The 272 km long USBRL project, constructed at a cost of around Rs 43,780 crore includes 36 tunnels (spanning 119 km) and 943 bridges.

The project establishes all-weather, seamless rail connectivity between Kashmir and the rest of the country aiming to transform regional mobility and drive socio-economic integration.

Prime Minister Modi will also flag off two Vande Bharat Express trains from Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Katra to

Srinagar and back. They will offer a swift, comfortable, and reliable travel option for residents, tourists, pil-

grims among others. In a major boost to last mile connectivity especially in border areas, Modi will lay the foundation stone and inaugurate various road projects.

He will lay the foundation stone of road widening project from Rafiabad to Kupwara on National Highway-701 and the construction of Shopian bypass road on NH-444 worth over Rs 1,952 crore.

He will also inaugurate two flyover projects at Sangrama Junction on National Highway-1 in Srinagar and at Bemina Junction on National Highway-44. These

projects will ease traffic congestion and enhance traffic flow for the commuters. Prime Minister Modi

will also lay the foundation stone of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Institute of Medical Excellence in Katra worth over Rs 350 crore. It will be the first medical college in Reasi district contributing substantially to the

Its discontinuation has triggered a prolonged economic lull in the city," Mahajan stated.

He further added that while the intention behind ending Darbar Move was cited as saving public funds, the larger consequence

has been economic stagnation in Jammu. "Jammu used to bustle with activity during the Durbar months. Now the markets are dull, footfall is low, and traders are struggling to survive. If the government really wants to promote equitable growth, then the Darbar Move must be resumed," he emphasized.

Abhinavagupta a saint, Philosopher and mystic incarnation

bhinavagupta Jayanti this year falls on 5th of June 2025 Thursday.His Jayanti should be celebrated with great devotion. Kashmiri Pandits should feel proud to be the inheritors of great saints, seers and philosophers.Abhinavaguphta [C.950 -1016 CE] was a highly influential philosophe, mystic, and aesthetician from Kashmir Known for his contributions to Kashmir Shaivism. especially his work on Tantra.His birth anniversary, Abhinavagupta Javanti, is celebrated annually, particularly on the Nirjala Ekadashi often on June. The celebrations often involve scholarly discussions ,religious rituals, and the remembrance of his profound philosophical and spiritual insights. Abhinavagupta was a central figure in Kashmir Shaivism, a system of nondualistic philosophy that emphasized the interconnectedness of all things and the ultimate reality of Shiva.He developed a comprehensive methodology for Kashmir Shaivism, integrating its various schools. A-Tantricism---He was a key figure in the development of Tantric practices within Kashmir Shaivism, exploring the potential pf ritual and mediation for realising the divine.His most famous work,"Tantraloka ",is an encylopedic treatise on the philosophical and practical aspects of Kashmir Shaivism.B—Aesthetics---He made significant contributions to Indian philosophy of aesthetics, particularly with his commentary on the Natyashastra of Bharata Muni, known as Abhinavabharati.He explored the nature of rasa -aesthetic emotion and its role in artistic expression.HisNatyashatra has most recently recognised by UNESCO.C---Other works-Abhinavagupta wrote extensively on various subjects, including philosophy, literature, poetics, and the nature of sound.He is credited with authoring over 35 works, many of which have been lost.D—His work continues to be studied and admired for its profound insights into the nature of reality, the role of consciousness, and the path to spiritual realisation. Abhinavagupta Jayanti is a significant event in the Shaiva tradition, marking the birth anniversary of this great philosopher of yore.It is celebrated with various religious, scholarlydiscussions, and commemorations of his life and works. The Jayanti serves as a reminder of Abhinavagupta's profound contributions to Indian thought and spirituality, and it inspires ongoing engagement with his teachings.Many universities and organisations around the world organise webinars, and paper presentations to commemorate his Jayanti, highlighting the global impact of his work.Abhinavagupta was a philosopher.mystic and aesthetician from Kashmir.He was considered an influential musician, poet, dramatist, exegete, theologian and logician -a polymathic personality who exercised strong influence on Indian culture.Abhinavagupta was born in a Kanyakubja Brahmin family of scholars and mystics whose ancestors immigrated from Kannauj on invitation by the great king of Kashmir, Lalitaditya Muktapida . He studied all the schools of philosophy and art of his time under the guidance of as many as fifteen teachers and gurus. In his long life he completed over 35 works ,the largest and most famous of which is Tantraloka, an encyclopedic treatise on all the philosophical and practical aspects of Kaula, and Trika [known today as Kashmir Shaivism]., Another one of his important contributions was in the field of philosophy of aesthetics with his famous Abhinavabharati commentary of Natyasastra of Bharat Muni."Abhinavagupta" was not his real name ,rather a title he earned from his Guru , meaning "competence and authoritativeness ."In his analysis ,Jayaratha who was Abhinavagupta's most important commentator -also reveals three more meanings-"being ever vigilant'', ''being present everywhere" and "protected by praises."Gnoli ,the only Sanskrit scholar who completed a translation of Tantraloka in a European language, mentions that "Abhivana "also means "new", as a reference to the ever -new creative force of his mystical experience. From Jayaratha ,we learn that Abhinavagupta was in possession of all the six qualities required for the recipients of the tremendous level of Saktipata, as described in the sacred text [Sripurvasastra] an unflinching faith in God , realisation of mantras , control

