





URGENT MEASURES REQUIRED

The recent spell of heavy rainfall across multiple regions of the country has led to a severe flood situation, affecting thousands of lives, property, agriculture, and infrastructure. With rivers overflowing, lowlying areas submerged, and disaster response teams stretched thin, the situation demands immediate attention from authorities and support from civil society.

Over the past week, multiple states have experienced incessant rains, with some areas recording rainfall far above normal levels. This sudden and continuous downpour has overwhelmed local drainage systems and caused rivers to breach their danger marks. In several districts, rivers such as the Ganga, Yamuna, Brahmaputra, and their tributaries have swollen beyond safe levels, flooding nearby villages and towns. In hilly areas, landslides triggered by waterlogged soil have blocked roads and disrupted connectivity.

States such as Assam, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, and parts of Jammu and Kashmir have borne the brunt of the floods. In Assam, more than 500 villages have been submerged, affecting over 3 lakh people. Relief camps have been set up in schools and community halls to house displaced residents. In Jammu & Kashmir, flash floods caused by cloudbursts in mountainous regions have led to road blockages and temporary isolation of some remote areas.

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and State Disaster Response Forces (SDRF) have launched rescue and relief operations. Over 10,000 people have been evacuated to safer locations, with hundreds still stranded in inaccessible areas. Helicopters are being deployed in the worst-affected areas for aerial surveys and relief drops.

One of the gravest consequences of the floods has been the destruction of crops. Paddy fields, vegetable patches, and orchards have been washed away, causing distress to thousands of farmers already battling inflation and economic uncertainty. In many areas, cattle and livestock have been lost to the floodwaters, adding to the burden on rural families who depend on agriculture for sustenance.

The floodwaters have damaged crucial infrastructure including roads, bridges, electricity poles, and water pipelines. Several highways and railway routes have been either suspended or rerouted due to waterlogging and landslides. In urban areas, sewage systems have collapsed under the pressure of heavy rainfall, leading to contamination of drinking water sources and increased risk of waterborne diseases.

With stagnant water collecting in streets and fields, the risk of vector-borne diseases such as dengue, malaria, and chikungunya has sharply increased. Additionally, water contamination is leading to cases of diarrhea, cholera, and skin infections. Health officials have warned of a potential outbreak if sanitation is not maintained in relief camps. The supply of clean drinking water, medicines, and basic hygiene materials such as sanitary pads and disinfectants is being prioritized by health departments and non-governmental organizations. The state governments have issued alerts and advisories, urging people in flood-prone areas to relocate to safer zones. Singer Adnan Sami blasted Pakistan in his latest interview. The popular playback singer, who got his Indian citizenship a few years back, blamed the Pakistan army for exploiting their own people and the Kashmir issue in front of the world to fill their pockets.

Sami appeared on the India TV show 'Aap Ki Adalat' and exposed the Pakistani establishment left, right, centre. He said he is an artiste, but he understands how the Pakistan army doesn't let its people and government prosper.

"Those who say that I came to India carrying top secrets, they should know I am a musician, a singer and a composer. Those generals did romance on my tunes and danced to my songs. The entire army establishment, including ISI, wants to keep the Kashmir issue alive in the guise of Islam," he said.

The 53-year-old called Pakistan's military the 'looters' of the nation. He added that it's a strange country where any politician who is loved by the people is 'packed off'.

"But reality is different. They hype up the Kashmir issue to get donations and funds from other countries to line their pockets. They live a life of luxury after loot-



ing the nation, while the people have no money or food. The entire nation is run by generals," he said.

Sami went on to mention popular Pakistani leaders Benazir Bhutto and Imran Khan - killed, and put in jail, respectively. "In other countries, an army lives within a country, but Pakistan is a waahid mulk (unique country), where the country was born inside an army. The army there even sells cornflakes. Any politician who becomes popular is packed off," he said.

"Then, they finished off Benazir Bhutto. In today's times, Imran Khan is the most popular leader in Pakistan; he is a sports hero, but he has been thrown in jail," he continued. Pakistan doesn't have

NEW DELHI, Jun 2 (Agencies): Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday attacked the Modi government over the flood situation in the northeastern states, and hoped Prime Minister Narendra Modi will open the floodgates of his PM CARES Fund, where he claimed crores lie without any audit. Referring to Assam,

he said PM Modi had promised in 2016 to make the state floodfree but it seems the BJP's double engine governments have

betrayed Assam. In a post on X, he noted that the northeast is reeling under devastating floods, landslides and heavy rains. Assam, Arunachal,

Manipur, Sikkim and Meghalaya are among the worst affected states, where many lives have been lost and lakhs of people have been affected, he observed

Congress leaders and workers must do everything to provide assistance to the people, he said.

