Man shot at **Gangyal Chowk** in suspected group rivalry

JAMMU, Jun 6 (Agencies): A man was shot and injured in broad daylight at Gangyal Chowk on Friday in what police suspect to be a case of group rivalry.

Initial investigations have ruled out any terror-related angle.

The victim has been identified as Paramjeet Singh, a resident of Sehora and a known history-sheeter of Police Station Gangyal.

Police said he was attacked by unidentified persons and sustained injuries in the firing.

They have taken cognizance of the incident, and a case has been registered.

Meanwhile, further investigation is underway to trace the attackers and ascertain the exact motive behind the attack.

Kupwara DM bans firecrackers ahead of Eid-ul-Azha

SRINAGAR, Jun 6 (Agencies): District Magistrate Kupwara Ayushi Sudan on Friday imposed a complete ban on the sale and use of firecrackers across the district on the eye of Eid-ul-Azha, citing concerns over public health, air pollution, and public safety.

As per the official order, the district administration observed that the use of firecrackers during festive occasions leads to significant noise and air pollution, causing harm to health and property, and creating public discomfort. "In the interest of public safety, it has become imperative to restrict the use and sale of firecrackers.

the order reads. Invoking powers under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNSS), the District Magistrate said the ban will remain effective during the forthcoming Eid-ul-Azha celebra-

Pakistan attacked 'insaniyat', Kashimiriyat in Pahalgam: PM Modi

KATRA, Jun 6 (Agencies): Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday accused Pakistan of attacking 'insaniyat' and Kashimirivat by targeting tourists in Pahalgam, saying the intent was to trigger communal clashes in India and rob Kashmiri people dependant on tourism of their livelihoods.

The prime minister was speaking after flagging off the first train service to the Kashmir Valley, and inaugurating sever

He said tourism provided employment and acts as a connecting link between people, but unfortunately, the neighbouring country is an enemy of humanity, harmony and tourism.

"Not only that, Pakistan is also the enemy of poor's bread and butter. What happened on April 22 in Pahalgam is an example of that. Pakistan attacked 'insaniyat' and Kashmiriyat in Pahalgam.

"The intent of Pakistan was to trigger communal riots in India. It wanted to strip people of Kashmir of their earnings that's why Pakistan attacked tourism," he said.

Anticipatory bail must not be given mechanically: Supreme Court

NEW DELHI, Jun 6 (Agencies): The Supreme Court has said anticipatory bail in cases involving serious offences should not be given in a mechanical manner.

A three-judge bench of Justices Vikram Nath, Sanjay Karol and Sandeep Mehta made the observation while setting aside an order of anticipatory bail to four accused in a murder case.

"The order of the High Court (Patna) does not disclose any reasoning for granting anticipatory bail in a matter involving serious offences under Sections 302 and 307

IPC," the bench said in its May 1 order.

It continued, "The impugned order is cryptic and lacking in judicial analysis. In cases involving serious offences, the grant of anticipatory bail in such a mechanical manner cannot be sustained and is liable to be set aside.'

On a plain reading of the FIR and accompanying material, the court noted that the appellant's father was assaulted and killed in the presence of the appellant, who was also the informant.

"The incident appears to have stemmed from a dispute regarding obstruction of a pathway. The specific roles attributed to the accused, as stated in the FIR, indicate that they participated in the assault even after the deceased had collapsed," the top court

ACB files chargesheet in illegal appointment of 82 persons in Municipal **Committee Sumbal**

SRINAGAR, Jun 6 (Agencies): J&K Anti-Corruption Bureau presented a chargesheet in the Court of Special Judge Anti-Corruption, Baramulla for the illegal appointment of 82 persons in Municipal committee (MC) Sumbal Bandipora during 2009-2010.

The chargesheet was submitted on Thursday against Ghulam Ahmad Wani alias Gulzar, then President of MC Sumbal, Abdul Rashid Shah, then In-Charge

Executive Officer, and 82 beneficiaries.

The case originated from a complaint received by the then Vigilance Organization Kashmir (VOK), now ACB J&K, regarding large-scale fraudulent appointments in Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) across Kashmir.

A probe by VOK revealed that during 2009-2010, President and In-charge Executive Officer MC Sumbal, in league with accused beneficiaries by abuse of their official position and in gross violation of the standing government rules, made 82 illegal appointments of various persons to different posts on the regular pay scale.

The ACB probe found that their salary was drawn by Shah, who also attested service particulars of these 82 illegal appointees.

Verification conducted revealed that these 82 accused beneficiaries were illegally &

NEW TRAIN JOURNEY

n a landmark development for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, Indian Railways has flagged off a new train journey that is set to transform travel, tourism, and trade across the region. The inauguration of this new rail route between Sangaldan and Reasi marks a major milestone in the ambitious Udhampur–Srinagar–Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project, aimed at integrating the Kashmir Valley with the rest of the country through a reliable and efficient railway network.

The newly inaugurated stretch includes the historic Chenab Bridge – the world's highest railway bridge – which towers 359 meters above the Chenab River. This engineering marvel has already become a symbol of India's infrastructural prowess and determination to overcome geographical challenges. Built at a cost of over Rs 1,400 crore, the bridge spans 1.3 kilometers and connects two remote mountain regions that were previously accessible only through winding roads or by foot.

The train journey between Sangaldan and Reasi provides stunning panoramic views of lush valleys, snow-capped peaks, and scenic mountain passes. It offers a unique experience to passengers, blending modern comfort with the natural beauty of the region. The route is equipped with modern amenities, including CCTV surveillance, GPS-enabled tracking, digital display boards, and clean bio-toilets, ensuring a safe and pleasant journey.

This rail connection is expected to greatly benefit local residents, particularly in remote and underserved areas. It will drastically reduce travel time between districts, ease the transportation of goods, and improve access to education, healthcare, and employment opportunities. Farmers and artisans in the region will now have better connectivity to major markets in Jammu, Delhi, and beyond.