over objective principles [referring to the 36 tattvas], successful conclusion of all the activities undertaken, poeticcreativity and spontaneous knowledge of all disciplines.Abhinavagupta's creation is well equilibrated between the branches of the triad [trika], will[iccha] ,knowledge[jana],action[kriya],his works also include devotional songs ,academical /philosophical works and works describing ritual /yogic practices.As an author,he is considered as systematiser of the philosophical thought .He reconstructed, rationalized and orchestrated the philosophical knowledge into a more coherent form, assessing all the available sources of his time ,not unlike a modern scientific researcher. Various contemporary scholars have characterised Abhinavagupta as a "brilliant scholar and saint,""the pinnacle of the development of Kashmir Shaivism" and "in possession of yogic realisation."His was a magical birth.The term by which Abhinavagupta himself defines his origin is 'Yognibhu',born of a Yogini.In Kashmir Shaivism and especially in Kaula it is considered that a progeny of parents "established in the divine essence of Bhairava ,is endowed with exceptional spiritual and intellectual prowess.Such a child is supposed to be "the depository of knowledge", who "even as a child in the womb, has the form of Shiva, to enumerate but a few of the classical attributes of his kind.Abhivavagupta was born in a Kanyakubja Brahmin family in Kashmir.His mother, Vimala died when Abhinavagupta was just two years old,as a consequence of losing his mother, whom he was reportedly very attached, he grew more distant from worldly life and focussed all the more on spiritual endeavour. The father, Narasimgupt, after his wife's death favoured an ascetic lifestyle, while raising his three children.He had a cultivated mind and a heart "outstandingly adorned with devotion to Mahesvara -Shiva .Abhinavagupta's first teacher, instructing him in grammar, logic and literature. By Abhivnavagupta's own account ,his most remote known ancestor was called Atrigupta, born in antarvedKanyakubja in Madhyadesha ,i.e,the middle country.From Madhyadesha, he travelled to Kashmir at the request of King Lalitad-

itya, around year 740 CE. Abhivnavagupta is famous for his voracious thirst for Knowledge.To study he took many teachers -as many as fifteen, both mystical philosophers and scholars. He approached Vaisnavas, Buddhists, S iddhantaSaivists, and the Trika scholars. Among the of most prominent of his teachers, he enumerates four, two of whom were Vamanatha, who instructed him in dualistic Saivism, and Bhutiraja in the dualistic /nondualist school, Besides, being the teacher of the famous Abhinavaguopta ,Bhutiraja was also the father of two eminent scholars.For Abhinavagupta,Sambhunatha was the most admired guru. Describing the greatness of his master, he compared Sambhunatha to the sun, in his power to dispel ignorance from the heart, and, in another place, with "the moon shinning over the ocean of Trika knowledge.Abhinavagupta remained unmarried all his life, and as an adept of Kaula, at least initially maintained brahmacharya and supposedly used the vital force of his energy -ojas to deepen his understanding of the spiritual nervous system he outlined in his works—a system involving ritual union between Purusha as Shiva and Shakti.Such union is essentially non-physical and universal, and thus he conceived himself as always in communion with Shiva and Shakti.He lived his life as a writer and teacher.. Abhinavagupta's personality was described as a living realisation of his vision.To conclude it is no exaggeration to say that Abhinavagupta was a mystic poet, philosopher, saint,teacher, author and a great Shaivaite scholar famous in the whole Indian.Let us celebrate his birth anniversary with great devotion and resolve to follow his principles and teachings.

Thathri Development Front appeals for tourism development, and road connectivity in Doda District

DODA, Jun 5: The members of the Thathri Development Front, District Doda, have issued a heartfelt appeal to the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi. the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu & Kashmir UT, Manoj Sinha, former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Member of Parliament Dr. Jitendra Singh, and local MLAs Daleep Singh Parihar and Mehraj Malik, urging them to focus attention on the neglected Sub-Division Thathri and develop it into a tourism hub.

They highlighted the immense potential of natural sites like Jantron Dhar, Mata Rashwar Temple, and Lamote Dhar, which remain underdeveloped despite their scenic beauty and religious significance. The region of Thathri, which stretches from Panshee to Goilla, is surrounded by beautiful villages such as Joura Kalan, Joura Khurd, Shamdlian, Budhi, Halaran, Sichal, Ranote, Goilla, Chirra, Dadi-Kathava, Rokali, and several others from

Chiralla Tehsil. These locations can be developed into major tourist attractions similar to Gulmarg, but have long been neglected by successive state governments. Despite comprising five full-fledged tehsils-Kahara. Thathri, Phaqsoo, Bhella, and Chirrala-the Sub-

Division has not been given its due share in tourism development. The Front has therefore demanded the creation of a separate Tourism Development Authority for Sub-Division Thathri to bring it into focus under various tourism promotion schemes.

The Front also emphasized the importance of completing several long-pending road projects in the region, which are crucial for boosting connectivity and promoting tourism. One of the major demands is the completion of the Kahara-Jai Road from Joura Kalan to Lambi Jai (10 km stretch), a project pending since 1987. They also stressed

the need to finish the remaining 5 km of the Thathri-Chirra Road, from Chirra to Gallu Top, which, once completed, would open up access to remote areas and facilitate tourism.

Moreover, they proposed that Gallu Top be connected to Joura through a 2 km link, which would bridge vital points in the circuit. Another vital proposal was the completion of a 5 km stretch connecting Joura Khurd to the Chiralla-Panshaee Road, which would help complete the regional road network. A dditionally, the

Halaran–Khatassu Road needs to be completed and linked with Badano through a mere 3 km stretch, further strengthening the circuit. These small yet significant road

works would drastically improve transportation in the region and make tourist sites easily accessible.

The Thathri Development Front has asserted that completion of these pending infrastructure projects would not only bring an end to the longstanding hardships faced by the people of these five tehsils but would also generate employment for thousands of youth and bring Thathri onto the tourism map of Jammu & Kashmir. They have appealed to all relevant authorities to take immediate steps to

fulfill these long-standing demands for the greater development of the region.