"In 2016, BJP had promised to make a 'Flood-Free' Assam. In 2022, Home Minister, Amit Shah repeated this promise.

Bihar has tremendous potential for agricultural development: Shivraj Singh Chouhan

MOTIHARI (BIHAR), Jun 2 (Agencies): Maintaining that Bihar has tremendous potential for agricultural development, Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Monday said for a "developed India, agriculture must develop and farmers must also prosper".

Chouhan said this on Monday when he visited Motihari, the district headquarters town of East Champaran district and interacted with farmers as part of his nationwide tour under the VKSA campaign.

"I have come to Bihar to support and serve the farmers here and help increase agricultural productivity. For me, serving farmers is like worshipping God ... 'Ek Rashtra, Ek Krishi, Ek Team' (one nation, one agriculture, one team) is the motto of this campaign," he said.

"The Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA) of the Central government is a landmark initiative aimed at transforming Indian agriculture. For a developed India, agri-



culture must develop and farmers must also prosper.....Bihar has tremendous potential for agricultural development.....and the VKSA campaign will accelerate the state's agricultural transformation and empower farmers through greater access to innovation, infrastructure, and institutional support," he said.

The VKSA campaign aligns with the vision of Prime Minister Narendra Modi for a selfreliant and sustainable India, and seeks to promote the widespread adoption of advanced agricultural technologies across the nation as well as in Bihar, said the union minister.

The campaign's ambitious goal is to reach farmers across India

through technology dissemination, capacity building, and grassroots engagement, he said adding the path to national development passes through agricultural prosperity and farmers' welfare.

"Around 16,000 agricultural scientists are engaging directly with farmers. Scientists, state and central agriculture departments and agricultural universities, are working together to find ways to increase production, reduce input costs, ensure fair prices for farmers, and provide compensation in case of losses. Efforts are being made to increase the production of Bihar's famous jardalu mango, shahi litchi and marcha rice by helping farmers through advanced agricultural technologies..." said the Union minister.

The government in April 2023 awarded the 'Geographical Indication' (GI) tag to 'marcha rice' (appears like black pepper). This rice is famous for its aromatic flavour, palatability and aromatic chura (rice flakes) making qualities. Prior to this, Bhagalpur's jardalu mango, katarni dhaan (rice), Nawada's maghai paan and Muzaffarpur's shahi litchi have already been awarded GI tag.

A GI is a label applied to goods with a particular geographic origin and characteristics or a reputation derived from that origin. An indication that a product is made in a specific location is necessary for a sign to be considered for GI tag. Bihar's famous shahi litchi is worldwide popu-

lar and this fruit has only 48 hours of shelf-life, now the government is exploring options to preserve it for a longer period so that farmers get better prices, said Chouhan. Also, cold storages should be built so that farmers can get the facility to store litchis, he added.

Maize production is increasing rapidly in Bihar and maize is also getting good prices. "It is the result of the policy of our PM that maize is now also being used to make ethanol," he said. "Today I got the opportunity to come to this holy land of Champaran,' he said, adding this

land where the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, started a movement (Champaran movement) against the atrocities and injustice being done by the British on the farmers.

Man, 21, dies by suicide after father could not buy him luxury car: Telangana cops

HYDERABAD, Jun 2 (Agencies): A 21-year-old man allegedly died by suicide in Siddipet district of Telangana after his father, who worked as a farm labourer, could not afford to buy him a luxury car, citing his financial condition, police said on Monday.

The incident happened at Chatlapally village on May 30. The man went to his agricultural field and consumed an unknown pesticide. Later, he went to his house and informed his parents that he had taken the extreme step, cops said.

He was taken to a hospital and died while



undergoing treatment on May 31, police said. The man had discontinued his studies. He was addicted to alcohol and his mental condition was not stable. He used to argue with his parents, demanding luxury things, including a modern house and a luxury car, a police official at Jagadevpur police station said. His parents own two acres of land and, due to their financial condition, they tried to convince him. However, he refused and insisted on buying the luxury car. They went to Siddipet on May 30 and offered to purchase another car, but the man refused and later in the afternoon consumed the "poisonous" substance, police said.

