 450 today.

India set to sharpen military edge with Rs 50,000 cr **budget surge post** 'Oneration Sindoor'

seen a steep upward trajectory In 2014-15, the Defence Ministry was allocated Rs 2.29 lakh crore. The current budget not only dwarfs that figure but also represents the largest allocation among all ministries, constituting 13 per cent of the national budget.

The momentum for the proposed increase comes in the wake of 'Operation Sindoor', India's decisive military response to the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam.

The operation, which targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied-Kashmir, demonstrated India's growing military capabilities and strategic

'Operation Sindoor' has also drawn attention to the Indian military's integration of indigenous defence systems with advanced technologies.

Notably, the operation showcased the effectiveness of India's air defence architecture, including the indigenous Akash missile system, often compared to Israel's Iron Dome.

In a related development, India also tested a new anti-drone weapon called Bhargavastra. Designed as a low-cost counterdrone system operating in 'hard kill' mode, it employs micro-rockets to neutralise aerial threats.

The system underwent successful trials at the Seaward Firing Range in Gopalpur, Odisha, earlier this week, with officials confirming that all test objectives were met.

But Wani's efforts didn't stop there. Throughout the morning, he continued to respond to multiple emergency calls, rescuing injured civilians from several locations, including industrial areas and nearby villages.

His bravery and selfless service have drawn widespread praise across the region.

The shelling, which began at 5:00

AM and lasted for nearly three hours, resulted in three deathsincluding the senior officer—and

left seven others injured. "I was the first ambulance driver on duty and responded immediately after receiving the SOS call." Wani said. "I was accompanied by a co-driver and a nursing assistant. We rushed to four different locations under heavy shelling to

rescue the injured." He added, "It was a team effort, and the motivation from our officers kept us going. We didn't think about ourselves—even a single thought of personal safety could have made us hesitate.'

Chief Medical Officer Rajouri, Dr. Manohar Lal Rana, called the actions of the ambulance teams that day "heroic."

"Ambulance drivers across the district responded in an unimaginable manner and carried out evacuations under heavy shelling," the CMO said. "We are proud to have such dedicated men on our team."

Locals start returning home in **Poonch's Salotri** village as India-**Pakistan tensions** ease

along the Line of Control, resulted in significant damage to homes and infrastructure as well as the loss of civilian lives.

The village people thanked the government for the understanding between India and Pakistan.

Amjid Ali, a resident of Salotri village, said, "We live here and we saw something like this happening for the first time. The government had provided everything for our safety, but still, we were scared after witnessing the situation between the two countries. The Indian Army also provided us with all the safety and took care of us. The complete village was left empty after the situation. We are back here in our village as there is

peace again.' Another villager Haji Juniet urged the government to build bunkers

"Around 400 people stayed here. When the fire started, the people left the village. The administration took care of us, and the SHO heard our problem. Today, we have returned to our village. But there is one problem here that we don't have bunkers here. Pakistan border is near, but here there are no sufficient bunkers. I request that the government build bunkers here. We urge both countries that war is not the solution, as people die in such situations. The people who say that war should take place, but we live here, and it is very difficult for the people who stay in the border areas," he said.

Yesterday, the Indian Army carried out a door-to-door assistance drive in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district, especially in areas near the Line of Control (LoC) that were severely affected by recent Pakistani shelling.

As part of the outreach effort, Army jawans distributed essential supplies, including medicines and rations, to civilians impacted by the cross-border hostilities following Operation Sindoor, which was launched in response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, including a Nepali national.

Troops from the Army's Romeo Force also interacted with locals to understand their needs and provide reassurance during the ongoing security situation.

The Indian Armed Forces responded firmly to the aggression, targeting several military positions across the border. Later, both countries agreed to stop the firing and military action after Pakistan's Director General of Military Operations (DGMO) contacted his

Indian counterpart. Operation Sindoor was India's decisive military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. Launched on May 7, Operation Sindoor led to the death of over 100 terrorists affiliated with terror outfits like the Jaish-e-Mohammed, Lashkar-e-Taiba, and Hizbul Mujahideen.

