SRINAGAR, May 30 (Agencies): At least eight police personnel were injured on Friday as their vehicle skidded off the road in Uri area of Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district, officials said.

The injured police personnel were rushed to sub district hospital Uri, they said, adding their condition was stated to be stable.

BSF apprehends **Pakistani** intruder in **Pathankot**

PATHANKOT, May 30 (Agencies): Alert Border Security Force (BSF) personnel on Friday apprehended a Pakistani national who had illegally crossed the International Border (IB) in Punjab's Pathankot

district, officials said. Official sources said that the intruder was intercepted by BSF troops near the Narot Jaimal Singh sector after they noticed suspicious movement ahead of the border fence.

"The individual was apprehended swiftly by alert troops before he could advance further into Indian territory," official sources said.

The arrested person has been identified as Jabar, son of Khadir, a resident of Jhelum district in Punjab, Pakistan, they said.

After preliminary questioning, the individual was handed over to Police Chowki Bamial under PS Narot Jaimal Singh for further investigation, they added.

Security agencies are verifying the motive behind the intrusion.

Three Judges take Oath, SC regains full working strength of 34 Judges



NEW DELHI, May 30 (Agencies): Chief Justice of India B R Gavai on Friday administered the oath of office to Justices N V Anjaria, Vijay Bishnoi and A S Chandurkar as judges of the Supreme Court.

The CJI administered the oath to the judges at a ceremony in apex court premises.

With the swearing in of the judges, the top court will regain its full working strength of 34 judges, including the CJI.

The Supreme Court collegium on Monday recommended the

appointment of Karnataka High Court Chief Justice Anjaria, Gauhati High Court Chief Justice Bishnoi, and Bombay High Court judge Justice Chandurkar as judges of the top court.

Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal announced their appointment on X.

Their names were recommended against the three existing vacancies of judges in the top court following the superannuation of ex-CJI Sanjiv Khanna, and Justices Abhay S Oka and Hrishikesh Roy.

Justice Anjaria had

taken oath as the chief justice of Karnataka High Court on February 25, 2024.

Earlier, he was elevated as additional judge, Gujarat High Court, on November 21, 2011 and confirmed as permanent judge on September 6, 2013.

Born on March 23, 1965 at Ahmedabad, Justice Anjaria obtained a Master's degree in law in 1989 from University School of Law, Ahmedabad.

He started law practice in the Gujarat High Court from August 1988

and conducted matters involving constitutional issues and all categories of civil cases, labour and service.

Justice Bishnoi took oath as the chief justice of the Gauhati High Court on February 5,

He was appointed additional judge of the Rajasthan High Court on January 8, 2013, and took oath as a permanent judge of the high court on January 7, 2015.

J&K admin warns against use of banned calcium carbide for artificial fruit ripening

JAMMU, May 30 (Agencies): The Jammu and Kashmir administration has issued an advisory on the artificial ripening of fruits, warning food business operators against using banned calcium carbide for this process in the Union Territory.

Consumers are also advised to remain vigilant in the market and purchase fruits only from known vendors who declare that the fruits sold have not been ripened using harmful and banned chemicals.

"We advise the food business operators (FBOs) dealing with storage, packaging, distribution, and sale of fruits and vegetables to strictly adhere to the prescribed guidelines during and after



t the recently con-cluded World Health Assembly at Geneva, the announcement of India's trachoma-free certification by the World Health Organization (WHO) is more than just a public health triumph; it's a profound testament to the power of a collective national will. This achievement, born from decades of proactive efforts in hygiene, cleanliness, and awareness, offers a compelling blueprint for how India is now tackling another ancient scourge, tuberculosis (TB). Indeed, the echoes of the trachoma victory resonate strongly in the nation's ambitious drive towards a TB-Mukt Bharat.

Just as a sustained focus on fundamental public health principles underpinned the fight against trachoma, the current war on TB is being waged with an equally comprehensive, and crucially, deeply ingrained Jan Bhagidari -people's participation—philosophy. This isn't merely a catchphrase; it's the very bedrock of the government's strategy. The recent 100day TB elimination campaign provides a vivid illustration of this resolve. The sheer scale of the undertaking, with 12.97 crore people screened and over 7.19 lakh TB patients notified, is staggering.

Treating TB beyond medicine Yet, what truly sets this effort cal will, with the highest ech-

Yet, what truly sets this effort apart is the parallel commitment to dismantling the social symptoms of TB. The organization of 13.46 crore "Ni-kshayShivirs," or community screening and awareness camps, speaks volumes about a recognition that effective treatment extends beyond medicine to encompass the eradication of stigma, myths, and misinformation.

Jan Bhagidari, in the context of TB elimination, is a vibrant, multi-faceted phenomenon. It's an ecosystem that supports the tireless dedication of community health workers like ASHAs and Anganwadi workers, who are themost valuable point of contact in remote villages. They are the unsung heroes identifying presumptive cases, ensuring treatment adherence, and providing vital nutritional support. Building on this foundation, the mobilization of resources by local self-help groups, NGOs, and faith-based organizations further strengthens this community-led effort by establishing critical patient support networks.