The father of the man complained, and a case was registered.

Right-wing Karol Nawrocki wins Poland presidential election

WARSHAW, Jun 2 (Agencies): Polish nationalist opposition candidate Karol Nawrocki won the second round of the country's presidential election with 50.89 per cent of the votes, the electoral commission said early on Monday, in a blow to the reform agenda of the pro-European government.

His rival, Rafal Trzaskowski, the liberal Warsaw mayor and an ally of the government led by Donald Tusk, got 49.11 per cent. An exit poll on Sunday had shown Trzaskowski winning with a razor-thin majority.

Nawrocki, 42, a eurosceptic historian who ran a national remembrance institute, campaigned on a promise to ensure economic and social policies favour Poles over other nation-



alities, including refugees from neighbouring Ukraine.

The amateur boxer won despite his past dominating the last days of the presidential campaign - from questions over his acquisition of a flat from a pensioner to an admission that

he took part in orchestrated brawls. While Poland's parliament holds most power, the president can veto legislation, and the vote was being watched closely

in Ukraine as well as Russia,

the United States and across

the European Union.

Nawrocki, supported by the Law and Justice party (PiS), is expected to continue the policies of his predecessor. President Andrzej Duda, also an ally of the largest opposition party, including blocking any attempts by the government to liberalise abortion or reform the judiciary. On social media platform X, Duda thanked Poles for going to vote in large numbers. Turnout was 71.31 per cent, the electoral commission said, a record for the second round of a presidential election.

"Groundless": China rejects Trump's 'Beijing violated Geneva trade deal' claim

BEIJING, Jun 2 (Agencies): China said on Monday that US President Donald Trump's accusations that Beijing had violated the consensus reached in Geneva trade talks were "groundless", and promised to take forceful measures to safeguard its interests.

The comment by the commerce ministry was in response to Trump's remarks on Friday that China had breached a bilateral deal to roll back tariffs.

The ministry said China had implemented and actively upheld the agreement reached last month in Geneva, while the US had introduced multiple "discriminatory restrictive" measures against China.

Those measures included issuing guidance on AI chip export controls, halting sales of chip design software to China and revoking visas for Chinese students, the ministry added.

"The US government has unilaterally and repeatedly provoked new economic and trade frictions, exacerbating uncertainty and instability in bilateral economic and trade relations," the ministry said in a statement.

It did not elaborate on what forceful measures it might take in response.

Beijing and Washington agreed in mid-May in Geneva to pause triple-digit tariffs for 90 days. In addition, China also promised to lift trade countermeasures that restricted its exports of the critical metals needed for US semiconductor, electronics and defence production.

Trump on Friday also announced a doubling of import tariffs on steel and aluminium to 50%.

While China is the world's largest steel producer and exporter, it ships very little to the United States after a 25% tariff imposed in 2018 shut most Chinese steel out of the market. China ranks third among aluminium suppliers.

Ukraine drone attacks on **Russia spark fires, disrupt** traffic, officials say

MOSCOW, Jun 2 (Agencies): Ukraine's overnight drone attacks on Russia's Kursk and Voronezh regions sparked residential fires and disrupted traffic on a major highway, regional officials said early on Monday.

Russian air defence units destroyed a total of 162 Ukrainian drones overnight, downing 57 of the air weapons over the Kursk region that borders Ukraine.

Falling debris from destroyed drones in the Kursk region sparked fires at several houses and damaged private apartments, said acting governor of the region, Alexander Khinshtein, on the Telegram messaging app.

In the southern Russian region of Voronezh, where Russian air units



destroyed 16 Ukrainian drones, regional governor Alexander Gusev said drone debris cut through power lines which fell on the M-4, a major expressway.

A small section of the highway, which links the cities of Moscow, Voronezh, Rostov-on-Don and Krasnodar, was closed, Gusev said. Falling drone debris also damaged the facade of several houses, he added on Telegram. There were no injuries

reported, the governors of the regions said. The attacks come as both Russia and Ukraine are about to meet for a round of peace talks, trying to find a way to end the war that Russia launched with a fullscale invasion on its smaller neighbour more than three years ago.

"India took steps to protect its national interest," says Malaysian minister YB Kulasegaran Murugeson

KUALA LUMPUR, Jun 2 (Agencies): Expressing strong concern over the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam, Malaysian leaders have acknowledged India's measured response and affirmed their support for peace and regional stability.