What was supposed to be a jubilant celebration of Royal Challengers Bengaluru's (RCB) maiden IPL title turned into a horrifying tragedy on Wednesday evening. A massive stampede outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru claimed the lives of 11 people and left at least 47 others injured. The incident unfolded just before the team's official victory celebration was set to begin, raising serious concerns over crowd control and preparedness by local authorities.

As the nation mourned the loss of lives, several celebrities took to social media to express their shock and sorrow over the incident.

Actor R Madhavan shared his grief through an Instagram story, stating, "This is so heartbreaking. Heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families. Please be responsible and safe and do not respond to rumours without checking with the authorities



(sic)." Actor-politician Kamal Haasan also expressed his anguish over the unfortunate turn of events, writing, "Heart wrenching tragedy in Bangalore. Deeply distressed and my heart reaches out to the families of the victims in this moment of grief. May the injured recover soon (sic)."

Actor Vivek Oberoi posted a detailed message on X (formerly Twitter), offering his condolences: "Deepest sorrow fills us as we mourn the lives tragically lost in the Bengaluru stampede. It's truly saddening to lose loved ones, especially during what should have been a moment of

collective joy in cricket (sic)." He further added, "To the families and friends now facing this unimaginable void, our hearts ache with yours. We send our deepest condolences and heartfelt support, hoping you find some solace amidst this profound grief. May strength and peace be with you (sic)."

India and RCB cricketer Virat Kohli, who was present at the stadium, said he was "at a loss for words" and "absolutely gutted" in an Instagram post. The RCB star shared the franchise's official statement, mourning the incident.

The team had begun the day by visiting the Vidhana Soudha, where they were felicitated by Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah. However, tragedy struck before the players could reach the stadium. Following the stampede, the planned victory celebrations were cut short. Only Kohli and RCB captain Rajat Patidar addressed the crowd before displaying the trophy to a packed stadium.

The horrifying incident has now cast a dark shadow over what was meant to be a historic and joyous occasion, with the nation and the cricketing world in collective mourning.

for such things, but even in metros, we can take small steps. That first baby step is all it takes." Now a mother, Rubina says her mission has taken on even greater meaning: "The only way I can teach my daughters to respect and nurture nature is by immersing them in the same environment I grew up in. They're happiest back home, surrounded by nature, just like we sisters were."

In fact, she and her husband, actor Abhinav Shukla, have made it a tradition to mark special moments with Nature. "On their birth and every birthday, we plant a tree in their name (children). It's our way of giving back to the Earth — and ensuring our daughters grow up as part of a truly green legacy," she signs off.

For Hollywood director Bronwen Hughes, stepping onto the set of her latest film—a romantic comedy set against the vibrant chaos of an Indian wedding feels less like entering foreign territory and more like coming home.

Known for her work across genres and acclaimed projects like Forces of Nature, Breaking Bad, The Journey Is the Destination among others, Hughes is now diving into something wholly new and yet deeply resonant—a cross-cultural tale of love, laughter, and self-discovery, rooted in the sensory splendor of Indian tradition.

In an exclusive conversation, this Canada-born director opens up about her journey. "I didn't realise there were so few female directors when I started," Hughes says with a laugh, reflecting on her early days in the industry. "That was my greatest protection."

Unaware of the gender imbalance, she drew inspiration from bold visionaries like Jane Campion, Claire Denis and Mira Nair—women who, like her, simply began. "My hope," she adds, "is that the next generation doesn't even notice it's unusual anymore. And honestly, from what I see on my sets today, that's already happening."

With stories in every language and culture now a click away, Hughes believes we're living in a 'global village'. "Streaming has opened up the world in ways theatrical releases never could. We can now experience other lives, other cultures, from anywhere. That's the real evolution."

This evolution led her to her latest project, a romantic

comedy centered on an Indian wedding-a genre she first explored in Forces of Nature for Spielberg's DreamWorks Studios. "I was interested in showing that few can find happiness in many forms, not always the same or expected. After that, I was offered many rom-coms, but they seemed to me to be stuck without a modern look at the woman's self-actualisation." But for Hughes, this story does more than follow genre conventions. "It digs deeper than just marriage. It's really about the eternal questions- how we become the best version of ourselves."

Explaining the themes further, Huges adds, "This story is modern, progressive and sometimes arcs towards a different way of finding happiness."

And the settings in which she is exploring the genre —an Indian wedding and modern Indian cities -has been an immersion in every sense of the word. Huges and her crew, which recently stayed at a hotel hosting a real wedding, have been 'crashing' sangeets and barats with open arms and wider eyes. "Indian weddings are cinema gold," she gushes. "The colours, the textures, the soundscapenothing else compares. Indian creativity around weddings is never-ending and I am learning something new every day. Even the local crew is debating which version of which ceremony we should include. It's amazing."

Seven palace visits later, Hughes is still wide-eyed. "Six of them were setting up for weddings! It's like the universe said, 'Here, soak it in.""

With her signature wit and sensitivity, Hughes is rethinking



rom-com humour for an Indian context. "We're not trying to mimic a Western tone. We're staying true to these characters and their specific cultural reality. When you do that, the humour resonates naturally. Love, awkwardness, joy—those emotions are universal."

And as for her Indian collaborators? "They read my mind. They seem to know what I will like before I like it myself. Seriously. With such amazing crew recommendations, casting choices and now locations —they are next-level."

She beams while talking about her co-producer, Preeti Singh. "Preeti is pure fire. A laser beam. She's my cultural compass and creative co-conspirator. She makes sure we aim for excellence, always."

As for food, she can already navigate an Indian vegetarian menu like a pro. "I eat Indian food four times a week. And yes, I've been singing Hindi songs to the crew. You should've seen their faces!"

Hughes has directed everyone from Sandra Bullock and Ben Affleck to Bryan Cranston and Bob Odenkirk. Her secret? "Psychology," she says. "Actors famous or not—work best when you understand what they need from you. You have to read the room. Create the space they need to fly. And the same goes for all creatives in the team. I hope to cheerlead the best out of every department."