Before these frontline warriors even step onto the field, however, the ground is already being prepared by India's dynamic media ecosystem. The catchy slogan for the 100-day campaign, 'Jan JanKaRakheDhyaan, TB-Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan', is not just a clever turn of phrase; it's a national clarion call, resounding across television, radio, and public spaces in myriad local languages. This comprehensive awareness generation has been significantly bolstered by unwavering political will, with the highest echelons of government, including the Honourable Prime Minister, consistently championing India's progress. And under the aegis of the Honourable Minister of Health and Family Welfare, a "whole-of-government" approach, fostering collaborations across ministries and proactive efforts at the state level, signifies a unified national commitment.

By spotlighting governmental interventions, social protection schemes, and inspiring stories of community-led initiatives, it cultivates public confidence and encourages individuals to step forward for care. This decentralized, people-centric model finds its most profound expression in the novel Ni-kshayMitra initiative. The extensive media coverage around the Indian Council of Medical Research's evidence linking nutrition and TB treatment outcomes ignited a powerful wave of community action, bringing corporations, NGOs, individuals, and even children forward to become NikshayMitras. The distribution of over 3.06 lakh food baskets to TB patients and their families by more than 1.05 lakh Ni-kshayMitras during the recent 100 days campaign vividly highlights the far reaching impact of this approach at the grassroots level.

Perhaps most powerfully, the emergence of TB survivors as champions has transformed the narrative. These individuals, having successfully navigated their own journeys of recovery, are now integral allies, offering empathy, guidance, and living proof that TB is entirely curable. Their structured training - where they understand the science of TB, the ways in which it affects a patient psychosocially, and techniques to build community networks - and public sharing of experiences inspire treatment adherence and build crucial community empathy.

As India accelerates towards a TB-Mukt Bharat, the continued synergy between these key catalysts and the spirit of Jan Bhagidari will be paramount. Their combined power to inform, inspire, and mobilize is undoubtedly India's greatest asset. By strategically leveraging technology, fostering innovative communication strategies, and deepening community involvement, India is not merely striving to eliminate a disease; it is forging a healthier, more engaged society where every citizen is aware, every patient is supported, and where TB, truly, becomes a relic of the past.

that because we can't be celebrating while our boys are dying there. So that's my first feeling. I said art come later, that's what I thought... It might irritate even the locals...," he said.

Would he like to make a film in Kashmir to encourage tourism, which has taken a hit in the aftermath of the Pahalgam attack?

"Maybe not now but I will do that because it's my place also... from Kanyakumari through Kashmir is my home. I still do believe it."

The 2001 film "Abhay", which featured Haasan in a double role, begins in Kashmir with the actor's character of a commando foiling a terror attack there.

"Amaran", starring Sivakarthikeyan and Sai Pallavi was based on Major Mukund Vardharajan, who was martyred during a counter terror operation in Kashmir in 2014.

Shweta's play will be shown in Mumbai during the Pride Month, but does it scare her as a producer that the play might face the same fate if it travels? "We are just hoping that there is no opposition. As artiste, our job is to keep trying and we will do that. We want to tell stories, but our aim is not to hurt anybody. Ours is a love story, which happens to be about queer people. This story can be about anybody as we are all human beings. So, we want people to support us as I can't do anything

alone," she insists. Talking of queer representation, Shweta says that it is improving in Hindi cinema today, but insists that it will still take more time to get normalised. "It's not just about the community but about understanding each other on a more spiritual level. There needs to be more people from the community in everything, and it will take time. We can hope for it, but the change won't happen overnight. We need to be more accepting as people. The change first needs to be brought in at an individual level, then only it will spread to a community level," she says.

Many people call out the industry for token representation of the community on screen at times, but the actor agrees that even that is necessary. "It's because if you do it suddenly, it will come out as you are doing it just to be cool or just to fit in. You need to imbibe it in the audience's mind gradually. But token representation should improve and evolve with time, and if it is happening that way, it's all fine. And no change is big or small," she ends.

'Came back to Bihar only after keeping my promise of teaching terrorists a lesson': PM Modi

PATNA, May 30 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said he had come back to Bihar only after fulfilling the pledge he made to its people — to bring justice to the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir, where several innocent tourists were targeted. Speaking at a rally in the state, the Prime Minister said the terrorists and their handlers had been taught a lesson, as promised.

Recalling his rally in Madhubani district last month (on April 24, a day after the Pahalgam incident), he said, "I had come to Bihar a day after the dastardly attack in Pahalgam, where many of our sisters had lost their husbands. I had promised that the perpetrators would get a punishment that they could not even dream of. Today, I am back in Bihar, after having delivered on the promise".

Modi accused the Congress and the RJD of deceiving Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, and Other Backward Classes under the guise of social justice and said these INDIA bloc constituents are now "trying to grab power again" in Bihar where assembly elections are due later this year.

Addressing a public rally at Bikramganj in Rohtas district, PM Modi invoked the legacy of Lord Ram and his kul (lineage) to emphasise that the new India was following his principles of keeping promises at all costs, even if it meant making supreme sacrifices.