YB Kulasegaran Murugeson, Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) of Malaysia, said the incident was "shocking" and "should not have happened at all.'

Speaking to agency, Murugeson stated, "India has taken necessary action. We spoke about Malaysia's concerns, and we feel India took steps to protect its national interest." He added, "We hope crossborder terrorism doesn't take place anymore," underscoring Malaysia's desire for peace in the region.

Malaysia's Deputy Minister of National Unity, YB Senator Saraswathy Kandasami, echoed similar sentiments following a meeting with an Indian all-party delegation. She said the message brought by the del-

egation was clear -- that India seeks peace and development, not conflict.

"There was a detailed explanation of what had happened on 22 April, and the Indian government's measured reaction after the attack. The all-party delegation very clearly conveyed the aspiration of the Indian government that India is not at all interested in war," Kandasami told agency.

Highlighting India's economic focus, Kandasami said, "India, as the world's fourth-largest economy, is focused on continued economic growth with the goal of becoming the third-largest economy. There needs to be an end to this aggression... They were seeking support from Malaysia and other countries in this region."

She emphasised that India and Pakistan are both friendly countries to Malaysia and noted that the Indian delegation urged Malaysia to help convey the message of peace and development to Pakistan. "They brought us this message so that we could convey it to Pakistan--that the need of the hour is not conflict, but economic development," she added.

Reaffirming Malaysia's stance, Kandasami said, "Our response has been made very clear by our Prime Minister--that Malaysia also has zero tolerance towards any form of violence, be it in any part of the world."

The Group 3 Indian delegation, led by JD(U) MP Sanjay Kumar Jha, met with representatives of Malaysia's Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) - People's Justice Party - in Kuala Lumpur. The PKR delegation was headed by Deputy Minister Saraswathy Kandasami.

The Indian delegation includes Aparajita Sarangi (BJP), TMC MP Abhishek Banerjee, Brij Lala (BJP), John Brittas (CPI-M),

Pradan Baruah (BJP), Hemang Joshi (BJP), Salman Khurshid, and Mohan Kumar.

This meeting marked a significant engagement between Indian lawmakers and Malaysian political leaders as part of a broader diplomatic outreach to brief international partners on India's counter-terrorism efforts.

The visit comes in the backdrop of Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7 in response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack by Pakistan-sponsored terrorists, which killed 26 people. As part of the operation, Indian Armed Forces targeted terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir, eliminating over 100 terrorists affiliated with groups including Jaish-e-Mohammed, Lashkar-e-Taiba, and Hizbul Mujahideen.

The delegation's tour includes visits to Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Republic of Korea, and Singapore to highlight India's firm stance against cross-border terrorism and to reinforce its commitment to peace and development.

Smuggling and land grabs allegedly driving military profits in Pakistan

PARIS, Jun 2 (Agencies): Grave allegations have emerged against the Pakistan Army, accusing it of operating a billion-dollar economic empire built on unregulated businesses, corruption, and illicit trade with Balochistan at the core of its shadow economy.

Taha Siddigui, a Pakistani journalist living in exile in France, stated that the Pakistan Army maintains vast commercial interests across real estate, consumer goods, and agriculture. According to Siddiqui, the military's business ventures are prioritised in the allocation of government contracts, functioning with little oversight or accountability.

"Due to such financial interests, its professional role as a military force has come under fire," Siddiqui said. "But given its authoritarian control and its manipulation of the judiciary and political class, the army continues to exploit the Pakistani nation for its own benefit."

Qambar Baloch, General Secretary of the Baloch Advocacy and Studies Centre (BASC), said that Balochistan has long served as a profitable zone for Pakistan's military elite. He alleged that the army has built an illicit, unregulated economy in the province, driven by border smuggling, drug trafficking, and the misappropriation of public funds.

He highlighted the 900-kilometrelong Goldsmid Line -- the border between Pakistan and Iran -- as a major corridor in an extensive fuel smuggling operation. "Each day, around 6 to 8 million litres of Iranian petroleum enter Pakistancontrolled Balochistan. Approximately 40 percent of the vehicles involved reportedly belong to the Pakistan Army, its informers, or pro-army death squads," Baloch stated.

While local traders are limited to loading their vehicles once every 30 to 40 days, army-affiliated transporters operate daily -- allegedly earning the military nearly \$1 million per day through this illicit trade.