After the attack, Pakistan retaliated with cross-border shelling across the Line of Control and Jammu and Kashmir as well as attempted drone attacks along the

border regions, following which India launched a coordinated attack and damaged radar infrastructure, communication centres and airfields across 11 airbases in Pakistan.

After this, on May 10, an understanding of the cessation of hostilities between India and Pakistan was announced.

JAMMU, May 16: Jammu and Kashmir Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Friday registered case against Sajjad Hussain, Teacher, (Incharge Headmaster) of Government Middle School (GMS), Jandreli, Zone Chassana, Abdul Aziz, Contractor and others for misappropriation of funds.

"The ACB has registered a case FIR No. 01/2025 in Police Station ACB Udhampur under sections 5(1) (d) r/w 5 (2) of J&K P.C Act, Svt. 2006 and section 120-B RPC against a public servant Sajjad Hussain, then Teacher (Incharge Headmaster) of GMS Jandreli, Zone Chassana, District Reasi, Abdul Aziz, Contractor and others and started investigation," ACB official said.

Official added an enquiry was conducted by ACB against abovenamed government official after receipt of a report from Director School Education Jammu substantiating therein the allegations of misappropriation of funds and use of substandard material in school building of Middle School Jandreli, Zone Chassana.

It surfaced during the course of probe that funds to the tune of Rs 11.50 lakhs were released in favour of Sajjad Hussain under SSA scheme for construc-

tion of School Building of Middle School Jandreli by then ZEO Chassana during the period 2016-17, official said adding that the construction work was carried out by Sajjad Hussain through contractor Abdul Aziz without observing codal formalities/norms meant for the purpose, besides withdrawal of funds etc. During spot visit by the Engineering Wing of ACB, many short comings were observed like cracks between slab and beams, non-execution of electric work, face lifting, cement flooring, and fixing of glass strips, door/window/

shutter etc. Apart from, non-maintenance of cash book as well as payment made without following the codal procedure etc. are also observed as a result of which a loss to the tune of Rs 1,65,634.86 has been caused to Govt. exchequer, official said.

By acting in the manner, the Sajjad Hussain, teacher (I/C Headmaster), by abuse of his official position and in league with contractor Abdul Aziz and others executed the substandard work of aforesaid school building, thereby conferred undue benefit to contractor and others and corresponding gain to himself, official said adding that further investigation in the case is going on.

Was sad and angry when I was not picked and then called up as injury replacement: RCB skipper Patidar Pradesh to the 2024-

BENGALURU, May 16 (Agencies): Rajat Patidar, who is leading Royal Challengers Bengaluru this IPL, revisited the 2022 season when he was left "sad" and "angry" after being ignored by the franchise despite assurances, only to be called up later as an injury replacement.

Patidar also admitted that being handed over the captaincy by the inimitable Virat Kohli ahead of IPL 2025 did put him under pressure, but supportive words from the legend calmed

Patidar has been one of RCB's middle-order mainstays this season, scoring 239 runs in 11 games as the southern franchise aims for a maiden men's IPL title.

"I had got a message (ahead of the mega auction for IPL 2022) that you be ready... that we will pick you. I had a little hope that I will get another chance (to play



for RCB). But I wasn't picked in the mega auction. I was a little sad," said Patidar on an RCB Podcast.

However, the 31-yearold Madhya Pradesh cricketer didn't have to wait long to again wear the RCB colours as one of his state-mates got injured. But Patidar was not really keen on coming back to Bengaluru, knowing that he would hardly get an opportunity to play in a star-studded lineup.

"I (had) started playing in my local matches in Indore (after not get-

ting picked in the auction). Then, I got a call that 'we are picking you as a replacement for Luvnith Sisodia', who was injured. To tell you

frankly, I didn't want to

come as a replacement

because I knew that I

won't get a chance to

play there, and I always

feel that I don't want to

sit there (in dugout)." "I wasn't angry. It was like, if they didn't pick me (during the auction), then I won't get it (get to play). I was angry for a while but then I was normal," said Patidar, who led Madhya 25 Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy final. Being handed over the

reins of a side that has the iconic Kohli in its ranks did put pressure on Patidar, but the star batter's backing gave him confidence.