Overwhelmed by the massive



public response, PM Modi said that he had declared from the soil of Bihar during his previous visit (on April 24, a day after the Pahalgam incident) that the terrorists would be taught a lesson beyond their imagination and that their hideouts would be razed to the ground.

"Jin logon ne Pakistan mein baithkar hamari bahno ka sindoor ujara tha, hamari sena ne unke thikanon ko khandhar mein badal diya (Those who, while sitting in Pakistan, orchestrated wiping out the vermillion from the foreheads of our sisters and daughters, our Armed Forces turned their hideouts into rubble)," he asserted.

He said that both Pakistan and the world witnessed the power of sindoor (vermillion). "The perpetrators of the Pahalgam terrorist attack felt safe after taking shelter under Pakistan's Army, but our Armed Forces made them bow down in one stroke," PM Modi said, amid thunderous

applause from the crowd. He said that Pakistan's air

base and military installations were destroyed within minutes. "This is new India, and it

is the power of new India," he

remarked.

Lauding the role of the Border Security Force (BSF) in safequarding the country's boundaries, PM Modi said that BSF personnel demonstrated exemplary courage, valour, and skill during Operation Sindoor. He recalled the supreme sacrifice made by BSF sub-inspector Mohammad Imtiyaz, a native of Nalanda in Bihar, during the operation.

PM Modi said that Bihar is the land of Veer Kuer Singh, and that the state's youths have always committed themselves to serving in the Army and the Border Security Force.

Issuing a stern warning to enemies, PM Modi said, "I want to repeat once again, the enemy has seen our power in Operation Sindoor, but they should understand that it is only one of the several arrows in our quiver. Our fight against terrorism has

neither halted nor stopped."

"Atankwad ka fan agar phir se uthega, Bharat use bil se khinch kar kuchalne ke kaam karega (If the hood of terrorism rises again, India will drag it out from its hole and crush it)," he remarked.

Taking a dig at the Congress-RJD alliance in Bihar, PM Modi alleged that they only exploited the people and made them suffer during their rule in the state. Referring to the era of jungle raj, PM Modi said that it was the NDA government under Chief Minister Nitish Kumar that lifted Bihar out of the dark age.

He also cautioned the people against the RJD-Congress combine and said that their promises of social justice were merely political tools used to deceive Dalits. Mahadalits. Other Backwards Classes, and Extremely Backward Classes.

PM Modi also mentioned the government's initiatives to curb Maoist activities across the country. While 125 districts were previously affected by Naxalism, the number has now come down to just 18. "The government is committed to eliminating Naxal operatives to ensure smooth and fast development," he added.

Earlier, he inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for several projects worth Rs 48,500 crore. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, Governor Arif Mohammad Khan, cabinet colleagues from the Modi Cabinet, deputy chief ministers, and other dignitaries were present on the occasion.

India will use every method to deal with Pakistan-backed terrorism: Rajnath Singh

The defence minister sent a stern warning to Islamabad saying India will not hesitate to use the methods to deal with terrorism that Pakistan cannot even think of.



NEW DELHI, May 30 (Agencies): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, while addressing officers and sailors aboard India's first indigenous aircraft carrier INS Vikrant off the Goa coast on Friday, firmly reiterated India's stance on Pakistan's repeated offers of dialogue. "If there are talks, it will only be on terrorism and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK). If Pakistan is serious about dialogue, it should hand over terrorists like Hafiz Saeed and Masood Azhar to India so that justice is served," he

Singh pointed out that both individuals are not only on India's list of 'Most Wanted Terrorists' but are also UN-designated terrorists. He highlighted the recent extradition of Tahawwur Rana, an accused in the 2008 Mumbai attacks, to India, adding that Hafiz Saeed too must face justice for his involvement in the attacks.

The Defence Minister reasserted that Operation Sindoor launched in response to the recent terror attack in Pahalgam is far from over. "This is only a pause, a warning," he said. "If Pakistan repeats the same mistake, India's response will be even

more severe." Operation Si carried out by the Indian Armed Forces, was aimed at dismantling terrorist infrastructures in Pakistan and PoK. Singh emphasised that the operation is not just a military manoeuvre but a clear declaration of India's zero-tolerance policy towards terrorism. "If Pakistan indulges in anything evil or unethical, it will this time face the full firepower of the Indian Navy." he warned.

He lauded the Indian Navy's strategic deploy-

ment and described it as the "silent service" during the operation. "The mighty Carrier Battle Group ensured the Pakistani Navy did not dare venture out, or else it would have faced dire consequences. If Pakistan casts an evil eye, it will be the Indian Navy that delivers the first blow in retaliation,"

Singh declared. Sending a stern message, the Defence Minister said Pakistan must understand that the era of using terrorism as a proxy war is over. "If Pakistan dares to provoke us with any terrorist activity, it will face defeat. India will not hesitate. Every means at our disposal will be used to root out this menace," he added.