Baloch also accused the Pakistan Maritime Security Agency and the Pakistan Coast Guard -- the latter commanded by an army officer -- of facilitating illegal trawling by Chinese and Karachi-based fishing vessels. "This practice is rapidly depleting marine resources in Balochistan's coastal waters and is devastating the livelihoods of local fishermen," he warned.

Simultaneously, the army has reportedly acquired prime coastal land in Gwadar and has been aggressively promoting investment by overseas Pakistanis and foreign entities, further marginalising the local population.

Baloch added that six of the nine major drug trafficking routes from Afghanistan pass through Balochistan. Despite the heavy presence of security checkpoints manned by various agencies, narcotics move freely, while ordinary citizens face frequent and rigorous inspections -- raising suspicions of complicity by the authorities.

The Pakistan Army is also accused of draining the provincial budget under the guise of security. In 2018 alone, between Rs 20 and 30 million per month was reportedly spent on the Frontier Corps (FC) to police Quetta. The Auditor General of Pakistan highlighted

financial irregularities of over Rs 570 million involving the FC in 2014. That same year, the National Accountability Bureau uncovered widespread corruption, including smuggled luxury vehicles and links to drug trafficking.

According to Baloch, the army's influence over electoral processes in Balochistan has allowed it to extract bribes from candidates seeking office. Seats are often awarded to military loyalists -- many of whom are allegedly involved in drug trafficking and the suppression of nationalist voices.

"Moreover, the army-run Frontier Works Organisation (FWO) has monopolised highway construction contracts and entered mineral exploration through a partnership with Pakistan Petroleum Limited. Their operations target copper and gold deposits in Eastern Chagai, covering 239 square kilometres under license EL-207," Baloch added.

These revelations raise serious concerns about Pakistan's compliance with Financial Action Task Force (FATF) standards. The reported activities suggest significant lapses in Anti-Money Laundering (AML), Counter-Terrorism Financing (CTF), anti-corruption frameworks, and judicial enforcement.

As international scrutiny intensifies over the Pakistan Army's dominance and its alleged economic exploitation of Balochistan, calls are mounting for independent investigations, judicial accountability, and structural reforms to dismantle what critics describe as a "military-mafia" system entrenched in the state.

TOKYO, Jun 2 (Agencies): Four people were found dead in a suspected murder-suicide on Monday in the western Japanese prefecture of Osaka, local media reported. An emergency call was made around 6:20 a.m. local time to report a man collapsed on a street in Suita City in Osaka Prefecture.

The 26-year-old man was later pronounced



dead at a hospital, Kyodo News reported. Police visited his home nearby where they Police identified the

The new case was reported after Pakistan on Sunday wrapped up its third nationwide polio vaccination drive of the year, aiming to immunize 45 million children. Mohammad Igbal, a director at the polio program in the northwest, said local health officials were still trying to determine how the poliovirus that was found in the southern port city of Karachi had infected the child in Diamer.

During the summer season, thousands of tourists from Karachi and elsewhere visit tourist resorts in Gilgit-Baltistan.

Pakistan's polio eradication program has been running anti-polio campaigns for years, though health workers and the police assigned to protect them are often targeted by militants who falsely claim the vaccination campaigns are a Western conspiracy to sterilize children. Since the 1990s, attacks on polio vaccination teams have killed more than 200 workers and security personnel.

RCB and Virat Kohli's 18-year wait meets Punjab Kings' tenacity as IPL set to crown new winner

AHMEDABAD, Jun 2 (Agencies): Virat Kohli's nearly twodecade long agonising wait to lay hands on an IPL Trophy with Royal Challengers Bengaluru will be up against Shreyas lyer's resolve to make first-time winners out of the tenacious Punjab Kings when the 18th season finale of the world's biggest T20 league unfolds here on Tuesday.

The summit clash here at the Narendra Modi Stadium could witness a thousands of fans donning jersey No.18 to support Kohli, who is in an IPL final for a fourth time overall.

The sentiments of the fans would indeed run high given it will be Kohli's last appearance on the cricket field for a while, having recently retired from Test cricket and India's next ODI assignment a few months away. Parting ways with issues that plagued their previous campaigns, RCB have been clini-

cal all the way through, coming into the final with an eight-wicket hammering of Punjab in a onesided Qualifier 1.