Destinations such as Reasi, which is close to the famous Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, and Sangaldan, known for its serene environment and proximity to the Ramban district, are expected to witness increased tourist footfall. The USBRL project, which began in 1997, has been executed in multiple phases. Tunnel T-49, the longest tunnel on the route, spans nearly 12.8 kilometers and has been constructed using advanced drilling and excavation techniques. The terrain and weather posed significant challenges, but consistent efforts by engineers and workers have made the dream a reality.

Security has also been a major consideration in the execution of this project. Special forces and surveillance systems have been deployed to ensure the safety of infrastructure and passengers. The local administration and security forces have played a key role in facilitating the project despite occasional disruptions.

Lack of reading is lacking in intellectual depth and cultural understanding in society. People are relying on superficial information available on social media, increasing misinformation and polarization. According to a roup of World Bank (2023), the rate of innovation and economic progress is also affected in societies with low reading habit, as reading promotes the solution and creative thinking of the problem. Also, reading reduces stress and calms the mind, but spending excessive time on the digital screen is increasing anxiety and depression. First of all, improvement in educational system is necessary. Schools should include literary and creative books in the curriculum. Teachers should organize events such as story sessions, book clubs and author meetings to spark enthusiasm for reading in children. In India, where the library facility in 65% of schools is inadequate (ASR2022), the government should invest on the development of libraries and availability of books. Second, families will have to motivate them to get used to reading in children. Parents should take time to read books with children and tell inspirational stories for them. This will not only increase the interest of reading in children, but also strengthen the engagement between the family. Third, libraries, book fair and literary festivals at the community level must be promoted. Remaining text Techniques

can also be used to promote reading habit. E-book and audiobook have made reading more accessible and engaging. Some online platform recorded an increase of 30% in India in 2023, which shows that people are getting attracted towards digital text. Social media can also be used in a positive way by making books review channels and online reader community. Writers and publishers need to provide diverse and interesting content. In India, where there is a shortage of books in regional languages, it is important to promote literature in local languages. A lack of reading habit is a challenge that can only be faced with collective efforts. It is essential not only for personal development but also for intellectual and cultural prosperity of the society. Books connect us to the new world, broaden our attitude and inspire us to be a better person. If we can strengthen the habit of reading, we can build a more conscious, creative and sympathetic society.

Remakes are a new canvas for me, will do them all my life: Aamir Khan

He believes in remakes and will make them all his life, says Aamir Khan, whose last film 'Laal Singh Chaddha' was an official adaptation of 'Forrest Gump' and latest 'Sitaare Zameen Par' has been trolled for being a remake of Spanish movie 'Campeones'.

The star and filmmaker said he has done over 10 remakes and they have all been superhits except for 'Laal Singh Chaddha'.

"Like, 'Ghajini' or if I've to start from the beginning of my career then 'Qayamat Se Qayamat Tak', which is a remake of Romeo and Juliet. So, I have never had a problem till date in remaking because for me, it is a new canvas," Aamir said in a group interview in response to a question.

Why is Shakespeare respected so much even today, Aamir asked about the playwright whose work has been endlessly adapted in cinema, theatre and other art forms.

"He is gone, write your own play. Why are you doing 'Hamlet' again? Why do you want to say,

'To be or not to be'? The chatter about remakes, I don't know where it came from. Now suddenly, some trolls have launched it.

"Some of our biggest hits have been remakes. If a cut and paste is so easy to do, then you do it, it's just a cut and paste. But it's not a cut and paste thing, you've to put your life into it," he added.

Aamir said he's not the only one doing remakes. Many in Hindi cinema, including the great screenwriting duo of Salim Khan and Javed Akhtar, have adapted stories in their career.

What is needed is sensitisation for all.

I want to listen to the real audience, who are neither a troll nor anything, they see your work and they either like it or they don't like it. If they like or dislike it, they say it from their heart. So, I'm bothered by the reactions of the real audience for whom I make films. I don't care about the reaction of the trolls."

Tom Cruise sets Guinness World Record for most burning parachute jumps in 'Mission: Impossible 8'

Hollywood superstar Tom Cruise has earned a Guinness World Record for performing the most burning parachute jumps by an individual, executing the feat 16 times during the filming of his latest movie, "Mission: Impossible - The Final Reckoning".

He performed the stunt 16 times and after each jump, he cut away the burning parachute and deployed a backup to land safely.

"Tom doesn't just play action heroes - he is an action hero," Craig Glenday, Editor-in-Chief of Guinness World Records, said in a statement posted on the official website.

"A large part of his success can be chalked up to his absolute focus on authenticity and pushing the boundaries of what a leading man can do. It's an



honour to be able to recognise his utter fearlessness with this new Guinness World Records title." In the scene from "The Final Reckoning", Cruise's character, Ethan Hunt, battled the movie's antagonist Gabriel (Esai Morales) for the control of an Al entity aboard 1940s biplanes above South Africa's Drakensberg mountains.

Some takes were filmed with a 50-pound camera rig attached to Cruise for close-up shots during freefall.

The record adds to Cruise's previous accolades, including having the most consecutive USD 100-million-grossing films.

The actor, who debuted as a leading man in "Risky Business" (1983) and has starred in over 30 films since, delivered 11 hits—from "Jack Reacher" (2012) to "Mission: Impossible

- The Final Reckoning" (2025). "Tom is no stranger to record breaking. Over his impressively long and consistent career, he's proved himself to be the most powerful actor in Holly-

wood and the most bankable star, and he's still the actor with the most consecutive USD 100 million movies on their resume and the most successful leading action hero at the worldwide box office," Craig said.