He criticised Paki-

stan for allowing anti-India activities to flourish openly on its soil and affirmed that India reserves the right to carry out any kind of operation across land or sea to protect its people. "Today, the global community acknowledges India's right to safeguard its citizens against terrorism," he noted, calling on Pakistan to dismantle the "nursery of terrorism" that continues to operate within its bor-

Praising the Indian Navy's contribution to the joint operation, Singh pointed out that as the Indian Air Force struck terror bases inside Pakistan, the Navy's aggressive presence in the Arabian Sea ensured Pakistani naval units remained confined to their shores. "Within 96 hours of the Pahalgam attack, our Western Fleet ships were at sea. They successfully carried out surface-tosurface and surface-toair missile and torpedo firings along both the western and eastern coasts. This demonstrated the combat readiness of our systems, our platforms, and our people," he said.

He added that the powerful projection of the Carrier Battle Group made India's intent and capabilities abundantly clear. "The Navy's military expertise and destructive capabilities broke the enemy's morale. It was a strong and effective message, Singh remarked.

The Defence Minister urged the Indian Navy to continue strengthening its operational readiness and reaffirmed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's declaration that any terrorist act on Indian soil will henceforth be considered an act of war, and responded to accordingly.

"Within a very short span of time, we dismantled Pakistan's terror infrastructure and shattered its intentions. Our response was so forceful that Pakistan pleaded for de-escalation. Let it be known we paused on our own terms. Our forces had not even begun to show their full might," he said.

Concluding address, Rajnath Singh remarked: "We now live in a world where wars are not fought only with bullets and bombs, but also through cyberspace, data dominance, and strategic deterrence. It is a matter of pride that the Indian Navy is advancing strongly in these domains."

Describing the Navy as more than just the "sentinel of the Indian Ocean", Singh said it is a strategic force strengthening India's regional and global influence. "The message to our adversaries is clear India is no longer merely a regional power. It is stepping into the role of a global power," he said.

The Defence Minister arrived in Goa on 29 May 2025 and interacted with Indian Navv personnel involved in the initial phase of Operation Sindoor. In addition to INS Vikrant, he boarded several frontline warships that played a critical role in compelling Pakistani naval units to remain close to the Makran Coast.

One dead, 2 injured, 8 missing as tourist vehicle plunges into Teesta river in Sikkim

GANGTOK, May 30 (Agencies): One person was killed, two injured and eight others went missing when a vehicle carrying 11 tourists plunged into the Teesta river in North Sikkim's Mangan district, police said on Friday.

The tourist vehicle plunged more than 1,000 feet into Teesta river near Munsithang along the Lachen-Lachung highway on Thursday night. Two critically injured persons have been rescued and one body recovered, they said.

Eight tourists are still missing, said Superintendent of Police (SP) Mangan, Sonam Detchu

Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang in a Facebook post said,

"I am deeply saddened by the tragic road accident that occurred on the night of May 29 near Chubombu, Mangan district, where a tourist vehicle fell into the Teesta river while travelling from Lachen to Lachung. My heartfelt prayers are with the vic-

tims and their families

during this extremely

difficult time."

The CM said that rescue operations began immediately under the supervision of SP Mangan, with the dedicated efforts of the police, ITBP, fire and medical teams, and local volunteers. He said that two individuals have been rescued and are receiving medical care. He further

said that the search for

others is ongoing, with NDRF teams joining the operation.

"Our government is fully committed to extending all possible support to the victims and their families. We are closely monitoring the situation and ensuring that every necessary resource is deployed for the ongoing rescue and relief efforts. Let us stand united in this hour of grief and extend our support to those affected," the CM said.

Details regarding the deceased, injured and the cause of the accident are still awaited. Authorities have cordoned off the area and requested tourists to avoid unnecessary travel along the route until further notice. the police added.

One killed, another injured as car rams into tractor-trolley in Rajasthan



JAISALMER, May 30 (Agencies): An advocate was killed in a collision between a car and a tractor-trollev here, the police said on Friday, adding that a police officer had also sustained injuries.

Advocate Genaram and SI Bhomaram were on their way from Jaisalmer to attend a wed-

ding in Ramdevra when their car rammed into a stationary tractor-trolley near Basanpeer village.

Both were rushed to a nearby hospital where the advocate succumbed to critical injuries, the police said.

The injured police officer is being treated at the district hospital.

Congress' Jai Hind Yatra more like Jai Pakistan Yatra: BJP

(Agencies): The BJP on Friday lashed out at the Congress for its leaders' questions and jibes at the government following the conflict with Pakistan, and alleged that the opposition party's ongoing 'Jai Hind Yatra' looks more like

"Jai Pakistan Yatra". BJP national spokesperson Sambit Patra told reporters that senior Congress leaders, including Rahul Gandhi and Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, have often asked about the number of aircraft India lost in the conflict, and accused Jairam Ramesh of equating MPs travelling abroad as members of all-party delegations with terror-

Gandhi never asked about the details of terror sites and air bases destroyed in Pakistan but his party has enquired about the losses of Indian jets more frequently than the neighbouring country, he said. These leaders are

like "babbar" (warrior) of Pakistan, he said, adding that they are gabbar of India, invoking the villain of iconic film Sholay, and added they will meet the same fate as the bandit did in the hands of heroes Jai and Veeru.