Kohli (614 runs) has gone about his business like every other year, piling up runs at the top and continuing to lay platforms, but where it has made the difference for RCB is that there's a lot more substance to their batting beyond the superstar

Kohli has not been the only one to carry the focus and atten-



tion this year, rather he has quietly gone about his business in fortifying for RCB.

Phil Salt is a perfect foil for the Indian superstar who goes allout in his attack, while Mayank Agarwal, skipper Rajat Patidar and Jitesh Sharma are the trusted lieutenants of that batting line-up.

Since he has missed RCB's last two games, it remains to be seen if Tim David is fit for this contest as he forms a vital death overs batting pair with another burly hitter in Romario Shepherd.

Like Kohli in their batting, the calm and composed Josh Hazlewood (21 wickets) has been at the helm of RCB's rise and the fourth highest wickettaker and the Australian would want to add more to move up the ladder in one last game.

Rajeev Shukla set to become acting BCCI president as incumbent Binny hits age cap

NEW DELHI, Jun 2 (Agencies): Veteran cricket administrator Rajeev Shukla is set to replace Roger Binny as BCCI president in an interim capacity after the latter turns 70 next month, BCCI sources told agency on Monday.

Binny, who had replaced Sourav Ganguly as the Board president in 2022, turns 70 on July 19, crossing the age-limit threshold for a BCCI office-bearer.

Shukla, 65, is currently serving as the BCCI vice-president, a post he has held since 2020. He would be the active BCCI chief until fresh elections are held during the

The Rajya Sabha MP from the Congress party has previously also served as the chairman of the Indian Premier League (IPL).

AHMEDABAD, Jun 2 (Agencies): Skipper Shreyas lyer uncorked a remarkable unbeaten 87 to carry Punjab Kings to a five-wicket win over Mumbai Indians in the Qualifier 2 here on Sunday, and to the IPL final against Royal Challengers Bengaluru, ensuring the league will have a new champion on June 3.

This will be Punjab's first title clash since 2014, and second successive for lyer as captain after marshalling Kolkata Knight Riders' triumph in 2024.

Chasing 204, lyer stood tall with an imperious knock (87 not out. 41b, 5x4, 8x6) as PBKS moved past the target with an over to spare.

Once Mumbai posted a 200-plus total, Punjab required someone to play with composure and a sense of purpose, and they found the best man in their ranks putting his hand up.

However, lyer and PBKS will also profusely thank the plucky Nehal Wadhera for exploiting his two reprieves to peel off an important 48 off 29 balls and adding 84 runs for the fourth wicket with his captain.

Stuart Broad takes first coaching role post retirement, joins SA as consultant ahead of WTC final against rival Australia

JOHANNESBURG, Jun 2 (Agencies): Former England pacer Stuart Broad has been roped in as a consultant for the South Africa men's team ahead of the ICC World Test Championship final against Australia, reported the International Cricket Council (ICC) on Monday.

Taking on his first coaching role since retiring in 2023, Broad will attend Proteas training on June 9 at Lord's as Temba Bavuma's side aim to dethrone Australia as defending World Test Championship mace-holders.

Broad took 604 wickets in 167 Tests, second on England's all-time list, of which he took 153 of those against Australia, the most by any player in red-ball history. The fast bowler also boasts a strong record at Lord's, taking 113 wickets in 28 Test matches. This experience and expertise of Broad against Aussies will help SA in their preparation for their first-ever major world title in cricket.

The Proteas have convened in the UK and face Zimbabwe at Arundel Castle Cricket Ground in Sussex from Tuesday in their Final build-up, before their meeting with Australia on June 11.

Australia are defending champions, having beaten India at The Oval in 2023.

The Proteas' WTC journey started with a 1-1 drawn series against India at home, before being handed a 2-0 series defeat by New Zealand, as per ICC.

They then travelled to the West Indies, winning 1-0, before picking up pace with 2-0 wins against both Bangladesh and Sri Lanka. This meant that a thrilling two-wicket win against Pakistan at Centurion was enough to help them

seal their berth in the showdown. They eventually went on to win the series 2-0 against Pakistan, earning their seventh consecutive Test win in this cycle, helping the Proteas qualify as the table toppers with eight wins, three losses and a draw. The ICC number one-ranked Test team Australia started their journey to the WTC Final with two Ashes wins before England's comeback to draw the series 2-2. This was followed by a clinical clean sweep at home, winning three Tests against Pakistan. They were not able to finish the home Test summer unbeaten, dropping the second Test against the West Indies to draw 1-1 thanks to Shamar Joseph's heroics for the tourists in Brisbane . A 2-0 sweep away from home against New Zealand followed, before Australia hosted India for the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. After being handed a huge defeat in the first Test. Australia hit back with three wins in the next four Tests to help them seal their spot in the Ultimate Test. The Aussies' final two Tests of the WTC 2023-25 cycle concluded with the visitors defeating Sri Lanka 2-0 in the subcontinent and finishing second in the table.