As for her directing style, it's ever-evolving. "Each film demands a different language visually, emotionally, structurally. I try never to get stuck in one way of seeing."

Looking back, instead of an advice to her younger self, Hughes has a thing or two to learn. "Young me was a better director because she didn't know what was impossible, so anything felt possible. I try to keep that spirit alive. I try not to curb my ideas. Sweat is not the problem. We film people love to work hard."

As for her next project, she won't spill all the details just yet, but Hughes hints at future stories dancing around in her head—literally. "Let's just say music and dance will play a big role."

For now, Bronwen Hughes is focused on bringing to life one very special love story—set against the backdrop of traditions older than time, told with the freshness of a modern voice, and wrapped in the colour and heart of India. It's a match made in cinematic heaven.

Stay tuned, the shadi—and the storytelling—have only just begun.

Modi will on Friday launch multiple development projects worth more than Rs 46,000 crore at Katra in Jammu and Kashmir and inaugurate the Chenab bridge, the world's highest railway arch bridge. He will also flag off Vande Bharat trains between Katra and Srinagar

In a post on X, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh noted that the prime minister is visiting Jammu and Kashmir tomorrow. "Surely he is aware that the terrorists directly responsible for the brutal terrorist attacks at Pahalgam on April 22nd have still not been brought to

justice. And according to some reports that have not been denied, these very terrorists were also involved in the terror attacks in Poonch in Dec 2023 and in Gagangir and Gulmarg in Oct 2024," Ramesh said.

Last month, Ramesh cited news reports that the terrorists responsible for the Pahalgam attack were also involved in three earlier terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir, and said there should be a clarification from the government on the issue. 

Israel says it has recovered the bodies of two Israeli-American hostages from the Gaza Strip

TEL AVIV. Jun 5 (Agencies): Israel has recovered the bodies of two Israeli-American hostages taken in Hamas' Oct. 7, 2023, attack that ignited the war in the Gaza Strip, officials said Thursday. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the remains of Judih Weinstein and Gad Haggai were recovered and returned to Israel in a special operation by the army and the Shin Bet internal security agency.

"Together with all the citizens of Israel, my wife and I extend our heartfelt condolences to the dear families. Our hearts ache for the most terrible loss. May their memory be blessed," he said in a statement.

Kibbutz Nir Oz announced the deaths of Weinstein, 70, and Haggai, 72, both of whom had Israeli and U.S. citizenship, in December 2023.

"My beautiful parents have been freed. We have certainty," their daughter, Iris Haggai Liniado, wrote in a Facebook post. She thanked the Israeli military, the FBI and the Israeli and U.S. governments and called for the release of all the remaining hostages.

The couple were survived by two sons and two daughters and seven grandchildren, the kibbutz said. Hamas-led militants

killed some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, in the Oct. 7 attack and abducted 251 hostages. They are still holding 56 hostages, around a third of them believed to be

alive, after most of the rest were released in ceasefire agreements or other deals. Israeli forces have rescued eight living hostages from Gaza and recovered dozens of bodies. Israel's military campaign has killed over 54,000 Palestinians, mostly women and children, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not say how many of the dead were civilians or combatants. The offensive has destroyed large parts of Gaza and displaced around 90% of its population of roughly 2 million Palestinians.

Ceasefire talks deadlocked

The United States, Egypt and Qatar have been trying to broker another ceasefire and hostage release after Israel ended an earlier truce in March and imposed a blockade that has raised fears of famine, despite being eased in recent weeks. But the talks appear to

Hamas says it will only release the remaining hostages in return for more Palestinian prisoners, a lasting ceasefire and an Israeli withdrawal from Gaza. It has offered to hand over power to a politically independent Palestinian committee.

Trump announces travel ban affecting a dozen countries set to go into effect Monday

WASHINGTON, Jun 5 (Agencies): President Donald Trump is resurrecting the travel ban policy from his first term, signing a proclamation Wednesday night preventing people from a dozen countries from entering the United States

The countries include Afghanistan, Myanmar, Chad, the Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan and Yemen.

In addition to the ban, which takes effect at 12:01 a.m. Monday, there will be heightened restrictions on visitors from Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo. Turkmenistan and Venezuela.

"I must act to protect the national security and national interest of the United States and its people," Trump said in his proclamation. Ten of the 19 coun-

tries under the bans and restrictions are in Africa, nine of those from majority Black African countries. Several of those, including Sierra Leone, Togo, and Equatorial Guinea, are not known for hosting armed groups that pose

a major threat to the

West. The list results from a Jan. 20 executive order Trump issued requiring the departments of State and Homeland Security and the Director of National Intelligence to compile a report on "hos-



tile attitudes" toward the U.S. and whether entry from certain countries represented a national security risk

During his first term, Trump issued an executive order in January 2017 banning travel to the U.S. by citizens of seven predominantly Muslim countries -Iraq, Syria, Iran, Sudan,

South Korean lawmakers approve special investigations into martial law, Yoon's wife

SEOUL, Jun 5 (Agencies): South Korea's liberal-led legislature overwhelmingly passed bills Thursday to launch special investigations into former President Yoon Suk Yeol's shortlived imposition of martial law in December and criminal allegations against his wife, targeting the ousted conservative a day after his liberal successor took office.

The National Assembly also passed a bill to initiate an independent investigation into the 2023 drowning death of a marine during a search-and-rescue operation for flood victims, an incident the Democratic Party, which holds majority, accuses Yoon's government of covering up

The bills previously had been vetoed by Yoon during his term and by South Korea's caretaker government after his Dec. 14 impeachment.

President Lee Jaemyung, a Democrat who won Tuesday's snap election triggered by Yoon's removal from office, is expected to sign the bills.