Cruise, who first portrayed Ethan Hunt in Brian De Palma's "Mission: Impossible" (1996), has consistently delivered high-octane cinematic thrills with each installment of the franchise

He has redefined the art of stunt work—leaping between buildings in "Mission: Impossible III" (2006), scaling Dubai's Burj Khalifa in "Ghost Protocol" (2011), clinging to the side of a flying plane in "Rogue Nation" (2015), and riding a motorcycle off a cliff in "Dead Reckoning"

"Mission: Impossible - The Final Reckoning" had its world premiere at the Cannes Film Festival. The film also stars Hayley Atwell, Ving Rhames, Simon Pegg, Pom Klementieff, and Angela Bassett.

Dakota Johnson distances herself from Madame Web's flop: 'It wasn't my fault'

With The Materialists gearing up for its release this month, Dakota Johnson is once again dominating headlines - but not just for her onscreen chemistry with Chris Evans and internet heartthrob Pedro Pascal. The buzz surrounding her latest project has reignited a less flattering conversation: Dakota Johnson's track record at the box office. While the upcoming rom-com might finally give her a commercial win, many are still looking back at Spider-Man spinoff Madame Web, one of 2024's most notorious flops — and Johnson has some pointed thoughts about why it failed.

In a recent interview, Johnson addressed the elephant in the room with a laugh, saying bluntly: "It wasn't my fault." That line alone

has sparked a media frenzy, as the actor shifts the blame from herself to the broader industry dynamics that she believes doomed Madame Web from the start.

"There's this thing that happens now where a lot of creative decisions are made by committee," she said. "Or made by people who don't have a creative bone in their body. And it's really hard to make art that way. Or to make something entertaining that way. And I think unfortunately with Madame Web, it started out as something and turned into something else. And I was just sort of along for the ride at that point. But that happens. Bigger-budget movies fail all the time."

About the movie In Madame Web, Johnson starred as Cassan-



dra Webb, a New York City paramedic who discovers she can see the future and must protect three teenage girls future Spider-Women from a villainous Ezekiel Sims. Despite a promising premise and a cast that included breakout names, the film bombed both critically and commercially. It went on to

collect a trio of Golden Raspberry (Razzie) Awards in early 2025, including Worst Picture. Worst Screenplay, and Worst Actress for Johnson herself — a trifecta no actor dreams of.

And yet, Johnson seems unfazed as she brushed off the backlash with a shrug: "I don't have a Band-Aid over

it," she said. "There's no part of me that's like, 'Oh, I'll never do that again' to anything. I've done even tiny movies that didn't do well. Who cares?" That devil-may-care

attitude may come off as refreshing honesty or deflection, depending on who you ask. Critics have noted that Johnson, despite her famous lineage as the daughter of Don Johnson and Melanie Griffith (and granddaughter of Tippi Hedren), has struggled to find her footing post-Fifty Shades. Mithi river case: ED raids actor Dino Morea, others



The Enforcement Directorate on Friday conducted searches at the premises of actor Dino Morea and some others in Maharashtra apart from some locations in Kerala as part of a money laundering investigation linked to the Mithi river desilting "scam", official sources said.

The fraud is alleged to have caused a Rs 65 crore loss to the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC).

The raids are covering more than 15 premises located in Mumbai and Kochi. This includes the premises of Morea, his brother, contractors and some others, the sources said.

The investigation is being conducted under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA),

The ED case against certain officials of the BMC and some others stems from a Mumbai Police economic offences wing (EOW) FIR filed to probe alleged irregularities in desilting of the Mithi river that is alleged to have caused a Rs 65 crore loss to the civic body.

Morea was questioned by the EOW in this case few days back.

The EOW registered a case against 13 persons, including civic officials and contractors, for their alleged involvement in the scam.

The river flows through the city and drains into the Arabian Sea. It is alleged that tenders for renting specialised dredging equipment were manipulated to favour certain suppliers.

Empowering youth the most powerful thing a nation can do: PM Modi

She also announced that government will provide laptops to 1,200 meritorious students of Delhi government schools this year as announced in the Budget 2025-26.

Earlier, the government provided 100 tablets to students sponsored by corporate social responsibility funds of a bank,



she added. The Chief Minister said that she has also directed officials to complete repair works at schools on priority.

NEW DELHI, Jun 6 (Agencies): Former Delhi Minister Satyendar Jain on Friday appeared before the **Anti-Corruption Branch** for questioning in connection with an alleged graft case in the construction of classrooms in Government schools.

Jain was summoned by the Delhi Government's ACB for questioning.

Before leaving for the ACB office, Jain had asserted that the previous AAP Government in the national capital worked towards improving the city's education, while the current BJP Government was only doing politics.

Kashmir rail link example of continuity in governance which PM never acknowledges: Congress

NEW DELHI. Jun 6 (Agencies): The Congress on Friday said the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Railway Line (USBRL) is a powerful example of continuity in governance which it claimed is "consistently denied" by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his "perennial desire for self-glory".

The opposition party's assertion came on a day Prime Minister Modi is set to inaugurate the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL). Stretching 272 km through the rugged Himalayas, the project has been built at a cost of Rs 43,780 crore.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said governance involves great continuity, "a fact consistently denied by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his perennial desire for self-glory".

This is especially



true when it comes to the implementation of extraordinarily challenging developmental projects, he said in a statement.

The 272 km long Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Railway Line (USBRL) was initially sanctioned in March 1995 when P V Narasimha Rao was Prime Minister, Ramesh said.

"In March 2002, it was declared as a national project when Atal Bihari Vaipavee was Prime Minister. Subsequently, on April 13, 2005, Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated the 53 km rail link between

Jammu and Udhampur." he said.

Ramesh further pointed out that on October 11, 2008 Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated the 66 km rail link between Anantnag and Mazhom outside Srinagar.

On February 14, 2009, Prime Minister Singh inaugurated the 31 km rail link between Mazhom outside Srinagar and Baramulla, he said.

"On October 29, 2009, Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated the 18 km rail link between Anantnag and Qazigund. On June 26,

2013, Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated the 11 km Qazigund to Banihal rail link," he said.

This meant that by June 26, 2013 the 135 km rail link between Baramulla and Qazigund had become operational, Ramesh added.