MELBOURNE, Jun 2 (Agencies): Australian all-rounder Glenn Maxwell on Monday retired from ODIs to focus on next year's T20 World Cup in India and Sri Lanka, saying that he did not want to "play for selfish reasons" given how his body has been struggling to hold up.

The 36-year-old explosive batter and often underestimated off-spin bowler played 149 ODI matches for Australia including what is regarded by many the greatest one-day innings of all-time.

Maxwell came in against Afghanistan at the 2023 World Cup with his side reeling at 7-91. In a high-pressure situation and battling severe cramps in searing heat, he smashed 201 off just 128 balls to snatch victory from jaws of defeat. Australia went on to win the World Cup, beating favourites India in Ahmedabad.

"I felt like I was letting the team down a little bit with how body was reacting to the conditions. I had a good chat with (Chair of Selec-



tors) George Bailey and I asked him what his thoughts were going forward," he told the 'Final Word Podcast'.

"Glenn's ballistic batting has lit up the cricket world and been one of the cornerstones of Australia's continued success in the 50 over game, including his heroic role in the 2023 World Cup triumph," he said.

"As with other greats of the game, crowds have flocked to grounds just to watch Glenn bat and children have been inspired to pick up a bat after seeing him put opposition attacks to the sword with a breathtaking array of shots." Former Australia captain and current chief selector George Bailey too spoke glowingly of Maxwell.

"Glenn will be known as one of the one-day game's most dynamic players, who had key roles in two ODI World Cup victories.

"His level of natural talent and skill is remarkable. Fortunately, he still has much to offer Australia in the T20 format. All things going well he will be pivotal in the next 12 months as we build toward the World Cup early next year," said Bailey.

Delay in Panchayat polls blocking development funds: AJKPC Rural governance paralyzed in J&K, rural areas worst-affected: Anil

JAMMU, Jun 2: All Jammu and Kashmir Panchayat Conference (AJKPC) has expressed deep concern over the prolonged delay in holding Panchayat elections in the Union Territory while pointing out that more than a year has passed since the dissolution of Panchayats on January 9, 2024.

In a strong appeal to the Union Territory administration, AJKPC president Anil Sharma, during a press conference, has called for immediate action to restore grassroots democracy and unlock developmental funds meant for rural areas. Sharma said that fail-

ure to conduct elections within one year of dissolution has resulted in blockage of funds meant for Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs). These funds, he stressed, are vital for the execution of key development proj-



ects across rural areas of Jammu and Kashmir. "We had hoped that once Assembly elections were conducted in Jammu and Kashmir, the Panchavat elections would follow. Unfortunately, that has not

happened," the AJKPC leader said. He regretted that rural development has been severely impacted due to the absence of elected Panchayat bodies. Projects related to roads, electricity, drink-

ing water supply, and ration distribution have reportedly slowed down or come to a complete halt in many areas. He also reminded the government of its longstanding demand for the establishment of a State

Election Commission (SEC) that is independent of political influence and capable of conducting elections on time. "We fought for the

establishment of a State Election Commission so that the people are not

dependent on political parties for the conduct of elections. However things are not moving in right directions as elections are getting delayed," the AJKPC leader said.

He has urged the administration to not delay further, and to set a clear timeline for both Panchayat and Block Development Council (BDC) elections. The delay, they warned, is not only a setback to democratic governance,

but also a major roadblock to rural development and delivery of essential services.

The AJKPC leader has said that the dissolution of Panchayats, and the delay in fresh elections, has left a democratic vacuum at the village level. "Elections are not a formality-they are a necessity.

Without them, rural governance is paralyzed, and the common man suffers," he said. "We request the gov-

ernment to conduct the elections without further delay. The UT administration

must take responsibility and act in the interest of rural people who are waiting for development, accountability, and representation," the AJKPC leader concluded. Prominent among those who were present on the occasion includ-