Many members of the conservative People Power Party refused to

participate in the votes. which took place after one of the party's lawmakers accused the liberals of being driven by vendetta

Kim Yong-min, a Democratic Party lawmaker, said the conservatives were effectively defending Yoon's imposition of martial law by repeatedly opposing investigations into it. "That's why they failed

to win public support and were rejected by voters in the presidential election," he said in a speech.

Lee, who drove the legislative efforts to impeach Yoon, pinned his presidential campaign on unity, promising not to target conservatives and calling for an end to political polarization.

Yet Lee has vowed a full investigation into Yoon's martial law imposition and the allegations surrounding his wife, moves that could overshadow the new government and inflame tensions as Yoon faces a high-stakes rebellion trial carrying a possible death sentence.

The Seoul Central District Prosecutors' Office has indicted Yoon on charges accusing Yoon of masterminding a

rebellion and enacting martial law as an illegal bid to seize the legislature and election offices and arrest political opponents. Liberals have insisted

independent investigations into Yoon are essential, saying probes by prosecutors, police and an anti-corruption agency were inadequate and hampered by Yoon's refusal to cooperate. If Lee approves the independent investigations, special prosecutors could request the transfer of relevant cases to expand those investigations or direct public or military prosecutors to continue handling them under their supervision. The bills calling for independent investigations into Yoon's martial law decree and criminal allegations involving his wife both passed by a vote of 194 to 3. Dozens of retired marines, dressed in red shirts, saluted and cheered from an obser-

vation box after lawmakers passed the bill for a special prosecutor investigation into the marine's death, which

also passed 194 to 3. Martial law lasted only a few hours after a quorum of lawmakers

pushed past a blockade of hundreds of heavily armed soldiers and voted to revoke the measure. Yoon defended the move as a necessary act of governance, accusing the Democrats, whom he labeled "anti-state forces," of abusing their majority to obstruct his agenda and paralyze state affairs.

That same majority now gives Lee a far more favorable path to advance his agenda, though conservatives claim it could grant him virtually unchecked power and allow him to pass laws that shield him from legal trouble.

Yoon's wife, Kim Keon Hee. also faces multiple corruption allegations, including claims that she received luxury items from a Unification Church official seeking business favors, as well as possible involvement in a stock price manipulation scheme. She also is suspected of interfering with PPP's candidate nominations ahead of legislative elections in April last year.

While in office, Yoon repeatedly dismissed calls to investigate his wife, denouncing them as baseless political attacks.

Six of 11 private firm employees abducted by militants in Pakistan rescued

PESHAWAR, Jun 5 (Agencies): Unidentified militants abducted 11 employees of a private company from Pakistan's northwestern province Khyber Pakhtunkhwa on Thursday, official sources said. However, police pursued the suspects

and rescued six of the abducted employees. On receiving the alert, District Police Officer Superintendent of Police Dera Ismail Khan and Counter Terrorism Department Superintendent of Police Shakeel Khan, along with their teams, reached the spot

and launched a search. A search operation is currently underway to rescue the remaining five hostages and nab the suspects. The employees, travelling in three vehicles of a private company, were were abducted near Domanda Bridge in Dera Ismail Khan district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province.

In a separate incident, residents of Tirah Valley in Khyber district bordering Afghanistan thwartenroute from Islamabad ed an attempt to abduct to Quetta when they a Pakistan army soldier.

China issues warrants for alleged Taiwanese hackers and bans a business for pro-independence links

TAIPEI, Jun 5 (Agencies): China issued warrants Thursday for 20 Taiwanese people it said carried out hacking missions in the Chinese mainland on behalf of the island's ruling party, while separately banning dealings with a Taiwanese company whose owners mainland authorities called "hardcore Taiwan independence supporters."

Police in the southern manufacturing hub of Guangzhou said they were led by a man named Ning Enwei on behalf of Taiwan's independence-leaning Democratic Progressive Party but did not identify their alleged crimes. Meanwhile, China's government

said all commercial contact had been banned with the Sicuens International Company Ltd., which it says are led by businessman Puma Shen and his father, calling

the two men independence supports.

Websites mentioning Sicuens say it specializes in sourcing bicycle parts from China.

Shen is also the head of the Kuma Academy, an organization that encourages Taiwanese people to prepare for possible invasion.

China considers Taiwan its own territory, to be brought under its control by force if necessary.

Zhu Fenglian, a spokesperson for the Taiwan Affairs Office of the China's Cabinet, said Sicuens "engages in trade and business cooperation with certain mainland enterprises in pursuit of economic benefits."

"The mainland side will never allow enterprises related to diehard 'Taiwan independence' supporters to seek profits in the mainland," Zhu was quoted as saying.

China last year announced punishments on Shen and the Kuma Academy, saying Shen had been "actively and systematically organizing activities promoting Taiwan independence."

The Academy's website says it "aims to prepare a prewar mentality for civilians, our mission is to cultivate self-defense capability and will to defend Taiwan. We provide knowledge and skills to help people sustain themselves and recognize enemy disinformation operations in both peace and wartime situations.'

Taiwan has responded by bulking up its own military, while some private individuals have opened camps for training in guerilla warfare.

Baramulla Police secures breakthrough in POCSO case as DNA evidence identifies perpetrator in minor's assault

On receiving information in January 2025, Kunzer Police Station registered FIR No. 04/2025 under relevant sections of the POCSO Act and BNS after a 16-year-old girl was found to be 25 weeks

pregnant during a medical examination at SDH Magam, read a police statement.

The investigation, led by then-SHO Kunzer Inspector Sheikh Adil revealed the minor had been repeatedly assaulted by multiple perpetrators. Initial inquiries led to the arrest of Mohd Rafiq Bhat(resident of Dhobiwan), Mohd Nasarullah Khan (resident of Hayhama Lolab, Kupwara) who were arrested for rape, aggravated sexual assault, and kidnapping under POCSO provisions, though DNA analysis excluded both of them as the father.