The inauguration of the 25 km rail link between Udhampur and Katra had to be put off because of the election code of conduct for the 2014 Lok Sabha elections, he pointed out.

It was inaugurated by the new Prime Minister on July 4, 2014, 39 days after he had taken over. Ramesh said.

He further pointed out that since 2014, the 111 km Katra-Banihal stretch, for which major contracts had been awarded much earlier, has been completed.

For instance, contracts for the iconic Chenab Bridge had been awarded by 2005 itself to the Konkan Railway Corporation, Afcons, VSK India, and Ultra Construction and Engineering Ltd of South Korea, Ramesh said.

"The Indian National Congress greets the people of Jammu and Kashmir on this important occasion. It also congratulates the personnel of the Indian Railways, and the public sector and private companies involved in the execution of the USBRL over the past three decades," the AICC general secretary said.

It reflects a collective resolve and success in the face of the gravest of odds. Ramesh added. Posting his statement on X, the Congress

leader said, "As the PM visits J&K today, here is our statement on the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Railway Line (USBRL) that, like Brahmos, is a powerful example of continuity in governance which he never acknowledges but cannot run away from."

SC allows NBE to hold NEET-PG 2025 examination on August 3

NEW DELHI, Jun 6 (Agencies): The Supreme Court on Friday allowed the National Board of Examination (NBE) to conduct on August 3, the NEET-PG 2025 exam in one shift in line with the top court's directions.

A bench of Justices Prashant Kumar Mishra and Augustine George Masih, which initially questioned the over twomonth window sought by the NBE for holding the examination, said the board's plea appeared to be "bonafide".

The top court, however, clarified no further time would be granted to NBE for holding NEET-PG 2025 examination.

The NBE referred to the May 30 order of the top court and said for holding the simultaneous examinations all over in one shift required about 1.000 examination centres.

The plea said it would hold the examination, scheduled on June 15 between 9 am and 12.30 pm on August 3, which was the earliest possible date given by their technology partner Tata Consultancy Services Ltd (TCS).

It had previously referred to various communications with the TCS and cited various arrangements like identification of examination centres, their availability and security measures to plug any leaks for holding the examination on August 3.

The bench questioned the long duration for holding the examination saying that students, who have prepared very hard for the examination, would face the brunt and even their selection process would

be further delayed.

"The order of this court was of May 30, what exercise has been done till now. The examination centres were already identified for holding the test on June 15 and the only thing which needed to be done was to see their availability. Secu-

rity arrangement is to be done in any case, whenever you have to hold the examination,"

entrance test.

the bench observed. Additional Solicitor

General K M Nataraj, appearing for the NBE, submitted that arrangements need to be made to avoid even a minor glitch in the all India level

He said examina-

tion centres, which are to be identified, had to be technology compliant and safe, therefore, requiring elaborate arrangements.

Justice Masih said the court very well knew how TCS works and it has had experience of

various examinations and finding such centres would not be a problem. The NBE's plea,

among other things, has sought the top court's "permission to schedule the NEET PG 2025 on August 3, 2025 which is the earliest possible available date given by its technology partner, i.e., M/s Tata Consultancy Services Ltd. (TCS) in accordance with the directions passed by this vide order dated May 30, 2025". It has said, "Thou-

sand plus centers shall need to be booked and engaged which will require considerable time."

For a shift of 2,42,679 candidates with buffers would require an infrastructure for 2.70 lakh to be made available across the country and it needed considerable time, the NBE has said.

The plea argued a collaborative effort of the

government authorities and the NBE was needed to enable students to navigate the "uncertain period" with "resilience and support".

The NBE said aside from NEET-PG, it was conducting Indian Railways, several banking exams and regional exams across states in the country.

"Hence we propose to conduct this exam on August 3, in the 1st shift from 9 am to 12.30 pm," the plea said.

On May 30, the top court ordered conducting the post-graduate medical entrance exam scheduled on June 15 in a single shift as two shifts created "arbitrari-

ness" in its opinion. The authorities were directed to make arrangements for holding NEET-PG 2025 exam in one shift and ensure transparency and identification of the secured centers.

The apex court had passed the order on the pleas challenging a notification for holding the examination for admissions in medical courses in two shifts.

While one of the pleas was filed through advocate Sukriti Bhatnagar, several lawyers, including advocate Tanvi Dubey, appeared in the matter.

The NBE is entrusted with the responsibility of conducting postgraduate and postdoctoral examinations in approved specialties leading to the award of Diplomate of National Board and Doctorate of National Board and Fellow of National Board.

Four killed in Kyiv after Russian missile, drone attack across Ukraine, says mayor

Kyiv mayor Vitali Klitschko said the search and rescue operations were underway at several locations.

KYIV, Jun 6 (Agencies): A Russian missile and drone attack on Kyiv early Friday killed at least four people and injured 20 others, city mayor Vitali Klitschko said, as air raid sirens rang out during a wider combined attack across Ukraine.

Klitschko said search and rescue operations were underway at several locations.

Multiple explosions were heard in the capital, Kyiv, where falling debris sparked fires across several districts as air defence systems attempted to intercept incoming targets, said Tymur Tkachenko, head of the Kyiv City Administration.

"Our air defence crews are doing everything possible. But we must protect one another.



Stay safe," Tkachenko wrote on Telegram.

Authorities reported damage in several districts, and rescue workers were responding at multiple locations. They urged residents to seek shelter

In Solomyanskyi district, a fire broke out on the 11th floor of a 16-story residential building.

Emergency services evacuated three people from the apartment, and rescue operations were ongoing.

Another fire broke out in a metal warehouse. Tkachenko said the

metro tracks between two stations in Kyiv were damaged in the attack, but no fire or injuries occurred.

In northern Chernihiv region, a Shahed drone exploded near an apartment building, shattering windows and doors, according to regional

military administration chief Dmytro Bryzhynskyi.