"I had a lot of questions like, there are so many (big players) in the team. Virat Kohli is such a big player, how will you do it under him. I know how supportive he is about this (captaincy change)."

"I knew I have his full support. Like I said, this is a learning for me, it's an opportunity for me. So, I will learn as much as I can from him. Because no one has the experience and ideas that he has in every role—be it batting, as an individual and as a captain." said Patidar.

The day he was unveiled as the RCB skipper was one of the most memorable days for Patidar and he says

he went "completely blank" while receiving the plaque from Kohli. "I have seen him

(Kohli) since I started watching TV, in the IPL, off the field, in the Indian team... To take that thing (captaincy plaque) that he has been doing for so many years... and he is giving it to me with his own hands "

"When he was giving it to me, I was a bit worried about how to take it. I was completely blank about what to do. He told me to hold it. I held it. After that, I was looking at him like, what should I do?" "Then he said a couple

of words like, 'you deserve it, you earned it'. So I felt a little bit okay. I mean when he said this to me then I became normal in that situation. I learn from him as much as possible. So I think that was a special moment... the way he introduced me to so many fans."

Our cricket board's physio and trainer, along with a specialist from the UK, have come together to set up a rehab plan," Taskin said as quoted by ICC. "So far, five sessions have been completed. I've also started light bowling. It's difficult to set a specific date for my comeback. Right now, we're targeting the Sri Lanka series in June and if everything



goes well. So far, there is no complaint, and if things continue like this, I'm hopeful of making a comeback in that series," he added.

Bangladesh recently announced that former Australian fast bowler Shaun Tait will join the Asian side as their new fast bowling coach, with the 2007 ICC Men's Cricket World Cup winner replacing the outgoing Andre Adams on a contract that runs until November 2027

Tait was renowned for bowling with express pace and Taskin is keen to lean on the knowledge of the Australian ahead of next year's ICC Men's T20 World Cup in India and Sri Lanka.

"He (Tait) was a very good fast bowler and played a lot for Australia. The best part is, we have a lot of T20 cricket this year, and he played T20s in the modern era and has experience in major T20 events. He must have some good insights into the game, and hopefully, his experience will help us," the fast bowler said.

"When you're in the national setup, a coach can help with game awareness and some technical aspects, but bowlers mostly have to coach themselves. Dimple alleges breakdown of online government services, demands urgent relief measures in J&K

JAMMU, May 16: President of Mission Statehood, Sunil Dimple, has raised serious concerns over the reported failure of more than fifteen government department websites in Jammu and Kashmir. In a press statement, Dimple claimed that online platforms for key departments like Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC), Power Development Department (PDD), and Public Health Engineering (PHE) have been inaccessible for the past 15 days, severely affecting

public services. Dimple urged Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah to take immediate notice, stating that since the Pahalgam incident, "all progress and prosperity in Jammu &

Kashmir has come to a

standstill." Highlighting the impact of the online outage, Dimple alleged that essential public work related to revenue, JDA, JMC, and PDD has been completely paralyzed. He particularly criticized the PDD, claiming its online billing portal is non-functional and that consumers are receiving conflicting electricity bills — with online and paper statements showing different amounts. He also raised serious allegations of financial mismanagement, asking where deposited funds are going, citing a lack of accountability. He condemned the issuance of two electricity bills in a single month with inflated charges and demanded an immediate halt to the prepaid smart metering system. "Poor fami-

lies don't have smart-

and can't navigate mobile apps," he said, emphasizing the digital divide impacting vulnerable communities. Dimple demanded the government provide free 200 units of electricity per month, 12 cooking gas cylinders annually and double ration for all citizens. He warned of mass agitation if these demands are not met. Further, Dimple pointed to civic neglect in Jammu city, claiming that 15,000 main roads and their streetlights remain defunct for over a month, plunging areas into darkness. The JMC website, he said, is also down halting services like birth and death certificates, sanitation complaints, and approval of building maps.

He criticized the failure of door-to-door garbage collection and alleged that overflowing drains, damaged sewer systems, and blocked manholes have made life miserable for citizens.

In a final appeal, Dimple called for free electricity and water for all residents and demanded speedy disbursement of cash relief to families affected during Operation Sindoor and drone attacks.