Through persistent efforts, investigators focused on Jawad Alam (resident of Champaran) as a prime suspect. Forensic matching confirmed his DNA matched the foetus, establishing him as the biological father and confirming his role in the sexual assault leading to the pregnancy.

Investigations confirmed all three accused independently assaulted the victim on multiple occasions, with Alam responsible for the conception.

"The business industry here is under unprecedented pressure. With the absence of state-level financial packages, lack of tax incentives, and declining increasingly difficult to sustain businesses," he said.

Mahajan suggested urged the government must undertake to support Jammu's economic revival by revival of Darbar Move to ensure equitable administrative and economic focus and restoration of full statehood to enhance regional governance and economic autonomy.

"The time has come to give Jammu its due. We are not against the progress of Kashmir, but Jammu must not be neglected. Restoring Darbar Move and Statehood will not only boost business morale but also create employment, revive trade, and restore public confidence in governance," Mahajan concluded.

His statement has resonated strongly across the local trade bodies, with many welcoming the call as a step in the right direction. As Jammu awaits economic rejuvenation, stakeholders hope the government listens to these urgent pleas for justice and balanced regional development.

Cyber Crime case solved by PS CICE Jammu; chargesheet filed against two accused

JAMMU, Jun 5: Police Station CICE Jammu has successfully solved a cybercrime and blackmailing case involving the creation of a fake Instagram profile and the circulation of obscene content.

The case has been chargesheeted following a comprehensive and professional investigation led by Inspector Jagdeep Singh.

The case originated from a complaint lodged by a distressed mother alleging that her daughter had fallen victim to online harassment.

As per the complaint, unknown persons had created a fake Instagram profile using a pornographic display picture (DP) of the victim. The perpetrators continued to harass and blackmail the girl by posting obscene material through various Instagram accounts and persistently stalking her.

Based on the seriousness of the allegations, a case-FIR No. 04/2025, dated January 31, 2025-was registered under Section 78 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) read with

Section 67 of the Information Technology Act, 2008 (Amended) against the accused individuals identified as Kunal Bharti (currently residing in Dubai) and Tirlok Chand Yadav, resident of Ajmer, Rajasthan.

Inspector Jagdeep Singh, the Investigating Officer, employed a combination of traditional policing and advanced technological tools to crack the case.

With assistance from telecom service providers and major social media platforms, crucial evidence was obtained. Modern investigative techniques such as reverse International Long Distance (ILD) and Internet Protocol Detail Records (IPDRs) were used to trace the origin of the posts and link them to the accused.

Both suspects were questioned using digital forensics and electronic gadgets, which enabled the collection of admissible evidence to support the prosecution. After compiling sufficient material, the charge sheet was formally filed before the City Judge Court, Jammu, on Thursday.

The public has widely lauded the efforts of the Jammu Police, particularly Inspector Jagdeep Singh, for his diligence and professional conduct throughout the investigation.

The case was handled under the close supervision of SHO PS CICE Jammu and Dy. SP Sachit Mahajan, with overall guidance and direction provided by Mohd Yaseen Kichloo (IPS), SSP CICE J&K.

This case highlights the increasing effectiveness of cyber policing in Jammu and Kashmir and sends a strong message that cyber harassment and exploitation will not be tolerated. The J&K Police has reiterated its commitment to protecting the dignity and safety of women and ensuring strict action against cybercriminals. A complaint was received from complainant alleging therein that her daughter has become

the victim of Cyber Crime and Blackmailing and the unknown persons have created a fake profile at Instagram and has uploaded pornographic picture as DP of the victim and continuously calling/stalking her by posting obscene material on various instagram IDs. On the basis of facts/disclosure, a

case FIR NO. 04/2025 dated 31.01.2025 was registered against the accused persons namely Kunal Bharti (presently at Dubai) and Tirlok Chand Yadav R/O Ajmer Rajasthan and investigation was entrusted to Inpsr. Jagdeep Singh, of PS CICE Jammu.

By conducting thorough, professional investigation, the Investigating Officer collected relevant documents/information from the telecom service provider, social media houses and also used reverse ILD/IPDRs techniques. Investigating officer by using modern electronic gadgets questioned/examined the accused persons. The Charge sheet in the instant case has been filed before the Hon'ble court of City judge Jammu on 05.06.2025 against both the accused persons U/S 78 BNS r/w 67 IT 2008 (Amended).



Top News Report JAMMU, Jun 5: Tensions flared in Jammu as the J&K Pradesh Youth Congress (JKPYC) staged a massive protest against BJP MLA R.S. Pathania of Udhampur East for his controversial remarks allegedly targeting the Indian Air Force. The protest, held under the directions of AICC Secretary Krishna Allavaru and IYC National President Uday Bhanu Chib, saw

Youth Congress workers burning an effigy of the BJP leader in a symbolic expression of outrage.

Led by Indian Youth Congress Secretary Incharge for J&K, Maan Singh Rathore, and senior JKPYC members, the protest drew a large number of Youth Congress activists who raised slogans condemning the BJP's "hypocrisy and political opportunism." Protesters accused the BJP of praising the armed forces for political gain during rallies while undermining them with baseless allegations for local political mileage. The uproar centers around comments made by BJP MLA R.S. Pathania during a recent public address in Udhampur, where he reportedly accused the Indian Air Force of encroaching on civilian land without providing compensation. The Youth Congress strongly condemned these remarks, calling them "deeply shameful, unpatriotic, and a direct



attack on the valor and integrity of India's armed forces.'