He added that explosions from ballistic missiles were also recorded on the outskirts of the city.

The nighttime attack came hours after US **President Donald Trump** said it might be better to let Ukraine and Russia 'fight for a while' before pulling them apart and pursuing peace, in comments that were a remarkable detour from Trump's often-stated appeals to stop the three-year war.

Trump spoke as he met with Germany's new chancellor, Friedrich Merz, who appealed to him as the 'key person in the world' who could halt the bloodshed by pressuring Russian President Vladimir Putin.

North Korea says it has raised a capsized destroyer upright as it continues repair



SEOUL, Jun 6 (Agencies): North Korea said Friday it had righted a capsized destroyer and moored it at a pier in the northeastern port of Chongjin as it continues to repair the new warship leader Kim Jong Un has described as a significant asset for his nuclear-armed military.

The report by North Korean state media aligned with South Korean military assessments and recent commercial satellite images.

North Korea's official Korean Central News Agency said experts will closely examine the ship's hull before beginning the next phase of restoration, which will take place at a dry dock at the neighboring port of Rajin and is expected to last seven to 10 days.

Satellite images taken Thursday by Planet Labs PBC analyzed by The Associated Press showed the stricken destroyer upright and floating. It wasn't immediately clear from the image just how much damage had been done to the vessel, which had been in the water for days after the failed launch. However, the ship did not appear to be noticeably listing, meaning Pyongyang is likely able to send it onward to the other port to inspect the vessel's electronics.

Jo Chun Ryong, a senior official from the ruling Workers' Party. told the agency that the "perfect restoration of the destroyer will be completed without fail" before a major party congress in late June,

a deadline set by Kim. Outside experts say it remains unclear how severely the 5,000-tonclass destrover was damaged during a botched launching ceremony in late May, which triggered a furious response from Kim, who called the failure a "criminal act caused by absolute carelessness, irresponsibility, and unscientific empiricism." North Korean law

enforcement authorities have detained at least four officials over the incident, including the vice director of the Workers' Party's munitions industry department, according to state media. The North's main military committee said those responsible would be held accountable for their "unpardon-

able criminal act." Lee Sung Joon, spokesperson for South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff, told reporters Thursday that the South's military assesses that the North Koreans righted the ship earlier this week and are likely conducting drainage operations while examining the damage.

"The nature and duration of the repair process will vary, depending on internal repairs, additional work or whether the incident affected the keel," Lee said, referring to the ship's structural backbone. "This could also affect how the ship is used going forward."

The damaged warship was North Korea's second known destroyer and seen as a crucial asset toward Kim's goal of modernizing its naval forces. It was in the same class as the country's first destroyer unveiled in April, which experts assessed as the North's largest and most advanced warship to date. Kim lavishly praised that ship, which was launched in the western port of Nampo, saying it advances his

goal of expanding the military's operations range and nuclear strike capabilities.

State media described that ship as designed to handle various weapons systems, including anti-air and anti-ship weapons as well as nuclear-capable ballistic and cruise missiles. Kim also supervised test-firings of missiles from the destroyer afterward, and state media said the ship was expected to enter active duty early next year.

While North Korea's naval forces are widely seen as far inferior to those of its rivals, analysts say a destroyer equipped with modern missile and radar systems could still boost the North's offensive and defensive capabili-

South Korean officials and experts say the North's destroyer was likely built with Russian assistance as the two countries' military cooperation have intensified amid Russian President Vladimir Putin's war on Ukraine. Kim's government has supplied Russia with thousands of troops and large shipments of military equipment, including artillery and ballistic missiles, to support its warfighting. Washington and Seoul have expressed concern that, in return, Kim may seek Russian technology transfers that could enhance the threat posed by his nuclear-armed military.

Kim met with Russian Security Council Secretary Sergei Shoigu in Pyongyang on Wednesday in the latest sign of the countries' deepening ties.

Kim has framed his arms buildup as a response to perceived threats from the United States and South Korea, which have been expanded joint military exercises in reaction to the North's advancing nuclear program. Kim says the acquisition of a nuclear-powered submarine would be his next big step in strengthening the North Korean navy.

Japan's ispace fails again: Resilience lander crashes on moon

TOKYO, Jun 6 (Agencies): Japanese company ispace said its uncrewed moon lander likely crashed onto the lunar surface during its touchdown attempt on Friday, marking another failure two years after an unsuccessful inaugural mission.

Tokyo-based ispace had hoped to join U.S. firms Intuitive Machines and Firefly Aerospace in making successful commercial moon landings amid a global race that includes staterun lunar missions from China and India.

Although the failure means another multi-year pause in Japan's commercial access to the moon, the country remains committed to the U.S.-led Artemis program and a wide range of Japanese companies are studying lunar exploration as a business frontier.

Resilience, ispace's second lunar lander, had problems measuring its distance to the surface fast enough, the company said, adding it has not been able to communicate with Resilience after a likely hard landing.

"Truly diverse scenarios were possible, including issues with the propulsion system, software or hardware, especially with sensors," ispace Chief Technology Officer Ryo Ujiie told a press conference.

A room of more than 500 ispace employees, shareholders, sponsors and government officials abruptly grew silent when flight data was lost less than two minutes before the scheduled touchdown time during a public viewing event at mission partner Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corp in the wee hours in Tokyo.

Shares of ispace were untraded, overwhelmed by sell orders, and looked set to close at the daily limit-low, which would mark a 29% fall. As of the close of Thursday, ispace had a market capitalisation of more than 110 billion yen (\$766 million).

"We're not facing any immediate financial deterioration or distress because of the event," CFO Jumpei Nozaki said in the press conference, citing recurring investor support.

In 2023, ispace's first lander crashed into the moon's surface due to inaccurate recognition of its altitude. Software remedies have been implemented, while the hardware design was mostly unchanged in Resilience.