"Gabbar's defeat is certain due to India's jai (glory) and veerta (valour)." He noted that even Congress MPs are part of the seven all-party delegations currently

on a visit to world capitals to put across India's stand following the Pahalgam terror attack and its punitive strikes against Pakistan.

These Congress MPs are doing a good job as the delegations are strongly projecting India's stand but Ramesh in one breath is comparing them to terrorists, he said.

The Congress chief spokesperson had said on Thursday that the terrorists behind the Pahalgam attack are roaming and so are these MPs abroad.

Patra cited controversial statements of a number of Congress leaders, including some questioning military conflict with Pakistan and the suspension of Indus



Water Treaty, since after the Pahalgam attack.

He said the opposition party might have claimed that it is with the government on the issue but it is lowering the morale of armed forces from the very beginning.

The Congress should suspend its Jai Hind Yatra, which is more

like Jai Pakistan Yatra, and instead consult with Pakistan and hold a joint press conference, he said, claiming that Gandhi has been quoted frequently in Pakistan.

With the Congress increasingly turning caustic at its MP Shashi Tharoor, who is leading the multi-party delega-

tion to the US and four other countries, for his stout defence of the government's actions, Patra said the party is divided into two factions.

One supports Pakistan, he alleged, while another include those who want to raise their voice for India but cannot due to leaders like Gandhi.

He noted that another Congress leader Salman Khurshid, who is a member of one of the delegarions, had spoken about the changes brought by the revocation of Article 370, and said somebody should relay the former Union minister's remarks to

Gandhi. During the Congressled UPA rule, terrorists were invited to the Prime

Minister's Office at the behest of the then Congress president Sonia Gandhi, he claimed and referred to reports that she had cried over the killing of some young terrorists in the Batla House encounter.

Patra also referred to Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's comments that India's Brahmos missiles hit his country's military facilities ahead of the planned attack on Indian targets to emphasise on the damages inflicted on the neighbouring coun-

"Gandhi should listen to his friend Sharif," he said.

Patra quoted the opinion of US-based military expert John Spencer, which has been reported widely in the Indian media, that India won the tech war in the conflict while Pakistan lost as China's proxy.

He said Spencer was not alone as many experts have spoken about India's decisive victory but some opposition parties, especially the Congress, have been trying to lower the country's morale.

Criticising West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee for her choice of words in slamming Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who at a rally in the state had hit out at her government, he said Modi is everyone's "sewak".

It is beyond any doubt that she was sheltering infiltrators and Rohingyas, he added.

Macron says stance on Israel must 'harden' unless **Gaza situation improves**

The French President also asserted recognition of a Palestinian state with conditions was "not only a moral duty, but a political necessity".

SINGAPORE, May 30 (Agencies): French President **Emmanuel Macron said Friday** that European countries should "harden the collective position" against Israel if it does not respond appropriately to the humanitarian situation in Gaza.

With international pressure mounting on Israel over the deepening hunger crisis in Gaza, Macron said action was needed "in the next few hours and days".

He also asserted recognition of a Palestinian state with conditions was "not only a moral duty, but a political necessity".

If there was no response in line with the humanitarian situation in Gaza "in the coming hours and days... we will have to harden our collective position," Macron said on a visit to Singapore.

This meant dropping an assumption that human rights were being respected "and apply sanctions", the French leader said hours before addressing a defence summit in the city-state.

Macron is on a diplomatic tour in Southeast Asia which also saw him visit Vietnam and Indonesia earlier this week

While in Jakarta, Macron and Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto issued a joint statement condemning Israeli plans to take control of Gaza and any



moves to "forcibly remove the Palestinian population from their homeland".

Paris hoped to "trigger a movement of recognition for a Palestinian state under certain conditions", including the demilitarisation of Hamas and recognition of Israel's right to exist and protect itself, Macron said in the Indonesian capital.

The humanitarian situation in Gaza remained dire despite aid beginning to trickle back into the territory after a more than twomonth Israeli blockade.

Food security experts said starvation was looming for one in five people.

Israel has also intensified its military offensive in what it said was a renewed push to destroy Hamas, whose October 7, 2023 attack triggered the war.

'Ukraine a test of credibility for

French President Emmanuel Macron said on Friday that Washington faces a "credibility test" over its response to Russia dragging its feet on a Ukraine ceasefire.

Moscow has rebuffed calls for an immediate ceasefire and kept up an intense bombardment of Ukraine even as diplomatic efforts to end the war have gained momentum.

US President Donald Trump called Vladimir Putin "crazy" late on Sunday in a rare rebuke of the Russian leader but he has yet to follow up on repeated threats to impose fresh sanctions on Moscow.

Macron said that if Russia gives "confirmation that it is not ready to make peace" Washington must then confirm its "commitment" to impose sanctions on Moscow, stressing it was a "credibility test for the Americans".

"I spoke 48 hours ago to President Trump who showed his impatience. The question now is what do we do? We (Europeans) are ready," he said during a visit to Singapore.