Addressing the protest, Maan Singh Rathore stated, "Such irresponsible statements politicize our defense institutions and belittle the sacrifices of our soldiers. The BJP cannot claim the glory of military operations like Operation Sindoor on one hand and accuse the same forces of wrongdoing on the other."

"This is a new low for the BJP," Rathore added. "By making such statements, the BJP is not only attacking the Indian Air Force but also disrespecting the very foundation of national security.'

General Secretary of JKPYC, Anirudh Sawhney, echoed these sentiments and criticized Pathania for what he termed "a theatrical stunt aimed at inciting public unrest." Sawhney claimed that the BJP MLA had torn official documents in public and attempted to provoke locals over administrative issues involving defense land. "This is not leadership; it's dangerous political drama that could disrupt communal harmony and public order," he said.

Sawhney went on to highlight the Air Force's decades-long contributions to national security and disaster relief efforts. "The Indian Air Force has stood by the nation in every crisis. To target them over land disputes is not only factually incorrect but morally bankrupt, he said. He further confirmed that a formal FIR complaint had been lodged against R.S. Pathania by JKPYC leaders including himself and others.

RCB victory parade stampede: Sachin Tendulkar, **Yuvraj Singh condole loss of lives**

NEW DELHI, Jun 5 (Agencies): India's legendary batter Sachin Tendulkar and World Cup-winning all-rounder Yuvraj Singh condoled the "tragic" stampede near Bengaluru's M Chinnaswamy Stadium, which killed 11 people and injured nearly 50 fans during Royal Challengers Bengaluru's (RCB) Indian Premier League (IPL) victory celebrations.

The incident occurred when thousands of fans gathered near the iconic stadium to catch a glimpse of their favourite players during RCB's maiden IPL title felicitation event. The celebratory event, which drew over two lakh fans to the Chinnaswamy Stadium—well beyond its 35,000-seat capacity-was cut short to just 20 minutes after organisers were alerted to the chaos unfolding outside. All RCB players and support staff, including head coach Andy Flower and team mentor Dinesh Karthik, were present at the event.

Sachin Tendulkar took to X



(formerly Twitter) to express his grief, writing, "What happened at Chinnaswamy Stadium, Bengaluru, is beyond tragic. My heart goes out to every affected family. Wishing peace and strength to all."

Former Indian all-rounder Yuvraj Singh offered his condolences, saying, "What was meant to be a moment of celebration turned into an unimaginable tragedy. My heart goes out to everyone affected by the incident in #Bengaluru. May the

families find strength and the departed souls rest in peace."

Former India spinner Anil Kumble mourned the lives lost and wished a speedy recovery to the injured. "It's a sad day for cricket! My heart goes out to the families of those who lost their lives while celebrating RCB's victory today. Praying for the speedy recovery of those injured. Tragic!!" he wrote on X. In a statement, Royal Chal-

lengers Bengaluru (RCB) expressed deep condolences over the loss of lives and said the felicitation event, which featured players and coaching staff, was promptly altered as soon as the franchise was informed about the stampede outside the stadium.

"We are deeply anguished by the unfortunate incidents that have come to light through media reports regarding public gatherings across Bengaluru in anticipation of the team's arrival this afternoon. The safety and well-being of everyone is of the utmost importance to us," RCB said in a statement.

"RCB mourns the tragic loss of lives and extends our heartfelt condolences to the affected families. Immediately upon being made aware of the situation, we promptly amended our programme and followed the guidance and advice of the local administration," the statement added.

and 1 half-century in those matches In 2018, India's tour of England saw KL score 299 runs in ten innings, including a century. His average in that series was under 30, and his strike rate was 66.4. In 2021, India's tour of England saw KL increase his stats. He

scored 315 runs in eight innings with an average of 39.4, including a century and a fifty each. In 58 test matches, KL has made 3257 at an average

KL has played 58 test matches so far in his career. The batter has made 3257 at an average of 33.57 and a strike rate of 52.80. His best test score (199) also came against England back in 2016. He has played 13 home and away test matches against England, in which the batter has made 955 at an average of 39.79. India tour of England

will take place from June to August 2025, with matches at Headingley (Leeds), Edgbaston (Birmingham), Lord's (London), Old Trafford (Manchester), and The Oval (London).

WTC Final 2025: South Africa batter Aiden Markram aims to end SA ICC trophy drought

NEW DELHI, Jun 5 (Agencies): In their quest to finally break South Africa's ICC trophy drought, South Africa batter Aiden Markram hopes a run for underdogs continues in the World Test Championship (WTC) final against Australia, according to the ICC website.

Markram hopes a run of sporting trophy droughts broken in 2025 rings true at the World Test Championship 2025 Final, with the Proteas taking on defending champions Australia from June 11.

In the cricket world, Royal Challengers Bengaluru finally tasted men's IPL success, beating Punjab Kings in the tournament final, while in football, Paris Saint Germain lifted the UEFA Champions League earlier this month for the first time. While Markram acknowledged it hasn't been a storyline taken on by the Proteas looking to finally break their duck, the right-hander hopes it may just be an omen for his team.

"(There's) not much chat along those lines in terms of watching the other events, but hopefully that trend can continue," Markram told ICC Digital ahead of the Final. Obviously, we've been chasing it now for many years as a squad," Aiden Markram said.

"Across all formats, we've probably improved slightly throughout and had sniffs to win it. If we can get ourselves into a position over the five days of the Test match to win, we'll push really hard for that." South Africa has been in the mix across formats at ICC events in recent years. Last year, it reached the ICC Men's T20 World Cup Final but fell at the final hurdle to India. The side also reached the semi-final stage at both the 2023 Cricket World Cup and 2025 Champions Trophy, and came into the Lord's final having topped the table.

"I think it's the collective decision for each guy to bring their best skill. It's going to be a tough game."