\$16 Million Payload

Resilience was carrying a fourwheeled rover built by ispace's Luxembourg subsidiary and five external payloads worth a total of \$16 million, including scientific instruments from Japanese firms and a Taiwanese univer-

The lander had targeted Mare Frigoris, a basaltic plain about 900 km (560 miles) from the moon's north pole. If the landing had been successful, the 2.3-metre-high lander and the rover would have begun 14 days of planned exploration activities, including capturing regolith, the moon's fine-grained surface material, in a contract with U.S. space agency NASA.

in January shared a SpaceX rocket launch with Firefly's Blue Ghost lander, which took a faster trajectory to the moon and touched down successfully in March.

Intuitive Machines, which last year marked the world's first commercial lunar touchdown, also landed its second Athena lander in March, although in a toppled position, just as with its first mission. Japan last year became the world's fifth country to achieve a soft lunar landing after the former Soviet Union, the United States. China and India, when the national Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency achieved the touchdown of its SLIM lander.

The government signed an agreement with NASA to include Japanese astronauts in Artemis lunar missions last year and has supported private companies' research projects for future lunar development, assuming ispace's transportation capabili-

"Expectations for ispace have not faded," Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba said in an X post. Although ispace will likely remain Japan's most advanced lunar transportation company, some Japanese firms may start to consider transport options from foreign entities to test their lunar exploration visions, said Ritsumeikan University professor Kazuto Saiki, who was involved in the SLIM mission. For its third mission in 2027, ispace's U.S. unit is building a bigger lander as part of NASA's Commercial Lunar Payload Services for the Artemis program. The company projects six more missions in the U.S. and Japan through 2029.

"NASA increasingly needs private companies to improve cost efficiency for key missions with limited budgets," ispace CEO Takeshi Hakamada said, referring to U.S. President Donald Trump's proposed budget cuts.

"To meet NASA's expectations, we'll support our U.S. subsidiary to keep up with development and play a role." (\$1 = 143.5600 yen).

Paank slams Balochistan Anti-Terror Bill, cites surge in rights abuses plified by enforced dis-

(Agencies): Paank categorically denounces the Balochistan Assembly's passage of the Anti-Terrorism (Balochistan Amendment) Bill 2025, which exacerbates the region's human rights crisis.

According to Paank's post on X, this legislation runs the risk of legitimising state-sponsored abuses by giving the military, paramilitary, intelligence services, and police broad authority to detain people on suspicion for a maximum of three months, with possible extensions under Article 10 of the Constitution.

It solidifies a fearbased environment in which civilian expression and political criticism are routinely repressed under the guise of counterterror-

"Balochistan has long endured severe human rights violations, exem-

appearances, extrajudicial killings, and torture. For instance, families have reported loved ones, including activists and students, being abducted by security forces without legal recourse, often leaving them in anguish for years. In 2025 alone, the Paank documented over sixty-six cases of extrajudicial killings of individuals previously in state custody," Paank's post stated on X.

"Peaceful protests, such as those led by the Baloch Yakjehti Committee (BYC), have faced violent crackdowns, with security forces firing on demonstrators, as seen in the July 2024 Gwadar gathering where 14 were injured," stated Paank's post on X.

"The Maintenance of Public Order (3MPO) Ordinance has been a key tool in silencing dissent, notably used against BYC leader-

ship. In March 2025, Dr. Mahrang Baloch, a prominent BYC leader and Nobel Peace Prize nominee, along with activists Bebarg Baloch, Gulzadi Baloch, Beebow Baloch, and Shahji Sibghatullah, were detained under 3MPO during a non-violent protest in Quetta," the post stated.

"These detentions, lacking legal justification, were challenged in the Balochistan High Court, which reserved its verdict on April 11, 2025, but later dismissed petitions, raising concerns about judicial independence. Reports confirm severe mistreatment in custody, including the forcible removal of Beebow Baloch from Huda Jail by the Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) on April 23, 2025, where she was beaten and transferred to an undisclosed location before being moved

to Pishin Jail," as per the

"Family visits revealed visible signs of physical abuse on detainees. prompting widespread protests and condemnations from human rights groups and legal associations across Balochistan", the post claimed.

take the utmost safety precautions despite knowing the risks of a serious accident in a major tsunami.

A magitude 9.0 earth-

quake and tsunami in March 2011 destroyed key cooling systems at the Fukushima Daiichi plant, causing its three reactors to melt down, spreading large amounts of radiation in the area and keeping tens of thousands of residents from returning home due to radioactive contamination and other

safety concerns. The Tokyo District Court ruling three years Fukushima disaster. It upheld the plaintiffs' argument that the executives had neglected to heed experts' long-term tsunami predictions and failed to take adequate tsunami precaution measures soon enough.

The court said, however, the long-term tsunani prediction was not considered pressing data requiring immediate tsunami measures and it was understandable the executives had no sense of urgency from the data they had at that time, Kyodo News

reported. Friday's ruling is a major disappointment for Fukushima residents and anti-nuclear activists seeking the managements' responsibility in nuclear safety.

Plaintiffs and their lawyers criticized the ruling as "unjust" and said they planned to appeal to the Supreme Court.

Hiroyuki Kawai, a plaintiffs' lawyer, criticized the ruling as "logically flawed," saying it means nobody can be held liable for any safety negligence because tsunami and earthquake predictions are still impossible today.

A group of more than 40 TEPCO shareholders filed the lawsuit in 2012 demanding five former executives pay the company 22 trillion yen (\$153 billion) in damages. The amount of the 2022 ruling against four of the executives was the highest ever ordered in a lawsuit.

Japan's top court in March found two former TEPCO executives not guilty of negligence over the Fukushima meltdowns, saying a tsunami of the magnitude that hit the plant was unforeseeable. It was the only criminal trial related to the nuclear accident and the only criminal case related to the nuclear

accident.

fraudulently appointed without following due process of law, the ACB said.

Finally on the culmination of verification, an FIR was registered at Police Station VOK (Now ACB Baramulla), against officers of MC Sumbal Bandipora & 82 illegal appointees, and investigations were set into motion.