Macron will give the opening speech at the Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore, Asia's main annual security and defence conference, which was addressed last year by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky.

The French leader said this week he believed Trump now realised Putin lied when he claimed to be ready for peace in Ukraine, and hoped the US president's anger would translate into action.

Macron said it was time to threaten Russia with "much more massive sanctions" to persuade it to end the conflict begun by its invasion of Ukraine in 2022.

The French president visited Kyiv on May 10 with other European leaders to give Russia an ultimatum -- agreed with Washington -- to accept a ceasefire.

The Russian offensive has resulted in tens of thousands of deaths and the destruction of large parts of eastern and southern Ukraine.

Moscow genuinely interested in revival of Russia-India-China troika format: Lavrov

MOSCOW. May 30 (Agencies): Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov has said his country is genuinely interested in the revival of activities within the framework of the Russia-India-China (RIC) format.

Following the deadly Galwan Valley standoff between the militaries of India and China in 2020, the RIC troika has not been very active.

"I would like to confirm our genuine interest in the earliest resumption of the work within the format of the troika-Russia, India, Chinawhich was established many years ago on the initiative of (ex-Russian prime minister) Yevgeny Primakov, and which has organised meetings more than 20 times at the ministerial level since then, not only at the level of foreign policy chiefs but also the heads of

China forms new global mediation group with dozens of countries

HONG KONG, May 30 (Agencies): Dozens of countries joined China on Friday in establishing an international mediationbased dispute resolution group.

Representatives of more than 30 other countries, from Pakistan and Indonesia to Belarus and Cuba, signed the Convention on the Establishment of the International Organization for Mediation in Hong Kong to become founding members of the global organization, following Chinese Foreign Minister

The support of developing countries signaled Beijing's rising influence in the global south amid heightened geopolitical tensions, partly exacerbated by U.S. President Donald Trump's trade tariffs.

At a ceremony, Wang said China has long advocated for handling differences with a spirit of mutual understanding and consensus-building through dialogue, while aiming to provide "Chinese wisdom" for resolving conflicts between nations.

"The establishment of the International Organization for Mediation helps to move beyond the zero-sum mindset of 'you

The body, headquartered in Hong Kong, aims to help promote the amicable resolution of international disputes and build more harmonious global relations, he said.

Beijing has touted the organization as the world's first intergovernmental legal organization for resolving disputes through mediation, saying it will be an important mechanism in safeguarding the principles of the Charter of the United Nations. It also positioned Hong Kong as an international legal and dispute resolution services center

Wang said the city's rule of law is highly developed, with the advantages of both common law and mainland Chinese law systems, asserting that it possesses uniquely favorable conditions for international mediation.

Hong Kong leader John Lee said the organization could begin its work as early as the end of this year.

The ceremony was attended by representatives from some 50 other countries and about 20 organizations, including the United Nations.

Although many details about the new body are yet to be clarified, it could open the door for greater synergy between formal litigation or arbitration and more flexible methods like mediation, she said.

Shahla Ali, a law professor at the University of Hong Kong, said the International Organization for Mediation would have the capacity to mediate disputes between states, between a state and a national of another state, or in international commercial disputes.

"Conventions can provide opportunities to experiment with new approaches," she said, noting rising interest in mediation globally as a means to resolve investor-state disputes.

BEIJING, May 30 (Agencies): China opposed its student visas revocation by the United States and said that this decision of the Trump administration exposes "hypocrisy behind US claims of freedom.'

Spokesperson of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of China, Lin Jian, said that the move is "unjustified" and "disrupts" people-to-people exchanges between the two countries

In a social media post on X, Lin Jian said, "The US decision to revoke Chinese student visas is fully unjustified. Citing ideology and national security as a pretext, the move seriously hurts interests of international students from China and disrupts people-to-people exchanges between the two countries. China firmly opposes this action and has protested to the US over the decision." Calling the US deci-

sion politically motivated, Lin Jian said this will damage the image and reputation of Washington itself.

"This politically motivated and discriminatory move exposes the hypocrisy behind the US's claims of freedom and openness. It will further damage the image and reputation of the US itself," he said.

On Wednesday, US



Secretary of State Marco Rubio said that the US will begin revoking visas of Chinese students, including those with connections to the Chinese Communist Party or studying in critical fields.

In a social media post on X, Rubio wrote, "The U.S. will begin revoking visas of Chinese students, including those with connections to the Chinese Communist Party or studying in critical fields.'

This further widens an already strained relationship between the US and China, which backtracked after Trump threatened China with reciprocal tariffs.

The US President introduced his "reciprocal" tariffs, placing substantial duties on imports from some of the United States' key trading partners. This led to a tariff war between both countries, with Trump indicating that the tariffs may go up to as high as 245 per cent.

However, both countries arrived at an agreement on May 12 and withdrew their previously announced tariffs. Currently, China imposes 10 per cent tariffs on US goods, and the US will tax Chinese goods at about 30 per cent.