"It's a Test match, of course, against Australia and a Dukes ball, Lord's, all those sorts of things, but ultimately, the guys have a skillset that have got them here, got them selected, throughout the cycle performed as well, doing those skills," he added.

"So it's about backing that, our best skill versus their (Australia's) best skill, and we'll see where it lands us at the end of the day." Australia stands as an imposing opponent. They are the defending champions and sealed their Final spot after a series win over giants India on home soil.

The Proteas fell 2-0 to the Aussies on tour in the 2021-2023 cycle, though Markram believes there is little he and his side haven't seen from their opponents. "We pretty much know what the Australians are all about and their skill levels, their characters and all those sorts of things," Markram said.

"It's always a challenge that we get really excited for, and we generally get up for it and look forward to it. I've got no doubt this time it'll be any different. In their quest for victory, the Proteas have set up in Arundel, taking on Zimbabwe in a warm-up match, before travelling to Lord's to join England fast bowling legend Stuart Broad, who comes in as a consultant for the team's fast bowling battery. Markram says vibes in the camp are positive ahead of the Final "The energies have been good, obviously lots of excitement in the air for the time being. (I'm) sure when we get a bit closer to the game or a few nerves will start kicking in," Markram said.

"When the opportunity comes, I will be ready not just to play, but to make it count": says India's Women's Hockey Team Reserve Goalkeeper Bansari Solanki

NEW DELHI, Jun 5 (Agencies): For Bansari Solanki, being a reserve goalkeeper for the Indian Women's Hockey Team is not a place of uncertainty--it is a position of patience, preparation, and pride, according to a release from Hockey India

The 24-year-old from Surat, Gujarat, has been part of the senior national camp for the past two years and was recently named as a reserve goalkeeper in India's squad for the upcoming European leg of the FIH Pro League 2024-25

Bansari is quietly putting in the work, staying mentally tuned in, and waiting for the moment her name is called. "I have learned to treat every training session like my debut," Bansari says. "It may not be today or tomorrow, but when the opportunity comes, I'll be ready--not just to play, but to make it count."

Her journey from a schoolgirl who stumbled into goalkeeping in the 8th grade to a rising star in Indian hockey is a testament to resilience and quiet determination. Initially, a studious child with dreams of becoming an aeronautical engineer, Bansari's hockey career began when her school's sports teacher needed a goalkeeper for the Under-14 team. Her height and build made her the natural choice. "It was never my plan," she recalls. "I didn't want to be a goalkeeper. But somehow, that one decision changed my life.'

Growing up in Gujarat, a state not known for a strong hockey culture, opportunities were few. But that changed when hockey legend and Padma Shri awardee Dhanraj Pillay became the Technical Director and High Performance Director for the Sports Authority of Gujarat. "If I'm here today, it's because of Dhanraj sir," she reflects. "He gave me my first real platform. That's when I truly began to love the game."

Her performance at the Sub-Junior Nationals led to her selection for the prestigious National Hockey Academy in Delhi. "It was overwhelming," she recalls. "I came from a place where we played in local kits and suddenly, I was in a national-level setup, wearing top-of-the-line goalkeeper's gear, sharing dorms with the country's best young talents."

At just 17, Bansari left behind her family and familiar life to pursue her dream in Delhi. She also completed her 12th grade through the National Institute of Open Schooling, proving her dedication to education alongside hockey. Her training at NHA under former India player and renowned goalkeeping coach Romeo James helped lay a strong technical foundation, and she credits him for shaping her into a goalkeep-



er of national calibre.

"I really want to mention Romeo James, sir--he was our goalkeeping coach at the National Hockey Academy," Bansari says. "Because of his everyday goalkeeping sessions, I could become a good goalkeeper.

He built our basics from the ground up." Bansari's family--her father, an engineer; her homemaker mother; a younger sister; and a younger brother--stood firmly behind her dreams, often making quiet sacrifices along the way. "My parents never said no to anything, even when it meant stretching the household budget," she recalls. "I still remember needing a new pair of kickers that cost nearly Rs 20,000. Without hesitation, my father said, 'Go ahead, buy them.' At the time, I didn't fully grasp the weight of that support. Now I do--and it means everything.

Over the years, Bansari has captained teams in the Khelo India League and played for Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, SAI, and Union Bank in national-level competitions. She was part of the Indian team that won Gold at the 2023 Hockey 5s Asia Cup in Oman, where she was named Best Rising Goalkeeper, and followed that with a Silver at the Hockey 5s World Cup in 2024.

Yet, despite these achievements, she continues to wait for her senior team debut. "It is not easy," she admits. "You travel, you train, and sometimes you don't get to step on the pitch. But I have learned that goalkeeping is a journey of patience. Every goalkeeper has struggled at some point, and that gives me strength."

She credits game legends like Savita and PR Sreeiesh for their mentorship. "Savita di isn't just a brilliant goalkeeper; she's a wonderful human being. I ask her everything--from technique to how to guide the team from the post. And Sree bhai once gave me some amazing advice on positioning and mindset. Watching and learning from them is an opportunity I cherish."

With two years in the national camp, Bansari has honed her technical skills and developed a deeper awareness of her game. "Goalkeeping isn't like math," she laughs. "It's not formulaic. Every moment is unpredictable. But I have learned to adapt and stay prepared."

Bansari also draws strength from her deep faith. "In my toughest moments, I turn to Lord Krishna. His teachings keep me grounded and remind me that every phase--good or bad--is part of a larger plan. I just have to keep doing my job. As Krishna says in the Bhagavad Gita -- Karm karo, phal ki chinta mat karo."

For Bansari, hockey is no longer just a sport--it is her purpose. "I left my dream of becoming an engineer behind, but I have no regrets. I now dream of winning an Olympic medal for India. That's the ultimate goal. And I'll keep showing up, every single day, until that dream comes true."