The investigation further found that the recruitment was made without any transparent recruitment process, without the issuance of any advertisements for wider circulation, and the majority of posts against which accused beneficiaries were appointed do

not figure in the schedules given under the Recruitment Rules 2008.

The ACB said investigations conducted also revealed that the majority of the appointments were made on recommendations of the then Speaker J&K Assembly, then MLA Sonawari, as well as Municipal council resolution, which again were not authorized forums as per rules to intervene in the recruitment process.

Accordingly, the sanction for launching prosecution against an service public servant, Rashid Shah, a resident of Papachan, Bandipora, was accorded by the Government. Shah was also prematurely retired from government service; however was reinstated by the High Court order.

On culmination of investigations, the chargesheet against the then President, MC Sumbal; the then I/C Executive Officer, MC Sumbal and 82 illegal appointees was produced in the Court for commission of offences as defined under section 5(1),(d) r/w 5(2) of Jammu & Kashmir Prevention of Corruption Act, Samvat, 2006, and under Section 120-B, 201 RPC was presented before special Judge Anticorruption court Baramulla for judicial determination.

Boost' to Jammu Kashmir's Economy

Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers Cum Dealers Union hailing it as a "historic and long-awaited milestone" that will change the course of regional trade, travel, and connectivity

Representing fruit grower associations across Srinagar, Sopore, Baramulla, Ganderbal, Anantnag, Shopian, Pulwama and other horticultural hubs of the Valley, the Union described the rail link as a "bridge of opportunity" that will dramatically cut travel time, provide all-weather connectivity and offer a safe and economical mode of transportation not only for local commuters but also for tourists and traders.

It will become the lifeline of our economy, especially during the offseason months when our produce still needs a fast, reliable route to markets.'

The Srinagar-Katra Vande Bharat Express, flagged off by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, now connects the Kashmir Valley with the rest of India's railway network through

a high-speed route that passes through the Chenab Bridge, the world's highest railway arch bridge. Services are scheduled to begin on June 7.

The Fruit Growers Union expressed hope that this development will lead to enhanced accessibility for tourists and traders from across India and will help ease congestion on Kashmir's roads, particularly on the Jammu-Srinagar highway, which remains vulnerable to frequent weatherrelated disruptions.

The Union also urged the government to take the next step by introducing direct railway connectivity between Delhi and Srinagar and simultaneously launching a dedicated goods train service to the Valley. "This would revolutionise horticulture trade, reduce transport costs, minimise damages to perishable produce and enhance logistics," the statement said. "It would also open more economic opportunities for the Indian Railways, while boosting employment and trade volumes in Jammu and

Kashmir. Calling the rail link a symbol of hope and progress, the Union extended congratulations to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, stating that the moment marked a turning point not just for infrastructure but for economic empower-

"Winning or losing doesn't change it, I'm always under pressure": Gambhir ahead of England Test series

MUMBAI, Jun 6 (Agencies): Indian cricket team head coach Gautam Gambhir has admitted that the pressure of delivering results never leaves him, regardless of victories or defeats. Speaking at the predeparture press conference ahead of India's five-match Test series against England, Gambhir was open about the constant expectations that come with the role

"First of all. I am always under pressure. Regardless of whether I would've won the Champions Trophy or not. Because being the coach, you want the results. It does not change with winning or losing," Gambhir

India recently lifted the ICC Champions Trophy, but Gambhir said that the win hasn't changed how he feels about the responsibility he carries.

"He was little disappointed when I retired": Rohit Sharma on his father's love for Test cricket

MUMBAI, Jun 6 (Agencies): India's cricketing stalwart Rohit Sharma recently offered a heartfelt tribute to his father, Gurunath Sharma, highlighting the deep-rooted influence he had on his journey as a cricketer. Reflecting on his upbringing and his father's quiet sacrifices, Rohit shed light on the values that shaped his career and the unwavering support he received from the man who shaped his understanding of the game.

Rohit shared that his father, who once worked for a transport company, played a pivotal role in ensuring that the family never lacked anything.

"My father was very much involved in sacrificing things so that we could have a good life." Rohit recalled in a book launch event by India cricketer Cheteshwar Pujara's wife, Puja Pujara, who wrote 'The Diary of a Cricketer's

"He has always been a fan of Test cricket from day one," he added. "He does not like this new age cricket," he noted.

That love for the red-

ball game clearly rubbed off on Rohit. Even on the day he set the world alight with his recordbreaking 264 in an ODI match against Sri Lanka

in Kolkata, his father's

reaction remained stoic. "I still remember the day I scored 264 in an ODI," Rohit recounted.

"He was like, 'Okay, well played, well done.' There was no such excitement, despite it being a world record,"

he said. In contrast, his father's enthusiasm for Test

cricket was unmissable. "Even if I get a good 30s or 40s or 50s or 60s in Test cricket, he would talk to me in detail. That's the kind of love he had for the game," he

For Rohit, his father's appreciation of the redball format made his recent decision to step away from Test cricket

an emotional one.

"He has seen me play a lot of cricket with the red ball, obviously. So, he appreciates red-ball cricket a lot and was a little disappointed when I announced my retirement, but he was happy as well at the same time," he said.

Rohit acknowledged his father's lasting impact on his life and career.

"He has played a huge role in where I am today," he added.

On May 7, Rohit announced his retirement from Test cricket after a career spanning 67 Tests and 11 years. ahead of the England tour, leaving India with a massive leadership vacuum. He amassed 4,301 runs at an average of 40.57, with 12 centuries and 18 fifties.

Team India departs for England for their opening series of WTC 2025-27 cycle

MUMBAI, Jun 6 (Agencies): The Indian cricket team left for England from Mumbai Airport on Friday for a five-match Test series, which is part of the 2025-27 ICC World Test Championship cycle.