30 (Agencies): At least eight people died while 21 others were injured as heavy rain accompanied by thunderstorms and strong winds lashed parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province in northwest Pakistan on Thursday evening, an official said today.

The deceased included five men, two women and a child, a spokesman for the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) said. Among the injured were 10 men, five women and six children. Heavy rain accompanied by strong winds wreaked havoc across Pakhtunkhwa on Thursday.

The PDMA has released a report detailing human and material losses caused by rain and strong winds across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa since May 27.

The report noted that 25 houses have been damaged, including one completely destroyed and 24 partially dam-

aged. The incidents occurred in various districts, including Mardan, Swabi, Peshawar, Shangla, Swat, Torghar, Mohmand, Mansehra,

and Haripur. The PDMA has instructed the respective district administrations to ensure immediate relief for the affected families and provide the injured with the best possible medical treatment.

The weather pattern is expected to continue until May 31.

The PDMA remained in close touch with all the district administrations and the relevant relief agencies, the spokesman said.

The PDMA emergency operations centre is fully operational, and citizens have been advised to report any untoward incident by calling 1700, he added.

J&K admin warns against use of banned calcium carbide for artificial fruit ripening

artificial ripening treatment to ensure safe and compliant ripening practices. Failing this, penal action shall be initiated," the Drug and Food Control Organisation (D&FCO) said in an advisory issued here.

It warned FBOs against applying banned calcium carbide in the artificial ripening of fruits.

"Considering the issue of the use of banned calcium carbide and the non-availability of alternative ripening agents, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has permitted the use of ethylene gas for ripening of fruits in India, subject to adherence to the SOPs by the FBOs," it added.

The organisation said that artificial ripening with calcium carbide, popularly known as 'Masala', has been strictly banned due to its potential health hazards.

The organisation has specifically issued an advisory for the ripening of climacteric fruits — fruits which are harvested at full maturity and can be further ripened during transit or storage, like banana, guava, avocado, mango, apple, pear, apricot, peach, tomato, etc.

It said a detailed SOP for the use

of ethylene gas for artificial ripening has been notified by FSSAI.

"Ethylene gas, ethanol, ethephon, etc, can be used on fruits to trigger the ripening process under controlled conditions of humidity, temperature, and exposure time," the organisation said.

However, any source of ethylene gas coming in direct contact with fruits is not permitted.

Further, only approved sources of ethylene gas are allowed to be procured and used, besides ensuring the authenticity and purity of the sachets containing ethephon in powdered form and other components, it added.

"Only those sachets must be used that are properly labelled, mentioning details of the manufacturer, composition, instructions for use, etc. Use of ethylene gas for artificial ripening can be done up to the concentration of 100 ppm (100 µl/L) only," the organisation further advised.

Fruit should not occupy more than 75 per cent of the volume of the chamber as well as the crate during the treatment.

"Gas leakage monitoring systems should be installed in the commercial ripening chambers. Stacking of boxes should be done keeping a minimum 4–6 inches space from the walls and between the adjacent crates," it said.

Consumers are also advised to wash fruits thoroughly with potable water before consumption, the advisory said.

"The accused admitted the crime during interrogation," the statement said.



Harry Brook crosses 4000 international runs, enters England's top 50 scorers list

BIRMINGHAM, May 30 (Agencies): Harry Brook continues to rise rapidly in the international cricketing arena, marking another significant milestone in his burgeoning career. The 26-yearold completed 4,000 international runs during the first ODI against the West Indies in Birmingham, becoming the 49th highest run-scorer for England across formats.

Brook contributed a composed 58 off 45 deliveries in the match, laced with five boundaries and three sixes, helping England to a comprehensive win in his debut outing as white-ball captain. His performance underscored both his leadership credentials and his value as a dependable middle-order batter.

Since making his international debut, Brook has played 96 matches and amassed 4.011 runs at an impressive average of 43.12. He already boasts 9 international centuries and 21 halfcenturies, and his overall strike rate of 99.47 highlights his attacking instincts and ability to control the tempo across

Brook's strongest impact so far has come in Test cricket. In just 25 Tests, he has racked up 2,339 runs at a stellar average of 58.47, including eight centuries and eleven fifties. His careerbest score of 317 further underlines his

capability to play long, match-defining

In the ODI format, Brook has featured in 27 matches and scored 874 runs. In T20ls, he has accumulated 798 runs from 44 games, demonstrating his flexibility and adaptability across the formats.

England got their home summer off to an excellent start at Edgbaston as they cruised to an impressive 238-run triumph over the Caribbean side in what was Brook's first game in charge as white-ball skipper.

While tougher tests will await England before the next ICC Men's Cricket World Cup in South Africa, Namibia and Zimbabwe in 2027, the showing against the West Indies was much improved from what the side has shown in recent

England failed to make it out of the group stages of the most recent 50-over World Cup in India and went winless at the ICC Champions Trophy at the start of this year, while the team haven't even won a bilateral ODI series since they snuck past Ireland 1-0 in September

Former New Zealand coach David Trist passes away at 77

CHRISTCHURCH, May 30 (Agencies): David Trist, the former New Zealand cricket coach who led the team to victory in the 2000 ICC KnockOut Trophy, now known as the Champions Trophy, has passed away at the age of 77, as per ESPNcricinfo.

Trist enjoyed a 14-year playing career as a pace bowler for Canterbury before transitioning into coaching. His coaching journey included stints with Canterbury, South Africa, Hong Kong, and the Netherlands, before he took charge of the New Zealand national side in 1999, succeeding Steve Rixon.

Although his tenure lasted just two years, Trist played a pivotal role in securing New Zealand's first major ICC title. Under his guidance, the team triumphed over

India by four wickets in the final in Nairobi, with Chris Cairns anchoring the chase with an unbeaten century. That victory marked a historic moment for New Zealand cricket, later followed by their 2021 World Test Championship triumph.

"Cairns was outstanding, and played an innings that he will remember forever, because it was the winning of the game," Trist told in an interview with ESPNcricinfo in 2017.

"But the feeling was we could do it, and we had to do it. That was what pervaded the dressing room - although there were moments of concern, quite clearly, with losing wickets early and one or two other batsmen not quite doing what they had done previously," he added, as quoted from ESPNcricinfo.



"But Cairns' innings was one of his greatest, if not his greatest, innings, in so much as it won basically the only thing New Zealand has ever won. He could take the game away from you. He was a big hitter, but he was also technically very sound. He wasn't unsettled by fast bowling, and against spin he was positive,"

he noted. "I think in the latter stage of that innings, the Indians went from 'We've won this' to 'Oh

shit!' And Chris went on, of course, to get a hundred. It was a huge innings, and probably one of the most important innings in terms of New Zealand that we've witnessed," he said.

"I look back on it as pleasing for the players in the first instance, and a special moment for New Zealand. Even though they were only three matches, they were very testing ones: Zimbabwe in Africa, and then us as underdogs beating two of the powerhouses of world cricket on a fair and equal environment - we caused one of the bigger upsets in one-day cricket finals," he reflected on the title, where New Zealand beat Zimbabwe and Pakistan before facing India.

Following his time with the national side, Trist continued to contribute to the sport as the coaching director at Christchurch's Old Collegians Cricket Club. He also took on coaching roles in both India and England.

"NZC is deeply saddened to confirm the passing of former Blackcaps coach David Trist, who died in Christchurch yesterday, aged 77... NZC extends its heartfelt condolences to David's family and friends," New Zealand Cricket said in a statement on social media.

"Stop at any cost": R Ashwin doesn't want MI vs RCB IPL final

MUMBAI, May 30 (Agencies): As Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) gear up for their fourth IPL final, former India spinner Ravichandran Ashwin believes there's one team they wouldn't want to face-Mumbai Indians (MI). Speaking on his YouTube channel, Ashwin said RCB will be praying MI don't make it to the final in Ahmedabad. RCB sealed their place after thrashing Punjab Kings in Qualifier 1, while MI will first play Gujarat Titans in the Eliminator, with the winner then taking on PBKS in Qualifier 2 on June 1.

Ashwin, who played for Chennai Super Kings (CSK) in IPL 2025, said the fivetime champions MI are the only team capable of denying RCB their maiden IPL title. "If RCB has to win the IPL, then Gujarat Titans should win against Mumbai Indians. MI are one team that you cannot allow to enter the final, you have to stop them at any cost," Ashwin said in his analysis of the playoffs.

He added that if he were in RCB's shoes, he would prefer facing Gujarat Titans in the final rather than MI, who he believes are the only real threat to Rajat Patidar's side. "RCB will keep their fingers crossed to not have Mumbai Indians in the final. It looks like RCB are going the distance, but it is cricket; anything can happen. If I was RCB, I would want

to face Gujarat Titans" he said. Ashwin also touched upon Virat Kohli's incredible run in the past year, saying

everything seems to be aligning for the RCB star. Kohli, who has never won the IPL, has had a stellar run in international cricket recently—winning both the T20 World Cup in 2024 and the ICC Champions Trophy earlier this year.

"Virat Kohli, I want to tell you all one thing. I don't want to make it about him, but I cannot help but feel that this is RCB's year. People used to say Kohli has no ICC title, and now he has two in the space of a year. Not as captain, but he's still been central to the wins. He's also one of the greatest Indian Test captains. Is he going to win the first-ever IPL title for RCB in the 18th season? If they are chasing in the final, Kohli knows how to handle those situations," Ashwin said.

RCB booked their final berth with a dominant performance in Qualifier 1. After bowling out Punjab Kings for just 101, Phil Salt led the chase with an unbeaten half-century, helping the team reach the target in only 10 overs. Kohli, however,

had a rare failure, scoring just 12 runs. Despite the low score, Kohli has had a remarkable season—scoring 614 runs in 14 matches at an average of 55.82 and a strike rate of 146.54. With the final looming, RCB fans will be hoping for another match-winning performance from their talisman. RCB will now wait to find out who they face in the final-MI, GT or PBKS. But as Ashwin puts it, if it's Mumbai, "stop them at any cost."