The series will be held from June to August 2025, with matches scheduled at Headingley in Leeds, Edgbaston in Birmingham, Lord's and The Oval in London, and Old Trafford in Manchester.

This will be India's first bilateral Test series since both Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli announced their retirement from Test cricket earlier this month. The team is undergoing a tran-

sition, with Shubman Gill taking over as captain and R Ashwin, Rohit Sharma, and Virat Kohli stepping away from the longest format.

India has not won a Test series in England since 2007. To prepare, several Indian players had already arrived earlier to represent India A in warm-up matches against the England Lions. The rest of the touring party is scheduled to arrive in the UK on Friday.

Meanwhile, ahead of the Test series, India 'A' are currently playing a three-match unofficial Test series against the England Lions. The first match ended in a draw, while the second unofficial

Test is set to begin on Friday, June 6, at the County Ground in Northampton.

On Thursday, England announced their squad for the opening Test at Headingley. The English side has seen several changes since their 4-1 Test series defeat in India last year. Veteran pacer James Anderson has retired, and players like Jonny Bairstow, Ben Foakes, and Ollie Robinson have been dropped.

ARUNDEL, Jun 6 (Agencies): South Africa's batting line-up for the World Test Championship Final has been hinted at through their warm-up exploits at Arundel, with Wiaan Mulder emerging as the likely No.3 to take on Australia at Lord's, according to the ICC

Mulder batted in the third spot against Zimbabwe in their final hit out ahead of the June 11 final, though only made 26 before falling Ibw to Tanaka Chivanga.

After losing Aiden Markram for 13 early in the day, the Proteas batting unit picked up through half-centuries from Ryan Rickelton (62), Temba Bavuma (58), and Tristan Stubbs (58) to eventually post 313/2, retiring several players to give others batting time in

With head coach Shukri Conrad all but confirming Aiden Markram and Ryan Rickelton to stand at the top of the order, the No.3 spot will fall to Tony de Zorzi, Tristan Stubbs or Mulder, with the three also against David Bedingham for spots further down the order.

De Zorzi made 28 before being retired batting at No.6, though, should they turn out with a similar make-up from the warm-up game. de Zorzi would likely be the unlucky player

Mulder could shoulder an increased bowling workload should the pitch be as fastbowling friendly as predicted, and assuming spinner Keshav Maharaj is picked to help the quicks.

Despite the murmurs, and considering Mulder's role in the side, batting coach Ashwell Prince kept his cards close to his chest. "At the moment, the best way to prepare

open," Ashwell said. "We don't know what the surface is going to look like when we get there. Should it be a case where he's required to do that job,

for us as a squad is to keep all possibilities

we want to make sure that he's at least had some sort of preparation, but we don't know whether he's going to be required to do that, because we haven't had a look at the sur-

"We'll only be able to tell when we get there," he added.

Mulder is yet to bowl in Zimbabwe's innings, with the side led by Craig Ervine resuming on day on 48/1 from 11 overs.

England seamer Mark Wood could potentially return for fourth test against India after recovering from injury

LONDON, Jun 6 (Agencies): England seamer Mark Wood could 'potentially' return in Test four or five against India as he continues his recovery from a knee injury he suffered back in March, according to Sky Sports.

His injury occurred during England's ICC Champions Trophy 2025 group-stage defeat to Afghanistan in Lahore after he "suffered increased stiffness and discomfort.'

Luke Wright, England's national selector, said Mark Wood has started bowling lightly.

"I think Woody's now started bowling just lightly, to be honest. He's just off a few paces, but that's been a great sign," Wright added.

"So, he's on the road to recovery. I think he's more long-term, if we can get him back, he might have an option for the fourth or fifth Test.

But again, each day it's ticking off each box and making sure he's OK."

"But he's trucking on well and same with Stoney. So, we are starting to get boys back, but they're still further away than right now. But it would be nice having those options back as well," he added.

Jofra Archer also has been out with a thumb injury but is targeting a return for England's second Test against India, according to a report from Sky Sports.

He has been out with the injury that saw him miss England's ODI series against the West Indies between May 29 and June 3, which England won 3-0.

Luke Wright also believed Archer could return for England's second Test against India. " Joff's trucking on really well, actually. The plans for him are that he's playing a few second-team games,"



Luke Wright said, as quoted by Sky Sports.

"He's getting a few loading up in the second team for Sussex, and then the idea for him is to play for Sussex against Durham, I think on the 23rd, just during the first Test. So, he'll play for Sussex if all things go well, and then if things go well, fingers crossed, he should be available for the second

Test," he added. Wright said that if Archer gets through that Durham game, then he's available potentially for selection for that second

test against India, starting from July 2.

J&K Handicraft Employees Association criticizes J&K Bank's advance EMI deductions, seeks policy review

SRINAGAR, Jun 6: The Jammu & Kashmir Handicraft Employees Association has voiced strong opposition to J&K Bank's recent move to deduct advance EMIs from the accounts of salaried employees, citing significant financial strain and lack of transpar-

In a statement issued today, Suhaib Munshi, President of the J&K Handicraft Employees Association and the Kashmir Provincial President of the National Movement for Old Pension Scheme (NMOPS), expressed deep concern over the bank's action, which he says has led to "confusion, distress, and overdrafts" in the accounts of unsuspecting employees.

"Several government employees were shocked to find their accounts overdrawn due to advance EMI deductions without proper communication," said Munshi. "We understand the importance of maintaining a good credit score, but this arbitrary and sudden deduction has disrupted household budgets and caused unnecessary anxiety."

financial move should be preceded by clear communication and consent from account holders. "It is only fair that employees are informed in advance and allowed to choose repayment options that align with their financial capacity."

He further urged the bank to adopt a more flexible and humane approach, such as EMI cycle adjustments or structured repayment plans, which would meet institutional goals without compromising the financial stability of cus-

The association has called on J&K Bank and relevant authorities to urgently review the current policy and ensure employee welfare remains a central factor in all decisions impacting their livelihoods.
